





SIM card

Caution: Don't bend or scratch your SIM card. Keep it away from static electricity, water, and dirt.

Your Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card contains personal information like your phone number and phonebook entries. It can also contain your voicemail, text message, and Internet access settings. If you put your SIM card in another phone, that phone uses your phone number.

Insert the SIM card with the gold plate facing down and the notch in the upper right corner as shown:



battery

battery installation

1 Pull the release button down and hold it there while you lift up the battery door.



2





battery charging

New batteries are not fully charged. Plug the battery charger into your phone and an electrical outlet. Your phone might take several



seconds to start charging the battery. Your display shows **Charge Complete** when finished.

Tip: Relax, you can't overcharge your battery. It will perform best after you fully charge and discharge it a few times.

Note: You can charge your battery by connecting a cable from your phone's mini-USB port to a USB port on a computer. Both your phone and the computer must be turned on, and your computer must have the correct

software drivers installed. Cables and software drivers are available in Motorola Original data kits, sold separately.

battery tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, features, and accessories you use.

- Always use Motorola Original batteries and chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.

- When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.



Contact your local recycling center for proper battery disposal.

Warning: Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.

turn it on & off

Caution: Some phones ask for your SIM card PIN code when you turn them on. If you enter an incorrect PIN code three times before the correct code, your SIM card is disabled, and your display shows **SIM Blocked**. Contact your service provider.

To turn on your phone, press and hold of for a few seconds or until the display lights up. If



prompted, enter your four-digit SIM card PIN code and/or four-digit unlock code.

To turn off your phone, press and hold for two seconds.

make a call

Enter a phone number and press ① to make a call.

To "hang up," press .

answer a call

When your phone rings and/or vibrates, just press to answer.

To "hang up," press 💿.

store a phone number in the contact list

You can store a phone number in your **Contacts** list.

Note: You can store a contact in phone memory or on your SIM card. You can't set a

picture ID or special alerts for contacts stored on the SIM card. To change your default save location to phone, SIM card, or both, see page 63.

- 1 Enter a phone number in the home screen.
- 2 Press the Save key.
- 3 Enter a name for the phone number, and specify the number type if necessary. To select a highlighted item, press the navigation key in •
- 4 Press the Save key to store the contact.

To edit or store additional information about the contact, see page 64. To delete a contact, see page 67.

call a stored phone number

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > Contacts

- 1 Scroll to the contact.
 - **Shortcut:** In the contact list, press keypad keys to enter the first letters of the contact you want. Press the *navigation key in* to go to the contact.
- 2 Press (1) to call the contact.

your phone number

To see your phone number from the home screen, press the Main Menu key > \ Settings > Call Settings > My SIM Number.

To see your phone number while you're on a call, press the **Options** key > **My Telephone Number**.

To store or edit your name and phone number on your SIM card, select the field you want to edit. If you don't know your phone number, contact your service provider.

main attractions

You can do much more with your phone than make and receive calls!

audio player

load music files on your computer

To load music on your phone, you need to have a digital music library on your computer. Here is how to create a digital music library on your computer:

Insert a music CD in your computer's CD drive.

- 2 Launch your computer's music player program (such as Windows® Media Player).
- 3 Copy the music CD to your media player program's library (also called *ripping* the CD).

If your computer is connected to the Internet when you insert your music CD, the music player program may retrieve data about the Album such as Song Titles, Album name, Artist name, and Album art work. This data can be edited or entered manually by using your computer's music player application. This data will be displayed in your phone's audio player.

load music files on your phone

To transfer your music from your computer's digital music library to your phone and its SD memory card, see page 25. To download songs from the Web, see page 81. For a list of the file formats your phone can play, see page 26.

Note: Your SD memory card is formatted with FAT16 and has limits on how many files/folders you can store at the top level. We recommend that you create a folder on your SD card and then store your files inside that folder.

play music files

Your phone can play and store audio files (for a list of formats, see page 26). You can use a removable SD memory card with your phone to store more songs (see page 23).

Note: You can use any stereo headset with a 3.5 mm plug. For best performance, use a Motorola Original headset or a headset with an impedance rating between 16-32 ohm.

Find it: Press . Then, press . up or down to scroll to an option, and press the *navigation key in* . to select the option:

All	Show and play individual songs.	
	Note: All of your phone's songs appear in the All list. Some songs may not have any Artist, Album, or Genre information stored, so they don't appear in those lists.

You can control playback with the keys on the left side of your phone, or with your navigation key.



