## Getting to know your phone

  - 4: Messaging
- End/Power key**: Allows you to power the phone on or off, end calls, or return to Standby Mode.
- Alphanumeric keys**: In most of the time, the numeric keys are used to input number or characters.

## Installing the SIM Card

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card loaded with your subscription details, such as your PIN, any optional services available and many others.

**Important!** The plain SIM card and its contacts can be easily damaged by scratches or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting or removing the card. Keep all SIM cards out of the reach of small children.

## Entering Text

You can enter alphanumeric characters by using the phone's keypad. To change modes, press the **ABC** key.

### T9 Mode

This mode allows you to enter words with only one keystroke per letter. Each key on the keypad has more than one letter. The T9 mode automatically compares your keystrokes with an internal linguistic dictionary to determine the correct word, thus requiring far fewer keystrokes than the traditional ABC mode.

The input method is display at the upper right corner of your phone.

## Menu 5. Messaging

- Press **ABC** to open the address book.
- Using the keypad, enter the first letter of the contact you want to call.
- To scroll through the contacts use up and down navigation key and to scroll through their different numbers use left and right navigation keys.
- Press **ABC** or **END** to reject the incoming call.

**TIP:** You can change the settings on your phone to answer your calls in different ways. Press **Menu**, select **Settings** and choose **Call**. Select **Answer mode** and choose from **Any key** or **Send key** only.

## Menu 2. Contacts

You can search for a contact in your contacts.

- Press **Contacts** and choose **Search**, select **Contacts** from the **Menu** screen or press **ABC** from the standby screen.
- Using the keypad enter the first letter of the contact you want to call.
- To scroll through the contacts use up and down navigation key and to scroll through their different numbers use left and right navigation keys.

- New contact:** You can add phonebook entries by using this menu.
- Speed dial:** Assign contacts to any of keys between 2 and 8.
- SOS Message:** (Speed dial-> Ok->Key 9) An emergency message can be sent to the predefined number's (3 maximum) by long press of 9 key. On long press of 9 key, a popup comes, Set SOS message? Press Yes then type the required message and input 3 numbers to which you want to send the message in emergency mode and press Save/Done.
- Copy all:** You can copy all entries from SIM card memory to Phone memory and also from Phone memory to SIM card memory.

## Menu 1. Calendar

When you enter this menu, a calendar appears. A square cursor is located on the current date. You can move the cursor to another date using the navigation keys.

## Menu 5. Messaging

- Sending a message**
  - Press **Menu**, select **Messaging** and choose **New message**.
  - A new message editor will open. The default setting of the message editor is SMS mode.
  - Enter your message using either the T9 predictive mode or ABC manual mode. You can switch text input mode by pressing **ABC**.
  - Press **Options** and choose **Insert** to add an **Symbol**, **Template**, **Contact**, **Business card**.
  - Press **Send**.
  - Enter the phone number or press **Options** and select **Contacts** or **Recent list** to open your contacts list select the number and press **Insert** then option.
  - Press **Send**.
- Inbox:** You will be alerted when you have received a message. And it will be saved here.
- Drafts:** This menu allows you to view the messages which is about to be sent or has failed to be sent.
- Sent:** This menu allows you to view the messages which have already been sent, including time and content.
- Listen to voicemail:** This menu provides you with a quick way of accessing your voice mailbox.
- Info message:** Info service messages are text messages delivered by the network to your handset.
- Templates:** There are pre-defined messages in the list. You can view and edit the template messages or create new messages.
- Settings:** This menu allows you to set features of your network service provider.

## Menu 2. Contacts

- Delete all:** You can delete all entries from SIM card memory or Phone memory.
- Information**
  - > **Service dial number:** Access the list of service numbers assigned by service provider safely.
  - > **Own number:** You can save and check your own numbers in SIM card.

### Menu 3. Call history

You can check the record of all missed, dialed, received calls and call duration. The number and name (if available) are displayed together with the date and time at which the call was made. You can also view the number of times you have called.

- All calls:** Displays all the lists of three types (Received/Dialed/Missed calls) by time.
- Missed calls:** This option lets you view the last 40 unanswered calls.
- Dialed calls:** This option lets you view the last 40 outgoing calls (called or attempted).
- Received calls:** This option lets you view the last 40 incoming calls.
- Call duration:** Allows you to view the duration of your incoming and outgoing calls.

### Menu 4. Game

Your LG-A175a comes with preloaded games to keep you amused when you have time to spare. Press **Menu** and select **Games**.

