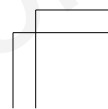
Switch between views

Swipe left or right to switch between the home screens.

Check your latest activity

In the apps menu, swipe left or right to switch to view your latest activity. Here, you can see the following:

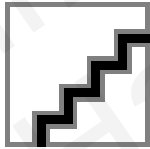
- Apps you've opened recently, grouped by date
- Your upcoming calendar events. Swipe down at the top of the activity list to see what you've got planned next.

- Your latest messages, missed calls, recent music, and more

★ **Tip:** You can easily pause or resume the currently playing song directly from the list.

Clear all activity
Tap and hold an item, and tap **Clear all**.


Copy contacts from your old phone



Get all your contacts to your new phone in one go.

Your old phone must have Bluetooth, and the contacts must be stored in


the phone memory, not on the SIM.

1. On both your new and old phone, switch Bluetooth on.
2. On your new phone, tap .
3. Swipe up from the bottom of the screen, and tap **Import contacts > Other device**.
4. Move the phones close to each other. When the phones are connected via

Bluetooth, the contacts transfer starts.

If your contacts are written in a language that is not supported by your new phone, the contact info may not show correctly.

Make or answer a call

2. Type in the phone number.

To type in the + character, used for international calls, tap * twice.

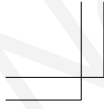

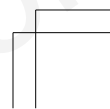

Share your content using Slam



Share your content easily with Slam.

1. Switch Bluetooth on in both phones.
2. Make sure the phones are visible to others.


3. Tap, for example, a photo, and **< > Slam via Bluetooth.**
4. Move your phone close to the other phone.
5. **Slam** searches for the nearest phone, and sends the item to it.

Connect to a Wi-Fi network



To help save on data costs, you can use a Wi-Fi network to connect to the internet, whether you're at home or at a library or internet café.

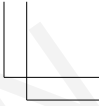

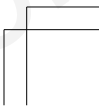

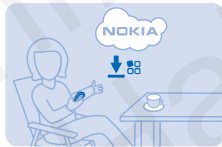

Update your phone software



You can update your phone software wirelessly. You can also set your phone to automatically check for updates.

1. Tap > Phone update.

★ **Tip:** To quickly go to updates, when your phone notifies you of an update, swipe down from the top of the screen, and swipe the update notification right.

2. To download and install an update, tap **Updated**, and follow the instructions shown on the phone.

The update may take several minutes. If you encounter problems, contact your network service provider.

Network services and costs

You can only use your device on the GSM 850 and 1900 MHz networks. You need a subscription with a service provider. Using some features and downloading content require a network connection and may result in data costs. You may also need to subscribe to some features.

Emergency calls

1. Make sure the device is switched on.
2. Check for adequate signal strength.

You may also need to do the following:

- Put a SIM card in the device.
- Switch the call restrictions off in your device, such as call barring, fixed dialling, or closed user group.
- Make sure the flight profile is not activated.
- If the device screen and/or keys are locked, unlock them.

3. Press the back key repeatedly, until the home screen is shown.

4. To open the dialler, select 

5. Type in the official emergency number for your present location. Emergency call numbers vary by location.

6. Select 

7. Give the necessary info as accurately as possible. Do not end the call until given permission to do so.

Important: Activate both cellular and internet calls, if your phone supports internet calls. The phone may attempt to make emergency calls both

through cellular networks and through your internet call service provider. Connections in all conditions cannot be guaranteed. Never rely solely on any wireless phone for essential communications like medical emergencies.

Battery and charger info
Use your device only with an original BL-4U rechargeable battery. Nokia may make additional battery models available for this device. Charge your device with AC-11 charger. Charger plug type may vary.

Battery safety
Always switch the device off and unplug the charger before removing the battery. To unplug a charger or an accessory, hold and pull the plug, not the cord. When your charger is not in use, unplug it. Do not leave a fully charged battery connected to a charger, as overcharging may shorten the battery's lifetime. If left unused, a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time. Always keep the battery between 15°C and 25°C (59°F and 77°F). Extreme temperatures reduce the

capacity and lifetime of the battery. A device with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily. Accidental short-circuiting can happen when a metallic object touches the metal strips on the battery. This may damage the battery or the other object. Operating environment

This device meets radio frequency exposure guidelines in the normal use position at the ear or at least 1.5 centimetres (5/8 inch) away from the body. Any carry case, belt clip, or holder for body-worn operation should not contain metal and should position the device the above-stated distance from your body. The sending of data files or messages requires a quality network connection and may

be delayed until such a connection is available. Follow the separation distance instructions until the sending is completed.

This mobile device meets guidelines for exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by

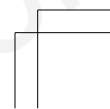
international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organisation ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to assure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health. The exposure guidelines for mobile devices employ a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate or SAR. The SAR limit stated in the ICNIRP guidelines is 2.0 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over 10 grams of tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at

its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. The actual SAR level of an operating device can be below the maximum value because the device is designed to use only the power required to reach the network. That amount changes depending on a number of factors such as how close you are to a network base station. The highest SAR value under the ICNIRP guidelines for use of the device at the ear is 0.52 W/kg. Use of device accessories may result in different SAR values. SAR values may vary depending on

national reporting and testing requirements and the network band. Additional SAR information may be provided under product information at www.nokia.com. Your mobile device is also designed to meet the requirements for exposure to radio waves established by the Federal Communications Commission (USA) and Industry Canada. These requirements set a SAR limit of 1.6 W/kg averaged over one gram of tissue. The highest SAR value reported under this standard during product certification for use at the ear



is 1.00 W/kg and when properly worn on the body is 0.62 W/kg.
