Unpacking

For the United Kingdom


Important!

Units shipped to the U.K. are designed for operation on 240 volts AC only.

The mains plug must be removed from the wall socket prior to any internal examination.

The wires in this mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

The wires in this mains lead must be connected to the terminals in the plug as follows:



Notes:

- If a 13-amp plug is used, this must be fitted with a 13-amp fuse.
- If a 3-pin plug with earthing contact is used, no wire must be connected to the E terminal.

For Australia and Europe

Important!

Units shipped to Australia are designed for operation on 240 V AC only.

Units shipped to Europe are designed for operation on 230 V AC only.

For other countries

Important!

Units shipped to countries other than the above countries are equipped with an AC voltage selector switch under the turntable platter. Refer to the following paragraph for the proper setting of this switch.


AC voltage selection

This unit operates on 110 - 120 or 220 - 240 volts AC. The AC voltage selector switch under the turntable platter is set to the voltage that prevails in the area to which the unit is shipped. Before connecting the power cord to your AC outlet, make sure that the setting position of this switch matches your line voltage. If not, it must be set to your voltage in accordance with the following direction.

Note:

Our warranty does not cover damage caused by excessive line voltage due to improper setting of the AC voltage selector switch.

Move switch lever to match your line voltage with a small screwdriver or other pointed tool.


IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

Caution: Read this page carefully to ensure safe operation.

Please read all of the safety and operating instructions before operating this unit. For best results, follow all warnings placed on the unit and adhere to the operating and use instructions. These safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

- Power sources The unit should be connected to a power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the appliance.
- 2. Power/cord protection Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, pay particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the unit.

Never pull or stretch the cord.



- Grounding or polarization The precautions should be taken so that the grounding or polarization means of this unit is not defeated.
- Ventilation The unit should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation.

To maintain good ventilation, do not put records or a table-cloth on the unit. Place the unit at least 10 cm away from the walls.


Do not use the unit on a bed, sofa, rug or similar surface that may block the ventilation openings.



 Water and moisture - The unit should not be used near water - for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.




6. Temperature – The unit may not function properly if used at extremely low, or freezing temperatures. The ideal ambient temperature is above +5°C (41°F). Heat - The unit should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other units (including amplifiers) that produce heat.



8. Electric shodk - Care should be taken so that objects do not fall and liquid is not spilled into the enclosure through openings. If a metal object, such as a hair pin or a needle, comes into contact with the inside of this unit, a dangerous electric shock may result. For families with children, never permit children to put anything, especially metal, inside this unit.



Enclosure removal – Never remove the enclosure.
 If the internal parts are touched accidentally, a serious electric shock might occur.



10.Magnetic fields – Keep the unit away from sources of magnetic fields such as TV sets, speaker systems, radios, motorized toys or magnetized objects.



11.Cleaning - Do not use volatile solvents such as alcohol, paint thinner, gasoline, or benzine, etc. to clean the cabinet. Use a clean dry cloth.



12.Carts and stands – An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.




- 13.Nonuse periods The power cord of the unit should be unplugged from the outlet when left unused for a long period of time.
- 14. Abnormal smell If an abnormal smell or smoke is detected, immediately turn the power OFF and pull out the power cord. Contact your dealer or nearest service center.




- **15.Damage requiring service** The unit should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
 - **A.** The power-supply cord or the plug has been damaged; or
 - B. Objects have fallen, or liquid has been spilled into the unit; or
 - C. The unit has been exposed to rain; or
 - **D.** The unit does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance; or
 - **E.** The unit has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged.
- 16.Servicing The user should not attempt to service the unit beyond that described in the operating instructions. All other servicing should be referred to qualified service personnel.

17. Outdoor antenna grounding — If an outside an tenna is connected to the receiver, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode. See Figure.



- **18.Power lines** An outdoor antenna should be located away from power lines.
- 19.AC outlets Do not connect other audio equipment with a power consumption larger than that specified to the AC outlet on the rear panel. Never connect other electrical units, such as an iron or toaster, to it to prevent fire or electric shock.




Notes:

- 3. Item 17 complies with UL in the U.S.A.


Parts nomenclature and assembly

Verify that all of the following parts are present before carrying out the assembly procedures. First, set the EQ ON/OFF switch on the bottom according to the type of your amplifier. (Refer to "Connections" below.)






- Set the turntable platter carefully on the center spindle.
- **2** Using the ribbon tape, engage the drive belt with the motor pulley as shown.



- 3 Remove the ribbon tape.
 - Take care not to twist the drive belt.

■ Replacing the stylus

- Use an N-78 replacement stylus.
- Remove this unit's power cord from the AC outlet before replacing the stylus.
- One stylus is good for playing an LP record approximately 500 times.
- Remove the existing stylus in the order ①→②
- 2 Install the new stylus in the order ①→②







In case of difficulty

What appears to be a malfunction may not always be serious. If your unit should not perform as expected, consult the table below to see if the problem can be corrected before seeking help from your dealer or service representative.

Symptom	Cause	Remedy
No sound from both left and right channels or one channel.	Turntable audio cable are not connected correctly.	Check connections to amplifier.
Loud hum, no music.	Poor connection of turntable audio cables.	Make solid connections to amplifier.
Howling drowns out music when volume is increased.	Speaker vibration picked up by turntable.	Separate turntable from speakers.
Turntable platter does not turn.	Poor AC plug contact. Turntable belt does not engage with the motor pulley.	Check connection. Make sure AC outlet is active. Engage the turntable belt with the motor pulley.
Poor tracking	Excessive dust on record or stylus. Stylus tip wear.	Remove dust from stylus or record. Replace the stylus. (Refer to "Replacing the stylus" on page 7.)
Sound is too low or distorted.	The EQ ON/OFF switch on the bottom is not set correctly.	Set the switch correctly referring to "Connections".

Note:

Do not use contact cleaner because it could cause a malfunction. Be specially careful against contact cleaners containing oil, for they may deform the plastic components.
