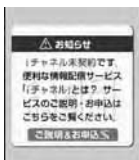

- Battery packs may leak, overheat, rupture or ignite.



Don't

Do not attempt to incinerate battery packs.

- Battery packs may leak, overheat, rupture or ignite.



Don't

Do not puncture the battery pack, or strike it with a heavy blow.

- Battery packs may leak, overheat, rupture or ignite.



Do

If battery fluid somehow gets into your eyes, immediately flush your eyes with clean water and immediately seek emergency medical advice.

- Do not rub your eyes.



WARNING



Do

If normal charging time has elapsed but charging does not complete, stop the charging anyhow.

- Battery packs may leak, overheat, rupture or ignite.



Do

If the battery fluid gets on your skin or clothes, immediately stop using the battery pack and rinse with clean running water.

- Failure to do so may cause injury on your skin.



Do

If you see that battery pack is leaking, or if it smells bad, stop using it.

- Be sure to keep a leak battery pack away from open flames since the battery fluid is highly inflammable and could ignite or explode.



CAUTION



Don't

After its useful life, a battery pack should be properly disposed of. Do not dispose of exhaust batteries with ordinary household waste.

- Battery packs which are not disposed of properly may burn, explode or cause environmental damage. Cover the battery terminals with a non-conductive tape and take them to a service counter such as DoCoMo shop or dispose of them in accordance with procedures for disposing of battery packs set up by your local authorities.

Precautions for Adapters (Including the Chargers)



WARNING



Don't

Do not use a damaged adapter (including the charger) or one with a damaged power cord.

- Electric shock, overheating or ignition may result.



Don't

Do not use the AC adapter or Desktop Holder in places with a very high level of humidity such as a bath.

- You could suffer an electric shock.



Don't

Use the DC adapter only in a negative (-) ground vehicle. It is not designed for use in a positive (+) ground vehicle.

- Otherwise, ignition may result.



Don't

If you hear thunder, do not touch the FOMA handset or adapter (including the charger).

- There is a risk that you may receive an electrical shock or even be struck by lightning.



Don't

Do not short-circuit the Charging Terminal when the adapter is plugged into the outlet or cigarette lighter socket. Also, never touch the Charging Terminal with fingers or other bare skin.

- Doing so could cause fire, equipment failure, electric shock or other injury.



Don't

Place the charger or Desktop Holder on a stable location during charging. In addition, do not cover or wrap the charger in cloth or bedding.

- If cooling air is restricted by wrapping the device, it may overheat, ignite or fail.



No wet hands

Do not touch the power cord of the adapter (including the charger), or the outlet with wet hands.

- You could suffer an electric shock.



Do

Use the adapter only with the specified power source and voltage.

- Failing to do so may result in fire or malfunction. When you use the FOMA handset overseas, use the AC adapter appropriate for the location.

AC adapter: AC 100V

DC adapter: DC 12V, 24V (only for a negative ground car)

Available AC adapter overseas:

AC100-240V (plug into a home AC outlet)



Do

If you below the fuse of the DC adapter, replace it with the specified fuse.

- The use of an incorrect fuse may cause fire or malfunction. See the user's manual supplied with the adapter for the specified fuse.



Do

Keep the power plug dust-free.

- Otherwise, ignition may result.



Do

When plugging the adapter (including the charger) into an outlet, plug it in firmly, being careful not to let it contact with metal lanyards or the like.

- Otherwise, electric shock, a short-circuit or fire may result.



Unplug

If you are not planning to use the AC adapter for a long period of time, unplug it from the outlet.

- Otherwise, electrical shock, fire or malfunction may result.



Unplug

If the Adapter gets wet, unplug it immediately from the outlet or cigarette lighter socket.

- A wet adapter can cause electric shock, smoke or fire.



CAUTION



Don't

Do not place heavy objects on the adapter (including the charger) cord and power cord.

- Electric shock or fire may result.



Do

Always hold the adapter (including the charger) firmly when pulling it out of the outlet or cigarette lighter socket.

- If you pull on the cord instead of the adapter or plug, the cord could come loose or be damaged resulting in electric shock or fire.



Unplug

Before cleaning, pull the plug out of the outlet or cigarette lighter socket.

- You could suffer an electric shock.

Precautions for the UIM



CAUTION



Do

Be careful not to touch the edge of UIM (IC portion) when removing it.

- Your hands or fingers may be injured.

Notes on Using near Electronics Medical Equipment

- The description below meets "Guideline on the Use of Radio-communication Equipment such as Cellular Telephones - Safeguards for Electronic Medical Equipment" by the Electromagnetic Compatibility Conference Japan.



WARNING



Do

Be sure to adhere to the following regulations inside medical facilities:

- Keep the FOMA handset out of operating rooms (ORs), intensive care units (ICUs) or coronary care units (CCUs).
- Turn off the FOMA handset in hospital wards.
- Turn off the FOMA handset in hospital lobbies and corridors if electrical medical devices could be nearby.
- If the medical facility has specific zones where use or possession of handsets is prohibited, follow those regulations.
- If the function which automatically turns on your FOMA handset is set, cancel the setting before turning it off.



Do

Turn off the FOMA handset in crowded trains or other public places where implanted cardiac pacemaker or defibrillator wearers could be nearby.

- Operation of an implanted cardiac pacemaker or implanted defibrillator may be affected by radio waves.



Do

If you use an implanted cardiac pacemaker or implanted defibrillator, use the FOMA handset 22cm or more away from the implanted cardiac pacemaker or implanted defibrillator.

- Operation of an implanted cardiac pacemaker or implanted defibrillator may be affected by radio waves.



Do

Patients using electronic medical equipment other than implanted cardiac pacemakers or implanted defibrillators (outside medical facilities for treatment at home, etc.) should check the influence of radio waves upon the equipment by consulting the manufacturer.

- Operation of electronic medical equipment may be affected by radio waves.

Handling and Care

General Usage Guidelines

■ Do not let the equipment get wet.

The FOMA handset, battery pack, adapter (including the charger) and UIM are not waterproof. Do not use them in places with high humidity such as a bath or where rain may get it wet. If you carry them close to your body, moisture from sweat may corrode the internal parts causing a malfunction. Note that malfunctions deemed to be caused by water are not covered by the warranty, and may be impossible to repair. Since these malfunctions are not under warranty, even when repair is possible, it will be done at the user's expense.

■ Clean the FOMA handset with a dry, soft cloth (Lens cleaning cloth).

- The Display of the FOMA handset sometimes has a special coating so that it is easier to see. If you rub the Display roughly with a dry cloth, it may be scratched. Take care of the way of handling, and use only a dry, soft cloth such as used for cleaning glasses. If the Display is left with water drop or stain adhered, smear may be generated or the coating may peel off.
- Do not use alcohol, thinner, benzene, detergent or other solvents for cleaning, otherwise the printing may be removed or discoloration may result.

■ Occasionally clean the connector terminal with a dry cotton swab.

If the connector terminal becomes dirty, the connection may become intermittent because power disconnects or the battery is not fully charged. Wipe the connector terminal with a clean dry cloth or cotton swab.

