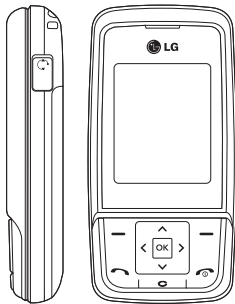

# For Your Safety

## **WARNING!**

- *Mobile Phones must be switched off at all times in aircrafts.*
- *Do not hold the phone in your hand while driving.*

## Certification information (SAR)

### **THIS DEVICE MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES**

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) recommended by international guidelines (ICNIRP). These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the

general population. The guidelines were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

- ▶ The exposure standard for mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit stated in the international guidelines is 2.0 W/kg\*. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR of the

device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station, the lower the power output of the device. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with the European R&TTE directive must be shown. This directive includes as one essential requirement the protection of the health and the safety for the user and any other person. The highest SAR value for this device when tested for use at the ear is 0.752 W/kg.

- ▶ This device meets RF exposure guidelines when used either in the normal use position against the

ear or when positioned at least 1.5 cm away from the body. When a carry case, belt clip or holder is used for body-worn operation, it should not contain metal and should position the product at least 1.5 cm away from your body. In order to transmit data files or messages, this device requires a quality connection to the network. In some cases, transmission of data files or messages may be delayed until such a connection is available. Ensure the above separation distance instructions are followed until the transmission is completed. The highest SAR value for this device when tested for use at the body is 1.01 W/kg.

# Guidelines for Safe and Efficient Use

\* The SAR limit for mobile devices used by the public is 2.0 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over ten grams of body tissue. The guidelines incorporate a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements. SAR values may vary depending on national reporting requirements and the network band. ## Product care and maintenance

### **WARNING!**

*Only use batteries, chargers and accessories approved for use with this particular phone model. The use of any other types may invalidate any approval or warranty applying to the phone, and may be dangerous.*

- ▶ Do not disassemble this unit. Take it to a qualified service technician when repair work is required.
- ▶ Keep away from electrical appliances such as a TV's, radios or personal computers.
- ▶ The unit should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators or cookers.
- ▶ Never place your phone in a microwave oven as it will cause the battery to explode.

- ▶ Do not drop.
- ▶ Do not subject this unit to mechanical vibration or shock.
- ▶ The coating of the phone may be damaged if covered with wrap or vinyl wrapper.
- ▶ Do not use harsh chemicals (such as alcohol, benzene, thinners, etc.) or detergents to clean your phone. There is a risk of this causing a fire.
- ▶ Do not subject this unit to excessive smoke or dust.

# Guidelines for Safe and Efficient Use

## Battery information and care

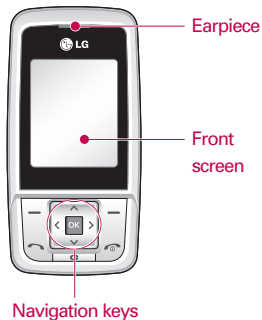
- ▶ You do not need to completely discharge the battery before recharging. Unlike other battery systems, there is no memory effect that could compromise the battery's performance.
- ▶ Use only LG batteries and chargers. LG chargers are designed to maximize the battery life.
- ▶ Do not disassemble or short-circuit the battery pack.
- ▶ Keep the metal contacts of the battery pack clean.
- ▶ Replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. The battery pack may be recharged hundreds of times until it needs replacing.
- ▶ Recharge the battery if it has not been used for a long time to maximize usability.
- ▶ Do not expose the battery charger to direct sunlight or use it in high humidity, such as the bathroom.
- ▶ Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places, this may deteriorate the battery performance.
- ▶ Risk of explosion if battery is replaced by an incorrect type.
- ▶ Dispose of used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions.



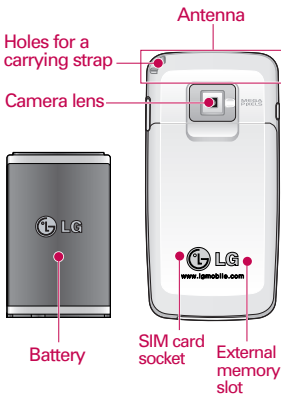

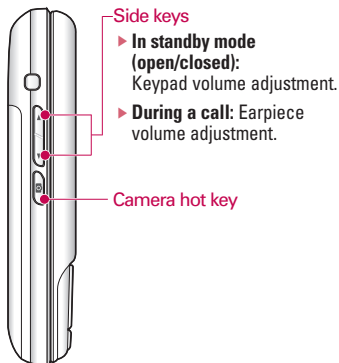

## Display Information











Area	Description
First line	Displays various icons.
Middle lines	Display messages, instructions and any information that you enter, such as number to be dialed.
Last line	Shows the functions currently assigned to the two soft keys.

