

Use and Care

To care for your Motorola phone, please keep it away from:



liquids of any kind

Don't expose your phone to water, rain, extreme humidity, sweat, or other moisture. If it does get wet, don't try to accelerate drying with the use of an oven or dryer, as this may damage the phone.



dust and dirt

Don't expose your phone to dust, dirt, sand, food, or other inappropriate materials.



extreme heat or cold

Avoid temperatures below $0^{\circ}\text{C}/32^{\circ}\text{F}$ or above $45^{\circ}\text{C}/113^{\circ}\text{F}$.



cleaning solutions

To clean your phone, use only a dry soft cloth. Don't use alcohol or other cleaning solutions.



microwaves

Don't try to dry your phone in a microwave oven.

Don't drop your phone.

battery

Battery Use & Safety

- Motorola recommends you always use Motorola-branded batteries and chargers.
 - The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers. **Caution:** Use of an unqualified battery or charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. Improper battery use, or use of a damaged battery, may result in a fire, explosion, or other hazard.
- Battery usage by children should be supervised.

- Important: Motorola mobile devices are designed to work best with qualified batteries.
 If you see a message on your display such as Invalid Battery or Unable to Charge, take the following steps:
 - Remove the battery and inspect it to confirm that it bears a Motorola "Original Equipment" hologram;
 - If there is no hologram, the battery is not a qualified battery;
 - If there is a hologram, replace the battery and retry charging it;
 - If the message remains, contact a Motorola Authorized Service Center.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- Charging precautions: When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature. Never

- expose batteries to temperatures below 0°C (32°F) or above 45°C (113°F) when charging. Always take your mobile device with you when you leave your vehicle
- When storing your battery, keep it in a cool, dry place.
- It is normal over time for battery life to decrease, and for the battery to exhibit shorter runtime between charges or require more frequent or longer charging times.
- Avoid damage to battery and mobile device. Do not disassemble, open, crush, bend, deform, puncture, shred, or submerge the battery or mobile device. Avoid dropping the battery or mobile device, especially on a hard surface. If your battery or mobile device has been subjected to such damage, take it to a Motorola Authorized Service Center before using. Do not attempt to dry it with an

appliance or heat source, such as a hair dryer or microwave oven.

Use care when handling a charged battery—particularly when placing it inside a pocket, purse, or other container with metal objects. Contact with metal objects (such as jewelry, keys, beaded chains) could complete an electrical circuit (short circuit), causing the battery to become very hot, which could cause damage or injury.

Promptly dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Contact your local recycling center for proper battery disposal.

Warning: Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.

install the battery

1 Remove the battery door by pressing the release button.



2 Lift off the battery door.



3 Insert the battery by aligning the metal contacts and then gently pressing it into place.

4 Replace the battery door.

charge the battery

New batteries are not fully charged. Plug the battery charger into your phone and an electrical outlet. Your phone may take several seconds to



start charging the battery. When the battery is fully charged, your phone displays •••••.

Tip: Relax, you can't overcharge your battery. It will perform best after you fully charge and discharge it a few times.

You can also charge your battery by connecting a cable from your phone's USB port to a USB port on a computer.

Both your phone and the computer must be turned on, and your computer must have the correct software drivers installed. Cables and software drivers are available in Motorola Original data kits, sold separately.

conserve battery charge

Using certain features can quickly deplete your battery's charge. These features can include downloading music, using the camera, replaying

video clips, and using Bluetooth® wireless connections.


You can conserve your battery's charge:

- Turn Bluetooth power off when not in use (see page 100).
- Turn off the backlight (see page 37).

turn it on & off

To turn on your phone, press and hold the Power/End key () until the display turns on.

The phone may take several seconds to turn on. If prompted, enter your



four-digit unlock code (the last four digits of your phone number) and press the center select key (•••) (**OK**) to unlock the phone.

To turn off your phone, press and hold the Power/End key (2).

make a call

Enter a phone number and press the Send key ((to make a call.

To "hang up," close the phone or press the Power/End kev (10).

answer a call

When your phone rings and/or vibrates, open the phone or press to answer.

To "hang up," close the phone or press the Power/End key (100).

