
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



battery

battery tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, features, and accessories you use.

- Always use Motorola
 Original batteries and
 chargers. The warranty does
 not cover damage caused by
 non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.

• When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.

When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place.

- Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.




Contact your local recycling center for proper battery disposal.

Warning: Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.

install the battery



charge the battery

New batteries are not fully charged. Plug the battery charger into your phone and an electrical outlet. Your phone might



take several seconds to start charging the battery.

If you are charging your phone while it is off, your phone displays **Charge Complete** when finished. If you are charging your phone while it is on, it displays a temporary charge complete message, and the battery symbol stops flashing when finished.

Tip: Relax, you can't overcharge your battery. It will perform best after you fully charge and discharge it a few times.

You can charge your battery by connecting a cable from your phone's mini-USB port to a USB port on a computer. Both your phone and the computer must be turned on, and your computer must have the correct software drivers installed. Cables and software drivers are available in Motorola Original data kits, sold separately.

conserve battery charge

Using certain features can quickly deplete your battery's charge. These features can include downloading music, using the camera, replaying video clips, and using Bluetooth® wireless connections.

You can conserve your battery's charge by doing the following:

 Turn Bluetooth power off when not in use (see page 58).

- Turn off wallpaper (see page 40) and screen saver (see page 41).
- Turn off backlights (see page 42).

turn it on & off

To turn on your phone, press and hold the Power/End key



(1) until the display turns on.

The phone may require several seconds to turn on. If prompted, enter your four-digit unlock code (the last four digits of your phone number or 1234) and press **OK** to unlock the phone.

To turn off your phone, open the slider, and then press and hold the Power/End key (②).

lock & unlock slider

You can lock your phone to keep from accidentally pushing external keys when the slider is closed. To lock the phone, push the Lock Key up (see page 2).

Note: When the phone is **on and locked**, if you open the slider, the keypad unlocks. When you close the slider, the phone goes back into the locked state. When the phone is **off and the locked**, the phone will not turn on, but will briefly display a white padlock to remind you that you have locked the phone.

make a call

Open the slider, then enter a phone number and press the Send key () to make a call.

To "hang up," close the slider or press the Power/End key (☑).

Tip: You can make a call with the slider closed. Select a contact, then press the Send key ((a)) to call the number.

answer a call

When your phone rings and/or vibrates, just open the slider or press the Send key (10) to answer.

To "hang up," press the Power/End key (10).

store a phone number

You can store a phone number in Contacts:

- **1** Enter a phone number in the home screen.
- 2 Press the left soft key () (Save).

- 1 Select Create New and press the center select key (•) (OK).
- 2 Scroll to a type of entry and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- **3** Enter a name and other details for the phone number.
- **4** Press the center select key (♠) (Save) to store the number.

To edit or delete a **Contacts** entry, see page 96.

Tip: You can set your phone to display a picture or play a special ringtone for caller (see page 98 and see page 98).

call a stored phone number

- 1 Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
 - (2) CONTACTS is automatically selected.
- 2 Scroll to Contact List and press the center select key (♠) (OK) to select it.
- **3** Scroll to the **Contacts** entry.
- 4 Press the Send key ((a)) to call the entry.

see your phone number

Open the slider. From the home screen, press and then #. Press the center select key $(\cdot \hat{\bullet})$ to select MDN.

tips & tricks

From the home screen (page 18), you can use the following shortcuts:

home screen

The *home screen* appears when you turn on the phone.



Note: Your home screen might look different.

To dial a number from the home screen, press number keys and the Send key ().

Press the center select key $(\cdot \hat{\phi} \cdot)$ to open the main menu. *Soft key labels* show current soft key functions. (For soft key locations, see page 2.)

Tip: You can quickly select a menu option by pressing the number for that option. For example, from the **SETTINGS & TOOLS** menu, press to select **Display Settings**.