The screen displays several icons. These are described below.

## Note

- The quality of the conversation may change depending on network coverage. When the signal strength is below 2 bars, you may experience muting, call drop and poor audio. Please refer to this signal as an indicator for your calls. When there are no bars, that means that there is no network coverage: in this case, you won't be able to access the network for any service (call, messages and so on).

# Getting Started

## Installing the SIM card and battery

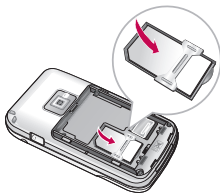
### 1. Installing the SIM card.

Your SIM card contains your phone number, service details and contacts and must be inserted into your handset.

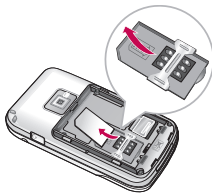
If your SIM card is removed then your handset becomes unusable (even the emergency calls) until a valid one is inserted. Always disconnect the charger and other accessories from your handset before inserting and removing your SIM card. Slide the SIM card into the SIM card holder.

Make sure that the SIM card is properly inserted and the gold contact area on the card is facing downwards. To remove the SIM

card, press down lightly and pull it in the reverse direction.



To insert the SIM card



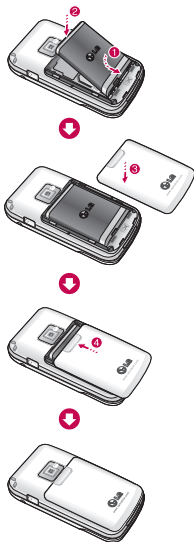
To remove the SIM card

### Note

- ▶ The metal contact of the SIM card can easily be damaged by scratches. Pay special attention to the SIM card while handling. Follow the instructions supplied with the SIM card.

## 2. Installing the battery.

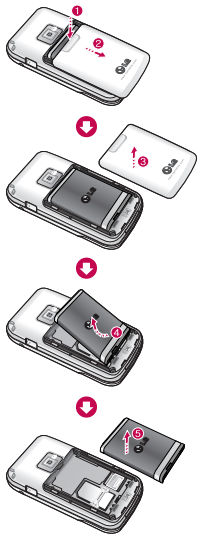
Insert the battery aligning the gold contacts on the battery with the battery terminals (gold contacts) in the battery compartment. Then push down the top of the battery until it snaps into place.

## 3. To remove the battery.

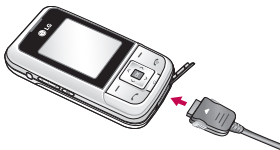
Turn the power off. (If the power is left on, there is a chance you could lose the stored telephone numbers and messages.) Press the battery release latches **1** and open the battery **2**. Then remove the battery.





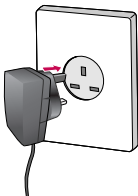
## Charging the Battery

Before connecting the travel adapter to the phone you must first install the battery.



1. With the arrow facing you as shown in the diagram push the plug on the battery adapter into the socket on the left side of the phone until it clicks into place.

2. Connect the other end of the travel adapter to the mains socket.



### Note

- ▶ Only use the charger included in the box.

3. The moving bars on the battery icon will stop after charging is complete.
4. Ensure the battery is fully charged before using the phone for the first time.

# Getting Started

## CAUTION!

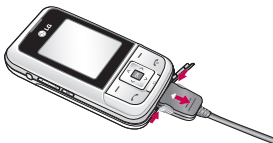
- *Do not force the connector as this may damage the phone and/or the travel adapter.*
- *If you use the battery pack charger when abroad, use an attachment plug adaptor for the proper configuration.*
- *Do not remove your battery or the SIM card while charging.*

## WARNING!

- *Unplug the power cord and charger during lightning storms to avoid electric shock or fire.*
- *Make sure that no sharp-edged items such as animal teeth or nails, come into contact with the battery. This may cause a fire.*

## Disconnecting the charger

Disconnect the travel adapter from the phone as shown in the diagram below.



## Access codes

You can use the access codes described in this section to avoid unauthorised use of your phone. The access codes (except the PUK and PUK2 codes) can be changed by using the **Change codes** feature [Menu 9.6.6].

