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# CHILD SAFETY

**As you enjoy your new product, keep these safety tips in mind**

## The issue

The home theater entertainment experience is a growing trend, and larger TVs are popular purchases. However, TVs are not always supported on the proper stands or installed according to the manufacturer's recommendations. We and the consumer electronics industry are committed to making home entertainment enjoyable and safe.

*TVs that are inappropriately placed on dressers, bookcases, shelves, desks, speakers, chests, or carts may fall over and cause injury.*

## Tune into safety

- One size of TV stand does **not** fit all. Use only a TV stand rated for the weight of your TV.
- Carefully read and understand all enclosed instructions for proper use of this product.
- Don't let children climb on or play with entertainment system furniture and TVs.
- Don't place TVs on furniture that can easily be used as steps, such as a chest of drawers.
- Remember that children can become excited while watching a program, especially on a "larger-than-life" TV. Make sure that you place or install the TV where it cannot be pushed, pulled over, or knocked down.
- Make sure that you route all cords and cables so that they cannot be pulled or grabbed by curious children.



## Wall mounting

If you decide to wall mount your TV, always remember:

- One size of wall mount does **not** fit all. Use only a wall mount rated for the weight of your TV and that has been recommended by this TV manufacturer, listed in this manual, or otherwise listed by an independent laboratory as suitable for your TV.
- Follow all instructions supplied by the TV and wall mount manufacturers.
- If you have any doubts about your ability to safely wall mount your TV, get help from a professional installer.
- Make sure that the wall where you are mounting the TV is appropriate. Some wall mounts are not designed to be mounted to walls backed with steel studs or cinder blocks. If you are unsure, ask a professional installer.
- TVs can be heavy. At least two people are required for safe wall mount installation.




# Important safety instructions



This symbol indicates that dangerous voltage constituting a risk of electric shock is present within your TV/Blu-ray combo. This label is located on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo.



This symbol indicates that there are important operating and maintenance instructions in the literature accompanying your TV/Blu-ray combo.

- 1 Read these instructions.
- 2 Keep these instructions.
- 3 Heed all warnings.
- 4 Follow all instructions.
- 5 Do not use this apparatus near water.
- 6 Clean only with a dry cloth.
- 7 Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- 8 Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- 9 Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.
- 10 Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.
- 11 Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- 12 Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over. 
- 13 Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
- 14 Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or moisture, does not operate normally, or has been dropped.

- 15 The main plug is the disconnecting device. The plug must remain readily operable.
- 16 An apparatus with a three-prong, grounding-type plug is a Class I apparatus, which needs to be grounded to prevent possible electric shock. Make sure that you connect this Class I device to a grounding-type, three-prong outlet.
- 17 Remote control batteries should not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire, or the like.
- 18 The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing, and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

## Warnings

### Electric shock hazard

To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not remove any cover or expose the device to rain or moisture. No user-serviceable parts are inside. Refer servicing to qualified service technicians.

### Lightning

For added protection for your device receiver during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the power outlet and disconnect any antenna or cable system. This helps prevent property damage and personal injury from lightning and power line surges.

### Power lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

### Handling the LCD panel

- Your TV's screen is made of glass. Do not drop your TV/Blu-ray combo or hit, jolt, or press hard against the LCD panel. If the screen breaks, be careful of broken glass.
- If the LCD panel is broken, make absolutely sure that you do not touch the liquid in the panel. This may cause skin inflammation.
- If the liquid gets in your mouth, immediately gargle, rinse, and consult with your doctor. Also, if the liquid gets in your eyes or touches your skin, consult with your doctor after rinsing for at least 15 minutes or longer in clean water.

### Replacement parts

When replacement parts are required, make sure that the service technician uses replacement parts specified by the manufacturer that have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, personal injury, or other hazards.

### Safety check

After completing any service or repair to this device, ask the service technician to perform routine safety checks to determine that your TV/Blu-ray combo is in correct operating condition.

## Power source

Operate your TV/Blu-ray combo only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supplied to your home, consult an electrician or your local power company.

## Cautions

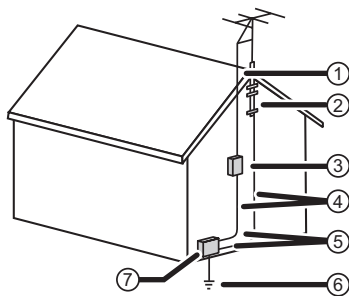
### Damage requiring service

Unplug this TV/Blu-ray combo from the power outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

- When the power supply cord or plug is damaged or frayed.
- If liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into your TV/Blu-ray combo.
- If your TV/Blu-ray combo has been exposed to rain or water.
- If your TV/Blu-ray combo does not operate normally by following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions because incorrect adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore your TV/Blu-ray combo to its normal operation.
- If your TV/Blu-ray combo has been dropped or damaged in any way.
- When your TV/Blu-ray combo exhibits a distinct change in performance.

### Outdoor antenna grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to your TV/Blu-ray combo, make sure that the antenna or cable system is grounded to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70, provides information with respect to correct grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of the antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

## Note to CATV system installer

Article 820 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 40 provides guidance for correct grounding. Specifically, it states that the cable ground must be connected to the grounding system of the building as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

## Condensation

Moisture will form on the TV/Blu-ray combo if the TV/Blu-ray combo is brought from cool surroundings into a warm room or if the temperature of the room rises suddenly. When this happens, the TV/Blu-ray combo's performance may be impaired. To prevent this, let the TV/Blu-ray combo stand in its new surroundings for about an hour before switching it on, or make sure that the room temperature rises gradually.

Condensation may also form during the summer if the TV/Blu-ray combo is exposed to the breeze from an air conditioner. In such cases, change the location of the TV/Blu-ray combo.

## Mobile telephone warning

To avoid interference with your TV picture and sound, operating problems, or even damage, keep your cordless and cellular telephones away from the TV/Blu-ray combo.

## End of life directives

Your TV/Blu-ray combo contains tin-lead solder and a fluorescent lamp containing a small amount of mercury. Disposal of these materials may be regulated for environmental reasons. Your TV/Blu-ray combo also contains material that can be recycled and reused. For disposal or recycling information, contact your local authorities or the Electronic Industries Alliance at [www.eia.org](http://www.eia.org) to find a recycler in your area.

## Non-active pixels

The LCD panel contains almost 3 million thin film transistors, which provide exceptionally sharp video quality. Occasionally, a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed blue, green, or red point. These non-active pixels do not adversely affect the performance of your TV/Blu-ray combo, and are not considered defects.

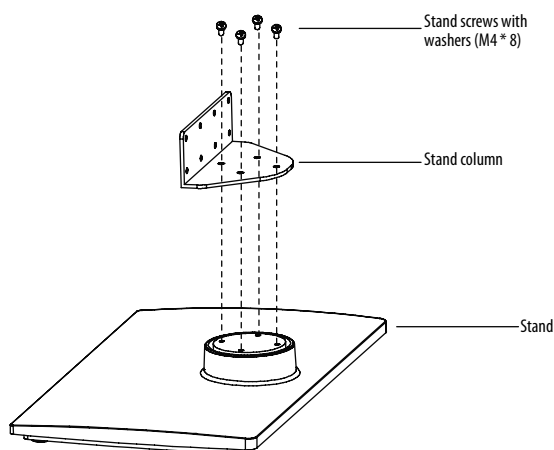
## Installing the stand

### Tips

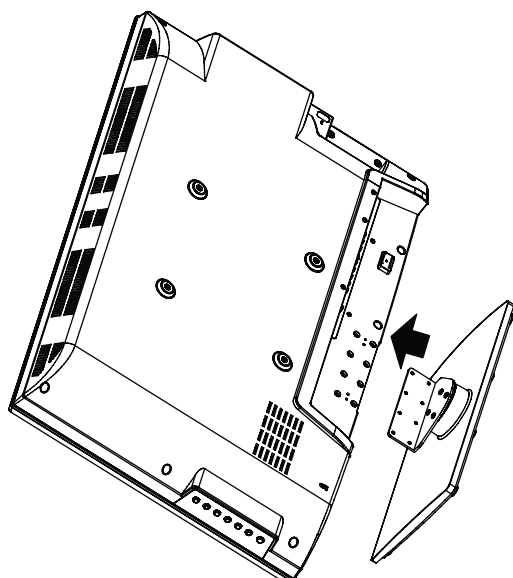
- Unplug the AC cord from the **AC INPUT** jack.
- Before beginning this process, make sure that you lay your TV/Blu-ray combo on a clean, safe, and cushioned surface to avoid any damage to your TV/Blu-ray combo.
- Do not touch or press the TV screen. The glass might break under pressure.

### To install the stand:

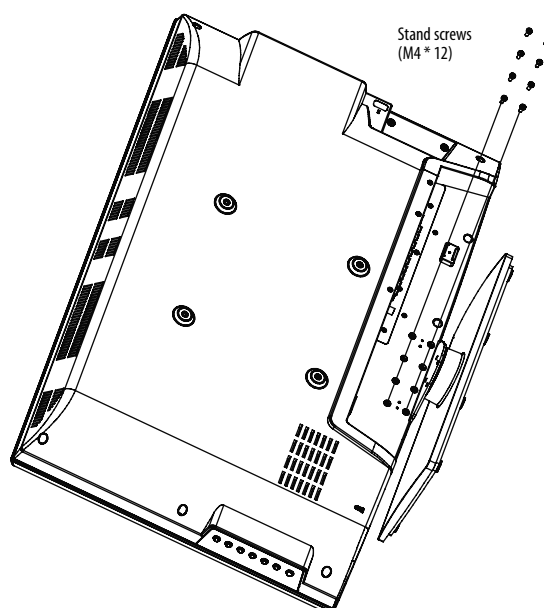
- 1 Remove the stand from the box and place it on a table or bench.
- 2 Secure the stand to the stand column with the provided four screws and washers.



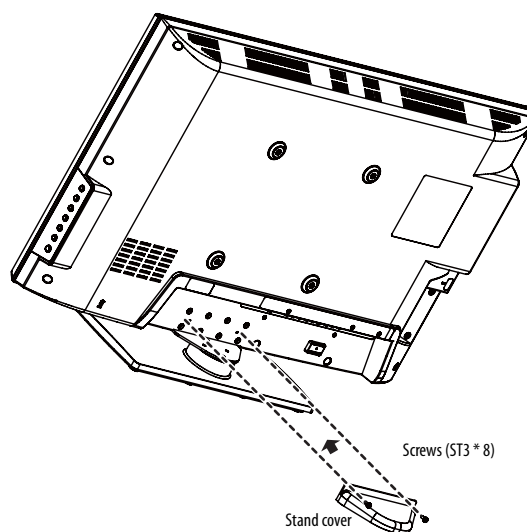
- 3 Place your TV/Blu-ray combo face down on table, aligning the bottom of your TV/Blu-ray combo with the edge of the table. Place a towel or similar material between the screen and the table to protect the screen.
- 4 Slide the stand column into the slot in the bottom of the TV/Blu-ray combo.



- 5 Secure the stand column with the eight provided screws.



- 6 Secure the stand cover (included) to the TV/Blu-ray combo with the two screws provided.



- 7 Place your TV/Blu-ray combo in an upright position on a flat surface.

To remove the stand, reverse these steps.

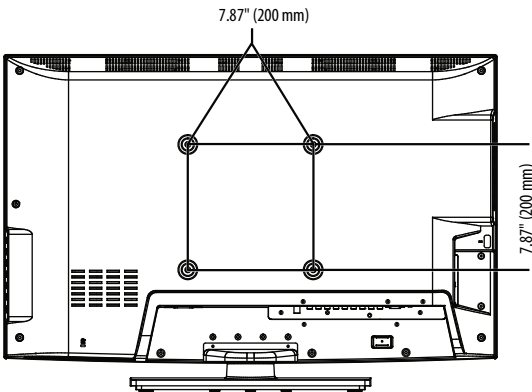
Installing a wall-mount bracket

- 1 Remove the two screws on the back of the stand that secure the back cover, then remove the cover.
- 2 Remove the eight screws holding the TV/Blu-ray combo to its stand, then remove the stand.
- 3 Attach the wall-mount bracket with M4 screws (not provided).

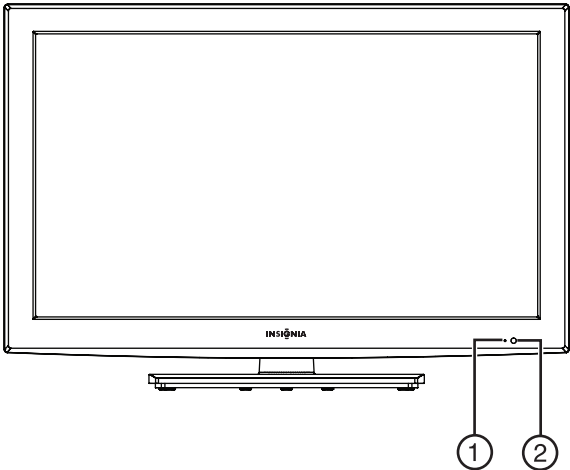

## Using the remote control

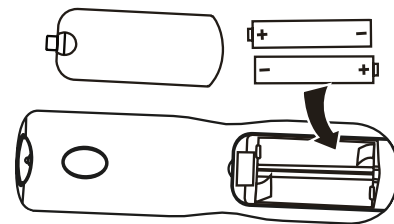
### Installing remote control batteries

To install remote control batteries:

- 1 Remove the battery compartment cover.



