OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Remote Controller

- Unscrew back compartment with a phillips screwdriver to open battery door
- Install 1-9V battery with polarity as shown inside battery compartment
- Extend antenna
- Only different frequency cars can be operated at the same time

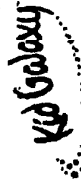
Vehicle

- Unscrew plastic holder attached to back of vehicle with a phillips screwdriver
- Install 2-AAA batteries with polarity as shown inside battery compartment
- Turn switch to ON to start vehicle
- Model#4203-Bee stinger stored with the operating instructions. Open & snap into hole in rear

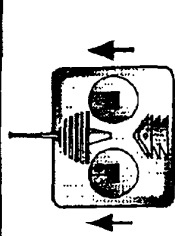
The radio circuitry in your vehicle and remote controller is sensitive. Radio interference can affect the control of your vehicle. You may have to choose another location to operate your vehicle.

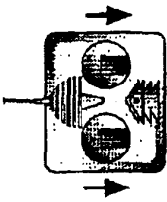
PLAY with knobs for wheelies, turns, and spins



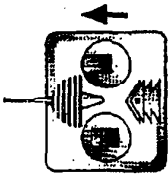

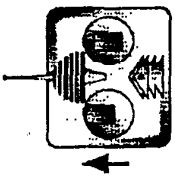
FORWARD:
