



Connecting the Microphone(s)




Microphones:

Connect a microphone into MIC Jack 1 1 as well as MIC Jack 2 2 (when desired).

Note: Do not drop or tap the Mic as damage to the Mic or speakers may occur. Do not twirl the microphone cord as it will cause damage to the encased wiring.

Connecting the Unit to a TV



To output the video, lyrics and audio to your TV, perform the following steps:

Connect the RCA video cable (Yellow) to the VIDEO OUT jack and the audio cables (White and Red) to the AUDIO OUT jacks located on the back of the Singing Machine.


Connect the opposite end of the RCA video cable (Yellow) to the VIDEO IN jack and the audio cables (White and Red) to the AUDIO IN on your TV.

Notes:

- This unit can be used with or without a TV.
- · Also refer to the TV's User Guide.
- To see the lyrics on the screen, you must use a CD+G disc or MP3+G files.
- · Audio/Video cables are included.

Connection

Connecting to AC Power



Insert the small end of the AC adapter into the DC IN Jack on the rear of the unit. Insert the other end (with the 2 blades) into a conveniently located AC outlet having 120V AC, 60Hz.

Note: Make all connections before connecting to AC power.

Connecting to LINE IN Jack



Connect an external device by using an appropriate cable (3.5mm audio cable not included) as shown.

Note: See page 17 to select and use the LINE IN function.

Disco Lights



To illuminate the disco light and get your desired lighting effect, slide the Disco Light **DIMMER** slide switch from the MIN position to your desired level.

Playing a CD





- Connect the unit as described previously. Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit on.
- 2 Lift open the CD door and insert a CD (with standard or MP3+G files) or a CD+G by gently pressing it on the center spindle. Then close the CD door.

Notes:

- · What is a CD+G?
 - A CD+G (CD+Graphics) is the standard format for most karaoke discs that will display the words on the screen.
- What is an MP3+G?
 MP3+G is the newest format for karaoke music utilizing the MP3's small file size. It will display the words on the screen. See page 19 to order and download MP3+G files.
- Never place anything other than a CD in the compartment, as foreign objects can damage the unit.
- If no disc is inserted, "NO DISC" will appear on the screen.
- If connected to a TV or other audio source, adjust the volume of the TV using its own volume control.
- Repeatedly press the **FUNCTION** button to select the CDG/CD mode; "READ" will appear when searching the disc and then the total number of tracks will appear.
- Press the Play/Pause ►■ /ENTER button to start playback. If listening to a CD+G file, press the MONITOR ON/OFF button to view the image and lyrics on the screen.

Playing a CD (Continued)



Adjust the volume to a comfortable level using the **MASTER VOLUME** control.



6 Connect microphone(s) as shown on page 5, and slide the **ON/OFF** switch on the microphone to the ON position.



- Adjust the **MIC VOLUME** control as desired. Increasing this control will increase the volume of both microphones.
- Rotate the **ECHO** control to add an echo effect to your voice. Rotate towards MAX to increase the echo effect.
- Adjust the Key using the **KEY +/ ▶** and **KEY -/ ◆** buttons to obtain the best key for the singer.

Playing a CD (Continued)







AUTO VOICE CONTROL can be activated by pressing the AUTO VOICE CONTROL ON/OFF button. The vocals on a multiplex recording will be muted as soon as the singer begins singing into the microphone. When the singer stops singing, the recorded vocals on the multiplex recording will resume to normal.

Note: This is only for files recorded with this multiplex feature.

1 1 Rotate the **BALANCE** control clockwise to hear the recorded vocals with some music in the background or counter-clockwise to hear the music only from a multiplex recording.

Note: To use the **BALANCE** control, a CD+G disc must be used, otherwise it will operate as a standard Balance control.

1 2 SKIP: Advance or go back one track by pressing the Skip ⋈/▲ or Skip ⋈/▼ buttons.

SEARCH: When playing any audio CD, press and hold the Skip ⋈/ ▲ or Skip ⋈/ ▼ button. The CD will search at high speed in the forward or backward direction. Normal play will continue when you release the button.

Note: SEARCH function only works with CD not CD+G discs.

REPEAT: To repeat the current track, press the PROGRAM/REPEAT button once during playback, —1 will appear in the display and the current track will be repeated. To repeat all tracks, press the PROGRAM/REPEAT button again, — will appear. Press again to cancel the Repeat feature; —x will appear.

Playing a CD (Continued)



PROGRAM: You can program up to 20 tracks for playback in any desired order. While in Stop mode, press the PROGRAM/REPEAT button; PROG SET 00:XX (xx is the total tracks) will appear in the display. Select the first track using the Skip ⋈/ ♠ or Skip ⋈/ ▼ buttons, then press the PROGRAM/REPEAT button. Repeat to set up to 20 tracks into memory. When done, press the Play/Pause ▶Ⅲ /ENTER button to start playback.

Note: Press the **Stop** ■/**PAIR** button TWICE to stop and clear the program.



