Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg.\*

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions specified by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified by the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government-adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.

Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon availability of accessories and FCC requirements. While there may be

differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF emission guidelines. #### Optimize your phone's performance

Use the guidelines in this guide to learn how to optimize the performance and life of your phone and battery.

#### Air Bags

If you have an air bag, DO NOT place installed or portable phone equipment or other objects over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If equipment is not properly installed, you and your passengers risk serious injury.

#### Medical devices

Pacemakers—Warning to pacemaker wearers: Wireless phones, when in the 'on' position, have been shown to interfere with pacemakers. The phone should be kept at least six (6) inches away from the pacemaker to reduce risk.

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association and the wireless technology research community recommend that you follow these guidelines to minimize the potential for interference.

- Always keep the phone at least six inches (15 centimeters) away from your pacemaker when the phone is turned on.
- · Do not carry your phone near your heart.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker.
- If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn off your phone immediately.

Hearing aids—Some digital wireless phones may interfere with hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your service provider or call the customer service line to discuss alternatives.

Other medical devices—If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of the device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to help you obtain this information.

In health care facilities—Turn your phone off in health care facilities when instructed. Hospitals and health care facilities may be using equipment that is sensitive to external RF energy.

#### Potentially unsafe areas

Posted facilities—Turn your phone off in any facility when posted notices require you to do so.

Aircraft—FCC regulations prohibit using your phone on a plane that is in the air. Turn your phone off or switch it to Airplane Mode before boarding aircraft.

Vehicles—RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systlems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer of the device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy.

#### Use with care

Use only in normal position (to ear). Avoid dropping, hitting, bending, or sitting on the phone.

#### Avoid magnetic environments

Keep the phone away from magnets which can cause improper functioning of the phone.

#### Keep your phone dry

Keep the phone dry. Damage can result if the phone gets wet. Water damage is not covered under warranty.

#### Resetting the phone

If the screen seems frozen and the keypad does not respond to keypresses, reset the phone by completing the following steps:

- Remove the battery door.
- Remove and replace the battery.

If the problem persists, return the phone to the dealer for service.

#### Accessories

Use only Kyocera-approved accessories with Kyocera phones. Use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and will invalidate the phone warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the phone.

#### Radio Frequency (RF) energy

Your telephone is a radio transmitter and receiver. When it is on, it receives and sends out RF energy. Your service provider's network controls the power of the RF signal. This power level can range from 0.006 to 0.6 watts.

In August 1996, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for hand-held wireless phones. These guidelines are consistent with the safety standards previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies in the following reports:

- ANSI C95.1 (American National Standards Institute, 1992)
- NCRP Report 86 (National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements, 1986)
- ICNIRP (International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection, 1996)

Your phone complies with the standards set by these reports and the FCC guidelines.

#### E911 mandates

Where service is available, this handset complies with the Phase I and Phase II E911 Mandates issued by the FCC.

#### Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) Features

This phone has received a HAC performance rating (designated by the letter M followed by a number). The rating for this phone is identified on the outside of this phone's original packaging. While there is no guarantee, digital wireless phones that receive a minimum of an M3 rating should provide acceptable performance with most hearing aids. Hearing loss and hearing aids are highly individualized, however, so optimal performance cannot be guaranteed. Other factors, such as type of hearing aid device or degree of hearing loss, also can affect a phone's performance for a particular user.

#### Hearing Aids and Wirelesss Phones

A hearing aid uses a microphone to collect and convert sound waves to electrical signals. The hearing aid then amplifies and converts the electrical signals back to audible sounds for the hearing aid user to hear. Radio Frequency (RF) emissions generated by digital wireless phones often interfere with the operation of a hearing aid's microphone, distorting the amplified audible sound. In addition, hearing aid microphones tend to collect ambient noise and amplify these sounds, interfering with the desired audio transmission.

#### ANSI Standard

To diminish interference between wireless phones and hearing aids, the FCC requires wireless carriers to offer phones that meet the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard for reduced RF emissions. Wireless phones that comply with the FCC's hearing aidcompatibility (HAC) regulations must receive a minimum rating of "M3" for RF emissions under the ANSI C63.19 standard. The "M" rating refers to the

phone's RF emissions level for use with hearing aids operating in the microphone setting.

The higher the phone's "M" rating, the more likely the phone is compatible with a hearing aid operating in the microphone setting. Hearing aids also have ratings similar to wireless phones. Most newer hearing aid models receive at least an M2 rating.

To determine the level of compatibility between your hearing aid and this HAC certified phone, combine the M rating of your hearing aid and the M rating of this phone. For example, if you pair an M3 hearing aid with an M4 phone, you will achieve a combined rating of 7.

- Any combined rating equal to or greater than 6 provides excellent performance.
- Any combined rating equal to 5 offers good performance.
- Any combined rating equal to 4 offers acceptable performance.

T-Ratings—Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch") than unrated phones. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. (Note that not all hearing devices have telecoils in them.)

Hearing devices may also be measured for immunity to this type of interference. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you choose the proper rating for your mobile phone. The more immune your hearing aid is, the less likely you are to experience interference noise from mobile phones.

## **Phone Battery**

#### Install the Battery

To install the battery:

 With the back of the phone facing you, press on the back cover and slide it to the bottom of the phone.



- 2. Lift the back cover from the bottom to remove.
- Place the battery in the phone casing with the metal contacts toward the top of the phone.



4. Align the back cover side tabs with the slots on each side of the phone.

5. Slide the back cover to the top of the phone until it is securely in place.



Note: Before removing the battery, make sure to power off the phone.



#### Charge the Battery

You must have at least a partial charge in the battery to make or receive calls.

To charge the battery:

1. Connect the AC adapter to the microUSB jack on the side of the phone.



2. Plug the adapter into a wall outlet.

The battery icon in the upper-right corner of the screen shows whether the phone is:

- Charging (animated icon)
- Partially charged
- Fully charged

You can safely recharge the battery at any time, even if it has a partial charge.

