

Insert a SIM card and battery

Note: Switch the device off and disconnect the charger and any other device before removing any covers. Avoid touching electronic components while changing any covers. Always store and use the device with any covers attached.

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Important: Do not use a mini-UICC SIM card, also known as a micro-SIM card, a micro-SIM card with an adapter, or a SIM card that has a mini-UICC cutout (see figure) in this device. A micro SIM card is smaller than the standard SIM card. This device does not support the use of micro-SIM cards and use of incompatible SIM cards may damage the card or the device, and may corrupt data stored on the card.



Important: To prevent damage to the SIM card, always remove the battery before you insert or remove the card.

This device is intended for use with a BL-5C battery. Always use original Nokia batteries.

The SIM card and its contacts can be easily damaged by scratches or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting, or removing the card.

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10 Get started

Place your finger in the recess at the top of the device, and carefully lift and remove the back cover (1). If the battery is inserted, lift it out (2).



2 Open the SIM card holder (3), and insert or remove the SIM card (4 or 5). Make sure the contact area of the card is facing down.

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3 Line up the contacts of the battery and the battery compartment, and insert the battery (6). To replace the back cover, direct the bottom locking catches toward their slots (7), and press down until the cover locks into place (8).





Insert a memory card

Use only compatible memory cards approved by Nokia for use with this device. Incompatible cards may damage the card and the device and corrupt data stored on the card.

Your device supports memory cards with a capacity of up to 32 GB. $\,$



1 Switch the device off, and remove the back cover and battery.

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- To release the memory card holder, slide the holder in the direction indicated by the arrow on the holder. Open the memory card holder (1).
- Insert a compatible memory card. Make sure the contact area of the card is facing down (2).
- Close the memory card holder (3).
- To lock the memory card holder, slide the holder to its original position (4).

Remove the memory card

- Switch the device off. 1
- 2 Remove the back cover and battery.
- 3 To release the memory card holder, slide the holder in the direction indicated by the arrow on the holder. Open the memory card holder, and remove the memory card.

Charge the battery

Your battery has been partially charged at the factory, but you may need to recharge it before you can switch on your device for the first time. If the device indicates a low charge, do the following:

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14 Get started

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- 1 Connect the charger to a wall outlet.
- 2 Connect the charger to the device.
- 3 When the device indicates a full charge, disconnect the charger from the device, then from the wall outlet.

You do not need to charge the battery for a specific length of time, and you can use the device while it is charging.

If the battery is completely discharged, it may take several minutes before the charging indicator appears on the display or before any calls can be made.

If the battery has not been used for a long time, to begin charging, you may need to connect the charger, then disconnect and reconnect it.

GSM antenna



The figure shows the GSM antenna area marked in grey.

Avoid touching the antenna area unnecessarily while the antenna is transmitting or receiving. Contact with antennas affects the communication quality and may

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cause a higher power level during operation and may reduce the battery life.

PIN or PIN2 code	These protect your SIM card against unauthorised use or are required to access some features.
(4-8 digits)	If not supplied with the card or you forget the codes, contact your service provider.

	If you enter the code incorrectly three times in a row, you need to unblock the code with the PUK or PUK2 code.



Scroll in a list or menu

Place your finger on the screen, slide it quickly up or down the screen, and then lift your finger. The content of the screen scrolls with the speed and direction it had at the moment of release. To select an item from a scrolling list and to stop the movement, tap the item.

For example, when you are viewing a picture, to view the next picture, swipe left. To quickly browse through your pictures, swipe the screen quickly, and then scroll left or right through the thumbnails.

Swipe to open an application or activate a feature

You can open applications or activate features when you swipe left or right on the home screen.

Copy contacts or pictures from your old device

Want to copy your content from your previous compatible Nokia device and start using your new device quickly? You can copy, for example, contacts, calendar entries, and pictures to your new device, free of charge.

Call the last dialled number

Trying to call someone, but they are not answering? It is easy to call them again.

View your missed calls

Want to see who made the call you missed?

On the home screen, select **View**. The caller's name is displayed, if stored in the contacts list.

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Missed and received calls are logged only if supported by the network, and the device is switched on and within the network service area.

Call back the contact or number

When writing text, you can use traditional \searrow or predictive $\underline{\searrow}$ text input.

Abc, abc, and ABC indicate the character cases. 123 indicates that number mode is activated.

Select **Options** > **Prediction**. Not all languages are supported by predictive text input.

Switch between character cases

Select #.

Switch between the letter and number modes Select and hold #.

Set the writing language

Select Options > **Writing language**.

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Write using traditional text input

- Press a number key (2-9) repeatedly, until the desired character is displayed.
- Insert the next character. If it is located on the same key, wait until the cursor is displayed, or move the cursor forward.