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store a phone number

You can store a phone number in Contacts:

- 1 Enter a phone number in the main screen and press the left soft key (() (Save).
- 3 Use the navigation key (*\hat{\phi}*) to scroll to a type of entry and press the center select key (*\hat{\phi}*) (0K).
- 4 Enter a name and other details for the phone number and press the center select key (*•) (Save) to store the number.

To edit or delete a Contacts entry, see page 92.

Tip: You can set your phone to display a picture or play a special ringtone for caller (see page 94).

call a stored phone number

- 1 From the main screen, press the right soft key (\(\subseteq\)) (Contacts) to open the Contact List quickly.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•Q•) to scroll to the entry.
- **3** Press the Send key () to call the entry.

From the main screen (page 17), you can use the following shortcuts:



main screen

The main screen appears when you turn on the phone.



Note: Your main screen might look different.

To dial a number from the main screen, press number keys and the Send key (().

Press the center select key (••) to open the main menu. *Soft key labels* show current soft key functions. (For soft key locations, see page 2.)

Tip: You can quickly select a menu option by pressing the number for that option. For example, from the **SETTINGS & TOOLS** menu, press 5 to select **Display Settings**.

Press up, down, left, or right on the navigation key $(\hat{\cdot Q} \cdot)$ to open these basic menu feature shortcuts:

alert/indicator

Y Signal Strength

EVDO indicator shows when phone is in EVDO coverage area (necessary for V CAST services). 1X indicator shows when phone is in 1x-RTT coverage area. The number of bars show the strength of each signal.

alert/indicator

Roaming

Indicates phone is roaming off your home network.

S SSL

Indicates application verification is via SSL during a download session.

□ = Data Call, Tethered, or Embedded WAP/BREW Application

Shows during data call, tethered mode, or WAP/BREW application.

□ Dormant

Indicates phone is dormant and PPP session is active.

☑ No Service

Phone is in area with no service coverage.

alert/indicator

Phone is in TTY mode.

■ Voice Call

Shows during an active voice call.

⊕ E911

Indicates E911 is On.

Indicates Location is set to On.

Battery Level

Shows battery strength. The more bars, the greater the charge.

All Sounds Off

Indicates Master Volume is set to Off.

alert/indicator

Indicates Master Volume is set to Alarm Only.

Indicates Master Volume is set to Vibrate On.

Speakerphone

Indicates speakerphone is on.

Missed Call

Indicates a call was missed.

Shows when you receive a new message.

alert/indicator

Alarm On

Shows when an alarm has been set.

■ Bluetooth Connection Active

Indicates your phone is paired with another Bluetooth device.

adjust volume

Press the volume keys to:


- · turn off an incoming call alert
- change the earpiece volume during calls with the flip open
- change the ringer volume from the main screen (with the flip open)

Tip: Sometimes silence is golden. That's why you can quickly set your ringer to **Vibrate Only** or

All Sounds Off by holding the down volume key while in the main screen

change sound settings

Press the down volume key to switch to lower call sounds volume, then switch to Vibrate Only, then Alarm Only, and, finally, All



Sounds Off. Press the up

volume key to cycle back from silent to vibrate and then to the lowest call volume setting.

handsfree speaker

You can use your phone's handsfree speaker to make calls without holding the phone to your ear.

The handsfree speaker stays on until you press and hold the smart/speakerphone key again or turn off the phone.

Note: The handsfree speaker won't work when your phone is connected to a handsfree car kit or headset.

flip open

To activate the speakerphone during a call, press and hold the smart/ speakerphone key.

You will hear an audio alert and see the speakerphone indicator ◄.

To end the call, press the Power/End key (1). You will hear an audio alert that tells you the call ended.

Note: Closing the phone while using the speakerphone does not end the call.


To turn off the speakerphone during a call, press and hold the smart/speakerphone key, or press and hold the Power/End key () to end the call.

flip closed

- Open your phone.
- **2** Press and hold the smart/speakerphone key to turn on the speakerphone.
- Enter the number you want to call and press the Send key ().
- **4** When the call connects, close the phone and continue your conversation.
- To end the call, press and hold the smart/speakerphone key. You will see Call Ended and hear a soft audio alert.

touch sensitive buttons

When the flip is closed, press any side key to activate the touch sensitive buttons:



You can use the touch sensitive buttons for the music player, vibrate mode, or Bluetooth power.