**Warning:** The battery does not charge if you use the phone while it is connected to an AC adapter.

## **Battery Safety Guidelines**

- Do not disassemble or open the battery.
- Do not crush, bend, deform, puncture, or shred the battery.
- Do not attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery.
- Do not immerse the battery or expose it to water or other liquids. Even if a battery appears to dry out and operate normally, internal parts can slowly corrode and pose a safety hazard.
- Always keep the battery between 15 °C and 25 °C (59 °F and 77 °F). Do not expose the battery to extremes of temperature (heat or cold), fire, or other hazards such as a cooking surface, iron, or radiator.
- Never use any damaged battery.
- Only use the battery for its intended phone.
- Only use the battery with a qualified charger.
   Use of an unqualified battery charger may

- present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. If you are unsure about whether a charger is qualified, contact customer support.
- Do not short-circuit the battery or allow metallic conductive objects—such as keys, coins, or jewelry—to contact the battery's terminals.
- Replace the battery only with another qualified battery. Use of an unqualified battery may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. If you are unsure about whether a replacement battery is compatible, contact customer support.
- Promptly dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations and recycle if possible. Do not dispose as household waste.
- Supervise all battery usage by children.
  - Avoid dropping the phone or battery. If the phone or battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, an internal short-circuit can occur and pose a safety hazard. If you suspect battery damage, take it to a service center for inspection.
- Improper battery use may result in a fire, explosion, or other hazard.

#### **Common Causes of Battery Drain**

- Playing games or using the Web.
- Taking pictures with the flash on.
- · Keeping backlighting on.
- Operating in digital mode when far away from a base station or cell site.
- · Using data cables or accessories.
- Operating when no service is available, or service is available intermittently.
- High earpiece and ringer volume settings.
- · Repeating sound, vibration, or lighted alerts.

#### **Purchase Accessories**

To purchase accessories for your phone, such as a hands-free headset, carrying case, or car power adapter, check with your service provider.

#### Find the Serial Number

To activate your account, you need your phone's serial number.

From Phone info, select My Phone Number to find your phone's serial number.

You can also dial ##6343# from the main screen to display your phone's serial number.

## **Activate your Account**

Before using your phone, you need to activate its service. To activate your account, check with your service provider

## **Program your Phone**

With your account activated, you need to program your phone number into your phone. When ready, follow these steps:

- Turn on your phone.
- Dial #-#-8-4-7-4-4-6-#.
- From Programming, select Activate phone.
- 4. To activate your phone, select **Yes** at the prompt.
- 5. When you phone connects to the network, select Start at the prompt.
- 6. When your phone displays your new phone number, write it down.
- 7. Select Finish to complete the activation process. Your phone restarts by itself.


It may take a couple of hours to set you up on their network. We send you a text message when you can start making calls. It may also take up to 4 hours for VirginXL, Voicemail, and Top-Up features to work.

## **Get to Know your Phone**

The following shows the front of the phone with the slide closed.

- Phone speaker.
- Rewind, Play/Pause, and Fast Forward keys for the music player.
- Phone screen.

- Left option button accesses menus and functions. At the main screen, selecting the left option button displays the main menu.
- Speakerphone key activates the speakerphone and answers calls.




- Sen d key starts or answers calls. Press once to display the recent calls list and twice to redial the last number dialed. Press and hold to activate voice commands.
- Navigation key scrolls through lists and text entry fields and accesses the following shortcuts from the main screen.

- Scroll left to access Tools & Settings.
- Scroll right to access Messaging > Send text msg or Send pic msg.
- Scroll up to access My Account > Balance & usage.
- Scroll down to go to Recent calls > All calls.
- Right option button accesses the contacts list and other menu options. At the main screen, selecting the right option button displays your contacts list.
- Back key erases characters in text entry or returns you to the previous screen when navigating through menus.
- 10. End key turns the phone on and off, ends calls or browser session, and returns you to the main screen.
- OK key selects a menu item or option. At the main screen, pressing the OK key displays the on-screen number keypad.

**Warning:** Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack damages the phone.

The following shows the phone's QWERTY keypad with the slide open.

 Right option button accesses the contacts list and other menu options. 2. Enter key generates a carriage return in text entry.




- Back key erases characters in text entry or returns you to the previous screen when navigating through menus.
- 4. QWERTY keypad.
- 5. Number keypad.
- Sym key enables you to type symbol characters or toggle between alphabets and symbols. Press the Sym key once to change

- the input mode for the next character; press twice (within 2 seconds) to toggle between alphabets and symbols.
- CAP key enables you to press once to change case mode or press twice to toggle between case modes.
- 8. Left option button accesses menus and functions

The following shows the back of the phone with the slide closed.

- 1. Accessory eyelet (for optional straps and lanyards).
- 2. Jack for AC adapter (included) and microUSB cable (sold separately).

3. Jack for a hands-free headset (sold separately).



- 4. Memory card slot.
- 5. Camera lens.
- Camera key activates Camera mode. To activate camera mode, press and hold the Camera key.
- 7. Volume key raises or lowers ringer volume.

**Warning:** Inserting an accessory into the wrong jack may damage the phone.

#### **Guide Conventions**

In this guide, the following conventions are used when describing phone features.

Select means to press the Left softkey, Right softkey or OK key to select an item seen on the display. For example, "Select Menu" tells you to physically press the left softkey to choose Menu from the display.

Press means to press a phone key. For example, "Press the Send key to make a phone call" tells you to physically press the Send key on your phone.

Scroll means to use the Navigation key to move though a list on the display. For example, "Scroll through your contacts list to choose a contact" means to physically press the Navigation key up or down to scroll through the list on the display.

- > (greater than symbol) tells you to select an option from a menu or list. For example, "Menu > Tools & Settings" means to:
- 1. Press the left softkey to select Menu.
- 2. Scroll to the Tools & Settings option.
- Press the OK key to select Tools & Settings.

## **Power Phone Up**

- To turn your phone on, press the End key and wait until the phone display lights up.
- To turn your phone off, press and hold the End key until the phone plays a musical chime and turns off.

#### Make Phone Calls

Make sure you are in an area where a signal can be received. Look for the signal strength icon on the home screen. The more bars, the stronger the signal. If there are no bars, move to where the signal strength is better.

When the phone has been idle for a time, it changes to power save mode. When you see "Power Save" on your phone's screen, press any key to return to normal operating mode.

There are several ways you can make a phone call.

#### Call Using a Number

- 1. Enter a phone number.
- 2. Press the Send key.

## Call Using a Contact

- From Find name, highlight a contact.
- Press the Send key.

#### **Call Using Voice Commands**

You can use voice commands to call a contact from your voice dial list or to dial a phone number. For more information, see "Voice Commands" on page 76.

#### Redial a Number

- 1. Press the Send key twice to open your call history.
- Highlight a phone number or contact and press the Send key.

**Note:** To redial the last number called, received or missed, press the **Sen d** key three times.

#### Answer Phone Calls

When a call comes in, the phone rings, vibrates, or lights up. The phone number of the caller also appears if it is not restricted. If the number is stored in your contacts list, the contact's name appears. There are several ways you can answer a phone call.

