 - Unauthorized battery charger, stereo earphone, USB data cable, batteries or any other unauthorized devices may decrease your product's performance and may result in product malfunction.
- Do not use your earphone for extended hours.

 - Saved phone numbers or other data can get lost due to user's carelessness or other unexpected problems.

- For normal operation of the touchscreen, do not attach any protection film. Also, be careful with the moisture and use the touchscreen with clean and dry hands.

Operational Precautions

For optimal mobile device performance, and to be sure that human exposure to RF energy does not exceed the guidelines set forth in the relevant standards, always follow these instructions and precautions.

Product Operation

When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your mobile device just like you would a landline phone.

If you wear the mobile device on your body, always place the mobile device in a Motorola-supplied or approved clip, holder, holster, case, or body harness. If you do not use a body-worn accessory supplied or approved by Motorola, keep the mobile device and its antenna at least 2.5 centimeters (1 inch) from your body when transmitting.

Using accessories not supplied or approved by Motorola may cause your mobile device to exceed RF energy exposure guidelines. For a list of Motorola-supplied or approved accessories, visit our Web site at: www.motorola.com.

To use the mobile phone safely for a long time

Use authentic products only.

Using unauthorized products (battery, charger etc.) may shorten product's life or decrease its performance.

Be careful not to cause damages to the glass of mobile phone display.

Some part of your mobile device is made out of tempered glass. This glass could break if the product is dropped on a hard surface or receives a substantial impact. If glass breaks, do not touch or attempt to remove. Stop using your mobile device until the glass is replaced by a qualified service center.

Do not dry your mobile phone with a heating apparatus.

If you dry a wet mobile phone or battery with a heating apparatus may cause explosion or damage to your phone. In this case, do not turn on the power, separate a battery from the phone and contact a service center designated by Motorola.

Keep the mobile phone clean at all time.

- If there are foreign substances on a metal part of a charger or battery, the phone may not be charged properly.
- Use smooth cloth to clean the mobile phone and do not use flammable chemicals (such as alcohol, benzene, thinner, etc.) for cleaning.

Do not give strong impact to the mobile phone, disassemble or modify it.

Giving a strong impact or dropping the mobile phone or battery may cause malfunction or explosion.

In case of disassembling or modifying the mobile phone on your own discretion, you will lose privilege to receive free service.

Do not use the phone while charging.

If you use the mobile phone while charging it with a charger or USB data cable, there is a risk of electric shock or fire. Make sure that you use the phone after disconnecting it from USB data cable or charger.

Be cautious when you use an USB data cable.

If you connect the phone with PC via USB data cable, there is a risk of electric shock depending on the grounding status of the PC's power supply.

Do not place your phone near items containing magnetic components.

Placing the phone near magnetic components may cause product malfunction or cause battery discharge which can lead to performance decrease.

To use the mobile phone safely for a long time

Make sure to back-up all the data stored in your mobile phone.

- Saved data (such as phone number or pictures etc.) can be deleted unexpectedly due to user's carelessness, software upgrade or product repair etc.
- Manufacturer shall not be responsible for such data loss.

Use and keep the phone at room temperature.

If a mobile phone or battery is placed in a hot or cold place, it may shorten product's life or decrease its performance.

Keep the phone out of animal or children's reach.

If children or animals suck or bite the mobile phone or battery, they may run into a risk of having an electric shock or exposure to electromagnetic wave.

Be careful when you use a necklace or cord for the mobile phone.

Be careful that using a necklace or cord for the mobile phone may cause you to run into dangerous accidents like being caught in train, electric railway or car doors.

Do not paint or put sticker on your mobile phone.

- Such action may damage your phone's joints and your phone may not open or close properly.
- Paint or metallic content on the phone may cause an allergic reaction, eczema, itching, swell, etc.

Do not place your phone near credit card, phone card, bank book or other materials that uses magnetic strip.

Your phone may damage the magnetic strip.

Do not hold or block the intenna with your body during a call.

- If you hold the bottom part of the phone (where intenna is located) during a call or data transfer, it may decrease the performance.
- If you attach materials (such as metallic stickers) that may effect intenna, it may decrease the quality of the call.

To use the mobile phone safely for a long time

Do not use the mobile phone in a place with risk of explosion.

In a construction sites and military areas, explosives can be controlled with RF devices. Turn off your phone and follow the proper instructions and signals.