- 15 RECORDING YOUR SINGING:
 Insert a USB drive first, then press
 the RECORD button; the song
 will start over and recording will
 begin. REC with track progress in
 percentage will appear at the top
 left of the screen. When done
 recording, press the RECORD
 button again to stop recording.
 See page 11 to play back your
 recorded files saved in the USB
 flash drive.
- 16 PAUSE: During playback, if you wish to pause the disc momentarily, press the Play/Pause > II /ENTER button. Press again to resume normal playback.
- 1 7 Press the **Stop** ■/**PAIR** button to stop playback.
- Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit off

Playing Songs from the USB



- Connect the unit as described previously. Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit on.
- 2 Insert a USB flash drive into the USB port on the unit so it faces upward.

 Make sure to download music from the Karaoke store, see page 19.



- Repeatedly press the **FUNCTION** button to select the USB mode; "READ USB" will appear when searching the drive and then the total number of files will appear.
- Press the Play/Pause ►■ /
 ENTER button to start playback; if listening to an MP3+G file, press the MONITOR ON/OFF button to view the image and lyrics on the screen.


Note: On the screen, folders that contain recordings and songs appear to the left and the list of tracks from a selected folder will appear to the right. To navigate these folders see page 13 "SKIP" section.



Adjust the volume to a comfortable level using the **MASTER VOLUME** control.

Note: If connected to a TV or other audio source, adjust the volume of the TV using its own volume control.

Playing Songs from the USB (Continued)







- 6 Connect microphone(s) as shown on page 5, and slide the **ON/OFF** switch on the microphone to the ON position.
- Adjust the **MIC VOLUME** control as desired. Increasing this control will increase the volume of both microphones.
- Rotate the **ECHO** control to add an echo effect to your voice. Rotate towards MAX to increase the echo effect.
- Adjust the Key for the song using the **KEY +/ >** and **KEY -/ <** buttons to obtain the best key for the singer.
- AUTO VOICE CONTROL can be activated by pressing the AUTO VOICE CONTROL ON/OFF button. The vocals on a multiplex recording will be muted as soon as the singer begins singing into the microphone. When the singer stops singing, the vocals are automatically unmuted.

Note: This is only for files recorded with this multiplex feature.

Adjust the **BALANCE** control to move the audio from the left to right speaker or vice-versa.

Playing Songs from the USB (Continued)



1 2 SKIP: Advance or go back one file by pressing the Skip ⋈/ ▲ or Skip ⋈/ ▼ buttons. You can also skip ahead 10 files/tracks using the 10+ button.


SEARCH: When playing any audio from the USB, press and hold the **Skip ⋈/** → or **Skip ⋈/** → buttons. The USB will search at high speed in the forward or backward direction. Normal play will continue when you release the button.

During Stop mode you can also select a file using the **Skip I44/** △ or **Skip I>1/** ✓ buttons to scroll up/down and/or the **KEY** +/ → and **KEY** -/ ◀ buttons to scroll right/left. Recorded music will be in the folder labeled, REC.



REPEAT: To repeat the current track, press the PROGRAM/
REPEAT button once during playback, —1 will appear in the display and the current track will be repeated. Press the PROGRAM/
REPEAT button twice, — will appear and all MP3 tracks inside the current folder will be repeated continuously. To repeat all tracks, press the PROGRAM/REPEAT button again, — will appear. Press again to cancel the Repeat feature; — will appear.

Playing Songs from the USB (Continued)









PROGRAM: You can program up to 20 tracks for playback in any desired order. While in Stop mode, press the **PROGRAM/ REPEAT** button: PROG SET 00:XX (xx is the total tracks) will appear in the display. Select the first track using the **Skip ⋈/**▲ or **Skip** ► buttons, then press the **PROGRAM/REPEAT** button. Repeat to set up to 20 tracks into memory. When done, press the Play/Pause ►II /ENTER button to start playback.

Note: Press the **Stop** ■ /**PAIR** button TWICE to stop and clear the program.

PAUSE: During playback, if you wish to pause the music momentarily, press the Play/ Pause ► II /ENTER button. Press again to resume normal playback.


Press the **Stop** ■/**PAIR** button to 6 stop playback.

7 Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit off.

Note: You cannot record from the USB, only from a CD.

Using a Bluetooth Device





- Connect the unit as described previously. Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit on.
- Repeatedly press the **FUNCTION** button to select the Bluetooth; "BLUE TOOTH" will appear on the screen. The screen will show your Bluetooth device is ready to connect with a notification sound. If there is a previously paired Bluetooth device nearby, the unit will connect to it automatically with a successful pairing sound. If no previously paired devices are present, connect as shown in the next step.

Note: You can also press the **Stop** ■/**PAIR** button to disconnect any paired devices in order to pair another device.

Turn on your device's Bluetooth option in settings to search for a discoverable device with a Bluetooth signal. Select "Singing Machine" from the device results on the Bluetooth menu.

