- *1 This is for preventing malfunction by touching the touch screen with your face after switching touch screen to on.
- *2 Antenna is built inside this terminal. If the antenna area is covered by your hand, quality may be affected.

Note

- · Do not put any sticker on the sensor area.
- Do not remove stickers from the back surface of the back cover. If a sticker is removed, the IC card may not be read or written.

There are three keys on the front of this terminal. The roles of these keys are shown below.

Back key

Tap this key to return to the previous screen. It also closes a dialog box, an options menu, the Notification panel, or the on-screen keyboard.

Home key

- If you tap this key, you will return to the Home screen, regardless of the application being used or the screen being displayed.
- If you touch this key for over 1 second, the list of the most recently used applications appear. Tap an thumbnail to open the application. (It may be displayed as horizontal screen.)
 Drag a thumbnail to right and left to delete from the list.

Menu key

Tap this key to display the options menu for the current screen or application.

miniUIM

miniUIM is an IC card that stores informations of each customer.

You cannot use some of this terminal functions if the miniUIM is not inserted. Before inserting or removing the miniUIM, you must always turn OFF the power and disconnect the adapter. This terminal uses only the miniUIM. Bring your UIM/FOMA card to a docomo Shop to exchange it.

miniUIM security codes

The miniUIM can set security code named PIN code. This code is set to "0000" at the time of subscription, but you may subsequently change it. For details about changing this security code, refer to "Security Code and miniUIM Protection" (P145).

Inserting the miniUIM

 Remove the back cover (P37)
 Remove the battery pack (P46), and insert the miniUIM into the slot with the gold-colored IC side facing down

Removing the miniUIM

Remove the back cover and the battery pack. Gently press the miniUIM with your fingertip and slide it out

microSD Card

A microSD card can be used with any other compatible devices.

- This terminal supports a microSD card of up to 2 GB, and a microSDHC card of up to 32 GB (as of June 2012).
- Consult with the manufacturers about the supporting microSD cards.

Note

 Attaching a microSD card which exceeds the maximum capacity may cause data loss.

Inserting a microSD Card

Remove the back cover (P37) Insert the microSD card into the slot with the metal contacts facing down Insert a microSD card properly, paying attention to the insertion direction.
 Improper insertion of a microSD card may damage the card itself and the slot, or may be unable to eject the card.

Removing a microSD Card

Remove the back cover, gently press the microUSB card with your fingertip, remove it to the arrow direction

Remove the back cover (P37)
 Insert the battery pack in the direction of the arrow • with the "CE" mark facing up. Ensure that the tabs on this terminal and the battery pack are aligned with each other

2 Put your fingernail into the groove, and lift out the battery pack in the direction of the arrow ①, pushing it to the direction of the arrow ②

Note

 Turn the power OFF before attaching/ removing the battery pack.

Charging

Battery Pack Life

- The battery pack is a consumable accessory. The usage time of the battery per one charge decreases gradually each time the battery is recharged.
- When the usage time from one charge becomes about half of a new battery pack, the life of the battery pack is assumed to be almost over. We recommend that you replace the battery ahead of time.

Battery Charging

- For detailed information, refer to manuals for AC adapter and battery charger.
- The shape of the AC adapter plug is for AC 100 V (Japanese standard). The conversion plug adapter for overseas is required if you use an adapter for AC 100 V to 240 V. Also do not use a transformer for overseas travel.
- Do not force the connector when inserting/ pulling it out. Instead, insert/pull it out slowly.
- If you start charging when the battery pack is empty, you may not be able to power ON this terminal for a while.

 Make sure to unplug the power cord after finishing charging.

Do not charge for a long time (several days)

 If you carry on charging this terminal after it has been fully charged, the battery pack will start supplying power to this terminal. This will reduce the actual usage time and deplete the battery. If this happens, please charge it again correctly. Before recharging, remove this terminal from microUSB connection cable and reset.