Press the navigation key (•�•) up, down, left, or right as a shortcut key to open these basic menu features:

You can set your phone to display or hide these menu icons on the home screen (see page 108).

Your phone displays system status indicators:



alert/indicator

Y N Signal Strength

1x-EVDO indicator shows when phone is in 1x-EVDO coverage area (necessary for V CAST services). 1X indicator shows when phone is in 1x-RTT coverage area. Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection.

Roaming

Indicates phone is roaming off your home network.

alert/indicator

S SSL

Indicates application verification is via SSL during a download session.

⊕ Data Call, Tethered, or Embedded WAP/BREW Application

Shows during data call, tethered mode, or WAP/BREW application.

Indicates phone is dormant and PPP session is active.

Phone is in area with no service coverage.

Phone is in TTY mode.

Voice Call

Shows during an active voice call.

alert/indicator

⊕ E911

Indicates E911 is On.

⊕ Location On

Indicates Location is set to On.

Battery Level

Shows battery strength. The more bars, the greater the charge.

All Sounds Off

Indicates Master Volume is set to Off.

Alarm Only

Indicates Master Volume is set to Alarm Only.

(Vibrate On

Indicates Master Volume is set to Vibrate On.

◄ Speakerphone

Indicates speakerphone is on.

alert/indicator

I Missed Call

Indicates a call was missed.

Shows when you receive a new message.

⊞ Calendar Event

Shows number of calendar appointments.

≥" New Voicemail

Shows when a voicemail message is received.

Alarm On

Shows when an alarm has been set.

≵ ■ Bluetooth Connection Active


Indicates your phone is paired to another Bluetooth device.

enter text

Some features allow you to enter text. This example shows a **Contacts** entry screen:



This example shows an entry screen for creating a text message:



select entry mode

Multiple entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The mode you select stays active until you select another mode.

To select an entry mode from the CREATE TXT MESSAGE screen, press the left soft key (123), then select an entry mode.

To select an entry mode from the CONTACT LIST screen, press the left soft key () (Edit), and then press the left soft key () (Abc).

You can select one of these entry modes:

odes		
The phone predicts each word (in English) as you press keys.		
The phone predicts each word (in Spanish) as you press keys.		
Enter letters and numbers by pressing a key one or more times, first character of a sentence in uppercase.		
Enter letters and numbers by pressing a key one or more times, all characters in uppercase.		
Enter numbers only.		
Enter symbols.		

Tip: Press **★** in a text entry screen to toggle through capitalization options:

abc no uppercase letters

ABC all uppercase letters


tap mode

This is the standard mode for entering text on your phone. Regular tap mode cycles through the letters, numbers, and symbols of the key you press.

- 1 Press a key one or more times to select a letter, number, or symbol.
- **2** Enter the remaining characters in the same way.

Tip: Press # to enter a space.

When you enter text with tap mode, the soft key functions change:




- Press the navigation key (••) left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a text message.
- If you don't want to save your text or text edits, press the Power/End key
 to exit without saving.

iTAP® mode

iTAP software provides a predictive text entry method that combines your key presses into common words.

When you enter three or more letters in a row, your phone may guess the rest of the word. For example, if you enter **prog**, your phone might show:



If you want a different word (such as progress), continue pressing keys to enter the remaining letters.

- Scroll to view other possible combinations, and select the one you want.
- Press the navigation key (••Q•) right to enter the highlighted combination when it spells a word. A space is inserted automatically after the word.
- To enter numbers quickly, press and hold a number key to temporarily switch to numeric mode. Press the number keys to enter the numbers you want.
- Press to enter punctuation or other characters.

enter words

1 Press keys (one press per letter) to begin entering a word.

As you type, your phone automatically shows additional letters that form a suggested combination.

- 2 Scroll to view other possible combinations, and highlight the combination you want.
- 3 Press the navigation key (•••) right to enter the highlighted combination when it spells a word. A space is automatically inserted after the word.

