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Browser

Menu 1.1

You can access various WAP (Wireless Application Protocol) services such as banking, news, weather reports and flight information. These services are specially designed for mobile phones and they are maintained by WAP service providers.

Check the availability of WAP services, pricing and tariffs with your network operator and/or the service provider whose service you wish to use. Service providers will also give you instructions on how to use their services.

Once connected, the homepage is displayed. The content depends on the service provider. To exit the browser at any time, press the () key.

Navigating with the WAP browser

You can surf the Internet using either the phone keys or the WAP browser menu.

When surfing the Internet, the phone keys function differently to phone mode.

Home

Bookmarks

Menu 1.2

This menu allows you to store the URL of favourite web pages for easy access at a later time.

To create a bookmark

- 1. Press the left soft key (Options).
- 2. Scroll to Add new and press the OK key.
- After entering the desired URL press the OK key. Add a title and press the OK key again.

After selecting a desired bookmark, the following options are available.

- ▶ Connect: Connects to the selected bookmark.
- ▶ Add new: Select this to create a new bookmark.
- ▶ Edit: You can edit the URL and/or the title of the selected bookmark.
- ▶ **Delete:** Deletes the selected bookmark.
- ▶ **Delete all:** Deletes all the bookmarks.

Menu 1.3

You can connect directly to the site you want. After entering a specific URL, press the OK key.

Settings

Menu 1.4

You can set the profile, cache, cookie and security related to Internet service.

WAP profiles (Menu 1.4.1)

A profile is the network information used to connect to the Internet.

There are default profiles for some operators, stored in the phone memory. It's impossible to rename default profiles.

Each profile has submenus as follows:

- ▶ Activate: Activates the selected profile.
- Settings: Use this to edit and change WAP settings for the selected profile.

- Homepage: This setting allows you to enter the address (URL) of a site you want to use as homepage. You do not need to type http:// at the front of each URL as the WAP Browser will automatically add it.
- Gateway settings: IP Adress/Port Number: You need to enter IP adress or Port number that you want.
- Connection type: This setting allows you to select the type among HTTP and HTTP with proxy and WAP.
- Network profile: You can select the relevant network profile.
- ▶ Rename: You can change the profile name.
- Add new: You can add a new profile.
- Delete: Deletes the selected profile from the list.
- ▶ Delete all: Deletes all profiles from the list.

Cache (Menu 1.4.2)

The information or services you have accessed are saved in the cache memory of the phone.

Clear cache (Menu 1.4.3)

Removes all context saved in cache.

Note

A cache is a buffer memory, which is used to save data temporarily.

Security certificates (Menu 1.4.4)

A list of the available certificates is shown.

- Authority: You can see the list of authority certificates that have been stored in your phone.
- Personal: You can see the list of personal certificates that have been stored in your phone.

WAP Information (Menu 1.4.5)

Call history

You can check the record of missed, dialled, and received calls only if the network supports the Calling Line Identification (CLI) within the service area.

The number and name (if available) are displayed together with the date and time at which the call was made. You can also view call times.

All calls

Menu 2.1

You can view all lists of outgoing or incoming calls.

Missed calls

Menu 2.2

This option lets you view the last 50 unanswered calls.

You can also:

- ▶ View the number if available and call it.
- ▶ Enter a name for the number and save it in your contacts.
- ▶ Send a message to this number.
- ▶ Delete the call from the list.

Dialled calls

Menu 2.3

This option lets you view the last 50 outgoing calls (called or attempted).

You can also:

- ▶ View the number if available and call it.
- Enter a name for the number and save it in your contacts.
- Send a message to this number.
- ▶ Delete the call from the list.

Received calls

Menu 2.4

This option lets you view the last 50 incoming calls.

You can also:

- ▶ View the number if available and call it.
- ▶ Enter a name for the number and save it in your contacts.
- ▶ Send a message to this number.
- Delete the call from the list.

Call duration

Menu 2.5

Allows you to view the duration of your incoming and outgoing calls. You can also reset the call times. The following timers are available:

- Last call: Length of the last call.
- ▶ Dialled calls: Length of the outgoing calls.
- Received calls: Length of the incoming calls.
- ➤ All calls: Total length of all calls made and incoming calls since the timer was last reset.