Note: Also refer to the user manual of your Bluetooth device for detailed instructions.

The screen will show that your Bluetooth device is connected successfully followed by a paired sound.

Notes:

- If your Bluetooth prompts you for a passcode during the pairing process, please enter "0000" to connect.
- On some Bluetooth devices, once pairing is complete, select your Bluetooth device as "Use as Audio Device" or similar.
- If connection is lost after successful pairing, check to make sure the distance between speaker and Bluetooth-enabled device does not exceed 30 feet/10 meters.

Using a Bluetooth Device (Continued)




To control your Bluetooth device from this unit, press the Play/Pause ►Ⅲ / ENTER button to start playback (music app must be open). Press the Play/ Pause ►Ⅲ /ENTER button during playback to pause the song.





7 Connect microphone(s) as shown on page 5, and slide the **ON/OFF** switch on the microphone to the ON position.





- 9 Rotate the **ECHO** control to add an echo effect to your voice. Rotate towards MAX to increase the echo effect.
- Adjust the **BALANCE** control to move the audio from the left to right speaker or vice-versa.




- **SKIP:** Advance or go back one track by pressing the **Skip** M/ ▲ or **Skip** M/ ▼ buttons.
- 1 2 Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit off.

Note: You cannot record from the Bluetooth device, only from a CD.

Using the LINE IN Jack





2 Connect the external unit to the LINE IN Jack on the front of this unit. Connecting an external unit will allow the audio to be played through your Singing Machine.

Notes:

- It is highly recommended to set the volume on the auxiliary unit to 1/3 or lower to avoid distortion.
- Skipping files/tracks is not possible on this unit when using an external device.



- Repeatedly press the **FUNCTION** button to select the Line In; "LINE IN" will appear on the screen.
- Adjust the volume using the **MASTER VOLUME** control on this unit or your external device's volume control.



5 Connect microphone(s) as shown on page 5, and slide the **ON/OFF** switch on the microphone to the ON position.

Using the LINE IN Jack (Continued)



- Adjust the **MIC VOLUME** control as desired. Increasing this control will increase the volume of both microphones.
- 7 Rotate the **ECHO** control to add an echo effect to your voice. Rotate towards MAX to increase the echo effect.



- Adjust the **BALANCE** control to move the audio from the left to right speaker or vice-versa.
- Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit off.

Note: You cannot record from the LINE IN, only from a CD.

Where to Download MP3+G Files

Helpful Hints:

The .mp3 and .cdg files are delivered for download in a single, compressed MP3+G.zip file. The MP3+G file cannot be played as a .zip file on a USB flash drive. To play karaoke songs using a USB flash drive, the MP3+G .zip file must be unzipped as follows:

- · Connect a USB flash drive to your computer.
- Download the MP3+G file from your Digital Locker and save the .zip file to a folder on your computer.
- Double click the .zip file to open the .zip (you will see the .mp3 and .cdg files).
- Drag and drop the .mp3 and .cdg files to the USB flash drive.
- Remove (eject) the USB flash drive from your computer.

Turn on the Singing Machine and connect the USB flash drive.

- 2 Select and purchase your favorite karaoke music from the Singing Machine Download Store.
- Download your selected purchase(s) from the Singing Machine Digital Locker to your USB flash drive.
- 4 Insert the USB flash drive as shown on page 11 and have fun singing!

Note: Your downloaded songs can also be burned to a blank CDR/CDRW.



Troubleshooting Guide

Should this unit exhibit a problem, check the following before seeking service:

No Power

- Power is not on; press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn power on.
- Confirm that the AC adapter is connected securely to the back of the unit.
- Connect the unit to a different outlet.

No Sound - General

- Master Volume is set to minimum: raise volume.
- Correct Function was not selected; select using the **FUNCTION** button.
- If using an external device, raise the volume.

No Sound - If connected to a TV

- · Volume on the TV is muted or too low.
- Correct source (usually AV) was not selected on the TV's menu.

No sound from the microphone

- Make sure the microphone is firmly connected to the MIC 1 or MIC 2 jack.
- Make sure the mic's **ON/OFF** switch is set to the ON position.
- Make sure the **MIC VOLUME** control is not set too low.
- MASTER VOLUME control is set to minimum; raise volume.

File(s) on USB Jack not playing

- The file is corrupted; replace the file.
- The file is not in a format this unit will play.
- The connected USB device is not supported by the product.

The Bluetooth device cannot be paired or connected with the unit

- You have not activated the Bluetooth function of your device; see page 15 or refer to the Bluetooth device user's manual.
- The system is not in pairing mode; press the $Stop extbf{ extbf{PAIR}}$ button to restart pairing.

The Music is not available on the unit after successfully connecting the Bluetooth

- Ensure your Bluetooth device can support the A2DP Bluetooth profile.
- The volume on the external Bluetooth device is set too low or muted; raise as desired.

The unit will not record

 No USB device inserted, or USB device is full. Move all recordings to your computer to make room.
