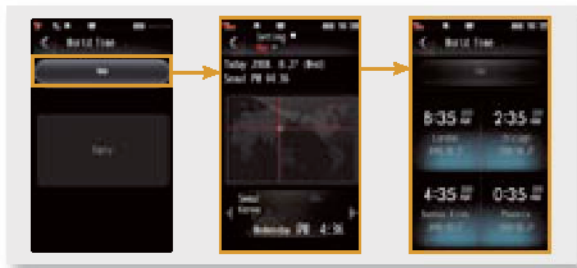


## 5. World Time

# 1. Messages

You can view and manage the messages saved in your phone.



## Menu ▶ Message ▶ Messages

- You can tap from the main screen for direct access.
- When you receive the message, icon will be displayed on the standby screen.
  - Most recently saved message will be shown on the top of the list.
- You can check 'Inbox', 'Outbox' or 'Saved' messages.
- If you select a message then tap menu, you can select form 'Save Message', 'Delete Selected Msg.' or 'Deselect All'.
- When you check the message, you can tap to see the previous or next message on the list.
- When you check the message, you can press volume button up or down to zoom in/out.

### Button description

	Check the menu
	Confirm selection
	Move to previous screen

### Note

- If the capacity for received message is exceeded, the oldest message deleted first.
- You can change settings from 'MSG Noti. Settings' or 'MSG Notification' to check the received message in the main screen. (Settings, see p.124)

## Inbox

### Menu ▶ Message ▶ Messages ▶ Inbox



- You can tap from the main screen to access directly.
- You can check and manage the received messages. (Including voice messages.)
- Select a message and tap to read the message.
- The attached contents will be played automatically.

- Save Message: You can save the selected message in Saved box.
- Save Contents: If received message contains any multimedia contents, you can save the contents to your phone.
- Add to Spam List: Register a selected message as a spam number to block the message.
- Sort Message: You can sort the message into name/time/size order.
- Message Search: You can search and find the message by name/number/string.
- Delete All: You can delete all saved message in the inbox.



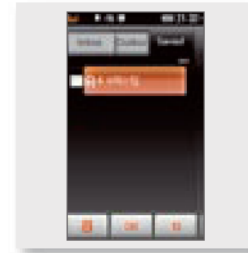

- Save to Outbox: You can send the selected message back to outbox.
- Save to Inbox: You can send the selected message back to inbox.
- Save Contents: If received message contains any multimedia contents, you can save the contents to your phone.
- Delete All: You can delete all saved message in outbox.
- Sender's info: You can check the sender's information if you have received the message.
- Receiver's info: You can check the receiver's information if you have sent the message.

## 2. New Message

The integrated MMS function enables you to attach content to the long text message and send to the mobile phone or e-mail address.



### Menu ▶ Message ▶ New Message

- ▶ A message can be sent to up to 20 people at a time.
- ▶ You can answer a call while you are writing a message, and return to the message screen after the call.
- ▶ You can send up to 3 image files (photo or picture) and 1 music and movie file.
- ▶ After writing a message, you can preview the message.
- ※ MMS is an SKT's new multimedia transmission service integrating the text message function and the color mail function.

### Note

#### Cautions in writing messages

- Messages are sent as SMS in default. However In the following cases, they are changed to MMS and additional data fee is charged: message exceeding 40 Korean letters/80 English letters, font color changed, emoticon added, avatar added, paper set, content attached (photo, movie, background music, etc.).
- If a message is changed to MMS, a message 'Converted to MMS' is displayed on the message window.

#### MMS fee

- The same information fee is charged for long text message, changed font color, paper set, avatar set, and emoticon added between MMS and SMS.
- Additional service fee is charged. No data call fee is charged for sending and receiving MMS. Visit SKT T-World website (<http://www.tworld.co.kr>) or contact SKT Customer Center for further information.