Call costs

Menu 2.6

Allows you to check the cost of your **Last call**, **All calls** and **Cost setting**. To reset the cost, you need to enter the PIN2 code.

Data information Menu 2.7

You can check the amount of data transferred over the network through the GPRS information option. In addition, you can also view how much time you are online.

Data time (Menu 2.7.1)

You can check the duration of **Last session** and **All sessions**. You can also **Reset** the call timers.

Data volume (Menu 2.7.2)

You can check the **Sent**, **Received** or **All** data volumes and **Reset**.

Favourites

Menu 3.1

This option allows you to add your own favourites to the list already provided. Once you create your own menu, you can access the desired function quickly in the idle screen by pressing the up navigation key.

Note

▶ Radio is already preset in favourites.

Alarm clock

Menu 3.2

You can set the alarm clock to go off at a specified time.

- Select **On** and enter the alarm time you want.
- Select the repeat period: Once, Mon-Fri, Mon-Sat, Sat-Wed, Sat-Thu and Everyday.
- Select the alarm tone you want and press [Set].

Calendar

Menu 3.3

When you enter this menu a Calendar will show up. On top of the screen there are sections for date. Whenever you change the date, the calendar will be updated according to the date. And square cursor will be used to locate the certain day. If you see under bar on the calendar, it means that there is a schedule or memo that day. This function helps to remind you of your schedule and memo. The phone will sound an alarm tone if you set this for the note. To change the day, month, and year:

Delete (Menu 3.3.4)

New schedule (Menu 3.3.5)

Allows you to add new schedule and memo for the chosen day. You can store up to 100 notes. Input the subject and then press left soft key [OK]. You enter the appropriate information in the follow section; Time, Repeat and Alarm.

Calendar (Menu 3.3.6)

Jump back to the calendar screen.

Go to date (Menu 3.3.7)

You can go the chosen date directly.

Alert tone (Menu 3.3.8)

You can set the alarm tone of each chosen date.

View all schedules (Menu 3.3.9)

View all schedules and memo for the chosen

day. Use to browse through the note lists. If you set alarm for the note, the alarm icon is displayed. If you want to view the note in detail, press left soft key [Select]. Press left soft key [Options] to delete, edit the note you selected.

Delete past (Menu 3.3.0)

You can delete the past schedules.

Delete all (Menu 3.3.*)

You can delete all scheduled items.

Calculator

Menu 3.4

This contains the standard functions such as +, -, x, \div : Addition, Subtraction,

Multiplication, and Division. Furthermore, you can use the various functions of the calculator such as +/-, sin, cos, tan, log, ln, exp, sqrt, deg, rad.

- Input the numbers by pressing numeric keys.
- Use a navigation key to select a sign for calculation.
- 3. Then input the numbers.

- 5. To input a decimal, press key. If you press key, you can enter '()'.
- To end Calculator, press the right soft key[Back].

You can view clocks of the world's major cities.

SIM services

Menu 3.9

This menu depends on SIM and the network services.

Multimedia

You can enjoy multimedia functions such as camera, voice recorder, and MP3 for your fun and entertainment.

- ▶ While using the Multimedia function, the battery status is changeable.

You can adjust the zoom and brightness by pressing the navigation keys.

Select the left soft key for more options.

- Mode: Allows you to choose between
 Single shot or to take Multi shot photos successively.
 - Multi shot/ Single shot
- Metering: Determines the lighting based on a selected part of the subject. You can select from Centered and Combined to establish the best lighting.
- ▶ Auto focus: Automatically adjusts the focus for a clear, sharp image with a single press of a button. You can select Macro for close up shots.
- ▶ White balance: Allows you to change the settings according to the environment.
- Quality: Allows you to set the image quality from Super fine/Fine/Normal.

Multimedia

- Delay timer: Allows you to select the delay time (10 seconds, 5 seconds, 3 seconds, Off). Then the phone takes a photo after the specified time.
- Size: Allows you to set the image size to one of (1600x1200), (1280x960), (640x480), (320x240).
- Shutter tone: You can select from a choice of different sounds, or you can turn the sound off.
- Save to: You can select a storage location: External or Phone.
- Flash: Adds additional light when you take a photo in dark surroundings. You can also turn the flash On/ Off by pressing the key while in the camera mode.
- ▶ Image effect: 4 settings are available: Negation, Mono, Sepia, and Colour.
- Night mode: On/Off Set to On for better pictures in poor lighting conditions.

