

1. Introduction

The Nokia Bluetooth Headset BH-900 allows you freedom to make and receive calls while on the move or in the office. The headset has a sliding boom that allows to answer and end calls and to talk at a lower volume or in a noisy environment.

You can connect the headset to a compatible phone that supports Bluetooth wireless technology.


Read this user guide carefully before using the headset. Read also the user guide for your phone, which provides important safety and maintenance information. Keep the headset out of reach of small children.


Bluetooth wireless technology

Bluetooth wireless technology makes it possible to connect compatible communication devices without using cables. A Bluetooth connection does not require that the phone and the headset be in line of sight, but both devices should be within 10 meters (30 feet) of each other. Connections can be subject to interference from obstructions, such as walls or other electronic devices.

The wireless headset is compliant with Bluetooth Specification 2.0 supporting the following profiles: Headset Profile 1.1 and Handsfree Profile 1.5. Check with the manufacturers of other devices to determine their compatibility with this device.

There may be restrictions on using Bluetooth technology in some locations. Check with your local authorities or service provider.








The headset contains the following parts as shown in the figure:

- Indicator light (1)
- Volume key (2)
- Power key (3)
- Sliding boom (4)
- Answer/end key (5)
- Charger connector (6)
- Earphone (7)
- Microphone (8)







Note: Parts of the headset are magnetic. Metallic materials may be attracted to the headset. Do not place credit cards or other magnetic storage media near the headset, because information stored on them may be erased.


Chargers

Get started

Charge the battery

This device has an internal, non-removable, rechargeable battery. Do not attempt to remove the battery from the device as you may damage the device.

- 1. Connect the charger to a wall outlet.
- 2. Connect the charger cable to the headset as shown in the figure.

The red indicator light is displayed during charging. If charging does not start, disconnect the charger, plug it in



again, and retry. Charging the battery fully may take up to 2 hours.

3. When the battery is fully charged, the green indicator light is displayed. Disconnect the charger from the wall outlet and the headset.

The fully charged battery has power for up to 8 hours of talk-time or up to 180 hours of standby time. However, the talk and standby times may vary when used with different mobile phones or other compatible Bluetooth devices, usage settings, usage styles, and environments.

When the battery is running out of power, the headset beeps, and the red indicator light starts to flash.


Switch the headset on or off

To switch on, press and hold the power key. The headset beeps, and the green indicator light starts to flash. The indicator light turns blue when the headset is connected to your phone and ready for use.


To switch off, press and hold the power key. The headset beeps, and the red indicator light is displayed briefly.

Pair the headset with a compatible phone

- 1. Switch on your phone and the headset.
- 2. Activate the Bluetooth feature on the phone, and set the phone to search for Bluetooth devices. See the user guide of your phone for instructions.

- 3. Select the headset (Nokia BH-900) from the list of found devices.
- 4. Enter the passcode 0000 to pair and connect the headset to your phone. In some phones you may need to make the connection separately after pairing. See the user guide of your phone for details. You only need to pair the headset with your phone once.
- 5. If the pairing was successful, the headset beeps and appears in the phone menu where you can view the currently paired Bluetooth devices.

Disconnect the headset from the phone

To disconnect the headset from your phone (for example, to connect the phone to another Bluetooth device), do one of the following:

- Switch off the headset.
- Disconnect the headset in the Bluetooth menu of your phone.
- Move the headset more than 10 meters (30 feet) away from the phone.

You do not need to delete the pairing with the headset to disconnect it.

Reconnect the paired headset to your phone


To connect the headset to your phone, switch on the headset, make the connection in the Bluetooth menu of your phone, or press and hold the answer/end key.

You can set your phone to connect with the headset automatically when the headset is switched on. To do this in Nokia phones, change your paired device settings in the Bluetooth menu.

Troubleshooting

If you cannot connect the headset to your phone, do as follows:





The sliding boom



The sliding boom brings the microphone closer to your mouth, which improves the audio quality even when you talk at a low volume or in a noisy environment. You can use the boom to answer, end, or reject a call.

To use the boom, gently pull it down toward your mouth (1), or push it up to its initial position (2).



Call handling

To make a call, use your phone in the normal way when the headset is connected to your phone.