### PIN code (4 to 8 digits)

The PIN (Personal Identification Number) code protects your SIM card against unauthorised use. The PIN code is usually supplied with the SIM card. When the **PIN Code Request** is set to **On**, your phone will request the PIN code every time it is switched on. When the **PIN Code Request** is set to **Off**, your phone connects to the network directly without the PIN code.

### PIN2 code (4 to 8 digits)

The PIN2 code, supplied with some SIM cards, is required to access functions such as **Fixed Dial Number**. These functions are only available if supported by your SIM card.

### PUK code (4 to 8 digits)

The PUK (PIN Unblocking Key) code is required to unlock a PIN blocked phone. The PUK code may be supplied with the SIM card. If not, contact your network operator for the code. If you lose the code, also contact your network operator.

# Getting Started

## PUK2 code (4 to 8 digits)

The PUK2 code, supplied with some SIM cards, is required to unlock a blocked PIN2 code. If you lose the code, please contact your network operator.


## Security code (4 to 8 digits)



The security code prevents unauthorised use of your phone. The default security code is set to '0000' and the security code is required to delete all phone entries and to restore the handset to the factory settings.



# General Functions

## Making and answering calls

### Making a voice call




1. Enter the number including the full area code, or select the phone number from call logs by pressing .

► To delete a digit press .  
To delete all digits press and hold .



2. Press  to make the call.
3. Press  to finish the call, or close the handset.

### Making a voice call from Contacts or close the handset


It is easy to call anyone whose number you have stored in your Contacts.

1. Press  to access the contacts list.
2. Scroll to the contact to make a call.
3. Press  to make a voice call.
4. Press  to finish the call.


### Making international calls

1. Press and hold  for the international prefix. The '+' character prefixes the international access code.
2. Enter the country code, area code, and the phone number.
3. Press .

### Adjusting the volume



During a call, if you want to adjust the earpiece volume, use  on the left side of the handset.

In idle mode with the phone open, you can adjust the key volume using .


## Answering a call

When you receive a call, the phone rings and the flashing phone icon appears on the screen. If the caller can be identified, the caller's phone number (or name if stored in your Contacts) is displayed.


1. Open the phone and press  to answer an incoming call. If the answer mode is set to **Press any key**, any key will answer a call except for .

### Note


- ▶ To reject an incoming call, press  or the right soft key twice.
- ▶ If you set **Answer mode** as **Slide open** (Menu 9.5.2), you can answer the call simply by opening the phone.

2. End the call by closing the handset or pressing .

### Note

- ▶ You can answer a call while using Contacts or other menu features.
- ▶ When the compatible headset is connected, you can also answer a call using the headset key, as well as using the phone. To reject an incoming call, press .
- ▶ You can mute the ringtone when a call comes in by pressing and holding the volume down side key.

## Signal strength

You can check the strength of your signal by the signal indicator () on the left top of your phone screen. Signal strength can vary, particularly inside buildings. Moving close to a window may improve reception.

## Entering text

You can enter alphanumeric characters using the keypad. For example, storing names in Contacts, writing a message, creating a personal greeting or scheduling events in the calendar all require entering text. The following text input methods are available with the handset.

### T9 mode

This mode lets you enter words with only one keystroke per letter. Each key on the keypad has more than one letter. The T9 mode automatically compares your keystrokes with an internal dictionary to determine the correct word, thus requiring far fewer keystrokes than the traditional ABC mode. This is sometimes known as predictive text.


### ABC mode

This mode lets you enter letters by pressing the key labelled with the required letter once, twice, three or four times until the letter is displayed.


# General Functions

## 123 mode (Number mode)

Type numbers using one keystroke per number.



To change to 123 mode in a text entry field, press  until 123 mode is displayed.

## Changing the text input mode


1. When you are in a field that allows characters to be entered, you will notice the text input mode indicator in the upper right corner of the LCD screen.
2. Press  to switch between T9Abc, T9abc, T9ABC, ABC, Abc, abc and 123.

## Using the T9 Mode

The T9 predictive text input mode allows you to enter words easily with a minimum number of key presses. As you press each key, the handset begins to display the characters that it thinks you are typing based on a built-in dictionary. As new letters are added, the word changes to reflect the most likely candidate from the dictionary.

1. When you are in the T9 predictive text input mode, start entering a word by pressing keys  to . Press one key per letter.
  - ▶ The word changes as letters are typed. Ignore what's on the screen until the word is typed completely.




