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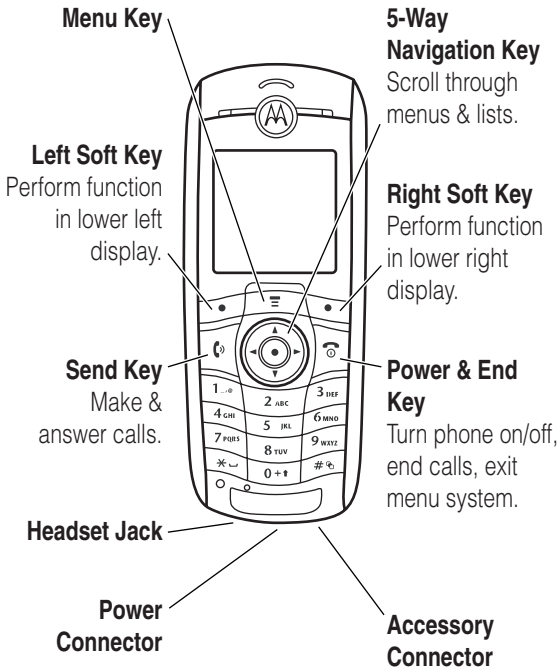

About This Guide

This guide describes the basic features of your Motorola wireless phone.

Optional Features



This label identifies an optional network, SIM card, or subscription-dependent feature that may not be offered by all service providers in all geographical areas. Contact your service provider for more information.

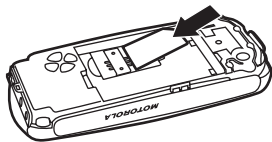
Optional Accessories



This label identifies a feature that requires an optional Motorola Original™ accessory.

Installing the SIM Card

Your SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card contains your phone number, service details, and phonebook/message memory.



Caution: Do not bend or scratch your SIM card. Avoid exposing your SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt.

Battery Tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, features, and accessories you use.

- Always use Motorola Original batteries and battery chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.
- When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change



in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.



Contact your local recycling center for proper battery disposal.

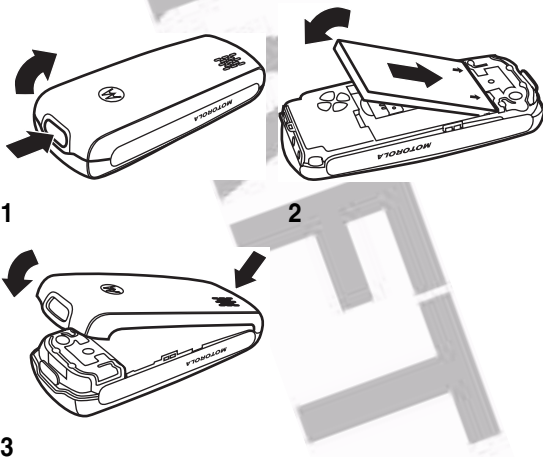

Installing the Battery



™ Your phone is designed to use only Motorola Original batteries and accessories.



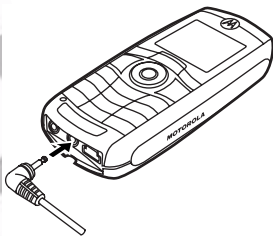
Charging the Battery

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.



Action

- 1 Plug the travel charger into the bottom of your phone.




- 2 Plug the other end of the travel charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
- 3 When your phone indicates **Charge Complete**, remove the travel charger.

Tip: You can safely leave the travel charger connected to your phone after charging is complete. This will not damage the battery.

Turning Your Phone On



Action

- 1 Press and hold  for 2 seconds to turn on the phone.




- 2 If necessary, enter your SIM card PIN code and press the **OK** key to unlock the SIM card.

Caution: If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in a row, your SIM card is disabled and your phone displays SIM Blocked.

- 3 If necessary, enter your 4-digit unlock code and press the **OK** key to unlock the phone.

Adjusting Volume

Press the 5-way Navigation key () left or right to increase or decrease volume.