■ Do not place the equipment near air conditioner outlets.

Condensation may form due to rapid changes in temperature, and this may corrode internal parts and cause malfunction.

■ Do not use excessive force using the FOMA handset or the battery pack

If the FOMA handset is inserted to a full bag, or placed in a pocket and sat on, its LCD and/or internal PCBs may be damaged or malfunction. And if external devices are inserted to the external connector terminal, the connector may be damaged or malfunction.

■ Do carefully read each manual attached to the battery pack, adapter, or Desktop Holder (including the charger).

Precautions for FOMA Handsets

■ Avoid extreme temperatures.

The FOMA handset should be used within a temperature range from 5°C to 35°C and a humidity range from 45% to 85%.

■ The FOMA handset may affect general phones, televisions or radios, etc. in use nearby. Use as far as possible from such appliances.

■ Keep a separate record of any information stored on the FOMA handset and store the copies in a safe location.

DoCoMo assumes no responsibility for the loss of any of your data.

■ Do not insert the the external devices to Headphone/Microphone Jack or the external connector terminal obliquely or do not pull out with the connector is inserted. it may cause damage or malfunction.

■ It is normal for the FOMA handset to become warm during use or while charging. You can continue to use it even if it is warm.

■ Do not leave the FOMA handset directly under the sunlight.

Pixels may become discolored or burn out.

Precautions for Battery Packs

■ Battery packs are expendable.

Depending on the use condition, the battery pack may be inflated as it comes to the end of its life. This is not a malfunction. Purchase the battery pack specified in this manual.

■ Charge the battery pack in a place with an ambient temperature of 5°C to 35°C.

■ Be sure to charge the battery pack before you first use the FOMA handset or after you have not used it for a long time.

■ The actual time that a battery pack holds its charge depends on how the FOMA handset is used and how close the battery pack is to the end of its useful life.

■ The battery pack may bulge towards the end of its useful life. This is normal.

- **When you are not using a battery pack, keep it in a cool dry place away from direct sunlight.**

If you are not planning to use the FOMA handset for a long time, remove the battery pack from the FOMA handset after its power has been completely drained. Keep the battery pack in its original plastic bag.

- **If the battery packs are damaged or deformed as by dropping the handset, contact a repair counter.**

Precautions for Adapters (Including the Chargers)

- **Charge the battery pack in a place with an ambient temperature of 5°C to 35°C.**
- **Charge the battery pack where:**
 - There is very little humidity, vibration, and dust.
 - There are no general phones, television sets or radios nearby.
- **It is normal for the adapters (including the chargers) to become warm while using or charging the FOMA handset. You can continue to use it even if they become warm.**
- **Only use the DC adapter when the car engine is running.**
The car battery could be depleted.
- **When using a outlet with a latch mechanism, observe the precautions that came with the outlet.**
- **Do not subject the adapters to sharp impacts. Also, do not bend the Charging Terminal and terminal guide.**
Malfunction may result.

Precautions for UIMs

- **Do not use excessive force to insert/remove the UIM.**
- **It is normal for the UIM to become warm during use. You can continue to use it even if it becomes warm.**
- **Note that NTT DoCoMo will not be liable for malfunctions occurring as the result of inserting and using a UIM with not recommended IC card reader/writer.**
- **Always keep the IC portion of the UIM clean.**
- **Clean the UIM with a soft, dry cloth (Lens cleaning cloth).**

- **Keep a separate record of any information stored on the UIM and store the copies in a safe location.**
DoCoMo assumes no responsibility for the loss of any of your data.

- **To protect the environment, please bring the old UIM to a service counter such as DoCoMo shop.**

- **Avoid extreme temperatures.**

- **Do not scratch, touch carelessly or short circuit the IC portion.**

Data loss or malfunction may result.

- **Do not drop or give shock to the UIM.**

Malfunction may result.

- **Do not bend the UIM or put heavy things on the UIM.**

Malfunction may result.

- **Do not insert the UIM with labels or stickers attached.**

Malfunction may result.

Camera Handling


If you seriously annoy others when using the FOMA handset, you may be liable for prosecution under applicable laws or regulations (such as the Public Nuisance Laws).



Please be considerate of other people's privacy when capturing and sending pictures using camera-equipped mobile phones.

Cautions

- **Never use a modified FOMA handset. Using a modified device violates the Radio Wave Law.**

The FOMA handset is given a certificate for conformity of technical standards of specified radio equipment based on the Radio Wave Law. To confirm this, the rating sticker on the FOMA handset has  written.

If you modify the internal components of the FOMA handset by removing screws, the certificate for conformity of technical standards becomes void.

Using the handset with the void certificate for conformity of technical standards violates the Radio Wave Law.

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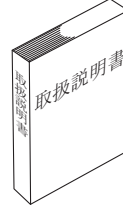

To vibrate the FOMA handset when you use the touchpad

Notes when Using the Touchpad

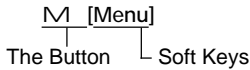

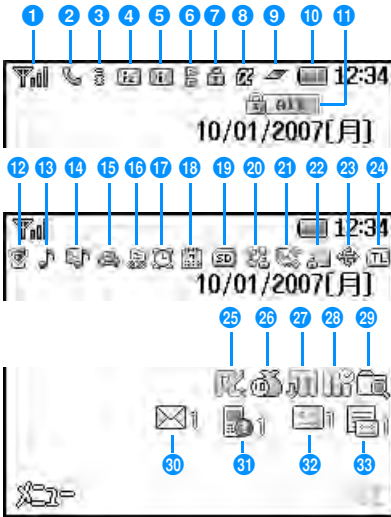



- The Display of the FOMA handset employs high-precision production technology, however, there may be instances where there are missing dots or dots that remain on. This is not a manufacturing defect.

Function mark assigned to the touchpad ([Show shortcut icons](#))

Icons indicating the function assigned to touchpad navigation key and  appear on the Stand-by display by default. For the functions assigned, see P26.



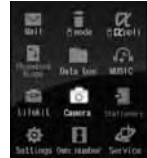

Selecting Menu Items

On your FOMA handset, you can configure execution settings, perform operations, or save items through the main menu or sub menu.

Selecting Functions from Main Menu

You can choose a function from the menu by using the navigation buttons or the dial buttons.

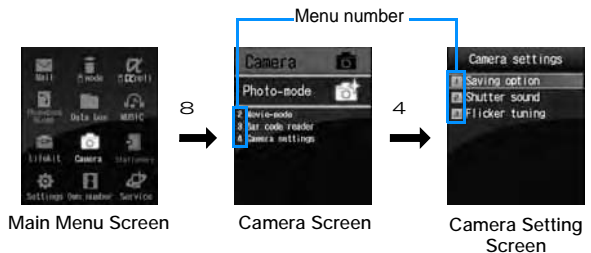

c From the Camera screen, press **4** that corresponds to the "Camera settings".



Basic Functions for Each Menu

Returning to the Previous Screen/the Stand-by Display

Press the following keys to return to the previous screen or pause/cancel the operation to return to the Stand-by display.