Do not use the mobile phone near inflammable materials.

Do not use your phone or attach accessories on it in a potentially explosive atmosphere including gas station, gas leaking areas, and deck on boats.

Do not use the mobile phone in a prohibited area such as air plane and hospitals.

Radio frequency emitted from your phone may affect some of the devices used in an air plane or hospitals and cause accidents.

Do not use the mobile phone near pacemakers.

- Electromagnetic waves from your mobile phone may affect pacemaker when it is used within 15cm (6 inches) from it.
- If it is necessary, person with pacemaker should always use the phone in the opposite side of the pacemaker and keep the distance over 15cm.

A chargeable battery is consumable.

The repetition of charging/discharging will shorten its operation time gradually.

When the phone is not being charged properly, lamp on the charger will blink.

Check the charger to avoid the trouble that may occur to each device.

Mobile phone and battery cover need to be combined at all time.

If not, it may cause malfunction.

In case of separating a battery from the mobile phone, please turn off the power.

↘ Safety Information (cont'd)

To use the mobile phone safely for a long time

Make sure to charge the battery with the TTA authorized battery charger.

Using unauthorized charger may cause damage to your phone.

Keep your phone at room temperature of 0°C~40°C, avoid direct sunlight or place with high temperature and humidity.

If not, it may damage the phone and cause the phone to explode.

Do not place the phone in areas that may get very hot, such as microwave or near heating apparatus.

There is a risk of explosion or fire.

Ensure that charging terminal of the battery does not make contact with other metallic objects such as necklace, coins and keys.

There is a risk of explosion or fire.

Do not use the mobile phone while driving.

- Using the mobile phone while driving a car is dangerous and such action can cause car accidents.
- Check the local laws and regulations on using the mobile phones while driving.

Do not install a hands-free device near air bag.

An air bag inflates with great force in a moment. Do not leave your phone or set up the hands-free kit near to the air bag. You may be seriously injured when the air bag is activated.

Your phone checks battery temperature on its own for your safety. When the temperature of the battery raises over 55°C, phone will automatically stop all the functions and notify you to place the phone in cooler area with a pop-up message. Pop-up message will appear every 3 minutes when the temperature of the battery is between 55°C to 58°C.

When the temperature pass over 58°C, your phone will automatically turns in to cool down mode.

※ What is cool down mode?

It is a state where you can only make emergency calls and your phone will stop all the functions until the temperature of the battery becomes lower than 50°C.

When the temperature becomes lower than 50°C, your phone will notify you in a pop-up message that your phone is back to normal.



