

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



SIM card


Your Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card contains personal information like your phone number and phonebook entries.

Caution: Do not bend or scratch your SIM card. Keep it away from static electricity, water, and dirt.



battery

battery installation



Note: If you remove the battery for a long time, the phone will ask you to reset the time and date. If you choose to cancel or ignore, the time and date will be **affected**. You can input the correct time and date by:

Find it: Press > Setting > Initial Setup > Time and Date

But, if you remove the battery just for a few seconds (e.g., quickly change SIM card), the system either won't ask you to reset the time and date or if prompted, you can choose **BACK** on the time and date screen, the clock will only be slightly affected.

battery charging

Before you can use your phone, you need to completely charge the battery. New batteries are not fully charged. Plug the Mini-USB cord into your



Power Connector Insert the charger.

phone and an electrical outlet or a PC. Your phone displays **Charge Complete** when finished.

Tip: You cannot overcharge your battery. It will perform best after you fully charge and discharge it a few times.

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, install and charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

battery tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, features, and accessories you use.

- Always use Motorola
 Original™ batteries and chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.

- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.
- When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F).
 Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times.
 If you notice a change in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.





turn it on & off

To turn on your phone, press and hold for 2 seconds. If prompted, enter your SIM card PIN code and/or unlock code.



Caution: If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in a row, your SIM card is disabled and your phone displays **SIM Blocked**. Contact your service provider.

To turn off your phone, press and hold for 2 seconds.

make a call

Enter a phone number and press (1) to make a call

To end the call, press

answer a call

When your phone rings and/or vibrates, press to answer.

To end the call, press ①

You can also answer or end a call by pressing any key when the **Multi-key** answer option is activated.

Find it: Press > Settings > In Call Setup > Answer Ontions

your phone number

To see your number:

Press 🔳 > Settings > Phone Status > My Numbers

To store or edit your name and number on your SIM card, press the **VIEW** key while displaying it. If you don't know your phone number, contact your service provider.

Tip: To insert a **picture, sound, or other object**, press **□** > **INSERT**.

To insert another slide, press > Insert > Insert Slide. You can enter additional text and objects on the new slide.

- **2** When the message is finished, press **0K**.
- 3 Scroll to the desired entry and press ADD. Repeat step 3 until all desired entries are added, and press DONE.

Tip: To enter a new number, scroll to **[One Time Entry]** and press **SELECT.**

To enter and store a new number, scroll to [New Entry] and press SELECT.

- **4** Scroll to the desired message field, and press **CHANGE** to edit.
- **5** Press **SEND** to send the message.

Tip: To cancel or save the message as a Draft, press **1**.

receive a multimedia message



When you receive a multimedia message or letter, your phone sounds an alert and displays **New Message** with a message indicator such as $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{S}}$.

Press the **READ** key to open the message.

If a multimedia message contains media objects:

- photos, pictures, and animations will display as you read the message.
- sound files will play when its slide bar displays.

chatting


Select Chat from the Office Tools menu to keep in touch with friends. You can save time by inserting a common phrase, such as In a meeting now or Take Care, by selecting Msg: > Change > Insert.

camera

To activate your phone's camera using the menu system:

Find it: Press 🔳 > Multimedia > Camera

The active viewfinder image appears on your display.



Point the camera lens at the photo subject, then:

- **1** Press **CAPTURE** to take a photo.
- Press STORE to view storage options. If you choose to keep the photo, continue to step 4.
- **3** Press **DISCARD** to delete the photo and return to active viewfinder.
- 4 Scroll to Send in Message, Store Only, Apply as Wallpaper, Apply as Screen Saver or Apply as Phonebook and press SELECT.

Note: If the screen flickers when taking a picture, you may need to select an alternative frequency for the **Flicker** setting. For example, if the **Flicker** setting is currently 50Hz, switch to 60Hz, and try to take the picture again.

Find it: Press > Multimedia > Camera > > Picture Setup > Flicker

Set the camera to take a photo automatically after counting down 5 or 10 seconds.

View Free Space

Check used and available memory.

After **Capture**, you can choose to **Store** your picture. Store options include:.

Send in Message

An MMS message will be initiated with the captured picture. You can edit the MMS message and send it with the captured picture. You can also add a voice note.

Store only

The captured picture will be stored in **Pictures**.

Apply as Wallpaper

Your picture will be applied as Wallpaper.

Apply as Screen Saver

Your picture will be applied as the Screen Saver

Apply as Phonebook Entry

Your picture will be saved in the **Phonebook**.

use the FM radio

You can listen to and program up to nine of your favorite FM radio stations.

turn on the FM radio

Find it: Press > Multimedia > FM radio

The FM radio will automatically tune in the lowest available frequency when you use it for the first time. After that, it will tune in the frequency last used. Press •• up and down or use the side volume key to increase or decrease the volume.



Press **T** > **MUTE** to make the output volume silent.

Note: The earpiece must be inserted into the phone for the FM radio to function. If you try to turn it on without inserting the earpiece, your phone will display **Please Insert The Earpiece**.