Charging Time (estimate)

The estimated time for charging an empty battery pack is shown below. Charging under low temperatures requires longer time.

Charging with the AC Adapter

How to use the optional AC adapter $O3^*$ to charge this terminal is described below.

* AC adapter O3 consists of AC adapter and microUSB connection cable.

Insert the USB connector of the microUSB connection cable into the USB connection terminal of AC adapter

- 2 Insert the microUSB connector of microUSB connection cable into the microUSB connection terminal of this terminal
 - Insert the microUSB connection cable horizontally with the USB mark facing up.

3 Insert the AC adapter plug into the power outlet

- · Red charging lamp lights up.
- When the battery pack is fully charged, the battery level icon on the status bar changes to .
- When charging is completed, an battery completion sound rings, and and battery completion message are displayed.
- 4 When charging is completed, remove the microUSB connector of microUSB connection cable from this terminal
- 5 Remove the USB connector of microUSB connection cable from the USB connection terminal of AC adapter

6 Remove AC adapter plug from the power outlet

Charging with Battery Charger LO1

How to use the Battery Charger L01* to charge the Battery Pack L18 is described below.

 Battery Charger LO1 consists of battery charger and USB connection cable (sample).

Attaching the battery pack to the battery charger

Put your finger into the groove of the battery cover, and lift in the direction of the arrow **1** Insert the battery pack in the direction of the arrow **1** with the "CE" mark facing up. Ensure that the tabs on the battery charger and the battery pack are aligned with each other

3 Close the battery cover

Charging the battery pack

- Insert the USB connector of USB connection cable to the USB connection terminal of AC Adapter O3 (optional)
- 2 Insert the microUSB connector of USB connection cable to the connection terminal of Battery Charger LO1
 - Insert the USB connection cable horizontally with the USB mark facing up.

- 3 Insert the AC adapter plug into the power outlet
 - The charge indicator on the battery charger lights up to Red → Green → Orange. Charging starts.
 - The charge indicator lights up in red while charging.

- 4 When charging is completed, remove the microUSB connector from this terminal from the Battery Charger L01
- 5 Remove AC adapter plug from the power outlet

Note

- When the charge indicator of battery charger blinks orange, charging is failed. Confirm the connection or remove grime from the connection terminals, and charge again.
- Store your battery in battery charger to prevent dirt or damage.

Charging with a PC

Connect this terminal to a PC with the USB connection cable (sample) to charge.

- Insert the microUSB connector of USB connection cable into the microUSB connection terminal of this terminal
 - Insert the USB connection cable
 horizontally with the USB mark facing up.
- 2 Insert the USB connector of USB connection cable to PC USB port
- 3 "Charge only"
 - For details about the types of USB connection, refer to "Connecting this terminal with a PC" (P164).

Confirmation and Settings before Using

- 4 When charging is completed, remove the microUSB connector from this terminal
- 5 Remove the USB connector from the PC USB port

Note

• Depending on the condition of PC, the charging may take time or the charging is not possible.

Turning ON/OFF the Power

Turning ON the Power

- Press and hold the power key for over 3 seconds
 - · The screen lock is displayed.

Turning OFF the Power

- Press and hold the power key for over 1 second
- Power off"
- 3 "OK"

Turning on Backlight

To prevent unintended operation and to save power, the backlight turns off after a set period. If you then turn on the backlight to release the screen lock, the screen that was displayed before the backlight was turned off appears again.

Press the power key

· The "Locked" screen appears.

Note

- Pressing the power key while the backlight is on locks the screen.
- Set the time duration before the backlight turns off and the screen is locked. For details, refer to "Display" (P138).

Unlock the Screen Lock

Tap 🚺

 In case "Lock screen" is set, unlock with the method you have set beforehand.

Note

 When the screen lock is set as "Touch". drag or swipe the status bar to down while the screen is locked to open the notification panel.

Confirmation and Settings before Using

Basic Operations

The display of this terminal has a touch screen that allows you to perform various operations by touching it.

Precautions on Using Touch Screen

The touch screen has been designed for finger touching slightly. Do not press it with sharp objects (fingernail, ballpoint pen, pin etc.) or press it hard with your finger.

The following user actions may cause the touch screen not to work properly. They may also cause malfunction.

- · Touching the screen with gloved hands
- Touching the screen with the tip of a fingernail
- · Placing a foreign object on the screen
- Sticking a protective sheet or seal on the screen
- · Touching the screen when it is wet
- Touching the screen with wet fingers
- Operating while charging with an adapter other than designated adapter by docomo

Touch Screen Operations

You can perform the following actions on the touch screen.

- · Tap: Touch the screen lightly
- Double-tap: Touch the screen lightly twice successively
- Touch for over 1 second: Touch and hold down the screen
- · Swipe: Lightly flick the screen
- Drag: Touch and hold down to flick the screen, and then release your finger
- Pinch-out: Touch the screen with 2 fingers
 and then move them apart
- Pinch-in: Touch the screen with 2 fingers apart and then move them together, as if pinching

Opening Items

Tap an item

Checking or Unchecking Options

Tap an item that has a checkbox

- If the checkbox was unmarked, a check mark now appears in it.
- If the checkbox was marked, the check mark now disappears from it.

Scrolling Screen

You can scroll the screen up or down. On some web pages, you can also scroll side to side.



Drag up or down to scroll.



Swipe to scroll quickly. To stop scrolling, touch the screen.

Zooming In or Out

Some applications allow you to zoom in on small text that is difficult to read. After zooming in, you can also zoom out to a full-screen view.



The movement of your fingers enlarges the screen display by pinching it out.



- The movement of your fingers reduces the screen display by pinching it in.
- Pinch in on the Home screen to display the Home screen list, and then set the Home screen.

Note

Sometimes (a) appears when you drag the screen. You can also zoom in or out by tapping this zoom control icon. Tap (a) to zoom in by one level. Tap (a) to zoom out by one level. However, (a) or (a) grays out if you have already zoomed in to the maximum or zoom out to the minimum. This grays out indicates that you cannot zoom in or out any further.

Using Motion Gesture

Various functions can be operated simply by moving this terminal.

- - ▶ "Gesture" from the Home screen, and place a check mark in each item.

Using motion gesture on alarm

- Stopping alarm
 - Flip this terminal while alarm is ringing
 - · Alarm stops.

Using motion gesture while an incoming call arrives

Muting ringtone

- When an incoming call arrives, flip this terminal
- The ringtone is muted.

Changing Screen Orientation

This terminal screen automatically rotates to horizontal (landscape) or vertical (portrait) views, depending on the direction in which it is turned.

Note

- Screen orientation may not change in some applications.

Capturing Screen Shot

You can capture the display on screen and save it as an image.

Hold down the power key and volume key (below) for over 1 second

 You can see the captured screen shots in "Screenshots" of "Gallery".

Initial Settings

First-time Settings

When the power is first turned ON, you need to set the language and date for this terminal. Once you set those settings, there is no need to set them the next time the power is turned ON. You can also change these settings later.

- Procedures differ depending on the connection with network and settings.
- Press and hold the power key for over 3 seconds
- 2 On the "Welcome to Startup Wizard" screen, tap "Next"
 - Tap "日本語(日本)" to change language.
- 3 Check or uncheck "Mobile network"/ "Wi-Fi" on the "Set internet connection" screen ► "Next"
 - Set the each item for Wi-Fi network when you select "Wi-Fi".