If your phone supports redialing, press the answer/end key twice briefly when no call is in progress.

If your phone supports voice dialing, press and hold the answer/end key when no call is in progress, and proceed as described in the user guide of your phone.

To answer a call, pull the boom down toward your mouth, press the answer/end key, or use the phone keys. If the automatic answer function




You can use the headset to make and receive push to talk (PTT) calls. To use this network service, your phone needs to support it and the function needs to be set to on in the phone. For general information on using the PTT function, see the user guide of your compatible phone.

To make a PTT call to the default PTT channel defined in your phone, press the middle of the volume key (while no call is in progress) and hold it pressed as long as you speak.

When you receive a PTT call while no call is in progress, the headset beeps and you start to hear speech from the group. To answer and speak to the listened channel, press the middle of the volume key within the time defined by the network operator or service provider, and hold it pressed as long as you speak. To answer and speak to the default channel, press the middle of the volume key after the time defined by the network operator or service provider, and hold it pressed as long as







you speak. For details on the time limit, contact your network operator or service provider.

Switch a call between phone and headset

To switch the phone call or PTT call between the headset and a compatible Nokia phone, press and hold the answer/end key, or use the respective function in your phone.

You can pair the headset with up to eight phones but connect it to only one phone at a time.


The phone that was first paired with the headset is the default phone. If the headset is switched on within 10 meters (30 feet) of several paired phones, the headset tries to connect to the default phone.

If the headset cannot connect to the default phone, the headset tries to connect to the last used phone. If the headset cannot connect to this phone either, one of the other six paired phones can be connected to the headset. See the user guide of your phone for details.

Clear the settings

If you want to clear all the settings from the headset (for example, the list of paired devices), press and hold the power key and the volume key up for 10 seconds. After the settings are cleared, the headset beeps twice, and the red, green, and blue indicator lights alternate for several seconds.







4. Battery information


Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery. The full performance of a new battery is achieved only after two or three complete charge and discharge cycles. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. Recharge your battery only with Nokia approved chargers designated for this device.


Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use. Do not leave a fully charged battery connected to a charger, since overcharging may shorten its lifetime. If left unused, a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time.


Never use any charger that is damaged.


Leaving the device in hot or cold places, such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions, will reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery. Always try to keep the battery between 15°C and 25°C (59°F and 77°F). A device with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily, even when the battery is fully charged. Battery performance is particularly limited in temperatures well below freezing.

You can pair the headset with up to eight phones but connect it to only one phone at a time.


The phone that was first paired with the headset is the default phone. If the headset is switched on within 10 meters (30 feet) of several paired phones, the headset tries to connect to the default phone.

If the headset cannot connect to the default phone, the headset tries to connect to the last used phone. If the headset cannot connect to this phone either, one of the other six paired phones can be connected to the headset. See the user guide of your phone for details.

Clear the settings

If you want to clear all the settings from the headset (for example, the list of paired devices), press and hold the power key and the volume key up for 10 seconds. After the settings are cleared, the headset beeps twice, and the red, green, and blue indicator lights alternate for several seconds.







4. Battery information


Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery. The full performance of a new battery is achieved only after two or three complete charge and discharge cycles. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. Recharge your battery only with Nokia approved chargers designated for this device.


Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use. Do not leave a fully charged battery connected to a charger, since overcharging may shorten its lifetime. If left unused, a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time.


Never use any charger that is damaged.


Leaving the device in hot or cold places, such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions, will reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery. Always try to keep the battery between 15°C and 25°C (59°F and 77°F). A device with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily, even when the battery is fully charged. Battery performance is particularly limited in temperatures well below freezing.

Do not dispose of batteries in a fire as they may explode. Batteries may also explode if damaged. Dispose of batteries according to local regulations. Please recycle when possible. Do not dispose as household waste.

Care and maintenance

Your device is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you protect your warranty coverage.

- Keep all accessories and enhancements out of the reach of small children.
- Keep the device dry. Precipitation, humidity, and all types of liquids or moisture can contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits. If your device does get wet, allow it to dry completely.
- Do not use or store the device in dusty, dirty areas. Its moving parts and electronic components can be damaged.