- ▶ If the word is still incorrect after typing completely, press  once or more to scroll through the other word options.

### Example

Press     to type

**Good.**

Press  to get **Home**.

- ▶ If the desired word is missing from the word choices list, add it by using the ABC mode.
2. Enter the whole word before editing or deleting any keystrokes.
  3. Complete each word with a space by pressing .

To delete letters, press .




Press and hold down  to erase entire words.

## Using the ABC Mode

Use  to  to enter your text.

1. Press the key labelled with the required letter:

- ▶ Once for the first letter.
- ▶ Twice for the second letter.
- ▶ And so on.

2. To insert a space, press  once. To delete letters, press . Press and hold down  to clear the display.

## Note

- The characters assigned to the keys and their order of appearance depends on the language selected using the option **Input method**. The table above provides the characters set for English language.

## Using the 123 (Number) mode

The 123 mode enables you to enter numbers in a text message (a telephone number, for example). Press the keys corresponding to the required digits before manually switching back to the appropriate text entry mode.

## Using the symbol mode

The symbol mode enables you to enter various symbols or special characters. To enter a symbol, **Options** → **Add** → **Symbol**. Use the navigation and numeric keys to select the desired symbol and press .

# Overview of Menu Functions

You can launch a menu by pressing  in the idle screen. Move to the desired item and press  to go into the sub menu.

From the main menu you can also go into a submenu by directly pressing the corresponding numeric key as follows. The main menu consists of the following top menus and sub menus.

## Orange World

Menu 1.1

You can launch the web browser and access the homepage of the web service provided by your Service Provider.

## Bookmarks

Menu 1.2

You can store frequently accessed or favourite URLs/Pages. Several preconfigured URLs are stored as bookmarks.

### Adding a new bookmark

1. Select **New Bookmark** from the **Options** menu.
2. Enter the title and associated URL information.
3. Press the left soft key [OK] to save.

### Connecting to a desired bookmark

Press  or select **Connect** from the **Options** menu.



### Adding a new folder

1. Select **New folder** from the **Options** menu.
2. Enter the title.
3. Press the left key [OK] to save.

## Enter URL

Menu 1.3

You can manually enter a URL address and access the associated web page.

- ▶ To enter a symbol, press  to display the Symbol table.
- ▶ To switch input mode, press .

## History

Menu 1.4

Shows the list of web page's titles accessed recently. You can access the web page easily.

## Saved pages

Menu 1.5

The phone can save the page on display as an offline file.


## Settings

Menu 1.6

You can change the settings for browser display, security, and certificates.

## Network profiles

(Menu 1.6.1)

Select the appropriate profile by pressing . This will activate the profile to initiate the browser launch.

## View style

(Menu 1.6.2)

You can change the browser screen size. (Full screen or fit to screen)

## Cache

(Menu 1.6.3)

Enabling Cache allows you to store accessed pages to your phone. Once a page has been stored in the cache it will greatly enhance the page loading speed on subsequent browsing of the same page.

## Cookies

(Menu 1.6.4)

Enabling Cookies allows you to store cookies sent from the server. Disabling this function will prevent cookies from being stored on your phone.

## Security Certificates (Menu 1.6.5)

If stored, a list of root/ca certificates required for WTLS/TLS can be found here. Certificates can be viewed from the list.

## Show image (Menu 1.6.6)

Allows you to enable or disable the image display during browsing.

### Note

- Enabling this function will delay displaying images until the completion of transmission. Disabling this function will prevent the browser from downloading images from the server, thus allowing faster transmission.

## Java script (Menu 1.6.7)

This menu allows you to activate the Java Script while you use the web browser.

## Memory in use (Menu 1.6.8)

You can select a memory to use.(Phone or External)

## Information Menu 1.7

You can check the version of your browser.

# Call history

You can check the record of missed, received, and dialled calls only if the network supports Calling Line Identification (CLI) within the service area.

The number and name (if available) are displayed together with the date and time at which the call was made.

## All calls

Menu 2.1

Allows you to view the missed, received, and dialled call records. You can make a call or send a message to the number you have selected from the records. You can also save the number in the Contacts.

## Missed calls

Menu 2.2

Allows you to view missed call records, make a call, send a message and save the number in Contacts.

## Dialled calls

Menu 2.3

Allows you to view dialled call records, make a call, send a message and save the number in Contacts.

## Received calls

Menu 2.4





Allows you to view received call records, make a call, send a message and save the number in Contacts.