### Message screen description

**BG:** You can set the background for your messages.

**Avata:** The character or the photo of the sender is displayed on the message receiver's phone.

**Attach:** You can attach picture, movie clips, images, sound files with the message.

**Sender:** You can enter the number of the sender.

**Receiver:** You can enter select the receiver from call history or phonebook.

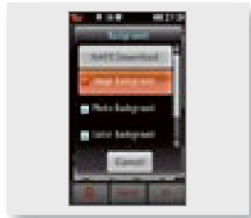

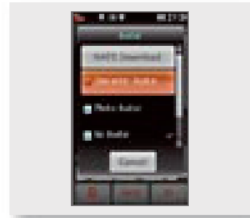

 Color Background: You can select the background color of the letter paper. (Note that the content might not be identified if the letters are written on the paper of the same color.)  
 No Background: You can set the background as a white paper.

### Avatar

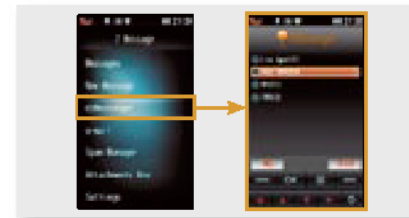

## 3. Mobile Messenger

- If you tap **Settings**, you can use talk, delete, message box, settings, help, update functions.
- You can select the person you wish to chat and tap 'Talk' to chat with the person.

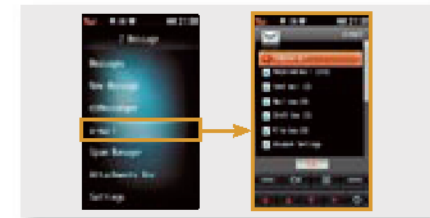

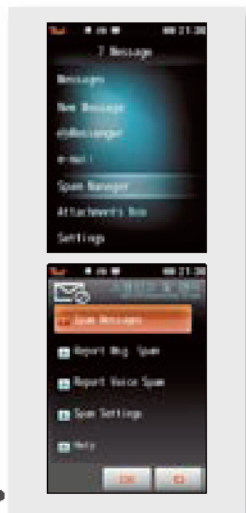

## 5. Spam Manager

## 2. Troubleshooting

Nothing is displayed on the screen

- There is no communication channel available or your phone has failed in communicating with a base station. Press **END CALL** to clear the call and press **CALL** to redial the number.

The charging lamp of the charger blinks in red

- Check the battery position or clean the terminals before reattempting charging. If the lamp keeps blinking, contact the nearest service center.

Battery operating time does not comply with the User Manual

- The battery operating time reduces slowly as the battery repeats charging and discharging. The operating time reduces rapidly if the battery is left in a cold or hot place for a long time.

Malfunction or failure to power On

- Remove the battery and reinstall it, and then turn the power on.

## 5. Specific Absorption Rate Data

This model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 w/kg.<sup>1</sup> Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value.

This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power

levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 0.99 w/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 0.85 w/kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements).<sup>2</sup>

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.

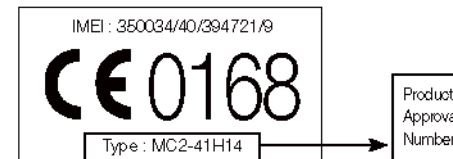

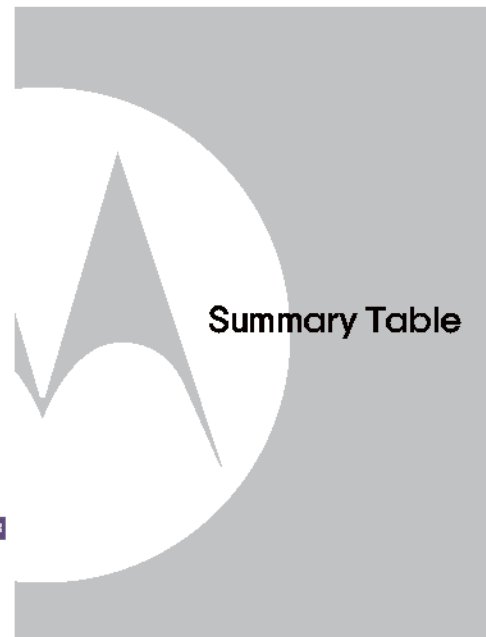
