




General


Transporting

To safely transport your Revolution, follow the steps below to prevent damage to your unit.

- 1 Place protective needle cover over needle.
- 2 Place the 45rpm adapter on the revolution as shown below



3 Move the TONE ARM from the ARM REST and position it over the 45rpm adapter and align the TONE ARM with the grooves in the 45rpm adapter as shown below.



- 4 Gently press TONE ARM into grooves on 45rpm adapter.
- 5 Close the LID and check to make sure it is secure.

Troubleshooting

There is no Power

- 1 Make sure unit is plugged in correctly.
- 2 Replace batteries
- 3 The unit is not turned on: press the POWER button to ON Position.

There is no Sound

- 1 Slide the VOLUME CONTROL to raise volume.
- 2 Check to make sure headphones are not plugged into the unit.

No signal on FM Transmitter

- 1 Make sure TRANSMITTER SWITCH is on the ON position.
- 2 Make sure the unit and the FM tuner are set to the same frequency.
- 3 Check that the distance between the two is 20 feet or less.
- 4 Remove obstructions to minimize interference.
- 5 Try moving the Revolution closer to the FM tuner to reduce signal interference.



Basic Operation

Control Locators

Turntable

- 1 Press the POWER button to turn the unit on.
- 2 Set the SPEED CONTROL SWITCH to the correct speed (33-1/3 or 45) for the selected record.
- 3 Slide the LID LOCK towards the rear of the unit to open the lid.
- 4 Lift the TONE ARM from its rest and gently move it to the right until it clicks into the ARM LOCK as shown below.



- 5 Remove the 45rpm adapter from the unit. If you are playing a 45 rpm record, place the adapter on the spindle.
- 6 Place record on the turntable.
- 7 Gently move the tone arm from the ARM LOCK and lower it to the desired starting point on the record.
- 8 Slide the VOLUME CONTROL to adjust the volume level.
- 9 At the end of the record, lift the TONE ARM from the record and return it to the ARM REST.


FM Transmitter


This unit is equipped with a built in FM transmitter. This feature allows the user to listen to their albums on any FM radio within approximately 15-20 feet. To use this feature, follow the instructions below.

- 1 Slide the TRANSMITTER ON/OFF switch to the ON position.
- 2 Slide the FREQUENCY SELECT switch to either 88.1 or 89.9 MHz.
- 3 Adjust the tuner on your FM radio to match the selected frequency from step 2.
- 4 Follow the instructions for Turntable Operation on the left side of this page.
- 5 Adjust the volume of your FM radio accordingly.

Notes:

- 1 Switch between the two frequencies listed above to determine which gives you the best signal for your location.
- 2 The maximum range of the FM Transmitter is approximately 20 feet, depending on your location.
- 3 For best performance, a clear line of sight between the Revolution and your FM radio is recommended.

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USB

Using the included software and cable, the USB connection allows you record your records onto your computer. Follow these instructions to use the USB.

- 1 Insert the enclosed software CD into your computer.
- 2 Connect the small end of the USB cable to the USB JACK on the back of the unit.
- 3 Follow the instructions on the computer screen to install the software. If the software does not load automatically, browse the CD and open the Read Me folder for further instructions.
- 4 Connect the other end to a USB port on your computer.
- 5 On your computer, open the Record Recording Software.
- 6 For instructions on operating the Record Recording Software, browse the software CD and open the Read Me folder.

Audio Output

Using the Audio Output allows you to listen to your Revolution on a home stereo, TV or other stereo source. The type of cable needed will vary depending on the input jack configuration of your external device. The output jack on your Revolution is a standard 3.5mm stereo output. See your local electronics store to purchase the correct cable for your needs. For more information on hooking up to an external device, see the owner's manual for the selected device.

Note: You can still listen to your unit when using the Audio Output feature.

Accessory: ADAPTER FOR 45 RPM


This adaptor allows you to play 45 RPM records.

- 1 Place the 45 RPM adapter over the spindle.
- 2 Gently place your 45 RPM record onto the turntable.
- 3 Follow the steps under turntable operation to play your record.










Unpacking

- 1 Remove plastic bag covering unit.
- 2 Remove AC ADAPTER from packing.
- 3 Remove tie from A/C ADAPTER.
- 4 Open lid and remove styrofoam shipping material from turntable.
- 5 Remove white protective needle cover by gently pulling towards the front of the unit.



Power Source

- 1 Plug the AC ADAPTER into appropriate walloutlet.
- 2 Plug the small end of the adapter into the ADAPTER JACK on the back of the unit.

Headphones Jack operation)

- 1 Connect headphones to the Headphone Jack.
- 2 Adjust volume to the desired listening level. Note: When using headphones, sound from the unit will be turned off.



The sound from all speakers is cut off.

NOTE: Headphones not included with unit.

Battery Operation

- The battery compartment is located at the bottom of the unit. Push the lever at the center of the door toward the rear of the unit, then lift the door free.
- Six "AA" size batteries are required. Refer to the orientation diagram shown inside the battery compartment when installing.

- 3. Replace the battery cover.