- increase or decrease earpiece volume during a call
- increase or decrease the ringer volume setting when the home screen is visible

Tip: At the lowest volume setting, press the key left once to switch to vibrate alert. Press it again to switch to silent alert. Press the key right to switch back to vibrate alert, then ring alert.

- turn off an incoming call alert



Making a Call

Press	To
1 keypad keys	dial the phone number
2 	make the call
3 	end the call and “hang up” the phone when you are finished






Answering a Call

When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.

Press	To
1  or ANSWER key	answer the call
2 	end the call and “hang up” the phone when you are finished

Viewing Your Phone Number

To view your phone number from the home screen, press  .

While you are on a call, press  > **My Tel. Numbers**.

Note: Your phone number must be stored on your SIM card to use this feature. To store your phone number on the SIM card, see page 41. If you do not know your phone number, contact your service provider.

Highlight Features



You can do much more with your phone than make and receive calls! This section describes some of your phone's highlight features.

Sending a Multimedia Message



A **Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS)** message contains one or more slides with text and embedded media objects (including pictures, animations, sounds, or voice records). You can send the multimedia message to other wireless phone users, and to email addresses.



Receiving a Multimedia Message



When you receive an MMS message, your phone displays the  (message waiting) indicator and a **New Message** notification, and sounds an alert.

Press	To
READ key	open the message

MMS messages that you receive can contain the following media objects:

- Pictures, and animations are displayed as you read the message.
- A sound file begins playing when its slide is displayed.
- Attached files are added to the end of the message. To open the attachment, highlight the file indicator/ filename and press the **VIEW** key (image file type), **PLAY** key (sound file), or **OPEN** key (object such as phonebook or datebook entry, or unknown file type).

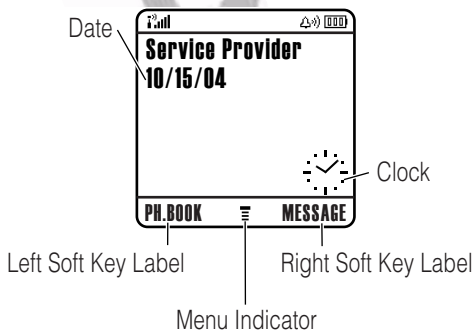


Learning to Use Your Phone

See page 1 for a basic phone diagram.

Using the Display

The *home screen* displays when you are **not** on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to dial a phone number.

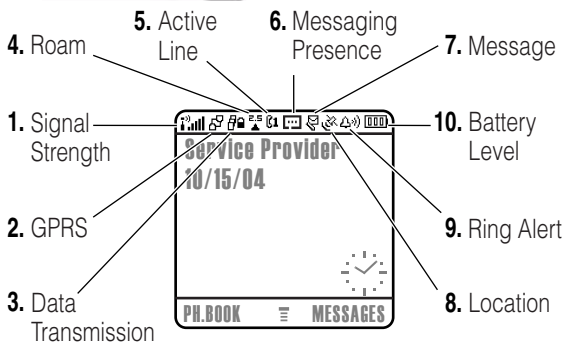


The ☰ (menu) indicator indicates that you can press the menu key (☰) to enter the main menu.



Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key or right soft key to perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label.

Your phone can display an analog or digital clock in the home screen (see page 73).

The following status indicators can display:




1. Signal Strength Indicator

Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when the  (no signal) indicator or  (no transmit) indicator displays.

2. GPRS Indicator



Shows that your phone is using a high-speed General Packet Radio Service (GPRS) network connection. GPRS allows faster data transfer speeds. Indicators can include:


 = GPRS PDP context active


 = GPRS packet data available





3. Data Transmission Indicator


Shows connection and data transmission status. Indicators can include:

 = secure packet data transfer

 = insecure packet data transfer

 = secure application connection

 = insecure application connection

 = secure Circuit Switch Data (CSD) call

 = insecure CSD call

4. Roam Indicator



Shows when your phone is seeking or using another network outside your home network. Indicators can include:

 = 2.5G home

 = 2.5G roam


 = 2G home


 = 2G roam

5. Active Line Indicator



Shows  or  to indicate the current active phone line. Other indicators can include:


 = line 1 active, call forward on

 = line 2 active, call forward on

 = alarm activated

6. Messaging Presence Indicator




The PTT () icon means that you can make and receive PTT calls.