#### **Answer Using Earpiece**

Press the Send key.

## **Answer Using Speakerphone**

Press the Speakerphone key.

## **Answer Using Slide**

You can set the phone to answer immediately when you open the slide. This feature does not apply to incoming data calls. For more information, see "Enable Open to Answer" on page 69.

#### **End Phone Calls**

Press the End key.

## Activate Voice Dialing

- 1. Press and hold the Send key.
- 2. Follow the prompts.

For more information, see "Voice Commands" on page 76.

#### Volume Control

#### Adjust Volume during a Call

Press the Volume key up or down to adjust the earpiece volume during a call.

## Use the Speakerphone

Your phone has a built-in speakerphone.

• To turn on the speakerphone, press the **Speakerphone** key. The speakerphone icon

- appears on the home screen when the speakerphone is on.
- To turn off the speakerphone, press the **Speakerphone** key again.

**Note:** If you press the **Speakerphone** key during an incoming call, you will answer the call.

## Silence an Incoming Call

- To silence the phone without answering the call select Silence, press the Back key, or press the Volume key.
- To silence the phone and answer the call, select Silence and then press the Send key.

Note: In the absence of voicemail, this feature drops the call.

## **Use Speed Dialing**

Speed dialing allows you to assign a one- or two-digit shortcut to a contact. Before you can use speed dialing you must save a phone number as a contact and assign a speed dial location to it. See "Assign Speed Dials to Contacts" on page 30.

To call a contact that has a speed dial location.

- Enter the one- or two-digit speed dial location.
- Press the Send key.

## **Emergency Services**

#### Call Emergency Service

You can call an emergency code, even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted. When you call, your phone enters emergency mode. This enables the emergency service exclusive access to your phone to call you back, if necessary. To make or receive regular calls after dialing the code, you must exit this mode.

To place dial an emergency code:

- 1. Enter your 3-digit emergency code.
- Press the Send key.

Note: Regardless of your 3-digit emergency code (911, 111, 999, 000, etc.), your phone operates as described.

#### Exit Emergency Services

When you have completed the emergency call:

- Select Exit.
- 2. Select Exit again to confirm your choice.



## 3 Text Entry

You can enter letters, numbers, and symbols in contacts, text messages, and your banner.

## **Text Entry Modes**

The text entry screen has the following features:



- Characters remaining that you can type.
   Allowed length of messages can vary depending on your service.
- 2. Text entry fields.
- 3. Current capitalization setting.
- Current text entry mode.

Note: The mode you start in depends on the task you are doing. For example, when entering a phone number, you're in a number mode. When entering a name for a contact, you're in a letter mode.

## Enter Numbers with QWERTY Keypad

At a text entry field, select **Options > Numbers Only** and press the number key to enter your number.

The 123 icon indicates you are in Numbers Only mode. Press the Sym key twice quickly (within two seconds) to change modes. Press the Sym key once to change the mode for the next character only.

## Enter Letters with QWERTY Keypad

At a text entry field, select Options > Normal Alpha to enter letters. You can enter text in the following ways:

- To enter a letter, press the key for the letter. If your phone is set to Spanish, French, or Portuguese, accented letters are available. Press and hold the key to select accented letters. Press the CAP key to change the case of a letter. Press the CAP key twice quickly (within two seconds) to change case modes. Press the Space key to enter a space.
- To enter a number or symbol, press the Sym key and the key for the number or symbol.

The abc icon indicates that you are in Normal Alpha mode. Press the Sym key twice quickly (within two seconds) to change modes. Press the

Sym key once to change the mode for the next character only.

## Rapid Entry with QWERTY Keypad

At a text entry field, select **Options > Rapid**Entry to speed up word completion. To enter
words, press a key once. For example, to enter
the word "Wyoming" press the w > y > o keys and
then the **OK** key.

The e∠i icon indicates you are in Rapid Entry mode. To change case mode, press the CAP key.

## **Enter Symbols with QWERTY Keypad**

- While entering text in Normal Alpha mode, do one of the following to enter symbols displayed on your keypad:
  - Press and hold the Sym key while entering the symbols.
  - Press the Sym key and then the key for the symbol.
- While entering text in Normal Alpha mode, do the following to access the full set of symbols:
  - a. Select Options > Add symbol.
  - b. Scroll up or down to view the list of symbols.
  - c. Press the letter key corresponding to the symbol to enter it.

   You can message up to ten recipients at once. Use comma or spaces to separate addresses.
- 2. Enter the message. (Select **Options** to access more features.)
- 3. When done, select Sen d.

## Create a Multimedia Message

You can only send multimedia messages to phone numbers capable of receiving them or to email addresses. When you reach the character and file size limit for a single multimedia message, you must edit the message to meet the size limitation.

Note: Multimedia messaging is not available on all phones. Check with your service provider.

- From Send pic msg, enter a recipient's phone number or email address. (Select Options to access contacts, groups or recently used addresses. Scroll down to move to the next field when done.)
  - You can message up to ten recipients at once. Use comma or spaces to separate addresses.
- Repeat the first step for CC and BCC, if needed
- 3. Enter a subject.
- 4. Enter a message.

## Create an Instant Message

From Send IM, you can send instant messages (IMs) from your phone if supported.

## Create an Email Message

From Send email, you can send email messages from your phone if supported.

Check with your service provider for availability and pricing.

## Receive Calls while Creating Messages

If you receive a call while creating a message a notification appears. Do the following:

- Select Ignore to not answer the call, but return to the message screen.
- Press the Send key to answer the call and save the message to Drafts.

- Select Immediate or Set Time to set a specific time to send the message.
- 3. Press the **OK** key to change the time.
  - Scroll left or right to move between the hour, minute, and AM/PM.
  - Scroll up or down to change the hour, minute, and AM/PM.
- Select Next.
- Press the OK key to change the date.
  - Scroll left or right to move between the month, day, and year.
  - Scroll up or down to change the month, day, and year.
- 6. Select Done.
- Complete your message. Your phone saves the message and sends it later.

#### Set the Slide Interval

- When entering the message, select Options > Msg settings > Slide interval.
- 2. Select a time interval for the slides.
- Complete your message.

# Handle Received Messages Reply to Text Messages

When receiving a message, your phone displays a notification and the message icon appears at the

top of your screen. The message icon flashes with an urgent message alert if the message is urgent.

- When a message notification appears, select Inbox (to view the message) or Ignore (to clear the notification).
  - An icon appears at the top of your screen when you have an unread message.
- From Inbox, highlight a message and select View > Reply (to compose your message) or Options (to access more features).
- Complete your message and select Send.