Note: To lock or unlock the touch sensitive buttons, press and hold the Smart key.

standalone mode

Note: Consult airline staff about the use of **Standalone Mode** in flight. Turn off your phone whenever instructed to do so by airline staff.

Use *standalone mode* to turn off your phone's calling features in locations where wireless phone use is prohibited. **You cannot make or receive calls or use Bluetooth in standalone mode**, but you can use your phone's other non-calling features.

- 1 Press the center select key (••) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- Press center select key (**) to select Standalone Mode.

5 Select On and press the center select key (*\ointer*) (OK).

Your phone indicates that **Standalone Mode** is set to **On** by displaying indicators and a message on the main screen:



change lock code

Your phone's four-digit **lock code** is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number. If your service provider didn't change this code, you should change it.

- 1 Press the center select key (•) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- Scroll to Security and press the center select key (♣) (OK).
- When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key (••••) (OK).
- Scroll to Edit Codes and press the center select key (•••) (OK).
- 7 Scroll to Phone Only or Calls & Services and press the center select key (�) (OK).
- 8 Enter the new four-digit lock code in the Enter New Code entry area, then press down on the navigation key (*Ô*) to move the cursor into the Re-Enter New

Code entry area. Re-enter the new four-digit lock code.

9 Press the center select key (•••) (OK).

lock & unlock phone

You can lock your phone to keep others from using it. To lock or unlock your phone, you need the four-digit lock code (which is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number).

Note: You can make emergency calls on a locked phone (see page 53). A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, **but you need to unlock it to answer**.

To manually lock your phone:

Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- Scroll to Security and press the center select key ('♠') (OK).
- When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- 6 Select Lock Phone Now and press the center select key (•♠•) (OK).

To automatically lock your phone whenever you turn it off:

- Press the center select key (••) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (••••) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.

- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 4 Scroll to Security and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- 5 When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key (♠) (**0K**).
- 6 Scroll to Phone Lock and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 7 Scroll to On Power Up and press the center select key (*\hat{\phi}*) (OK).
- 8 Press the Power/End key (1) to return to the main screen.

To unlock the phone, enter the four-digit lock code in the Enter Lock Code entry area and press the center select key $(\cdot \hat{\Phi} \cdot)$ (OK).

manage memory



You can store multimedia content such as songs and photos on your phone's internal memory or on a removable microSD memory card.

Note: If you download a copyrighted file to your phone and store it on your memory card, you can use the file only when your memory card is inserted in your phone. You cannot send, copy, or change copyrighted files.

install memory card

1 With your phone off, remove the battery door.



Remove the battery.



With the gold contacts down, slide the memory card into the slot



4 Replace the battery and the battery door.

Caution: Do not remove your memory card while your phone is using it or writing files to it.

To remove the memory card, remove the battery door, remove the battery, and carefully slide the memory card out.

set memory for multimedia content

You can set whether multimedia content that you download or create with your phone's camera is stored in phone memory or on the memory card.

- Press the center select key (*•) to open the menu.
- Use the navigation key (ô) to scroll to 2 SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- Scroll to Memory and press the center select kev (**•••**) (**0K**).
- Scroll to Save Options and press the center select key (**...**) (**0K**).
- 5 Scroll to Pictures, Videos, or Sounds, and press the center select key (*•) (OK).
- Select Phone Memory or Card Memory and press the 6 center select key (*•) (OK).

basics

view memory information

- 1 Press the center select key (�) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Memory and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 4 Select Phone Memory or Card Memory and press the center select key (•••) (OK).
- 5 Select Phone Memory Usage or Card Memory Usage; My Pictures, My Videos, My Music, or My Sounds; and press the center select key (+♠+) (OK).

move files from phone to memory card

You can move files (such as pictures, video clips, sounds, and music files) to your memory card to free up phone memory.

Note: Moving a file to the memory card deletes it from the phone.

To move photos or video clips:

- 1 From the main screen, press right on the navigation key (••••) to open * GET IT NOW.
- 2 Use the navigation key (*•Q**) to scroll to Picture & Video and press the center select key (*•Q**) (0K).
- 3 Open the appropriate list (My Pictures or My Videos).

A memory card icon in the picture thumbnail or next to a video file indicates that the **file** is stored on the memory card.

An an in the picture thumbnail indicates that the picture came preloaded on your phone and cannot be moved to the memory card.

If the picture or video is not marked with a memory card icon, it is stored on the phone.