If you enter a word the phone does not recognize, the phone stores it as a new word option. When you fill memory space for new word options, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new ones.

numeric mode

Press keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press the 123 key to switch to another entry mode.

symbol mode

On the **SYMBOLS** screen, scroll to the desired symbol and press the center select key $(-\hat{\phi})$ (**OK**) to select it.

Press the right soft key () (Next) to page down to the next set of symbols. Press the left soft key () (Prev) to page up to the previous set.

delete letters & words

Move the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, then:

- Press and release to delete one letter at a time.
- Press and hold to delete an entire word.

adjust volume


Press the volume keys to:

- turn off an incoming call alert
- change the earpiece volume during calls with the slider open
- change the ringer volume from the home screen (with slider open)

Tip: Sometimes silence really is golden. That's why you can quickly set your ringer to **Vibrate** or **Silent** by holding the down volume key in the home screen.

change sound settings

Press the down volume key to switch to lower call sounds volume, then switch to Vibrate Only, then Alarm



Only, and, finally, All Sounds Off. Press the up volume key to cycle back from silent to vibrate and then to the lowest call volume setting.

handsfree speaker

You can use your phone's handsfree speaker to make calls without holding the phone to your ear.

The handsfree speaker stays on until you press and hold the smart/speakerphone key again or turn off the phone.

Note: The handsfree speaker won't work when your phone is connected to a handsfree car kit or headset.

slider open

To activate the speakerphone during a call, press and hold the smart/ speakerphone key.



You will hear an audio alert and see the speakerphone indicator ◄.

To end the call, press the Power/End key (②). You will see **Call Ended** and hear an audio alert.

Note: Closing the slider while using the speakerphone does not end the call (see "slider closed" below).

To turn off the speakerphone, press the smart/speakerphone key, or press and hold the Power/End key (②) to turn off the phone.

slider closed

- Slide your phone open.
- Press and hold the smart/speakerphone key to turn on the speakerphone.
- Enter the number you want to call and press the Send key (10).
- **4** When the call connects, close the slider and continue your conversation.
- 5 To end the call, press and hold the smart/ speakerphone key. You will see Call Ended and hear an audio alert.

standalone mode

Note: Consult airline staff about the use of **Standalone Mode** in flight. Turn off your phone whenever instructed to do so by airline staff.

Use standalone mode to turn off your phone's calling features in locations where wireless phone use is prohibited. You cannot make or receive calls or use Bluetooth in standalone mode, but you can use your phone's other non-calling features.

- 1 Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (••) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to **Phone Settings** and press the center select key (♠) (**OK**).
- 4 Press center select key (♠) to select Standalone Mode.

5 Select **0n** and press the center select key (♠) (**0K**).

Your phone indicates that **Standalone Mode** is set to **On** by displaying indicators and a message on the home screen:



change lock code

Your phone's four-digit **lock code** is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number. If your service provider didn't change this code, you should change it:

- 1 Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (••) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 4 Press center select key (♠) to select Security.
- 5 When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 6 Scroll to Edit Code and press the center select key (.♠.) (OK).
- 7 Enter the new four-digit lock code in the New Code entry area, then press the navigation key (••) down to move the cursor into the Confirm Code entry area. Re-enter the new four-digit lock code.
- **8** Press the center select key (••) (**0K**).

lock & unlock phone

You can lock your phone to keep others from using it. To lock or unlock your phone, you need the four-digit lock code (originally, the last four digits of your phone number).

Note: You can make emergency calls on a locked phone (see page 50). A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, **but you need to unlock it to answer**.

To **manually lock** your phone:

- 1 Press the center select key (••) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (•••) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (••) (OK).

- 4 Press center select key (♠) to select Security.
- 5 When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key (-♠) (0K).
- 6 Select Lock Mode and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 7 Scroll to Lock and press the center select key (•) (OK).

To **automatically lock** your phone whenever you turn it off:

- Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (•••) to scroll to **SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- Scroll to Security and press the center select key (•) (OK).