Press • up to play or pause. Press • down to stop. Press • right or left to go forward or back.

If you receive a call during a song, the song pauses until the call is over. You can hear the call through your headphones and speak into the microphone on your phone (or the microphone on your headphones, if available).

During a song, you can press the **Options** key to show these options:

options	
Hide	Hide the audio player while music plays. To see the audio player again, press �� up. To stop the hidden audio player, press ②.
Manage	Show song Properties , such as the file name, type, and size.
Delete	Delete the song. This does not appear for preloaded items.

options	
Send to	Attach the song to a message, copy it to your memory card, or send it over a Bluetooth™ connection.
Apply to	Add the song to a playlist or make it a ringtone.
Setup	Customize settings (see page 20).

During a song, the music player shows the song Title, Artist, Album, and Artwork if available. To see a larger image of the **Artwork**, press the *navigation key in* • (press it again to return to the media player).

add music files to a playlist

Find it: Press ①. Then, press �� up or down to scroll to a folder (such as All), and press the navigation key in �� to open the folder:

1 Scroll to a song you want to add to the playlist.

Tip: To select multiple songs for the list, press the **Options** key and select **Select Multiple.** Your phone shows a song list where you can scroll to songs you want to add and press the *navigation key in* ⋅♠ to select them.

- 2 Press the Options key and select Apply to > Playlist. Your phone shows a list of playlists.
- 3 Scroll to an existing playlist.

To create a new playlist, press the **Options** key and select **New Playlist**. Enter a name for the playlist and press the **OK** key.

- 4 Press the Apply key.
- 5 Repeat the procedure to add more songs, or press the **Back** key to return to the menu.

To hear a playlist, press > Playlists. Scroll to the playlist, press the Options key, and select Play.

customize audio player

Find it: Press , press the Options key, and select Setup. You can change:

Shuffle	Play songs in a random order.
Equalizer	Choose a setting (such as Techno
	or Reggae) to customize sound.

options	
End Call	If you receive a call during a song, the song pauses. When the call is done, this setting makes the song resume playing (Auto-Play) or stay paused (Pause).
Auto - Repeat	Repeats a song or playlist until you stop the player.
Stereo Effect Settings	Set Spatial Audio and Bass Boost to customize sound.
Internet Connection	Choose the Internet connection profile for the New Ringtone link on the II menu.

If you highlight a song in a song list and press the **Options** key, you may also see options for the song and list such as **Delete**, **Rename**, **Send to**, **Apply to**, and **Sort by**.

FM radio

To listen to an FM radio station on your phone, you must plug in a headset. Then:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > Multimedia > FM Radio.



Note: You can use any stereo headset with a 3.5 mm plug. For best performance, use a Motorola Original headset or a headset with an impedance rating between 16-32 ohm.

Press the **Options** key for these options:

Hide	Hide the radio display while it is on. To see the radio display again, press the navigation key in • up. To stop the hidden radio, press ①.	
Mute / Unmute	Mute or unmute the radio.	
Switch to Speaker	Switch sound to your phone speaker.	
Switch Bands	Switch to FM1, FM2, or FM3. Each band stores presets 1-9.	

options	
Scan	Briefly hear each station your phone can receive. Press the navigation key in • to stop the scan.
Scan Presets	Briefly hear each station stored as a preset. Press the navigation key in •• to stop the scan.
Presets List	See the list of preset stations for the current band. Press the Options key to tune, store, rename, or clear presets.

To turn off the radio, press in the radio display.

airplane mode

Airplane mode turns off your phone's Bluetooth™ and calling features in locations where wireless phone use is prohibited. You can use the phone's music player and other non-calling features in airplane mode.

To set airplane mode:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 3\% Settings > Profiles > Airplane Mode

When airplane mode is active, the airplane mode indicator → shows in the top left corner of the display. To reactivate your phones calling features, return to the **Profiles** menu and select a different profile.

memory card

You can use a removable SD memory card with your phone to store and



retrieve multimedia objects (such as photos and sounds). Your phone can use SD cards with up to a 2 GB capacity.

Note: If you download a copyrighted file and store it on your memory card, you can use the file only while your memory card is inserted in your phone. You cannot send, copy, or change copyrighted files.

install a memory card

Caution: Don't bend or scratch your memory card. Keep it away from static electricity, water, and dirt.

Open the memory card door and press the SD memory card into its slot until it clicks into place.



your memory card while your phone is using or writing files on it.

To remove the memory card, push the card in until it clicks. It begins to slide out, and you can slide it the rest of the way out.

see memory card contents

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > Multimedia > Media Finder.