## Call duration

Menu 2.5





This function allows you to view the duration of your Last call, Dialed calls, Received calls and All calls in hours, minutes and seconds. You can also reset the call timers.

1. Press the left soft key [Menu] and then press  for direct access or use [] and [] to enter **Call history**.
2. Scroll to **Call duration** and Press  [OK].  
The following 4 submenus:  
**Last call, Dialed calls, Received calls** and **All calls**.

## Call costs

Menu 2.6

This function allows you to check the cost of your last call, all calls, remaining and reset the cost. To reset the cost, you need the PIN2 code.

1. Press the left soft key [Menu] and then press  for direct access or use [] and [] to enter **Call history**.
2. Scroll to **Call costs** and Press  [OK].  
The following 3 submenus:  
**Last call, All calls** and **Cost settings**.

### Note

- The actual cost invoiced for calls by your service provider may vary, depending upon network features, rounding-off for billing, tax, and etc.

You can check the **Data time** and **Data volume**.



## Alarm clock

Menu 3.1

If you set the alarm, the  appears on the indicator bar. The specified alarm sounds at the scheduled time. Press right soft key [Quit] to stop the alarm, and the alarm is released. Press the left soft key [Snooze]. The alarm sound stops and resumes after the selected Snooze duration. You can configure up to 5 alarms.

1. Select your desired alarm to configure in the alarm list. If there is no alarm, press the right soft key [New] to add a new alarm.

## Calendar

Menu 3.2

You can refer to your schedule by months. The cursor is on the current date, and the registered date is marked.

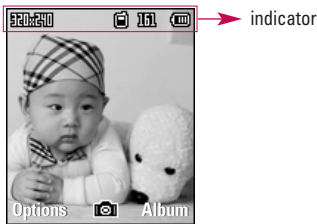



You can set the option whether you will receive the message or not.

## **Info message** (Menu 5.9.5)

### ► **Receive**


- **On:** If you select this menu, your phone will receive Info service messages.

- **Off:** If you select this menu, your phone will not receive Info service messages any more.

You can view a video using the video player. Video files are displayed in the list as thumbnails. You can select a desired video by using the  /  / [] / [] .

Select a desired video and select Play to view the recorded video.

Select the left soft key [Send] to attach the selected video to a message, Email.

When option **1. Open** is selected and you press  , the video clip will be played with the Media Player. To pause the playback, press  during the playback. To resume the paused playback, press  once again.

When viewing video clips in the Media Player, the following options are available:

- ▶ **File → Information:** You can check information on files being played (File name, Size, Date, Type, Playback time, Copyright).
- ▶ **Send via:** You can send the video via Picture message or Bluetooth if the file is not protected by Digital Rights Management (DRM).
- ▶ **Delete:** Deletes the selected video.

## Note

- ▶ According to your Service Provider, it varies whether you can download new Images or Sounds or Videos etc. through the Internet.



## Others

Menu 6.4

Any type of file can be stored here. This folder is mainly used for transporting files from one PC to another.

### Note

- ▶ You can see only specific files in a specific folder. That is, files in a suitable format to each folder are only shown. (e.g. BMP, JPG, etc. files for the **Images** folder and MP3, WMA, etc. files for the **Sound** folder, and so on)

## Games & Apps

Menu 6.5

You can easily download games and other applications in this menu. Please note that additional cost may be incurred when using online services.

## Games & Apps

(Menu 6.5.1)

- **Games:** In this menu, you can manage the Java applications installed in your phone. You can play or delete downloaded applications, or set the connect option. The downloaded applications are organised in folders.

After selecting a folder, press [Options] and then sub menus available to several options are displayed.

- ▶ **Open:** You can see the stored games.
- ▶ **New folder:** Create a new slide.
- ▶ **Delete all:** You can delete all.

Java™, is a technology developed by Sun Microsystems. Similar to the way you would download the Java Applet using the standard MS Internet Explorer browsers, Java MIDlet can be downloaded using a WAP enabled phone. Depending on the service provider, all Java based programs such as Java games can be downloaded and run on a phone. Once downloaded, the Java program can be viewed in the **Games & Apps** menu where you can select, execute, or delete. The Java program files saved in the phone are in .JAD or .JAR format.

- **Applications:** In this menu, you can manage the Java applications installed in your phone. You can play or delete downloaded applications, or set the connect option. The downloaded applications are organised in folders. Press the left soft key [Options] and select **Open** to open the selected slide or launch the selected midlet.

