

6 Safety

Network services

To use the device you must have service from a wireless service provider. Some features are not available on all networks; other features may require that you make specific arrangements with your service provider to use them. Network services involve transmission of data. Check with your service provider for details about fees in your home network and when roaming on other networks. Your service provider can explain what charges will apply. Some networks may have limitations that affect how you can use some features of this device requiring network support such as support for specific technologies like WAP 2.0 protocols (HTTP and SSL) that run on TCP/IP protocols and language-dependent characters.

Your service provider may have requested that certain features be disabled or not activated in your device. If so, these features will not appear on your device menu. Your device may also have customized items such as menu names, menu order, and icons.

Shared memory

The following features in this device may share memory: multimedia messaging (MMS), e-mail application, instant messaging, for example. Use of one or more of these features may reduce the memory available for the remaining features. If your device displays a message that the memory is full, delete some of the information stored in the shared memory.

About Digital Rights Management

If your device has WMDRM-protected content, both the licence and the content will be lost if the device memory

is formatted. You may also lose the licence and the content if the files on your device get corrupted. Losing the licence or the content may limit your ability to use the same content on your device again. For more information, contact your service provider.

Some licences may be connected to a specific SIM card, and the protected content can be accessed only if the SIM card is inserted in the device.














During extended operation such as high speed data connection and extensive WLAN usage, the device may feel warm. In most cases, this condition is normal. If you suspect the device is not working properly, take it to the nearest authorised service facility.

Insert SIM card and battery


Safe removal. Always switch the device off and disconnect the charger before removing the battery.



- 1 To release the back cover, pull and hold the release button.
- While holding the release button, lift the back cover.




- 4 To unlock the SIM card holder, push it to the right.


- 8 Line up the battery contacts with the battery compartment connectors, and insert the battery.
- 9 Replace the back cover.

Memory card

Use only compatible microSD cards approved by Nokia for use with this device. Nokia uses approved industry standards for memory cards, but some brands may not be fully compatible with this device. Incompatible cards may damage the card and the device and corrupt data stored on the card.

Insert a memory card

A memory card may already be inserted in the device. If not, do the following:









- To release the memory card holder, push the holder to the direction indicated by the arrow on the
- 2 Lift the memory card holder up.
- Slide a compatible memory card into the memory card holder. Make sure the contact area of the card is facing down.
- Push the memory card holder down.
- To lock the memory card holder, push the holder to its original position.

Remove the memory card

- Switch the device off.
- Remove the back cover and the battery.
- Remove the memory card from the memory card holder.

Antenna locations

Your device may have internal and external antennas. Avoid touching the antenna area unnecessarily while the antenna is transmitting or receiving. Contact with antennas affects the communication quality and may cause a higher power level during operation and may reduce the battery life.



Switch the device on and off





Press and hold the power key to switch the device on and off. Briefly pressing this key ends an active call or closes an application.

If the device asks for a PIN code, enter the PIN code, and select OK.

If the device asks for the lock code, enter the lock code, and select **OK**. The factory setting for the lock code is 12345.


To set the correct time zone, time, and date, select the country you are presently in, then enter the local time and date

Charge the battery

Your battery has been partially charged at the factory, but you may need to recharge it before you can switch on your device for the first time.

If the device indicates a low charge, do the following:

- 1 Connect the charger to a wall outlet.
- 2 Connect the charger to the device.




When the device indicates a full charge, disconnect the charger from the device, then from the wall outlet.



To avoid breaking the charger connector, be careful when connecting or disconnecting the charger cable.







You do not need to charge the battery for a specific length of time, and you can use the device while it is charging. If the battery is completely discharged, it may take several minutes before the charging indicator appears on the display or before any calls can be made.

Charge over USB

- Use a compatible USB cable to connect to a compatible device, such as a computer.
- If your device is switched on, when prompted, select a USB mode.

If connected to a computer, you can synchronise your device while charging.

Charging over USB can take longer to start, and may not work if you connect through a non-powered USB hub. Your device charges more quickly when connected to a wall outlet.

Keypad lock (keyguard)

To unlock the keypad, open the slide, or select Unlock, then quickly select OK.

Select Menu > Ctrl. panel > Settings and General.

To set the device to lock the keypad when you close the slide, select Slide handling > Keyguard activation.

To set the device to automatically lock the keypad after a certain length of time, select Security > Phone and SIM card > Keypad autolock period > User defined, and select the desired time.

When the device or keypad is locked, calls may be possible to the official emergency number programmed into your device.







