



# Safety and General Information

This section contains important information on the safe and efficient operation of your mobile device. Read this information before using your mobile device.\*

# Exposure To Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

Your mobile device contains a transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your mobile device, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your mobile device transmits.

\* The information provided in this document supersedes the general safety information in user's guides published prior to September 1, 2005. Your Motorola mobile device is designed to comply with local regulatory requirements in your country concerning exposure of human beings to RF energy.

## **Operational Precautions**

For optimal mobile device performance and to be sure that human exposure to RF energy does not exceed the guidelines set forth in the relevant standards, always follow these instructions and precautions.

### External Antenna Care

If your mobile device has an external antenna, use only a Motorola-supplied or approved replacement antenna. Use of unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the mobile device and/or may result in your device not

complying with local regulatory requirements in your country.

DO NOT hold the external antenna when the mobile device is IN USE. Holding the external antenna affects call quality and may cause the mobile device to operate at a higher power level than needed.

## **Product Operation**

When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your mobile device just like you would a landline phone.

If you wear the mobile device on your body, always place the mobile device in a Motorola-supplied or approved clip, holder, holster, case, or body harness. If you do not use a body-worn accessory supplied or approved by Motorola, keep the mobile device and its antenna at least 2.5 centimeters (1 inch) from your body when transmitting.

When using any data feature of the mobile device, with or without an accessory cable, position the mobile device and its antenna at least 2.5 centimeters (1 inch) from your body.

Using accessories not supplied or approved by Motorola may cause your mobile device to exceed RF energy exposure guidelines. For a list of Motorola-supplied or approved accessories, visit our website at www.motorola.com.

# RF Energy Interference/Compatibility

Nearly every electronic device is subject to RF energy interference from external sources if inadequately shielded, designed, or otherwise configured for RF energy compatibility. In some circumstances your mobile device may cause interference with other devices.

This device complies with Part 15 of the FCC Rules. Operation is subject to the following two conditions: (1) this device may not cause harmful interference, and (2) this device must accept any interference received, including interference that may cause undesired operation.

# Follow Instructions to Avoid Interference Problems

Turn off your mobile device in any location where posted notices instruct you to do so. These locations include hospitals or health care facilities that may be using equipment that is sensitive to external RF energy.

In an aircraft, turn off your mobile device whenever instructed to do so by airline staff. If your mobile device offers an airplane mode or similar feature, consult airline staff about using it in flight.

### **Pacemakers**

If you have a pacemaker, consult your physician before using this device.

Persons with pacemakers should observe the following precautions:

 ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than 20 centimeters (8 inches) from your

- pacemaker when the mobile device is turned ON
- DO NOT carry the mobile device in the breast pocket.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.
- Turn OFF the mobile device immediately if you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place.

## **Hearing Aids**

Some digital mobile devices may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your hearing aid manufacturer or physician to discuss alternatives.

## Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical device, consult your physician or the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from RF energy.

## **Driving Precautions**

Check the laws and regulations on the use of mobile devices in the area where you drive. Always obey them.

When using your mobile device while driving, please:

- Give full attention to driving and to the road.
   Using a mobile device may be distracting.
   Discontinue a call if you can't concentrate on driving.
- Use handsfree operation, if available.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.

## **Operational Warnings**

## Automobile Air Bags

## Potentially Explosive Atmospheres

Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres are often but not always posted, and can include fueling areas such as below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, or areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders.

When you are in such an area, turn off your mobile device, and do not remove, install, or charge batteries. In such areas, sparks can occur and cause an explosion or fire.

## Damaged Products

If your mobile device or battery has been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use it until you take it to a Motorola Authorized Service Center. Do not attempt to dry it with an external heat source, such as a microwave oven.

## **Batteries and Chargers**

If jewelry, keys, beaded chains, or other conductive materials touch exposed battery terminals, this could complete an electrical circuit (short circuit), become very hot, and could cause damage or injury. Be careful when handling a charged battery, particularly when placing it inside a pocket, purse, or other container with metal objects. Use only Motorola Original <sup>™</sup> batteries and chargers.

## **Glass Parts**

Some parts of your mobile device may be made of glass. This glass could break if the product is dropped on a hard surface or receives a substantial impact. If glass breaks, do not touch or attempt to remove. Stop using your mobile device until the glass is replaced by a qualified service center.

## Seizures/Blackouts

Some people may be susceptible to epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, such as when playing video games. These may occur even if a person has never had a previous seizure or blackout.

