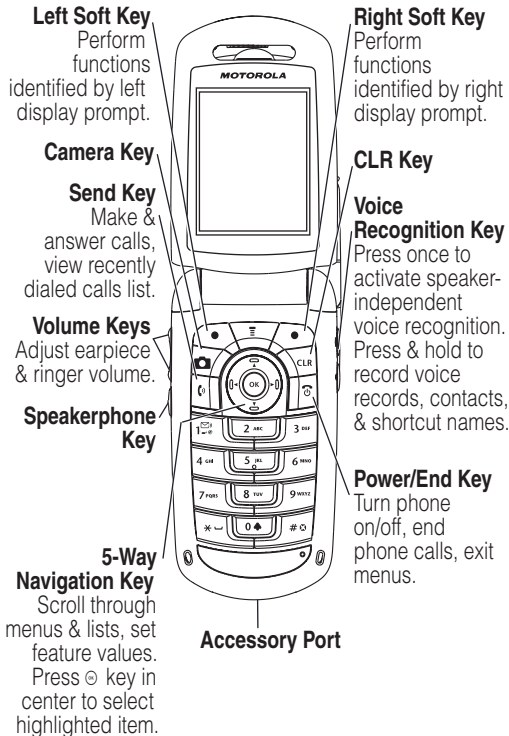

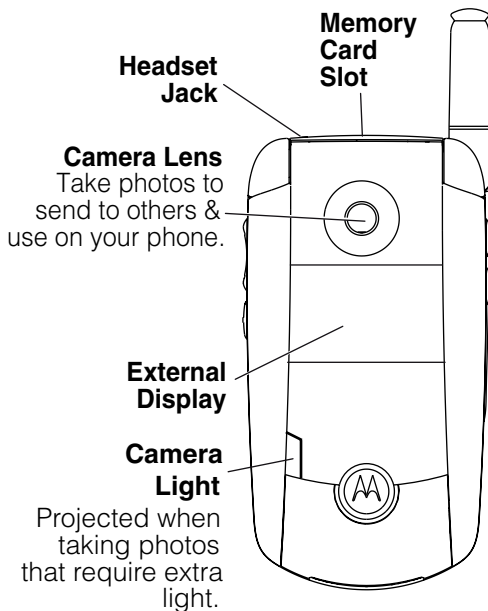

# Getting Started



**CAUTION:** Before using the phone for the first time, read the *Important Safety and Legal Information* included in the gray-edged pages at the back of this guide.

## About This Guide

This guide describes the basic features of your Motorola wireless phone.

### Optional Features



This label identifies an optional network or subscription-dependent feature that may not be offered by all service providers in all geographical areas. Contact your service provider for more information.

### Optional Accessories



This label identifies a feature that requires an optional Motorola Original<sup>®</sup> accessory.

## Battery Use

Battery performance depends on many factors, including your wireless carrier's network configuration; signal

strength; the temperature at which you operate your phone; the features and/or settings you select and use; items attached to the phone's accessory connector port; and your voice, data, and other application usage patterns.

**Caution:** To prevent injuries or burns, do not allow metal objects to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

To maximize your battery's performance:

- Always use Motorola Original batteries and battery chargers. The phone warranty does not cover damage caused from using non-Motorola batteries and/or battery chargers.
- New batteries or batteries that have been stored for a long time may require a longer charge time.
- Maintain the battery at or near room temperature when charging.
- Do not expose batteries to temperatures below  $-10^{\circ}\text{C}$  ( $14^{\circ}\text{F}$ ) or above  $45^{\circ}\text{C}$  ( $113^{\circ}\text{F}$ ). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- When you do not intend to use a battery for a while, store it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Batteries gradually wear down and require longer charging times. This is normal. If you charge your battery regularly and notice a decrease in talk time or an increase in charging time, then it is probably time to purchase a new battery.





The rechargeable batteries that power this phone must be disposed of properly and may need to be recycled. Refer to your battery's label for battery type. Contact your local recycling center for proper disposal methods.



**Warning:** Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.

## Installing the Battery

You must install and charge the battery to use your phone.