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
Volume control

To adjust the earpiece or loudspeaker volume during a call or when listening to an audio file, use the volume keys.

To activate or deactivate the loudspeaker during a call, select **Loudsp.** or **Handset**.

Warning:

Continuous exposure to high volume may damage your hearing. Listen to music at a moderate level, and do not hold the device near your ear when the loudspeaker is in use.



You can use the Switch application to copy content such as phone numbers, addresses, calendar items, and images from your previous compatible Nokia device to your new device.




Copy content for the first time

- To retrieve data from the other device for the first time, on your device, select Menu > Ctrl. panel > Switch.
- Pair the two devices. To have your device search for devices with Bluetooth connectivity, select Continue. Select the device from which you want to transfer content. You are asked to enter a code on your device. Enter a code (1-16 digits), and select OK. Enter the







If your old Nokia device does not have the Switch application, your new device sends it in a message. Open the message in the old device, and follow the instructions on the display.

On your device, select the content you want to transfer from the other device.

> When the transfer has started, you can cancel it and continue later.

Content is transferred from the memory of the other device to the corresponding location in your device. The transfer time depends on the amount of data to be transferred.

The type of content that can be transferred depends on the model of the device from which you want to transfer content. If that device supports synchronisation, you can also synchronise data between the devices. Your device notifies you if the other device is not compatible.

Home screen **About home screen**

The home screen is your starting point where you can collect all your important contacts and application shortcuts.

When you have switched on the device, and it is registered to a network, the device is in the home screen view.

Use the scroll key to navigate in the home screen.



To customise application plug-ins and shortcuts, or to change the home screen theme, select Menu > Ctrl. panel > Settings and General > Personalisation > Standby mode and the appropriate option. You may not be able to change all shortcuts.

Write text

The available input methods may vary.


Switch between the different character cases

To change between the upper and lower case modes, press the shift key twice. To enter a single upper case letter in lower case mode, or vice versa, press the shift key once, and then the desired alphabet









Press the function key, and then press the corresponding alphabet key, or press and hold the alphabet key only. To enter several special characters in a row, press the function key twice quickly, and then press the desired alphabet keys. To return to normal mode, press the function key once.

Insert a special character that is not on the keyboard

Press the sym key, and select *# and a character.

Insert a letter that is not on the keyboard

It is possible to insert variations of letters, for example, letters with accents. For example, to insert á, press and hold the sym key, and simultaneously press the A key repeatedly, until the desired character is displayed. The order and availability of letters depends on the selected writing language.

Insert a smiley

Press the sym key, and select a smiley. Smileys are only available for text and multimedia messages.

Tip: To add a recently used special character, while pressing and holding the ctrl key, press the sym key, and from the pop-up menu, select the character.

Copy and paste text

- Press and hold the shift key, and scroll to highlight the text you want to copy.
- Press ctrl + C.
- Go to the place where you want to paste the text, and press ctrl + V.

Change the writing language or activate predictive text input

Select Options > Input options.

Predictive text input

To activate predictive text input, select Options > Input options > Activate prediction. The indicator ais displayed.







18 Personalise your device

When you start writing a word, your device suggests possible words. When the correct word is found, scroll right to confirm it

While writing, you can also scroll down to access a list of suggested words. If the desired word is on the list, select the word.

If the word you are writing is not in the dictionary of the device, the device suggests a possible word, while the word you were writing is shown above the suggested word. Scroll up to select your word. The word is added to the dictionary when you start writing the next word.

To deactivate predictive text input, select Options > Input options > Deactivate prediction.

To define the settings for text input, select **Options** > **Input options** > **Settings**.

To change the writing language, select Options > Input options > Writing language.

3. Personalise your device

Profiles

Select Menu > Ctrl. panel > Profiles.

You can adjust and customise the ringing tones, alert tones, and other device tones for different events, environments, or caller groups. The active profile is shown at the top of the display in the home screen. However, if the active profile is General, only today's date is shown.

To create a new profile, select **Options** > **Create new**, and define the settings.


To customise a profile, select a profile and **Options** > **Personalise**.

To activate a profile, select a profile and **Options** > **Activate**.

To set the profile to be active until a certain time within the next 24 hours, scroll to the profile, select **Options** > **Timed**, and set the time. When the time expires, the profile changes back to the previously active non-timed profile.







To delete a profile that you created, select Options > Delete profile. You cannot delete the predefined profiles.