- **Q** : Return to the previous menu
- **P**: Returns to the Stand-by display. If a confirmation screen to exit is displayed, press "Yes" to return to the Stand-by display.

Note

- Depending on the operation on the FOMA handset, pressing **P/Q** may not return to the Stand-by display/the previous screen.

Selecting Setting Items

Option fields for a setting screen show the currently set options. To change a setting, select an option field and select an item from a list that opens.

- When **◀ ▶** is displayed to the right and left of an option field, use **J** to switch items.



Note

- The settings may not be switched depending on the items.

Authentication

For certain functions and services, it may be required for confirmation purposes to enter a password(P110). If the entry screen appears, use the dial buttons to enter the password and press **C** [OK]. If correctly entered, you can complete the function, or continue to use the function.

- The entered password will appear as "*" (Asterisk) marks.

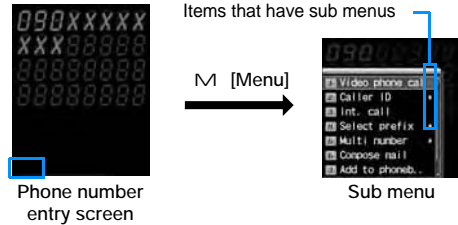

Sub Menu

When "Menu" is displayed on the Soft Key, you can call up the sub menu to perform various functions.

- The sub menu's display varies depending on the function or your FOMA headset's settings.



About the sub menu on the List Screen

On the sub menu for a list screen, there are some items that apply only to the highlighted item such as "Delete" and other items that apply all items on the list such as "Delete all". Move the cursor to the item before pressing M [Menu] when executing an operation that applies to only one item.

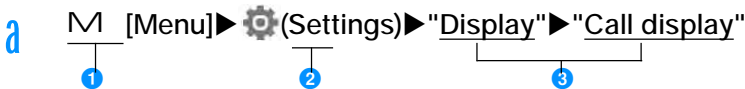

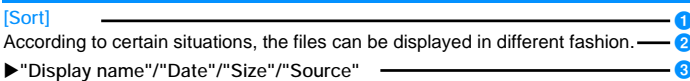

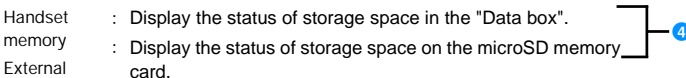

- ④ Item names, function description of items, and operation description of items after the selection of items.

Note

- If multiple sub menus such as the redial list screen and the redial detail screen are collectively described, some menu items that do not actually appear may be included (depending on the settings or screens).

Notation Rules

■ Description of steps starting from other than the Stand-by display

At the beginning of the description, the status of the handset or the screen to open such as "Ringing " or "List screen" is written.

■ Omitting C [Select] in selection operation

As shown in ③ in "Example of Operations" (P37), to explain a step to select an icon or a function from a list, operational steps such as pressing C [Select] are omitted.

Similarly, to explain steps to enter a password or fix entered characters, the operations for fixing such as C [OK] are omitted.

■ Omitting C when carrying out a function to make into

The instruction beginning with "Enable xxx checkbox" means that you have to enable the checkbox by pressing C to turn to shown beside the desired item.

Using the UIM (FOMA Card)

The UIM is an IC card that contains subscription information, such as your phone number. You can use communication functions including calls, mail, and i-mode communication by inserting the UIM into the handset. Inserting the UIM into another FOMA handset allows you to operate multiple FOMA handsets for various purposes.

For details on how to handle the UIM, refer to the UIM instruction manual.

Inserting/Removing the UIM

- After you turned off the handset following the steps described in "Turning the Power Off" (P46), turn the handset upside down, then remove or insert the battery pack.→P42
- Turn off the FOMA handset and remove the battery pack before inserting or removing the UIM.→P46

Inserting

To insert the UIM, close the FOMA handset and hold it with both hands.

- ① Insert the UIM in the direction of the arrow with the IC chip side down

Note

- Do not use excessive force inserting the UIM to avoid damaging it.

Removing

To remove the UIM, close the FOMA handset and hold it with both hands.

- ① Slide the UIM in the direction of the arrow and remove it from the FOMA Card Slot

Note

- Do not misplace the removed UIM.

Security Code for the UIM

You can assign the security code to the UIM, "PIN1 code" and "PIN2 code". →P111

Operations Restricted by the UIM

The UIM operation restriction function is embedded in the FOMA handset as a security function to protect your data and files.

- UIM restrictions will be set automatically to data or files if an i-appli is launched or if the data or files are obtained in one of the following methods, with the UIM inserted in the FOMA handset:
 - Images or melodies downloaded from sites or Web pages
 - Site or Web pages saved as Screen memos
 - i-mode mail received with attachments
 - i-appli launched
 - Data, files or applications with UIM restrictions set can be viewed, played, attached to i-mode mail, launched, sent/received via infrared, or copied to a microSD memory card only when the UIM that was inserted when the data, files or applications were obtained is inserted. If the UIM that was inserted is replaced with another UIM, these data and files become unavailable.
 - The following data/files are restricted:
 - Files attached to i-mode mail
 - Files (ringtones / pictures) that are attached to MessageR/FS.
 - Files contained in Screen Memos
 - Images inserted in the main text of Deco-mail
 - i-motion
 - i-appli
 - Images (including Flash animations)
 - Chaku-Uta®/Chaku-Uta-Furu (Downloaded Music)®
 - Melody
 - Motion-restricted data, including mail templates.
 - Music Channel episodes
- * "Chaku-Uta" is a registered trademark of Sony Music Entertainment Inc.

* Hereafter, the UIM that was inserted when the data or files were obtained is called "your UIM" and any other UIM is "another UIM".

Note

- Even if you have set the data/files restricted with this function for the Stand-by display, the settings will revert to their factory-default settings temporarily if another UIM is inserted (or if no FOMA card is inserted). When you re-insert your UIM, it will restore the phone to your original settings.
- Pre-installed i-appli programs are not restricted. However, if you delete an i-appli and then download it, the newly-downloaded i-appli program will be restricted.
- The following data/files are not restricted with this function:
 - Data/files obtained by using Infrared communication, the microSD memory card, or data communications
 - Images captured/edited using your FOMA handset
- Even if a different UIM from the time when data/files were obtained is inserted, the data/files restricted with this function can be deleted.
- Settings that are saved on the UIM are as follows:< (Confirming specs)>
 - Phone number display - SMS Center settings - PIN1 and PIN2
 - Select language - SMS validity period setting - Setting to enable or disable DoCoMo certificate 1
- If the UIM is inserted into another i-Channel compatible handset, the ticker will not appear. The latest information is downloaded and ticker is shown after you press \square for 1+ seconds to obtain the channel list.

WORLD WING

WORLD WING is DoCoMo's FOMA international roaming service that provides telephone and other types of mobile communications. It allows the subscriber's phone number to stay constant overseas by inserting the UIM(green/white) into a FOMA handset or a mobile phone designed for overseas use (W-CDMA or GSM systems).

