Specific Absorption Rate Data

This model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg. ¹ Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR

level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 1.28 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 1.29 W/kg.²

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.

- In the United States and Canada, the SAR limit for mobile phones used by the public is 1.6 watts/kg (W/kg) averaged over one gram of tissue. The standard incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements.
- The SAR information includes the Motorola testing protocol, assessment procedure, and measurement uncertainty range for this product.

battery

battery installation



battery charging

New batteries are not fully charged. Plug the battery charger into your phone and an electrical outlet. It might take several seconds to start charging. When finished, your phone displays a full battery icon ...



Tip: Relax, you can't overcharge your battery. It will perform best after you fully charge and discharge it a few times.

Unless your battery is completely drained, you can also charge your battery by using a **USB cable** plugged into a computer. Use a wall charger or car charger for completely

drained batteries. Some USB ports charge faster than others.

battery tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, features, and accessories you use.

turn it on & off

To turn on your phone, press and release the Power/End key (③). If prompted, enter your four-digit unlock code (the last four digits of your phone number).



Tip: If your phone does not turn on, take your battery out, put it back in, and try again.

To turn off your phone, press and hold the Power/End key (1 for three seconds, then **release** it.

make a call

From the home screen, enter a phone number and press the Send key ((to make a call.

To voice dial, see page 90.

answer a call

When your phone rings and/or vibrates, press the Send key ((a)) to answer. To "hang up," press the Power/End key ((a)).

- If you are busy when a call comes in, press the right soft key () (Ignore) to send the call directly to voicemail.
- To put a call on hold, press the Send key (☑). To return to the call, either press the Send key (☑) again or press the right soft key (√) (Unhold).

If you are on a call and another call comes in, you can send the new call to voicemail by pressing the right soft key (►) (Ignore) or answer the new call and put the current call on hold by pressing the Send key (☑). Press either the Send key (☑) or the left soft key (፲√) (Swap) to switch between the two calls.

store a phone number

You can store a phone number in Contacts:

- 1 Enter a phone number in the home screen and press the left soft key () (Save).
- 2 Select < New Contact> by pressing the center select key (♠).
- 3 Enter a name and other details for the phone number and press the left soft key (→) (Save) to store the number.

Tip: While entering the number, you can tell your phone to pause and then dial more digits (for example, for a voicemail password or PIN). 


text entry


You can enter text and numbers using the keypad. When you select a field that requires text or numbers, the phone automatically selects the appropriate entry mode. The default mode is **Abc** (tap mode, first character of a sentence in uppercase).

An indicator at the top right of the display shows the current entry mode.

text prediction

To select a prediction, press down on the navigation key $(\cdot \hat{\mathbf{Q}} \cdot)$ to highlight your selection and then press the center select key $(\cdot \hat{\mathbf{Q}} \cdot)$. To enter a space after your characters instead of using the predicted text, press the space bar.

To turn off text prediction:

- 1 From the home screen, press the left soft key (() (Start).
- 2 Scroll to Settings and press the center select key (♠).
- 3 Scroll to Text Input Settings and press the center select key (-♠-).
- 4 Uncheck Suggest words when typing, and press the left soft key (→) (Done).

Tip: While entering the number, you can tell your phone to pause and then dial more digits (for example, for a voicemail password or PIN). Press press the right soft key (\subseteq \cdot) (Menu) and scroll to Insert Pause to insert a 2-second pause (shows as a p) or scroll to Insert Wait to tell your phone to prompt you before dialing the remaining digits (shows as a w).

volume

To set the **earpiece** volume, press and hold the thumb wheel. Your phone uses this same volume setting for its **speaker** or a **headset**.

- Want to change profiles? On the home screen, scroll to and select **Profile**. Choose from **Normal**, **Silent**, and others.
- Want to turn off a sound? Press press the left soft key () (Start). Scroll to Settings, then Sounds, and select None.

Tip: You can eliminate the ringer volume instantly when an incoming call comes in—just use the thumb wheel to turn the ringer off.

handsfree speaker

Note: The use of wireless phones while driving may cause distraction. Discontinue a call if you can't concentrate on driving. Additionally, the use of wireless devices and their accessories may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

To use your phone's handsfree speaker, press the speaker key (). For key location, see page 2.

Note: The handsfree speaker won't work when your phone is connected to a car kit or headset. With a Bluetooth headset press the right soft key (\searrow) (Menu), scroll to Handsfree Off. Press the right soft key (\searrow) (Menu) and scroll to Speakerphone On.

lock & unlock phone

You can manually lock your phone to prevent accidental key presses.

To **lock your phone**, press the home key (a) and then the space bar. Your left soft key becomes **Unlack**.

To **unlock your phone**, press the left soft key () (**Unlock**) and then **X**. Then, enter your password and press **Unlock** again. Your phone uses * if you have not set a password.

