Mail for Exchange

Mail for Exchange can be set up only if your company has a Microsoft Exchange server. In addition, your company IT administrator must have activated Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync for your account.

Before starting the setup, make sure you have the following:

 name (contact your
 company IT
 department)
- Your network domain name (contact your company IT
- department)
 Your office network password

Depending on the Exchange server

configuration, you may need to type in additional info during the setup. If you don't know the correct info, contact your company IT department.

During the setup, you can define how often you want your phone to sync the content with the server. Only content defined when setting up the account is synced. To sync additional content,

change the Mail for Exchange account settings.

With Mail for Exchange, it may be mandatory to use the lock code.