If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult with your physician before playing video

games or enabling a flashing-lights feature (if available) on your mobile device.

Discontinue use and consult a physician if any of the following symptoms occur: convulsion, eye or muscle twitching, loss of awareness, involuntary movements, or disorientation. 
## SIM card

Your Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card contains personal information like your phone number and contacts list.

**Caution:** Don't bend or scratch your SIM card. Keep it away from static electricity, water, and dirt. Turn off your phone and remove the battery before you install or remove the SIM card.  If necessary, press in the battery door release latch and remove the battery door.



2 Hold the SIM card with the notch in the lower left corner and the gold plate facing down. Slide the SIM card under the metal clip and into the card slot as shown.



## battery

## battery tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, features, and accessories you use.

- Motorola Original batteries and chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.
- When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place.
- Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.

 It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.



Contact your local recycling center for proper battery disposal.

**Warning:** Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.

## battery charging

New batteries are not fully charged. Open the protective cover on your phone's mini-USB port, then insert the



battery charger plug into the phone as shown. Plug the other end into an electrical outlet.

Your phone might take several seconds to start charging the battery. The main display shows **Charge Complete** when finished.

**Tip:** Relax, you can't overcharge your battery. It will perform best after you fully charge and discharge it a few times.

Note: You can charge your battery by connecting a cable from your phone's mini-USB port to a USB port on a computer. Both your phone and the computer must be turned on, and your computer must have the correct software drivers installed. Cables and software drivers are available in Motorola Original data kits, sold separately.

## turn it on & off

**Caution:** Your phone may prompt you to enter your SIM card PIN code when you turn it on. If you enter an incorrect PIN code three times before the correct code, your SIM card is disabled, and your display shows **SIM Blocked**. Contact your service provider.

To turn on your phone, press and hold the power key for a few seconds or until the keypad or display lights up. If prompted, enter your eight-digit SIM card F



your eight-digit SIM card PIN code and/or four-digit unlock code.

To turn off your phone, press and hold for a few seconds.

## make a call

Enter a phone number and press the send key • to make a call.

**Tip:** If you make a mistake when entering a phone number, press the *clear/back key* to delete the character to the left of the cursor.

To "hang up," close the phone flip or press the end key .

**Note:** Closing the phone flip doesn't end a call when the handsfree speaker is turned on (for more information about the handsfree speaker, see page 62).

## answer a call

When your phone rings and/or vibrates, just open the phone flip or press the *send key* to answer.

To "hang up," close the phone flip or press the end key **a**.

**Note:** Closing the phone flip doesn't end a call when the handsfree speaker is turned on (for more information about the handsfree speaker, see page 62).

# store a phone number in the contact list

You can store a phone number in your list of **Contacts**.

**Note:** You can store a contact in phone memory or on your SIM card. You can't set a

picture ID or special alerts for contacts stored on the SIM card. To set storage location, see page 76.

- 1 Enter a phone number in the home screen.
- 2 Press the Save key.
- **3** Enter a name for the phone number, and specify the number type if necessary.
- **4** Press the **Save** key to store the contact.

To edit or store additional information about the contact, see page 77.

# call a stored phone number

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > Contacts.

- Scroll to the contact.
  - **Shortcut:** In the contacts list, press keypad keys to enter the first letters of the contact you want. Press the center key to go to the contact.
- 2 Press to call the contact.

# your phone number

To see your phone number from the home screen, press the Main Menu key > \ Settings > Call Settings > My SIM Number.

To see your phone number while you're on a call, press the **Options** key > **My Tel. Numbers**.

To store or edit your name and phone number on your SIM card, select the field you want to edit. If you don't know your phone number, contact your service provider.

# calls over a WiFi Internet connection

You can use your phone to make and receive calls over an Internet connection (instead of a cellular network connection). To use an Internet connection, you must connect to your service provider through a WiFi CERTIFIED® wireless connection to a network access point.

## WiFi setup wizard

When you power on your phone, the **WiFi Setup Wizard** application automatically launches to help you connect your phone to your home access point. Follow the on-screen prompts to set up a WiFi connection to the access point.

### available networks list

To see a list of available access points within range of your phone:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > WiFi > Available Networks.

Your phone lists available access points. The orange WiFi signal strength indicator **4** 

shows the strength of each WiFi connection. Other indicators can include:

★ = saved	Om = secure
network	access point
✓ = active  network  connection	

Scroll to the network access point you want to use, then press the **Options** key > **Connect**.

# create a secure network connection

To create and save a secure connection with a network access point:



Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > WiFi > EasyKeySetup.