- 4 "Sign in"/"Get an account"/"Not now" on the "Make it Google" screen ► set by following screen instructions until the "Thank you!" screen appears
 - "OK" on the "Software Update" screen
- 6 "Next" on the "docomo service initial settings" screen
- 7 "Install"/"Not install" on the "Install all apps" screen ► "Next"
- 8 "Set"/"Not set" on the "Use Osaifu-Keitai" screen ► "Next"
- 9 "Set" on the "docomo apps password settings" screen ► input a docomo apps password ► "OK" ► input new docomo apps password ► "OK" ► input the new docomo apps password again ► "OK"
- IO "Location providing ON"/"Location providing OFF"/"unknown blocking" on the "Location providing setting" screen ► "Next"

- "Send"/"Not send" on the "Preinstalled apps usage sync" screen ▶ "Next"
- 12 "OK" on the "Complete setting" screen

Note

 A data connection (LTE/3G/GPRS) is required to set online services. For details on enabling data connection, refer to "WIRELESS & NETWORKS" (P131).

Configuring Wi-Fi Settings

This terminal connects to the Internet via access points for Wi-Fi networks or public wireless LAN services.

To connect, you must configure the access point connection settings on this terminal.

Reception interference caused by Bluetooth devices

- As this terminal's wireless LAN devices and Bluetooth device use the same frequency (2.4 GHz), reception interference may occur or the communications speed may lower. Also, you may hear noise or have a connection problem. In these cases, do the following:
 - Keep the wireless LAN device over 10m away from the Bluetooth device.
 - Within 10 m, turn off either the wireless LAN device or the Bluetooth device.

Note

- Packet communication can be connected, even when Wi-Fi function is ON. However, while Wi-Fi is available, Wi-Fi is prioritized.
 When the Wi-Fi network is disconnected, this terminal automatically connects to the LTE/3G/GPRS network. Packet communication charges apply if you use it with LTE/3G/GPRS connected.
- You can reduce battery consumption by turning OFF Wi-Fi when you are not using it.

Wi-Fi network status

When this terminal is connected to a WI-Fi network, a appears in the status bar. An open network with no security protection is detected when WI-Fi network notification is set to ON, always a appears in the status bar.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

- - The "Wi-Fi" screen appears.
- Turn "Wi-Fi" ON



Tap the Wi-Fi network that you want to connect to

- If you try to connect to a protected Wi-Fi network, you will be prompted to enter the security key for that Wi-Fi network. Tap the "Password" box, enter the network password and tap "Connect".
- Usually, when you enter a password, the last character entered is displayed and as many "." as the number of characters appear instead of previously entered characters. All characters can be displayed when you place a check mark on "Show password".
- When connecting to an access point that supported WPS, place a check mark in "Show advanced options" and select a connection method.

Note

- There are two types of available networks open networks and protected networks. The network type is indicated by an icon to the network name. The presents an open network and the presents a protected network.
- · The icon also indicates the signal strength.



- Network name does not appear depending on the settings for the access point even if the network is connectable. If this happens, you can still connect to the network. Refer to "Adding a Wi-Fi network" (P62).

- · When establishing a Wi-Fi network connection, the required information is generally obtained from a DHCP server automatically. However, it is possible to specify these items separately.
- To check the Wi-Fi MAC address and IP address, from the Home screen, tap =
 - "Settings" > "Wi-Fi", and then tap =
 - "Advanced"

Notifving when Wi-Fi network with no security protection is detected

- From the Home screen. "Settings" ▶ "Wi-Fi"
- · The "Wi-Fi" screen appears.
- Turn "Wi-Fi" ON



? Place a check mark on "Network notification"

 You will be automatically notified when an open network with no security protection is detected.

Adding a Wi-Fi network

- From the Home screen, "Settings" ▶ "Wi-Fi"
 - The "Wi-Fi" screen appears
- Turn "Wi-Fi" ON
- 3 "ADD NETWORK"
 - The "Add network" menu appears.
- Enter the network SSID in the "Network SSID" box
- "Security" 5
 - "Security" menu appears. Select the appropriate type from "None", "WEP", "WPA/WPA2 PSK", and "802.1x EAP".
 - · The setting method differs depending on the security settings.
- "Save" 6
 - The Wi-Fi network is added.

