

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Getting Started



CAUTION: Before using the phone for the first time, read the Important Safety and Legal Information included in the gray-edged pages at the back of this guide.

About This Guide

This guide describes the basic features of your Motorola wireless phone.

Optional Features



This label identifies an optional network, SIM card, or subscription-dependent feature that may not be offered by all service providers in all geographical areas. Contact your service provider for more information.

Optional Accessories



This label identifies a feature that requires an optional Motorola Original™ accessory.

Installing the SIM Card

Your SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card contains your phone number, service details, and phonebook/message memory.





Caution: Do not bend or scratch your SIM card. Avoid exposing your SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt.

Battery Tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, features, and accessories you use.

 Always use Motorola Original batteries and battery chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.



- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.
- When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change

in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.



Contact your local recycling center for proper battery disposal.



Installing the Battery



Your phone is designed to use only Motorola Original batteries and accessories.



Charging the Battery

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.



Action

1 Plug the travel charger into the bottom of your phone.



- 2 Plug the other end of the travel charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
- 3 When your phone indicates Charge Complete, remove the travel charger.


Tip: You can safely leave the travel charger connected to your phone after charging is complete. This will not damage the battery.

Turning Your Phone On



Action

1 Press and hold for 2 seconds to turn on the phone.



2 If necessary, enter your SIM card PIN code and press the **OK** key to unlock the SIM card.

Caution: If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in a row, your SIM card is disabled and your phone displays SIM Blocked.

3 If necessary, enter your 4-digit unlock code and press the **OK** key to unlock the phone.

Adjusting Volume

Press the 5-way Navigation key (·�·) left or right to increase or decrease volume.



- increase or decrease earpiece volume during a call
- increase or decrease the ringer volume setting when the home screen is visible

Tip: At the lowest volume setting, press the key left once to switch to vibrate alert. Press it again to switch to silent alert. Press the key right to switch back to vibrate alert, then ring alert.

Viewing Your Phone Number

To view your phone number from the home screen, press #.

While you are on a call, press **> My Tel. Numbers**.

Note: Your phone number must be stored on your SIM card to use this feature. To store your phone number on the SIM card, see page 41. If you do not know your phone number, contact your service provider.

Highlight Features



You can do much more with your phone than make and receive calls! This section describes some of your phone's highlight features.

Sending a Multimedia Message



A Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS) message contains one or more slides with text and embedded media objects (including pictures, animations, sounds, or voice records). You can send the multimedia message to other wireless phone users, and to email addresses.

Receiving a Multimedia Message



When you receive an MMS message, your phone displays the ♥ (message waiting) indicator and a New Message notification, and sounds an alert.

Press	То
READ key	open the message

MMS messages that you receive can contain the following media objects:

- Pictures, and animations are displayed as you read the message.
- A sound file begins playing when its slide is displayed.
- Attached files are added to the end of the message.
 To open the attachment, highlight the file indicator/filename and press the VIEW key (image file type),
 PLAY key (sound file), or OPEN key (object such as phonebook or datebook entry, or unknown file type).





Using the Display



The *home screen* displays when you are **not** on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to dial a phone number.




The

(menu) indicator indicates that you can press the menu key (□) to enter the main menu.

Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key or right soft key to perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label.

Your phone can display an analog or digital clock in the home screen (see page 73).

The following status indicators can display:





1. Signal Strength Indicator

Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when the i^a (no signal) indicator or $i^a \times$ (no transmit) indicator displays.

2. GPRS Indicator



Shows that your phone is using a high-speed General Packet Radio Service (GPRS) network connection. GPRS allows faster data transfer speeds. Indicators can include:

3. Data Transmission Indicator

Shows connection and data transmission status. Indicators can include:

= secure application connection

□ = secure Circuit Switch Data (CSD) call ■ = insecure application connection

4. Roam Indicator



Shows when your phone is seeking or using another network outside your home network. Indicators can include:

5. Active Line Indicator



Shows 1 or 12 to indicate the current active phone line. Other indicators can include:

6. Messaging Presence Indicator



The PTT () icon means that you can make and receive PTT calls.

When Instant Messaging (IM) is active, indicators can include:

7. Message Indicator



Displays when you receive a new message. Indicators can include:

When you enter a message, a number in this location shows the number of characters left on the current page (text message), or the message size (multimedia message).



8. Location Indicator



Your phone may be able to send location information to the network during an emergency call. Indicators show when your phone is sending location information:

Shows the ring style setting.

10. Battery Level Indicator

Vertical bars show the battery charge level. Recharge the battery when **Low Battery** displays and the battery alert sounds.

Using the 5-Way Navigation Key

Use the 5-way navigation key (•••) to scroll up, down, left, or right through the menu system, highlight menu items, change feature settings, and



play games. Press the center select button to select a highlighted menu item.