- 1 If necessary, read the on-screen instructions and press **Next** to begin scanning for an access point.
- 2 If necessary, scroll to the network you want to secure, then press **Select**.
- When prompted by your phone, press the secure button on your access point.
- **4** On your phone, press **Continue**.

Your phone creates a secure connection with the network, and saves the network profile in the **Saved Networks** list.

**Note:** Your phone automatically connects to a network in the **Saved Networks** list when the phone is within range of the network access point.

## quick connect

To have your phone automatically locate and connect to an open (non-secure) network access point:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > WiFi > Quick Connect

Your phone connects to the network access point with the best signal strength within range of your phone. If the first connection fails, the phone connects to the next available network.

**Tip:** From the home screen, press the **Options** key > **Quick Connect** to connect to an open access point.

### saved networks list

To see the network connection profiles you've saved on your phone:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > WiFi > Saved Networks.

**Note:** Your phone automatically connects to a network in the **Saved Networks** list when the phone is within range of the network access point.

#### add network to list

To manually set up a network access point and add it to the list:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > WiFi > Add New Network > Enter Network Info.

You must enter the following configuration settings:

SSID	Enter the broadcast name that identifies the wireless access point.
Profile Name	Enter the name you want to use to identify the access point in the Saved Networks list.
Connection Setting	Set to Automatically Connect or Ask Before Connecting.

Non- Broadcast SSID	Select this option if the name of your access point is not being broadcast.
	<b>Tip:</b> Check the available networks list to see if the access point name is being broadcast.

## view or edit a network profile

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > WiFi > Saved Networks, scroll to the network, press the Options key > View Details or Edit Profile.

### send network profile

To send a network profile to another phone or PC in an SMS text message:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 3% Settings > WiFi > Saved Networks, scroll to the network, press the Options key > Send To.

### receive network profile

Your phone notifies you when you receive a network profile message from another phone or PC.

Press the **Options** key, then press **Save** to save the network profile to your **Saved Networks** list.

**Tip:** Press the **Options** key, then press **View** to see network details before you save the network profile to your phone.

## turn WiFi power on or off

Find it: Press the Main Menu key  $> \frac{8}{8}$  Settings > WiFi > WiFi Power On or WiFi Power Off.

**Note:** To extend battery life, use this procedure to turn off WiFi power when not in use.

## WiFi help

To learn more about the WiFi features on your phone:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > WiFi > WiFi Help.

# music player

Your phone can play music and audio files in a variety of formats (for a list of formats, see page 37). You can use a removable MicroSD memory card with your phone to store more songs (see page 34).

**Note:** Your phone can **not** play music or audio files that use *Digital Rights Management* (DRM) copy protection. Make sure the music files you load on your phone are not DRM-protected.

# load music files on your computer

To load music on your phone, you need to have a digital music library on your computer. To create a digital music library on your computer:

- Insert a music CD in your computer's CD drive.
- 2 Launch your computer's media player program (such as Windows™ Media Player).
- **3** Copy the music CD to the media player library (also called *ripping* the CD).

If your computer is connected to the Internet when you insert your music CD, the media player may retrieve data about the album, such as song titles, album name, artist name, and album artwork. You also can enter or edit data manually using the computer's media

player program. This data will display in your phone's music player.

## load music files on your phone

To transfer music from your computer's digital music library to your phone and its MicroSD memory card, see page 36. To download songs from the Web, see page 95. For a list of the file formats your phone can play, see page 37.

## play music files

Use the **Music and Sounds** application to play music on your phone.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > Multimedia > Media Finder > Music and Sounds > folder name.

Select a song or playlist from the following folders:

folders	
All	Show and play individual songs.
	<b>Note:</b> All of your phone's songs appear in the <b>All</b> list. Some songs may not have any <b>Artist</b> , <b>Album</b> , or <b>Genre</b> information stored, so they don't appear in those lists.
Playlists	Create or play a playlist of songs (see page 32).
Recently Played	See songs you recently played.
Albums	Select an album to show or play its songs.
Artists	Select an artist to show or play their songs.

folders	
Composers	Select a composer to show or play their songs.
Genres	Select a type of music to show or play songs.
Preloaded Ringtones	Show and play your standard ringtones.

**Tip:** When you launch the **Media Finder**, your phone prompts you to **Refresh Media**. Press **Yes** to update the list of media files stored on the current installed memory card. You should refresh the media list whenever you install or switch memory cards.

Use the navigation key • to control song playback.