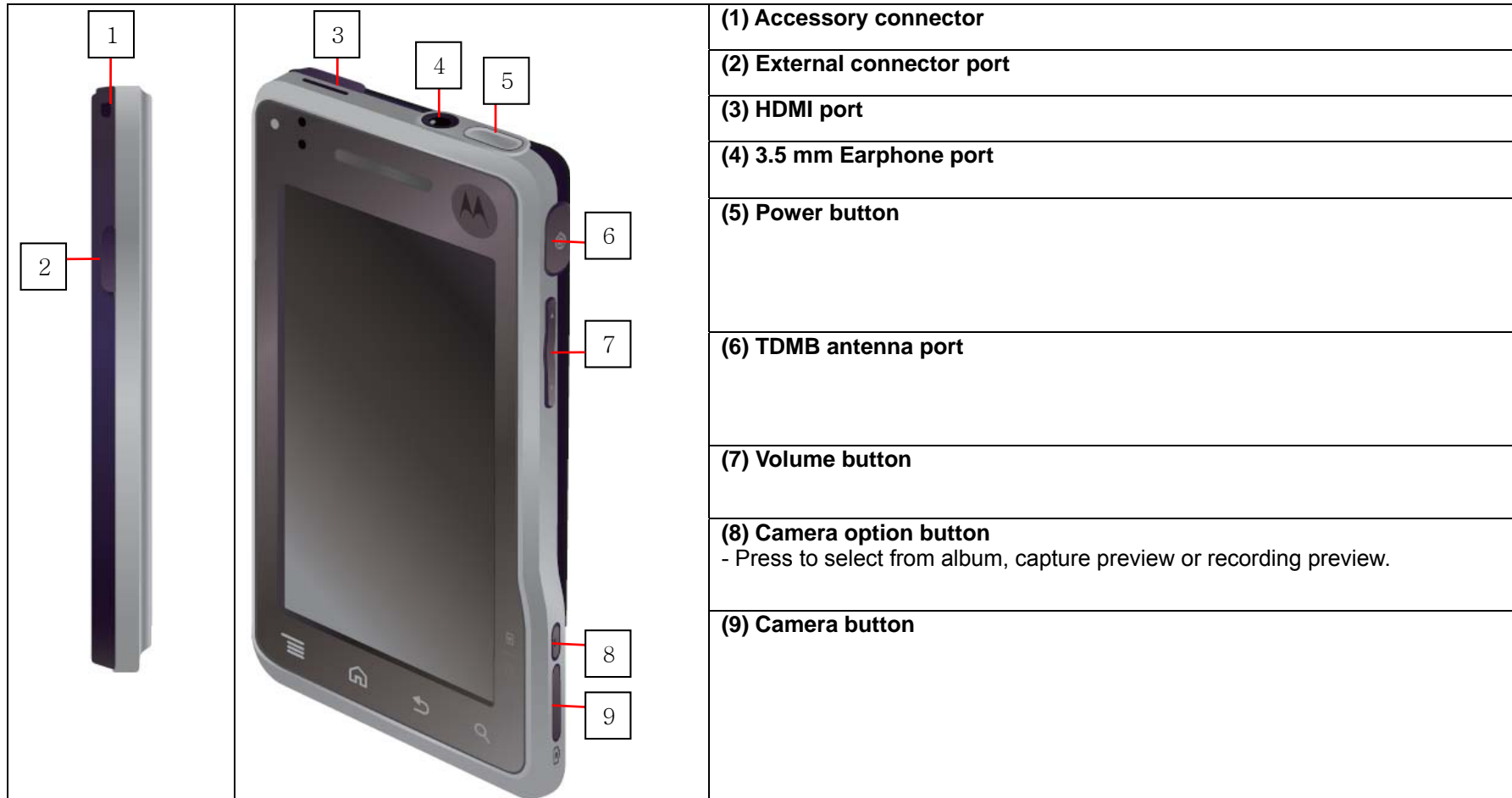

Battery

Battery in the package is not fully charged therefore make sure to fully charge the battery.

	1. Put the battery with the battery charge terminal and the phone charge terminal engaged as shown in the figure.		1. Push the battery cover (in the direction of the arrow as shown in the figure) while pressing the battery cover release button.
	2. Put the battery properly in the battery slot. Push it until it clicks.		2. Lift up the battery as shown in the figure.
	3. Place the battery cover to the battery cover groove. Push the battery cover (in the direction of the arrow as shown in the figure) until it clicks.		3. Remove the battery from the phone.

Caution

Make sure that the power is off when you remove the battery.

- If you remove the battery while the phone is on, it may damage your phone.

Charging the battery with a USB data cable

- 1) Open the external connection port cover and connect the USB data cable.
 - To charge your phone by using the USB data cable, you should have the SKT integrated USB driver installed in your PC.
 - If you connect your phone to your PC by using the USB data cable, both charging and communication function is available.
- 2) Connect the USB data cable to the USB port on your PC.

Note

- Some data cables, other than Motorola's authorized USB data cable, do not support battery charging function depending on their type.

- Use TTA certified charger. Uncertified chargers or USB data cables may cause incidents or damage to your phone.
- Travel charger is not included in the package for conservation of resources. You may purchase them separately from the retail shop or service center.

Battery charging status

Lamp blinks in red

- Status of the charging terminal is poor. Check if the battery is clean and try again.
- Battery or the other accessories may be damaged. Contact service center.

Lamp blinks in orange

- Battery is being charged in a place too hot or too cold. When the temperature returns to normal, the lamp turns red and begins charging again.
- If the phone is being charged in a too hot or too cold place, it can stop charging itself. In this case, the screen is on and special battery icon will blink. (Icon description, see p.36) If temperature changes into the room temperature, the lamp is changed into red and the battery starts to be charged.