To **keep others from using your phone**, change your password:

- 1 From the home screen, press the left soft key (() (Start).
- 3 Scroll to **Device Lock** and press the center select key (**...)**.

- 4 Select Prompt if device unused for, and select the time you want the phone to be inactive before automatically locking.
- 5 Choose either a simple (4-digit number) or strong password (a mixture of at least 7 uppercase and lowercase letters, numbers, and punctuation).
- **6** Enter and confirm your password.
- 7 Press the left soft key () (Done).

To unlock the phone, press the left soft key () (Unlock). At the prompt, enter your password and press the left soft key () (Done).

Caution: Make your password something you will remember! Without your password, you can reset your phone, but you will lose your personalized settings and all content stored in phone memory. To perform a hard

reset, hold down the center select key (•) for 5 seconds while turning the phone on.

Note: You can make emergency calls on a locked phone (see page 42). A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, **but you do not need to unlock it to answer**.

storage card

Note: A storage card is not included with your phone. It is sold separately.

You can use a removable miniSD storage card with your phone to store content music, pictures, videos, applications, and files.

Caution: Do not remove your storage card while your phone is using or writing files on it.

To insert a miniSD storage card:

 Open the card slot cover by putting your fingernail on the ridge of cover and gently pulling it away.



Insert the storage card into the slot with the metal contacts facing down. Press the card until it clicks into place.



3 Replace the storage card cover.

Caution: Don't bend or scratch your storage card. Keep it away from static electricity, water, and dirt.

Note: Your phone supports miniSD cards up to 4 GB. To save storage space on your phone, move media files (pictures, videos, music) to a storage card as often as possible.

flight mode

In flight mode, you **turn off your phone's network and Bluetooth services** to safely access your address book, games, camera, and music in areas where cellular network access is prohibited (such as during flights, when allowed, and in hospitals).

- 1 Press and hold the home key (a) until the Quick List appears.
- 2 Scroll to Wireless Manager and press the center select key (•••).
- 3 Scroll to All and press the left soft key ((-7) (Done).

Use the same steps to turn Bluetooth and phone mode on After a pause, Bluetooth changes to $\mathbf{0n}$, and then Phone changes to $\mathbf{0n}$.

file manager

You can use File Manager to sort, view, copy, and move files, such as text, pictures, music, and video files, on your phone or storage card.

To find File Manager:

- 1 From the home screen, press the left soft key () (Start).
- 2 Scroll to File Manager and press the center select key (•).

task manager

Want to see what programs are running on your phone? Use the Task Manager to see or stop a program.

To find the Task Manager:

- 1 From the home screen, press the left soft key () (Start).
- 2 Scroll to **System Tools** and press the center select key (••).
- 3 Scroll to **Task Manager** and press the center select key (�).

Tip: Need to stop running program? In **Task Manager**, select the program and press the right soft key (\bigcirc) (**Menu**), scroll to **Kill** and press the center select key ($\widehat{\bullet}$).

Note: To completely remove a program from your phone, from the home screen, press the left soft key () (Start), then scroll to and select Settings, and then scroll to Remove Programs. Select the program and press the right soft key () (Menu) and then select Remove and press the center select key ().

customize

profiles

Each profile uses a different set of sounds, ring styles, earpiece volume settings, or vibrations for incoming calls and other events. For example, the **Outdoor** profile volume is much louder than the **Normal** profile.

time & date

To save battery life, your **backlight** turns off when you're not using your phone. The backlight turns back on when you press a key. To set how long your phone waits before the backlight turns off:

To make and answer calls, see page 13.

turn off a call alert

You can scroll the *thumb wheel* down (or press it) to turn off the ringer.

recent calls

Your phone keeps a list of incoming and outgoing calls, even for calls that didn't connect. The most recent calls are listed first. The oldest calls are deleted as new calls are added.

To see recent calls:

- 1 From the home screen, press the left soft key (() (Start).
- 2 Scroll to Call History and press the center select key (-♠).

You can select a call and then:

- To call the number, press the Send key ((6)).
- To see call details (like time and date), press the center select key (•).

 To see options, press the right soft key (\(\subseteq\)) (Menu):

options	
Find Contact	Find this phone number in your Contacts .
Send Text Message	Send a text message to this phone number.
E-mail	Send an e-mail message to this contact (if you already have the contact's e-mail address).
View Timers	View the call times for this call and all calls.
Delete/ Delete List	Delete a call from the Call History. Select Delete List to delete all calls from the call history.
Save to Contacts	Save this number to a contact.

options	
Filter	Filter all calls in the Call History list. Filtering calls allows you to group calls in a specific matter. For example, if you filter the list for all Missed Calls, all the incoming phone calls that you did not answer will be listed first.

redial

- Press the Send key () from the home screen to see the dialed calls list.
- 2 Highlight the entry you want to call, then press the Send key (①).