**If you receive a call during a song**, the song pauses until the call is over.

When a song is playing, press the **Options** key to select music player options:

options	
Hide	Hide the music player while music plays. To see the music player again, press 🌣 up. To stop the hidden music player, press 🖜
Manage	Show song <b>Properties</b> , such as the file name, type, and size.
Send to	Send the song in a message or email, or send it to a printer or other device over a Bluetooth <sup>™</sup> connection.
Apply to	Add the song to a playlist or make it a ringtone.
Setup	Customize settings (see page 33).

During a song, the music player shows the song title, artist, album, and artwork, if available. To see a larger image of the **artwork**, press the center key •• (press it again to return to the music player).

## add music files to a playlist

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > Multimedia > Media Finder > Music and Sounds > folder name.

- 1 Scroll to a song you want to add to the playlist.
  - **Tip:** To select multiple songs for the list, press the **Options** key and select **Select Multiple**. Your phone shows a song list where you can scroll to songs you want to add and press the center key to select them.
- 2 Press the Options key > Apply to > Playlist. Your phone shows a list of playlists.

**3** Scroll to an existing playlist.

To create a new playlist, press the **Options** key > **New Playlist**. Enter a name for the playlist and press the **OK** key.

- 4 Press the Apply key.
- Repeat the procedure to add more songs, or press the Back key to return to the My Media menu.

To hear a playlist, press the Main Menu key > Multimedia > Media Finder

> Music and Sounds > Playlists. Scroll to the playlist, press the Options key > Play.

## customize music player

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > Multimedia > Media Finder > Music and Sounds, press the Options key > Setup.

You can select the following options:

options	
Shuffle	Play songs in a random order.
End Call	If you receive a call during a song, the song pauses. When the call is done, the song resumes playing (Auto-Play) or stays paused (Pause).
Auto- Repeat	Replay the song or playlist when the last file finishes playing.
Stereo Effects	Set <b>Spatial Audio</b> and <b>Bass Boost</b> to customize sound.
Internet Connection	Set your Internet connection preference for downloading songs from the Web.

If you scroll to a song in a list and press the **Options** key, you may also see options for the

song and list such as **Delete**, **Rename**, **Send to**, **Apply to**, and **Sort by**.

# memory card

You can use a removable MicroSD memory card with your phone to store and retrieve multimedia files (such as music and pictures). Your phone can use memory cards with up to 2 GB capacity.

**Note:** If you download a copyrighted file onto your memory card, you can use the file only while the memory card is inserted in your phone. You cannot send, copy, or change copyrighted files.

### install a memory card

**Caution:** Don't bend or scratch your memory card. Keep it away from static electricity, water, and dirt.

Insert the memory card into the memory card slot on the side of your phone until it clicks into place. Don't remove the



memory card while your phone is using or writing files on it.

**To remove the memory card**, push the card in until it clicks. It begins to slide out, and you can slide it the rest of the way out.

**Tip:** You can insert and swap memory cards when the phone is turned on. You should refresh the media list whenever you install or switch memory cards.

### see memory card contents

To see files stored on the memory card, press the Main Menu key  $> 2 \ \$  Office Tools > File Manager  $> \ \$  Memory Card.

**Tip:** The memory card may have a different user-assigned name.

**Tip:** Is your phone not seeing your memory card? Try turning the phone off, then on again. Then return to the **File Manager** list.

# move or copy files between the phone and memory card

You can move or copy files (such as music files, pictures and photos, and video clips) from your phone to the memory card or from the memory card to your phone.

**Note:** Moving a file to a new location deletes the file from its original location.

To see files stored on the phone or memory card, press the Main Menu key > 43 Office Tools

- > File Manager. Select a phone folder or
- Memory Card to see its contents.
- Scroll to the file you want to move or copy.
- 2 Press the Options key > Manage > Move or Copy.

**Note:** The **Move** and **Copy** options do not appear if the highlighted file is copyright-protected.

3 Scroll to the destination location, then press the **Place** key.

**Tip:** Did your phone not find the memory card you installed? Try turning the phone off, then on again. Then, try to copy the file again.

# connect the memory card to a computer

You can connect your phone to a computer to transfer files to and from the memory card.

**Note:** When your phone is connected to a computer, you can access the memory card only through the computer.

#### on your phone

Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > Connections > USB Setting > Connection Type > Memory Card.