Note: The headset also acts as an antenna, so the FM Radio receiver performance is dependent on the type of headset device connected. If a non-Motorola 3.5 mm headset is connected to the phone through the adapter (2.5 - 3.5 mm), or the headset is curled up or kinked, performance may be affected.

tune the FM radio

- 1 Press > Multimedia and scroll to FM radio.
- 2 Press • left or right to increase or decrease the frequency. Each keypress

- will increase or decrease the frequency by 0.1 MHz.
- 3 Press and hold ·Ŷ· left or right to activate the scanning feature. The FM radio will scan to the next usable frequency. You can continue scanning by pressing ·Ŷ· again. Press > Set Frequency to save the channel.

use the radio presets

You can store up to nine preset radio stations.

set the radio presets

- 1 Tune in the desired frequency by pressing • o left or right.
- 2 Press and hold 1 9 to save that number as the preset.

select a radio preset

Press 1 - 9 to select the corresponding radio preset.

FM radio selection

You can manually set the radio frequency and display or edit the frequency list.

set frequency



- 1 Press **and scroll to Set Frequency**. Press **SELECT**.
- 2 Use the number keys to enter the desired frequency. Press # to enter a decimal point.
- 3 Press OK.

display or edit the channel list

- 1 Press **and scroll to Station Presets.** Press **SELECT**.
- 2 Press the keypad keys to select the desired channel or press •� to scroll to the desired channel, then press EDIT.
- 3 Use the number keys to enter the Friendly Name and Frequency.
- 4 Press OK.

play FM radio through speaker or headset

Press and scroll to **Speaker**, then press **SELECT**. To play the FM Radio through the headset, press and scroll to **Headset**, then press **SELECT**.

Note: The headset must be inserted into the phone for the FM radio to play through the Speaker.

turn off FM radio

To turn off the radio, press .

usb connection

Your phone can be USB charged by connection to a PC. It can also upload and download files via connection to a PC or other USB device.

To use this feature

- 1 Insert the USB cable into the USB port on the left side of the phone. The phone will display Connect phone as storage device?
- 2 Press Yes to use phone as a portable USB storage device.

Note: When the phone is in this mass storage mode, it cannot make or receive calls, or perform any other functions. Disconnecting will resume normal operation.

or

Press No to enable USB charge if the connected device is a PC.

Downloaded files can be viewed by pressing

II > Multimedia > Pictures or Sounds

> Additional Storage Device.

Note: The home screen must be displayed when connecting.


basics

See page 1 for a basic phone diagram.

display

The home screen displays when you turn on the phone. To dial a number from the home screen, press the number keys and ②.

Note: Your home screen may look different from the one on this page, depending on your service provider.




When \blacksquare is displayed, you can press \blacksquare to open the menu. Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left or right soft key to perform the function indicated by the label. For soft key locations, see page 1.

In the home screen, press • • up, down, left, or right to open basic menu features. You can choose to show or hide home screen display icons.

Find it: Press > Personalize > Home Screen > Home Keys > Icons

status indicators

Status indicators may be shown at the top of the home screen:



- 1 **Signal Strength Indicator** Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when it displays.
- 2 GPRS Indicator Shows when your phone is using a high-speed GPRS network connection. Indicators show PDP context active ☑ or packet data available ♣ .
- **3 Data Indicator** Shows connection status.

= unsecure packet data transfer

- 4 Roam Indicator Shows when your phone is seeking or using a network outside of your home network.
- 5 Active Line Indicator Shows (♣) to indicate an active call, or (♣) to indicate when call forwarding is on. Indicators for dual phone lines (requires SIM card for 2 phone lines) can include:



select a feature option

Some features require you to select an option from a list.



- Press • up or down to highlight the option you want.
- In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight an option.
- In an alphabetized list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters and highlight the closest matching option on the list.
- When an option has a list of possible settings, press ô left or right to select the setting.
- When an option has a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.

text entry

Some features let you enter text.



choosing a text entry method

Multiple text entry methods make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The method you select remains active until you select another method.

Press # in any text entry screen to select one of the following entry methods:

Primary The primary text entry

method (see below to set).

Numeric Enter numbers only (see page

47).

Symbol Enter symbols only (see page

47).

set up a text entry mode

To set your **Primary** and **Secondary** text entry modes, press **S** > **Entry Setup** in a text entry view and select **Primary setup** or **Secondary setup**.

iTAP® mode

Press # in a text entry screen to switch to iTAP mode. If you don't see or , press > Entry Setup to set iTAP mode as your primary or secondary text entry mode.

iTAP mode lets you enter words using one keypress per letter. The iTAP software combines your keypresses into common words and predicts each word as you enter it.

For example, if you press 7764, your phone displays:



- If you want a different word (such as Progress), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.
- Press 1 to enter punctuation or other characters.

tap mode

Press # in a text entry screen to switch to TAP mode. If you do not see 1 or 2, press $\boxed{\mathbb{Z}} > \text{Entry}$ Setup to set TAP mode as your Primary or Secondary text entry mode.