- If you subscribed to the FOMA service after September 1, 2005, a separate subscription is not required. However, if you unsubscribed to the FOMA service subscription or canceled the service, a separate subscription is required.
- If you initially subscribed to the FOMA service before August 31, 2005 and have not subscribed to "WORLD WING", a separate subscription is required.
- This service is not available with some billing plans.
- In the case that your UIM (green/white) is lost or stolen overseas, contact DoCoMo immediately and temporarily suspend your subscription. For contact information, see "DoCoMo Information Center" on the back of this manual. Call and communication charges apply after the handset was lost or stolen are still charged to you.

Inserting/Removing the Battery Pack

- Turn off the handset and hold it closed in your hand.

Inserting

- ① While pushing the rear cover in the direction of the arrow ①, slide the cover in the direction of arrow ②. Pick up the cover as shown by arrow ③.
- ② Align the metal contacts of the battery pack and the FOMA handset, attach the battery pack in the direction of the arrow ①, and insert the battery pack in the direction of the arrow ②.
 - When mounting the battery pack, press it underneath the tab and push it down.
- ③ Align the tabs for Rear Cover and while pushing it in the direction of arrow ①, slide it in the direction of arrow ②; push until you hear a "click" sound.

Make sure there are no gaps between the FOMA headset and the rear cover.

Hold the battery pack with the product name side up.

Note

- For further details on how to handle the Battery Pack, refer to the Battery Pack L03 instruction manual.

Removing

- ① While pushing the rear cover in the direction of the arrow ①, slide the cover in the direction of arrow ②. Pick up the cover as shown by arrow ③.
- ② Press down the battery pack in the direction of the arrow ①, lift the tab in the direction of the arrow ②, and remove in the direction of the arrow ③.

Note

- For further details on how to handle the Battery Pack, refer to the Battery Pack L03 instruction manual.

Charging the Mobile Handset

Use the AC adapter (optional), Desk Adapter (optional) or DC adapter (optional) designed for the handset to charge the FOMA handset. When using the FOMA handset abroad, you must use the FOMA foreign use AC adapter 01 (sold separately). To make full use of the FOMA handset, use the Battery Pack L03 exclusively designed for the handset.

■ Battery pack lifetime

- Battery packs are expendable. As charging is repeated, available time by each charging will gradually become shorter.
- When the available time of each charging becomes approximately half of that of the time of purchase, it is recommended to replace the current battery pack with a new one as early as possible. It is normal for the battery pack to grow in size towards the end of its operational lifetime.
- If the i-appli or video phone functions are used for long periods of time while charging the battery pack, the battery pack lifetime will be reduced.

To protect the environmental, be sure to bring the exhausted battery pack to an NTT DoCoMo store, sales agent, or recycle shop.



■ **Charging**

- For details, refer to the instruction manuals for the FOMA AC Adapter 01/02(optional), FOMA Overseas/Domestic AC Adapter 01 (optional) and FOMA DC Adapter 01 /02(optional).
- The FOMA AC Adapter 01 can be used only for AC100V. The FOMA AC Adapter 02 can be used from AC100V to 240V.
- Even though the FOMA Overseas/Domestic AC Adapter 01 can be used from AC100V to 240V, the shape of the AC adapter plug is for AC100V (for Japan). When you use the FOMA handset overseas, a conversion plug adapter appropriate for the location may be required. Do not charge the handset with a transformer designed for overseas trips.
- Insert the battery pack into the FOMA handset before charging the battery pack with the AC or DC adapter. The battery pack cannot be charged unless it is in the handset.
- Plug/Unplug the connector slowly and securely while avoiding excess force.
- Even during a call, the charge start tone sounds from the Earpiece (if you start charging during a call).
- If you start charging the battery pack when it is empty, the handset may not be turned on for a while.
- During a long video call while charging, the inside of the FOMA handset may become hot and charging may stop. If this happens, try charging again later.

■ **Do not charge the battery pack for a long time (several days) with the handset power turned on.**

- If the FOMA handset is left with the power turned on for a long time while charging, after the charging completes, the handset uses the power supplied from the battery pack, and the actual time to use the battery pack becomes short and the low battery alert may sound in a short time. In this case, recharge the battery pack properly. When recharging the battery pack, once disconnect the AC adapter or DC adapter from the handset and reconnect it, then start recharging.

■ **Approximate battery pack usage time**

The battery pack usage time may vary depending on the operating environment and the battery pack deterioration.

- Continuous call time is approximate duration of time to be spent for talking with normal radio wave reception level.
- Continuous standby time is approximate duration of battery time while in motion. Depending on the battery level, set functions, operating environment such as ambient temperature, or radio wave reception level (Poor or weak radio wave reception level), battery life can reduced to half. When i-mode communications are performed, the call (communication)/standby time becomes shorter. Even if you do not make calls or perform i-mode communications, the call (communication)/standby time becomes short if you compose an i-mode mail, start a downloaded i-appli, start the i-appli Stand-by display, perform data communications or multiaccess, use a camera, or playback videos or music.
- Depending on network conditions in your location, this may be shorter than the published values.
- Continuous standby time in a stationary state is the average usage time in a stationary state with normal radio wave reception level while the handset is closed.
- Continuous standby time in motion is the average usage time in a state combining "standstill", "in motion" and "out of service area" in an area with normal radio wave reception level while the handset is closed.

■ **Estimated battery pack charging time**

- The estimated charging time is the duration of time to charge the battery pack with the FOMA handset turned off and with a fully drained battery pack. The charging time becomes longer with the FOMA handset turned on.

Charging with the AC Adaptor and the Desk Adaptor

a The AC Adaptor (optional) attaches to the Desk Adaptor.

b The AC Adaptor plug connects to the outlet.

c Insert the head of FOMA handset into the Desk Adaptor's stopper as shown by arrow **1**. While doing that, push down the bottom of the FOMA handset in the direction of an arrow **2**.

- The charge start tone sounds and charging begins.
- Make sure the FOMA handset is flush against the desktop holder. Be careful not to nip the connector cap or straps between the handset and the holder.
- When charging finishes, a Charging complete sound will be heard.

d Once charging is complete, while holding down the desk adaptor with your fingers, firmly remove the FOMA headset from the adaptor.

- During long periods of disuse, please disconnect the AC adaptor from the outlet.



- Make sure the AC Adaptor's connector is facing the correct side. Forcibly trying to remove the adaptor could damage the handset.

■ DC adapter (optional)

- A fuse (2A) is a consumable item. Purchase a replacement fuse from any car parts shop.
- Do not charge while the car engine is not running to avoid exhausting the car battery.

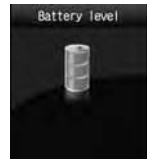

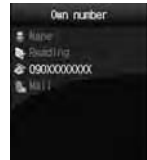

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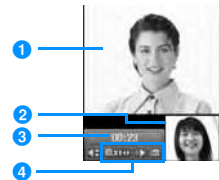
About Video Phone

The Video phone function can be used with a handset that supports DoCoMo's Video phone service.