Using Menus

From the home screen, press 🔳 to enter the main menu.





Press • • to scroll to and highlight a menu feature icon in the main menu. The following icons represent features that may appear in the main menu, depending on your service provider and service subscription options.


Selecting a Menu Feature

To select a menu feature, starting from the home screen:

This example shows that from the home screen, you must press , scroll to and select Recent Calls from the main menu, then scroll to and select Dialed Calls. Press • • to scroll, and the left/right soft keys to select the functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

Selecting a Feature Option

Some features require you to select an option from a list:



Press <.p>
• to scroll up or down to highlight the option you want.


- In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight the option.
- In an alphabetized list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list option.

When an option displays a list of possible values, press $\cdot \hat{\diamondsuit}$ left or right to scroll through and select a value.

When an option displays a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.


Entering Text

Some features require you to enter information.





The message center lets you compose and send text messages. A *Character Counter* indicates how many more characters will fit in a message.



Choosing a Text Entry Mode

Multiple text entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The method you select remains active until you select another method.

Press # in any text entry screen to select one of the following entry modes:

Primary The primary text entry mode (see

below to set).

Numeric Enter numbers only (see

page 31).

Symbol Enter symbols only (see page 31).

Secondary The secondary text entry mode

(see below to set).

Alternatively, you can select a text entry mode in any text entry screen by pressing \square > Entry Mode.

Setting Up a Text Entry Mode

Press > Entry Setup from any text entry screen. Select Primary Setup or Secondary Setup, and choose:

ITAP Let the phone predict each word

as you press keys (see page 29).

Tap Enter letters and numbers by

Using Capitalization



Tap method cycles through the letters and number of the key you press. Tap Extended method also cycles through additional symbols as shown in the chart on page 28.

When you enter text with **Tap** or **Tap Extended** method, the soft key functions change.



When you enter 3 or more characters in a row, your phone may guess the rest of the word. For example, if you enter prog you might see:



If you want a different word (such as **progress**), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

Tap Method Text Entry Rules


- Press a keypad key repeatedly to cycle through its characters.
- Press • left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a text message.
- The first character of every sentence is capitalized. If necessary, press ô down to force the character to lowercase before the cursor moves to the next position.
- If you enter or edit information and do not want to save the changes, press to exit without saving.

Using iTAP™ Method

iTAP[™] software provides a predictive text entry mode that lets you enter a word using one keypress per letter. This can be faster than **Tap** method, because your phone combines the keypresses into common words.



For example, if you press 7764, letter combinations that match your keypresses display:



If you want a different word (such as **Progress**), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

Entering Words

In a text entry screen, you can press # to switch entry modes. An indicator shows which method is active (see page 26). If ITAP method is not available as the **Primary** or **Secondary** entry mode, see page 25.

If you enter a word your phone does not recognize, the phone stores it to use as one of your word options. When you fill memory space for unrecognized words, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new words.

Using Numeric Method

In a text entry screen, press # to switch entry modes until the 12 (numeric) indicator displays.

Press keypad keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press # to switch to another entry mode.

Using Symbol Method

In a text entry screen, press # to switch entry modes until the @ (symbol) indicator displays.

Deleting Letters and Words

Place the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, and then:

Action

Press the **DELETE** key to delete one letter at a time.

Hold the **DELETE** key to delete the entire message.

Using the Push to Talk (PTT) Key

Press the Push to Talk (PTT) key to access the PTT menus, contacts, groups, and settings. For details, see page 57.



Using the Handsfree Speaker

When you activate your phone's integrated handsfree speaker, you can talk to the other party without holding the phone to your ear.

Press the **SPEAKER** key to turn the handsfree speaker on or off during a call.

When you turn the handsfree speaker on, your phone displays **Speaker On** in the home screen. The handsfree speaker remains on until you press the **SPEAKER** key again or turn the phone off.

Note: The handsfree speaker is disabled when you connect your phone to a handsfree car kit or headset accessory.

Changing a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset these codes before you receive your phone.

If your service provider has not reset these codes, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.

You can also reset your SIM card PIN code, PIN2 code, and/or call barring password if necessary.

To change a code or password:



- > Settings > Security
- > New Passwords

Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, but you must unlock it to answer.

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked (see page 48).

If You Forget a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number before you receive your phone.

If you forget your unlock code, try entering 1234 or the last 4 digits of your phone number. If that does not work, at the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:

If you forget your security code, SIM card PIN code, PIN2 code, or call barring password, contact your service provider.

Locking and Unlocking the Keypad

You can lock the keypad to prevent accidental key presses (for example, when carrying your phone in a purse or pocket).

Tip: This feature also locks the PTT key so you do not accidentally start a PTT call.

Press	То
*	lock or unlock the keypad

Note: Incoming phone calls and messages unlock the keypad. Incoming PTT calls **do not** unlock the keypad.