Changing the Wi-Fi network password

From the Home screen, "Settings" ▶ "Wi-Fi"

The "Wi-Fi" screen annears

Touch the Wi-Fi network name for over 1 second

A menu appears.

"Modify network"

· The network settings are displayed. Tap the "Password" hox and enter the new nassword

Disconnecting from a Wi-Fi network

- From the Home screen. "Settings" ▶ "Wi-Fi"
 - · The "Wi-Fi" screen appears.
- Touch the name of Wi-Fi network that you want to disconnect from for over 1 second
 - · A menu appears.

"Forget"

The Wi-Fi network is disconnected.

Setting Wi-Fi connection while the screen is OFF

Disconnect Wi-Fi while the screen is OFF and specify the timing of switching this terminal to data communications

- From the Home screen. "Settings" ▶ "Wi-Fi"
 - · The "Wi-Fi" screen appears.
 - Advanced"

"Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep"

 "Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep" menu appears. Choose from "Always" "Only when plugged in" "Never (increase data usage)".

Ignore unavailable radio waves

This function enables re-connection after conducting disconnection when the access point is recognized as an unavailable one by Internet due to no reply is received from your desired access point.

Confirmation and Settings before Using

Setting Online Service Accounts

You can update your status on Google and other online services once you have set up your online service account on this terminal. You can also configure this terminal to automatically sync updates from the online service. You can also delete unnecessary accounts.

Adding an online service account

- · The "Accounts & sync" screen appears.
- 2 "ADD ACCOUNT"
 - · The "Add account" screen appears.
- 3 Tap the online service that you want to set an account
 - Follow the screen instructions and enter your login details.
 - When you have finished adding the account, the added online service appears in the "Accounts & sync" group.

Note

- It is not available to add docomo account.
- If you mark the "Sync..." checkbox, the applications will also automatically synchronize data with their respective services. These operations may incur packet communication charges. Marking these checkboxes also runs down the battery.

Manually synchronizing online service data

- - · The "Accounts & sync" screen appears.
- 2 Tap the account that you want to synchronize with
 - A list of online service's synchronized data appears.
- 3 Place a check mark on synchronized data
 - · The data with a check mark is synchronized.

Deleting an online service account

- - The "Accounts & sync" screen appears.

2 Tap the account that you want to delete

· The "Sync settings" screen appears.

The selected account is deleted.

Note

· docomo account cannot be deleted.

Drag or swipe the status bar downwards

 The Notification panel appears. Icons are displayed at the top of the Notification panel. Icons are blue when they are on, and white when they are off.

OneTouch Memo

Activate OneTouch Memo.

2 Sound profile

Switch Sound & Vibrate/Vibrate only/Silent. Touch for over 1 second to display the "Sound" screen.

3 Wi-Fi

Switch between on and off. Touch for over 1 second to display the "Wi-Fi" screen.

4 GPS

Switch between on and off. Touch for over 1 second to display the "Location services" screen.

6 Edit

Display "Edit quick settings" screen.

6 Clear

Delete notification information and icons.

Ø Notification information

Display details of notification information.

Viewing notification details

Tap the notification message on the Notification panel

 The notification details are displayed in the appropriate application.

Clearing notification informations

Tap 🗙 on the Notification panel



 - When your location is notified, the name of agency that received the emergency call is displayed on the display of this terminal.
 - If you are not sending your caller ID by calling with "184" added or other means, your location information and phone number are not notified. However, if the agency that received the emergency call considers your location information and phone number necessary for important purposes, such as life saving, the agency can retrieve them regardless of your settings.

- In addition, the area/timing to introduce "Location notification of emergency call" depends on the state of preparation in each agency that receives emergency calls.