Note

When you are in camera mode, and there's no action for a while, the phone will automatically exit to idle mode.

Video camera

Menu 4.2

- 1. Select Video camera menu.
- Press the key to start recording. A timer will be displayed while recording is in progress.
- To stop recording press the left soft key (Stop).
- 4. When recording is completed, you have a choice of 3 options: Send by MMS by pressing the left soft key (Send), Save by pressing the key, or Delete by pressing the right soft key (Delete).

MP3 player

The ME830d features an integrated MP3 player. You can enjoy listening to MP3 music files on your phone using a compatible headset or via the internal loudspeaker.

Note

Because of the small dimension of the speaker, in some cases the audio may be distorted, especially at maximum volume and when there is an excess of bass sounds. Therefore, we recommend you to use the stereo headset in order to appreciate the high quality of your music.

The music player supports:

- MPEG-1 Layer III, MPEG-2 Layer III, MPEG-2.5 Layer III: Sampling frequency up from 8KHz to 48KHz. Bit rate up to 320Kbps, stereo.
- ▶ AAC: ADIF, ADTS formats (Sampling frequency from 8KHz to 48KHz)

- ► AAC+: V1: (Bit rate 16-128 kbps)

 V2: (Bit rate 16-48 kbps)

 (Sampling frequency from 8KHz to 48KHz)
- ▶ **MP4:** Sampling frequency up from 8KHz to 48KHz, Bit rate up to 320Kbps, stereo.

Note

▶ The ME830d doesn't support the variable bit rates of all mentioned file types. Therefore, you can't change the file from MP3 format to AAC.

You can transfer MP3 files from a compatible PC to the memory in your phone using the Mass Storage. When you connect the phone to a PC using the USB cable (supplied in the box), the phone will be recognised as a removable disk through windows explorer. After you copy songs to the removable disk you should execute the safe removal of hardware from your PC.

- You should copy MP3 files to My media\Music folder. If you copy to another folder, you won't be able to play the MP3 files.

The ME830d features a built-in FM radio. The stereo headset must be plugged in to enable you to listen to the radio because the headset acts as the FM antenna.



Multimedia

 Search the desired radio station using the left/right navigation keys.

Up/Down navigation keys	Increases/Decreases the volume level

- To improve the radio reception, extend the headset cord which functions as the FM antenna.
- You can preset channels by using the Auto scan feature or Edit in the Options menu.

- Auto scan: Select this to automatically scan through available stations. When it finds a station you can decide if you want to save it as as one of the 10 presets.
- Reset all channels: Cancels all preset channels.
- Listen via speaker: You can listen to the radio through the internal built-in speaker. You will still need the headset plugged in to act as the antenna.

Voice recorder

You can record voice memo. The following [**Options**] menus are available.

Storage

You can choose Phone or External memory.

▶ Recording mode

You can choose **General** mode of unlimited recording or **MMS** mode of recording up to 30 seconds.

Record

- Press OK to start recording. Once recording is started, the message Recording and the counter is displayed.
- If you want to pause or resume recording, press left soft key or OK key.
- 3. If you want to finish recording, press right soft key [Stop].

Album

You can view the Sounds folder which lists all sound files saved in the memory.

New message

Menu 5.1

This menu includes functions related to SMS (Short Message Service), MMS (Multimedia Message Service), Email, voice mail, as well as the network's service messages.

Text (Menu 5.1.1)

You can write and edit text messages

1. Enter the New message menu by pressing the left soft key [OK].

The following [Options] menus are available.

- ▶ **Send to:** Sends text messages.
- Enter numbers of recipient. Also, you can select Options and choose from Contacts, or Recent messages to send a text message.

- Once the numbers have been entered, press the left soft key to send the message. All messages will automatically be saved in the outbox folder, even after a sending failure.

