




Front View

- 1. PHONO door
- 2. LCD DISPLAY
- 3. REP: In CD/MP3 play mode, press to repeat/random songs.
- 4. PROG: In CD stop mode/ In Radio mode, Press to set the program playback / In Standby mode,

press and hold this button to into time set mode.

- RM:REMOTE SENSOR
- 6. F-10: Press to skip to 10 previous tracks.
- 7. ST/MONO: Stereo / Mono Selection in Radio Mode

- VOL-:Reduce Volume, press the button repeatedly or press once and hold down until you reach the desired volume level
- MODE: Press to select between the different functions such as the FM Tuner, AUX, CD player, Bluetooth and Phonograph.

26. FM Wire Antenna

While tuned to a station in FM mode, extend the wire and reposition to adjust for best reception.

27. Line out Socket

Connect external speakers

28. AUX IN Cord

Connect an external source

29. LIGHT Mode Switch

Single light mode or mixed light mode for LED Tube.

30. Line out ON/OFF Switch

Select ON position, to use external or built-in speakers, select OFF position, to use the unit's built-in speakers.

Note: The unit of the volume button can't control the Line out volume

31. AC Power Cord

Plugs into a wall outlet.

Parts of the Turntable

- A. Turntable.
- B. Counter weight
- C. Safety Screw (for transport) Before using the unit, turn the screw

clockwise using a coin or screwdriver.

Important: When you transport the unit, turn the screw counterclockwise to secure the turntable.

The silver screw on the back of the turntable is a balancer for both the turntable as well as for

the tone arm.

Please turn this screw with a coin to either left or right and test by moving your tone arm to the A C C B

middle of the spindle. Please note that this screw is a balancer and will have to be adjusted until the tone arm moves freely to the end of the record (middle of the spindle) without any resistance

- before using the turntable phonograph.
- D. Cue-lever. Use this lever to lift the tone arm.
- E. Tone Arm holder.
- F. Speed Selector.
- G. Tone Arm. Before use, completely loosen the fixed rope on the tone arm and lift the tone arm up.

REMOTE CONTROL



- MODE: Press to select between the different functions such as the FM Tuner, AUX, CD player, Bluetooth and Phonograph.
- OPOWER: Push to turn the unit on or off.
- STOP: Press to stop playback or cancel the program setting.
- 4. I◄◄PREVIOUS TRACK: In CD Mode, press once to skip to the previous track. Press and hold to fast rewind/In Standby mode, press to set the time/In BLUETOOTH Mode, press to skip to the previous track. / In Radio Mode, press to manually tune to a desired station or press and hold this button to auto search a station.
- 5. PROG: In CD stop mode, Press to set the program playback

/ In Standby mode, press and hold this button to into time set mode.

- REPEAT: In CD/MP3 play mode, press to repeat/random songs.
- 7. SCAN; Press to automatically search and save radio stations.
- 8. ST/MONO: Stereo / Mono Selection in Radio Mode
- OP-CL/MEM: Press to Open/Close CD Tray and to use the Memory Function while using the Radio.
- 10. ►IIPLAY/PAUSE In CD/ BLUETOOTH mode, press to play or pause playback
- VOL-:Reduce Volume, press the button repeatedly or press once and hold down until you reach the desired volume level.
- VOL+: Increase Volume, press the button repeatedly or press once and hold down until you
 reach the desired volume level.
- 13. **>>INEXT TRACK:** In CD Mode press to skip to the next track. Press and hold to fast forward/ In Standby mode, press to set the time./In BLUETOOTH Mode, press to skip to the next track./ In Radio Mode, press to manually tune to a desired station or press and hold this button to auto search a station.
- 14. FOLFER-: Press to select previous Folder
- 15. FOLDER+: Press to select next Folder
- EQ: Press to change the Equalizer setting. Equalizer settings preloaded on to the Unit are Pop (POP), Rock (ROC), Classical (CLA), Jazz (JAZ), and Flat (FLA)
- 17. PRE-: Press to listen preset station. In program mode, press to select preset station number.
- 18. PRE+: Press to listen preset station, In program mode, press to select preset station number.

The Remote Control Unit can operate the unit from a distance. When operating the remote control unit, point it towards the front panel of the unit.

- Even if the remote control unit is operated within the effective range, remote control operation
 may be impossible if there are any obstacles between the unit and the remote control.
- If the remote control unit is operated near other appliances which generate infrared rays, or if
 other remote control devices using infrared rays are used near the unit, it may operate
 incorrectly. Conversely, the other appliances may operate incorrectly.

TO ACTIVATE THE REMOTE CONTROL:

The remote control is built with cell battery before shipment. To activate the battery, remove the transparent plate at the bottom of the remote control.




Now the remote control is ready to use.

BATTERY REPLACEMENT: If the distance required between the remote control unit and main unit decreases, the battery is exhausted. In this case, please replace the battery with new one.

TO REPLACE WITH A NEW BATTERY:

- Remove the battery compartment cover as per illustration on the right.
- Observing the correct polarity and put a 3Vdc lithium battery (CR2025).



Close the cover.

Battery Precautions:

- Be sure to insert the battery with correct positive + and negative polarities.
- Refer to the precautions on the battery labels.
- When the remote control unit is not to be used for a long time (more than a month), remove the
 battery from the remote control unit to prevent it from leaking. If it leaks, wipe away the liquid
 inside the battery compartment and replace the battery with new one.
- Do not heat or disassemble batteries and never dispose of old batteries by throwing them in a fire.
- Purchase the correct size and grade of cell or battery most suitable for the intended use.

- Keep cells or batteries clean and dry both during use and storage. Wipe metal terminals with a soft, dry cloth if they become dirty.
- Retain original product literature for future reference.
- Only use the cell or battery in the application for which it was intended.

General Operation

GETTING STARTED

- Plug unit's AC cord to AC Wall Outlet.
- 2. Push the large, red "ON/OFF" Main Power Button to turn on the unit.
- Press the small, red ON/OFF button to use the unit.



LED LIGHTING EFFECTS

- To turn on/off the LED lighting effects simply press the LIGHT button located on the front of the unit.
- Switch Light Mode located on the back of the unit to PLAY to have the colors gradually change or to HOLD to have one steady color.

NOTE: The lighting effects operate independently of the ON/OFF button.



SETTING THE TIME

- Press and hold (3-5 Seconds)the PROG button on the front of the unit , the "12-H" on the LCD Display will blink, then press the I◄◄ or ►►I button to Switch from "12-H" to "24-H".
- Press the PROG button to confirm and the Hour Time will blink, press the I◄◄ or►►I button
 until you get to the correct hour.
- Press the PROG button to confirm and the Minute Time will blink, press the I◄◄ or►►I
 button until you get to the correct Minute, press the PROG button to confirm.

NOTE: The time will only be saved when the unit is ON or in Standby Mode, if you want the time to be saved do not turn off the main power button.

LINE OUT OPERATION (FOR EXTERNAL SPEAKERS ONLY)

NOTE: LINE OUT ON THE BACK OF THE UNIT SHOULD BE SWITCHED TO THE "OFF" POSITION TO USE THE UNIT'S BUILT-IN STEREO SPEAKERS.

- 1 Switch Line Out to "ON" position.
- Use the left/right channel to connect your external, more powerful speakers.

NOTE: 1. When Line Out is ON, no sound will play from the unit's speakers.

Listening to a CD/MP3

- Press the "MODE" button to select CD mode. The unit will display the "CD"
- Note: When no disc is set, "no disc" will appear on the display.
- 3. Push the CD door to open the tray.
- 4. Place a disc on the tray with the printed label facing outward, then close the tray.
- The unit will automatically start playing from the first track.
- To temporarily pause playback, press the ▶IIbutton. Press again to resume.
- To skip tracks backward or forward, press the corresponding skip button (40r pm). Pressing 44 will return to the beginning of the previous track. Pressing photton to skip to the next track.
- To fast forward / rewind within a track, press and hold down the corresponding skip button until the desired position is reached.
- Press F-10 button to skip to 10 previous tracks
- 10. Press F+10 button skip to 10 next tracks
- 11. To stop playback, press the STOP | button

Important:

- Never place more than one disc on the tray.
- The disc must be placed in the center of the disc tray. An incorrectly loaded disc can permanently damage the tray door mechanism.
- It takes a moment for the unit to load a disc, during which all buttons will be temporarily deactivated.