## Reply to Multimedia Messages (with Auto Retrieve)

When receiving a message in auto retrieve mode, your phone automatically downloads it with a notification.

Note: If receiving a message during a call, the phone downloads the message after the call.

- At a message notification, select View (to view the message) or Later (to check it later).
- After viewing the message, select Reply or Options > Reply if the message has more than one slide.
  - Select **Options** to access more features.
- 3. Complete your message and select Send.

## Reply to Multimedia Messages (with Prompt)

When receiving a message in prompt mode, your phone displays a notification showing a new message is available for download.

- At a download notification, select Yes (to download the message) or Options (to retrieve it later or erase it without downloading).
- At the message notification, select View (to view the message) or Later (to check it later).
- Select Reply or Options > Reply if the message has more than one slide.
   Select Options to access more features.
- 4. Complete your message and select **Send**. Select **Options** to access more features.

## Forward Messages

- When viewing a received message, select Options > Forward.
- Enter a number or address.
- 3. Complete your message and select Send.

## Reply to all Recipients

- When viewing a received message, select
   Options > Reply all to send your reply to
   all the message recipients.
- 2. Complete the message and select Send.

## Reply with a Copy of the Message

- When viewing a received message, select Options > Reply with copy.
   The original message appears in your reply message.
- Complete your message and select Send.

## Call a Number in a Message

When viewing a received message, select **Options** > Call to call a valid number in the message.

## Save Received Messages

When viewing a received message, select Options
> Save message to save it to Saved.

## View Recipients

When viewing a received message, select **Options** > **Recipients** to check all recipients of the message.

#### View Sender Information

When viewing a received message, select **Options** > **Sender** to view an existing contact, add to an existing contact, or create a new contact depending on the sender.

## Lock Messages

When viewing a received message, select **Options** > Lock msg to protect it from accidental deletion. To unlock the message, select **Options** > Unlock msg.

#### Sort Messages in Inbox

- 1. From Inbox, select Options > Sort.
- 2. Select a sort option.

## Go to Web Addresses in Messages

When viewing a received message, select **Options** > Launch browser to go to a web address included in the message.

#### Handle Attached Files

#### **Play Attached Files**

When viewing a received message with files attached, select Options > Play (to play an attached file), Stop (to stop playing), or Mute (to turn off the sound).

#### Save Attached Files

When viewing a received message with files attached, select the applicable save option to save the attached files, including graphics, sounds, contacts (vCard), or events (vCal). For example, to save a contact, select Options > Save contact

#### View Messages with Multiple Slides

When viewing a received message containing multiple slides, use the following options to navigate through the slides.

- Next to view the next slide.
- Options > Replay to restart the message from the beginning slide.
- Options > Pause to pause at the current slide.
- Options > Resume to resume playing the slides.
- Options > Done to exit the message.

#### View Message Information

When viewing a received message, select Options > Message info to view the message priority, sent time, size, and so on.

#### Replay Messages

When viewing a received message, select **Options** > **Replay** to restart the message (including a slide or sound if contained) from the beginning.

#### **Use Voicemail**

## Configure your Voicemail

Before your phone can receive voicemail messages, you must set up a password and record a personal greeting with your service provider. When you have set up your voicemail, all unanswered calls to your phone are automatically

transferred to voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off.

- Press and hold the 1 key.
- Follow the system prompts to create a password and record a greeting.

## Check your Voicemail

When receiving a voice message, a notification appears with a voicemail message icon at the top of your screen.

- At the voicemail notification, select Call to call your voicemail number and follow the system prompts to retrieve the message.
   Select Ign ore to clear the notification without checking messages. The notification icon still remains on top of the screen.
- When only the voicemail message icon appears on top of the screen, select
   Voicemail and follow the system prompts to retrieve the message.

Note: For the phone to remind you of voicemails, set the phone to beep or vibrate every five minutes. For more information, see .

## **Handle Sent Messages**

#### Check Message Status in Sent

Use the following symbols to check **Sent** for the status of messages successfully sent.

	The scheduled message will be sent at the scheduled time. You cannot cancel delivery of the message.
	The message was sent. You cannot cancel delivery of the message.
<b>V</b>	The message has been received.
	The message has been sent to more than one recipient.

#### Check Message Status in Outbox

Use the following symbols to check Outbox for the status of messages sent but still in process.

R	The message is pending and will be sent when possible. You can cancel delivery of the message.
X	The message cannot be sent because service is not available. An alert appears on your phone if the message cannot be sent.

#### **Unable to Send Messages**

You may not be able to send or receive messages if your phone's memory is nearly full, or if digital service is not available at the time. To free up memory, erase old messages. See "Erase Messages" on page 26.

## Appended Messages

If you go over the character limit for a single message, the phone may automatically append an empty segment to your message to make space.

**Warning:** Your service provider may charge you for each message segment.

When you start a message, the maximum character limit appears once you are in the message entry field. This number counts down as you enter characters, until it reaches 0.

If you continue to enter text after this counter reaches 0, a message segment may be appended. When you reach the message size limit, you are prompted to edit the message or alerted that the message is being appended.

**Note:** Appended messages may not be available on all phones. Check with your service provider.

#### **Handle Alerts**

- 1. From Alerts, select an alert.
- Select Connect to launch the browser or Erase to delete the alert.

## Message Settings

The following message settings affect all messages unless you change them for individual messages.

## Set your TXT Tone

- From TXT tone, select a ringtone from the list to alert you when you receive a new message. (Scroll through the list to hear the different ringtones.)
- Follow the prompts to assign the ringtone to all incoming messages for all or specific numbers in your selected contact or group.

## Set your Reminder

From Reminder, select On to enable a reminder beep to sound every five minutes until you address the message alert.

#### Set your Signature

Your created signature appears at the end of all outgoing messages.

- 1. From Signature, enter your signature.
- 2. Select **OK** to save the signature.

**Note:** Your signature counts in the total characters of your messages.

#### **Edit Preset Messages**

Your phone comes with preset messages, such as "Please call me," which you can insert into the

body of a text message. You can edit or create up to 40 preset messages.

- From Edit auto text, do one of the following:
  - Scroll to a preset message and select Edit.
  - Select New msg to create a new preset message.
- Enter or edit the text.
- Select Save.

**Note:** You can also save messages you have written or received as preset messages.

#### **Enable Auto Retrieve**

From Auto retrieve, select one of the following:

- Disabled turns off auto retrieve and prompts you before downloading any multimedia messages.
- Enabled turns on auto retrieve to automatically download multimedia messages.