This directs the USB connection to your memory card. Attach the Motorola Original USB cable to the mini-USB port on your phone and to an available USB port on your computer. Then follow these steps:

#### on your computer

- 1 Find where your phone's memory card displays as a Removable Disk icon. On a PC this is the My Computer window. On a Macintosh™ computer, it's on the desktop.
- 2 Double-click the Removable Disk icon to access the files on your phone's memory card.
- **3** To store the desired files onto the memory card, drag and drop them onto the removable disk drive icon.
- 4 When you finish, remove the phone with memory card safely from your computer:

**If you are using a PC**, right-click the Safely Remove Hardware icon in the system tray at the bottom of your computer screen. Then select USB Mass Storage Device.

**If you are using a Mac**, select and drag the Removable Disk icon to the Trash.

### file formats that work on your phone

**Note:** Your phone **cannot** play media files that use *Digital Rights Management* (DRM) copy protection. Make sure the media files you load on your phone are not DRM-protected.

Before you copy files to your phone, make sure the files are in a format that your phone recognizes:



Press the *camera key* to see the camera viewfinder.



**Tip:** To take photos in low-light settings, press the **Options** key > **Flash** > *flash* option to use the built-in flash.

- 1 Point the camera lens at the photo subject.
- 2 Press the center key 💠 to take a photo.
- **3** Press the **Send** key to send the photo in a multimedia message (see page 43).

or

Press the Options key to select another option: Save Only, Discard, Send To, Apply To, or Edit.

**Note:** You can't apply a photo to a contact stored on the SIM card.

To see a picture you saved, press the Main Menu key > Multimedia > Media Finder > Pictures > All.

**Tip:** To store photos on your **memory card**, press the **Options** key > **Camera Settings** 

> Storage Location > Memory Card from the camera viewfinder.

### self portrait

When the phone flip is closed, press and hold the side select key (see illustration on page 2) to activate the camera and see the viewfinder image in the external display. Press the side select key to take a photo. Open the flip and use the **Media Finder** to locate and view the photo (for more information about using the media finder, see page 94).

### camera settings

When the viewfinder is active, press the **Options** key to select camera options:



**Tip:** If you want to send your video in an MMS message, the video length must be set to **MMS Short** or **MMS Long**. To set length, press

the Options key > Camera Settings > Video Settings > Video Length.

- 1 Point the camera lens at the video subject.
- Press the center key to begin video recording.
- **3** Press the **Stop** key to stop video recording.
- 4 Press the **Send** key to send the video clip in a multimedia message (see page 43).

#### or

Press the **Options** key to select another option: **Save Only, Discard, Send To,** or **Play**.

**Tip:** To store video clips on your **memory card**, press the **Options** key > **Camera Settings** > **Storage Location** > **Memory Card** from the video camera viewfinder.



### send a multimedia message

A Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS) message contains pages with text and media objects (including photos, sounds, or video clips). You can send the multimedia message to other MMS-capable phones, and to email addresses.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key  $> \square$  Messages > Create Message.

 Press keypad keys to enter text on the page (for text entry information, see page 57).

To insert a **picture**, sound, video clip, voice record, contact info, Web address, or quick note on the page, press the

**Options** key > **Insert**. Select the file type and the file.

To insert another **page**, press the **Options** key > **Insert** > **Page**. You can enter more text and objects on the new page.

- When you finish the message, press the Options key > Sending Options to set message options (such as Subject and Priority).
- When you finish setting message options, press the **Done** key.
- 4 Press the **Send To** key to select message recipients. You can:
  - Select one or more entries from your contacts list.
  - Press the Options key > Enter Number or Enter Email.
- **5** Press the **Send** key to send the message.

To save or cancel the message, press the **Options** key > **Save To Drafts** or **Cancel Message**.

### receive a multimedia message

When you receive a multimedia message or postcard, your phone plays an alert and the display shows

New Message with a message indicator (such as

Press the **Read** key to open the message.

- Photos, pictures, and animations show as you read the message.
- A sound file plays as you read the message. Use the side up/down keys to adjust the sound volume.
- Attached files are added to the end of the message. To open an attachment, select the file indicator/filename.

### Bluetooth™ wireless

Your phone supports Bluetooth wireless connections. You can connect your phone with a Bluetooth headset or car kit to make handsfree calls. You can connect your phone with a phone or computer that supports Bluetooth connections to exchange files.



**Note:** The use of wireless phones while driving may cause distraction. Discontinue a call if you can't concentrate on driving. Additionally, the use of wireless devices and their accessories may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

**For maximum Bluetooth security**, you should always connect Bluetooth devices in a safe, private environment.

### turn Bluetooth power on or off

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > ② Bluetooth, press the Options key > Manage > Setup Bluetooth > Bluetooth Power > On.