- 5 When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key $(\hat{\bullet})$ (**0K**).
- Scroll to Lock Mode and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 7 Scroll to **On Power Up** and press the center select key (�) (**OK**).
- **8** Press the Power/End key (1) to return to the home screen.

To unlock the phone, enter the four-digit lock code in the **Enter Lock Code** entry area and press the center select key $(\cdot \hat{\phi} \cdot)$ (**OK**).

Note: You can also lock the slider. See page 14.

manage memory



You can store multimedia content such as songs and photos on your phone's internal

memory or on a removable microSD (TransFlash) memory card.

Note: If you download a copyrighted file and store it on your memory card, you can use the file only when your memory card is inserted in your phone. You cannot send, copy, or change copyrighted files.

install memory card

- 1 Open the memory card slot cover on the top of your phone.
- 2 With the gold contacts up, slide the memory card into the card slot and press the card in until it clicks.



3 Replace the memory card slot cover.

Caution: Do not remove your memory card while your phone is using it or writing files on it.

set memory for multimedia content

You can set whether to store multimedia content that you download or create in phone memory or on the memory card.

- 1 Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (•♠•) to scroll to ★ SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to **Memory** and press the center select key $(\hat{\bullet})$ (**OK**).
- 4 Scroll to Phone Memory or Card Memory and press the center select key (•) (OK).

5 Scroll to My Pictures, My Videos, My Music, or My Sounds, and press the center select key (♠) (OK).

view memory information

- **1** Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Memory and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 4 Select Phone Memory or Card Memory and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 5 Select Phone Memory Usage or Card Memory Usage and press the center select key (••) (OK).

move files from phone to memory card

You can move files (such as photos, videos, sound, and music files) to the memory card to free up phone memory.

Note: Moving a file to the memory card deletes the original from phone memory.

To move photos or video clips:

- 1 Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (♠) to scroll to → GET IT NOW.
- 3 Scroll to **Picture & Video** and press the center select key (•♠•) (**OK**).
- 4 Open the appropriate list (My Pictures or My Videos).

A memory card icon in the thumbnail picture for a **Picture** indicates that the **Picture** is stored on the memory card.

A memory card icon beside a **Video** file name indicates that the **Video** is stored on the memory card.

An **a** in the thumbnail picture for a **Picture** indicates that the **Picture came preloaded** on your phone and cannot be moved to the memory card.

If the **Picture** or **Video** is not marked with a memory card icon, the **Picture** or **Video** is stored on the phone.

- 5 Scroll to the file you want to move and press the right soft key () (Options).
- Select Move and press the center select key (♠) (OK).

Your phone asks if you want to move the file.

7 Select Yes and press the center select key (-•) (0K) to confirm that you want to move the file.

To move an audio clip that you recorded:

- Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (••) to scroll to get IT NOW.
- Scroll to Music & Tones and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- **4** Scroll to **My Sounds** and press the center select key (♠) (**OK**).

A memory card icon beside the file name of an audio clip indicates that the audio clip is stored on the memory card.

If the file name is not marked with a memory card icon, the audio clip is stored on the phone.

- **5** Scroll to the file you want to move and press the right soft key () (**Options**).
- 6 Select Move and press the center select key (♠) (OK).

Your phone asks if you want to move the file.

TTY operation

You can use an optional teletypewriter (TTY) device with your phone to send and receive calls. You must plug the TTY device into the phone's headset connector and set the phone to operate in one of three TTY modes.

Notes:

- A TTY is a communication device used by people who are hard of hearing or have a speech impairment. TTY does not work from mobile phone to mobile phone.
- Use a TSB-121 compliant cable (provided by the TTY manufacturer) to connect the TTY device to your phone. Your phone has a 2.5mm jack.
- Set the phone to level 4 (middle setting) for proper operation. If you experience a high number of incorrect characters, adjust the volume as needed to minimize the error rate.
- For optimal performance, your phone should be at least 12 inches (30 centimeters) from the TTY device.
 Placing the phone too close to the TTY device may cause high error rates.

set TTY mode

When you set your phone to a TTY mode, it operates in that mode whenever a TTY device is connected.

- Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (♠) to scroll to ♠ SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Call Settings and press the center select key (•) (OK).
- Select TTY Mode and press the center select key (♠) (OK).

TTY Mode can include these options:

option	
TTY Full	Transmit and receive TTY
	characters.

option	
TTY + Talk	Receive TTY characters but transmit by speaking into microphone.
TTY + Hear	Transmit TTY characters but receive by listening to earpiece.
TTY Off	All TTY modes are turned off.

When your phone is in a TTY mode, your phone displays the international TTY mode, the international TTY symbol, and the mode setting during an active TTY call.

return to voice mode

To return to standard voice mode, select **TTY OFF** from the **TTY MODE** menu.

customize

sounds settings

You can set how your phone alerts you to incoming calls or other events.

master volume

- Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (♠) to scroll to ★ SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Sounds Settings and press the center select key (**) (OK).
- 4 Select Master Volume and press the center select key (♠) (OK).

- **5** Press the navigation key (••) to scroll up or down to the desired setting:
 - **High, Med High, Med, Med Low, Low**—Your phone rings for incoming calls and other events, depending on the detail settings.
 - **Vibrate Only**—The phone vibrates to indicate an incoming call.
 - Alarm Only—Your phone plays an audible alarm to alert you to events. You are not able to change detail settings for events.
 - All Sounds Off—The phone does not alert you to incoming calls or other events.
- With the desired setting highlighted, press the center select key (**) (SET).

7 Press the Power/End key (1) to return to the home screen.

sounds for calls, events, & alerts

Note: Master Volume must be set to High, Med High, Med, Med Low, or Low.

Set sounds for calls:

- 1 Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (••) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Sounds Settings and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- Select Call Sounds and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 5 Scroll to Call Ringtone and press the center select key (
) (OK), then scroll to a

desired ringtone and press the center select key $(\hat{\bullet})$ (OK).

Note: Press the left soft key () (**Play**) to preview the ringtone.

or

Scroll to **Call Vibrate** and press the center select key $(\cdot \hat{\phi} \cdot)$ (**OK**), then scroll to **On** or **Off** and press the center select key $(\cdot \hat{\phi} \cdot)$ (**OK**).

6 Press the Power/End key (1) to return to the home screen.

Set sounds for events (such as incoming messages) or alerts:

- 1 Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (••) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Sounds Settings and press the center select key (♠) (OK).

- **4** Select **Alert Sounds** and press the center select key (**.♠**) (**OK**).
- 5 Scroll to TXT Message, Pic-Video Message, or Voicemail, and press the center select key (♠) (OK).

AGPS & your location

Services may use your known location to provide useful information (for example, driving directions, or the location of the nearest bank). Your phone prompts you when the network or a service asks for your location. You can refuse at this point.

When ALI is set to **911 Only**, your phone displays the ⊕ (ALI off) indicator, and the phone does not send location information

unless you call the emergency phone number (such as 911).

- 2 Press the navigation key (•••) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to **Phone Settings** and press the center select key (••) (**OK**).
- Select Location and press the center select key (-♠) (OK).

- 6 Press the center select key (♠) (**0K**) to select the setting.

AGPS limitations & tips

Your phone uses Assisted Global Positioning System (AGPS) satellite signals to estimate your location. If your phone cannot find strong

satellite signals, your AGPS might be slower, less accurate, or it might not work at all. AGPS provides only an approximate location, often within 150 feet (45 meters) but sometimes much farther from your actual location.

To improve AGPS accuracy:

- Go outside and away from underground locations, covered vehicles, structures with metal or concrete roofs, tall buildings, and foliage. Indoor performance might improve if you move closer to window, but some window sun-shielding films can block satellite signals.
- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.

