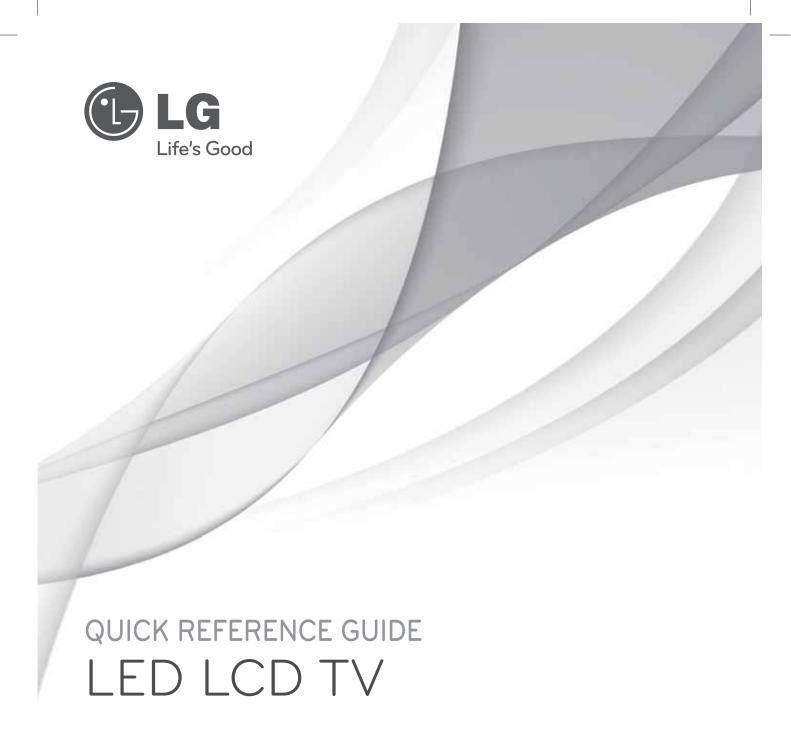

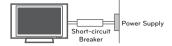

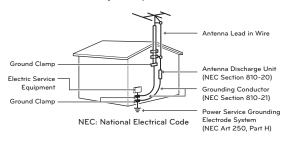

Cleaning

Mounting on a wall

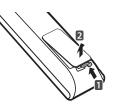


- Make sure that the external speaker should be connected with TV under power-off
- Use EXT speaker with BTL type (4p)

REMOTE CONTROL

The descriptions in this manual are based on the buttons on the remote control. Please read this manual carefully and use the TV correctly.

To replace batteries, open the battery cover, replace batteries (1.5 V AAA) matching the \oplus and \bigcirc ends to the label inside the compartment, and close the battery cover. To remove the batteries, perform the installation actions in reverse.

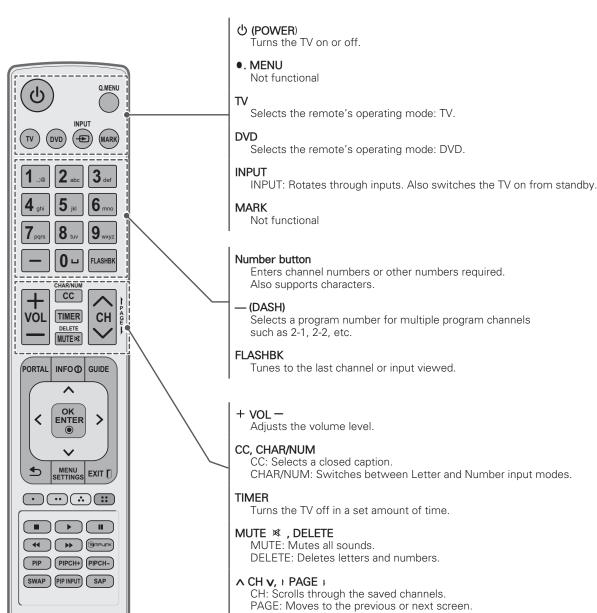


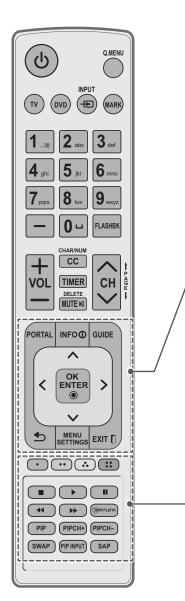

Navigation buttons (up/down/left/right)

Scrolls through menus or options.

OK/ENTER ⊚

Selects menus or options and confirms your input.

Returns to the previous level.

MENU/SETTINGS

Accesses the main menu.

EXIT I

Clears all on-screen displays and returns to TV viewing.

Color buttons

These access special functions in some menus.

VCR/DVD/USB control buttons

Controls video cassette recorders or DVD players or USB.

(S)MPLIN

Accesses the AV devices connected to the TV; Opens the SIMPLINK menu.

PIP

Not functional (For LT670H series)

Enters the split screen mode. (Some input sources may not be displayed.) (For LT770H series)

PIP CH +/-

Not functional (For LT670H series)

Channel up or down the sub window. (For LT770H series)

SWAP

Not functional (For LT670H series)

Changes the main window and the sub window. (For LT770H series)

PIP INPUT

Not functional (For LT670H series)

Rotates through input of the sub window. (For LT770H series)

SAF

Analog mode: Selects MTS sound (Mono, Stereo or SAP)