Repeat/Random Playback

Each time the REP button is pressed, the repeat / shuffle mode will cycle through the following options:

REPEAT 1(Repeat one track)

The current track will be played repeatedly. If you select another track, the track you select will be play on repeat.

REPEAT FOLDER (Repeat folder Only in MP3)

The current folder will be played repeatedly.

REPEAT ALL (Repeat the entire CD)

The entire CD will be played repeatedly.

SHUFFLE PLAY (Shuffle through the entire CD)

The entire CD will be played randomly.

Notes:

Press REP button, the repeat mode will be cancelled.

Programmed Playback

Program play must be set when the CD is stopped. You can program up to 20 tracks on a CD.99 tracks on MP3.

Notes:

- Programmed playback works with finalized disc only.
- 1. Press MODE button to select CD mode, then load a CD.
- 2. While the CD is stopped, press the PROG button.
- PROGRAM indicator will blink, and P01 will appear on the display.


- Pressissor ▶ to select a track number.
- 5. Press the PROG button again to set the current track.
- P02 will then be displayed. Repeat steps 4 thru 5 to program the additional tracks.
- When the selection of track numbers has been finished, press the ►IIbutton to start program playback.
- 8. To cancel the program mode, press the STOP button once.
 (Note: when all 20 program tracks are set, press the PROG button and "FULL" will appear on the display as a notification that you've filled all 20 programmable tracks.)

Listening to a Vinyl Record

Installation of the Counter weight

As with all quality turntables built to utilize aftermarket cartridges, the weight of the cartridge must be balanced with a counter weight to allow accurate setting of the cartridge's downward force.


- The first step is to insure a level, stable surface for your new turntable and move the tone arm gently to the record.
- While carefully securing the tone arm from movement and protecting the stylus from damage; gently glide the counter weight with the numerals facing forward onto the rear of the tone arm.
- Rotate the weight in a clockwise fashion from the perspective of the end of the arm opposite of the cartridge until the threads are just engaged.
- 4. With the tone arm lift lowered and the stylus protector removed, seek to instill a state of equilibrium in the arm by rotating the counterweight so that balance will be achieved in the form of a tone arm that is level and free from interference.
- 5. The next step is to create a reference to this position by rotating the numerically enhanced ring at the front of the counterweight to indicate "0" at the top position in alignment with the mark on the tone arm while holding the rear portion of the counterweight to prohibit its movement.
- 6. Finally, from this "0" reference place, grasp both the front and back of these two parts of the counterweight and set the weight to indicate "3.5" on the dial to align with the marking on the top of the tone arm. This will indicate 3.5 grams of downward force, the recommended tracking weight for this cartridge.



NOTE: The balance weight is to adjust the pressure of the needle. If the pressure is too much, the sound will become distorted; if the pressure is too little, track skipping will easily happen. Please adjust the balance weight by turning the balance weight clockwise or counter-clockwise.

LISTENING TO RECORDS

- Press MODE button to select PHONO Function.
- Gently open the top cover. Note: Be carefully not to pinch your finger when opening/closing the top cover.



- Place a vinyl record on the turntable. When playing a^t 45 RPM record, use the included adaptor.
- Select the appropriate speed.



- Gently push tone arm clip to the right to release the tone arm.
- Raise the cue lever to lift the tone arm off the tone arm support.
- Move the tone arm gently to the edge of the record (or the starting point of a track). The turntable will begin to turn.
- 8. Gently lower the tone arm by slowly releasing the cue lever.
- When the record reaches to its end, tone arm and rotation stop. Lift the tone arm and place it to tone arm rest manually.

Note: It will take approximately 20 seconds for tone arm to return to its holder when playing a 78 rpm record.

Important:

- Closing the top cover will help prevent dust from settling on the turntable.

- Always relock the tone arm clip before transporting the unit.
- Do not place anything on top of the turntable cover, especially while playing a record.
- Remove the needle cover before you balance the tone arm
- -Hold tone arm whenever you make any adjustment or action so as to protect the tone arm.
- Do not try to adjust the balance weight while playing a record as this could break the needle and scratch the record.
- Remove the balance weight before transportation to prevent damage or breakage to the unit...