When Instant Messaging (IM) is active, indicators can include:


 = IM active


 = available for IM

 = busy

 = invisible to IM

 = available for phone calls


 = offline

When a Java application is active, the  (Java midlet) indicator can display in this location.

7. Message Indicator





Displays when you receive a new message. Indicators can include:

 = text message

 = voicemail message

 = IM message

 = active chat session

 = voicemail and text message

When you enter a message, a number in this location shows the number of characters left on the current page (text message), or the message size (multimedia message).



8. Location Indicator



Your phone may be able to send location information to the network during an emergency call. Indicators show when your phone is sending location information:

= location on

= location off

9. Ring Style Indicator

Shows the ring style setting.

= loud ring

= soft ring

= vibrate

= vibrate and ring

= silent

10. Battery Level Indicator

Vertical bars show the battery charge level. Recharge the battery when **Low Battery** displays and the battery alert sounds.


Using the 5-Way Navigation Key

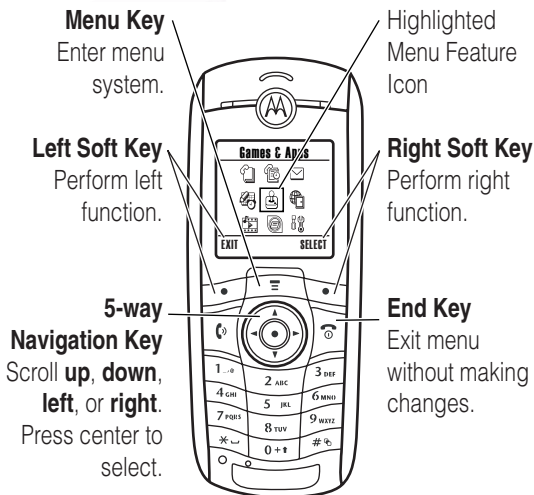
Use the 5-way navigation key (⬇️) to scroll up, down, left, or right through the menu system, highlight menu items, change feature settings, and play games. Press the center select button to select a highlighted menu item.

Using Menus




From the home screen, press  to enter the main menu.



Press  to scroll to and highlight a menu feature icon in the main menu. The following icons represent features that may appear in the main menu, depending on your service provider and service subscription options.

Selecting a Menu Feature


To select a menu feature, starting from the home screen:

Find the Feature  > **Recent Calls** > **Dialed Calls**


This example shows that from the home screen, you must press , scroll to and select  **Recent Calls** from the main menu, then scroll to and select **Dialed Calls**. Press  to scroll, and the left/right soft keys to select the functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

Selecting a Feature Option

Some features require you to select an option from a list:



Press the **BACK** key to go back to previous screen.

Press  to open sub-menu.

Highlighted Option

Press the **VIEW** key view details of highlighted option.

Press **⬅** to scroll up or down to highlight the option you want.

- In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight the option.
- In an alphabetized list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list option.

When an option displays a list of possible values, press **⬅** left or right to scroll through and select a value.

When an option displays a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.



Entering Text

Some features require you to enter information.

Press **⬇** to scroll down to other options.

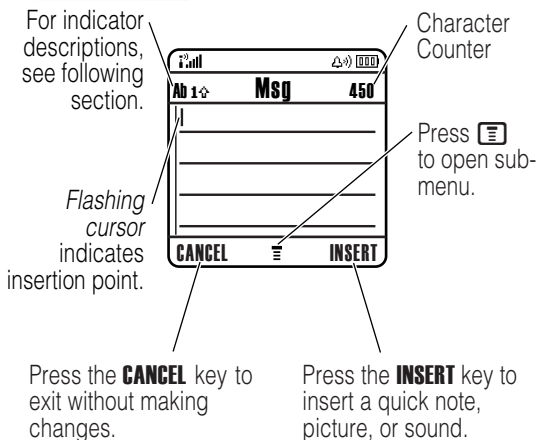
Press the **CANCEL** key to go back to previous screen.