Note: If your phone does not prompt you to refresh the list, press the **Options** key > **Refresh**.

To see only the files stored on your memory card, press the Main Menu key > 3 Office Tools > File Manager, then choose the memory card icon (\blacksquare).

Tip: Is your phone not seeing your memory card? Try turning your phone off, then on again. Then, return to the **File Manager** list.

copy files from the phone to the memory card

You can copy files (such as pictures and photos, video clips, and sound files) from your phone to the memory card.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > Office Tools > File Manager.

- 1 Select a folder and scroll to the file you want to copy.
- Press the Options key > Send to > Memory Card.
 Note: The Send to option does not appear if the highlighted file is copyright-protected. The Memory Card option does not appear if your phone does not find a memory card installed

Tip: Did your phone not find the memory card you installed? Try turning your phone off, then on again. Then, try to copy the file again.

connect the memory card to a computer

You can connect your phone to a computer to transfer files to and from the memory card.

Note: When your phone is connected to a computer, you can access the memory card only through the computer.

On your phone:

Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > Connections > USB Settings > Memory Card. The Memory Card option might already be selected.

This directs the USB connection to your memory card. Attach the Motorola Original USB cable to the accessory port on your phone and to an available USB port on your computer. Then follow these steps:

On your computer:

- 1 Find where your phone's memory card displays as a "Removable Disk" icon. On a PC this is the "My Computer" window. On a Mac it's on the desktop.
- 2 Double-click the "Removable Disk" icon to access the files on your phone's memory card.
- **3** To store the desired files onto the memory card, drag and drop them onto the removable disk drive icon.
- **4** When you finish, remove the phone with memory card safely from your computer:

If you are using a PC, right-click the "Safely Remove Hardware" icon in the system tray at the bottom of your computer screen. Then select "USB Mass Storage Device".

If you are using a Mac, select and drag the "Removable Disk" icon to the "Trash."

Real Audio + video: video up to 296 Kbps, 320 x 240, 15 fps., 44 kHz, stereo audio in .rm, .rmvb file formats.

voice commands

You can use voice commands to make calls, open phone applications, and perform basic phone functions.

Note: Not all phone languages support voice recognition and voice commands.

voice dial a call

You can dial an entry in your contacts list by speaking the entry's name, or dial any phone number by speaking its digits.

Tip: Speak numbers at a normal speed and volume, pronouncing each digit distinctly. Avoid pausing between digits.

1 Press and release • on the right side of your phone.

Your phone prompts you to say a command or name.

2 Say the name of an entry in your contacts list. Your phone confirms the name and makes the call.

or

Say "Dial Number." Your phone prompts you to speak the digits in the phone

number, confirms the number, and makes the call.

Notes:

- If your phone recognizes the name or number, it shows it in the display and repeats it back to you. Say "Yes" to call, or say "No" and say another name or number.
- If your phone doesn't recognize the name or number, it doesn't make the call.

If your phone shows a list of similar names or numbers, you can select a name or number manually by scrolling to it and pressing the navigation key in ••.

voice activate phone functions

You can use voice commands to open some applications (for example, "Open Camera") or perform many basic phone functions (for example, "Check Battery"). Press and release to see a complete list of voice commands.

To perform a voice command:

- 1 Press and release on the right side of your phone. Your phone prompts you to say a command or name.
- 2 Say the command. If your phone recognizes the command, it performs the command.

talking phone

You can set your phone to recite incoming caller ID information, read the names of menu features or entries on your contacts list, read

messages you receive, and provide audio feedback for other phone functions.


Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > Phone Settings > Talking Phone

Shortcut: Press and release ● on the right side of your phone, then say "Talking Phone."

photos

take a photo

Press to see the camera viewfinder.



Tip: To take photos in low-light settings, press the **Options** key > **Flash** > *flash* option to use the built-in flash.

- 1 Point the camera lens at the photo subject.
- 2 Press the *navigation key in* to take a photo.
- 3 Press the Send key to send the photo in a multimedia message.

or

Press the Options key to select another option: Save Only, Discard, Send To, Apply To, or Edit.

To see a picture you saved, press the Main Menu key > 26 Office Tools > File Manager > Pictures.

Note: You can't assign a photo to a phonebook entry stored on the SIM card.



video clips

record a video clip

Press the Main Menu key > Multimedia > Video Camera to see the video camera viewfinder.



Note: You can zoom only before you start recording.