When the Offline profile is activated, your connection to the cellular network is closed. All radio frequency signals between the device and the cellular network are prevented. If you try to send a message, it is placed in the Outbox folder, and is sent only when another profile is activated.

You can also use your device without a SIM card. If you remove the SIM card, the Offline profile is activated.

Important: In the Offline profile you cannot make or receive any calls, or use other features that require cellular network coverage. Calls may still be possible to the official emergency number programmed into your device. To make calls, you must first activate the phone function by changing profiles. If the device has been locked, enter the lock code.

When you use the Offline profile, you can still use a wireless LAN (WLAN), for example, to read your mail or browse the internet. You can also use Bluetooth connectivity. Remember to comply with any applicable safety requirements when you establish and use WLAN or Bluetooth connections.

Select ringing tones

To set a ringing tone for a profile, select Options > Personalise > Ringing tone. Select a ringing tone from the list, or select Download sounds to open a bookmark folder containing a list of bookmarks for downloading tones using the browser. Any downloaded tones are saved to Gallery.

To play the ringing tone for a selected contact group only, select **Options** > Personalise > Alert for, and select the desired group. Phone calls coming from outside that group have a silent alert.

To change the message tone, select Options > Personalise > Message alert tone.





20 Make calls

Change the display theme

Select Menu > Ctrl. panel > Themes.

Select from the following:

General — Change the theme used in all applications.

Menu view — Change the theme used in the main menu.

Standby — Change the theme used in the home screen.

Wallpaper — Change the background image of the home screen.

Call image — Change the image displayed during calls.

Audio themes — Set sounds for various device events.

To activate or deactivate the theme effects, select **General** > **Options** > **Theme effects**.

4. Make calls

Make a call

To make a call, open the slide, enter the phone number, including the area code, and press the call key.

If you use a headset, you do not need to open the slide to make a call.

Tip: For international calls, add the + character that replaces the international access code, and enter the country code, area code (omit the leading 0, if necessary), and phone number. The + character as a replacement for the international access code may not work in all regions. In this case, enter the international access code directly.

To end the call or cancel the call attempt, close the slide. If you are using a headset, to end the call, press the end key.

To make a call using the saved contacts, open the contacts list. Enter the first letters of the name, scroll to the name, and press the call key.

To make a call using the log, press the call key to view up to 20 numbers that you last called or attempted to call. Scroll to the desired number or name, and press the call key.

To adjust the volume of an active call, use the volume keys.





To switch from a voice call to a video call, select Options > Switch to video call. The device ends the voice call and makes a video call to the recipient.

Answer or reject a call

Answer a call

Open the slide, or connect a headset and press the call key.

Mute the ringing tone of an incoming

Select Silence.

Reject a call

Press the end key. If you activate the Call divert > Voice calls > If busy function in phone settings, rejecting an incoming call also diverts the call.

Send a reject call text message

Select Silence and Send msg., edit the message text, and press the call key. With the reply message you can inform the caller that you cannot answer the

Activate the reject call text message feature

Select Menu > Ctrl. panel > Settings and Phone > Call > Reject call with message > Yes.

Write a standard reject call text message

Select Menu > Ctrl. panel > Settings and Phone > Call > Message text, and write the message.

Voice mail

Select Menu > Ctrl. panel > Call mailbox.

When you open the Call mailbox application (network service) for the first time, you are asked to enter the number of your voice mailbox.

To call your voice mailbox, go to the voice mailbox, open the slide, and select Options > Call voice mailbox.

To call your mailbox in the home screen, press and hold 1, and select the mailbox to call.

To change the mailbox number, select the mailbox and **Options** > **Change** number.

5. Contacts

Stay connected with your online friends

You can synchronise the contact information on your device with contacts you have on Facebook. When you allow synchronisation, you are able to view your contacts' Facebook profile information, such as their picture and status updates, in the Contacts application on your device.

Synchronising your contacts and retrieving status updates are network services. Roaming and data transfer charges may apply. If the social networking service is not available or functioning correctly, you may not be able to synchronise or retrieve status updates.

To start synchronising your contacts, go to the settings of the social networking application on your device, select an access point and set the frequency of the automatic synchronisation.

To deactivate the connection between Contacts and the social networking service, in the settings of the social networking service application on your device, clear the Enable check box.

This feature may not be available in certain regions.

Save and edit names and numbers

Select Menu > Contacts.

Add a new contact to the contacts list

- 1 Select **Options** > **New contact**.
- 2 Fill in the appropriate fields, and select **Done**.

Edit a contact


Select a contact and **Options** > **View details** > **Options** > **Edit**.