Highlighted Option


Press the **CHANGE** key to view details of highlighted option.

The message center lets you compose and send text messages. A *Character Counter* indicates how many more characters will fit in a message.




Choosing a Text Entry Mode

Multiple text entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The method you select remains active until you select another method.

Press  in any text entry screen to select one of the following entry modes:

- | | |

| Primary | The primary text entry mode (see below to set). |
| Numeric | Enter numbers only (see page 31). |

Symbol	Enter symbols only (see page 31).
Secondary	The secondary text entry mode (see below to set).


Alternatively, you can select a text entry mode in any text entry screen by pressing  > **Entry Mode**.

Setting Up a Text Entry Mode

Press  > **Entry Setup** from any text entry screen. Select **Primary Setup** or **Secondary Setup**, and choose:

ITAP	Let the phone predict each word as you press keys (see page 29).
Tap	Enter letters and numbers by pressing a key one or more times.
Tap Extended	Enter letters, numbers, and symbols by pressing a key one or more times.
None	Hide the Secondary setting (available only for Secondary Setup).

Using Capitalization

Press  in any text entry screen to change text case. The following indicators show capitalization status:

abc = no capital letters	Abc = capitalize next letter only
ABC = all capital letters	



Text Entry Mode Indicators

When you select the **Primary** or **Secondary** text entry mode, the following indicators identify the text entry setting:

Primary	Secondary	Description
1	2	Tap, no capital letters
1↑	2↑	Tap, capitalize next letter only
1↑	2↑	Tap, all capital letters
1☐	2☐	iTAP, no capital letters
1☐↑	2☐↑	iTAP, capitalize next letter only

The following indicators identify **Numeric** or **Symbol** entry mode:


12 = numeric method @ = symbol method

Using Tap Method

This is the standard method for entering text on your phone.

Tap method cycles through the letters and number of the key you press. Tap Extended method also cycles through additional symbols as shown in the chart on page 28.

Press	To
1 A keypad key one or more times	select a letter, number, or symbol
2 keypad keys	enter remaining characters
	Tip: Press  right to accept a word completion, or  to insert a space.
3 OK key	store the text

In a text entry screen, you can press  to switch entry modes. If **Tap** or **Tap Extended** is not available as the **Primary** or **Secondary** entry mode, see page 25.

When you enter text with **Tap** or **Tap Extended** method, the soft key functions change.

Character displays at insertion point.

After 2 seconds, character is accepted and cursor moves to next position.

Press the **DELETE** key to delete character to left of insertion point.

Press the **OK** key to accept and store text.



When you enter 3 or more characters in a row, your phone may guess the rest of the word. For example, if you enter **prog** you might see:

Character displays at insertion point.





Press  to accept **program**, or press  to reject it and enter a space after **prog**.


If you want a different word (such as **progress**), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

Tap Method Text Entry Rules

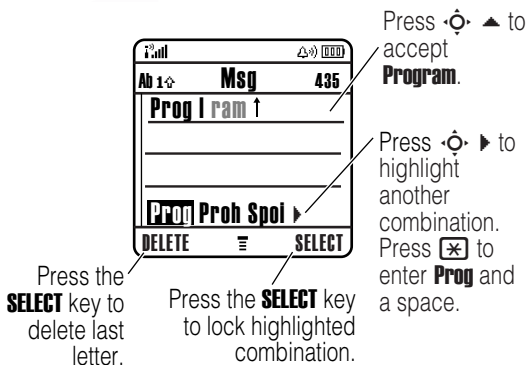
- Press a keypad key repeatedly to cycle through its characters.
- Press  left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a text message.
- The first character of every sentence is capitalized. If necessary, press  down to force the character to lowercase before the cursor moves to the next position.
- If you enter or edit information and do not want to save the changes, press  to exit without saving.