Tip: If you want to send your video in an MMS message, the video length must be set to **MMS Short** or **MMS Long**. To set length, press the **Options** key > **Camera Settings** > **Video Settings** > **Video Length**.

- 1 Point the camera lens at the video subject.
- 2 Press the *navigation key in* ♠ to begin video recording.
- **3** Press the **Stop** key to stop video recording.
- **4** Press the **Send** key to send the video clip in a multimedia message.

or





Bluetooth™ wireless

Your phone supports Bluetooth wireless connections. You can connect your phone with a Bluetooth headset or car kit to make handsfree calls. You can connect your phone with a phone or computer that supports Bluetooth connections to exchange files.

For maximum Bluetooth security, you should always connect Bluetooth devices in a safe, private environment.

turn Bluetooth power on or off

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 3% Settings > Connections > Bluetooth, press the Options key > Manage > Setup Bluetooth > Bluetooth Power > On

Note: To extend battery life, use this procedure to set Bluetooth power to **Off** when not in use. Your phone will not connect to another device until you set Bluetooth power back to **On** and connect your phone to the device again.

use a headset or handsfree car kit

Before you try to connect your phone to a handsfree device, make sure the device is on and ready in pairing or bonding mode (see the user's guide for the device). You can connect your phone with only one device at a time.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8 Settings

- > Connections > Bluetooth, press the Options key
- > Search For Devices > Headset

Your phone lists the devices it finds within range.

- 1 Scroll to a device in the list.
- 2 Press the Options key > Manage
 - > Bond With Device to connect to the device.

Your phone automatically uses **0000** as the passkey to bond with the device. If **0000** does not work, your phone prompts you to enter the device's passkey.

When your phone is connected, the Bluetooth indicator **3** shows in the display.

Shortcut: When Bluetooth power is on, your phone can automatically connect to a handsfree device you have used before. Just turn on the device and move it near the phone.

copy files to another device

You can copy a photo, picture, video clip, sound file, phonebook entry, datebook event, or bookmark to another phone or computer that supports Bluetooth connections.

Note: You can't copy some copyrighted objects.

Before you try to copy a file to another device, make sure the receiving device is **on** and **ready** in discoverable mode.

- On your phone, scroll to the object that you want to copy to the other device.
- 2 Press the Options key, then select:
 - Send To > Bluetooth for a photo, picture, video clip, or sound file.
 - Send Contact Via > Bluetooth for a phonebook entry.

- Share Event Via > Bluetooth for a datebook event.
- Share Page Via > Bluetooth for a bookmark.
- 3 Select a recognized device name, or [Search For All Devices] to search for an unrecognized device where you want to copy the object.

Note: Once you connect your phone to a Bluetooth device, that device can start a similar Bluetooth connection with your phone. Your display shows the Bluetooth indicator when there is a Bluetooth connection.

receive files from another device

Before you try to receive a file from another device, make sure your phone's Bluetooth power is **on** (see page 33). For a list

of file formats that work on your phone, see page 26.

- 1 Place your phone near the device, and send the file from the device.
 - If your phone and the sending device don't recognize each other, place your phone in discoverable mode so the sending device can locate it. Press the Main Menu key > % Settings > Connections
 - > Bluetooth, press the Options key
 - > Find My Device
- 2 Press the Accept key to accept a file from another device. Your phone notifies you when file transfer is complete, and saves the file.

send a photo to a printer

You can send a photo to a printer that supports Bluetooth connections.

Note: You can print 4×6 or 8.5×11 size pages. To print another size, copy the object to a linked computer and print it from there.

- On your phone, take a new photo or scroll to a stored photo that you want to print, then press the Options key > Send To > Printer.
 - **Note:** If you see **Service Not Supported** when you try to print, select **Send To** > **Bluetooth** instead. Always use this option to print 4x6 photos.
- 2 Select a recognized printer name, or [Search For All Devices] to search for an unrecognized printer where you want to send the object.
- **3** If available, modify print options.

If no SyncML profile is stored on your phone, the phone prompts you to create a profile. Contact your synchronization service provider and phone network service provider to obtain the information you need to set up a profile.

Note: If your phone cannot connect to the server, verify that your phone's network

service provider has data service activated on your account (additional fees may apply for this service).

tethered sync

You can connect your phone and PC using a Bluetooth™ wireless connection (see page 33) or a Motorola Original USB cable connected to your phone and PC.



Before you use a USB cable to sync your phone, set Modem as your USB default connection: Press the Main Menu key > \$\mathbb{S}\$ Settings > Connections > Modem.