#### Enable CC/BCC Fields

From CC and BCC, select Disabled (to hide the CC and BCC fields) or Enabled (to show them).

#### **Enable Save to Sent**

From Save to sent, select Enabled (to automatically save outgoing messages to the Sent folder) or User Confirmation (to choose whether to save them when sending them).

#### **Enable Auto-Erase**

Use Auto-erase to set your phone to erase messages automatically when needing memory for incoming messages.

From Auto-erase, select one of the following:

- · Disable d erases no messages.
- Inbox msgs erases old messages in Inbox when memory is needed.
- Sent msgs erases old messages in Sent when memory is needed.
- Both erases old messages in both Inbox and Sent when memory is needed.

#### Set Default Text

You can change the default text entry mode when creating a text message. This setting applies only to the Message field, not the Send To field.

From Text entry, select Normal alpha (to enter text letter by letter) or Rapid mode (to enter text with word recognition).

#### Set your Voicemail Number

Often your service provider automatically programs your voicemail number (the number your phone calls to retrieve voicemail). To change it:

- 1. From Voicemail number, select Edit.
- Enter your voicemail number. (Use Options
   Time pause or Hard pause to enter pauses.)
- Select Save.

## **Erase Messages**

Erasing old messages frees up memory in your phone. You can erase messages as you send or read them, erase them one at a time, or erase them all at once.

## Erase a Single Message

When viewing a received message, select **Options** > Erase > Yes

**Note:** You can erase a scheduled message, but cannot cancel its delivery.

#### Erase Messages from a Folder

From Erase msgs, select a folder to erase messages from. For example, to erase received messages, select Inbox > Yes.

Note: You cannot recover deleted information.

#### **Erase All Messages**

From Erase msgs, select All > Yes to erase all messages from all folders, except for voicemail messages.

Note: You cannot recover deleted information.

Your account information appears with Top-Up information relative to your selected plan. When your account is low or empty, you receive a notification to Top-Up.

# Top-Up your Account

Top-Up is how you add money to your account. You can Top-Up your account right from your phone. First, buy a Top-Up card at the thousands of retailers that carry them or register your debit card, credit card, or PayPal account.

When your balance is low, you can Top-Up your account from your phone account from your phone.

**Note:** Additional charges may apply for multiple balance checks in one day. Check with your service provider for more details.

# Top-Up with a Top-Up Card

- From the main menu, select My Account.
- Scroll down to the Top-Up link and press the OK kev.
- 3. Enter your Account Pin (vKey) and press the **OK** key.
- 4. Scroll down to select Login and press the OK key.
- 5. Enter your Top-Up card's PIN number and press the **OK** key.
- 6. Scroll down to select Top-Up Now and press the OK key.
- 7. You are now topped up. Press the End key to exit.

#### Set Auto Off Duration

Use Auto off to set the duration for which your phone is paused or stopped before automatically turning off Media Player. From Auto off, select one of the following:

- 10 minutes automatically turns off Media Player after the phone pauses or stops for 10 minutes.
- 20 minutes automatically turns off Media Player after the phone pauses or stops for 20 minutes.
- Off never automatically turns off Media Player.

#### Enable BT headset

Use BT headset to pair your Bluetooth device with Media Player. Refer to "Pair with a Device" on page 60 for more information.

# Camera Tips

Your phone comes with a camera. Before using your phone's camera, here are some tips:

- You cannot activate the camera while on an active call or while browsing files in the media gallery.
- · Once the camera is active, the home screen acts as the viewfinder.
- · If you get a "Low memory" error, check your resolution and quality compression settings.
- If there is no activity within 45 seconds after you turn your camera on, the camera quits and returns to the previous launch point.
- Menu settings and options can only be accessed when the camera is active.
- Numbers in the top right corner indicate the number of snapshots remaining before the phone runs out of memory.

### Take a Picture

- To activate the camera, press and hold the Camera key. You can also select Pictures from the main menu.
- Focus on the image using the phone's display as a viewfinder.
- To take a picture, press the OK key. You can also select Capture. The picture is saved to My pictures.

- 4. Select Send and one of the following:
  - Via MMS msg to attach the file to a multimedia message.
  - Via bluetooth to send the file to a Bluetooth-enabled device.
  - To printer to print the file on a Bluetooth-enabled device.

Select Erase to delete the picture from your phone.

5. Press the End key to exit camera mode.

# Go to My pictures

From camera mode, select Options > Camera images to see all of the pictures you have taken. These are located in My pictures.

# Camera Options

### Camera Settings for Pictures

### Adjust the Resolution

From camera mode, select Options > Settings > Resolution and a size for your pictures.

Numbers in the bottom left corner indicate the current resolution setting.

#### Set Self Timer

From camera mode, select **Options** > **Settings** > **Self timer** and a time.

The \int icon indicates the timer is activated. When you take a picture, a beep plays three seconds from the time the shutter snaps the picture.

### **Enable Date/Time Stamp**

From camera mode, select Options > Settings > Date/Time > On to place a date/time stamp each picture taken.

The oicon indicates when the date/time stamp is on.

#### **Enable Multishot Mode**

From camera mode, select **Options** > **Settings** > **Multishot** > **On** to take multiple pictures.

The indicates multishot mode is enabled. When you take a picture, press and hold the OK key to take multiple pictures. A single tone plays for each picture taken.

Your camera is set to a lower resolution during multishot mode. The resolution setting returns to the previous setting when you are done.

#### Set Shutter Sound

- 1. From camera mode, select **Options** > **Settings** > **Shutter sound**.
- Select a sound to play when the shutter takes a picture.

#### Set White Balance

- From camera mode, select Options > Settings > White balance.
- Scroll left or right to select the white balance setting. Look at the viewfinder to see how each setting looks.

#### Set Color Tone

- From camera mode, select Options > Settings > Color tone.
- Scroll left or right to select a color tone. Look at the viewfinder to see how each setting looks.

### Set Picture Quality

### Surf the Web

#### Launch Browser

Select Surf the Web to launch the browser. An alert appears notifying of airtime fees, if you have enabled web alerts. Select OK to continue. For more information, see .

If this is the first time you have connected to the Internet, a message informs you that security is not yet enabled for your browser. Select Yes to enable security.

#### Browse the Web

When you are connected, a browser home page appears. It has a list of bookmarks and some browser menu options at the bottom of the screen. The lock icon appears in a secure session. You can do the following:

- To choose a site, scroll to the link and press the OK key.
- An underline and an arrow indicate that there is more text. Scroll down to view more text.
- Press the Back key to return to the previous screen.

- · Press the End key to exit.
- Select Options to access more browser features.