- 2 Insert two AA batteries (included) into the battery compartment. Make sure that the + and – symbols on the batteries match the + and – symbols in the battery compartment.



- 3 Replace the cover.

#### Cautions

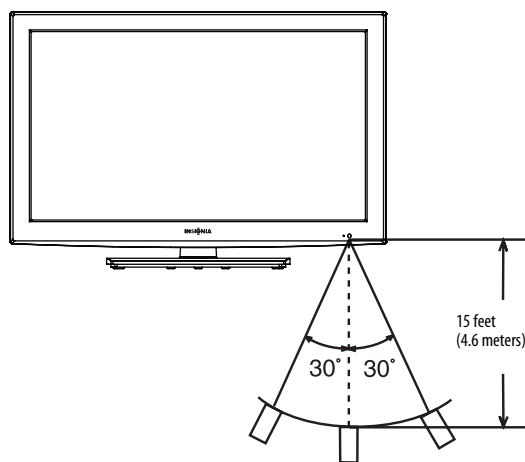
- Batteries should not be exposed to excessive heat, such as sunshine, heat registers, or fire.
- Battery chemicals can cause a rash. If the batteries leak, clean the battery compartment with a cloth. If chemicals touch your skin, wash immediately.
- Make sure that batteries are disposed of correctly. Do not burn or incinerate.
- Make sure that you match the + and – symbols on the batteries with the symbols in the battery compartment.
- Do not mix different types of batteries or old and new batteries.
- If you do not intend to use the remote control for an extended period of time, remove the batteries to prevent leakage.
- Do not try to recharge non-rechargeable batteries. They may overheat and rupture.



## Aiming the remote control

### To use the remote control:

Point the remote control directly at your TV/Blu-ray combo, within a 60° angle horizontally (30° to either side) and within 30° vertically of the remote control sensor on the front of your TV/Blu-ray combo, and within 15 feet (4.6 meters) of your TV/Blu-ray combo.



#### Caution

Do not expose the remote control to liquids, direct sunlight, or shock.

#### Notes

- Objects between the remote control and the remote control sensor may block the remote control signal.
- The range of the remote control may be diminished if direct sunlight or other strong light is shining at the remote control sensor. In this case, change the angle of the lighting, move your TV/Blu-ray combo, or operate the remote control closer to the remote control sensor.

## Programming your universal Insignia remote control

### To program your remote control:

- 1 Find the codes for the devices you want to program in "Remote control codes" on page 66 and write them down or highlight them.
- 2 Turn on the device (for example, a DVD player) and, if needed, load media such as a DVD.
- 3 Press the device button on the TV remote for the device that you want to program (**STB** or **AUX**).
- 4 Press and hold **SET** until the red LED blinks twice, then release.
- 5 Enter the first five-digit code for the device and brand that you want to program. The LED blinks once as each digit is entered. If the code is valid, the LED blinks twice.

#### Note

If the LED does not blink twice, repeat steps 2 to 4 and try entering the code again.

- 6 Aim the remote at the device and press **⏻** (power). The device should turn off. If it does not, repeat Steps 3 through 5, trying each code for your brand until you find one that works. If you cannot find a code that works, see "Searching for your code" below.
- 7 Repeat Steps 1 to 5 for the other devices you want to control. For future reference, write down each working device code.

### Searching for your code

If your device does not respond to the remote control after trying all codes listed for your brand, or if your brand is not listed, try searching for your code.

#### To search for your code:

- 1 Turn on the device you want to control.
- 2 Press the device button on your TV remote control (**STB** or **AUX**) once.
- 3 Press and hold **SET** until the red LED blinks twice, then release.
- 4 Enter **9 9 1**. The LED blinks twice.
- 5 Press the number that matches your device type.
  - **0**—Cable converters, video accessories, satellite receivers
  - **1**—TVs
  - **2**—VCRs, DVD players, Blu-ray Disc players
  - **3**—Audio amplifiers, audio amplifiers/tuners, CD players
- 6 Aim the remote at the device and press **⏻** (power). The remote sends IR codes from its library to the selected device, starting with the most popular code first. If the device responds, go to Step 8.
- 7 If the device does not respond, press **CH ▲** and the remote tests the next code for that device type. Continue to press **CH ▲** until the device turns off.

#### Note

Press **CH ▼** to try the previous code.

- 8 Now that you have found the correct code, press **SET** to save the code that worked for your device. The LED blinks twice to indicate that the code has been saved.
- 9 To search for other device codes, repeat Steps 1 to 8.

### Checking the codes

If you have set up the remote using the procedure in "Searching for your code" on page 11, you may need to find out which five-digit code is operating your equipment.

#### To find out which code is assigned to your STB (for example):

- 1 Press **STB** once.
- 2 Press and hold **SET** until the red LED blinks twice, then release.
- 3 Enter **9 9 0**. The LED blinks twice.



- 4 To view the code for the first digit, press **1**. Count the red LED blinks (for example, three blinks = 3), then write down the number in the appropriate code listing at the top of this column.

#### Note

If the LED does not blink, the code digit is 0.

- 5 Repeat Step 4 for the four remaining digits, using **2** for the second digit, **3** for the third digit, **4** for the fourth digit, and **5** for the fifth digit.
- 6 To check for other device codes, repeat Steps 1 through 5, substituting the device button for the device you would like to check.

### Using learning

This universal remote control includes a learning feature so you can add functions that are unique to your home entertainment devices (such as VCR Tracking Up or Down). However, there are some considerations to keep in mind.

#### Precautions

- Your original remote controls must be in working order for learning to work properly.
- Learned buttons are mode-specific, so each one can store a unique function for each mode.
- Do not use the following buttons for learning: **Device buttons** or **SET**.
- Learning capacity is approximately 42 to 75 buttons, depending on the code being learned.
- Certain device functions are not learnable, including multi-frequency types, some high frequency functions, and other unusual formats.
- For optimum learning, avoid high levels of ambient light such as natural sunlight or energy-efficient fluorescent lights.

#### Note

Have your original remote controls handy before programming learning.

### Programming a learned button

#### To program a learned button:

- 1 Place your Insignia remote control head-to-head (about 2" apart) from your original remote control (the one that came with the device).
- 2 Locate the button on your original remote control that you want the Insignia remote control to learn. Press the mode button you want to learn functions on.
- 3 Press and hold **SET** until the LED blinks twice, then release.
- 4 Enter **9 7 5**. The LED blinks twice.

#### Note

If more than 10 seconds pass between button presses, the remote exits programming.  
If the LED displays one long flash instead, replace the batteries. If the remote control continues to display one long flash, the remote control cannot learn a new button.

- 5 Press the button on your TV's remote control that you want to program. The feedback LED stays lit for three seconds, indicating that the remote is ready to learn.

- 6 On the original remote, press and hold the button to be learned. Continue holding the button on the original remote until the Insignia's LED blinks twice.

#### Note

If the red LED displays one long blink, a learning error has occurred. Try repeating this step again until a successful capture occurs. If the function is still not captured, press and hold **SET** to exit programming and review the Precautions" above. After reviewing, start programming again at Step 1.

- 7 Repeat Steps 4 and 5 to program another button. Once you have completed programming all the buttons you want, press and hold **SET** until the LED blinks twice to save all data learned.

### Deleting a single learning button

This process returns the button to its original programming for the mode you select. You can also delete learned programming by teaching a different function to the button (see "Programming a Learned button" above).

#### Note

If more than 10 seconds pass between button presses, the remote exits programming.  
If the LED displays one long flash instead, replace the batteries. If the remote control continues to display one long flash, the remote control cannot learn a new button.

#### To delete a single learned button:

- 1 Press the mode button that you want to remove the learned button from.
- 2 Press and hold **SET** until the LED blinks twice, then release.
- 3 Enter **9 7 6**. The LED blinks twice.
- 4 Press the button containing the learned function to be deleted, twice. The LED blinks twice and programming ends.

### Deleting all learned buttons in a specific mode

#### Note

If more than 10 seconds pass between button presses, the remote exits programming.  
If the LED displays one long flash instead, replace the batteries. If the remote control continues to display one long flash, the remote control cannot learn a new button.

#### To delete all learned buttons in a specific mode:

- 1 Press and hold **SET** until the LED blinks twice, then release.
- 2 Press **9 7 6**. The LED blinks twice.
- 3 Press a mode button twice (for example, **TV** (should TV be deleted here?), **STB**, or **AUX**) to clear all the learned buttons for that mode. The LED blinks twice and programming ends.

### Changing volume lock

Volume Lock sets the volume and mute buttons to the device you select, regardless of what mode you are in. For example, if you lock the volume to your DVD player and then go to TV mode, when you press the volume button on your Insignia remote, the volume will change on the DVD player and not on your TV.

#### To lock volume control:

- 1 Press and hold **SET** until the red LED blinks twice, then release.
- 2 Enter **9 9 3**, the LED blinks twice.
- 3 Press the mode button for the device you want to control (for example, TV).
- 4 The LED blinks twice. Now when you press **VOL+**, **VOL-**, or **Mute**, the selected device controls the volume regardless of the current mode.

#### To unlock all volume control:

- 1 Press and hold **SET** until the red LED blinks twice, then release.
- 2 Enter **9 9 3**, the LED blinks twice.
- 3 Press **VOL+**. The LED blinks four times. Volume is independently controlled for all programmed devices.

#### To unlock a single device's volume control:

- 1 Press the device mode button (*should TV be deleted here?* **TV**, **STB**, or **AUX**).
- 2 Press and hold **SET** until the red LED blinks twice, then release.
- 3 Enter **9 9 3**. The LED blinks twice.
- 4 Press **VOL-**. The red LED blinks four times. Volume is independently controlled for the selected devices.

### Programming channel lock

Channel control can be locked so that the Insignia remote controls a single device's channel-changing functions, regardless of operating mode. This is often enabled by users who watch all broadcast TV through one device, such as a cable set-top box. The affected buttons are **1** through **0**, **CH ▲**, **CH ▼**, and **RECALL**.

#### To lock all channel controls to one device:

- 1 Press the mode button for the device that you want to use for changing channels, such as **STB** for your cable set top box.
- 2 Press and hold **SET** until the mode LED blinks twice, then release.
- 3 Enter **9 7 3**. The mode LED blinks twice.
- 4 Press **CH ▲** once. The mode LED blinks twice.

Now, regardless of what mode you select, the channel buttons will only change channels on the assigned device.

#### To unlock channel locks:

- 1 Press and hold **SET** until the mode LED blinks twice, then release.
- 2 Enter **9 7 3**. The mode LED blinks twice.

- 3 Press **CH ▼** once. The mode LED blinks four times.

Now the channel functions will correlate to the active mode (for example, press **CH ▲** in TV mode and the TV changes channel accordingly).

### Using buttonmover

Your Insignia universal remote control includes a buttonmover feature that lets you copy buttons from one mode (such as source mode) to another mode (such as destination mode) or to a different button in the same mode.

#### Note

Do not use any of the Device buttons,  (power), or **SET** as a source or destination button.

#### To move buttons in the same device mode:

- 1 Press the device button (*should TV be deleted here?* **TV**, **STB**, or **AUX**).
- 2 Press and hold **SET** until the LED blinks twice, then release.
- 3 Press **9 9 4**. The LED blinks twice.
- 4 Press the button you want to move.
- 5 Press the new button that should perform the function. The LED blinks twice.
- 6 Repeat Steps 1-5 to move additional buttons.

#### To move buttons to a different device mode:

- 1 Press and hold **SET** until the LED blinks twice, then release.
- 2 Press **9 9 4**. The LED blinks twice.
- 3 Press the device button that contains the function you want to move (for example, **AUX**).
- 4 Press the button you want to move (such as **Play**).
- 5 Press the device button that you want to move the function to (such as **TV**).
- 6 Press the button in the new mode that should perform the function (for example, **Play**). The LED blinks twice.
- 7 Repeat Steps 1-6 to move additional buttons.

#### To restore all buttonmoved data in a specific mode:

- 1 Press and hold **SET** until the LED blinks twice, then release.
- 2 Press **9 9 4**. The LED blinks twice.
- 3 Press the device button you want to remove all buttonmoved data from twice. The LED blinks twice.
- 4 Repeat for each device you want to restore.