Press • up, down, left, or right in the home screen to open basic features. You can show or hide icons for these features in the home screen, and change the icons that are shown (for more information about changing icons in the home screen, see page 72).

Status indicators can show at the top of the home screen:



Signal Strength/Airplane Mode Indicator – Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You can't make or receive calls when the no signal indicator ♥ or airplane mode indicator ➤ shows. The roam indicator (♦ or ऺऻ) shows when your phone is seeking or using a network outside your home network.

2 GPRS Indicator – Shows when your phone is using a high-speed General Packet Radio Service (GPRS) network connection. Indicators can include:



text entry

Some features let you enter text. You can use several different text entry modes.

Press # to select a text entry mode.



Press the **Options** key to change text entry options.

To change your text entry mode options, press the Main Menu key > %% Settings > Phone Settings > Text Entry.

Change text case (° *): Press ① in a text entry screen to change text case to all capital letters (*), next letter capitalized (°), or next letter lowercase (no symbol). Your phone capitalizes the first letter of each sentence, unless you press ① to choose next letter lowercase

Set text prediction and completion (**pi**): Your phone can learn the words you enter, to improve text prediction and completion. In a

text entry display, press the Options key > Text Entry > Set Text Prediction > Learn My Words. If Learn My Words is active, you can also activate Offer Completion so that your phone guesses the rest of a word when you enter the first three letters. Your phone shows when Learn My Words is active and when Offer Completion is also active.

Enter punctuation: Press 1 to enter punctuation or other characters.


Edit or delete text: To edit text, press · • to position the cursor to the right of text you want to edit. Press the *clear key* • to delete the character to the left of the cursor. Hold the *clear key* • to delete the word to the left of the cursor.

word mode

Press # in a text entry screen to switch to "word" predictive text entry mode. Your phone shows in the display.

Word mode lets you enter words using one keypress per letter. The phone combines your keypresses into common words, and predicts each word as you enter it.

For example, if you press 7 7 6 4, your display shows:



Press • • to move the flashing cursor.

Tip: When you are entering a word, hold the •**ô**• **down** (not **in**) to open a list of word options.


abc mode

Press # in a text entry screen to switch to "abc" text entry mode. Your phone shows

Ab in the display.

To enter text, press a keypad key repeatedly to cycle through the letters and number on the key. Repeat this step to enter each letter.

After two seconds, character is accepted and cursor moves to next position.

Press • to move the flashing cursor.

numeric mode

Press # in a text entry screen until you see 123. Press the number keys to enter the numbers you want.

Tip: Just need one number? To enter a number quickly, press and hold a number key until the number appears.

symbol mode

Press # in a text entry screen until you see @. The display shows the symbol associated with each keypad key. Press • up or down to see different symbols, or scroll to one you want. To insert a symbol, press its key, or scroll to it and press the navigation key in • •

volume

Press the volume keys to:

- turn off an incoming call alert +→
- change the speaker volume when playing a song or video clip
- change the earpiece volume during a call
- change the ring profile from the home screen

Tip: Sometimes silence really is golden. That's why you can quickly set your ringer to **Vibrate** by holding # in the home screen. Hold # again to return to your last ring profile. To set the ringer from the menu, see page 50.

handsfree speaker

You can use your phone's handsfree speaker to make calls without holding the phone to your ear.

During a call, press the **Options** key > **Speaker On** to turn the handsfree speaker on. Your display shows the speakerphone indicator until you turn it off (press the **Options** key > **Speaker Off**) or end the call.

lock & unlock keypad

You can lock your keypad to prevent accidental key presses. Slide the keypad lock switch up to lock it, or down to unlock.



Note: When your keypad is locked, you can still **end calls** with the **1**, **make emergency calls**, or **answer** incoming

calls, alarms, and connection requests from other Bluetooth™ devices. If you answer a call, your keypad is active until the call ends.

lock & unlock phone

You can lock your phone to keep others from using it. To lock or unlock your phone, you need the four-digit unlock code.

To **manually lock** your phone: Press the **Main Menu** key > \$ **Settings** > **Security** > **Phone Lock** > **Lock Now**.

To **automatically lock** your phone whenever you turn it off: Press the **Main Menu** key > §§ Settings > Security > Phone Lock > Lock at Power On > On.

Note: You can make emergency calls on a locked phone (for more information, see page 58). A locked phone still rings or vibrates

for incoming calls or messages, **but you need to unlock it to answer**.

codes & passwords

Your phone's four-digit **unlock code** is originally set to **1234**. The six-digit **security code** is originally set to **000000**. If your service provider didn't change these codes, you should change them:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > #\$ Settings > Security > Change Passwords

You can also change your **SIM PIN** or call barring passwords.