Using iTAP™ Method

iTAP™ software provides a predictive text entry mode that lets you enter a word using one keypress per letter. This can be faster than **Tap** method, because your phone combines the keypresses into common words.



For example, if you press **7 7 6 4**, letter combinations that match your keypresses display:



If you want a different word (such as **Progress**), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

Entering Words

In a text entry screen, you can press **#** to switch entry modes. An indicator shows which method is active (see page 26). If **ITAP** method is not available as the **Primary** or **Secondary** entry mode, see page 25.

Press	To
1 keypad keys (one press per letter)	show possible letter combinations at the bottom of the display
2 ⬅ left or right	highlight the combination you want

Press**3 SELECT** key**To**

lock a highlighted combination

You can press keypad keys to add more letters to the end of the combination.

or



enter the highlighted combination when it spells a word

A space is automatically inserted after the word.



If you enter a word your phone does not recognize, the phone stores it to use as one of your word options. When you fill memory space for unrecognized words, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new words.

Using Numeric Method

In a text entry screen, press to switch entry modes until the 12 (numeric) indicator displays.

Press keypad keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press to switch to another entry mode.

Using Symbol Method

In a text entry screen, press to switch entry modes until the @ (symbol) indicator displays.

1 keypad keys (one press per symbol)	show possible symbol combinations at the bottom of the display
2 ◂◃ left or right	highlight the combination you want
3 SELECT key	lock a highlighted combination You can press keypad keys to add more symbols to the end of the combination.
or ✖	enter the highlighted combination

Deleting Letters and Words

Place the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, and then:

Action

Press the **DELETE** key to delete one letter at a time.

Hold the **DELETE** key to delete the entire message.

Using the Push to Talk (PTT) Key

Press the Push to Talk (PTT) key to access the PTT menus, contacts, groups, and settings. For details, see page 57.



Using the Handsfree Speaker

When you activate your phone's integrated handsfree speaker, you can talk to the other party without holding the phone to your ear.

Press the **SPEAKER** key to turn the handsfree speaker on or off during a call.

When you turn the handsfree speaker on, your phone displays **Speaker On** in the home screen. The handsfree speaker remains on until you press the **SPEAKER** key again or turn the phone off.

Note: The handsfree speaker is disabled when you connect your phone to a handsfree car kit or headset accessory.

Changing a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset these codes before you receive your phone.

If your service provider has not reset these codes, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.

You can also reset your SIM card PIN code, PIN2 code, and/or call barring password if necessary.

To change a code or password:



Find the Feature



> **Settings** > **Security**
> **New Passwords**

Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, but you must unlock it to answer.

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked (see page 48).



Locking Your Phone Manually

Find the Feature



> **Settings** > **Security**
> **Phone Lock** > **Lock Now**

Press	To
1 keypad keys	enter your unlock code
2 OK key	lock the phone

Unlocking Your Phone

Your phone's unlock code is originally set to 1234. Your service provider may reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number.

At the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:

Press	To
1 keypad keys	enter your unlock code
2 OK key	unlock your phone

Setting Your Phone to Lock Automatically

You can set your phone to lock every time you turn it off:

Find the Feature



> **Settings** > **Security**
 > **Phone Lock**
 > **Automatic Lock** > **On**


Press	To
1 keypad keys	enter your unlock code
2 OK key	activate automatic lock

If You Forget a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number before you receive your phone.

If you forget your unlock code, try entering 1234 or the last 4 digits of your phone number. If that does not work, at the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:




Press	To
1 	display the unlock code bypass screen
2 keypad keys	enter your security code
3 OK key	submit your security code

If you forget your security code, SIM card PIN code, PIN2 code, or call barring password, contact your service provider.

Locking and Unlocking the Keypad

You can lock the keypad to prevent accidental key presses (for example, when carrying your phone in a purse or pocket).

Tip: This feature also locks the PTT key so you do not accidentally start a PTT call.