#### Add a Bookmark

- 1. From a Web page you want to bookmark, select Options > Add to Bookmarks.
- Modify the details of the bookmark, if needed.
- 3. Select Options > Save to save the bookmark.

To access you saved bookmarks, select Options > Bookmarks from any web page.

### Search the Web

From Web, select Search to go directly to the browser's search page.

### **Bluetooth**

The Bluetooth® wireless technology (not available on all phones) enables wireless connectivity with accessories such as portable or installed hands-free car kits, headsets, handsets, computers, and so on. For details, check with your service provider.

You must use a Bluetooth device (compatible with Class 2 Bluetooth wireless technology, version 1.2) in order to use this phone wirelessly. Bluetooth accessories display a symbol on your phone.

#### **Enable Bluetooth**

You must turn on your phone's Bluetooth feature to use it with Bluetooth devices.

From Settings, select On/Off > On to allows other devices to find your phone.

When you turn on Bluetooth the first time, you need to find your device before pairing with it.

### Pair with a Device

You must first "pair" your phone with the Bluetooth device to allow your phone to communicate with it. Use the following instructions for setting up Bluetooth with the user guide provided for your Bluetooth device.

- Prepare the Bluetooth device (accessory) for pairing as described in the other device's user guide.
- From My devices, select Find new. Your phone then searches and detects the visible Bluetooth devices in the vicinity.
   You must turn on Bluetooth to do a search.
- At the device list, highlight a device and select Add.

60 Bluetooth

With pairing initiated from another Bluetooth device, you need to accept or reject the pairing.

 If necessary, enter the password provided in the Bluetooth device's user guide and select OK.

Your phone waits for the device's response. With the password accepted, the device appears in your device list.

#### Use Bluetooth Devices

#### Connect to a Device

Before you can use Bluetooth, you must get your phone ready to communicate with a device, called "connecting."

To connect your phone to a Bluetooth device, from My devices, highlight a device and select Connect.

A notification appears confirming the connection. You can now use the device with your phone.

#### Disconnect from a Device

From My devices, highlight a connected device and select Disconnect.

#### Rename a Device

- 1. From My devices, highlight a device.
- Select Options > Rename.
- Enter a new name and select Save.

#### Delete a Device

You can delete a Bluetooth device that you have paired your phone with.

- From My devices, highlight a device.
- 2. Select Options > Delete > Yes.

#### View Device Services

A Bluetooth device paired with your phone may have more than one service profile (such as Headset, Handsfree, and so on). Do the following to check the services available:

- 1. From My devices, highlight a device.
- 2. Select Options > Services.
- 3. At the service list, highlight a profile and select Connect to change the active profile.

#### Turn on or off Bluetooth

### Change Phone's Name

You can change the name presented for other Bluetooth devices' search of your phone.

- 1. From Settings, select Device name.
- 2. Enter a new name and select Save.

#### Enable OBEX Authentication

From Settings, select OBEX authentication >

With object exchange (OBEX) authentication enabled, you need a user name and password to transfer files via Bluetooth.

### **View Supported Services**

From Settings, select Device info to view a list of the Bluetooth service profiles your phone supports.

### **Graphics**

Graphics stores your preloaded and downloaded graphics. You can download wallpapers and screensavers to your phone from the Web site or directly from your phone. Charges apply.

### Download a Graphic

Before downloading, make sure you have enough money in your account; otherwise you can Top-Up your account.

- From Graphics, select Get more graphics and search for a graphic.
- 2. Follow the prompts to purchase and download the selected graphic.

### Assign a Graphic

- From Graphics, browse the Wallpapers, Screen savers, My pictures or other graphic folders.
- 2. From a file list, select a graphic.
- Select Assign and choose how you want to assign the graphic.
- 4. Complete the appropriate task.

#### Set Main Menu View

From Menu style, select one of the following:

- **Grid** displays icons of each menu item, with its name at the top of the screen.
- · List displays a list of all menu items.

The next time you view the Menu, your selected menu style appears.

#### Set Theme

From Themes, select a color theme for the display background.

# Set My Banner

The banner is the personal label for your phone, appearing on the home screen above the time and date

- 1. From Greeting banner, select Edit.
- 2. Press the Back key to clear the current banner.
- Enter your new text (no more than 14 characters) or press the Space key for a blank banner.
- Select Save.

### Set Language

From Language, select a language.

### Set Backlight

Use Backlight to minimize the bright time and maximize the battery life.

From Backlight, select one of the following:

- Display duration sets the duration of the display backlighting.
- Keypad duration sets the duration of the keypad backlighting.

### Set Display Duration

From Backlight, select Display duration and one of the following:

- Always dim forces the backlight to remain dim before turning off.
- 7 Seconds, 10 seconds, 15 seconds, or 30 seconds turns backlighting on for the set time after your last keypress.
- Always bright forces the backlight to remain bright before turning off.

### **Set Keypad Duration**

From Backlight, select Keypad duration and one of the following:

- Always dim forces the backlight to remain dim before turning off.
- 7 Seconds, 10 seconds, 15 seconds, or 30 seconds turns backlighting on for the set time after your last keypress.
- Always bright forces the backlight to remain bright before turning off.

### **Enable Auto-Hyphenation**

Auto-hyphenation, when enabled, automatically inserts hyphens into your phone numbers to be consistent with the U.S. dialing plan (or the North American Numbering Plan).

From Auto-hyphen, select Enabled to turn on auto-hyphenation.

#### Set Time and Date Format

From Time/Date format, select a time and date format

# Set Brightness

- From Brightness, scroll to change the brightness level.
- 2. Select Save.

### Sounds

Your phone has several settings that control the sound. You can select from a variety of ringers and control the volume.

### Ringers

You can change the ringer for your phone. You can also assign ringers for different tasks.

### Set your Ringtone

Use My ringtones to set your ringtone with a preloaded or downloaded ringtone. See "My ringtones" on page 34 for more information.

### Set your Business Ringtone

Use Business ringtones to set the ringtone for your business group contacts with a preloaded or downloaded ringtone. See "My ringtones" on page 34 for more information.

### Set your Personal Ringtone

Use Personal ringtones to set the ringtone for your personal group contacts with a preloaded or downloaded ringtone. See "My ringtones" on page 34 for more information.

### Set your TXT Tone

Use TXT tone to set your text message ringtone with a preloaded or downloaded ringtone. See "My ringtones" on page 34 for more information.

# Set Flip Sounds

- From Flip sounds, select Flip open or Flip close.
- Select a sound. (Scroll down the list to play the sounds.)