- 4 Scroll to the file you want to move and press the right soft key () (Options).
- 5 Select Move and press the center select key $(\hat{\bullet})$ (OK).
- **6** When your phone asks if you want to move the file, select **Yes** and press the center select key (�) (**0K**) to confirm that you want to move the file.

To move an audio clip that you recorded:

- 1 From the main screen, press left on the navigation key (ô) to access Music &Tones.
- 2 Use the navigation key $(•\hat{\mathbf{Q}}•)$ to scroll to My Sounds and press the center select key $(•\hat{\mathbf{q}}•)$ (OK).

A memory card icon beside the file name of an audio clip indicates that the audio clip is stored on the memory card.

If the file name is not marked with a memory card icon, the audio clip is stored on the phone.

- 3 Scroll to the file you want to move and press the right soft key () (Options).
- 4 Select Move and press the center select key (♠) (OK).

Your phone asks if you want to move the file.

5 Select Yes and press the center select key (••)
(OK) to confirm that you want to move the file.

TTY operation

You can use an optional teletypewriter (TTY) device with your phone to send and receive calls. You must plug the TTY device into the phone's headset connector and set the phone to operate in one of three TTY modes.

Notes:

 A TTY is a communication device used by people who are hard of hearing or have a

- speech impairment. TTY does not work from mobile phone to mobile phone.
- Use a TSB-121 compliant cable (provided by the TTY manufacturer) to connect the TTY device to your phone.
- Set the phone to Medium volume level for proper operation. If you experience a high number of incorrect characters, adjust the volume as needed to minimize the error rate.
- For optimal performance, your phone should be at least 12 inches (30 centimeters) from the TTY device. Placing the phone too close to the TTY device may cause high error rates.

set TTY mode

When you set your phone to a TTY mode, it operates in that mode whenever a TTY device is connected.

- 1 Press the center select key (••) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (��•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- Scroll to Call Settings and press the center select key (+ ••••) (OK).
- Select TTY Mode and press the center select key (-♠+) (OK).

TTY Mode can include these options:

option	
TTY Full	Transmit and receive TTY characters.
TTY + Talk (VCO)	Receive TTY characters but transmit by speaking into microphone.
TTY + Hear (HCO)	Transmit TTY characters but receive by listening to earpiece.
TTY Off	All TTY modes are turned off.

When your phone is in a TTY mode, your phone displays the international TTY symbol and the mode setting during an active TTY call.

return to voice mode

To return to standard voice mode, select TTY OFF from the TTY MODE menu

handsfree

Note: The use of wireless phones while driving may cause distraction. Discontinue a call if you can't concentrate on driving. Additionally, the use of wireless devices and their accessories may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

accessory volume settings (car kit or headset)



To adjust volume of Bluetooth wireless headsets or car kit accessories, press your phone's up or down volume key during an active call.

voice privacy

Encrypt outgoing voice calls and use secure channels when available:

- Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Call Settings and press the center select key (★♠) (OK).
- Scroll to Voice Privacy and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 5 Select On and press the center select key () (OK).

personalize

sounds settings

You can set how your phone alerts you to incoming calls or other events.

master volume

- Open your phone.
- 2 Press the up or down side volume keys for the desired setting:

High, Med High, Med, Med Low, Low—Your phone rings for incoming calls and other events, depending on the detail settings.

Vibrate Only—The phone vibrates to indicate an incoming call.

Alarm Only—Your phone plays an audible alarm to alert you to events. You are not able to change detail settings for events.

All Sounds Off—The phone does not alert you to incoming calls or other events.

sounds for calls, events, & alerts

Note: Master Volume must be set to High, Med High, Med, Med Low, or Low.

To set sounds for calls:

- Press the center select key (••) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•••) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.

- 3 Scroll to Sounds Settings and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- Select Call Sounds and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- 5 Scroll to Call Ringtone and press the center select key (·♠·) (OK), then scroll to a desired ringtone and press the center select key (·♠·) (OK).

Note: Press the left soft key () (Play) to preview the ringtone.

or

From Call Sounds, scroll to Call Vibrate and press the center select key $(\cdot \hat{\phi} \cdot)$ (OK), then scroll to On or Off and press the center select key $(\cdot \hat{\Phi} \cdot)$ (OK).