Press	To
	lock or unlock the keypad

Note: Incoming phone calls and messages unlock the keypad. Incoming PTT calls **do not** unlock the keypad.

Using the Phonebook

This section briefly describes basic phonebook operations. For more information about using the phonebook, see page 70.



Shortcut: To open your phonebook from the home screen, press **⬆** up or down.

Storing a Phone Number

Enter a phone number in the home screen, then press the **STORE** key to create a phonebook entry with that number. Fill in the other fields to complete the entry.

Select **MORE** to store another number (for example, a work number) for the same **Name**.



Recording a Voice Name

Note: This option is not available for entries stored on the SIM card.

When creating a phonebook entry, scroll to **Voice Name** and press the **RECORD** key. When you are ready, press the **RECORD** key again and say the entry's name (within 2 seconds). When prompted, press the **RECORD** key and repeat the name. Press the **DONE** key to store the voice name.

Storing a Picture for Caller ID





Note: This option is not available for entries stored on the SIM card.

You can store a picture for a phonebook entry. The picture displays when you receive calls from the entry.

When creating a phonebook entry, scroll to **Picture** and press the **CHANGE** key. Press **⬆** to select a picture, and press the **SELECT** key to store it for the entry.




Dialing a Number

Press  > **Phonebook** > *entry to call* .



Tip: To quickly highlight entries in your **Phonebook** list: If your entries are sorted by **Speed No.**, press an entry's speed number to highlight it. For example, press   for entry number 15. If your entries are sorted by **Name**, **Voice Name**, or **Email**, enter the first letter of the entry's name to highlight it. For example, press   for the first entry that starts with "K".

Voice Dialing a Number

Press  > **Office Tools**, press **Dialing Services** > **Voice Dial**, and say the entry's name (within 2 seconds).

Tip: To create a shortcut to **Voice Dial**, press  > **Office Tools** > **Dialing Services**, scroll to **Voice Dial**, and hold the . Your phone prompts you to save the shortcut. To use a shortcut, press  and the shortcut key number.

Sorting Phonebook Entries

Press  > **Phonebook**, press  > **Setup** > **Sort by**, then select whether you want to sort the phonebook list by **Name**, **Speed No.**, **Voice Name**, or **Email**.

When sorting by name, you can view **All** numbers or just the **Primary** number for each name. To set the primary number for a name, see page 72.

Viewing Entries By Category

Press  > **Phonebook**, press  > **Categories**, then select whether you want to view **All** entries, entries in a predefined



category (**Business, Personal, General, VIPs**), or entries in a category you created.

To set the category for a phonebook entry, see page 72.



Setting Up Your Phone

Storing Your Name and Phone Number



To store or edit your name and phone number information on your SIM card:

Find the Feature



> **Settings** > **Phone Status**
> **My Tel. Numbers**

Shortcut: Press from the home screen to edit your name and phone number.

If you do not know your phone number, contact your service provider.

Setting the Time and Date

Your phone uses the time and date for the **Datebook**. Your phone can synchronize its time and date with the network:

Find the Feature



> **Settings** > **Initial Setup**
> **Time and Date** > **Autoupdate**
> **On**

To set the time and date manually, set **Autoupdate** to **Off** and then set the **Time** and **Date** options:



Find the Feature



- > **Settings** > **Initial Setup**
- > **Time and Date**
- > **Time** or **Date**

Setting a Ring Style

Your phone rings or vibrates to notify you of an incoming call or other event. This ring or vibration is called an **alert**.

You can select one of five different ring styles. The ring style indicator in the display shows the current ring style (see page 17).

Setting a Wallpaper Image

You can set a picture or animation as a wallpaper (background) image in your phone's home screen. The

The screen saver image displays when the phone is on and no activity is detected for a specified time. The image shrinks to fill the display, if necessary. An animation repeats for one minute, then the first frame of the animation displays.

Calling line identification (Caller ID) displays the phone number for incoming calls in your phone's display.