## Menu 5. Messaging

You can enter alphanumeric characters using the phone's keypad. For example, storing names in **Contacts**, writing a message and creating scheduling events in the **Calendar** all require entering text. The following text input methods are available in the phone: T9 predictive mode, ABC manual mode and T23 mode.

**Note:** Some fields may allow only one text input mode (e.g. telephone number in address book fields).

### T9 predictive mode

T9 predictive mode uses a built-in dictionary to recognise words you're writing based on the key sequences you press. Simply press the number key associated with the letter you want to enter, and the dictionary will recognise the word once all the letters are entered.

### ABC manual mode

This mode allows you to enter letters by pressing the key labeled with the required letter once, twice, three or four times until the letter is displayed.

### T23 mode

Type numbers using one keystroke per number. You can also add numbers while remaining in letter modes by pressing and holding the desired key.



- Using the keypad enter the first letter of the contact you want to call.

- New contact:** You can add phonebook entries by using this menu.
- Speed dial:** Assign contacts to any of keys between 2 and 8.
- SOS Message:** (Speed dial-> Ok->Key 9) An emergency message can be sent to the predefined number's (3 maximum) by long press of 9 key. On long press of 9 key, a popup comes, Set SOS message? Press Yes then type the required message and input 3 numbers to which you want to send the message in emergency mode and press Save/Done.
- Copy all:** You can copy all entries from SIM card memory to Phone memory and also from Phone memory to SIM card memory.

## Menu 6. Profiles

- You change your profile, then choose from General, Silent, Vibrate only, Outdoor, Flight mode and Headset.
- General:** After setup this profile, the indicator  will be displayed on the standby screen.
- Silent:** Ring tone and vibrator is set to be off. After setup this profile, the indicator  will be displayed on the standby screen.
- Outdoor:** This is the default profile. Ring tone and key tone volume is set to maximum. After setup this profile, the indicator  will be displayed on the standby screen.
- Flight Mode:** Use this option to switch the flight mode On or Off. You will not be able to make calls. Connect to the Internet. Send messages when Flight mode is switched On.

## Menu 7. Tools

- Fake call:** You can set a fake incoming call which will come after specific time with name and number you set. To set Fake Call Go to Fake call settings. Set Fake call to On. Select the name and number for the calls when the set Fake call should involve. Give the Name and Number from whom the Fake call should come and finally Press save to save the settings. Now to invoke the fake call press  from idle screen.
- Calculator:** This contains the standard functions such as Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division.
- Stopwatch:** This option allows you to use the function of a stopwatch.
- Unit converter:** This converts any measurement into a unit you want.
- World clocks:** allows you to determine the current time in another time zone or country.
- SIM services:** This feature depends on SIM and the network services. In case the SIM card supports SAT (i.e. SIM Application Toolkit) services, this menu will be the operator specific services names stored on the SIM card.

## Menu 8. Organiser

- Alarm:** You can set up to 3 alarm clocks to go off at a specific time.
- Memo:** You can register your own memos here.

## Settings Menu 9

- Date & Time:** You can set functions relating to the date and time.
- Languages:** You can change the language for the display texts in your phone. This change will also affect the Language Input mode.
- Display:** You can adjust settings for the phone display.
- Call:** You can set the menu relevant to a call.
- Security:** This menu allows you to set the phone safely.
  - > **Pin code request** - Choose a PIN code to be requested when you turn your phone on.
  - > **Auto lock** - You can set the time interval for which the phone will be locked or immediately.
  - > **Attached mobile number** - With this handset is attached to the handset is attached to the SIMS to the numbers configured by real owner. User has to configure the ATMT settings with name, primary phone number, secondary number. User has to Set ATMT ON to activate the ATMT feature. Default ATMT code is '0000'. ATMT SMS will contain information about the stolen phone IMEI, current location & number of the person who is using that handset.
  - > **Change codes** - Changing your security code or PIN code or PIN2 code, ATMT code, enter the old code followed by the new code.

## Settings Menu 9

- Power save:** If you set Always on, you can save the battery power when you don't use the phone. Choose to switch the power save settings Always on, Night only or Off.
- Network selection:** You can select a network that will be registered either automatically or manually.
- Reset settings:** Use Reset to reset all the settings to their factory definitions. You need the security code to activate this function. The default number is '0000'.
- Memory status:** You can check free space and memory usage of each repository.