#### To restore original button function:

- 1 Press the device button for which you want to remove the buttonmoved data from a specific button.
- 2 Press and hold **SET** until the LED blinks twice, then release.
- 3 Enter **9 9 4**. The LED blinks twice.
- 4 Press the button you want to remove the buttonmoved data from twice. The LED blinks twice.

- Repeat Steps 1-4 for additional buttons you want to remove.

## Programming macros

Your Insignia universal remote control includes the ability to program any button (other than the **SET** button) with a macro function. Each one can be set up to perform a pre-programmed set of sequential button presses with the press of a single button. A macro can be used to control a home theater operation, to set a favorite channel, or for other functions you would like to control with one button press. Each macro button can hold up to 15 button presses, total.

### Note

Programming a new macro over an existing one erases the original macro.

## To program a mode-independent macro:

- Press and hold **SET** until the red LED blinks twice, then release.
- Press **9 9 5**. The LED blinks twice.
- Press the button you want to assign to a macro.
- Enter the series of commands you want the macro to execute (up to 15 commands).
- Press and hold **SET** until the red LED blinks twice, then release.

Now, when you press the preset macro button, the remote sends the series of commands you have entered, regardless of what mode you are in. For example, you could program a macro button to turn on both your TV and cable box and select a particular channel.

### Note

To clear the macro, repeat Steps 1-5, but do not enter a series of commands at Step 4.

## To program a mode-dependent macro:

- Press the device mode button (**should TV be deleted here? TV, STB, or AUX**).
- Press and hold **SET** until the LED blinks twice, then release.
- Press **9 7 8**. The LED blinks twice.
- Press the button you want to assign to a macro.
- Enter the series of commands you want the macro to execute (up to 15 commands).
- Press and hold **SET** until the red LED blinks twice, then release.

Now, when you press the macro button, the remote sends the series of commands you have entered, but only if you are in the mode you selected in Step 1. For example, you could program the macro button to turn on both your TV and cable box and select a particular channel, but only if you are in TV mode. If you are in DVD mode, this button does not execute the macro you set up in TV mode.

### Note

To clear the macro, repeat Steps 1-6, but do not enter a series of commands at Step 5.

## Programming a different universal remote control

You can operate your Insignia TV/Blu-ray combo with a new or existing universal remote control.

## To program a different universal remote control:

- See the table below for common codes. If you have problems programming your remote or need a different remote control code, visit [www.insigniaproducts.com](http://www.insigniaproducts.com) for the latest remote control code information.

### Tips

- The brand name is often visible on the front of the universal remote control, and the model number is often visible on the back.
- If your universal remote control isn't listed on the chart, refer to your universal remote control's instructions and try codes for the brands Orion, Emerson, Memorex, Sansui, Sylvania, or Zenith. You may need to try several codes before finding a match.

- Follow your universal remote control's instructions to enter the TV code you found in Step 1.

### Tips

- If your universal remote control has a code search feature, run a code search to identify a code that matches your TV. See your universal remote control's instructions for details.
- If your universal remote control has a "Learn" feature, you can manually program it using the Insignia TV remote to "teach" the commands one at a time. See your universal remote control's instructions for details.

- If all else fails, you must use a different universal remote control that can operate both your set-top box and your TV. Four such remotes are listed on the chart, but many other compatible models are available in the market.

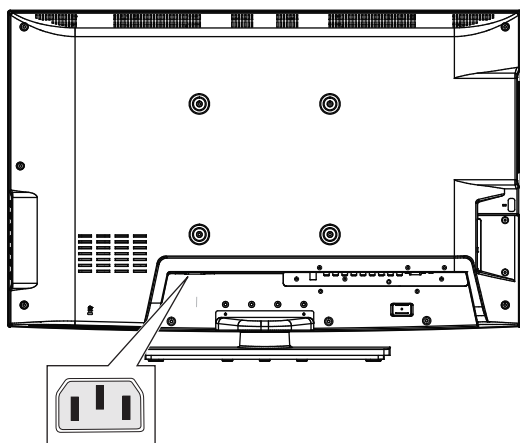

# Making connections

## Connecting the power

### To connect the power:

- Plug the power cord into the AC INPUT jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and into a power outlet.



### Warnings

- Do not connect your TV/Blu-ray combo to power using any device other than the supplied AC power cord. This could cause fire, electrical shock, or damage.
- Do not use with a voltage other than the power voltage displayed on the label on your TV/Blu-ray combo. This could cause fire, electrical shock, or damage.
- Do not plug or unplug the power cord when your hands are wet. This may cause electrical shock.
- The AC cord has a grounding-type AC line plug. If the supplied AC cord does not match your power outlet, contact a qualified electrician to replace the obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the purpose of a grounded plug. This could cause fire or electrical shock.

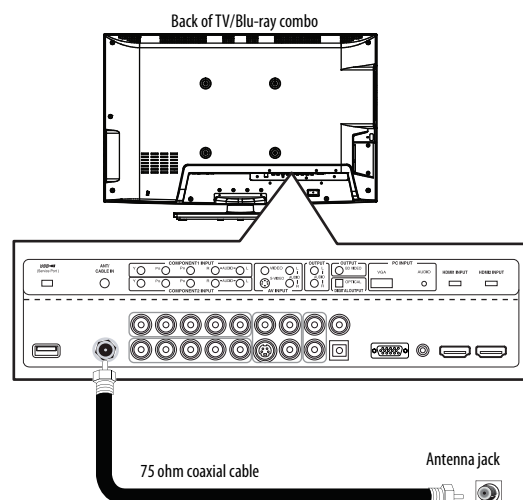
### Cautions

- When your TV/Blu-ray combo is not used for a long time, unplug it from the power outlet.
- If you need to replace the supplied AC cord, contact customer service.

## Connecting an antenna or cable TV (no box)

### To connect an antenna or cable TV (no box):

- Make sure that your TV/Blu-ray combo's power cord is unplugged.
- Connect one end of a 75 ohm coaxial cable to the antenna or cable wall jack, then connect the other end of the cable to the **ANT/CABLE IN** jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo. If your antenna cable has a 300 ohm twin-lead connector, use a 300-75 ohm adapter.



### Note

- Always unplug the coaxial cable when you move your TV/Blu-ray combo.
- If you switch between antenna and cable, install an antenna selector.
- If you need help connecting cable TV, contact your cable TV provider.

## Connecting a cable or satellite TV box

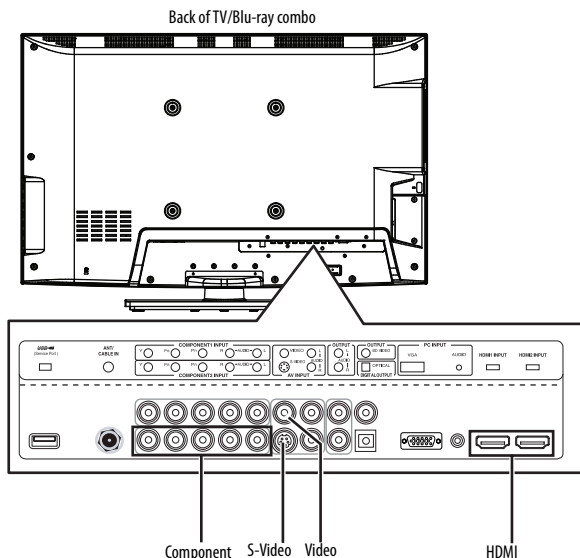

### Note

Installation methods may vary depending on the type of cable or satellite box. Contact your cable or satellite provider for more information.

### To connect a cable or satellite TV box:

- 1 Make sure that your TV/Blu-ray combo's power cord is unplugged and the cable or satellite TV box is turned off.
- 2 Connect the incoming cable from the cable TV or satellite TV wall jack to the cable-in jack on the cable or satellite TV box.



- 3 Depending on the jacks available on the cable or satellite TV box, connect a cable from the outgoing jacks on the cable or satellite TV box to the corresponding jacks on the back of your TV. The connection can be to an **HDMI** jack, **COMPONENT1** or **COMPONENT2** INPUT jacks, **AV INPUT S-VIDEO** jack, or **AV INPUT VIDEO** jack.

- 4 If you use the **COMPONENT1** or **COMPONENT2** INPUT jacks, connect an audio cable to the **L/R** audio jacks to the right of the video jacks.

### Or,

If you use the **AV INPUT S-VIDEO** or **AV INPUT VIDEO** jack, connect an audio cable to the **AV INPUT AUDIO L/R** audio jacks.

### Note

If the cable or satellite TV box does not have an HDMI, component, S-Video, or composite jack, connect the cable or satellite TV box to the **ANT/CABLE IN** jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo. For more information, see "Connecting an antenna or cable TV (no box)" on page 15.

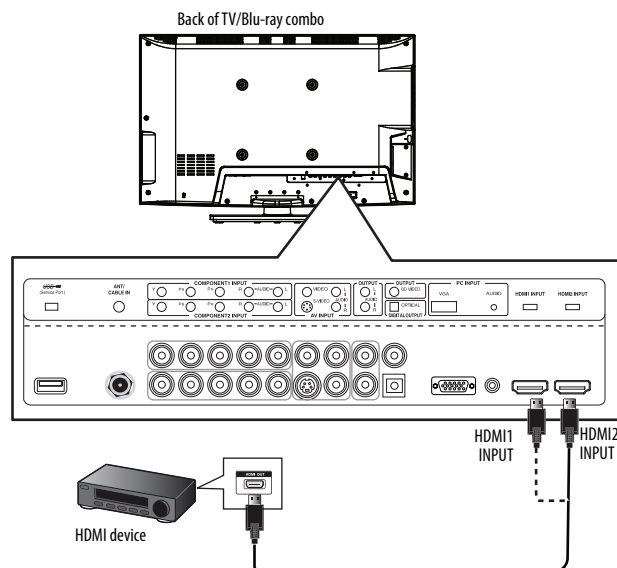
## Connecting an HDMI device

### To connect an HDMI device:

- 1 Make sure that your TV/Blu-ray combo's power cord is unplugged and the HDMI device is turned off.
- 2 Connect an HDMI cable to the **HDMI1 INPUT** or **HDMI2 INPUT** jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to the **HDMI OUT** jack on the HDMI device.

### Note

You can also connect an HDMI device to the **HDMI3 INPUT** jack.



- 3 Turn on your TV/Blu-ray combo, then turn on the HDMI device.
- 4 Press **INPUT** to open the source list, press **INPUT** repeatedly or press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **HDMI-1**, **HDMI-2**, or **HDMI-3**, then press **ENTER**.

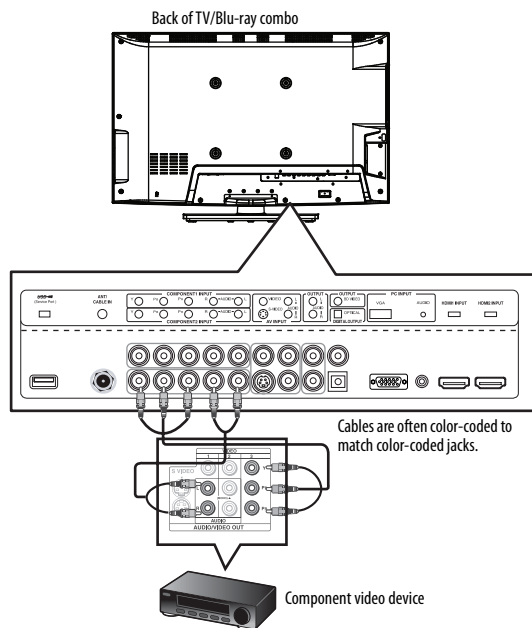
### Note

To connect a DVI device, use a DVI to HDMI adapter cable to connect to any **HDMI** jack on your TV/Blu-ray combo, then connect an audio cable to the **PC INPUT AUDIO** jack on the back of the TV/Blu-ray combo.

## Connecting a component video device

### To connect a component video device:

- 1 Make sure that your TV/Blu-ray combo's power cord is unplugged and the component video device is turned off.
- 2 Connect a component video cable to the **COMPONENT1 INPUT (Y, PB, PR)** or **COMPONENT2 INPUT** jacks on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to the corresponding **COMPONENT OUT** jacks on the component video device.