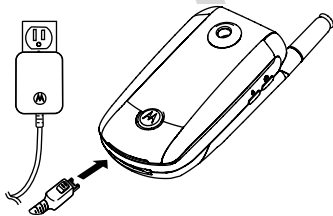
Your phone is designed to use only Motorola Original batteries and accessories. We recommend that you store batteries in their protective cases when not in use.

## Charging the Battery

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

### Action

- 1 Plug the travel charger into your phone with the release tab facing up.





## Action

- 2 Plug the other end of the travel charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
- 3 When your phone indicates **Charge Complete**, press the release tab and remove the travel charger.

**Tip:** You can safely leave the travel charger connected to the phone after charging is complete. This will **not** damage the battery.

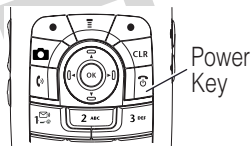
**Note:** When you charge the battery, the battery level indicator in the upper right corner of the display shows how much of the charging process is complete. At least 1 segment of the battery level indicator must be visible to ensure full phone functionality while charging.

## Turning On Your Phone

### Action

- 1 Open your phone.
- 2 Press and hold the power key for 3 seconds.

The phone may require several seconds to power on.



- 3 If necessary, enter your 4-digit unlock code (the last 4 digits of your phone number) and press **OK** (⏏) to unlock the phone.

## Adjusting Volume

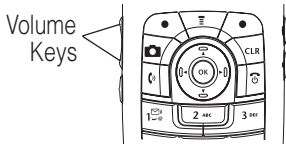


Press the up or down volume keys to:

- increase or decrease earpiece volume during a call
- increase or decrease the ringer volume setting when the home screen is visible (flip must be open)

**Tip:** At the lowest volume setting, press the down volume key once to switch to vibrate alert. Press it again to switch to silent alert. Press the up volume key to cycle back to vibrate alert, then ring alert.



- turn off an incoming call alert





## Making a Call

### Action

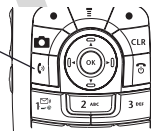
- 1 Dial the number.

**Tip:** If you make a mistake, press the clear key  to delete the last digit. Press and hold  to clear all digits.

- 2 Press  to make the call.

- 3 Press  to end the call.

Press to send call.



**Tip:** You can also close the flip to end the call.

**Note:** You must dial the phone number from the home screen. See page 24.

## Answering a Call

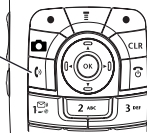
When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.



### Action

- 1 Press to answer.
- 2 Press to end the call.

Press to answer.



**Tip:** When the phone flip is active, open the phone to answer the call. (To activate, press > **Settings** > **In-Call Setup** > **Answer Options** > **Open to Answer**.)

**Note:** If the phone is locked, you must unlock it to answer the call.

## Changing the Call Alert

### Phone Flip Open

In the home screen, press the down volume key to switch to lower call alert volume, then switch to vibrate and, finally, silent alert. Press the up volume key to cycle back from silent alert to vibrate and then to the lowest alert volume setting.

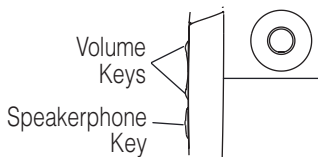




## Phone Flip Closed



Press the up or down volume key, then press the speakerphone key




to scroll through the alert styles: **Loud**, **Soft**, **Vibrate**, **Vibe & Ring**, and **Silent**. The alert styles are shown on the external display.

After scrolling to the desired alert style, press the up or down volume key to save the setting and return to the home screen.

## Viewing Your Phone Number

To view your phone number from the home screen, press




While you are on a call, press  > **My Tel. Numbers**.

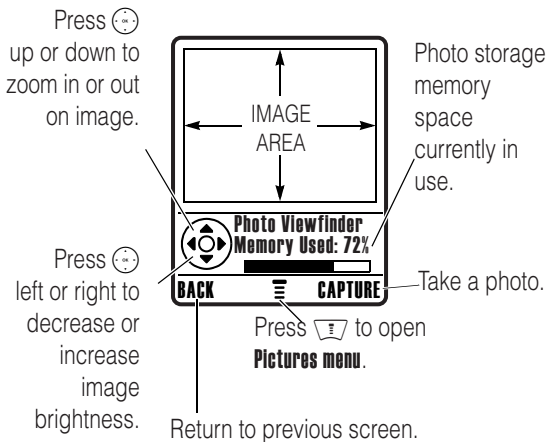

## Taking and Sending a Photo







From the home screen, press the camera key  to activate your phone's camera.