- DoCoMo's Video phone service complies with "ISO 3GPP*1 standardized 3G-324M*2." DoCoMo's Video phone cannot connect with handsets that support a different form of video call.
 - * 1: 3GPP (3rd Generation Partnership Project) is local standardization organization established for the development of common technical specifications related to 3rd Generation Mobile Communication System (IMT-2000).
 - * 2: 3G-324M is the international standard of 3rd Generation Mobile Video Phone.
- Though Video phone may have communication speeds of 64K (64K bps) or 32K (32K bps), this FOMA handset cannot make 32K Video call.
- This FOMA handset does not support remote monitoring.

Components of Video Call Screen

- 1 Main window
The other party's image appears by default.
- 2 Sub window
Your image appears by default.
- 3 Call Duration
Display in the format of Minutes: Seconds.
- 4 Settings icons
 - Zoom Adjustment→P53
 - Handsfree ON/OFF State Display→P49

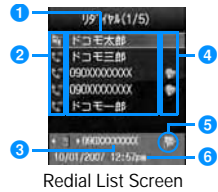

Making International Calls

WORLD CALL is an international calling service available on DoCoMo mobile phones. FOMA service subscribers are also signed up for WORLD CALL at the time of initial subscription (except subscribers explicitly declining this service).

- This service works with approximately 240 countries and regions around the world.
- Charges for "WORLD CALL" are added to the monthly FOMA service call charges.
- No initial fee and no fixed monthly charges apply.
- This service is not available with some billing plans.
- For details on WORLD CALL, contact the "DoCoMo Information Center" shown at the back of this manual.
- When using international carriers other than DoCoMo, please contact the carrier directly.

Change to the International Call Dialing Procedure

The "MY LINE" service is not applicable to mobile phone communications, including WORLD CALL service. Along with the introduction of the "MY LINE" service, the dialing procedure for international communications using a mobile phone has been changed. Consequently, the previous dialing procedure (Omitting "010" from the following dialing procedure) can no longer be used.

If an overseas party uses a specific 3G mobile phone, you can make an International video call to that party by pressing **M** [Menu] ► Select "Video phone call" after the following dialing procedures.

- For information about the countries where connection can be made and telecommunications carriers, visit the DoCoMo's web site.
- The other party's image displayed on the FOMA handset may blur and may be unable to be connected depending on the handset connecting the international video-phone.

Warning about Passwords

- Avoid setting a password using your birthday, a part of your phone number, your address or room number, 1111 or 1234, that can be easily guessed by others. Be sure to write down the set passwords and store them in a separate location.
- Do not reveal your passwords to others. DoCoMo is not responsible for damage caused by misuse of your security codes by others.
- DoCoMo will never ask you for your passwords.
- If you forget your passwords, you need to bring an ID (driver's license, etc.), the handset and the UIM to a service counter such as DoCoMo shop. For details, contact a "DoCoMo Information Center" on the back of this manual.

Security Code

The Security Code is a 4-8 digit number. The Security Code is set to "0000" by default and , however, you can change the code by yourself.→P111

If the Security Code entry screen opens, enter the 4~8 digit Security Code and press C [OK].

- The Security Code is marked as "*" on the screen. The actual numbers entered will not be displayed.

UIM PIN/UIM PIN2

You can assign 2 PIN numbers to the UIM, UIM PIN and UIM PIN2. These codes are set to "0000" by default, however, you can change them by yourself. →P112
The UIM PIN is a 4- to 8-digit number (code) required to identify the user every time the UIM is inserted into the handset or the handset power is turned on in order to prevent unauthorized use. The UIM PIN entry is required to make or receive calls, and operate the handset. The UIM PIN2 is a 4- to 8-digit number used to reset outgoing call charges, incoming call charges (if any) and the total of both, to reset total call charges, to set the maximum limit for call charges, to set the currency, or to use or apply for User certificates.

If the UIM PIN/UIM PIN2 entry screen opens, enter the 4- to 8-digit UIM PIN/ UIM PIN2 and press C [OK].

- The entered UIM PIN/UIM PIN2 is marked as "*" on the screen. The numbers actually entered will not be displayed.
- Use the UIM PIN and UIM PIN2 you set previously if you purchase a new handset but keep the same UIM.

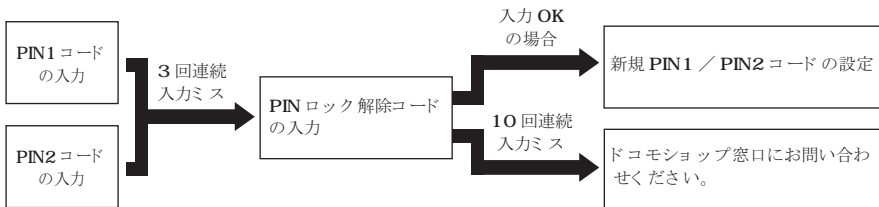

Camera

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Before Using the Camera

Notes for Capturing Images

- The camera employs high precision technology, but some pixels or lines may seem brighter or darker than others. Also, when capturing in places with insufficient lighting, noise, seen as white lines, increases. This is normal.
- Clean the lens with a soft cloth before capturing. If the lens is stained with fingerprints or oil, the captured image may appear out of focus or blurred.
- Do not leave the handset in a warm place or under a direct sunlight for a long period. The image or video to capture may deteriorate.
- If you capture under a fluorescent light, mercury lamp or sodium lamp flickering at high speed, flickering such as stripes may appear. The color tone of still images or movies may vary depending on the capturing timing.
- Do not expose the lens to direct sunlight for a long period and do not capture at the sun or bright lamp directly. The image may become discolored or the camera may fail.
- Do not cover the lens with your fingers, hair or the handset lanyard when capturing.
- Capturing a fast moving object may result in an image slightly distorted from the image displayed on the screen at the time of capturing, or the image may be blurred.
- When the battery level is low, you may not be able to save captured still images or movies. Check the battery level before capturing.
- Captured still images or movies may differ from the actual subjects in brightness or color tone.
- Even in Manner mode, the shutter tone sounds at a fixed volume. The shutter tone sounds from the Speaker even when a Flat-plug earphone/microphone with switch (optional) is connected to the FOMA handset.

■ QR codes

The QR code is one of the 2 dimensional codes that expresses text including Kanji, Kana or Pictograph (E-Moji) in the vertical and horizontal patterns. Some QR codes have an image or melody embedded, and there are split QR codes where multiple images contain 1 larger piece of information.

<Common Functions>

- Barcodes other than Japan Article Number code and QR Codes and 2 dimensional codes cannot be scanned.
- Barcodes may not be correctly scanned because of scar, smudge, damage, printing quality or reflection of lights.
- Some codes may not be scanned depending on the type, size or QR code version.
- If trying to save more than 5 pieces of data, you will see a message asking to delete older data first. "Yes"▶Select Scanner▶Select "Yes".
- If Bar code reader can not scan the code within 30 seconds after activation, a message indicating that it fails to scan the code appears. And if the Bar code reader can not scan the code in a certain period of time, it automatically ends.

<Compose message/Send Mail>

i-mode is a service that makes use of the display of the FOMA handset supporting i-mode (i-mode handset) to enable you to use online services such as sites (programs) access, Internet access and i-mode mail.