The available characters depend on the selected writing language.

Move the cursor

Select **◄** or **▶**, or tap where you want to place the cursor.

Insert a common punctuation mark

Press 1 repeatedly.

Insert a special character

Select **?!£** and the desired character.

Insert a space

Press 0.

The built-in dictionary suggests words as you select the number keys.

- 1 Select each number key (2–9) once for each character.
- 2 To find the desired word, select * repeatedly.
- 3 To confirm the word, select ▶.

Add a missing word to the dictionary

If ? is displayed when you enter a word using predictive text input, the word is not in the dictionary. You can add it to the built-in dictionary.

- 1 Select Spell.
- 2 Write the word using traditional text input.
- 3 Select Save.

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Write a compound word

- Write the first part of the word. To confirm the word, move the cursor forward.
- 2 Write the next part of the word, and confirm again.

Messaging

Send a message

Keep in touch with your family and friends with text and multimedia messages. You can attach your pictures, videos, and business cards to your message.

Select Menu > Messaging.

- 1 Select Create message.
- 2 To add an attachment , select Options > Insert object.
- 3 Write your message, and select **Continue**.
- 4 To enter a phone number or mail address manually, select Number or mail. Enter a phone number, or select Mail, and enter a mail address.
- 5 Select Send.

Tip: To insert a special character or smiley, select **Options** > **Insert symbol**.

Sending a message with an attachment may be more expensive than sending a normal text message. For more information, contact your service provider.

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32 Messaging

You can send text messages that are longer than the character limit for a single message. Longer messages are sent as two or more messages. Your service provider may charge accordingly.

Characters with accents, other marks, or some language options, take more space, and limit the number of characters that can be sent in a single message.

If the item you inserted in a multimedia message is too large for the network, the device may automatically reduce the size

Only compatible devices can receive and display multimedia messages. Messages may look different in different devices.

View a conversation

You can see the messages you have sent to and received from a particular contact from a single view, and continue the conversation from that view.

Select Menu > Messaging.

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Read a message in a conversation

Select Conversations, a conversation, and a message.

Switch to the traditional Inbox view

Select Options > Inbox view.

Listen to voice messages

When you can't answer, you can divert calls to your voice mailbox and listen to your messages later.

You may need a voice mailbox subscription. For more information on this network service, contact your service provider.

- Select Menu > Messaging > Voice messages and Voice mailbox no..
- Enter your voice mailbox number, and select **OK**.
- 3 To call your voice mailbox, on the home screen, press and hold 1.

After selecting a ringtone, you can mark a section of the ringtone, and set the section as your ringtone. The original ringtone or sound clip is not copied or modified. Preset ringtones cannot be modified, and not all formats of ringtones are supported.

For example, GMT -5 denotes the time zone for New York (USA), 5 hours west of Greenwich, London (UK).

Bluetooth

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About Bluetooth connectivity

Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth.

Use Bluetooth to connect wirelessly to compatible devices, such as other mobile devices, computers, headsets, and car kits.

You can also send items from your device, copy files from your compatible PC, and print using a compatible printer.

Bluetooth uses radio waves to connect, and devices must be within 10 metres (33 feet) of each other. Obstructions, such as walls or other electronic devices, can cause interference.



Send a picture or other content to another device using Bluetooth

Use Bluetooth to send pictures, videos, business cards, and other content created by you to your computer or a friend's compatible device.

Media transfer — Nokia Ovi Suite is not installed on your computer. If you want to connect your device to a home entertainment system or printer, use this mode.

Mass storage — Nokia Ovi Suite is not installed on your computer. The device is displayed as a portable device on your computer. If you want to connect your device to other devices, such as a home or car stereo, use this mode.

To copy the content, use the file manager of the computer.

About Maps

Send your location or a place to a friend in a text message

Your device is approved for use on the (E)GSM 850, 1900 MHz networks. To use the device, you need a subscription with a service provider.

Take care of your device

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Batteries and chargers Battery and charger information

Your device is intended for use with a BL-5C rechargeable battery. Nokia may make additional battery models available for this device. Always use original Nokia batteries.

This device is intended for use when supplied with power from the following chargers: AC-3. The exact Nokia charger model number may vary depending on the plug type, identified by E, X, AR, U, A, C, K, or B.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. When the talk and standby times are noticeably shorter than normal, replace the battery.

Battery safety

Always switch the device off and disconnect the charger before removing the battery. When you unplug a charger or an accessory, hold and pull the plug, not the cord.

When your charger is not in use, unplug it from the electrical plug and the device. Do not leave a fully charged battery connected to a charger, as overcharging may shorten the battery's lifetime. If left unused, a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time.

Make an emergency call