The active viewfinder image appears on your phone's display.



Point the camera lens at the photo subject, then:



Press	To
1 	take a photo
or <b>CAPTURE</b> 	
2 <b>STORE</b> 	view storage options If you choose to store the photo, continue to step 3.
or <b>ERASE</b> 	delete the photo and return to active viewfinder
3 	scroll to <b>Send in Message</b> , <b>Send to Online Album</b> , <b>Store Only</b> , <b>Apply as Wallpaper</b> , <b>Apply as Screen Saver</b> , or <b>Apply as Phonebook Entry</b> .
4 <b>SELECT</b> 	perform the storage option of your choice

## Taking a Self Portrait

To take a self portrait:


### Action

- 1 Close the flip.
- 2 Hold the camera with the lens aimed at yourself.  
Use the external display as a viewfinder.

## Action

- 3 Press the camera key on the side of the phone to capture the photo.


## Pictures Menu Options

When the camera is active, press  to access the **Pictures Menu**. The **Pictures Menu** can include the following options:

Option	Description
<b>Go To Pictures</b>	View pictures and photos stored on your phone.
<b>Auto-Timed Capture</b>	Set a timer for the camera to take a photo.
<b>Delete All</b>	Delete all pictures.
<b>Pictures Setup</b>	Open the setup menu to adjust picture settings.
<b>Switch Storage Device</b>	Save the picture on memory card ( <b>TRI-mmc</b> ), if installed, or on phone memory ( <b>Phone</b> ).
<b>View Free Space</b>	See how much memory remains for storing pictures.
<b>Camera Light</b>	Set a camera light for photos taken in settings with low light.
<b>Adjust Contrast</b>	Increase or decrease contrast.





Option	Description
Image Style	Press  right and left to select <b>Color</b> , <b>Black &amp; White</b> , <b>Antique</b> , or <b>Negative</b> .

## Sending a Multimedia Message










A *Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS)* *multimedia message* contains one or more slides with text and embedded media objects (including photos, pictures, animations, sounds, voice records). You can send the multimedia message to other wireless phone users and to other email addresses.

# Receiving a Multimedia Message



When you receive a multimedia message or letter, your phone displays the  (message waiting) indicator and a **New Message** notification, and sounds an alert.






Press	To
<b>READ</b> (  )	open the message

Multimedia messages that you receive can contain different media objects:

- Photos, pictures, and animations are displayed as you read the message.
- A sound file begins playing when its slide is displayed. Use the volume keys to adjust the volume as the sound file plays.

**Note:** In a multimedia letter, you may have to highlight an indicator embedded in the text to play a sound file.

- Attached files are appended to the message. To open the attachment, highlight the file indicator/filename and press **VIEW** () (image file type), **PLAY** () (sound file), or **OPEN** () (vObject such as phonebook or datebook entry, or unknown file type).

## TTY Operation

You can use an optional TTY device with your phone to send and receive calls. You must plug the TTY device into



the phone's headset jack and set the phone to operate in 1 of 3 TTY modes.






**Note:** Use a TSB-121 compliant cable (provided by the TTY manufacturer) to connect the TTY device to your phone.

**Note:** Set the phone to level 4 (middle setting) for proper operation. If you experience a high number of incorrect characters, adjust the volume as needed to minimize the error rate.

**Note:** For optimal performance, your phone should be at least 12 inches (30 centimeters) from the TTY device. Placing the phone too close to the TTY device may cause high error rates.

## Setting TTY Mode

 When you set your phone to a TTY mode, it operates in that mode whenever the TTY device is connected.