If you hear a **busy signal** and you see **Call Failed, Number Busy**, press the Send key (②) or the **RETRY** key to redial the number.



When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates one time, shows **Redial Successful**, and connects the call.

view missed calls

Your phone keeps a record of your unanswered calls. To view your missed calls:

- 1 From the home screen, press the left soft key () (Start).
- 2 Scroll to Call History and press the center select key (♠).
- 3 Press the right soft key () (Menu).
- **4** Scroll to **Filter** and press the center select key (♠).
- 5 Scroll to Missed Calls and press the center select key ().

caller ID

Calling line identification (caller ID) shows the phone number for an incoming call on your home screen.



Your phone shows the caller's name and picture if you have stored a picture in your contacts, or **Incoming Call** when caller ID information isn't available.

You can set your phone to play a distinctive ringer ID for specific entries in your contacts (see page 91).

emergency calls

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911 or 112, that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone and keypad are locked.

Note: Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

- 1 Press the keypad keys to dial the emergency number.
- 2 Press the Send key ((5)) to call the emergency number.

international calls

If your phone service includes international dialing, press and hold to insert your local international access code (indicated by +). Then, press the keypad keys to dial the country code and phone number.

speed dial

You can use speed dialing in two ways: quick access for up to 98 phone numbers and shortcuts to features found in the Start menu including e-mail, calendar, and Bluetooth® Manager.

To access speed dial entries, press and hold the single-digit speed dial number for one second. If the speed dial is two digits, press the first digit, then press and hold the second digit. The phone dials the phone number, opens a new e-mail message, or goes to the Web page.

phone numbers

You can set the speed dial to call the entries in your phone's contact list:

- 1 From the home screen, press the right soft key () (Contacts).
- 2 Scroll to the desired contact and press the center select key (♠).
- 3 Select the phone number or e-mail address you want to add to speed dial.
- 4 Press the right soft key () (Menu).

- 5 Scroll to Add to Speed Dial. and press the center select key (♠).
- 6 In the Keypad Assignment, select the speed dial number to use and press the left soft key (() (Done).

Note: Speed dial 1 is reserved for calling your voicemail.

To **delete** a speed dial entry, press the left soft key () (Start) and select Speed dial. Scroll to the entry, press the right soft key () (Menu), and select Delete.

menu shortcuts

You can set a shortcut speed dial to open an application on your phone:

- 1 Press the left soft key () (Start).
- 2 Scroll to the icon of the application you want a shortcut for and press right soft key () (Menu).

- 3 Scroll to Add to Speed Dial and press the center select key (••).
- 4 In the Keypad Assignment, select the speed dial number to use and press the left soft key () (Done).

Note: Speed dial 1 is reserved for calling your voicemail.

To delete a shortcut, press the left soft key () (Start) and select Speed dial. Scroll to the entry, press the right soft key () (Menu), and select Delete. Your service provider might add a Voicemail shortcut you cannot delete.

voicemail

Note: Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

Your network stores the voicemail messages you receive.



When you **receive** a voicemail message, your phone shows the voicemail message indicator ∞ and **New Voicemail**.

To check voicemail messages, press and hold **1**.

Note: You can't store a pause (p) or wait (w) character in your voicemail number. If you want to store a voicemail number with these characters, create a contact for your voicemail number (see page 14) and use the contact to call your voicemail.

three-way calling

While connected to a call:



- 1 Place your current call on hold by pressing the Send key (()).
- 2 Enter the number of the other person you want to connect to a three-way call and press the Send key ((a)).
- After you are connected to the other phone, you can press the left soft key () (Swap) to switch between the calls, or the right soft key () (Menu) and select Conference to combine them.

If you **receive a second call** while you are already on a call:

 To answer the second call and put the first call on hold, press the left soft key () (Answer). Then, you can press the left soft key () (Swap) to switch

- between the calls, or the right soft key $(\ \)$ (Menu) and select Conference to combine them.
- To send the second call to your voicemail, press the right soft key (\(\sigma\)) (\(\left(\frac{1}{2}\)) (\(\left(\frac{1}{2}\)))



messages

Note: These steps vary depending on your e-mail provider. For example, for Gmail, you need to enable POP. If your e-mail provider does not provide IMAP or POP access, you can still use the Web browser to access e-mail.

After you know your e-mail address:

- 1 Press the left soft key () (Start).
- 2 Scroll to **Messaging** and press the center select key (♠).

- 3 Scroll to **New E-Mail Account** and press the center select key (♠).
- 4 Enter your e-mail address, select **Try to get** e-mail server settings from internet, and press the right soft key (\(\frac{1}{2}\)) (Next).
- 5 Enter your e-mail user name and password.