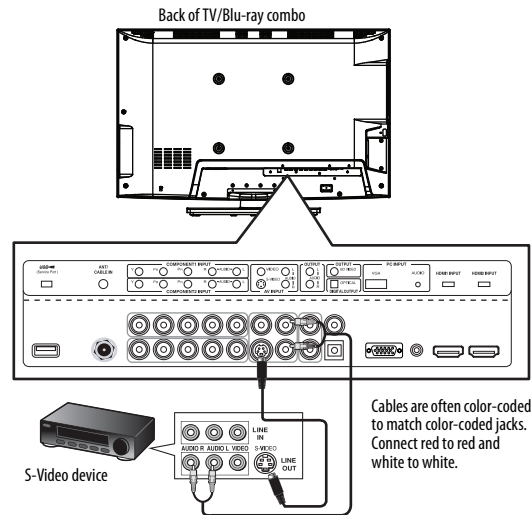


- 3 Connect an audio cable to the **COMPONENT1 INPUT AUDIO L and R** or **COMPONENT2 INPUT AUDIO L and R** jacks on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to the **COMPONENT AUDIO OUT** jacks on the component video device.
- 4 Turn on your TV/Blu-ray combo, then turn on the component video device.
- 5 Press **INPUT** to open the source list, press **INPUT** repeatedly or press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **Component-1** or **Component-2**, then press **ENTER**.

## Connecting an S-Video device

### To connect an S-Video device:

- 1 Make sure that your TV/Blu-ray combo's power cord is unplugged and the S-Video device is turned off.
- 2 Connect an S-Video cable to the **AV INPUT S-VIDEO** jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to the **S-VIDEO OUT** jack on the S-Video device.



- 3 Connect an audio cable to the **AV INPUT AUDIO L and R** audio jacks on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to the **AUDIO OUT** jacks on the S-Video device.
- 4 Turn on your TV/Blu-ray combo, then turn on the S-Video device.
- 5 Press **INPUT** to open the source list, press **INPUT** repeatedly or press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **AV**, then press **ENTER**.

#### Note

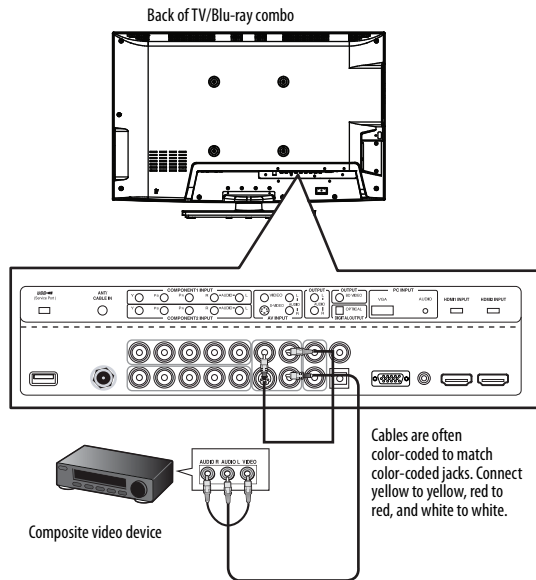
The **AV INPUT S-VIDEO** jack and the **AV INPUT VIDEO** jack share the **AV INPUT AUDIO L and R** jacks. If you have devices connected to both video jacks, the **S-VIDEO** jack controls the audio jacks.



## Connecting a composite video device

### To connect a composite video device:

- 1 Make sure that your TV/Blu-ray combo's power cord is unplugged and the composite video is turned off.
- 2 Connect an AV cable to the **AV INPUT VIDEO** and **AV INPUT AUDIO L** and **R** jacks on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and the **VIDEO** and **AUDIO OUT** jacks on the composite video device.



- 3 Turn on your TV/Blu-ray combo, then turn on the composite video device.
- 4 Press **INPUT** to open the source list, press **INPUT** repeatedly or press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **AV**, then press **ENTER**.

### Note

The **AV INPUT S-VIDEO** jack and the **AV INPUT VIDEO** jack share the **AV INPUT AUDIO L** and **R** jacks. If you have devices connected to both video jacks, the **S-VIDEO** jack controls the audio jacks.

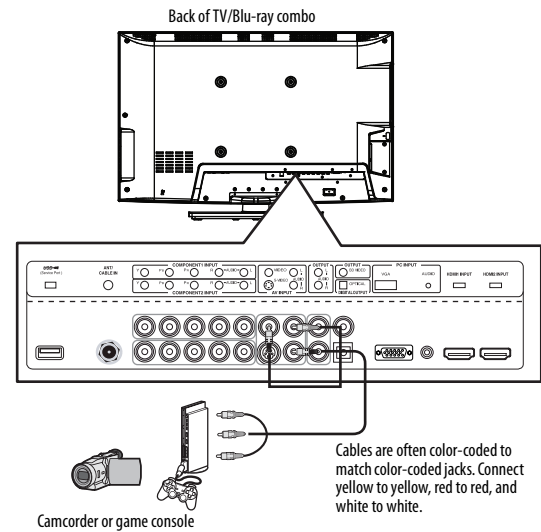
## Connecting a camcorder or game console

### Note

The **AV INPUT S-VIDEO** jack and the **AV INPUT VIDEO** jack share the **AV INPUT AUDIO L** and **R** jacks. If you have devices connected to both video jacks, the **S-VIDEO** jack controls the audio jacks.

### To connect a camcorder or game console:

- 1 Make sure that your TV/Blu-ray combo's power cord is unplugged and the camcorder or game console is turned off.
- 2 Connect the video connector on a composite video cable to the **AV INPUT VIDEO** jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and the **VIDEO OUT** jack on the camcorder or game console.



- 3 Connect the left and right audio connectors on the composite cable to the **AV INPUT AUDIO L/R** audio jacks on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to the **AUDIO OUT** jacks on the camcorder or game console.
- 4 Turn on your TV/Blu-ray combo, then turn on the camcorder or game console.
- 5 Press **INPUT** to open the source list, press **INPUT** repeatedly or press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **AV**, then press **ENTER**.

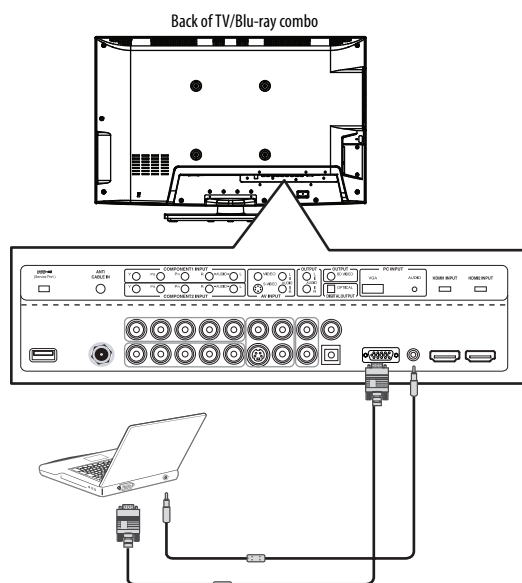
## Connecting a computer

### Note

If the computer has an HDMI jack, you can connect it to an HDMI jack on your TV/Blu-ray combo.

### To connect a computer:

- 1 Make sure that your TV/Blu-ray combo's power cord is unplugged and the computer is turned off.
- 2 Connect a VGA cable to the **PC INPUT VGA** jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to the **VGA** jack on the computer.



- 3 Connect an audio cable to the **PC INPUT AUDIO** jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to the **AUDIO OUT** jack on the computer.
- 4 Turn on your TV/Blu-ray combo, then turn on the computer.
- 5 Press **INPUT** to open the source list, press **INPUT** repeatedly or press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **VGA**, then press **ENTER**.

### Notes

- The on-screen menus may have different options in PC mode than in TV mode.
- If there is no video signal from the computer when your TV/Blu-ray combo is in PC mode, "No signal" appears on the TV screen.
- Your TV/Blu-ray combo does not support a Plug and Play connection to the computer.

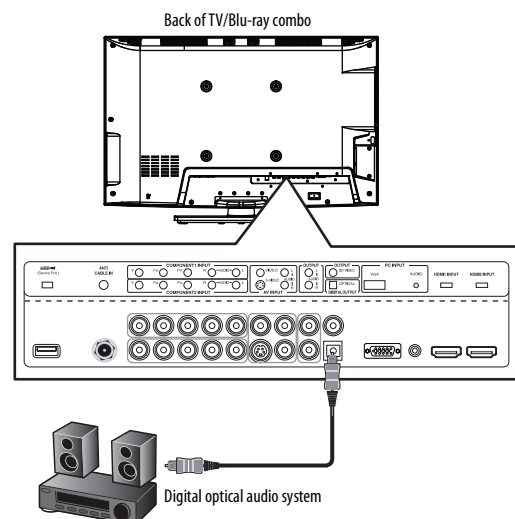

## Connecting a digital optical audio system

### To connect a digital optical audio system:

- Connect a digital audio optical cable to the **DIGITAL OUTPUT OPTICAL** jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to the **DIGITAL OPTICAL INPUT** jack on the audio system.



### Note

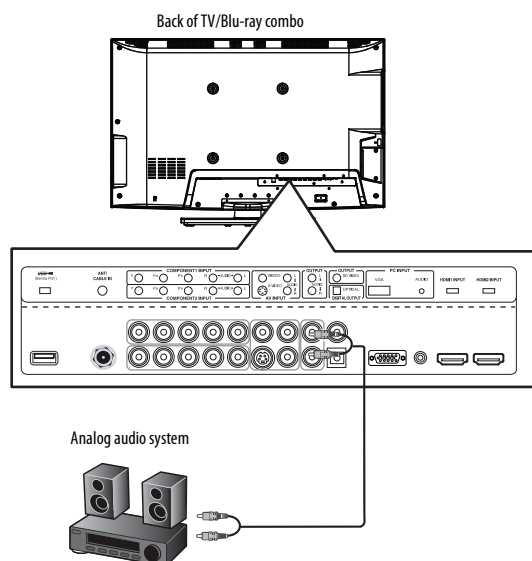
The **DIGITAL OUTPUT OPTICAL** jack only works with digital sources.



## Connecting an analog audio system

### To connect an analog audio system:

- Connect an audio cable to the **OUTPUT AUDIO L** and **R** jacks on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to the **AUDIO IN** jacks on the audio system.



### Notes

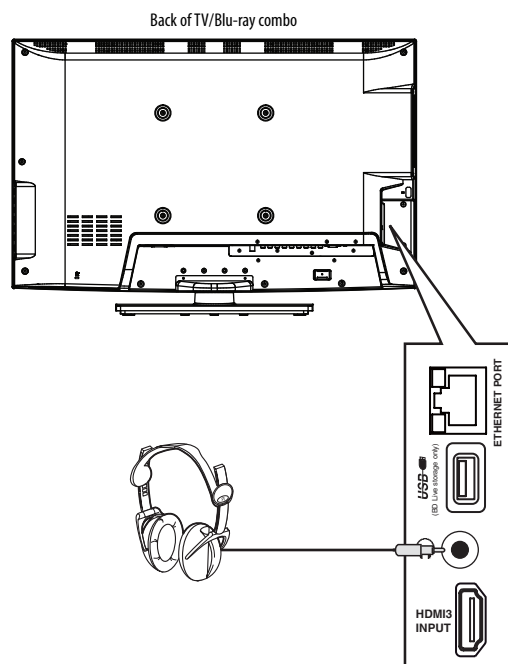
To hear the audio from your TV/Blu-ray combo through the audio system:

- You must turn off your TV/Blu-ray combo's internal speakers. For more information, see "Adjusting the sound" on page 27.
- Set the volume on your TV/Blu-ray combo and the audio system above 0 (zero).

## Connecting headphones

### To connect headphones:

- Connect the headphones to the  (headphone) jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo.



### Note

Loud noise can damage your hearing. When using headphones, use the lowest volume setting that still lets you hear the sound.

## Connecting a USB flash drive

### To connect a USB flash drive:

- Plug the USB flash drive into the USB port on your TV/Blu-ray combo.

## Connecting your home network

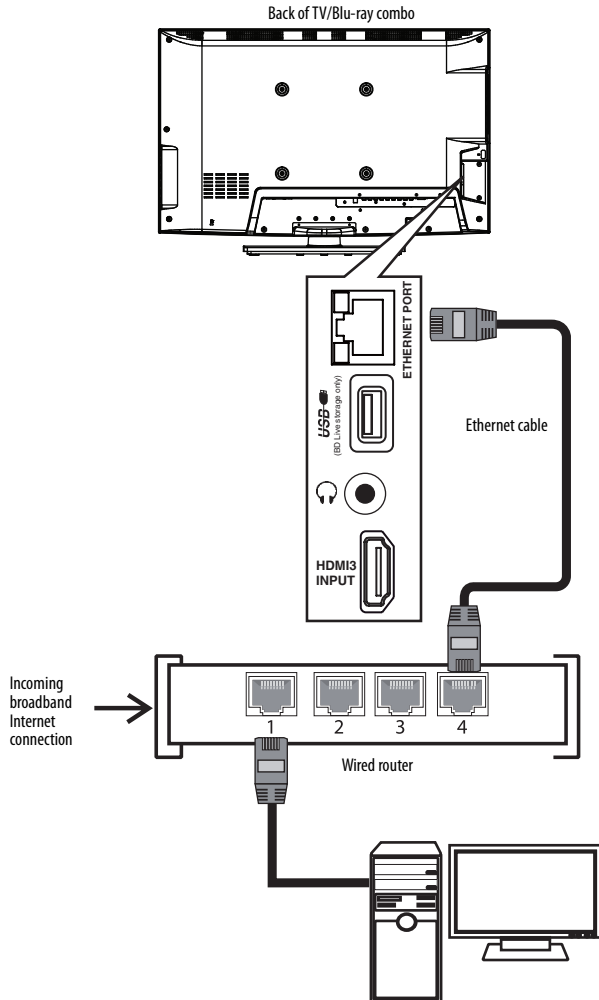
You can connect your TV/Blu-ray combo to your home network using:

- A wired connection. This type connection provides the best performance because devices attached with cables are not subject to radio frequency interference. For instructions, see "Wired connection" on page 21.
- A wireless connection. For instructions, see "Wireless connection" on page 21.