Listening to FM Radio

- Press the MODE button to select the FM tuning function.
- Press the → or → button to manually tune to a desired station
- You may also press and hold the →or →→button to auto scan for a station.
- Press the SCAN button to auto scan and save the stations, it can save 20 FM stations.
- Press the ST/MONO button to select stereo or mono mode, when you select mono mode, the display show "ONO".
- Using the PRE+ or PRE button you can scan through your preset stations.
 (See how to preset a station in the section below.)

Adjusting for Best Reception

FM broadcast: Extend and reposition the FM antenna located on the back of the unit.

Preset Tuning

You can preset and store up to 20 FM radio stations.

- 1. Select your desired FM station.
- Press the PROG button or press the OP-CL/MEM button on remote control and the display show P01.
- Press "PRE+" button or "PRE -" button to select the preset station from P01 to P20, using the "PRE+" or "PRE -"button to choose through the range.
- Press the PROG button or press the OP-CL/MEM button on remote control to confirm.
- According to the above way, you can store 20 stations in FM.

Listening to an External Audio Device (Auxiliary Mode)

In AUX (auxiliary) mode, this unit can play audio from an external audio device (iPod, MP3 Player, Portable CD Player, etc.)

CONNECTING VIA AUXILIARY

- Press the MODE button to select the AUX-IN function.
- Plug the AUX Cord located on back of the unit into your iPhone/iPod or other MP3 device.

NOTE: Playback functions and operations are only available on your external device.

Listening to an External Audio Device (Bluetooth Mode)

In BT (Bluetooth) mode, this unit can play audio from external devices that have a built-in Bluetooth function.

CONNECTING VIA BLUETOOTH

- 1. Press MODE button to select the Bluetooth mode.
- 2. Turn ON the Bluetooth function on your external device.

NOTE: The effective distance between your external device and this apparatus is 10 meters.

- Wait a moment until "Voctrola Jukebox" appears on the paired devices list, then select "Voctrola
 Jukebox" and allow it to connect. If a window appears and asks for a password, simply type
 "0000", then press ok on your external device.
- 4. Once the pairing is completed, an audible beep will sound.
- Control playback from the unit/remote control or Bluetooth device.
- To disconnect, press "MODE" button to other functions or turn off the Bluetooth connection from the Bluetooth device.

Maintenance / Proper Handling

Compact Disc Handling

- Always place the disc on the disc tray with the label side facing upward (compact discs can be played/recorded only on one side)
- To remove a disc from its storage case, press down on the center of the case and lift the disc upward, holding it carefully by its edges.
- To clean a disc, wipe the surface from the center hole outward towards the outer edge with a soft, dry cloth.
- Never use such chemicals as record spray, antistatic sprays or fluid, benzine or thinner to clean discs; they will irreparably damage the disc's plastic surface.
- Discs should be returned to their cases after use to protect from dust and scratches.
- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high humidity, or high temperature for extend periods of time.
- Printable CD-R and CD-RW discs are not recommended, as the label side may become sticky and damage the
 unit.
- Use a soft oil-based felt-tipped pen to write the information on the label side. Never use a ball-point or hard-tipped pen, as doing so may damage the recorded side.
- Do not use irregularly-shaped CDs (octagonal, heart shaped, business card size, etc), as they will damage the unit.
- Read all precautions supplied with any CD-R or CD-RW disc
- · Never handle a disc with dirty fingers.
- Never insert a disc that has a crack on the surface.

	Unit will not power on.	Unit is unplugged.	Connect the unit to the AC power supply.
	No sound output from speakers.	The volume level is set too low. The input selector does not match the playback source.	Adjust the volume. Select the correct input source.
	Noise/Distortion in sound output.	The unit is too close to a TV set or another interfering device.	Turn off the TV or other appliance, and relocate the unit.
	Unit fails to respond.	It might result from external factors such as ESD (Electro-static discharge).	Disconnect the power cord and external audio device.Re-plug the power cord after one minute.
FM RADIO	Cannot listen to any station, or signal appears weak.	The station is not tuned-in properly. ATV set is being used nearby and is interfering with the radio reception.	Properly tune-in the desired station. Turn-off the interfering TV set.