If you forget your unlock code: At the unlock code prompt, try entering 1234 or the last four digits of your phone number. If that doesn't work, press # and enter your six-digit security code instead.

If you forget other codes: If you forget your security code, SIM PIN code, PIN2 code, or call barring password, contact your service provider.

customize

profiles

You can quickly change your phone's alert profile to match your activity, environment, or personal requirements. Each profile uses a different set of sounds or vibrations for incoming calls and other events. The profile indicator shows at the top of the home screen:

change alerts in a profile

You can change the alerts that a profiles uses to notify you of incoming calls and other events.

Note: You can't set an alert for the **Silent** profile, or change some settings for some profiles.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 3% Settings > Profiles, scroll to the profile, press the Options key > Edit

- 1 Scroll to the profile setting you want to change, then press the navigation key in ••.
- **2** Select the setting value you want.
- **3** Press the **Save** key to save your profile changes.

create a new profile

You can create a new ring style profile to set alerts for incoming calls and other events.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > Profiles, press the Options key > Create New Profile

time & date

Your phone needs to know the current time and date for the **Calendar**.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 3% Settings > Phone Settings > Time & Date

To enter your **time** or **date**, choose **Time** or **Date**.

To change your **time zone**, choose **Time Zone**, then select a city in your time zone.

themes

You can use themes to personalize the look and sound of your phone. A theme is a package of images and sound files associated with available alert and image settings on your phone. Most themes content a wallpaper and screensaver images and ringtones.

A phone theme is a group of images and sound files that you can apply to your phone. Most themes include a wallpaper image, screen saver image, and ring tones.

To **apply** a theme: Press the **Main Menu** key > **Settings** > **Themes** > *theme*.

modify a theme

You can change the images and sounds that a theme applies to your phone.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > Themes, scroll to the theme, press the Options key > Edit

- 1 Press · ♠ left or right to select the ♣ sounds menu or Images menu.
- 2 Press • up or down to scroll to the setting you want to change, then press the navigation key in • .

- 3 Scroll to the image or sound file you want, then select it.
- **4** Press the **Save** key to save your theme changes.

The **Wallpaper** appears as a background image in your home screen.

The **Screen Saver** shows in the display when no activity is detected for a specified time.

To **reset** a theme's default settings: Press the **Main Menu** key > 8% **Settings** > **Themes**, scroll to the theme, press the **Options** key > **Manage** > **Restore To Default**.

create a new theme

You can create a new theme that uses the images and sounds you specify.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 3% Settings > Themes, press the Options key > Create New or Create a Copy.

To **delete** a theme you created: Press the **Main Menu** key > **Settings** > **Themes**, scroll to the theme, press the **Options** key > **Manage** > **Delete**.

display appearance

To set your display **brightness**: Press the **Main Menu** key > **B Settings** > **Phone Settings** > **Display Settings** > **Brightness**.

To save battery life, the **backlight** can turn off when you're not using your phone. The backlight turns back on when you press any key. To set how long your phone waits before the backlight turns off:

Press the Main Menu key > #\$ Settings > Phone Settings > Display Settings > Backlight Timeout.

To save battery life, the **display** can turn off when you're not using your phone. The display turns back on when you press any key.

To set how long your phone waits before the display turns off:

Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > Phone Settings > Display Settings > Display Timeout.

To select the delay interval (period of inactivity) before the **screen saver** shows in the display:

Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings

- > Phone Settings > Display Settings
- > Screensaver Timeout.

Tip: This feature helps save your screen, but not your battery. To extend battery life, turn off the screen saver.

answer options

You can set your phone to answer incoming calls when you press any key (not just):

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > §% Settings > Call Settings > In-Call Setup > Answer Options > Any Key Answer



calls

To make and answer calls, see page 13.

turn off a call alert

Press the volume keys to turn off a call alert before answering the call.

recent calls

Your phone keeps lists of incoming and outgoing calls, even for calls that didn't connect. The most recent calls are listed first. The oldest calls are deleted as new calls are added.

Shortcut: Press ① from the home screen to see the Dialed Calls list, and press # to switch to Missed Calls, Answered Calls, and Recent Calls.



emergency calls

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911 or 112, that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked or the SIM card is not inserted.

Note: Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

- 1 Press the keypad keys to dial the emergency number.
- **2** Press to call the emergency number.

international calls