**Note:** To extend battery life, use this procedure to set Bluetooth power to **Off** when not in use. Your phone will not connect to another device until you set Bluetooth power back to **On** and connect your phone to the device again.

### use headset or handsfree car kit

Before you try to connect your phone to a handsfree device, make sure the device is on and ready in *pairing* or *bonding* mode (see the user's guide for the device). You can connect your phone with only one device at a time.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > § Bluetooth, press the Options key > Search For Device > Headset.

Your phone lists the devices it finds within range.

- 1 Scroll to a device in the list.
- 2 Press the Options key > Manage > Bond With Device to connect to the device.

**Shortcut:** When Bluetooth power is on, your phone can automatically pair with a handsfree device you have used before. Just turn on the device and move it near the phone.

### copy files to another device

You can copy a photo, picture, video clip, sound file, contact, calendar event, or bookmark to another phone or computer that supports Bluetooth connections.

**Note:** You can't copy some copyrighted objects.

**Before you try to copy a file to another device**, make sure the receiving device is **on** and **ready** in discoverable mode.

- 1 On your phone, scroll to the object that you want to copy to the other device.
- **2** Press the **Options** key, then select:
  - Send To > Bluetooth for a photo, picture, video clip, or sound file.
  - Send Contact Via > Bluetooth for a contact.
  - Share Event Via > Bluetooth for a calendar event.
  - Share Page Via > Bluetooth for a bookmark.
- 3 Select a recognized device name, or [Search For Device] to search for an unrecognized device where you want to copy the object.
- **4** Press the **Options** key > **Send**.

5 If necessary, enter the device passkey (such as 0000), and press the **OK** key to connect to the device.

**Note:** Once you connect your phone to a Bluetooth device, that device can start a similar Bluetooth connection with your phone. Your display shows the Bluetooth indicator ≯ when there is a Bluetooth connection.

# receive files from another device

**Before you try to receive a file from another device**, make sure your phone's Bluetooth power is **on** (see page 45). For a list of file formats that work on your phone, see page 37.

Send the file from the device.
 If your phone and the sending device

- 2 Press the Accept key to accept a file from another device. Your phone notifies you when file transfer is complete, and saves the file.

### send photo to printer

You can send a photo to a printer that supports Bluetooth connections.

**Note:** You can print A4 or US Letter size pages. To print another size, copy the object to a linked computer and print it from there.

- On your phone, take a new photo or scroll to a stored photo that you want to print, then press the Options key > Send To > Printer.
  - **Note:** If you see **Service Not Supported** when you try to print, select **Send To** > **Bluetooth** instead. Always use this option to print 4x6 photos.
- 2 Select a recognized printer name, or [Search For All Devices] to search for an unrecognized printer where you want to send the object.
- 3 If available, modify print options.

#### advanced Bluetooth features

**Note:** A device is *recognized* after you connect to it once (see page 45).

# synchronize phone information

You can use different methods to synchronize information between your phone and a server or external device:

 MOTOSYNC with SyncML (over-the-air connection with a SyncML server). • **Tethered Sync** (Bluetooth wireless connection or USB cable connection to a PC using the Motorola mobile PhoneTools software accessory product).

### MOTOSYNC with SyncML

Use MOTOSYNC with SyncML to synchronize your contacts list, phone calendar, and tasks with a SyncML-compliant server.



Find it: Press the Main Menu key > Office Tools > MOTOSYNC > SyncML.

If no SyncML profile is stored on your phone, the phone prompts you to create a profile. Contact your IT system administrator to obtain the information you need to set up a profile.

**Note:** If your phone can't connect to the server, verify that your phone's network

service provider has data service activated on your phone (additional fees may apply for this service).

### tethered sync

You can connect your phone and PC using a Bluetooth wireless connection (see page 44) or a Motorola Original USB cable connected to your phone and PC.



Before you use a USB cable to sync your phone, set Modem as your USB default connection: Press the Main Menu key > % Settings > Connections > Modem.

**Once your phone is connected** to your PC, select the "Sync" option from the Motorola mobile PhoneTools software running on the PC. **Do not** manually open MOTOSYNC on your phone.

Note: To synchronize or transfer data between your phone and PC, you must install the Motorola mobile PhoneTools software included with the Motorola Original data kit. See the mobile PhoneTools user's guide for more information. Motorola mobile PhoneTools software is designed to synchronize with basic features of many popular Personal Information Management (PIM) software and hardware products.