### Wired connection

#### To connect your TV/Blu-ray combo using a wired router:

- Connect an Ethernet cable (CAT5 or better with an RJ45 connector) to the **ETHERNET** jack on the back of your TV/Blu-ray combo and to an Ethernet jack on a router.



#### Note

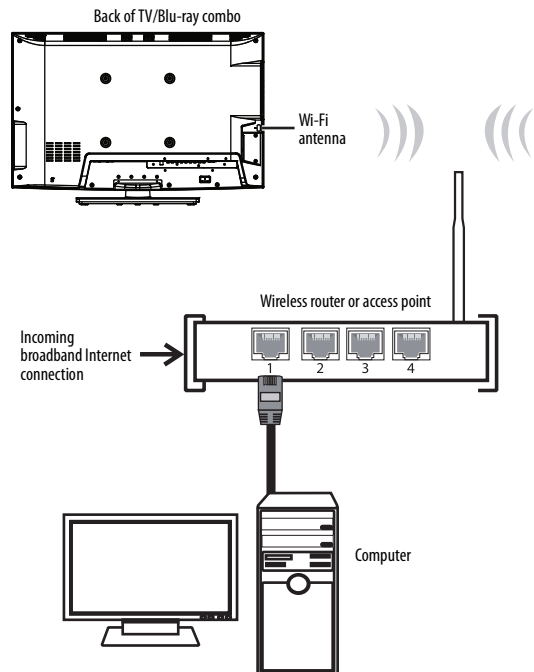
When plugging or unplugging the cable, hold the connector on the end of the cable. When unplugging, do not pull on the cable. Press down the lock tab and pull the connector out of the jack.

### Wireless connection

The network configuration and connection method may vary depending on the equipment in use and the network environment. Your TV/Blu-ray combo is equipped with an IEEE 802.11n (Wi-Fi) wireless module, which also supports the 802.11b/g standards. For the best wireless performance, we recommend using a IEEE 802.11n certified Wi-Fi network (access point or wireless router).







- 1 Make sure that you have inserted the batteries in the remote control, connected your devices to the TV/Blu-ray combo, and connected the power cord.
- 2 Press  (power), then wait several seconds. The *Choose Your Menu Language* screen opens (only the first time you turn on your TV/Blu-ray combo).



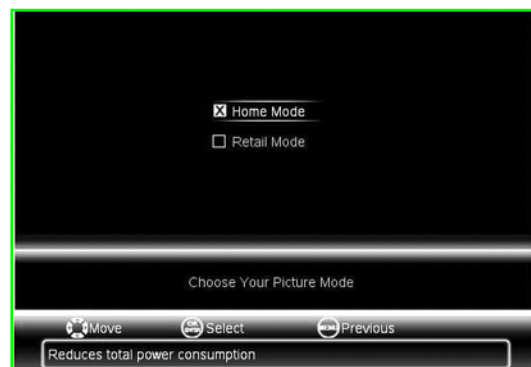
- 3 Press  or  to highlight **English**, **Français**, or **Español**, then press **ENTER**. The *Choose Your Time Setting* screen opens with **Mode** highlighted.





- 4 Press  or  to highlight an option, then press  or  to adjust the option. You can select:
  - **Mode**—You can select **Auto** or **Manual**. If you select **Auto**, the date and time are set based on a time signal received from a digital TV channel. If you select **Manual**, you can adjust the date and time.
  - **Time Zone**—You can select the time zone.
  - **Daylight Savings**—You can select **On** or **Off**.
  - **Year**—Press  or  to select the current year.

- **Month**—Press  or  to select the current month.
- **Day**—Press  or  to select the current day.
- **Time**—When **Time** is highlighted, press  or  to move the cursor from field to field, then press  or  to change the value in the field.

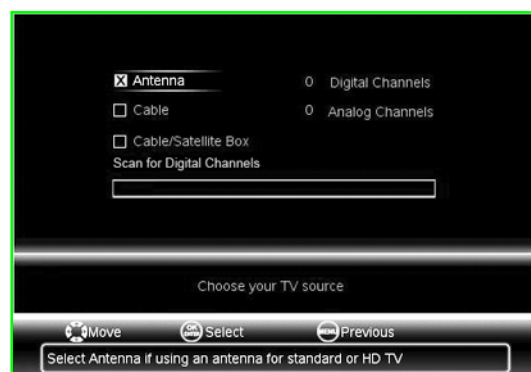
- 5 Press **ENTER**. The *Choose Your Picture Mode* screen opens.





- 6 Press  or  to highlight **Home Mode** or **Retail Mode**, then press **ENTER**. If you selected **Home Mode** (default selection with the same settings as the **Energy Savings** picture mode), the **Choose Your TV Source** screen opens. If you selected **Retail Mode** (selection has the same settings as the **Vivid** picture mode), the warning "If you select Retail Mode, then Energy Saving is not realized."

If you select **No**, then press **ENTER**, the *Choose Your Picture Mode* screen reopens. Go back to Step 5.

If you select **Yes**, then press **ENTER**, the *Choose Your TV Source* screen opens.



- 7 Press  or  to highlight **Antenna**, **Cable**, or **Cable/Satellite Box**, depending on the type of connection you have, then press **ENTER**.
  - If you are using an antenna for a standard or HD TV signal, select **Antenna**.
  - If your cable TV is connected directly to your TV/Blu-ray combo (without a box), select **Cable**.
  - If your cable is connected to your TV/Blu-ray combo through a cable or satellite box, select **Cable/Satellite Box**.

If you selected **Antenna** or **Cable**, your TV/Blu-ray combo automatically scans for available channels in your area and stores the channel information in the channel list. This may take several minutes. While scanning, your TV/Blu-ray combo display a progress bar.

If you selected **Cable/Satellite Box**, your TV/Blu-ray combo does not need to scan for channels, and no progress bar is displayed.

#### Notes

- During auto scan, digital channels will be scanned first, then analog channels. When all available digital channels have been found, the message will ask you "Do you want to continue scanning analog channel?" You can select **No**, then press **ENTER** to exit the analog channel scan, or let your TV/Blu-ray combo continue scanning.
- You can press **MENU** or **EXIT** at any time to stop the auto scan, but you will need to run the auto scan again to create a channel list.

- 8 If you connected a cable or satellite TV box, press **INPUT** to open the source list, press **INPUT** repeatedly or press **▲** or **▼** to highlight the jack the box is connected to, then press **ENTER**.

#### Note

Unless otherwise noted, all tasks in this section are based on using the remote control.

### Turning your TV/Blu-ray combo on or off

#### To turn your TV/Blu-ray combo on or off:

- 1 Make sure that you have connected the power cord to your TV/Blu-ray combo and a power outlet.
- 2 Press **⏻** (power). Your TV/Blu-ray combo turns on and the power indicator on the front of your TV/Blu-ray combo turns blue.
- 3 Press **⏻** (power) again. Your TV/Blu-ray combo turns off (Standby mode) and the power indicator on the front of your TV/Blu-ray combo turns red.

#### Warning

When your TV/Blu-ray combo is in Standby mode, power still flows into it. To disconnect power, unplug the power cord.

#### Note

When your TV/Blu-ray combo does not receive a signal and you do not press any buttons for 15 minutes, your TV/Blu-ray combo goes into Standby mode.

## Selecting a channel

### To select a channel:

- Press **CH ▲** or **CH ▼** to go to the next or previous channel in the channel list and skip channels that are not in the list. For more information, see "Automatically scanning for channels" on page 28.
- Press the number buttons for the channel, then wait for the channel to change or press **ENTER**. For example:
  - To select channel 2, press **2**.
  - To select channel 12, press **1** then press **2**.
  - To select channel 120, press **1**, **2**, then press **0**.
- Press **RECALL** to go to the last viewed channel.
- To select a digital sub-channel, press the number buttons for the main channel, press **—**, then press the number for the sub-channel. For example, to select sub-channel 001 of digital channel 015, press **0**, **1**, **5**, **—**, **0**, **0**, **1**.

## Adjusting the volume

### To adjust the volume:

- 1 Press **VOL+** to increase the volume.
- 2 Press **VOL-** to decrease the volume.
- 3 Press **MUTE** to turn off the sound. Press **MUTE**, again to restore the sound.

## Displaying additional information

### To display additional information:

- Press **INFO** to show an information banner. The information banner shows current program information such as channel number, channel name (if available), signal source, program description, and DTV signal strength, and resolution.
- Press **GUIDE** to display program information in a window with live program content for the channel you are watching. Press **►** to view information about next program, then press **◄** to go back to the information about the previous program. Press **GUIDE** or **EXIT** to exit this feature.

### Note

Unless otherwise noted, all tasks in this section are based on using the remote control.

## Adjusting the TV picture

### To adjust the TV picture:

- 1 Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the **PICTURE** menu displayed.



- 2 Press **▲** to access the **PICTURE** menu.
- 3 Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight a setting, then press **►** or **ENTER** to access the options for the setting. You can select:
  - **Mode**—Selects the picture mode. You can select:
    - **Vivid**—Provides a bright and dynamic picture.
    - **Standard**—Provides standard picture quality.
    - **Energy Savings**—Decrease the backlight brightness to save energy.
    - **Theater**—Provides a movie-like picture.
    - **Sports**—Provides an ideal picture for fast-motion sports.
    - **Custom**—Sets your personal preferences.

### Notes

- You can also press **PICT** to select the picture mode.
- If you adjust **Brightness**, **Contrast**, **Color**, **Tint**, or **Sharpness**, your TV/Blu-ray combo switches to **Custom** mode automatically.

- **Brightness**—Adjusts the picture brightness.
- **Contrast**—Adjusts the picture contrast.
- **Color**—Adjusts the color intensity of the picture.
- **Tint**—Adjusts the red and green colors in the picture.
- **Sharpness**—Adjusts the picture focus.



- **Advanced Video**—Opens the *Advanced Video* menu where you can adjust additional video settings. Press **►** or **ENTER** to access the Advanced Video settings.



- **Aspect Ratio**—Selects the aspect ratio of the picture. You can select **Normal**, **Wide**, **Zoom**, **Cinema**, or **Auto**. **Auto** is only available in TV mode when **Auto Zoom** on the **CHANNELS** menu is turned on. In VGA mode or when a computer is connected to an HDMI jack, only **Wide** and **Normal** are available.
  - **Overscan**—You can select **On** or **Off**. When a computer is connected to your TV/Blu-ray combo, this option is turned off automatically to show the computer's full image on the screen.
  - **Color Temperature**—Adjust the color temperature of the picture. You can select **Cool**, **Normal**, or **Warm**.
  - **Noise Reduction**—Selects the noise reduction mode to reduce picture noise (snow). You can select **Off**, **Low**, **Middle**, or **High**.
  - **Backlight**—Controls the overall brilliance of the screen. You can adjust the backlight through a range of 0 ~100. The backlight scale will appear on the screen. Press **◀** or **▶** to decrease or increase the backlight setting.
  - **Adaptive Contrast**—Optimizes the overall picture to make it more vivid. You can select **On** or **Off**.
  - **Dynamic Contrast Ratio**—Enhances the contrast ratio between light and dark areas of the screen. You can select **On** or **Off**.
  - **Reset Picture Settings**—Resets all picture settings to the factory defaults. When you select this option, a confirmation box opens. Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **Yes** or **No**, then press **ENTER**.
- 4 Press **◀** or **▶** to adjust the option, or press **▲** or **▼** to select a setting.
  - 5 Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

## Adjusting the computer image

### To adjust the computer image:

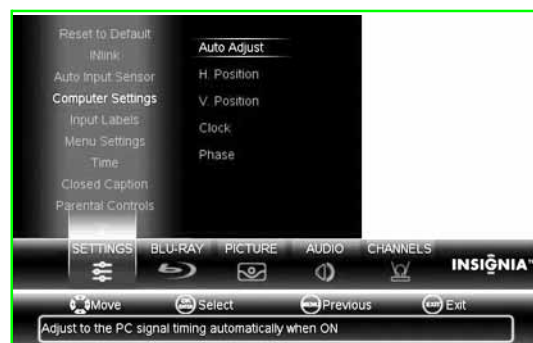
- 1 Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the **PICTURE** menu displayed.