To enter text in **TAP** mode, press a keypad key repeatedly to cycle through the letters and number on the key. Repeat this step to enter each letter.

For example, if you press **3** one time, your phone displays:



After 2 seconds, the character is accepted and the cursor moves to the next position.

numeric mode

In a text entry screen, press # to switch entry modes until the 12 (numeric) indicator displays.

Press keypad keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press ## to switch to another entry mode.

symbol mode

In a text entry screen, press # to switch entry modes until the @ (symbol) indicator displays.

Press keypad keys repeatedly to cycle through its symbols. Highlight the symbol you want, then press **SELECT**.

volume

You can adjust the earpiece speaker volume while you are talking by pressing $\cdot \hat{\mathbf{Q}} \cdot \text{right/up}$ to increase the volume or left/down to decrease the volume. You can also adjust the volume by pressing the side volume keys.

Tip: During a call, you can set your phone to mute by pressing **()** > **Mute**.

navigation key

Press the *navigation key*••• up, down, left, or right to scroll and highlight options.



handsfree speaker

You can use your phone's handsfree speaker to make calls without holding the phone to your ear.

During a call, press **SPKR ON** to turn the handsfree speaker on. When your handsfree speaker is on, you can press **SPKR OFF** to turn it off.

Note: The handsfree speaker does not work when your phone is connected to a handsfree car kit or headset.

codes & passwords

Your phone's **unlock code** is originally set to **1234**. The **security code** is originally set to **000000**. If your service provider didn't change these codes, you should change them:

Find it: Press > Settings > Security > New Passwords

You can also change your **SIM PIN** or call barring passwords.

If you forget your unlock code: At the Enter Unlock Code prompt, try entering 1234 or the last four digits of your phone number. If that doesn't work, press and enter your security code instead.

If you forget your other codes: If you forget your security code, SIM PIN code, PIN2 code, or call barring password, contact your service provider.

check battery meter

To check your battery meter:

Press **> Settings** > **Phone Status** > **Battery Meter.**

customize

ring style

Your phone rings and/or vibrates to notify you of an incoming call, message, or other event. This ring and/or vibration is called an alert. You can select one of six different alert profiles: Loud Ring, Soft Ring, Vibrate, Vibrate & Ring, Vibrate then Ring, and Silent.

The ring style profile's indicator displays at the top of your home screen. To choose your profile:

Find it: Press > Settings > Ring Style > Style > style name

change alerts

You can change the alerts for incoming calls and other events. Your changes are saved in the current ring style profile.

Find it: Press > Settings > Ring Style > Detail > desired event > Change > alert for event

time & date

To set the time and date for your phone:

Find it: $Press \blacksquare > Settings > Initial Setup > Time$ and Date

Note: To choose an analog or digital clock for your home screen, press **> Personalize > Home Screen > Clock Set**.

time, date, date format, and autoupdate setup



When you activate the *Autoupdate feature*, your phone's clock will automatically adjust to the correct time zone when you travel from one time zone to another.

Note: If your phone's clock does not adjust to the correct time zone, verify that the *Autoupdate feature* is activated, and check with your service provider to ensure that the network supports this feature.

Find it: Press > Settings > Initial Setup > Time and Date

wallpaper

You can set a photo, picture, or animation as a wallpaper (background) image on your home screen.

Find it: Press > Personalize > Wallpaper Select one of the following options.

option	
Set Layout	Select Center to center the image on the display, Tile to repeat the image across the display, Fit-to-Screen to fit the image to the display.
Picture	Select an image for your wallpaper image.

screen saver

You can set a photo, picture, or animation as a screen saver image. The screen saver displays

when no activity is detected for a specified time.

Tip: This feature helps save your screen but not your battery. To extend battery life, turn off the screen saver.

Find it: Press > Personalize > Screen Saver

display appearance

This section explains how to adjust the display contrast, color, and backlight.

contrast

Find it: Press > Settings > Initial Setup > Contrast

Press • right to increase the contrast.

Press • left to decrease the contrast.

color

Select the color style that sets the look and feel of your phone.

Find it: $Press \blacksquare > Personalize > Color Setting$

- **1** Press $\mathbf{\hat{Q}}$ to scroll to the desired style.
- 2 Press SELECT.
- 3 Press BACK to return to previous menu.

backlight

You can set the amount of time your phone's display and keypad backlight remain lit.

Find it: Press > Settings > Initial Setup > Backlight

- 1 Press up or down to scroll to a timeout setting.
- 2 Press SELECT.

3 Press **BACK** to return to previous menu.

Note: To save battery life, a shorter backlight display time should be chosen.

The display and keypad backlight will be lit when you press any key.

answer options

You can use additional, alternative methods to answer an incoming call. To activate or deactivate an answer option:

Find it: Press > Settings > In Call Setup > Answer Options

The model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg. ¹ Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the

maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada.