Note: If your phone finds your account settings, it automatically fills in the following screens. Enter your name, password and press the right soft key () (Next) for each screen. If your phone cannot find your settings, ask your e-mail provider for your settings.

6 Press right soft key () (Finish) to download e-mail now.

set up MSN or Hotmail e-mail

set up corporate e-mail

- Install Microsoft ActiveSync (for Windows® XP™ or earlier) or Windows Mobile Device Center (for Windows Vista) on your computer.

3 Follow the instructions on the screen to complete the wizard.

When you finish the wizard, synchronization with your phone automatically starts.

To read a message: Press the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to the message and press the select key •♠• to open it.

When you have a message open, you can press the navigation key (-••) right to open the next message, or left to open the previous message.

Tip: Want to switch inboxes quickly? Press left or right on the navigation key (••) to jump from one inbox to another.

message attachments

You can **send**, **read**, and **receive** PDF, ZIP, Microsoft® Word, Excel, and PowerPoint files attached to e-mail. **You can edit all Microsoft files on your phone**, but you can only view other files such as PDF and ZIP.

To see a ZIP file's contents, select the file. You can select files in the contents to view them, if they are a format your phone supports.

To **transfer** attachments to your computer for editing, use Microsoft® ActiveSync or Windows® Mobile Device Center.

For text messages, enter the contact telephone number or e-mail address.

- cards. In **To**, press the Enter key ((2)) and select a recipient from the list. Then select the recipient's phone number or e-mail address.

global address lookup



From your phone, you can search the global address list (GAL) stored on your company's Exchange Server. This means that you can find a contact's phone number or e-mail without having to store the information directly to your phone.

Note: GAL information can only be viewed during a data transfer session; the entire GAL cannot be stored for viewing offline.

To search for a contact:

- 1 Press the right soft key (\(\bullet\)) (Contacts).
- 2 Press the right soft key () (Menu).
- 3 Scroll to Company Directory and press the center select key $(\hat{\phi})$.
- 4 Enter a name and press Search.

5 Scroll through the list of entries that appears. When you locate your contact, press the Send key () to make a call.

Note: Although the entire GAL cannot be stored on your phone, after you find the contact, you can add the single contact to your contact list.

Tip: To send a message, SMS, or e-mail to a contact found using GAL, open the company directory, scroll to the contact name, and press the center select key (••). The e-mail information is populated into the **To:** field.

Note: You must have your e-mail set up to send an e-mail (see page 46).

To add a picture, voice note, or file to an e-mail message, open the message area and press the right soft key () (Menu), scroll to Insert, and then select to Picture, Voice Note, or File to choose a file.

Tip: You can save a draft of a message that you are composing to finish and send later. Press the right soft key () (Menu) and select **Save to Drafts**. A draft of the message is stored in the Drafts folder of the account you are in.

create and add an e-mail signature

- 1 Press the left soft key () (Start).

Tip: To insert a signature in every message you send, select **Include when replying and forwarding**. Otherwise, a signature is inserted only in new messages.

read new messages



To quickly view new messages, scroll to the message notification area on the home screen and press the center select key (•••).

view attachment



While viewing a message, use the center select key (••) to select the attachment.

Note: You can view attachments only for file types that are supported by the phone.

read old messages



- 1 Press the left soft key () (Start).
- 2 Scroll to Messaging and press the center select key (\(\diftheta\).
- 3 Scroll to your e-mail account and press the center select key (•).
 Icons next to each message show if it is
 - read, unread, urgent, or has an attachment (read or unread).

reply, reply all, or forward messages



- 1 From your inbox or an open message, press the right soft key () (Menu).
- 2 Scroll to Reply, Reply All, or Forward and press the center select key (...).

Tip: If you are replying to an e-mail message, you will send less data if you do not edit the original message. This may reduce data transfer costs based on your rate plan.

download message objects



If an e-mail message includes an attachment, the name of the attachment is highlighted when you open the message. To download the attachment, press the center select key (••) to select the highlighted attachment name. The attachment is downloaded the next time you synchronize or connect to your e-mail server.

Bluetooth® wireless

Your phone supports Bluetooth wireless pairing (also called linking or bonding). You can pair your phone with a Bluetooth headset or car kit, or pair your phone with a computer to exchange and synchronize files.

Before you try to pair your phone with a device, make sure your phone's Bluetooth power is on and the device is on and ready in pairing or bonding mode (see the device user's guide). You can pair your phone with multiple devices, but only use it with one headset device at a time.

Your phone lists the devices it finds within range.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. - Get to know your Motorola mobile device and its features such as speed dial and redial. If available, these features help you to place your call without taking your attention off the road.