 (110, 119, and 118) from your terminal, be sure to notify that you are calling from a mobile phone and give your mobile phone number and present location clearly, as the police/fire department may call you back for confirmation.
 During an emergency call, be sure to stay where you are so that your call will not be interrupted. After making an emergency call, do not turn off your mobile phone immediately. Keep it on for about 10 minutes so that it can receive an incoming call.
- Depending on the location from which you make an emergency call, connection may be made to the fire department or the police of another jurisdiction.
- In Japan, the 110, 119, and 118 emergency numbers cannot be dialed when miniUIM is not inserted, from the PIN code input screen or from the PIN unblocking key input screen. For details on PIN code, refer to "Security Code and miniUIM Protection" (P145).

Making an international call (WORLD CALL)

WORLD CALL is an international call service that enables you to make a call in Japan via the DOCOMO terminals.

Customers who have subscribed to the FOMA service would also have automatically subscribed to "WORLD CALL" at the same time. (However, you can decline to use "WORLD CALL" when subscribing to the FOMA services.)

 Available to make a call over 240 countries or areas.

You can make an overseas call to a fixed line telephone or a mobile phone.

- For information about the possible countries and carriers at overseas, refer to "Mobile Phone User's Guide [International Services]" or the DOCOMO "International Services website".
- Subscription fee and monthly fee will not be charged.
- Contact "General Inquiries" on the back of this manual for detailed information about WORLD CALL.
- When using an international call service company other than DOCOMO, consult with the international call service company you use.

 Depending on the carrier, the caller's number may not be notified or displayed correctly. In that case, making a call from call log is not available.



Google Talk is a Google instant messaging service. It allows you to chat (text chatting) with friends who have Google accounts. To use Google Talk, you must set up your own Google account. For details, refer to "Setting Online Service Accounts" (P64).



Notes on using Bluetooth function

- The distance between this terminal and another Bluetooth device keeps within approximately 10 m with no obstructions in sight. The distance that this terminal and a Bluetooth device can make connection may be shorter when there are obstructions between them or depending on the conditions of the surroundings (such as walls or furniture) and the structure of a building. Especially when there is a wall or floor of reinforced concrete between them, they may be unable to connect with each other. Note the above mentioned distance is not guaranteed.
- Make sure to keep this terminal and another Bluetooth device 2 m or more away from home electric appliances, AV devices, OA devices, etc. before connection. 1 Seg is a digital terrestrial TV broadcasting service for mobile devices that allows you to receive data programs along with video and audio. It is also possible to acquire detailed program information, participate in quiz shows, and enjoy TV shopping.

Before Using the 1Seg

- 1 Seg is a service provided by TV broadcast companies (broadcast stations).
 Receiving video and audio is free. For more information about NHK reception fees, contact NHK.
- There are two types of information displayed in the data broadcasting area: "Data broadcasts" and "Data broadcast sites".
 "Data broadcasts are displayed by broadcast wave for both video and audio, and "Data broadcast sites" are displayed by connecting to the site provided by the TV broadcasting company (broadcast station) through the data broadcast information.

To view "Data broadcast sites", etc. packet communication fees are charged. Information fees may be required to access some sites.

Broadcast wave

I Seg is one of broadcast services, and receives radio waves (broadcast waves) that are different from FOMA/XI service. Therefore, it is not possible to receive at locations where broadcast waves do not reach or during time zones where broadcasting is off regardless of whether you are in an area with FOMA/XI service. In addition, in areas with digital terrestrial TV broadcast service, reception may not be available in the following locations.

- Locations far from the broadcasting tower where the broadcast wave is sent
- Locations where waves are blocked by landscape or buildings such as in the mountains and or near buildings
- Locations where waves are weak such as tunnels, underground, and building basements

In order to have better reception, completely extend the 1Seg antenna. Changing the antenna orientation or changing location may help improve reception.

About the 1Seg antenna

- To view 1Seg, fully extend the 1Seg antenna. If you give too much force when the antenna is not fully extended, it may be damaged.
- When changing the orientation of the 1Seg antenna, hold the bottom portion.