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devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.

AGPS uses satellites controlled by the U.S. government and subject to changes implemented in accordance with the Department of Defense AGPS user policy and the Federal Radio Navigation Plan. These changes might affect AGPS performance.

automatic redial



When you receive a busy signal, your phone displays **Call Failed, Number Busy**.

With automatic redial, your phone automatically redials the number for four minutes. When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates once, displays **Redial Successful**, and connects the call.

You must turn on automatic redial to use the feature:

Your phone keeps lists of the last 60 calls you received and dialed, even if the calls didn't connect. The most recent calls are listed first. The oldest calls are deleted as new calls are added.

Your phone keeps a record of your missed calls, and displays the 'd' (missed call) indicator and X Missed Calls

- 3 Press the Send key ((a)) to make the call.

speed dial

Each entry you store in **Contacts** is assigned a unique *speed dial* number.

Note: Your service provider may have already assigned speed dial number 1 to your voice mail number.

To assign a speed dial number to an entry:

- 2 Press the navigation key (♠) to scroll to € CONTACTS.
- 3 Scroll to **Speed Dials** and press the center select key (♠) (**OK**).

emergency calls

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911 or 112, that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked.

Note: Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

- **1** Enter the emergency number.
- 2 Press the Send key () to call the emergency number.

AGPS during an emergency call



When you make an emergency call, your phone can use *Assisted Global Positioning System* (AGPS) satellite signals to tell the emergency response center your approximate location.

The AGPS feature has limitations, so always tell the emergency response center your best knowledge of your location. Remain on the phone for as long as the emergency response center instructs you.

AGPS **might not work** for emergency calls:

- Your phone's AGPS feature must be turned on (see page 43).
- Your local emergency response center might not process AGPS location

information. For details, contact your local authorities.

For best results:

- Go outside and away from underground locations, covered vehicles, structures with metal or concrete roofs, tall buildings, and foliage. Indoor performance might improve if you move closer to windows, but some window sun shielding films can block satellite signals.
- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.

If your phone cannot find strong AGPS satellite signals, the location of the nearest cell tower in contact with your phone is

automatically provided to the emergency response center.

voicemail

Your network stores the voicemail messages you receive.



Note: Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

When you **receive** a voicemail message, your phone shows the voicemail message indicator **\$**". Press the Send key (**⑤**) to call your voicemail phone number.

Tip: Your service provider may assign speed dial number 1 to your voicemail phone number. If so, simply press and hold 1 to call your voicemail number.

To **check** voicemail messages later:

- 1 Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the navigation key (♠) to scroll to ♠ MESSAGING.
- 3 Scroll to Voicemail and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 4 Press the Send key () to call your voicemail phone number.

Your phone may prompt you to store your voicemail phone number. If you don't know your voicemail number, contact your service provider.

Note: You can't store a **p** (pause), **w** (wait), or **n** (number) character in this number. If you want to store a voicemail number with these characters, create a **Contacts** entry for it. Then, you can use the entry to call your voicemail.





It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg. ¹ Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR

level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 1.35 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 1.29 W/kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements).²

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.

- In the United States and Canada, the SAR limit for mobile phones used by the public is 1.6 watts/kg (W/kg) averaged over one gram of tissue. The standard incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

DO NOT hold the external antenna when the mobile device is IN USE. Holding the external antenna affects call quality and may cause the mobile device to operate at a higher power level than needed.

Product Operation

When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your mobile device just like you would a landline phone.

If you wear the mobile device on your body, always place the mobile device in a Motorola-supplied or approved clip, holder, holster, case, or body harness. Turn off your mobile device in any location where posted notices instruct you to do so. These locations include hospitals or health care facilities that may be using equipment that is sensitive to external RF energy.

Pacemakers

The more immune your hearing aid is, the less likely you are to experience interference noise from mobile phones.