▶ Insert

- **Symbol:** You can add special characters.
- Image: You can insert the default graphics or other available graphics in My Folder that are available for short messages.
- **Sound:** You can insert sounds that are available for short messages.
- Default image: You can insert basic animations.
- Default sound: You can insert sound effects.
- Text template: You can insert preset text templates already set in the phone.
- Contact: You can insert phone numbers or e-mail addresses from the address hook
- **Business card:** You can add your signature to the message.
- ▶ Save to drafts: Stores messages in Drafts.
- ▶ T9 languages: T9 is set to off by default. Here you can turn it on, and also select the language.
- New T9 word: Enter a new T9 word.
- ▶ Clear text: You can clear the text.

Exit: If you press Exit whilst writing a message, you will be taken back to the message menu. The message you have written is not saved.

Note

The ME830d supports EMS release 5 and is able to send colour pictures, sounds, text styles, etc.. The other party may not receive pictures, sounds or text styles you sent properly if their phone does not support such options.

- Slide duration: You can set the duration of slides by the second.

Messaging

- ▶ T9 languages: Select the language for T9 input mode. You can also activate or deactivate T9 input mode.
- ▶ New T9 word: Enter a new T9 word.
- ▶ Exit: You can get back to the Message menu.

Note

If you select a picture with a large file size (200K for example) on writing multimedia message, the loading duration will take around 10 seconds. Furthermore, you can't activate any keys during the loading time. After about 10 seconds, you should be able to write the message.

New Fantastic LG

▶ The ME830d works as a mass storage device. If you connect the USB cable, you can use the phone as a Removable Disk. You can download MP3 files, photos, videos, text files etc. this gives you fast access from the PC to phone, by just connecting the USB cable.

Note

- MASS STORAGE function will only work when the phone is in idle mode.
- DO NOT remove the cable while you are downloading files. After you download the files, you need to click "Safely Remove Hardware" on the PC ॐ and then disconnect the cable.
- When you copy a file to the removable disk, you can see a message on the display "transferring". It means MASS STORAGE is working and data is being transferred. If you set On, you can save power when you don't use the phone.

Wallpaper (Menu 9.3.1)

You can select the background pictures in standby mode.

Default

You can select a picture or an animation of wallpaper by pressing ③, ⑤, ⑥,

My folder

You can select a picture or an animation as wallpaper.

Menu style (Menu 9.3.2)

Your phone provides you with 2 menu styles. Set the menu style by scrolling and pressing the left soft key () [OK].

Dialing Style (Menu 9.3.3)

You can choose your dialing style as Beads style or Digital style.

Standby text (Menu 9.3.4)

If you select On, you can edit the text which is displayed in standby mode.

Backlight time (Menu 9.3.5)

You can set the light-up duration of the display.

Brightness (Menu 9.3.6)

You can set the brightness of LCD: 100%, 80%, 60%, 40%

Network name (Menu 9.3.7)

If this function is activated, the network name will be displayed on main LCD.

Home screen shortcut (Menu 9.3.8)

You can set your home screen shortcut. On/Off

You can change the language for the display texts in your phone. This change will also affect the Language Input mode.

Connectivity

Bluetooth (Menu 9.5.1)

Bluetooth® functionality enables compatible mobile devices, peripherals and computers that are in close proximity to communicate directly with each other without wires. This handset supports built-in Bluetooth connectivity, which makes it possible to connect them with compatible Bluetooth headsets, computer applications and so on.

Note

- When you receive data from another Bluetooth device, the phone requests confirmation. After confirming the transfer, the file will be copied on to your phone.
 - Depending on the file type, it will be stored in the following folders:
 - MP3 (.mp3, mp4, aac): Music folder.

- Print via Bluetooth: It is available in printers which support Basic Printing Profile. You can print with "Send via Bluetooth" menu for the printers which support Object Push Profile. If the file size is the more than each of 500KB (Animated GIF file) 200KB(others), the popup message is displayed "Not supported".

Set Bluetooth

You can activate or cancel the Bluetooth function.

▶ Paired devices/Handsfree devices

You can view all devices which your ME830d is already paired to. If you enter Paired devices or Handsfree devices menu, you access the options:

- Add new: Allows to search new Bluetooth devices and add them to your phone's list of paired devices. When you select Add new your handset will start to search for Bluetooth devices within range. Once the device you wish to pair appears on the list press the right soft key [Stop]. Scroll to the desired device and press the left soft key [Pair]. You will then be asked to enter a passcode. The passcode can be any code you wish to use (the same passcode must be used by both devices) or is one that is predetermined by the manufacturer of the device you are trying to pair with. Please check the User Manual of the

device you are initiating the pair with to see if it already has a predetermined passcode in place.