6. Messaging

Write and send messages

Select Menu > Messaging.

Important: Exercise caution when opening messages. Messages may contain malicious software or otherwise be harmful to your device or PC





Before you can create a multimedia message or write an e-mail, you must have the correct connection settings in

The wireless network may limit the size of MMS messages. If the inserted picture exceeds this limit, the device may make it smaller so that it can be sent by MMS.

Check the size limit of e-mail messages with your service provider. If you attempt to send an e-mail message that exceeds the size limit of the e-mail server, the message is left in the Outbox folder, and the device attempts to resend it periodically. Sending an e-mail requires a data connection, and continuous attempts to resend the email may increase your data transfer costs. In the Outbox folder, you can delete such a message, or move it to the Drafts folder.

- Select New message.
- To send a text or multimedia message (MMS), selectMessage. To send a multimedia message that includes one sound clip, select Audio message. To send an e-mail, select E-mail.

- In the To field, press the scroll key to select recipients or groups from the contacts list, or enter the recipient's phone number or e-mail address. You can also copy and paste the number or address from the clipboard.
- In the subject field, enter the subject of the message. To hide or display fields when writing a text or multimedia message, select Options > Message header fields.
- In the message field, write the message. To insert a template or note, select **Options** > **Insert** content > Insert text > Template or Note.
- To add a media file to a multimedia message, select **Options** > **Insert** content, the file type or source, and the desired file. To insert a business card, slide, note, or other file to the message, select Options > Insert content > Insert other.
- To capture an image or record a video or sound clip for a multimedia message, select **Options** > **Insert** content > Insert image > New, Insert video clip > New, or Insert sound clip > New.

- 8 To insert a smiley to a text or multimedia message, press the sym key, and select the smiley.
- 9 To add an attachment to an e-mail, select Options > Add attachment, the memory, and the file to attach. (i) indicates an e-mail attachment.
- 10 To send the message, select Options > Send, or press the call key.

The available options may vary.

Note: The message sent icon or text on your device screen does not indicate that the message is received at the intended destination.

Your device supports text messages beyond the limit for a single message. Longer messages are sent as two or more messages. Your service provider may charge accordingly. Characters with accents, other marks, or some language options take more space, and limit the number of characters that can be sent in a single message.

You may not be able to send video clips that are saved in the MP4 file format or

that exceed the size limit of the wireless network in a multimedia message.

Check the number of unread messages


Shake your device to check how many unread text and multimedia messages you have.

- 1 Make sure the keypad is locked.
- 2 Press and hold one of the volume keys, and shake the device. The number of tones indicates the number of unread messages.



The number of tones is limited. If you have a large number of unread messages, the number of tones may be smaller than the actual number of messages.





Set up your e-mail

With the E-mail wizard, you can set up your corporate e-mail account, such as Mail for Exchange, and your internet email account.

When setting up your corporate e-mail, you may be prompted for the name of the server associated with your e-mail address. Contact your company IT department for details before you start setting up your corporate e-mail account.

When setting up your internet e-mail, you may need to contact your e-mail service provider to obtain your e-mail account type (POP or IMAP).

- To start the wizard, go to the home screen, and select the E-mail wizard.
- Enter your e-mail address and password. If the wizard is not able to configure your e-mail settings automatically, you need to select your e-mail account type and enter the related account settings.

If your device contains any additional email clients, those are offered to you when you start the E-mail wizard.

About Chat

With Chat (network service), you can exchange instant messages with your friends. You can access several chat services or communities simultaneously and switch between them. If you want to, for example, browse the web, you can leave the Chat application to run in the background, and still be notified of new instant messages.

The Chat application is preinstalled on your device. To start chatting, select Menu > Chat.

Using network services and downloading content to your device may result in data traffic costs.

Start using Ovi Contacts

Select Contacts, and open the Ovi tab.

The Ovi Contacts service is part of Ovi, and uses the same account information.

If you are new to Ovi and its services, to start using the Ovi Contacts application, you must register to Ovi by creating a Nokia account.

Create a Nokia account

- Select Ovi Chat, and when prompted, connect to the internet.
- 2 Enter the required information.
- 3 In the My profile view, enter your profile information. Your first and last name are mandatory details.
- 4 Select Done.

If you have already registered to Ovi using your PC or mobile device, you can start using Ovi Contacts with the same account details.

Sign in to Ovi Contacts and activate the service

Select **Ovi Chat**, and enter your user name and password. When you have activated the Ovi Contacts service on your device, you can connect to the service directly from the home screen.