Note

- When retracting the 1Seg antenna, hold the antenna straight up and push down. If too much force is applied, it may be damaged.
- When retracting the top portion of the 1Seg antenna, pay attention to its orientation.
- 1Seg audio cannot be output by Bluetooth devices that are not compatible with SCMS-T.
- 1 Seg is not compatible with the following functions due to copyright protection.
 - Screenshot
 - OneTouch memo

You should also avoid infringing the portrait rights of other people by using or modifying their portraits without their consent. Note that the shooting or recording of stage performances, shows or exhibitions may be prohibited, even for personal use. You may get fined according to law, regulation (nuisance prevention ordinance, etc.) if other people get disturbed or hurt by any improper behavior when using this terminal.

Please be considerate of the privacy of individuals around you when shooting and sending photos using camera-equipped mobile phones.

Notes for capturing images

- The Camera employs high precision technology, but some pixels or lines may seem brighter or darker than others. Also, when you shoot photos in places with insufficient lighting, noises seen as white line increase. This is normal.
- Clean the lens with a soft cloth before shooting. If the lens is stained with fingerprints or oil, the shot photo may appear out of focus or blurred.



GPS/Navigation

Location Information Services

Mobile networks, Wi-Fi and GPS methods are available to obtain current locations. With Wi-Fi current locations can be speedily determined, but accuracy is lacking. If GPS is used, it takes more time, but accurate positioning can be obtained. When determining current locations, activate both Wi-Fi and GPS to utilize both of their advantages.

What is GPS

- GPS is a function that receives signals from GPS satellites for obtaining the location of this terminal.
- It cannot be used as navigation devices for aircraft, vehicles and people or as a highprecision GPS for measurement. Please note that DOCOMO shall not bear responsibility for damages which are pure economic losses which are generated by opportunities missed to confirm positioning results and missed communications due to external factors (including exhausted batteries) such as malfunctions, improper operations and power outages of this terminal if it is used for these purposes.

- Since GPS is governed by the United States Department of Defense, the GPS signals might be controlled (degradation of accuracy, signal blackouts, etc.) according to national security reasons of the US. Also even if positioning is done in the same locations and environments, identical results may not be obtained due to the differences in signal conditions caused by the locations of the satellites.
- Since GPS uses signals from satellites, in the following environments there are locations where signals cannot be received or reception is poor. Thus, the range of error of location information may be over 300 m.
 - In the midst of or underneath dense tree growth, in areas lined with buildings or dense residential areas
 - Inside or underneath buildings
 - Inside of underground tunnels, underground and underwater
 - Near high-voltage lines
 - Inside of cars and trains
 - In poor weather such as heavy rainfall and snow
 - Inside of bags and boxes
 - Hindrances (people and things) around this terminal

- If this terminal is held with the hands covering up the area around the screen, buttons, microphone and speakers
- Please check the websites of the GPS service provider and DOCOMO for news regarding the usage of positioning provisions and current locations notifications. Also using these functions may incur charges.

- This terminal is equipped with a GPS receiver that uses satellite signals to calculate current locations. Some GPS service functions use the Internet. Data communication fee may happen when transferring data via GPS.
- To use a function which requires a GPS receiver for positioning of your current location, check for an unimpeded view of the sky. Move to another location if your current location is not determined after a few minutes.
- In order to calculate the current location faster, do not move or cover GPS antenna with other objects.
- It may take up to ten minutes to determine current locations when the GPS functions are used for the first time.

- Google Maps does not work for all nations or regions.
- Your current location may not be detected with just a 3G/Wi-Fi connection.

- Tap S to search for routes according to "Departure time", "Arrival time" and "Last available time".
- When search a route by mass transit system, tap "Show earlier trips" or "Show later trips", to search for routes at earlier or later times. Also, when routes are searched via Car or On foot, tap
 Stodisplay the changes in directions for the points on the routes on the maps.