6 Press the Power/End key () to return to the main screen.

To set sounds for events (such as incoming messages) or alerts:

- 1 Press the center select key (••) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Sounds Settings and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 4 Select Alert Sounds and press the center select key (- ••) (OK).
- Scroll to an alert type and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 6 Scroll to Tone and press the center select key (•••)
 (OK), then scroll to a desired ringtone and press
 the center select key (•••) (OK).

Note: Press the left soft key () (**Play**) to preview the ringtone.

or

From the TXT Message, Pic-Video Message, or Voicemail screen, scroll to Vibrate and press the center select key $(\hat{-\phi})$ (OK), then scroll to On or Off and press the center select key $(\hat{-\phi})$ (OK).

or

Scroll to Reminder and press the center select key ($\cdot \hat{\Phi} \cdot$) (OK), then scroll to Once, Every 2 Minutes, Every 15 Minutes, or Off, and press the center select key ($\cdot \hat{\Phi} \cdot$) (OK). For all settings but Off, your phone plays an audible beep at the interval you set.

7 Press the Power/End key (100) to return to the main screen.

get ringtones

- 1 From the main screen, press left on the navigation key (•Ô•) to access Music &Tones.
- Use the navigation key ('Q') to scroll to Get New Ringtones and press the center select key ('Q') (OK).
- 3 On the GET NEW RINGTONES screen, select Get New App and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
 - Your phone connects to the Get It Now site with ringtone collections. Follow the prompts on the screen to browse ringtone lists and to select and download a ringtone.
- 4 Press the Power/End key (100) to return to the main screen.

Note: Normal airtime and/or carrier usage charges may apply.

talking phone settings

You can set your phone to **speak aloud** when you press keys, receive a call with caller ID available, or scroll through recent calls or contacts:

- 1 Press the center select key (•) to open the menu.

AGPS & your location



Your phone can use the *automatic location information* (ALI) feature, along with *Assisted Global Positioning System* (AGPS) satellite signals, to tell the network where you are physically located.

When ALI is set to **Location On**, your phone displays the \oplus (ALI on) indicator. Services may use your known location to provide useful information (for example, driving directions, or the location of the nearest bank). Your phone prompts you when the network or a service asks for your location. You can refuse at this point.

When ALI is set to **911 Only**, your phone displays the Φ (ALI off) indicator, and the phone does not send location information unless you call the emergency phone number (such as 911).

- 1 Press the center select key (••) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (��) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- **4** Scroll to **Location** and press the center select key $(\hat{\phi})$ (**OK**).
- 5 Scroll to Location On or 911 Only.
- 6 Press the center select key (••) (OK) to select the setting.

AGPS limitations & tips

Your phone uses Assisted Global Positioning System (AGPS) satellite signals to estimate your location. If your phone cannot find strong satellite signals, your AGPS might be slower, less accurate, or it might not work at all. AGPS provides only an approximate location, often within 150 feet (45 meters) but sometimes much farther from your actual location.

To improve AGPS accuracy:

- Go outside and away from underground locations, covered vehicles, structures with metal or concrete roofs, tall buildings, and foliage. Indoor performance might improve if you move closer to window, but some window sun-shielding films can block satellite signals.
- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that

- might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.
- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.

AGPS uses satellites controlled by the U.S. government and subject to changes implemented in accordance with the Department of Defense AGPS user policy and the Federal Radio Navigation Plan. These changes might affect AGPS performance.

more personalizing

voice recognition

Your phone's voice recognition feature lets you make calls and complete other actions by speaking commands to your phone.

voice recognition tips

- When speaking the name of a Contacts entry, say the name exactly as it is listed. For example, to call the mobile number for an entry named Bill Smith, say "Call Bill Smith mobile." (If the entry includes only one number for Bill Smith, say "Call Bill Smith.")
- Speak numbers at a normal speed and volume, and pronounce each digit distinctly.
 Avoid pausing between digits.
- You can set your phone to play voice command instructions through the speakerphone by pressing the voice key, which opens the VOICE COMMANDS menu. If you use the Call command to place a call, audio plays through the phone's earpiece when the call connects. You can turn this feature off (see page 44).

voice commands

Choice Lists

If your phone is not sure that it has correctly identified a name or number that you speak, it can display up to three choices and prompt you to confirm the correct one.

You can control when choice lists appear:

Automatic—Display a list of choices from multiple alternatives.