The phone displays the caller's name (and picture, if available) when the name is stored in your phonebook, or **Incoming Call** when caller ID information is not available.

You can also set your phone to play a distinctive ringer ID and/or light ID for specific entries stored in your phonebook. For more information, see page 71.

Outgoing Calls



You can show or hide your phone number as an ID for the calls that you make.

You can override the default caller ID setting when you make a call. While dialing (with digits visible in the display):

Canceling an Incoming Call

While the phone is ringing or vibrating:

Depending on your phone settings and/or service subscription, the call may be forwarded to another number, or the caller may hear a busy signal.


Calling an Emergency Number

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911, that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked or the SIM card is not inserted.


Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be



placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.


Press	To
1 keypad keys	dial the emergency number
2 	call the emergency number

Dialing International Numbers

Press and hold  to insert the local international access code (+) for the country from which you are calling.



Viewing Recent Calls

Your phone keeps lists of the calls you recently received and dialed, even if the calls did not connect. The lists are sorted from newest to oldest entries. The oldest entries are deleted as new entries are added.

Shortcut: Press  from the home screen to view the dialed calls list.

Push to Talk (PTT) Calls



Push to Talk (PTT) is a feature that lets you talk walkie-talkie style with other PTT subscribers. You can talk to one person or a group.

Tip: To prevent accidental PTT calls, you can lock your keypad by pressing   in the home screen.

To make a PTT call:

- Enter a PTT subscriber's phone number with the keypad. Then hold the PTT key and speak after the tone. For call details, see page 58.
- Select a stored PTT contact or group in your list of **PTT Contacts**, **PTT Groups**, **Dialed Calls** or **Received Calls**. Then hold the PTT key and speak after the tone. For call details, see page 58.

Storing PTT Contacts and Groups

You can store PTT **Contacts** to make one-to-one calls, or you can store PTT **Groups** to make group calls.

Store a Contact

Find the Feature

PTT key  > **Add**



Enter the contact's **Name** and phone number (**No.**), then press the **DONE** key. Your network stores the contact and your phone returns to the **PTT Contacts** list with the new contact displayed.

Store a Group

After you store PTT contacts, you can put the contacts in groups so that you can call a group of contacts at the same time.

Making PTT Calls

When  displays at the top of your home screen, you can make and receive PTT calls. To make a PTT call:





Action

1 Enter a PTT subscriber's phone number in your home screen.

or

Open your list of **PTT Contacts**, **PTT Groups**, **Dialed Calls**, or **Received Calls** and highlight a stored contact or group.


- To open **PTT Contacts**, press the PTT key.
- To open **PTT Groups**, press the PTT key and  > **PTT Groups**.
- To open **Dialed Calls** or **Received Calls**, press  > **Recent Calls** > **Dialed Calls** or **Received Calls**.

2 Press and hold the PTT key to make the call and speak. Speak after you hear the Connection to Speak tone.

3 Release the PTT key to let others speak.

To speak during a PTT call, hold the PTT key and speak after the Connection to Speak tone. If you speak before the Connection to Speak tone, part of your message may be lost.

If nobody speaks for 20 seconds, the call ends.


4 Press  to end the call.

Tip: To send a PTT Alert tone instead of a call, open the list of **PTT Contacts**, **Dialed Calls** or **Received Calls**, highlight a PTT contact, and press the **ALERT** key. The contact receives a tone, and they can speak first. If they do not respond, the call ends. You cannot send alert tones to groups.



Answering PTT Calls

When you receive a PTT call, the Announce Call tone sounds followed by conversation from the caller.

- **To speak** when the caller releases their PTT key, hold your PTT key and speak after the Connection to Speak tone. Only one person can speak at a time.
- **To end the call**, press .

Tip: If you receive a PTT Alert tone, press the **ANSWER** key, press the PTT key, and speak after the tone. You can also press the **IGNORE** key when you receive a PTT Alert tone cancel the call.

Note: Your phone displays **Missed Call** if you miss a PPT Alert, but not if you miss a standard PPT call.