- i-mode is a fee-based service requiring a separate subscription. For details on subscription, contact the "DoCoMo Information Center" on the back of this manual.
- The i-mode service contents are subject to change. For details, refer to the latest "Mobile Phone User's Guide [i-mode]" .

Before Using i-mode

- Contents of sites (programs) and web sites are generally protected by copyright law. Data, such as text or images you download to the i-mode handset from sites (programs) or web sites, can be used only for personal entertainment but cannot be used, in whole or in part, as it is or after modification, for sale or redistribution, without the consent of the copyright holders.
- It is possible that contents saved on the i-mode handset (Mail, Message R/F, Screen memo, i-appli, i-motion) or Bookmarks will be deleted if the battery pack is removed for more than a month.
It is recommended that you make a copy of important data and keep it in a separate place. DoCoMo is not responsible for lost data .
- If you insert another UIM or turn the handset power on without the UIM, depending on the model of the handset, still images, videos, melodies, mail attachments (still images, videos or melodies), screen memos or Messages R/F cannot be viewed or played.
- When the data with UIM restriction is set as the Stand-by display or Ring alert, the setting will revert to its default if a different UIM is inserted or the handset power is turned on without a UIM.

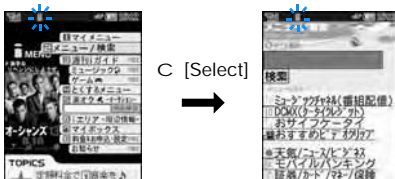

This action does not reveal your postal address, age, or sex to the information provider.

When an SSL page is acquired

The right screen opens when you access an SSL site. After acquisition is completed, the SSL page opens and  is displayed on the top of the screen.



To return to a normal site

The right screen opens when you return to a non-SSL site. Select "Yes" to return to a normal site, and  disappears.



Note

- If the SSL Certificate has already expired or the site does not support SSL, a warning indicating that this site may not be secure may appear. When connecting, select "Yes". However, your personal information (credit card number or contact address) may not be sent safely.

Last URL

Open the Most Recently Accessed Web Site

After i-mode is terminated, the URL of the last open page is saved in "Last URL". You can re-connect to the most recently accessed page using Last URL.

Operations on i-mode/ Web Sites

This section describes basic operations on i-mode/ Web sites (pages).

Going Back to the Previous Page/ Going to the Next Page

FOMA handset temporarily saves the displayed site data in a cache.

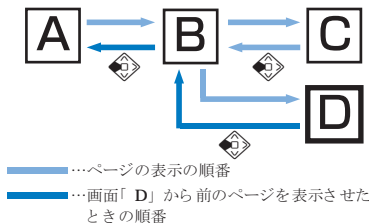
Data saved to the cache can be displayed, without visiting the site, by pressing J .

- However, the site will be reloaded if the data is larger than the cache size, or if the site requires the latest information always be loaded.
- Entered characters or settings at the site will not be stored in the cache.
- Terminating i-mode deletes data from the cache.

Ex. Pages are displayed in the order of Screen

"A"→"B"→"C"→"B"→"D"

If opening the pages in the order "A"→"B"→"C", then returning to "B", and opening "D", "C" is deleted from the cache. Pressing J displays "B"→"D".




Note

- When a Flash file is played, displayed action may be different from a standard site display.

Displaying Flash Animations

The FOMA handset supports Flash, an animation technology using images and sounds. You can access sites that provide various kinds of animations using the handset. You can also download a Flash file and set it as the Stand-by display.

Note

- Even if a Flash file is shown, the animation may not be shown correctly.
- Some Flash files can use data saved on your handset. To allow Flash files to use the data, set "Use phone info" to "Yes".
- Some Flash files play sound effects. To turn off sound effects, set "Sound effect" to "OFF".

- If you play a Flash file with vibration set, the handset vibrates regardless of what the "Sounds&Vibration" setting is on the handset.
- Flash files are not displayed if "Image" is set to "OFF".
- In some cases, the Flash file cannot be viewed if it was saved or set as a Screen memo, but can be viewed on the site.
- Flash sound effects are not played if they are set to the Stand-by display / Call Display.

Adding Mail Address/Phone Number to Phonebook

Saves the displayed phone number or mail address on the site page to the phonebook.

i-motion

i-motions are composed of video and sound files. They can be obtained from sites, played, saved, and even as the Stand-by display or Ringer ID, etc.

i-motion Types

There are 2 types of i-motion movies.

■ Standard

There are 2 forms standard type.

- ① Playback after downloading-type (Up to 500KB)
 - ② Playback while downloading-type (Up to 500KB)
- Some standard type i-motion movies cannot be saved.

■ Streaming Type

Playback while downloading an i-motion movie. Up to 2MB of i-motion can be played. The data is deleted after playback. It cannot be saved on the FOMA handset.

Note

- i-motion movies that can be downloaded and played are in MP4 (Mobile MP4) format. i-motion movies in ASF format cannot be downloaded or played.
- When you fast forward/rewind an i-motion movie during playback, only sound is played; video may not be displayed correctly.

Introduction to i-motion

Downloading i-motion Movies from Sites

Up to 1000 i-motion movies can be saved. However, the savable number depends on the amount of the data.

- Downloaded i-motions are saved in the "i-mode" folder under "i-motion" in the "Data box".

- a** On a site ▶ Select an i-motion

- When "i-motion auto play" is set to "ON", an i-motion movie is played automatically after being downloaded. Operations during Playback → P201

- Streaming-Type i-motions
 - Playback confirmation screen opens. When "Yes" is selected, the i-motion plays during download.
 - If "i-motion type" is set to "Standard type", streaming is impossible. If switching between "Std/Streaming", please download the i-motion again.→P153

b After download **Q** ▶ "Save"

Play

: Play a downloaded i-motion movie.

File property

: Display detailed information about the downloaded i-motion movie.

Back

: Returns to the site display page without saving the i-motion.

Note

- Depending on the connected site or i-motion movie, the i-motion movie may not be downloaded, or played during the download.
- If you play a movie while downloading it, the movie may stop playing or the picture may become distorted due to signal reception.
- Some i-motion movies cannot be saved on the FOMA handset.
- The file cannot be saved if a file of the same name already exist in the folder.
- Some i-motion movies have playback restrictions.
If an i-motion has a restricted playback (IE: repetitions/length of time, or an expiry date), ★ is displayed. An i-motion movie with playback period restrictions cannot be played prior to or after the restriction period.
- Some downloaded i-motion movies may not play correctly.

■ Information

The stored content may be lost due to the handset failure or repair. DoCoMo is not responsible for lost data. It is recommended that you keep saved content from the handset on a microSD memory card. You can connect the handset to a PC using Data Link Software and a FOMA USB Cable (optional) and save data to the PC.