Always On—Always display a list of choices when there are multiple alternatives.

Always Off—Never display a choice list. The phone chooses from the best alternatives.

voice recognition settings

Sensitivity

This setting allows you to fine tune the phone's ability to recognize voice commands.

If sensitivity is too strict, your phone will often reject voice commands and display "Please repeat ..." or "No match found." Adjust the sensitivity toward Reject Less.

If sensitivity is too forgiving, you will often experience false activations (indicating that the phone detects a wrong match). Adjust the Sensitivity setting toward Reject More.

voice recognition settings

Digit Dialing—Adapt digit dialing to your voice:

Adapt Digits—Adapt digits to improve recognition of spoken phone numbers. Adaptation takes about sixty seconds.

Reset Digits—Erase any digital adaptation you did previously and reset digit recognition to the factory default. If you have not adapted digits, this option appears in gray (not available).

voice recognition settings

Sound—Customize the voice recognition interface by turning playback on or off for prompts, names, and numbers. You can also adjust the speed and volume of name playback.

Prompts—Turn playback on or off for prompts such as "Please say a command."

Digits—Turn playback on or off for digits (for example, when confirming a phone number).

Names—Turn playback on or off for names.

Name Settings—Adjust speed and volume of name playback.

Speakerphone—Set whether your phone plays instructions through the speakerphone when you press the voice key (see "voice recognition tips" on page 40).

To access help information for a setting you speak, press the left soft key () (Info).

keypad volume

automatic redial

With automatic redial, your phone automatically redials the number for four minutes. When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates once, displays Redial Successful, and connects the call.

You must turn on automatic redial to use the feature:

Your phone keeps lists of the last calls you received and dialed, even if the calls didn't connect. The most recent calls are listed first. The oldest calls are deleted as new calls are added.

return missed calls

Your phone keeps a record of your missed calls, and displays [Number] Missed Calls.

1 When you see the missed call alert, select View Now and press the center select key (*•) (0K) to see the missed calls list.

or

Select View Later and press the center select key (*\oplus**) (OK). The missed call indicator (*\overline*) appears on the bottom of the main screen until you view recent calls by pressing the Send key ((\overline*)).

- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to the call you want to return.
- 3 Press the Send key () to make the call.

speed dial

Note: Speed dial number 1 is already assigned to your voice mail number.

To assign a speed dial number to an entry:

- 1 Press the center select key (••) to open the menu. CONTACTS is automatically selected.
- 2 Use the navigation key (••) to scroll to Speed Dials and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- 3 Scroll to an unassigned speed dial number and press the center select key (�・) (SFI).
- 4 Scroll to a contact in the Contacts list and press the center select key (♠) (**OK**).
- 5 Select a number for that contact and press the center select key (-.) (OK).
- 6 Select Yes and press the center select key (♠) (OK).

To see an entry's speed dial number:

- 1 From the main screen, press the right soft key () (Contacts) to open the Contact List.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to the entry and press the center select key (•�•) (View). The speed dial number is displayed with the \$\mathcal{E}\$ icon.

To speed dial an entry:

Call speed dial entries 1 through 9 by pressing and holding the one-digit speed dial number for one second.

For two-digit speed dial numbers, enter the first number, then press and hold the second number for one second.

emergency calls

Your service provider programs emergency phone numbers, such as 911, that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked.

- 1 Enter the emergency number.
- 2 Press the Send key (10).

Note: Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

AGPS during an emergency call



When you make an emergency call, your phone can use Assisted Global Positioning System (AGPS)

satellite signals to tell the emergency response center your approximate location.

The AGPS feature has limitations, so always tell the emergency response center your best knowledge of your location. Remain on the phone for as long as the emergency response center instructs you.

AGPS might not work for emergency calls:

- Your phone's AGPS feature must be turned on (see page 38).
- Your local emergency response center might not process AGPS location information. For details, contact your local authorities.

For best results:

 Go outside and away from underground locations, covered vehicles, structures with metal or concrete roofs, tall buildings, and foliage. Indoor performance might improve if you move closer to windows, but some window sun shielding films can block satellite signals.

 Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.

If your phone cannot find strong AGPS satellite signals, the location of the nearest cell tower in contact with your phone is automatically provided to the emergency response center.

voicemail

Your network stores the voicemail messages you receive. When you **receive** a voicemail message, your phone shows the voicemail message indicator **2** "I.