- 2 Press **◀** or **▶** to select **SETTINGS**. The **SETTINGS** menu opens.



- 3 Press **▲** to highlight **Computer Settings**, then press **►** or **ENTER** to access the *Computer Settings* settings.



- 4 Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight a setting, then press **►** or **ENTER** to access the options for the setting. You can select:
  - **Auto Adjust**—Automatically adjust the computer image for the best picture. When this option is selected, press **►** or **ENTER**.
  - **H. Position**—Adjusts the horizontal position of the computer image.
  - **V. Position**—Adjusts the vertical position of the computer image.
  - **Clock**—Adjusts the clock, to eliminate vertical bars or stripes on the picture background.
  - **Phase**—Adjusts the phase, after the frequency has been set, to optimize the picture.
- 5 Press **◀** or **▶** to adjust the option, or press **▲** or **▼** to select a setting.
- 6 Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

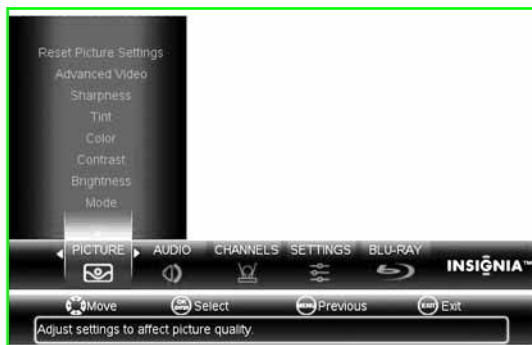

### Adjusting the sound

#### To adjust the sound:

- 1 Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the **PICTURE** menu displayed.



- 2 Press **◀** or **▶** to select **AUDIO**. The **AUDIO** menu opens.



- 3 Press **▲** to access the **AUDIO** menu.

- 4 Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight a setting, then press **►** or **ENTER** to access the options for the setting. You can select:
  - **Audyssey Dynamic Volume**—Selects the Audyssey mode. You can select **Off**, **Light**, **Medium**, or **Heavy**. When the Audyssey mode is set to **Light**, **Medium**, or **Heavy**, your TV/Blu-ray combo automatically adjusts the volume to keep the volume level consistent.
  - **SRS TruSurround HD™**—Provides the ultimate home theater sound solution. You can select **On** or **Off**.

### Note

If you set the SRS TruSurround HD™ to **On**, Audyssey Dynamic Volume is set to **Off** automatically.

- **Treble**—Adjusts the high sounds.
  - **Bass**—Adjusts the low sounds.
  - **Balance**—Adjusts the balance between the left and right audio channels.
  - **Advanced Audio**—Opens the *Advanced Audio* menu where you can adjust additional audio settings. Press **►** or **ENTER** to access the Advanced Audio settings.
    - **Digital Audio/SPDIF**—Sends digital audio to an external audio system. You can select **PCM** (to select to output audio in 2-channel stereo), or **RAW** (to pass through the original digital audio sound).
    - **Audio Language**—(Digital channels only) Selects an alternate audio language, if available.
    - **MTS/SAP**—(Analog channels only) Selects the audio mode. You can select:
      - **Mono**—Select this option if there is noise or static on weak stereo broadcasts.
      - **Stereo**—Select this option for programs broadcast in stereo.
      - **SAP**—Select this option to listen to a secondary audio program, if available.
    - **Speakers**—Selects the internal speakers or external speakers (line out).
  - **Reset Audio Settings**—Reset all audio settings to factory defaults.
- 5 Press **◀** or **▶** to adjust the option, or press **▲** or **▼** to select a setting.
  - 6 Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.



## Playing TV audio only

When watching TV, you can turn off the TV picture and listen to the audio only.

### To play TV audio only:

- 1 Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the **PICTURE** menu displayed.



- 2 Press **◀** or **▶** to select **CHANNELS**. The **CHANNELS** menu opens.



- 3 Press **▲** to highlight **Audio Only**, then press **▶** or **ENTER** to access the Audio Only settings.



- 4 Press **▲** or **▼** to select **On** or **Off**.
- 5 Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

### Notes

- After **Audio Only** is turned on, the TV picture will disappear within 10 seconds after the on-screen menu is closed.
- **Audio Only** works only when the input source is TV and your TV/Blu-ray combo is receiving a broadcast signal.
- To exit **Audio Only** mode, press any button except the power button. When you exit **Audio Only** mode, the **Audio Only** setting is automatically reset to **Off**.

## Changing channel settings

### Note

Unless otherwise noted, all tasks in this section are based on using the remote control.

### Automatically scanning for channels

When you scan for channels, your TV/Blu-ray combo searches for channels with signals and stores the channel information in the channel list. When you press **CH ▲/CH ▼**, your TV/Blu-ray combo goes to the next or previous channel in the channel list.

If the TV signal source changes, for example you change from an outdoor antenna to cable TV (no box), you need to scan for channels.

### To automatically scan for channels:

- 1 Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the **PICTURE** menu displayed.



- 2 Press **◀** or **▶** to select **CHANNELS**. The **CHANNELS** menu opens.



- 3 Press **▲** to highlight **Auto Channel Search**, then press **▶** or **ENTER** to access the *Auto Channel Search* screen.



- 4 Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **Antenna**, **Cable**, or **Cable/Satellite Box**, depending on the type of connection you have, then press **ENTER**.
  - If you are using an antenna for a standard or HDTV signal, select **Antenna**.
  - If your cable TV is connected directly to your TV/Blu-ray combo (without a box), select **Cable**.
  - If your cable is connected to your TV/Blu-ray combo through a cable or satellite box, select **Cable/Satellite Box**.

If you selected **Antenna** or **Cable**, your TV/Blu-ray combo automatically scans for available channels in your area and stores the channel information in the channel list. This may take several minutes. While scanning, your TV/Blu-ray combo displays a progress bar.

#### Notes

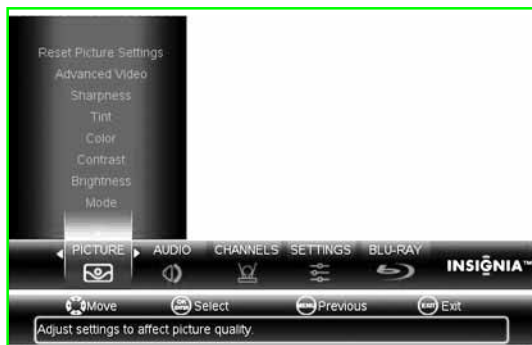
- During auto scan, digital channels will be scanned first, then analog channels. When all available digital channels have been found, the message will ask you "Do you want to continue scanning analog channel?" 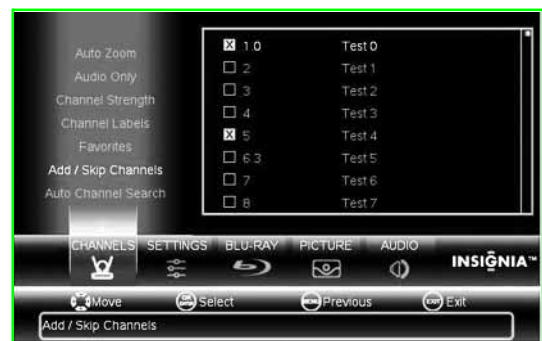

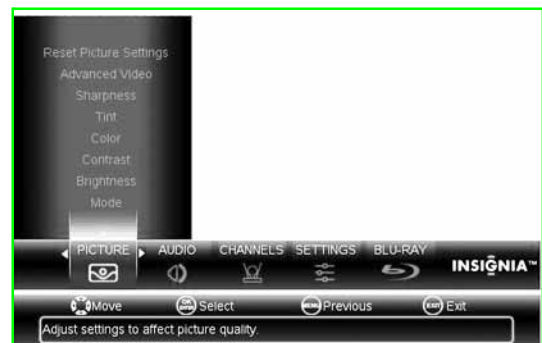

## Setting up a favorite channel list

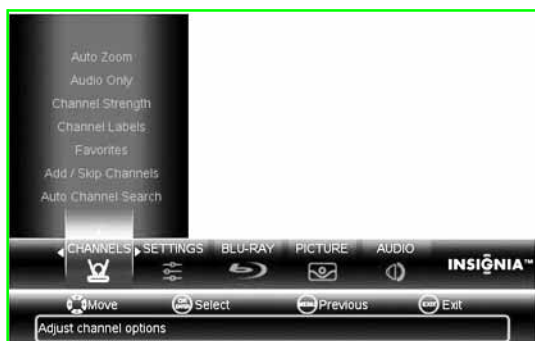
You can create a *Favorites* list so you can quickly browse through your favorite channels by pressing **FAV**, then selecting a channel from the *Favorites* list.

#### To set up a favorite channel list:

- 1 Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the **PICTURE** menu displayed.



- Press **◀** or **▶** to select **CHANNELS**. The **CHANNELS** menu opens.

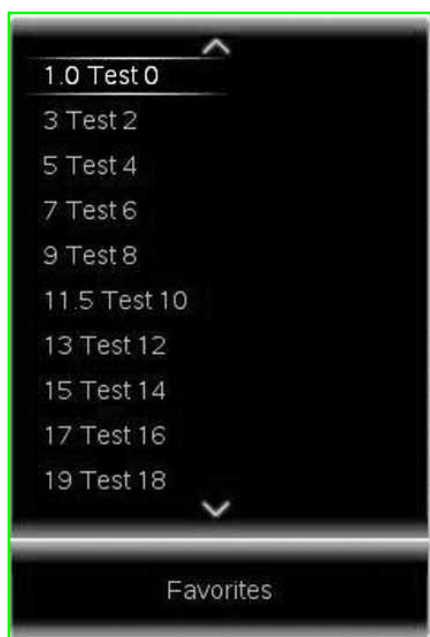


- Press **▲** to highlight **Favorites**, then press **▶** or **ENTER** to access the favorites screen.
- Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight the channel you want to add to the *Favorites* list, then press **ENTER** to check the highlighted channel. You can remove a channel from the list by highlighting the channel and unchecking it.
- Repeat Step 4 to add additional channels.
- Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

## Viewing a favorite channel

To view a favorite channel:

- Press **FAV** on your remote control. The *Favorites* channel list opens.



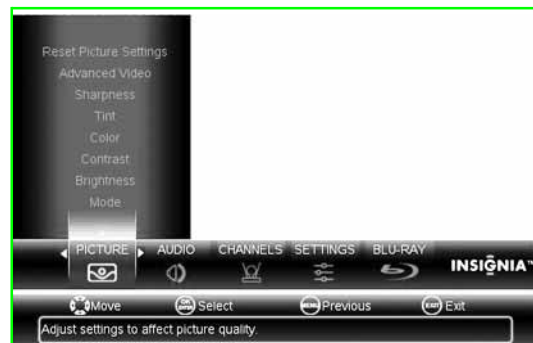

## Adding or changing a channel label

If a channel is not already labeled, you can label the channel to make it easier to identify. You can also relabel a channel that is already labeled.

To add or change a channel label:

- Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the **PICTURE** menu displayed.



- Press **◀** or **▶** to select **CHANNELS**. The **CHANNELS** menu opens.



- Press **▲** to highlight **Channel Labels**, then press **▶** or **ENTER** to access the channel labels screen.



- Press **▲** or **▼** to select the channel you want to label, then press **►** to move to the **Alpha 01** box. A small keyboard opens with the channel label in the text entry area.



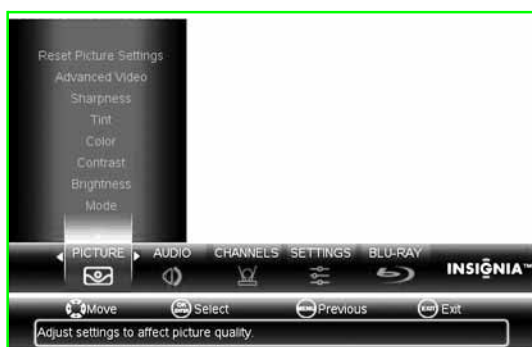
- Press **▲** **▼** **◀** or **▶** to highlight a letter, number, or character, then press **ENTER** to put your selection in the text entry area. Repeat this step to add additional letters. You can add as many as seven letters.
- Press **▲** **▼** **◀** or **▶** to highlight Enter on the keyboard, then press **ENTER**. The new label will appear in the Channel Label submenu and in the Channel List.
- Press **MENU** to close the keyboard and return to the channel entry area.
- Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

## Checking the digital signal strength

You can check the digital signal strength to determine if you need to adjust your antenna or digital cable input. The higher the signal strength, the less likely you are to experience picture degradation.

### To check the digital signal strength:

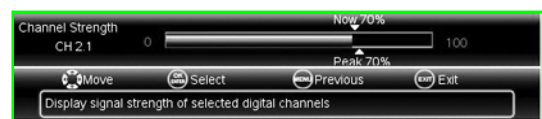

- Press **◀** or **▶** to select **CHANNELS**. The **CHANNELS** menu opens.