When Ticker Text is Highlighted

When a ticker is set in an i-motion movie, the ticker is displayed during playback. You can use the Phone To, AV Phone To, Mail To or Web To function by selecting the highlighted phone number, mail address or URL.

a After ending i-motion playback▶M [Yes]

- To use the above functions while playing i-motion

Pause the i-motion to use Phone To, AV Phone To, Mail To, Web To function. While playing i-motion▶C /U ▶C ▶M [Yes].

i-motion Auto Play

Setting Whether to Play an i-motion Movie Automatically

About i-Channel

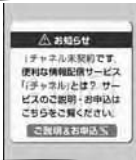
The service which DoCoMo or IP (Information Provider) provide graphical view of information such as news or weather forecasts, especially for i-Channel compatible handset.

It periodically updates information and displays it as a ticker on the Stand-by display. If \bigcirc is pressed for more than 1 second, the channel list is shown. Moreover, rich detail information can be acquired by selecting favorite channels from a channel list.

- Display method of Channel list→P155
- For precautions to take and more details about i-Channel, refer to "Mobile Phone User's Guide (i-mode<FOMA>)".

Before subscribing to the service

After the service subscription procedures have been completed

After subscribing to i-Channel, a ticker appears on the Stand-by display. At a fixed period of time, information is received or channel list is displayed.



\bigcirc (for 1+ sec)



Pressing \bigcirc for more than 1 second brings up the channel list. You can view in list format information, etc. given in ticker of each channel.

You can view detail information screen of each channel by selecting it.

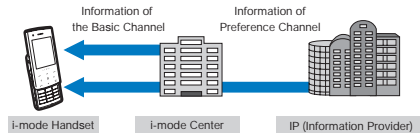
There are 2 types of channels: "Basic channels" and "Favorite channels".

"Basic channels" is channel provided by DoCoMo. Because it is registered by default, it is immediately available upon subscription to i-Channel. Packet communication charges applying to automatic update of information delivered for "Basic channels" is included in i-Channel service fee.

"Favorite channels" is provided by IP (Information Provider) other than DoCoMo and available when you register a favorite one. Packet communication charges applying to automatic update of information delivered for "Favorite channels" is not included in i-Channel service fee.

Information for "Basic channels" and "Favorite channels" can be displayed as a ticker on the Standby-display.

- Some "Favorite channels" may require an information fee for use.
- Some "Favorite channels" may require a separate subscription to their sponsoring IP (Information Provider).
- Both "Basic channels" and "Favorite channels" require packet communication charges for viewing detailed information from a channel list, on top of the i-Channel service fee.
- The i-Channel service charge does not include the packet communication charges for auto-updating the "Basic channels" information that is delivered during International Roaming.



- i-Channel is a fee-based service requiring a separate subscription (i-mode contract is necessary for subscription).

Trial Service

When you use an i-Channel compatible handset and have subscribed to i-mode, but not to i-Channel for the subscriber line using the i-Channel compatible handset, you can use "Basic channels" for a predetermined period of time without service charges. Note that you will be charged packet communication charges apply for viewing detail information from a channel list.


- For precautions and details of using the trial service, refer to "Mobile Phone User's Guide [i-mode]".

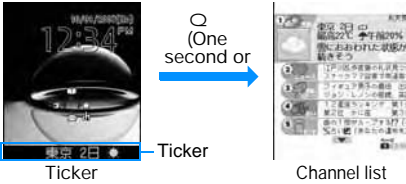
Trial service will be started automatically in principle when a predetermined period of time has elapsed after inserting UIM and starting to use i-Channel compatible handset. When automatic start is disabled, i-channel can be started by pressing \bigcirc for one second. Trial service can be used only once for 1 subscriber line. Trial service will be terminated automatically when a predetermined period of time has elapsed after the start. For the procedure to terminate it halfway, refer to "Mobile Phone User's Guide [i-mode]".

Displaying the i-mode Menu

When subscribed to an i-Channel, information appears, when received, as a ticker on the Stand-by Display.



- While receiving data,  blinks.
- Even when information is received, no ring alert or vibrator operates. Also, the Call Indicator does not light/blink.
- Information may not be received when the handset power is turned off, while out of service area, or when the signal reception is weak. Press  to receive information. The Stand-by display ticker will show the information automatically. Also, information may not be received while using default settings. In this case, hold down . The ticker on the Stand-by display will automatically display the information.
- In some conditions, information may be received only when a channel list is displayed.
- If you change the connection destination in "Host selection" of "i-mode setting", the connection destination of i-Channel is also changed. (Normally, you do not need to change the settings).
- The ticker will not appear after i-Channel is cancelled.

- There may be a notice of failure to acquire channel information in the following cases.
 - When i-Channel connection destination has been changed
 - When UIM has been replaced

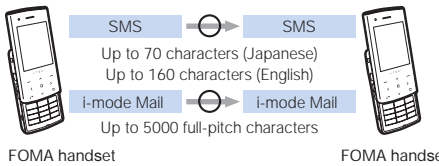

- Using SMS requires no i-mode subscription.

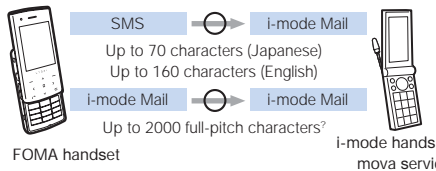

- SMS sent from a FOMA handset is received by a mova i-mode handset as an i-mode mail.
- When "SMS report request" is "ON", SMS cannot be sent to a mova i-mode handset.

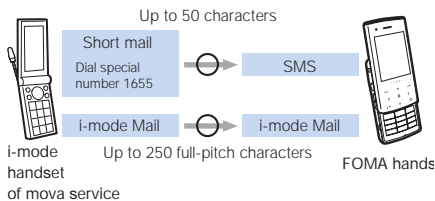

mova i-mode Handset→FOMA Handset

i-mode mails and SMS sent from mova i-mode handset can be received.

- Short mail* sent from a mova i-mode handset can be received by a FOMA handset as a SMS.



* : Short mail is a service that allows sending and receiving text messages with a mova handset.

What is i-mode Mail?

Upon subscription to i-mode, you can send and receive e-mails via internet, as well as between i-mode handsets (including mova handset).

On top of the text, a total of 2MB of attachments can be sent in 10 files (JPEG, etc.). Also, i-mode mail can be decorated by changing the font color, size, or background color of the message text. In addition, you can insert Deco-mail pictograms from the many pre-installed ones that can be inserted in the same manner as Pictographs, to easily create and send expressive mail.

The Mail address given at i-mode subscription is as below.

<When newly subscribing to i-mode>

Before the "@", a random number is inserted; please make certain of the Mail address.

Example: abc1234 ... 789xyz@docomo.ne.jp

Checking your mail address

- Between i-mode handsets (including mova handsets), mails can be sent and received using only the address preceding @.

- The i-mode service contents are subject to change. For details, refer to "Mobile Phone User's Guide [i-mode]".

■ Receive option

The subject of mail stored at the i-mode Center can be viewed beforehand; it can then be deleted (without downloading) or downloaded. →P167

Mail Setting

You can make various settings as described below. <Setting procedure>

"iMenu" → "English iMenu" → "Options" → "Mail Settings" → Specify each item

- For details, refer to "Mobile Phone User's Guide [i-mode]" that was provided when you subscribed to i-mode.