If you have not yet provided your profile information for Ovi Contacts, do so, and select **Done**. Your first and last name are mandatory details.

7. Music and audio

Music key

With the music key, the songs stored on your device are quickly at hand. You can always access Music player with a single key press.

Go to the Now playing view

Press the music key. If no song is currently playing, the last played song is displayed.

Access the Music menu

Press and hold the music key.

Music player

Play a song or podcast

Select Menu > Music > Music player.

Start playing

- Select the songs or podcasts you want to play.
- To play the selected items, press the scroll key.

Pause, resume, or stop playback

To pause playback, press the scroll key; to resume, press the scroll key again. To stop playback, scroll down.

Fast-forward or rewind a song

Press and hold the scroll key to the right

Play songs in random order

Select Options > Shuffle play.

Repeat the current item or all items Select **Options** > **Repeat**.

If you play podcasts, shuffle and repeat

are automatically deactivated. Modify the tone of the music playback

Select Options > Equaliser.

Modify the balance and stereo image, or enhance the bass Select Options > Settings.

Return to the home screen, and leave the player playing in the background Press the end key.

Close Music player Select **Options** > **Exit**.

Spin your device to play a random song

Let your device surprise you with music! While listening to music, to play a random song from your music library, set your device on a table, and spin it.

- Open Music player, and start listening to music.
- 2 To change the song, place your device on its back on an even surface, and spin it with your finger. When the device stops spinning, a random song starts playing.



Transfer music from a computer

You can use the following methods to transfer music:

- To install Nokia Ovi Player to manage and organise your music files, download the PC software from www.ovi.com, and follow the instructions.
- To view your device on a computer as a mass memory device where you can transfer any data files, make the connection with a compatible USB data cable or Bluetooth connectivity. If you are using a USB data cable, select Mass storage as the USB connection mode.



About Bluetooth

Bluetooth technology in your device enables wireless connections between electronic devices within a range of 10 metres (33 feet). A Bluetooth connection can be used to send images, videos, text, business cards, calendar notes, or to connect wirelessly to devices that use Bluetooth technology.

Since devices using Bluetooth technology communicate using radio waves, your device and the other devices do not need to be in direct line-of-sight. The two devices only need to be within a maximum of 10 metres of each other, although the connection can be subject to interference from obstructions such as walls or other electronic devices.






Access codes

If you forget any of the access codes, contact your service provider.

Personal identification number (PIN) code — This code protects your SIM card against unauthorised use. The PIN code (4 - 8 digits) is usually supplied with the SIM card. After three consecutive







UPIN code — This code may be supplied with the USIM card. The USIM card is an enhanced version of the SIM card and is supported by 3G mobile phones.

PIN2 code — This code (4 - 8 digits) is supplied with some SIM cards, and is required to access some functions in your device.

Lock code (also known as security code) — The lock code helps you to protect your device against unauthorised use. The preset code is 12345. You can create and change the code, and set the device to request the code. Keep the new code secret and in a safe place separate from your device. Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery. The battery intended for use with this device is BL-5F. Nokia may make additional battery models available for this device. This device is intended for use when supplied with power from the following chargers: AC-6. The exact charger model number may vary depending on the type of plug. The plug variant is identified by one of the following: E, EB, X, AR, U, A, C, K, or UB.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. When the talk and standby times are noticeably shorter than normal, replace the battery. Use only Nokia approved batteries, and recharge your battery only with Nokia approved chargers designated for this device.

If a battery is being used for the first time or if the battery has not been used for a prolonged period, it may be necessary to connect the charger, then disconnect and reconnect it to begin charging the battery. If the battery





is completely discharged, it may take several minutes before the charging indicator appears on the display or before any calls can be made.

Safe removal. Always switch the device off and disconnect the charger before removing the battery.

Proper charging. Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use. Do not leave a fully charged battery connected to a charger, since overcharging may shorten its lifetime. If left unused, a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time.

Avoid extreme temperatures. Always try to keep the battery between 15°C and 25°C (59°F and 77°F). Extreme temperatures reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery. A device with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily. Battery performance is particularly limited in temperatures well below freezing.





Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles such as electronic fuel injection, electronic antilock braking, electronic speed control, and air bag systems. Only qualified personnel should service the device or install the device in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate your warranty. Check regularly that all wireless device equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the device, its parts, or accessories. Remember that air bags inflate with great force. Do not place your device or accessories in the air bag deployment area.

Potentially explosive environments

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






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