## Note

- The JAR file is a compressed format of the Java program and the JAD file is a description file that includes all detailed information. From the network, prior to download, you can view all detailed file descriptions from the JAD file.

- While being based on a standard language (J2ME), not all Java applications are compatible with all handsets on sale insofar as specific libraries may be used for a telephone model. The software may be blocked or switch itself on when Java applications not specifically developed for the phone this manual refers to are downloaded, making it necessary to “restart” the handset. We would like to point out that these problems are caused by incompatible applications and are not a product fault.

### **CAUTION!**

*Only J2ME(Java 2 Micro Edition) based programs will run in a phone environment. The J2SE(Java 2 Standard Edition) based programs will only run in a PC environment.*

## Network profiles

(Menu 6.5.2)

A profile is the network information used to connect to the Internet. There are default profiles for some operators, stored in phone memory. It's impossible to rename default profiles.

Each profile has submenus as follows:

- **Activate:** Activates the selected profile.
- **Edit:** Use this to edit and change WAP settings for the selected profile.

- **Homepage:** This setting allows you to enter the address (URL) of a site you want to use as homepage. You do not need to type http:// at the front of each URL as the WAP Browser will automatically add it.
- **Proxy:** Activates or cancels proxy.
- **IP address:** Input the IP address of the Proxy server you access.
- **Port number:** Input the Proxy Port.
- ▶ **New profile:** You can add a new profile.
- ▶ **Reset all:** Reset all the profiles.

## External memory

Menu 6.6

By using the USB cable, you can connect your phone to PC and use the phone as a mass storage (Removable Disk). You can transfer MP3 files, Images and Videos etc. in your PC to your phone.

### Note

- ▶ When you format your SD Card, you should set the file system as **FAT** not FAT32. This system doesn't provide FAT32 file format.

**Note**

1. This function will only work in the idle mode.
2. Please do not try to disconnect the cable while you are transferring files. After you finish the download, you should disconnect the cable via a safe removal mode for a safety of your phone.
3. If you receive a call when you use this function, the call will be rejected but you can find it in a missed call list after you finish the connection.
4. You can use an external memory which is up to 2GByte.

# Profiles

In Profiles, you can adjust and customise the phone tones for different events, environments, or caller groups. There are five preset profiles: **General**, **Silent**, **Vibrate only**, **Outdoor** and **Headset**. Each profile can be personalised (Except Vibrate only, Silent menu).

## Search

Menu 8.1

You can see the contact lists. The search operation is performed based on a name. You can also perform some operations by option menu for the selected phone number; Edit, Send message, Delete, New contact, Multi delete, and Copy, etc..

## New contact

Menu 8.2

You can register a new contact address. You can enter the name, different phone numbers and email addresses of a new contact. You can also assign the contact to group, and include a picture and a specific ringtone. You can see the attached picture and hear the assigned ringtone when it's incoming call.

## Speed dials

Menu 8.3

Speed dials are configured between 2-9 and set by the information stored in your SIM card and phone. You can just check which number is in the speed dials list and can't manage them optionally.

## Groups

Menu 8.4

Using this menu you can manage contacts by grouping the handset stored contacts. There are 7 default groups you can make: Family, Friends, Colleagues, VIP, Group1, Group2, Group3. You can perform some operations by option menu for the selected Group; View members, Group ringtone, Group icon Add member, Remove member, Remove all member, Rename, and Reset all. Especially, you

You can copy an entry from SIM to phone or from phone to SIM.

You can display the shortcuts on the home screen. By using the shortcuts,

you can enter a specific menu directly.

(Menu 9.3.6)

You can select the desired menu style (Grid view or List view).

## Standby text

(Menu 9.3.7)

If you select **On**, you can edit the text which is displayed in standby mode.

If the function is activated, network name will be displayed on main LCD.

### Bluetooth

(Menu 9.4.1)

#### Bluetooth connection

Your phone has built-in Bluetooth wireless technology which makes it possible for you to connect your phone wirelessly to other Bluetooth devices such as a handsfree, PC, PDA or other phones.

You can, for example, have a conversation via a cordless Bluetooth handsfree or browse the Internet, wirelessly connected via a mobile

phone. You can also exchange, for example, business cards, calendar items and pictures.

#### Note

► We recommend that your phone and the Bluetooth device you are communicating with be within a range of 10 meters. The connection may be improved if there are no solid objects between your phone and the other Bluetooth device.