Press	To
1  up or down	scroll to the TTY mode
2 <b>SELECT</b> 	select the TTY mode

The **TTY Setup** menu can include the following options:

Press	To
<b>TTY</b>	transmit and receive TTY characters
<b>VCO</b>	receive TTY characters but transmit by speaking into microphone

Press	To
<b>HCO</b>	transmit TTY characters but receive by listening to earpiece
<b>Voice</b>	return to normal voice mode



When your phone is in a TTY mode, the international TTY mode, the international TTY symbol, and the mode setting display during an active TTY call.

### ***Returning to Voice Mode***

To return to normal voice mode, select **Voice** from the **TTY Setup** menu.

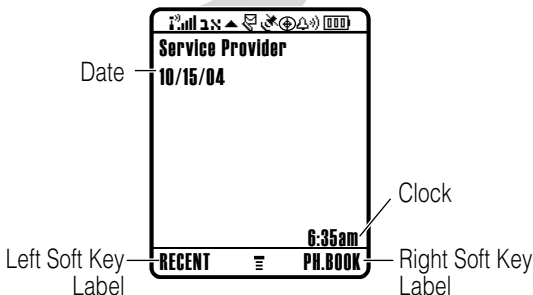
# Learning to Use Your Phone

## Using the Display


The *home screen* is displayed when you are **not** on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to dial a phone number.



**Note:** Your home screen may look different than the display shown above.

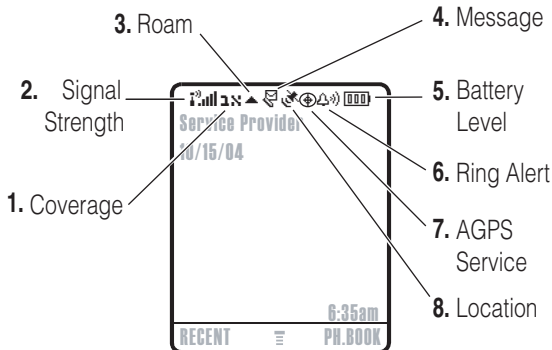
The ≡ (menu) indicator indicates that you can press the menu key (☰) to enter the main menu.

Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key (☐) or



right soft key (  ) to perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label.

Your phone can display an analog or digital clock in the home screen (see page 72).

The following status indicators can display:



## 1. Coverage Indicator

**2. Signal Strength Indicator** Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when the  (no signal) indicator or  (no transmit) indicator is displayed.





**3. Roam Indicator** Shows when your phone is seeking or using another network outside your home network.




**4. Message Indicator** Displays when you receive a new message. Indicators can include:



 = text message

 = voicemail message


 = voicemail and text message


When you enter a message, a number in this location shows the number of characters left on the current page (text message), or the message size (multimedia message or letter).



**5. Battery Level Indicator** Vertical bars show the battery charge level. Recharge the battery when **Low Battery** displays and the battery alert sounds.


**6. Ring Alert Indicator** Shows the ring alert setting.

 = loud ring

 = soft ring

 = vibrate

 = vibrate and ring

 = silent

**7. AGPS Service Indicator** Indicates when AGPS Service is off (icon is grey), on (icon is white), or on and finding your location (icon is green).



**8. Location Indicator** Your phone may be able to send location information to the network during an emergency call. Indicators show when your phone is sending location information:

 = location on

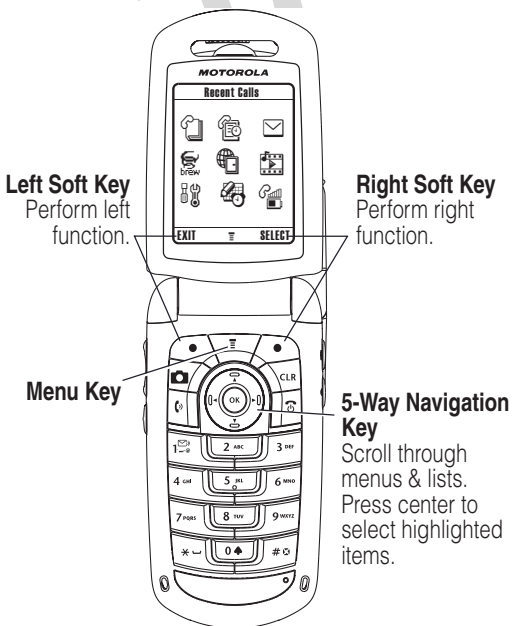

# Using the 5-Way Navigation Key










Use the 5-way navigation key (⊙) to scroll up, down, left, or right through the menu system. Press the ⊙ key in the center to select a highlighted menu item.