### voice commands

You can use voice commands to make calls, open phone applications, and perform basic phone functions.

**Note:** You can send voice commands to your phone using a connected headset or handsfree car kit. You **must** connect a headset to use voice commands when the phone flip is closed.

**Note:** Not all languages support voice commands.

### voice dial a call

You can dial an entry in your contacts list by speaking the entry's name, or dial any phone number by speaking its digits.

**Tip:** Speak numbers at a normal speed and volume, pronouncing each digit distinctly. Avoid pausing between digits.

- 1 Press and release the *voice key* on the right side of your phone. Your phone prompts you to say a command or name.
- Wait for the beep, then say the name of an entry as it appears in your contacts list. Your phone confirms the name and makes the call.

#### or

Say "Dial Number." Your phone prompts you to speak the digits in the phone number. Speak the digits. Your phone confirms the number and makes the call.

#### Notes:

 If your phone recognizes the name or number, it shows it in the display and repeats it back to you. Say "Yes" to call, or say "No" and say another name or number.  If your phone doesn't recognize the name or number, it doesn't make the call.

If your phone shows a list of similar names or numbers, you can select a name or number manually by scrolling to it and pressing the center key •.

### voice activate phone functions

You can use voice commands to open applications and perform many basic phone functions. Press and release the voice key to see the complete list of voice commands for your phone.

To perform a voice command:

1 Press and release the voice key on the right side of your phone. Your phone prompts you to say a command.

Wait for the beep, then say the command (see following list). If your phone recognizes the command, it performs the command.

### talking phone

You can set your phone to recite incoming caller ID information, read the names of menu features or entries on your contacts list, read messages you receive, and provide audio feedback for other phone functions.

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 8% Settings > Phone Settings > Talking Phone.

**Shortcut:** Press and release the voice key on the right side of your phone, then say "Talking Phone."

# airplane mode

Airplane mode turns off your phone's WiFi, Bluetooth, and calling features in locations where wireless phone use is prohibited. You can use the phone's music player and other non-calling features in airplane mode.

To set airplane mode:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 3% Settings > Profiles > Airplane Mode.

When airplane mode is active, the airplane mode indicator → shows in the display. To reactivate your phones calling features, return to the **Profiles** menu and select a different profile.



# display

The *home screen* appears when you turn on the phone.



**Note:** Your home screen may look different, depending on your service provider.

To dial a number from the home screen, press number keys and .

Press the **Main Menu** soft key to open the main menu. *Soft key labels* show the current soft key functions. For soft key locations, see page 1.

Press the **Options** key in the home screen to lock your phone's side keys, take a picture or create a message, change the alert profile, customize the home screen, or quick connect to a WiFi CERTIFIED® access point to make calls over an Internet connection.

Press • up, down, left, or right in the home screen to open basic features. You can show or hide the feature icons in the home screen and change the icons that are shown. For more information about changing icons in the home screen, see page 85.

Status indicators can show at the top of the home screen:



1 Signal Strength/Airplane Mode Indicator – Vertical bars show the strength of the wireless network connection. You can't make or receive calls when the no signal indicator ♥ or airplane mode indicator ➤ shows. The roam indicator (♦ or ﷺ) shows when your phone is seeking or using a network outside your home network.

When your phone is connected to an access point, the WiFi signal strength

indicator **◄** show the strength of the WiFi connection.

Connection Type Indicator – The WiFi network indicator flashes when your phone attempts to establish a network connection through an access point, and becomes solid when the connection is made.

Your phone also can use a high-speed Enhanced Data for GSM Evolution (EDGE) or General Packet Radio Service (GPRS) cellular network connection. Indicators can include:

- **Bluetooth Indicator** Shows when Bluetooth™ power is turned on.
- 4 Message Indicator Shows when you receive a new text or voicemail message.



To change your text entry mode options and languages, press the Main Menu key > 3% Settings > Phone Settings > Text Entry.

Change text case: Press ① in a text entry screen to change text case to all capital letters (\*), next letter capitalized (°), or next letter lowercase (no symbol). Your phone capitalizes the first letter of each sentence unless you press ① to choose next letter lowercase.

**Set text prediction:** Your phone can learn the words you enter, to improve text prediction and completion. Enter a word and press the **Options** key > **Text Entry** > **Set Text Prediction** 

> Learn My Words. Your phone shows 

when the feature is active.