To use the Bluetooth function, you must first set **On**.

## 2. Configuring Bluetooth settings

  - **My visibility:** Set [My handset's visibility] to [Show] so that other devices can detect your phone when they are searching for a Bluetooth device. If you select [Hide], other devices will not be able to detect your phone when they are searching for a Bluetooth device.
  - **My name:** You can name or rename your phone as it will appear on other devices. Your phone's name will be shown on other devices only when [My handset's visibility] is set to [Show].
  - **My address:** You can check the address of Bluetooth.

### Note

▶ When user uses Bluetooth Device in the handset, the security of the handset is at risk. Therefore, we recommend that Bluetooth visibility be set to **Hide** after configuration or device pairing. For incoming files via Bluetooth regardless of paired devices, you can choose to accept or reject the connection, after checking the sender details.

## Network

(Menu 9.4.2)

The Network feature enables you to indicate whether the network used when roaming(outside your home area) is selected automatically, manually or preferably.

## Note

- ▶ You can select a network other than your home network only if it has a valid roaming agreement with your home network.

## Network selection

(Menu 9.4.2.1)

### Automatic

Use this to set the phone to automatically search for and select one of the networks available in your area.

### Manual

If you want to select the desired network manually from a list of networks, you can activate this function. If the connection to the manually selected network is lost, the phone will give off a error tone and ask you to select a network again. The selected network must have a roaming agreement with your home network. The phone will let you select another network if the phone fails to access the initial selected network. The phone will



default back to Automatic if it is switched off.

### Preferred

You can set a list of preferred networks and the phone attempts to register with first, before attempting to register to any other networks.

#### America(1900)

Allows you to select America(1900) only depending on Network availability.

#### Europe(900/1800)

Allows you to select Europe(900/1800) depending on Network availability.

### GPRS attach

(Menu 9.4.2.3)

You can set GPRS service depending on various situations.

### Access point

(Menu 9.4.2.4)

Allow you to select the access point from the list.

### USB connection mode (Menu 9.4.3)

You can activate USB connecton mode of your phone for serveral usages.

If you use Mass storage function like USB memory card, select Mass storage in this menu. Mass storage is available for only external memory card.

If you use Data service such as PC suite application, select Data service in this menu.

If you use Music sync with Windows Media Player, select Music sync in this menu. Music sync is available for only music contents. If you want to synchronise with external memory, you can use 'External memory' as Primary storage. If you want to synchronise with internal memory, you can use 'Internal memory' as Primary storage.

### Call divert

(Menu 9.5.1)

The Call divert service allows you to divert incoming voice calls, fax calls, and data calls to another number. For details, contact your service provider.

- ▶ **All voice calls:** Diverts all voice calls unconditionally.

- ▶ **If busy:** Diverts voice calls when the phone is in use.
- ▶ **If no reply:** Diverts voice calls which you do not answer.
- ▶ **If out of reach:** Diverts voice calls when the phone is switched off or out of coverage.
- ▶ **All data calls:** Diverts to a number with a PC connection unconditionally.
- ▶ **All fax calls:** Diverts to a number with a fax connection unconditionally.
- ▶ **Cancel all:** Cancels all call divert service.

### The submenus

Call divert menus have the submenus shown below.

- ▶ **Activate:** Activates the corresponding service.

- **To voice mailbox:** Forwards to message centre.
- **To other number:** Input the number for call diverting.
- **To favourite number:** You can check recent five diverted numbers.
- ▶ **Cancel:** Deactivate the corresponding service.
- ▶ **View status:** View the status of the corresponding service.

## Answer mode

(Menu 9.5.2)

Allows you to set the answering method. You can choose between **Slide open**, **Any key** and **Send key only**.

## Send my number

(Menu 9.5.3)

- ▶ **Set by network:** Configures with the default settings determined by the service provider.
- ▶ **On:** Configures to send my phone number when making an outgoing call.
- ▶ **Off:** Configures not to send my phone number when making an outgoing call.

## Call waiting

(Menu 9.5.4)

- ▶ **Activate:** Activates call waiting service. Selecting this item, displays requesting message and animation. When the network answers, the result of the operation is displayed.

# Settings

- ▶ **Cancel:** Deactivates Call waiting service. Selecting this item displays requesting message and animation. When the network answers, the result of the operation is displayed.
- ▶ **View status:** Displays activated Call waiting service group item of the network. Selecting this item displays requesting message and animation. When the network answers, the result of the operation is displayed.