Using the Phonebook

This section briefly describes basic phonebook operations. For more information about using the phonebook, see page 70.

Shortcut: To open your phonebook from the home screen, press ·Ô· up or down.

Storing a Phone Number

Enter a phone number in the home screen, then press the **STORE** key to create a phonebook entry with that number. Fill in the other fields to complete the entry.

Select MORE to store another number (for example, a work number) for the same Name.

Recording a Voice Name

Note: This option is not available for entries stored on the SIM card.

When creating a phonebook entry, scroll to **Voice Name** and press the **RECORD** key. When you are ready, press the **RECORD** key again and say the entry's name (within 2 seconds). When prompted, press the **RECORD** key and repeat the name. Press the **DONE** key to store the voice name.

Storing a Picture for Caller ID

Note: This option is not available for entries stored on the SIM card.

You can store a picture for a phonebook entry. The picture displays when you receive calls from the entry.

When creating a phonebook entry, scroll to **Picture** and press the **CHANGE** key. Press \diamondsuit to select a picture, and press the **SELECT** key to store it for the entry.

Dialing a Number

Press **> Phonebook** > entry to call **>**.

Tip: To quickly highlight entries in your **Phonebook** list: If your entries are sorted by **Speed No.**, press an entry's speed number to highlight it. For example, press [] [5] for entry number 15. If your entries are sorted by **Name**, **Voice Name**, or **Email**, enter the first letter of the entry's name to highlight it. For example, press [5] [5] for the first entry that starts with "K".

Voice Dialing a Number

Press \blacksquare > Office Tools, press Dialing Services > Voice Dial, and say the entry's name (within 2 seconds).

Tip: To create a shortcut to Voice Dial, press

- \blacksquare > Office Tools > Dialing Services, scroll to Voice Dial, and hold the \blacksquare . Your phone prompts you to save the shortcut. To use a
- shortcut, press 🔳 and the shortcut key number.

Sorting Phonebook Entries

Press \blacksquare > Phonebook, press \blacksquare > Setup > Sort by, then select whether you want to sort the phonebook list by Name, Speed No., Voice Name, or Email.


When sorting by name, you can view **All** numbers or just the **Primary** number for each name. To set the primary number for a name, see page 72.

Viewing Entries By Category

Press \blacksquare > **Phonebook**, press \blacksquare > **Categories**, then select whether you want to view **All** entries, entries in a predefined

category (Business, Personal, General, VIPs), or entries in a category you created.

To set the category for a phonebook entry, see page 72.

Storing Your Name and Phone Number



To store or edit your name and phone number information on your SIM card:

Shortcut: Press **T #** from the home screen to edit your name and phone number.

If you do not know your phone number, contact your service provider.



Setting the Time and Date

Your phone uses the time and date for the **Datebook**. Your phone can synchronize its time and date with the network:

To set the time and date manually, set **Autoupdate** to **Off** and then set the **Time** and **Date** options:

Setting a Ring Style

Your phone rings or vibrates to notify you of an incoming call or other event. This ring or vibration is called an **alert**.

You can select one of five different ring styles. The ring style indicator in the display shows the current ring style (see page 17).

To set a ring style:

Each ring style contains settings for specific event alerts, ringer ID, and ringer and keypad volume. To change these settings, press \blacksquare > Settings > Ring Styles > style Detail.

Setting a Wallpaper Image

You can set a picture or animation as a wallpaper (background) image in your phone's home screen. The

wallpaper image appears as a faint watermark in text and menu displays.

Setting a Screen Saver Image

The screen saver image displays when the phone is on and no activity is detected for a specified time. The image shrinks to fill the display, if necessary. An animation repeats for one minute, then the first frame of the animation displays.

Turn off the screen saver to extend battery life.





To make a PTT call:

- Enter a PTT subscriber's phone number with the keypad. Then hold the PTT key and speak after the tone. For call details, see page 58.

Storing PTT Contacts and Groups

Tip: To send a PTT Alert tone instead of a call, open the list of **PTI Contacts**, **Dialed Calls** or **Received Calls**, highlight a PTT contact, and press the **ALERT** key. The contact receives a tone, and they can speak first. If they do not respond, the call ends. You cannot send alert tones to groups.



Answering PTT Calls

When you receive a PTT call, the Announce Call tone sounds followed by conversation from the caller.

- To speak when the caller releases their PTT key, hold your PTT key and speak after the Connection to Speak tone. Only one person can speak at a time.
- To end the call, press 3.

Tip: If you receive a PTT Alert tone, press the **ANSWER** key, press the PTT key, and speak after the tone. You can also press the **IGNORE** key when you receive a PTT Alert tone cancel the call.

Note: Your phone displays **Missed Call** if you miss a PPT Alert, but not if you miss a standard PPT call.