■ Changing your mail address [Mail Address (Change Mail Address)]

You can change characters preceding mark @ in a mail address, e.g., "docomo.xx_ab1234yz@docomo.ne.jp".

■ Confirm Mail Address [Mail Address (Confirm Mail Address)]

You can confirm the current mail address.

- Registering secret code [Mail Address (Other Settings) → Register a Secret Code]
When using a mail address of format "mobile phone number@docomo.ne.jp", you can register 4-digit secret code in addition to the mail address. Because mails with no secret code attached are not received, you can avoid receiving unnecessary messages.

- Resetting mail address [Mail Address (Other Settings) → Reset Mail Address]
You can set your mail address to "phone number@docomo.ne.jp".

■ Spam Mail Prevention

You can set your mail address to "mobile phone number@docomo.ne.jp".

- ① Reject Mail with URL[Spam Mail Prevention] → Reject mail with URL
Can set i-mode to reject mails classified by the NetStar corporation as being from Dating, Adult, Illegal and Insecure domains.
- ② Reject/Receive Mail Settings [Receiving Mail (Spam Mail Prevention) → Reject/Receive Mail Settings]
 - You can specify the senders from which you receive mails among DoCoMo, au, SoftBank, Tu-Ka and WILLCOM.
You can specify sender's domains or email addresses from which you receive mails. Also, you can exclude specific mail addresses to reject, even if they are from the accepted senders or domains you specified. You can reject mail pretending to use a mobile phone or PHS domain from Internet other than the above.

- ③ SMS Rejection Settings [Receiving Mail (Spam Mail Prevention) → SMS Rejection Settings]
 - You can restrict incoming SMS by selecting an option from "SMS一括拒否 (Reject All SMS)", "非通知SMS拒否 (Reject Anonymous SMS)", "国際SMS拒否 (Reject Intl. SMS)" or "非通知SMS及び国際SMS拒否 (Reject Anonymous and Intl. SMS)". You can also view the current settings.

- ④ Restricting reception of mails from mass i-mode mail senders [Receiving Mail (Other Settings) → Reject Mass i-mode Mail Senders]
 - You reject 201st and subsequent i-mode mails sent from one i-mode handset (including mova handset) a day. "Reject" is set by default, so you do not have to change the settings to reject messages sent from mass mail senders.

- ⑤ Reject Unsolicited Ad Mail [Receiving Mail (Other Settings) → Reject Unsolicited Ad Mail]
 - You reject reception of mails with "Reject Unsolicited Ad Mail" description added to a mail subject which are sent unilaterally for advertisement and/or promotion without agreement of the receiver. "Reject" is set by default, so you do not have to change the settings to reject such messages. (Senders are obligated by law to give description "未承諾広告* (Unsolicited Ad Mail)" (6 full-pitch characters) to the beginning of the mail subject field.)

- Limiting mail size [Receiving Mail (Limit Mail Size)]
You can limit i-mode mails to be received with the predetermined size.
- Confirm Settings [Receiving Mail (Confirm Settings)]
You can check the current settings of mail reception/rejection and others.
- Suspending mail function [Suspend Mail]
You can suspend the mail function in the i-mode Center when it is not necessary.

When Mail Cannot be Received

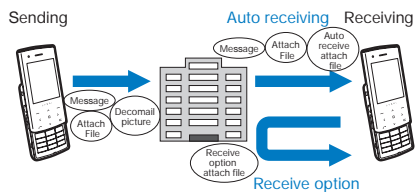
Mail delivered to i-mode Center will be immediately sent to your i-mode handset. When the i-mode handset is powered off or the i-mode service area or due to other reasons, the mail is held at the i-mode center, the center resends this mail to the i-mode handset within a span of 720 hours by the time you receive it.*

Also, if the Receive option settings are set, they allow a user to set which i-mode mails will be downloaded from the i-mode center.

* : Mails you have not received are stored in i-mode Center for 720 hours. Mail resend conditions change according to the unsend condition.

Other Functions

- Sending/Receiving Files
i-mode mails can store 2MB of attachments that can be of any type. A limit of 10 files, with a total size of 2MB, can be attached and sent. When receiving an i-mode mail (2MB), all files can be received, or just the first 100KB (Auto receive file attachment); any remaining files that are desired can be selected and downloaded (Selected attachment download). As well, the handset's file send settings permit leaving files less than 100KB on the server, letting the user choose whether or not to download it. Depending on the recipient's handset, some files may not be properly received because of included file types and sizes.



■ Deco-mail

You can create and send or receive enjoyable i-mode mail edited in a decorative manner such as changing the font size and/or background color or pasting an image in the text. The many preinstalled deco-mail pictographs, like emoticons, can be easily inserted into a mail and be sent. (In the case of emails sent from a PC, deco-mail pictographs may not display properly).

If deco-mail is sent to a non-supporting phone or one with a 10KB download limit, the other party may receive a mail containing URL. In this case, the receiver can view the Deco-mail by selecting the indicated URL.

SMS (Short Message Service)

You can send/receive text messages using only the mobile phone numbers without subscription to i-mode.

SMS (Short Message Service) Destination

SMS destination is "subscribed mobile phone number".

When SMS (Short Message Service) Messages Cannot be Received

SMS delivered to SMS Center will be immediately sent to your FOMA handset. Note that, however; when your FOMA handset is OFF or out of service area, the SMS is stored in SMS Center.

- The maximum storage period of SMS in SMS Center is 72 hours. The sender can specify the storage period within "SMS validity period". → P182
- SMS expired is automatically deleted.
- SMS stored in SMS Center can be received by "Check new SMS". →P182
- When SMS stored in SMS Center is received, it is deleted from SMS Center.

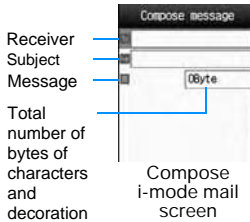

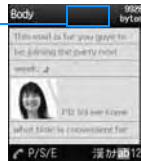

Creating and Sending Deco-mail

You can create your own designer mail by adding decorations such as changing font size, font color or background color, or inserting images when you edit i-mode mail messages.

- Deco-mail up to 100KB can be sent.
- 20 deco-mail items with 90KB of data can be inserted.
- When a Deco-mail is larger than 10KB, other than the following* Deco-mail compatible handsets will not browse itself but only URL to refer it.
 - * : 903i, 904i, 703i (except P703i μ), 704i model series
- When a non-compatible i-Mode handset sends a Deco-mail, the receiving handset sees only a URL. When a Deco-mail is larger than 10KB, some Deco-mail incompatible handsets will not browse it but only URL to refer it, and the other incompatible handsets will browse only Deco-mail's body text without URL.

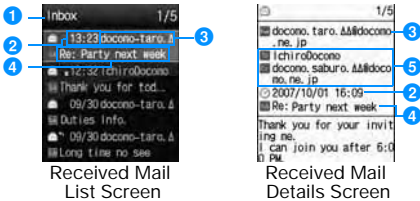