#### Set Power On/Off Sounds

- 1. From Pwr on/off sound, select Power on sound or Power off sound.
- Select a sound to play when your phone powers on or off. (Scroll down the list to play the sounds.)

## Convenience

Use Convenience to make your phone more convenient to use.

#### Set Date and Time

In Airplane mode, you can set the time and date manually.

Note: You can only access Set time/date with Airplane mode enabled.

- 1. From Set time/date, do the following to change the date:
  - Scroll left or right to move between the month, day, and year fields.
  - Scroll up or down to change the month, day, and year.
- Press the OK key to save the date.
- 3. Do the following to change the time:
  - Scroll left or right to move between the hour, minute, and AM/PM fields.
  - Scroll up or down to change the hour, minute, and AM/PM.
- Press the OK key to save the time.
- 5. Select Done.

## **Enable Airplane Mode**

While in an airplane, it is normally required that you turn off your mobile phone because it emits RF signals that interfere with air traffic control. In airplane mode, however, your phone does not emit RF signals. You cannot make or receive calls, send text messages, use the Browser or Bluetooth, but you can play games, use the Scheduler, set the clock, and make emergency calls to designated emergency numbers. Please check with uniformed personnel before operating your phone in Airplane mode.

From Airplane mode, select Enabled > OK to activate airplane mode.

With airplane mode enabled, you can also set the time and date manually.

## Auto keyguard

### **Enable Auto Keyguard**

Use Auto keyguard to automatically lock the keypad after 30 seconds of inactivity to prevent accidental key presses.

From Auto keyguard, select Enable or from the home screen, press and hold the Back key.

### Unlock Keyguard

From the home screen, select Unlock and press the **OK** key to unlock the keypad.

## Call Contact using Fast Find

- 1. From Fast find, select Enabled to turn on fast find
- From the home screen, press the keys corresponding to the letters of the name you want to find. A matching contact or speed dial entry appears.

## Enable Frequent List

#### Enable Hold Call

Use Hold call to place incoming calls on hold until you are ready to answer them.

Note: The Hold Call feature will not work if the Open to Answer feature is enabled. See "Enable Open to Answer" on page 69.

- From Hold call, select Enabled.
   If you have not recorded a hold message, you need to record one, such as "Please hold. I'll answer in a minute."
- Record the message twice, as prompted.

- Select Save or Options and one of the following:
  - Play to replay your message.
  - Re-record to record your message again.
  - Exit to exit.

The next time a call comes in, you can place it on hold

#### Place a Call on Hold

You can place a call on hold with Hold call enabled

Note: If you are already on a call and you receive another call, you cannot place the incoming call on hold. With no call waiting enabled, the call goes to Voicemail.

When a call comes in, do the following:

- Select Options > Hold call to place the caller on hold with your recorded hold message.
- Select Answer to speak to the caller on hold or End Call to hang up without speaking.

## Change Hold Call Message

- From Hold call, select Re-record msg.
- 2. Record the message twice, as prompted.
- Select Save to save the message or Options and one of the following:
  - Play to replay your message.
  - Re-record to record your message again.

Exit to exit.

## **Use 1-Touch Dialing**

The 1-Touch Dialing feature is the fastest way to call a speed dial location. To call a contact with speed dial, press and hold the speed dialing location.

If it is a two-digit location, press the first digit briefly, then press and hold the second digit.

Note: To use 1-Touch dialing, you must enable 1-Touch dialing on your phone and have a speed dial location assigned to a contact.

From 1-Touch dialing, select Enabled to turn on 1-touch dialing.

## Customize Keys

You can modify the Navigation key and Left softkey settings to set up your desired shortcut.

- From Customize Keys, select Up nav key, Left nav key, Right nav key, Down nav key, or Left soft key.
- Select your desired menu option for the targeted key shortcut.

- Normal sets the phone to default voice prompts.
- Expert sets the phone to sound tones instead of voice prompts.

## Set Display Results

You can set the phone to display up to three voice recognition contacts when calling or searching for a contact with voice commands.

From Voice dialing, select Display results > Single best or Three best.

### Set Digit Lengths

You can set the number of digits used for a phone number in your voice dial list.

From Voice dialing, select Digit lengths and one of the following options:

- North american recognizes only 7, 10, and 1
   + 10 digits in a phone number.
- Permit all allows 4-14 digits in a phone number.

#### Voice answer

#### **Enable Voice Answer**

You can set your phone to answer a call with your voice when using a hands-free accessory.

- 1. From Auto answer, select Disabled.
- 2. From Headset sound, select Out of headset
- From Voice dialing, select Voice answer
   With accessory.

### Answer Using Voice Answer

When you receive an incoming call, the phone prompts "Incoming call, answer?". With the caller recognized as a contact entry in your phone, the phone prompts "Incoming call from (Name), answer?" Do one of the following:

- Say "Yes" or press any except the End key to answer the call.
- Say "No" or press the End key to ignore the call.
- Remain silent. The voice alert repeats twice and the phone rings once before returning to the home screen.

#### Voice wake-up

#### **Enable Voice Wake-up**

- From Headset sound, select Out of headset.
- From Voice wake-up, select With accessory to activate voice dialling.

**Note:** You must use a headset or hands-free kit and connect the AC adapter to the phone and the wall outlet for voice wake-up to work.

### Start Voice Wake-up

- Say "Wake Up" and listen for a tone.
- Say "Wake Up" again until you hear two tones.

### **Use Voice Training**

If your phone has trouble recognizing your voice, you can train your phone to recognize specifically your voice for numbers.

- From Voice dialing, select Voice training.
- 2. Read the message and select OK > Train
- 3. Follow the prompts for each number until training is complete.

**Note:** You must read the numbers digit by digit for voice training to work.

## **Enable Open to Answer**

From Open to answer, select Enabled to answer calls by opening the phone.

## **Enable Any Key**

From Any key, select one of the following:

- Any key mute to silence calls when you press any key except for the Send or Speakerphone key.
- Any key answer to answer calls when you press any key except for the End, Back, or Navigation key.

# Security

This section describes all the features involved in securing your phone and preventing access to personal information. All security features are shielded by a four-digit lock code (typically 0000 or the last 4 digits of your phone number). Check with your service provider.

## Lock phone

#### Set Lock Phone

With your phone locked, you can call only emergency numbers or your service provider's customer service number. You can still receive incoming calls.

- From Security, enter your four-digit lock code.
- Select Lock phone > OK and one of the following:
  - Never leaves the phone always unlocked.

- On power up locks the phone every time you turn it on.
- Now locks the phone immediately.