## Using Menus

From the home screen, press  to enter the main menu.



Press  to scroll to and highlight a menu feature icon in the main menu. The following icons represent features that may appear in the main menu, depending on your service provider and service subscription options.

## Selecting a Menu Feature

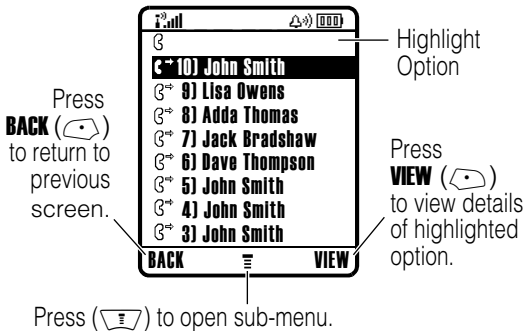
This guide uses the following format to show you how to select a menu feature, starting from the home screen.

**Find the Feature**  > **Recent Calls** > **Dialed Calls**

This example shows that from the home screen, you must press , scroll to and select **Recent Calls** from the main menu, then scroll to and select **Dialed Calls**. Press  to scroll, and the left/right soft keys to select the functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

## Selecting a Feature Option

Some features require you to select an option from a list:



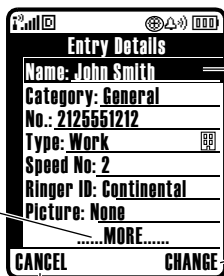
- Press (⬆) to scroll up or down to highlight the option you want.
- In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight the option.
- In an alphabetized list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list option.
- When an option has a list of possible values, press (⬅) left or right to scroll through and select a value.
- When an option has a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.





# Entering Text

Some features require you to enter information.



Press to scroll down to other options.

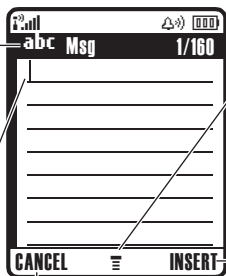
Highlighted Option

Press **CHANGE** () to enter or edit information.

Press **CANCEL** () to exit without making changes. **DONE** () displays when you enter or edit information.

The message center lets you compose and send text messages.

For indicator descriptions, see following section.



Flashing cursor indicates insertion point.

Press to open sub-menu.

Press **INSERT** () to insert a quick note, picture, or sound.


Press **CANCEL** () to exit without making changes.

## Choosing a Text Entry Method


Multiple text entry methods make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The method you select remains active until you select another method.

Press  in any text entry screen to select 1 of the following entry methods:

<b>Primary</b>	The primary text entry method (see below to set).
<b>Numeric</b>	Enter numbers only (see page 37).
<b>Symbol</b>	Enter symbols only (see page 38).
<b>Secondary</b>	The secondary text entry method (see below to set).

Alternatively, you can select a text entry method in any text entry screen by pressing  > **Entry Mode**.


## Setting Up a Text Entry Method

Press  > **Entry Setup** from any text entry screen. Select **Primary Setup** or **Secondary Setup**, and choose:

<b>ITAP</b>	Let the phone predict each word as you press keys (see page 36).
<b>Tap</b>	Enter letters and numbers by pressing a key 1 or more times.
<b>Tap Extended</b>	Enter letters, numbers, and symbols by pressing a key 1 or more times.
<b>None</b>	Hide the <b>Secondary</b> setting (only available for <b>Secondary Setup</b> ).



## Using Capitalization

Press  in any text entry screen to change text case. The following indicators show capitalization status:







abc = no capital letters

## Using Tap Method

This is the standard method for entering text on your phone.

