PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

The COMMUNICATOR is the newest generation in personal two-way communications. The COMMUNICATOR operates in a license-free radio band (no FCC license is needed for its operation), on any of the 14 license-free channels.

The COMMUNICATOR is a lightweight, compact two-way communication device that can be used to communicate with family or friends at parks, shopping malls, sporting events, concerts-any indoor or outdoor activity!

The COMMUNICATOR is compatible with other brands utilizing the same frequency band (operating in the frequency range from 462.5625MHz to 467.7125MHz).

The COMMUNICATOR has 14-CHANNELS, featuring a multi-functional LCD Screen (which displays the current channel and various status icons).

Other features include ELECTRONIC VOLUME CONTROL and BATTERY SAVE CIRCUITRY.



Special Features

BELT CLIP

SP. (SPEAKER) JACK - When earphone is connected into this jack, voice of the speaker will shift to earphone.

BUTTON - Press to transmit CALL Tones.

BUTTONS - Press to adjust volume level and change channels.

(PUSH TO TALK) BUTTON - Press to transmit.

BUTTON - Used to activate/deactivate CHANNEL SCAN.
SPEAKER

SLIP-ON COVER - Secures the BATTERY COMPARTMENT COVER. TX (Transmission) LED INDICATOR - Illuminates red when transmitting. MIC/CHG (MIC/BATTERY CHARGE) JACK

LCD (Liquid Crystal Display) SCREEN - Displays current channel selection and other radio status symbols.

POWER BUTTON - Press and hold the POWER button to turn your unit ON/OFF.

/LOCK BUTTON - Allows you to change channels. Press and hold for 5 seconds to LOCK the buttons.

MONITOR BUTTON - Press to tune in and hold onto weak signals.

MIC - MICROPHONE

ANTENNA

BATTERY COMPARTMENT - Houses four(4) "AAA" ALKALINE or NI-MH Batteries (BATTERY PACK not included).

Care and Safety

CAUTION

Damaged Antennas

Do not use any COMMUNICATOR that has a damaged ANTENNA. If a
damaged ANTENNA comes in contact with the skin, a minor burn may result.

Batteries

All batteries can cause property damage and/or bodily injury such as burns if conductive material such as jewelry, keys or beaded chains touches exposed terminals. The material may complete an electrical circuit (short circuit) and become quite hot. Exercise care in handling any charged battery, particularly when placing it inside a pocket, purse or other container with metal objects.

WARNING

For Vehicles with an Air Bag
Do not place your COMMUNICATOR in the area over an air bag or in the air both of prace your COMMUNICATOR in the area over an air pag or in the air bag deployment area. Removing the BELT CLIP



- 1. Pull the BELT CLIP LATCH away from the unit. 2. While pulling the BELT CLIP LATCH, push up on the BELT CLIP to remove it from the unit, as shown in Figure 1.

installing the BELT CLIP

Slide the BELT CLIP into the BELT CLIP SLOT as shown in Figure 2.
 A "click" indicates the BELT CLIP is locked into position.

Connecting the Adapter

To charge the unit with "AAA" Ni-MH rechargeable battery pack insert round connector of the AC/DC Adapter into the jack on top of the unit. (The adapter not is included with the unit.)


The COMMUNICATOR is designed to be used with accessories (Speaker, Microphone, etc.).

WARNING

DO NOT CHARGE THIS UNIT USING AN AC/DC ADAPTER WITH REGULAR "AAA" ALKALINE BATTERIES INSTALLED.
ONLY USE THE AC/DC ADAPTER WITH "AAA" NI-MH RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES. (BATTERY PACK NOT INCLUDED)

BATTERY INSTALLATION



- 1. Remove the SLIP-ON COVER. See Figure 3.
 2. Remove the BATTERY COMPARTMENT COVER from the BATTERY COMPARTMENT. See Figure 4.
 3. Install four (4) "AAA" Alkaline Batteries (not included) following the polarities
- as shown in Figure 5.
- 4. Reinstall the BATTERY COMPARTMENT COVER and return the SLIP-ON COVER into position

The COMMUNICATOR has a built in POWER SAVER feature for maximum battery life. But when the COMMUNICATOR is not being used, conserve battery power by pressing the POWER button to OFF. Remove the batteries if the unit will not be used for a long period of time.

Turning the Unit ON

Press and hold the POWER (1970-19) button. The unit will "beep" and the LCD SCREEN will briefly display a SELF-TEST SCREEN.

Turning the Unit OFF

Press and hold the POWER **DIAM** button. The unit will "beep" and the LCD SCREEN will turn blank.

Adjusting Speaker Volume

- Press the button to increase the SPEAKER volume.
- Press the button to decrease the SPEAKER volume.
- The SPEAKER volume level is indicated by the number of bars displayed in the lower right corner of the LCD SCREEN.

NOTE: Volume and down buttons are disabled during BUTTON LOCK

Receiving a Signal

The unit is continuously in the RECEIVE mode when the unit is ON and not Transmitting. When you receive a signal on the current channel, the RX icon (BUSY) is displayed. (See "LCD SCREEN"

Transmitting a Signal


- 1. Check the channel activity by pressing and holding the button. You'll hear static if the channel is unoccupied. Don't TRANSMIT if someone is talking on the channel. Press and hold the button to TRANSMIT. The TX LED indicator will illuminate red. Hold the unit in a vertical position with the MICROPHONE 2 to 3 inches from the mouth.