### Unlock the Phone

- 1. From the home screen, select Unlock.
- Enter your four-digit lock code.

## Change Lock Code

Change your lock code from the default provided by the service provider.

- From Security, enter your four-digit lock code.
- 2. Select Change lock code > Yes.
- 3. Enter a new four-digit code.
- 4. Re-enter your new lock code.

## **Assign Special numbers**

Use Special numbers (in case of emergency numbers) to specify three personal phone numbers you can call with your phone locked.

- 1. From Security, enter your four-digit lock code.
- 2. Select Special numbers.
- 3. Select an Unassigned slot.
- 4. Enter the number and select **Done**.

You can view these numbers only when entering them for the first time.

To make a call to an ICE number from a locked phone, you must dial the number (including area code) exactly as stored in Special numbers.

#### **Erase All Contacts**

- From Security, enter your four-digit lock code.
- Select Erase contacts > Yes > Yes to erase all entries from your contacts list.

Note: You cannot recover deleted information.

### Erase All Downloads

- 1. From Security, enter your four-digit lock code.
- Select Erase downloads > Yes > Yes to erase all your downloaded (excluding the preloaded) content.

Note: You cannot recover deleted information.

## **Reset your Phone Settings**

- From Security, enter your four-digit lock code.
- Select Reset phone > Yes to reset your phone settings to the factory default, deleting all your custom settings.

Note: You cannot recover deleted information.

Use Messaging to set up the settings affecting all messages unless you change them for individual messages. See "Message Settings" on page 24 for more information.

### Network

## **Enable Privacy Alert**

From Privacy alert, select Enabled to set your phone to alert you when enhanced digital CDMA privacy is lost or regained.

#### **Set Location Information**

Use Location to share your location information with network services other than emergency services (for example, 911, 111, 999 and 000) in serviced areas. This feature works only when your phone is in digital mode. You do have the option of turning off the locator to emergency services. From Location, select one of the following:

- 911 only (default) shares your position information only with emergency services when you call your 3-digit emergency code.
- Location on shares your position information, in addition to emergency services.

### Accessories

#### Set Headset Sounds

With a headset attached to your phone, you can play the ringer through the headset or phone speaker.

From Headset sound, select Out of phone (ringing from the phone speaker) or Out of headset (ringing from the headset).

## Enable Pwr backlighting

From Pwr backlighting, select Always on have the backlight always on whenever the phone detects external power.

Charge time may increase, preventing the phone from reaching its complete charge level.

#### Connect to TTY Device

You can connect the phone to a teletype (TTY) device for the hearing impaired.

**Note:** Enable TTY only when using the phone with a TTY device.

- Connect the TTY device to your phone.
- 2. From TTY, select **OK** to clear the notification.
- 3. Select one of the following:.
  - TTY off disables TTY.
  - TTY on enables TTY devices.
  - TTY on + talk enables TTY devices and voice carry over.

 TTY on + hear enables TTY devices and hearing carry over.

**Note:** You can also enter ##889 with your keypad and select TTY to enable TTY.

### Connect to Hearing Aid Device

With a T-coil hearing aid device connected, you can enable the hearing aid feature.

- Connect the T-coil hearing aid device to your phone.
- From Hearing aid, select OK > Enabled.

## Memory card

You must have a memory card inserted to use **Memory card** for its settings.

#### Select the Files to Save

- From Memory card, select Files to save to choose your desired files to save to your card.
- Select file types from the list provided. A
  checkmark appears next to each file type
  saved to the memory card. Press the OK key
  to add or remove checkmarks.
- 3. When finished, select **Done**.

### Format your Memory Card

From Memory card, select Format card > Yes to format your memory card.

**Note:** Formatting erases all information on the memory card.

### **Check Space on your Memory Card**

From Memory card, select Card memory to check how much space you have on your memory card.

#### Set USB Mode

You can set your phone to transfer files to and from a computer.

From USB mode, select one of the following:

- Mass storage to use the microUSB jack with a USB cable to transfer files.
- Charging only to use the microUSB jack for charging only.

## Check your Phone Number

From My Phone Number, check the number of your phone.

## Check your Phone Memory

From Phone memory, check the memory usage of your phone.

### View Build Information

From Version info, check your phone's software and hardware information.

#### View Phone Icons

From Icon keys, check the icons used in your phone.

- Select Options > New entry to create a new contact or Options > Add to existing to add address to an existing contact.

### Work with Call Timers

#### View All Calls Timer

Select All calls to view the number of calls and the total call time. Select **Done** when finished

This timer tracks all calls made and received for life of the phone and cannot be reset.

## **View Last Call Timer**

Select Last call to view the total call time of your last call made or received. Select Done when finished.

You can do certain commands through voice recognition. To control the settings associated with voice commands, see "Call options" on page 67.

### Call a Contact

- From the home screen, press and hold the Send key. The phone prompts, "Say a command"
- Say "Contact" and then name of the person you want to call.

The phone prompts, "Please repeat" or "Say a name" if it does not recognize the name. If the name you spoke matches a contact in the voice dial list, the phone prompts: "Name, correct?" Say "Yes" to make the call, "No" to select a similar name, or "Cancel" to cancel the phone call.

If the phone finds multiple voice tags that sound like the name you said, the phone will list the names, you will be asked to verify which name you want to call. Say "Yes" when you hear the correct name. Say "No" when you hear an incorrect name.

- 3. Press the End key to end the call. To modify your voice dial list, see "Enable Voice Dial Tags" on page 33.
- Say "Find Contacts". The phone prompts,

### Call a Number

- From the home screen, press and hold the Send key. The phone prompts, "Say a command".
- Say "Dial Number" and then speak the digits
  of the number you want to call. If you pause,
  the phone prompts you, "Did you say
  <number>" or "Say a number" if it does not
  recognize the name. Say "Yes" to make the
  call, "No" to cancel the phone call.
- Press the End key to end the call.

## Use a Shortcut

- 1. From the home screen, press and hold the Send key. The phone prompts, "Say a command".
- Say the name of the menu item you want to access or say "Shortcuts" to view a list of menu items. The phone prompts, "Say one of the shortcuts"
- Say the name of the menu item you want to access.

## Find a Contact

 From the home screen, press and hold the Send key. The phone prompts, "Say a command".

"Say a name".

76 Call a Contact

The phone prompts, "Please repeat" or "Say a name" if it does not recognize the name. If the name you spoke matches a contact in the voice dial list, the phone prompts: "Name, correct?" Say "Yes" to display the contact, "No" to select a similar name, or "Cancel" to cancel the search.

**Note:** You can only search for contacts that are in the voice dial list.