- Assign name: Allows you to change the name of the paired Bluetooth device and how it is displayed on the handset.
- Set as authorised/Set as unauthorized: Allows you to set an authorised connection between each Bluetooth device. For example if you regularly use a Bluetooth headset with your phone then setting the connection as authorised will mean the headset will automatically connect to the handset each time the headset is powered on.
- All services: Allows to view all services which are supported by Bluetooth device...
- **Delete:** Allows to delete a paired Bluetooth device.

Settings

 My handset's visibility: This indicates whether or not your handset will be visible to other Bluetooth devices. My handset's name: You can set the name of Bluetooth device. The default name is LG ME830d.

Network selection (Menu 9.5.2)

You can select a network which will be registered either automatically or manually. Usually, the network selection is set to Automatic.

Automatic

If you select Automatic mode, the phone will automatically search for and select a network for you. Once you have selected "Automatic", the phone will be set to "Automatic" even though the power is off and on.

Manual

The phone will find the list of available networks and show you them. Then you can select the network which you want to use if this network has a roaming agreement with your home network operator. The phone let you select another network if the phone fails to access the selected network.

Preferred

You can set a list of preferred networks and the phone attempts to register with first, before attempting to register to any other networks. This list is set from the phone's predefined list of known networks.

GPRS attach (Menu 9.5.3)

You can set GPRS service depending on various situations.

▶ Switch on

If you select this menu, the phone is automatically registered to a GPRS network when you switch the phone on. Starting a WAP or PC dial-up application created the connection between phone and network and data transfer is possible. When you end the application, GPRS connection is ended but the registration to the GPRS network remains.

▶ When needed

If you select this menu, the GPRS connection is established when you connect a WAP service and closed when you end the WAP connection.

Network profile (Menu 9.5.4)

Data connections

 Bearer: You can set the bearer data service.

1 Data/2 GPRS

- **Data settings:** Appears only if you select Data Settings as a Bearer/service.

Dial number: Enter the telephone number to dial to access your WAP gateway.

User ID: The users identity for your dial-up server (and NOT the WAP gateway).

Password: The password required by your dial-up server (and NOT the WAP gateway) to identify you.

Call type: Select the type of data call: Analogue of Digital (ISDN).

Linger time: You need to enter timeout period. After entering that, the WAP navigation service will be unavailable if any data is not input or transferred.

Call speed: The speed of your data connection; 9600 or 14400 (Depends on Operator)

 GPRS settings: The service settings are only available when GPRS is chosen as a bearer service.

APN: Input the APN of the GPRS.

User ID: The users identify for your APN server.

Password: The password required by your APN server.

- Proxy settings

Proxy: Activates or cancels proxy.

IP address: Input the IP address of the Proxy server you access.

Port: Input the Proxy Port.

- DNS settings

Primary server: Input the IP address of the primary DNS server you access.

Secondary server: Input the IP address of the secondary DNS server you access.

USB connection mode (Menu 9.5.5)

Allows you to set a mode for USB connection. Select Data service if you want to use it with the PC data kit. For Mass storage function, refer to the page 62.

Flight mode

Menu 9.6

You can use many of your phone's features when you are in an airplane or in any other area where making or receiving calls or data is prohibited.

Calling

Menu 9.7

You can set the menu relevant to a call by pressing [OK] in the Setting menu.

Call divert (Menu 9.7.1)

The Call divert service allows you to divert incoming voice calls, fax calls, and data calls to another number. For details, contact your service provider.

▶ All voice calls: Diverts all voice calls unconditionally.

- If busy: Diverts voice calls when the phone is in use.
- If no reply: Diverts voice calls which you do not answer.
- If out of reach: Diverts voice calls when the phone is switched off or out of coverage.
- All data calls: Diverts to a number with a PC connection unconditionally.
- ▶ All fax calls: Diverts to a number with a fax connection unconditionally.
- ▶ Cancel all: Cancels all call divert service.

The submenus

Call divert menus have the submenus shown below.