 2. While holding the button, speak into the unit using a normal tone of voice.

 3. Release the button when you have finished transmitting.

NOTE: In order for other people to receive your transmission, they must also be on the same channel you are currently using. Refer to the "Changing Channels" section for more information.

Changing CHANNELS

The COMMUNICATOR has 14 available channels. To change channels: Press and hold the button until the current channel number flashes on the LCD SCREEN.

- 2. While the channel number is flashing:
- Press the button to move to a higher channel.
 Press the button to move to a lower channel.

- The channel changes from 1 to 14, or from 14 to 1.

 Press the button or button to select the desired channel and return to NORMAL mode or press CALL button to confirm the the channel and TRANSMIT.

MONITOR

You can use the MONITOR feature to check for weaker signals in the current

- Press the button for normal monitoring.
- Press and hold the button until it "beeps" for continuous monitoring.

BUTTON LOCK

- Press and hold the transfer button for 5 seconds until the BUTTON LOCK icon is displayed on the LCD SCREEN.
- To return to the NORMAL mode, press and hold the button until the BUTTON LOCK icon is removed from the LCD SCREEN.

Changing CTCSS CHANNELS

The COMMUNICATOR has 38 available CTCSS sub-channels. To change

- channels;

 1. Press the button twice, the CTCSS sub-channel will flash.

 2. While the CTCSS sub-channel number is flashing;

 Press the button to move to a higher sub-channel.

 Press the button to move to a lower sub-channel.

 The sub-channel changes from OFF (0) to 38, or from 38 to OFF (0).

 3. Press the button to confirm your selection and return to the NORMAL mode. Press the button to shift to the next option.

NOTE: To communicate with other FRS units, both units must be switched to the same channel and CTCSS sub-channel.

VOX Selection

- 1. Press the button thrice, the VX icon will blink on the LCD

CHANNEL SCAN

CHANNEL SCAN performs searches for active signals in an endless

- loop from 1 to 14.

 1. Press and release the (CAN) button to activate CHANNEL SCAN. The channel number on the LCD Screen changes rapidly until an active signal is detected.
- 2. When an active signal (one of 14 channels) is detected, CHANNEL SCAN pauses keeping the active signal broadcasted.

 3. Press the button to communicate through the active signal
- 3. Press the title button to communicate through the active signal channel and CHANNEL SCAN is deactivated.

 4. When an active signal (one of 14 channels) is detected, but another channel is desired, press the title button to bypass the current channel and continue to search for another active channel.

 5. Press the title button to deactivate CHANNEL SCAN mode.

Operation

Battery Charge Level/Low Battery Indication

- The BATTERY CHARGE LEVEL is indicated by the number of squares
- present inside the BATTERY icon on the LCD Screen.

 * When the BATTERY CHARGE LEVEL is low, the BATTERY icon will flash to indicate that the batteries need to be replaced.
- Do not charge this unit using an AC/DC adapter with regular "AAA" alkaline batteries installed. Only use optional AC/DC adapter with "AAA" Ni-MH rechargeable batteries (batteries not included).

To Charge the COMMUNICATOR

In the event you wish to use the unit with rechargeable batteries (not included) you will be required to use an AC/DC Adapter - Input 120V AC 60 Hz - Output 8 VDC 350 mA (not included).

- Insert four (4) "AAA" Ni-MH rechargeable batteries (not included).
 Turn the POWER OFF.

- 2. Turn the POWER OFF.

 3. Plug the adapter into a 120V AC wall outlet and insert the round end plug into the MIC/CHG JACK on top of the unit.

 4. Unplug the adapter and the round end plug from the MIC/CHG JACK on the unit. Turn the POWER ON. The Battery indicator on the LCD Screen will display the new Battery Level charge.

NOTE: It takes approximately 6 hours to fully charge the batteries if they are at their lowest level.

Sending CALL TONES

You can use CALL TONES to alert the other user when you are attempting to contact with them. You can also use CALL TONES to signal the beginning or the end of a transmission.

- 1. Press the The Doutton, the red TX LED indicator will light up and the CALL TONE continues for 3 seconds.

Troubleshooting

SYMPTOM	SOLUTION
No power.	Check BATTERIES. Ensure that the BATTERIES are installed properly. The BATTERIES may be weak. Replace old BATTERIES with four (4) new "AAA" alkaline on NI-MH BATTERIES.
Reception is weak.	Press the button to increase VOLUME. The receiving signal may be weak and/or out of range. If this happens press the button.
Cannot change channels.	To change channels, press the total button until the channe number flashes on the LCD SCREEN. Press the flashes or the LCD SCREEN.
Range is limited.	BATTERIES may be weak. Replace with new BATTERIES if the BATTERY CHARGE LEVEL is low. The maximum range will vary depending on terrain and environment Open fields provide the maximum range, while steel/concrete structures, heavy foliage and use in buildings and in vehicles may limit the range significantly. Wearing the radio close to the body, such as in a pocket or or a bell, will decrease range; change the location of the radio
Sound distortion problems.	If you are transmitting, speak in a normal voice, 2 to 3 inches away from the MICROPHONE. If you are receiving, tower the VOLUME to a comfortable level Radios to close.