## Minute minder

(Menu 9.5.5)

Determines whether to sound a 1 minute tone every 1 minute when you are on the phone.

## Auto redial

(Menu 9.5.6)

Allows you to set the auto redial function when a call attempt has failed.

## Select line (SIM dependent)

(Menu 9.5.7)

This menu is shown only if the SIM supports two subscriber numbers, that is, two phone lines. Select which phone line (between Line 1 and Line 2) you want to use for making calls and sending short messages. Calls on both lines can be answered irrespective of the selected line.

## Send DTMF tones

(Menu 9.5.8)

DTMF tones allow your phone to make use of an automated switchboard.

Menu 9.6

### PIN code request

(Menu 9.6.1)

In this menu, you can set the phone to ask for the PIN code of your SIM card when the phone is switched on. If this function is activated, you'll be requested to enter the PIN code.

1. Select PIN code request in the phone settings menu, and then press  [OK].
2. Set **On/Off**.
3. If you want to change the setting, you need to enter PIN code when you switch on the phone.

You are requested to enter the security code to confirm the selection.

► To unlock the handset, you need to enter the security code.

## Call barring


(Menu 9.6.4)

### 1. All outgoing


When  is selected, it receives the Barring password from user, and activates the barring service on the network. A requesting message and animation appears. When the network answers,

the result of the operation is displayed.


### 2. Outgoing international

When  is selected, it operates in the same way as the **Outgoing calls** menu.


### 3. O/G international except home country

When  is selected, it operates in the same way as the **Outgoing calls** menu.

### 4. All incoming

When  is selected, it operates in the same way as the **Outgoing calls** menu.

### 5. Incoming when abroad

When  is selected, it operates in the same way as the **Outgoing calls** menu.

Select the **Activate** menu to receive the Barring password from the user and activate the barring service on the network.

The Cancel menu sets the selected call restriction off. The **View status** menu enables users to view the current network configuration. Selecting **View status** menu displays the Requesting message with animation and the result of the operation when the network answers.

## 6. Cancel all barrings

You can cancel all barring services.

## 7. Change password

You can change the password for Call Barring Service.

## Fixed dial number

(Menu 9.6.5)

- ▶ **ON/OFF:** Select whether to activate or not. PIN authentication is required.
- ▶ **Number list:** Displays the current Fixed dialist. You can edit, add, or delete fixed dial numbers. PIN2 authentication is required to edit the list. And the configuration information is saved on the SIM.

## Change codes





(Menu 9.6.6)

You can change the PIN, PIN2, Security code.

## PIN code

PIN is the abbreviation for Personal Identification Number, and is used to restrict use by an unauthorised user.

## PIN code change procedure

1. Select 'PIN code' from the 'Change codes' list and then press .
2. Enter the current PIN code and press .
3. Enter the new PIN code and press .
4. Enter the new PIN code once again and press .
- ▶ If the PIN code is different from that of step 3, the procedure is restarted from step 3.
5. When the PIN code is changed properly, a **Changed** message is displayed. If you enter an incorrect PIN code in step 2, the procedure is restarted from step 2, and the number of attempts you have left to enter the number is decreased by 1.

### Note

- ▶ Three incorrect PIN code entries in the PIN code entry window would invalidate the PIN code. In this case, you have to enter the PUK (PIN Unblock Key) code to configure the PIN code again. The maximum number of times you may enter the PUK code is 10. (Note: If you enter an incorrect PUK code 10 times, the SIM card will be blocked and must be replaced.)

## PIN2 code

PIN2 is the abbreviation for Personal Identification Number 2, and is used to restrict use by unauthorised users as with the PIN.

The PIN2 code change procedure is the same as the one for the PIN code. 3 incorrect PIN2 code entries would invalidate the PIN2 code.



In this case, you have to enter the PUK2 code in order to use the PIN2 code again. The maximum number of times you may try to enter the PUK2 code is 10, like PUK1. 10 incorrect PUK2 code entries would invalidate the PIN2 code.

### Security code

The security code is used to change the mobile phone password. The maximum number of attempts to enter the security code is not limited as it is with PIN2.

## Flight mode

Menu 9.7

If you activate the Flight mode, you can use the phone without connecting the 2G wireless network. 2G wireless phone and FM radio signals from the phone or Bluetooth connections are prevented, but you can still do tasks which do not require the use of wireless network. With flight mode you cannot make any calls including emergency calls or use other features that require network service.