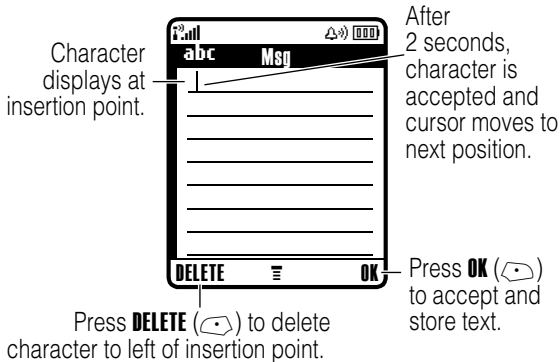
Regular **Tap** method cycles through the letters and numbers of the key you press. **Tap Extended** method also cycles through additional symbols as shown in the “Character Chart” on page 35.

2 keypad keys	enter remaining characters
	<b>Tip:</b> Press  right to accept a word completion, or  to insert a space.
3 <b>OK</b> 	store the text

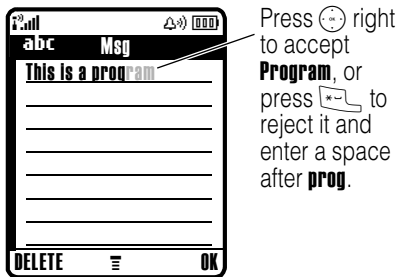

### Tap Method Text Entry Rules

- Press a keypad key repeatedly to cycle through its characters.
- Press  left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a text message.
- The first character of every sentence is capitalized. If necessary, press  down to force the character to




lowercase before the cursor moves to the next position.


- If you enter or edit information and do not want to save the changes, press  to exit without saving.



## Using iTAP™ Method


iTAP™ software provides a predictive text entry method that lets you enter a word using 1 keypress per letter. This can be faster than **Tap** method, because your phone combines the key presses into common words.


For example, if you press    , letter combinations that match your key presses display:



Press  up to accept **Program**.


Press  right to highlight another combination. Press  to enter **Prog** and a space.

Press **DELETE** () to delete last letter.




Press **SELECT** () to lock highlighted combination.

If you want a different word (such as **Progress**), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

## Entering Words

In a text entry screen, you can press  to switch entry methods. An indicator tells you which method is active

(see page 32). If **ITAP** method is not available as the **Primary** or **Secondary** entry method, see page 31.

If you enter a word your phone does not recognize, the phone stores it to use as 1 of your word options. When you fill memory space for unrecognized words, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new words.

## **Using Numeric Method**

In a text entry screen, press  to switch entry methods until the **123** (numeric) indicator displays.








Press keypad keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press  to switch to another entry method.

## Deleting Letters and Words

Place the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, and then:

Action
Press  to delete 1 letter at a time.
Hold  to delete the entire message.

## Using the External Display

When the flip is closed, you can use the external display for the following:

- View time, date, and phone status information.



- Read messages that notify you of incoming calls and other events.
- Use the external display as a viewfinder when you take a self portrait with the phone's camera.
- When you use a Bluetooth headset for voice recognition, view voice-activated dialing commands and other status information.

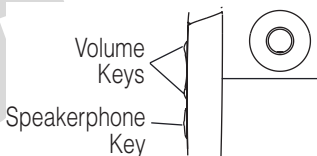

**Note:** Because the microphone and earpiece are unavailable when the phone is closed, you must use a headset or other handsfree device with this feature.

## **Using the Handsfree Speaker**

When you activate your phone's integrated handsfree speaker, you can talk to the other party without holding the phone to your ear.

Press and hold the speakerphone key to turn the handsfree speaker on or off during a call. A soft audio alert confirms activation/deactivation.



When you turn on the handsfree speaker, your phone displays **Speaker On** in the home screen. The handsfree speaker remains on until you press the speakerphone key again or turn the phone off.

**Note:** The handsfree speaker is disabled when you connect your phone to a handsfree car kit or headset accessory.

## **Changing a Code, PIN, or Password**

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000.

Your service provider may reset these codes before you receive your phone.

If your service provider has **not** reset these codes, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.

## ***Locking and Unlocking Your Phone***

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, **but you must unlock it to answer.**

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked (see page 52).

# Setting a Screen Saver Image

Set a photo, picture, or animation as a screen saver image.