- Activate: Activates the corresponding service.
 - To voice mail centre: Forwards to message centre. This function does not apply to All data calls and All fax calls menus.
 - To other number: Input the number for call diverting.

- To favourite number: You can check recent five diverted numbers.
- Cancel: Deactivate the corresponding service.
- View status: View the status of the corresponding service.

Answer mode (Menu 9.7.2)

- ➤ Slide up: Simply slide open the phone to answer the call. (set as default)
- Any key: press any key to answer the call except for the End key and the right soft key.
- ▶ Send key only: the Send key must be used to answer the call.

Send my number (Menu 9.7.3) (Network and subscription dependen

(Network and subscription dependent)

- Set by network: If you select this, you can send your phone number depending on two line service such as line 1 or line 2.
- On: You can send your phone number to another party. Your phone number will be shown on the receiver's phone.

▶ Off: Your phone number will not be shown.

Call waiting (Network Service) (Menu 9.7.4)

- Activate: If you select Activate, you can accept a waiting (receiving) call.
- Cancel: If you select Cancel, you cannot recognize the waiting (receiving) call.
- View status: Shows the status of Call waiting.

Minute minder (Menu 9.7.5)

If you select **On**, you can check the call duration by beep sound every minute during a call.

Auto redial (Menu 9.7.6)

- On: When this function is activated, the phone will automatically try to redial in the case of failure to connect a call.
- Off: Your phone will not make any attempts to redial when the original call has not connected.

Send DTMF (Menu 9.7.7)

You can send touch tones during an active call to control your voice mailbox or other automated phone services.

Security

PIN code request (Menu 9.8.1)

In this menu, you can set the phone to ask for the PIN code of your SIM card when the phone is switched on.

If this function is activated, you'll be requested to enter the PIN code.

- Select PIN code request in the Security menu, and then press [OK].
- 2. Set Enable/Disable.
- If you want to change the setting, you need to enter PIN code when you switch on the phone.
- 4. If you enter wrong PIN code more than 3 times, the phone will lock out. If the PIN is blocked, you will need to key in PUK code
- 5. You can enter your PUK code up to 10

times. If you put wrong PUK code more than 10 times, you can not unlock your phone. You will need to contact your service provider.

Handset lock (Menu 9.8.2)

Note

The default security code for this phone is 0000.

You can use security code to avoid unauthorized use of the phone. Whenever you switch on the phone, the phone will request security code if you set phone lock to when swith on. If you set phone lock to when SIM changed your phone will request security code only when you change your SIM card.

Touchpad lock (Menu 9.8.3)

You can lock the touchpad of your phone keeping you from using touchpad sensitivity unnecessarily.

Call barring (Menu 9.8.4)

The Call barring service prevents your phone from making or receiving certain category of calls. This function requires the call Network password. You can view the following submenus.

- ▶ All outgoing calls: The barring service for all outgoing calls.
- Outgoing international: The barring service for all outgoing international calls.
- Outgoing international when roaming:
 The barring service for all international outgoing calls except home network.
- ▶ All incoming: The barring service for all incoming calls.
- Incoming when roaming: The barring service for all incoming calls when roaming.
- Cancel all: You can cancel all barring services.
- ► Change password: You can change the password or Call Barring Service.

The submenus:

- Activate

Allows to request the network to set call restriction on.

- Cancel

Set the selected call restriction off.

- View status

View the status whether the calls are barred or not.

Fixed dial number (FDN) (Menu 9.8.5) (SIM dependent)

You can restrict your outgoing calls to selected phone numbers.

The numbers are protected by your PIN2 code.

- ➤ On: You can restrict your outgoing calls to selected phone numbers.
- ▶ Off: You can cancel fixed dialling function.
- ▶ Number list: You can view the number list saved as Fixed dial number.

Change codes (Menu 9.8.6)

PIN is an abbreviation of Personal Identification Number to prevent use by unauthorized person.

You can change the access codes: **Security code**, **PIN code**, **PIN2 code**.

- If you want to change the Security code/PIN/PIN2 code input your original code, and then press [OK].
- 2. Input new Security code/PIN/PIN2 code and verify them.

You can check free space and memory usage of each repository, Internal memory, Multimedia memory and External memory. You can go to each repository menu.

Reset default

Menu 9.0

You can initialize all factory defaults. You need Security code to activate this function.
