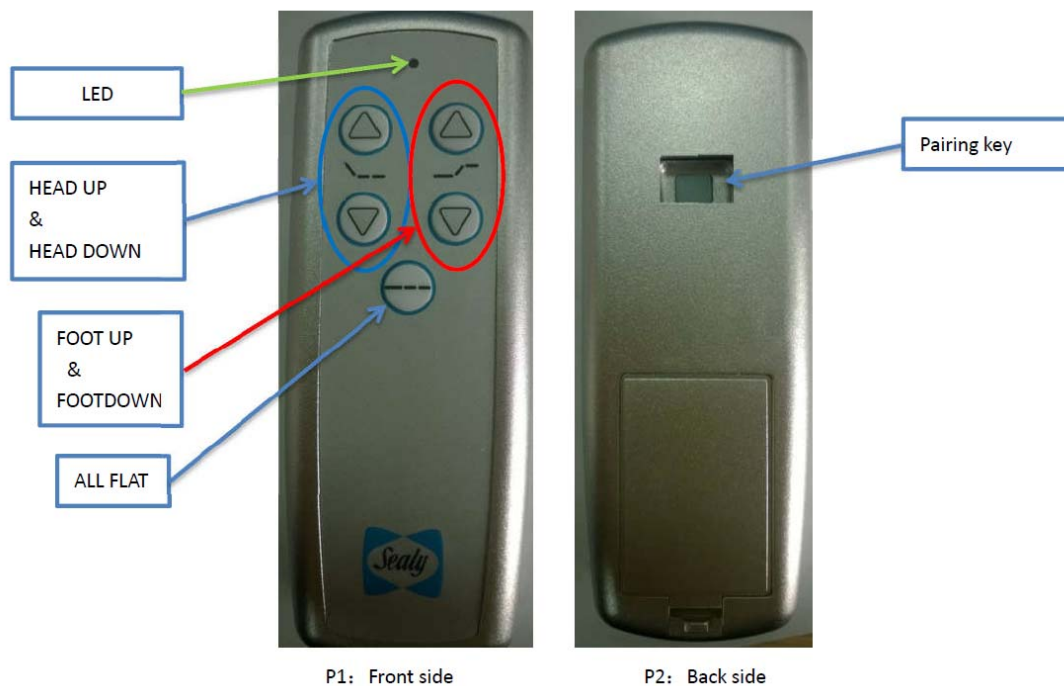

1. Appearance



2. Function description

- HEAD UP:** Press this key, the head actuator out, release to stop it.
- HEAD DOWN:** Press this key, the head actuator in, release to stop it.
- FOOT UP:** Press this key, the foot actuator out, release to stop it.
- FOOT DOWN:** Press this key, the foot actuator in, release to stop it.
- FLAT:** Actuators are moved into FLAT automatically. The movement starts when the key is released. Click any key to stop it.
- Pairing Key:** Press this key for more than 1 second, the remote will enter pairing mode and a blue LED besides the pairing key will flash. Release this key to stop pairing .After

the pairing is successful, LED will stop flashing.

7. **LED** :In unlocked state, the remote can control actuators normally and LED will on when you press any button. In locked state, LED will flash when you press any button which indicates the remote is locked.
8. **Child lock**
Press and hold the **HEAD UP & HEAD DOWN** and the LED will flash by 1Hz at the same time . After 5 times flash, the LED will turn off and the remote will enter into locked mode.
Press the **FOOT UP & FOOT DOWN** , the LED will flash by 1Hz. After 5 times flash, the LED will turn off and the remote will enter into normal mode.