- ※ **Based on a new battery/Bluetooth mode off/no external memory**
- Above service time of the battery is measured according to standard set by SKT. Actual operating time can be different depending on the status of usage.
 - Using bluetooth function will increase battery consumption.
 - If you have large amount of calling, it will be more convenient to charge a battery everyday.
 - Calling or browsing internet consumes more battery than when the phone is in standby. If the calling time becomes longer, standby time will get shorter.
 - Receiving call will consume as much battery as making a call.
 - Standby time may get shorter in out-of-service area.
 - Operating time may vary depending on the charge status, temperature(high/low), wave status in the surrounding and the lighting.




Low battery

- When the battery is low, pop-up notification will appear.
- When the battery is low, functions may not be able to operate. Charge the phone immediately.

USIM card

In order to use the phone, you should insert the USIM (Universal Subscriber Identity Module) card supplied by SKT. Emergency calls can be made without the USIM card.

Installing the USIM card



1. Remove the battery cover and the battery.
2. Remove the USIM card as shown in the figure.
3. Put the battery and the battery cover back.

- You can use the menu on the standby screen even when the USIM card is not inserted.

Note

- Calling and data usage fees are charged to the person registered to the USIM card. Therefore, be careful not to lose or transfer ownership.
- Set the password on your USIM card to prevent other people from using your USIM card when it is stolen or lost.
- Data inside of the USIM card can be damaged when the card gets scratched or bent.
- Using the USIM card with Transportation card function, battery usage time may get shorter.
- Turn the power off before inserting the USIM card. If you insert the USIM card while the phone is on, card will not be recognized.
- If you enter the wrong USIM card password for 3 consecutive times, USIM card usage will be restricted. In this case, contact the retail store or SKT.

Turning the power on

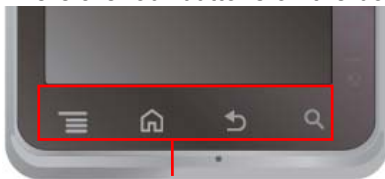
1. Press and hold the [Power] button.

Turning the power off

1. Press and hold the [Power] button.
2. When the phone option window appears, tap [Power off]
3. Tap [OK] to turn the power off.











Using the buttons

There are four buttons on the bottom of the touchscreen.





buttons

Button description

	Menu button	Press  to open menu options. Menu will be different depending on the application being used.
	Home button	Press  to close any menu or application and return to the home screen. Press and hold  to show the last few applications used, and then tap an application to open it. In the home screen, press  to open or close the main menu.
	Back button	Press  to go back to previous screen.
	Search button	Press  for text search, or press and hold for voice search.

Setting the screen lock

Your touch screen will be locked automatically when the phone is not being used for certain period of time.

1. From the Home screen, tap .
2. Tap [Settings] → [Sound & Display] → [Screen timeout]
3. Select the time for screen timeout.
 - Your screen will turn off and become locked if there hasn't been any action for the duration of the set time.
 - If you select never timeout, your phone will not become locked automatically. You have to lock the screen manually by pressing the  button.


Note

Screen will not turn off automatically when the USB data is connected.


Unlocking the touchscreen

Your touchscreen will be locked when it is not being used for long period of time.

1. Press the  button when the touchscreen is off.
2. Tap and drag [Lock] to the right (to the direction of the arrow).





You can draw on a screen to execute command on your phone.

Adding a gesture

1) Phone	You can dial number from dial pad
2) Call log	You can view history of incoming, outgoing, missed calls and messages
3) Contacts	You can view numbers stored in your phonebook.
4) Favorites	You can view the numbers
5) Entry field	Entered number will appear on this field. You can tap [←].
6) Dial pad	You can enter a number you wish to call.
7) Dial button	Press to dial a number. You can tap [Dial] without entering any numbers to call the most recent call.
8) Hide/Show dial pad	You can hide or show the dial pad.

Making a Call


You can make a call in various ways such as entering number directly or searching a number from your contacts.

Making a call from Dial pad

1. From the Phone screen, dial the number you wish to call.



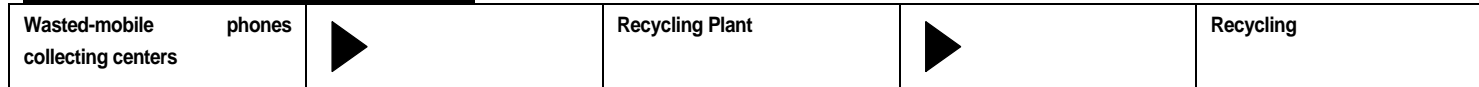