The screen saver image displays when the flip is open and no activity is detected for a specified time period. The image shrinks to fill the display, if necessary. An animation repeats for 1 minute, then the first frame of the animation displays.

# Hiding or Showing Location Information



Your phone can use the *automatic location information* (ALI) feature to tell the network where you are physically located.



When ALI is set to **Location On**, your phone displays the  (ALI on) indicator. Services may use your known location to provide useful information (for example, driving directions, or the location of the nearest bank). Your phone prompts you when the network or a service asks for your location. You can refuse at this point.



When ALI is set to **911 Only**, your phone displays the  (ALI off) indicator, and the phone does not send location information unless you call the emergency phone number (such as 911).

## Conserving Battery Power

**Note:** If **Speakerphone** is not already turned on and you want to activate it, press **SPEAKER** (). You can then speak the commands aloud, and hear phone prompts played out loud.

Your phone displays **Say a command**.



## Action

- 2 Say 1 of the following commands:

**Name Dial, Digit Dial, Camera, Voicemail, Redial, Received Calls**

Your phone opens the corresponding menu or performs the corresponding action.

---

## To Place Calls

Advanced Voice Dialing lets you place a call by speaking a phone number.

**Note:** This feature recognizes only 7-digit, 10-digit, and 11-digit numbers. It will **not** dial 3-digit numbers such as 911. To make an emergency call, use the phone keypad to dial and send the number.

## Action

- 1 Press and release the voice button on the right side of the phone.

Your phone displays **Say a command** and plays the same prompt out loud.

---

- 2 Say "Digit Dial."
- 

- 3 When prompted, say the phone number.

If the phone recognizes the number, it dials that number.

If the phone asks you to repeat a number, say it again. If the number is not valid or is not recognized, the phone does not place the call.

---



## Action

If the phone does not recognize the number, it displays a list of up to 3 numbers and asks, “Did you say ...” followed by the first number in the list.

- If the number is correct, say “Yes” to dial that number.

or

- If the number is not correct, say “No” to go to the next number.

or

- To select the number manually, scroll to the correct number on the list and press **SELECT** (⏏).

or

- To exit the list and repeat the number, press the voice button.

If you reach the end of the list without confirming a number, the phone asks if you want to try again. Say “Yes” to say the number again or “No” to exit without placing a call.

---

---

**Tip:** Speak numbers at a normal speed and volume, pronouncing each digit distinctly. Avoid pausing between digits.

### *To Adapt Advanced Voice Dialing to Your Voice*

For most people, Advanced Voice Dialing works well without any initial setup. However, if the phone is



frequently unable to recognize numbers correctly when you use Advanced Voice Dialing, you may be able to improve your results by adapting it to your voice.

**Note:** If the phone is used by several people, reset Advanced Voice Dialing to its original setting before proceeding. This ensures that you are not saving your settings over someone else's.

## Adapting Advanced Voice Dialing to Your Voice

### Find the Feature



> **Settings** > **Personalize**  
> **Voice Dial Setup**

### Action

- 1 Scroll to **Adapt Digits**.
- 2 Press **OK** (OK icon).
- 3 Press **START** (START icon).
- 4 When the phone prompts you to say the 1st digit sequence, wait for the beep and then repeat the digits in a normal tone of voice.
- 5 If the recording sounds acceptable (no mistakes or background noises), say "Yes" or press **OK** (OK icon).

or

If the recording is not acceptable, say "No."  
When prompted to say the digits again, wait for the beep and then record the digits again.  
Repeat this step until you are satisfied with the recording.





## Action

- Repeat the recording process with each set of digits (12 in all) until adaptation is complete. (The phone will say “Adaptation Complete.”)

**Tip:** When adapting Advanced Voice Dialing:

- Choose a quiet place for recording.
- Wait for the beep before you begin to speak.
- Speak at a normal speed and volume, pronouncing each digit distinctly. Avoid pausing between digits.
- If you make a mistake while recording a sequence of digits, or if an unexpected noise spoils the recording, rerecord that sequence.





## **The model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.**

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg.<sup>1</sup> Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 1.37 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as

described in this user guide, is 0.65 W/kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements).<sup>2</sup>

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.