Note: Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

Select Listen Now and press the center select key (•••) (OK) to dial voicemail.

or

Select Listen Later and press the center select key (••) (OK). The voicemail message indicator (2") appears on the bottom of the main screen until you listen to your message.

To check voicemail messages later, press and hold 1 to call your voicemail number.



call times & data volumes

Network connection time is the elapsed time from the moment you connect to your service provider's network to the moment you end the call by pressing the Power/End key (①). This time includes busy signals and ringing.

The amount of network connection time you track on your resettable timer may not equal the amount of time for which you are billed by your service provider. For billing information, contact your service provider.

call times







select entry mode

Multiple entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The default mode is **Abc** (tap mode, first character of a sentence in uppercase).

To select an entry mode from the NEW TXT MESSAGE screen, press the left soft key () (Abc), then select an entry mode.

To select an entry mode from the CONTACT LIST screen, press the left soft key (\bigcirc) (Edit), and then press the left soft key (\bigcirc) (Abc).

When your cursor is in a text field, you can select one of these entry modes:

entry modes	
iTAP English	The phone predicts each word (in English) as you press keys.
iTAP Spanish	The phone predicts each word (in Spanish) as you press keys.
Abc	Enter numbers and letters, first character of a sentence in uppercase.


tap mode

This is the standard mode for entering text on your phone. Regular tap mode cycles through the letters, numbers, and symbols of the key you press.

- Press a key one or more times to select a letter, number, or symbol.
- **2** Enter the remaining characters in the same way.

Tip: Press # to enter a space.

When you enter text with tap mode, the soft key functions change:



- Press left or right on the navigation key (�)
 to move the flashing cursor in a text message.
- If you don't want to save your text or text edits, press the Power/End key () twice to exit without saving.

iTAP® mode

iTAP software provides a predictive text entry method that combines your key presses into common words.

When you enter three or more letters in a row, your phone may guess the rest of the word. For example, if you enter prog, your phone might show:



If you want a different word (such as progress), continue pressing keys to enter the remaining letters.

If you enter a word the phone does not recognize, the phone stores it as a new word option. When you fill

memory space for new word options, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new ones.

- Scroll up or down to view other possible combinations, and select the one you want.
- Press right on the navigation key (•Q•) to enter the highlighted combination when it spells a word. A space is inserted automatically after the word.
- To enter numbers quickly, press and hold a number key to temporarily switch to numeric mode. Press the number keys to enter the numbers you want.
- Press 1 to enter punctuation or other characters.

numeric mode

After selecting numeric mode, press number keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press the left soft key () (123) to switch to another entry mode.

symbol mode

After selecting the symbols mode, in the **SYMBOLS** screen, use the navigation key $(•\hat{\mathbf{Q}}•)$ to scroll to the desired symbol and press the center select key $(•\hat{\mathbf{Q}}•)$ (**OK**) to select it.







Specific Absorption Rate Data

This model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg. ¹ Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR

level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. T-Ratings: Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch") than unrated phones. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. (Note that not all hearing devices have telecoils in them.)

Hearing devices may also be measured for immunity to this type of interference. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find results for your hearing device. The more immune your hearing aid is, the less likely you are to experience interference noise from mobile phones.



 Get to know your Motorola mobile device and its features such as speed dial and redial. If available, these features help you to place your call without taking your attention off the road. When available, use a handsfree device. If possible, add an additional layer of convenience to your mobile device with one of the many Motorola Original handsfree accessories available today.



- Position your mobile device within easy reach. Be able to access your mobile device without removing your eyes from the road. If you receive an incoming call at an inconvenient time, if possible, let your voice mail answer it for you.
- Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, ice, and even heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving. Jotting down a "to do" list or going through your

- address book takes attention away from your primary responsibility—driving safely.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when your car is not moving or before pulling into traffic. If you must make a call while moving, dial only a few numbers, check the road and your mirrors, then continue.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that can divert your attention away from the road.
- Use your mobile device to call for help. Dial 911 or other local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident, or medical emergencies.*
- Use your mobile device to help others in emergencies. If you see an auto accident, crime in progress, or other serious emergency where lives are in danger, call 911 or other local emergency number, as you would want others to do for you.*
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless assistance number when necessary.