Set text completion: Set your phone to guess the rest of the word when you enter three or more characters in a row. Enter a word and press the Options key > Text Entry > Set Text Prediction > Offer Completions. Your phone shows ### when text completion is active.

**Enter punctuation:** Press 1 to enter punctuation or other characters.


Edit or delete text: Press • to position the cursor to the right of text you want to edit. Press the *clear/back key* • to delete the character to the left of the cursor. Hold • to delete the word to the left of the cursor.

### word mode

Press # in a text entry screen to switch to "word" predictive text entry mode. Your phone shows in the display.

Word mode lets you enter words using one keypress per letter. The phone combines your keypresses into common words and predicts each word as you enter it.

For example, if you press 7 7 6 4, your display might show:



#### abc mode

Press # in a text entry screen to switch to "abc" text entry mode. Your phone shows Ab in the display.

To enter text, press a keypad key repeatedly to cycle through the letters and number on the key. Repeat this step to enter each letter.

For example, if you press **7** one time, your display shows:



After two seconds, character is accepted and cursor moves to next position. When text completion is activated, your phone attempts to guess the rest of the word:

- Press to select the suggested word.
- Press right to enter the suggested word and a space.
- If you want a different word, press keypad keys to enter the remaining letters.

To activate text completion, see page 58.

#### numeric mode

Press # in a text entry screen until you see 123. Press the number keys to enter the numbers you want.

**Tip:** Just need one number? To enter a number quickly, press and hold a number key until the number appears.


### symbol mode

Press # in a text entry screen until you see @. The display shows the symbol associated with each keypad key. Press • up or down repeatedly to see different symbols. To insert a symbol, press its key, or scroll to it and press the center key • •.

### volume

Press the side up/down keys to:





change the earpiece or speakerphone volume during a call

change the speaker volume when plaving a song or video clip

**Tip:** To set your phone's ring alert profile in the home screen, press the side up/down keys to scroll to a profile, then press the side select key to select it. For more information about using ring alert profiles, see page 64.


# navigation key

Press the navigation key ·ô· up, down, left, or right to scroll and highlight menu items. When you highlight something, press the center key • to select it.



# side select key

The side select key gives you another way to do things. When vou scroll to a menu item, you can press the side select key to



select it (instead of pressing the center key •••).

When the phone flip is closed, you can press and hold the side select key to activate the camera, then press the side select key again to take a photo.

# external display

When your phone flip is closed, the external display shows the time and indicates phone status, incoming calls, and other events. For a list of phone status indicators, see page 55.

To set your phone's ring alert profile in the external display, press the side up/down keys to scroll to a profile, then press the side select key to select it. For more information about using ring alert profiles, see page 64.

# handsfree speaker

You can use your phone's handsfree speaker to make calls without holding the phone to your ear.

During a call, press the <code>Options</code> key > <code>Speaker On</code> to turn the handsfree speaker on. Your display shows the speakerphone indicator until you turn it off (press the <code>Options</code> key > <code>Speaker Off</code>) or end the call.

**Note:** Closing the flip doesn't end a call when the handsfree speaker is turned on.

# codes & passwords

Your phone's four-digit **unlock code** is originally set to **1234**. The six-digit **security code** is originally set to **000000**. If your service provider didn't change these codes, you should change them:

Find it: Press the Main Menu key > 3% Settings > Security > Change Passwords.

You can also change your **SIM PIN** or call barring passwords.

If you forget your unlock code: At the Please Verify the Unlock Code prompt, try entering 1234 or the last four digits of your phone number. If that doesn't work, press # and enter your six-digit security code instead.

**If you forget other codes:** If you forget your security code, SIM PIN code, PIN2 code, or call barring password, contact your service provider.

# lock & unlock phone

You can lock your phone to keep others from using it. To lock or unlock your phone, you need the four-digit unlock code.

To **manually lock** your phone: Press the Main Menu key > §\$ Settings > Security > Phone Lock > Lock Now.

To **automatically lock** your phone whenever you turn it off: Press the **Main Menu** key > **8% Settings** > **Security** > **Phone Lock** > **Lock at Power On** > **On**.

**Note:** You can make emergency calls on a locked phone (for more information, see page 72). You also can receive and answer incoming calls when the phone is locked.



# THIS MODEL MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg1 Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and wom on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 0.51 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 0.22 W/kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements).2

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.

The World Health Organisation has stated that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for the use of mobile devices. They note that if you want to reduce your exposure then you can do so by limiting the length of calls or using a 'hands-free' device to keep the mobile phone away from the head and body.
