



1.1 tDynamo has two parts.




 $1.2\ \mathrm{tDynamo}$ can be used alone, also can be used on the support .




- 2.1 There are three kinds of usage

2.1.2 Second, on the card reader Connect the usb type - c interface, the other end is inserted into the host with USB interface, and then open the power supply




 $2.1.3\,$ In the third, put the reader into the base, with the base USB inserted into the host, open the power



supply


2.2 To use a MSR card

2.3 TO use a IC card


Make sure the IC contacts are on the top side. Insert the card to the end of the