- Press **▲** to highlight **Channel Strength**, then press **►** or **ENTER** to open the digital TV signal strength meter.



- Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

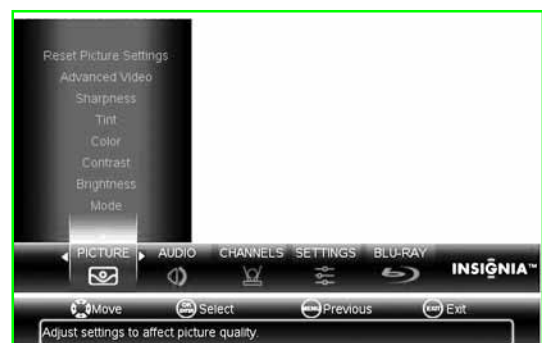
Your TV/Blu-ray combo has a V-chip that lets you control the type of programs your children can watch. Parental controls include two ratings: MPAA (based on age) and TV Parental Guidelines (based on content and age). A TV program may have an MPAA or TV Parental Guidelines rating, so you should set control for both ratings.

Before you can select ratings, you need to set up a parental controls password.

## Setting or changing the password

### To set or change the password:

- Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the **PICTURE** menu displayed.



- Press **◀** or **▶** to select **SETTINGS**. The **SETTINGS** menu opens.



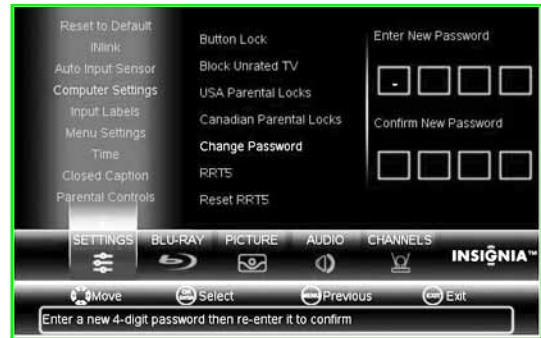
- Press **▲** to highlight **Parental Controls**, then press **▶** or **ENTER**. The **Enter Password** screen opens.



- Press the number buttons to enter the four-digit password. The default password is **0000**. You should change the password to a number you can remember. The **Parental Controls** menu opens.



- Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **Change Password**, then press **▶** or **ENTER**. The **Enter New Password** screen opens.



- Press the number buttons to enter a password, then enter the password again.
- Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

#### Note

If you forget your password, enter **9999**.

## Setting parental control levels

### To set parental control levels:

- Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the **PICTURE** menu displayed.



- Press **◀** or **▶** to select **SETTINGS**. The **SETTINGS** menu opens.





- 3 Press **▲** to highlight **Parental Controls**, then press **►** or **ENTER**. The *Enter Password* screen opens.



- 4 Press the number buttons to enter the four-digit password. The default password is **0000**. You should change the password to a number you can remember. The *Parental Controls* menu opens.



- 5 Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **USA Parental Locks** or **Canadian Parental Locks**, then press **►** or **ENTER** to open the *USA Parental Locks* or *Canadian Parental Locks* screen.



- 6 Press **▲** **▼** **◀** or **▶** to highlight a rating, then press **ENTER** to block or unblock the rating. When you block a rating, that rating and all higher ratings are blocked.
- 7 Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

#### Note

When you first set parental controls, they take effect immediately. If you have set parental controls then tune to a blocked channel or program, you are prompted to enter the password. After you enter the password, parental controls are tuned off. To reactivate the parental lock settings, turn off your TV/Blu-ray combo, then turn it on again.

Your TV/Blu-ray combo can decode and display closed-captioned television programs. Closed captioning displays text on the screen for hearing impaired viewers or translates and displays text in another language.

There are two closed-captioning formats:

- Captions**—This closed caption mode displays text in a small box across the bottom of the screen in English or another language. Generally, closed captions in English are transmitted on C1 and closed captions in other languages are transmitted on C2.
- Text**—This closed caption mode usually fills half of the screen with a programming schedule or other information provided by the broadcaster.

### Notes

- Writeable DVDs (DVD-RAM, DVD-RW, or DVD-R) must be finalized, VR mode only.
- Your TV/Blu-ray combo supports discs that are compatible with DVD-RAM Standard Version 2.0.
- Playback may not work for some types of discs, or when specific operations, such as changing the angle or aspect ratio, are being performed. Information about the disc is on the disc or disc packaging.
- Do not let the disc become dirty or scratched. Fingerprints, dirt, dust, scratches, or cigarette smoke on the recording surface may make it impossible to use the disc for playback.
- Your TV/Blu-ray combo can play CD-R/-RW, DVD-RAM/-RW/-R recorded with UDF or ISO9660 format.
- Windows Media Audio (WMA) files must be written to the disc with a .wma file extension in order to be recognized and played back correctly.
- High bit-rate or variable bit-rate .wma files may not play back correctly.

### About Blu-ray Discs

The massive storage capacity of a Blu-ray Disc allows a higher standard of picture and audio quality and a wealth of special effects and enhanced features not available on DVDs.

#### Java™

Your TV/Blu-ray combo features Java support so you can get the most out of the latest Blu-ray Discs. When a Blu-ray Disc loads, explore the title menu to enjoy these extra features.

#### Color buttons

The red, green, yellow, and blue buttons on the remote control are used with interactive menus when operating a Blu-ray Disc that includes Java applications. For more information about using this type of disc, see the instructions that came with the disc.

### Playing a disc

#### To play a disc:

- 1 Turn on your TV/Blu-ray combo.
- 2 Press **INPUT**, press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **BLU-RAY**, then press **ENTER**.
- 3 Insert a disc in the disc slot with the label (if the disc has one) facing forward. Hold the disc without touching either of its surfaces, align it with the guides, and gently push it in.

### Note

If a Disc is inserted during some modes other than Blu-ray mode, it may switch to Blu-ray mode and start playback automatically.

- 4 If the disc does not start playing automatically, press **▶** (play).
- 5 If a Blu-ray Disc or DVD menu opens, press **▲ ▼ ◀ ▶** to select **PLAY**, then press **ENTER**.
- 6 To eject the disc, press **EJECT/CLOSE ▲**.

### Note

If you eject a disc from the disc slot, then change to a different video input source or turn off your TV/Blu-ray combo, you cannot insert a disc into the disc slot.

### Controlling disc playback

#### To control disc playback:

- To pause playback, press **⏸** (pause). Press this button or **▶** (play) to resume normal playback.
- To stop playback, press **■** (stop). The **Setup** menu opens. To resume playback, press **▲ ▼ ◀ ▶** to select **DVD/BD-ROM**, then press **ENTER**. Depending on the disc, playback starts where it stopped or at the beginning of the disc. If you press **■** (stop) twice, playback stops completely. To start playback again, press **▶** (play).

### Notes

Not all Blu-ray Discs support the resume feature.

- To fast forward or fast reverse, press **⏭** or **⏮**. Each time you press one of these buttons, the fast-forward or fast-reverse speed increases from Fast X2, Fast X4, Fast X8, Fast X16, Fast X32, Fast X64, to Fast X128. Press **▶** (play) to resume normal playback.
- To go to the previous chapter, press **⏮** within two seconds after the current chapter starts. To go to the beginning of the current chapter, press **⏮** anytime after playing the first two seconds of the chapter.
- To go to the next chapter, press **⏭**.

### Note

If **⏸** appears on the screen, the operation you are trying is not allowed by your TV/Blu-ray combo or the disc. For example, most discs will not let you fast forward through the warning information at the beginning of a title.

## Displaying disc information

Your TV/Blu-ray combo displays information about the disc, such as type of disc, current elapsed time in the title, total amount of time in title, current chapter, and total number of chapters.

### To display disc information:

- 1 Press **INFO**.

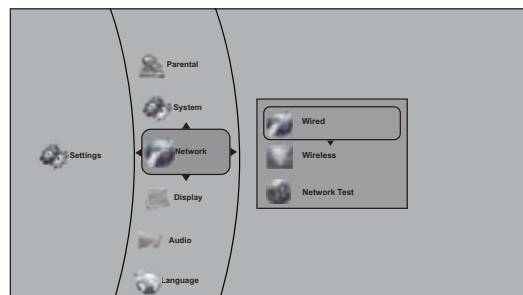


- 12 Press **ENTER** to close the message. Your TV/Blu-ray combo is now connected to the network. In the future, when you turn on your TV/Blu-ray combo, it will automatically connect to this network. You do not need to repeat these steps again.
- 13 Press **◀** to go to the previous menu.

## Testing the Internet connection

### To test the Internet connection:

- 1 Press **ENTER**. The *Settings* menu opens.
- 2 Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **Network**, then press **ENTER**. The *Network* menu opens.



- 3 Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **Network Test**, then press **ENTER**. Your TV/Blu-ray combo starts testing the network.
- 4 When test was completed, press **ENTER** to close the test menu.
- 5 Press **◀** to go to the previous menu.

## Using BD-Live Features

Some Blu-ray Discs contain additional features that you can access, such as:

- Downloadable movie trailers,
- Additional "commentary" by actors and directors
- Multi-person game play and chat

To access these features, your TV/Blu-ray combo must be configured for BD-Live Internet access and be equipped with additional memory.

## Adding BD-Live memory

### To add BD-Live memory:

- 1 Insert a 1 GB USB flash drive into a USB port on a computer and make sure that it is formatted FAT 32.
- 2 Insert the formatted flash drive into the USB port on your TV/Blu-ray combo.

## Setting up BD-Live Internet access

### To set up BD-Live Internet access:

- 1 Follow the instructions in "Setting the BD-Live Internet access level" on page 53. Make sure that **Limit Access** or **Always Allow Access** is selected.
- 2 If the free space on the USB flash drive is less than 100 MB, clear BD storage. Follow the instructions in "Erasing BD-Live storage" on page 53.
- 3 Set up the Internet connection. Follow the instructions in "Connecting to the Internet" on page 54.
- 4 Test the network connection. Follow the steps in "Testing the Internet connection" on page 60.

## Using BD-Live

### To use BD-Live:

- 1 Select the BD-Live option from the *Special Features Menu* on the Blu-ray Disc, then press **ENTER**. Your TV/Blu-ray combo will display the BD-Live Menu in a few minutes.
- 2 Select the content to download on the previews submenu. The download could take up to 10 minutes, depending on the content size and network speed.

The downloaded content is stored under *My Downloads*. You can choose to either playback or delete the downloaded content.

#### Notes

- Your TV/Blu-ray combo only supports the connection of USB memory in order to fulfill the BD 2.0 1 GB memory requirement.
- Any externally connected drive will become the default storage for BD-Live content, and the internal storage will be ignored.
- You must have the BD-Live disc in your TV/Blu-ray combo to play any related (and already downloaded) content.
- Some BD-Live content could expire and will not play.
- You will occasionally need to manually delete the contents in storage in order to free space. See "Erasing BD-Live storage" on page 53.

## Using Netflix

### Watching movies with Netflix™

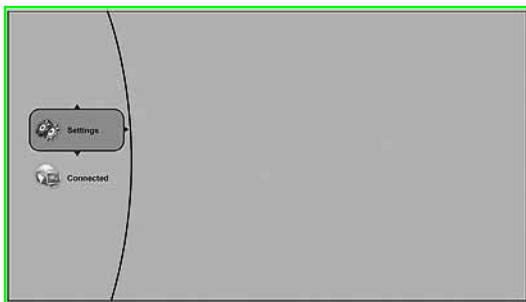
Before being able to view movies with Netflix, you must first:

- Have connected your TV/Blu-ray combo to the Internet and passed the Network Test.
- Have a valid Netflix account

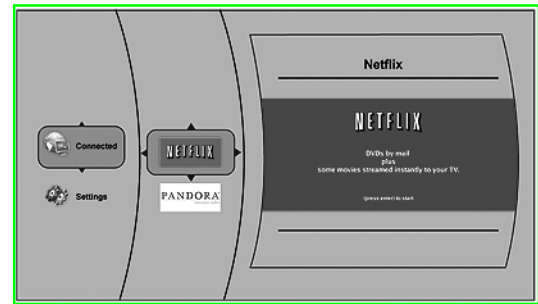
### Registering your TV/Blu-ray combo with Netflix

#### To register your TV/Blu-ray combo with Netflix:

- 1 Press **INPUT**, press ▲ or ▼ to highlight **BLU-RAY**, then press **ENTER**. The *Settings* menu opens.



- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight **Connected**, then press **ENTER**. The *Connected* screen opens.



- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight **NETFLIX**, then press **ENTER**. A message asks "Are you a member of Netflix?"
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight **Yes**, then press **ENTER**.
- 5 Follow the on-screen instructions to activate your TV/Blu-ray combo, and link it to your Netflix account. Your TV/Blu-ray combo will be registered, and you can begin enjoying movies from Netflix.

## Using Pandora

### Listening to radio with Pandora™

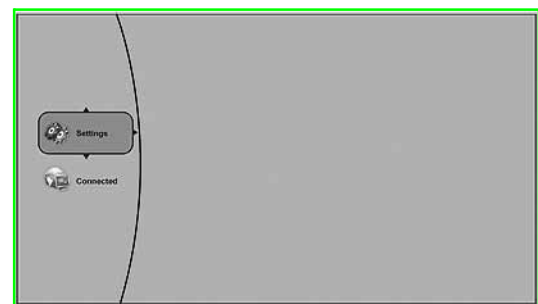
Before being able to listen to radio with Pandora, you must first:

- Have connected your TV/Blu-ray combo to the Internet and passed the Network Test
- Have a valid Pandora account

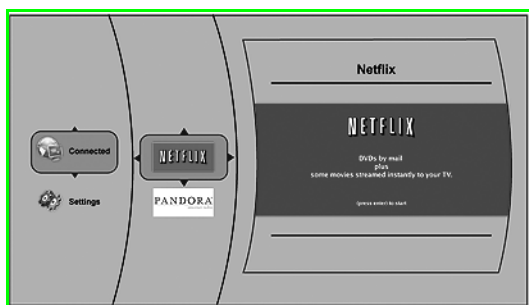
### Registering your TV/Blu-ray combo with Pandora

#### To register your TV/Blu-ray combo with Pandora:

- 1 Press **INPUT**, press ▲ or ▼ to highlight **BLU-RAY**, then press **ENTER**. The *Settings* menu opens.



- Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **Connected**, then press **ENTER**. The *Connected* screen opens.



- Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **PANDORA**, then press **ENTER**.
- Follow the on-screen instructions to activate your TV/Blu-ray combo, and link it to your Pandora account. Your TV/Blu-ray combo will be registered, and you can begin enjoying movies from Pandora.

## Maintaining

### General guidelines

- The top and back panels of your TV/Blu-ray combo may become hot after a long period of use. This is not a malfunction.
- When you are not using your TV/Blu-ray combo, make sure that you remove the disc and put your TV/Blu-ray combo into standby mode.
- If you do not use your TV/Blu-ray combo for a long period of time, it may not function correctly. Turn on and use your TV/Blu-ray combo occasionally.

- Do not locate your TV/Blu-ray combo:
  - Near heating devices or in an enclosed vehicle
  - In an area with a temperature over 95°F (35°C) or humidity over 80%
  - Dirty places
  - In an area with direct exposure to sunlight

### Condensation

Condensation may form inside your TV/Blu-ray combo when:

- You move your TV/Blu-ray combo from a cold area to a warm area
- You use your TV/Blu-ray combo in a cold room where you have just turned on a heater
- Air conditioning is blowing directly on your TV/Blu-ray combo
- Your TV/Blu-ray combo is in a damp place

If condensation forms inside your TV/Blu-ray combo, it will not work correctly. Turn on your TV/Blu-ray combo, remove the disc, and do not use your TV/Blu-ray combo for two to three hours. To minimize condensation problems, keep the power cord connected to a power outlet.

### Storing discs

- Do not store discs in a place that is exposed to direct sunlight or heat.
- Do not store discs in a place that is exposed to moisture and dust, such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in their cases. Stacking discs or placing objects on discs when not in their cases may cause warping.

### Handling discs

- To keep a disc clean, do not touch the play side (non-label side) of the disc.
- Do not attach paper or tape to the disc.



### Cleaning discs

- Before playback, wipe the disc outwards from the center (not in a circle) with a clean cloth.

## Frequently asked questions

Question	Answer
How do I play multi-channel surround sound?	Connect a sound system to the <b>DIGITAL OUTPUT OPTICAL</b> or <b>OUTPUT AUDIO L/ R</b> jacks.
Can I play Blu-ray Discs or DVDs that I bought in another country?	You can play the discs if the video was recorded in standard NTSC format. You cannot play: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Blu-ray Discs that do not have a region code of <b>A</b></li> <li>• DVDs that do not have a region code of <b>1</b> or <b>ALL</b></li> </ul>
What is the best type of video connection I should use?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Composite video provides a good picture.</li> <li>• Component video provides a better picture than composite video.</li> <li>• HDMI video provides the best picture, but it takes longer for an HDMI picture to appear when you first start playing a disc.</li> </ul>
What types of discs will my TV/Blu-ray combo play?	<p>Your TV/Blu-ray combo can play the following discs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Blu-ray Disc-video</li> <li>• DVD-video</li> <li>• CD</li> <li>• DVD-R/RW (DVD video format and DVD video recording format)</li> <li>• DVD-R DL (DVD video format and DVD video recording format)</li> </ul> <p>Your TV/Blu-ray combo can also play CD-Rs and CD-RWs that have been recorded in one of the following standards:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CD-DA</li> <li>• MP3/WMA</li> </ul> <p>You must close the session when you record CDs.</p>

## Power problems

Problem	Solution
No power	<p>Make sure that the power cord is plugged in.</p> <p>If the power is off in your location, check fuses or the circuit breaker.</p> <p>Unplug the TV/Blu-ray combo, then plug it back in.</p>

## Blu-ray Disc problems

Problem	Solution
Remote control does not work	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make sure that you point the remote control at the remote control sensor on the front of your player. For more information, see "Aiming the remote control" on page 11.</li> <li>• Make sure that there is no obstruction between the remote control and the remote control sensor.</li> <li>• Make sure that bright light does not shine on the remote control sensor. Bright light can interfere with signal reception.</li> <li>• Make sure that colored glass is not in front of the remote control sensor. Colored glass can interfere with signal reception.</li> <li>• The batteries may be dead. Replace the batteries.</li> </ul>
TV/Blu-ray combo does not work	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A built-in safety device may have been activated. Press  (power) on the side of your TV/Blu-ray combo to turn it off, then turn it on again. If your TV/Blu-ray combo still does not turn on, unplug the power cord, wait about one minute, plug it in again, then press  (power) on the side of your TV/Blu-ray combo.</li> <li>• Condensation may have formed inside your TV/Blu-ray combo. Turn off your TV/Blu-ray combo and wait about two to three hours for the condensation to evaporate.</li> </ul>
Playback will not start, or playback starts then stops	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If you see , the action you are trying is not allowed by your TV/Blu-ray combo or the disc.</li> <li>• Make sure that the disc is inserted with the label facing forward.</li> <li>• Make sure that the disc is not dirty. To clean the disc, see "Cleaning discs" on page 62.</li> <li>• The disc may be blank or not compatible with your TV/Blu-ray combo. For a list of compatible discs, see "Playable discs" on page 44.</li> </ul>
Startup is slow	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Startup may be slow the first time you plug in the power cord or after a power failure.</li> </ul>
The disc is ejected automatically while playing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make sure that the disc is not dirty. To clean the disc, see "Cleaning discs" on page 62.</li> <li>• The disc may be blank or not compatible with your TV/Blu-ray combo. For a list of compatible discs, see "Playable discs" on page 44.</li> <li>• Try resetting your player. Press <b>POWER</b>, wait five seconds, then press <b>POWER</b> again.</li> </ul>
Your TV/Blu-ray combo is on and displays the start logo and menu, but there is no image from the disc displayed	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make sure that the disc is not dirty. To clean the disc, see "Cleaning discs" on page 62.</li> <li>• Try resetting your player. Press  (power), wait five seconds, then press  (power) again.</li> </ul>

## TV problems


Problem	Solution
Ghosts in picture	Ghosts are caused by the television signal following two paths. One is the direct path and the other is reflected by tall buildings, hills or other large objects. Try changing the direction or position of the antenna to improve the reception.
Picture has spots, streaks, or it flutters	Black spots or horizontal streaks may appear or the picture may flutter or drift because of interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps, or AC-powered tools and appliances, such as drills or hair dryers. Turn off appliances, plug the power cord into another power outlet, preferably on a different circuit, or move your TV/Blu-ray combo to another location.
Picture has snow	If your TV/Blu-ray combo is located far from the TV station, such as in a fringe reception area where the signal is weak, small dots may appear in the picture. If the signal is extremely weak, the installation of a larger external antenna may be necessary.
Radio frequency interference (RFI)	RFI can be caused by two-way radios. This type of interference produces moving ripples or diagonal streaks in the picture. Some cases may cause a loss of contrast in the picture. Changing the direction and position of the antenna or installing an RFI filter may improve the picture.
Slight picture size variations	A slight picture size variation is normal when you adjust the contrast or brightness setting.
Poor or no sound	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The station or cable TV provider may be experiencing problems. Tune to another station.</li> <li>Check volume adjustments or muting.</li> <li>Check for sources of possible interference.</li> </ul>
Poor reception on some channels	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The station or cable TV provider may be experiencing problems. Tune to another station.</li> <li>Station signal is weak. Reorient the antenna to receive stronger reception.</li> <li>Check for sources of possible interference.</li> </ul>
Poor color or no color	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The station or cable TV provider may be experiencing problems. Tune to another station.</li> <li>Make sure that you have scanned for channels. See "Automatically scanning for channels" on page 28.</li> <li>Adjust the picture settings. See "Adjusting the TV picture" on page 25.</li> <li>Check antenna or cable TV connections or reorient the antenna.</li> <li>Check for sources of possible interference.</li> </ul>
Picture wobbles or drifts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The station or cable TV provider may be experiencing problems. Tune to another station.</li> <li>Make sure that you have scanned for channels. See "Automatically scanning for channels" on page 28.</li> <li>The cable TV provider is scrambling the channel.</li> <li>Check the antenna orientation.</li> </ul>
No cable TV reception	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Check all cable TV connections.</li> <li>Set <b>Choose your TV source</b> to <b>Cable</b>. See "Automatically scanning for channels" on page 28.</li> <li>The station or cable TV provider may be experiencing problems. Tune to another station.</li> </ul>
Horizontal or diagonal bars on the screen	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Check antenna connections and try reorienting it.</li> <li>Check for sources of possible interference.</li> </ul>

Problem	Solution
No reception above channel 13	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Make sure that <b>Choose your TV source</b> is set correctly. See "Automatically scanning for channels" on page 28.</li> <li>If using an antenna, check UHF antenna connections.</li> </ul>
Closed captioning does not work	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The TV station is experiencing problems or the program tuned is not closed captioned. Try another channel.</li> <li>Check cable TV connection or VHF/UHF antenna, then reposition or rotate the antenna.</li> <li>Turn on closed captioning in the menu. See "Viewing closed captioning" on page 36.</li> </ul>
Wrong language is displayed	Select the correct language in the menu options. See "Selecting the on-screen menu language" on page 39.
Picture has a few bright or dark spots	A few bright or dark dots on an LCD screen is normal. It does not affect the operation of this TV.

After connecting to the Internet, cannot download a file	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>BD storage may be full. Try clearing storage. For more information, see "Erasing BD-Live storage" on page 53.</li> <li>Make sure that the Internet connection is still working. Try testing the connection. For more information, see "Testing the Internet connection" on page 60.</li> <li>If you are using a USB drive, try a different drive.</li> </ul>
File downloaded successfully, but playback pauses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Make sure that the USB drive is a 2.0 USB device. If the drive is a 1.1 USB device, pausing can occur.</li> </ul>
When playing a file on a USB drive, playback pauses.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Try another USB drive.</li> </ul>

## Other

Problem	Solution
Audio and video pause momentarily.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This occurs normally between playlist chapters or scenes.</li> <li>Video and audio momentarily pause when your TV/Blu-ray combo switches between layers on a dual-layer disc.</li> </ul>
Blu-ray Disc or DVD does not play	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You can play the discs if the video was recorded in standard NTSC format. You cannot play: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Blu-ray Discs that do not have a region code of A.</li> <li>DVDs that do not have a region code of 1 or ALL</li> </ul> </li> <li>Make sure that the disc is not dirty or defective. For more information, see "Cleaning discs" on page 62.</li> <li>Parental controls are blocking the disc because of the rating. Change the parental controls to allow the rating to play. For more information, see "Setting the parental control level" on page 52.</li> </ul>
PIP does not work with a Blu-ray Disc	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Make sure that the Blu-ray disc allows PIP. See the documentation that came with the disc.</li> </ul>
Subtitles do not display	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Subtitles are not recorded on the disc.</li> <li>Turn the subtitles on. For more information, see "Selecting the subtitle language" on page 45.</li> </ul>
Cannot change the viewing angle	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Not all discs are recorded with multiple viewing angles.</li> <li>Not all scenes on a disc are recorded with multiple viewing angles.</li> </ul>
Resume feature does not work	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Resume information is lost when you press  (stop) several times or when you eject the disc.</li> <li>Some discs do not support the resume feature.</li> </ul>
