

### Turn it on & off

To turn on your phone, press Power 0 (on the top right).

To turn off your phone, press and hold Power (10), then touch Power off in the menu that opens.

Note: This phone supports data-intensive apps and services. It is strongly recommended that you purchase a data plan that meets your needs. Contact your service provider for details.

#### Wi-Fi connect

If you want to use a Wi-Fi network for even faster Internet access, press Home (a) > (a) Settings > Wireless Lan Settings. Touch WLAN to turn on, search for and connect to wireless networks. There's more in "Wi-Fi<sup>TM</sup>" on page 34.

#### Cool content & more

Browse and download thousands of the coolest apps on the planet from the Internet. On top of that, you get a full HTML browser, so you can surf in style.

Download new apps from the "Web" on page 29. Your phone comes with 122 MB of internal memory, and an optional microSD memory card (upto 16 GB) can be installed—you can load it up with photos, videos, and

music from your computer using "USB drag & drop" on page 35.

### Touchscreen & keys

a few essentials

### Touch tips

Here are some tips on how to navigate around your phone. With the flip closed, you can use your finger to touch the flip touchscreen. With the flip open, use the stylus to touch the phone touchscreen.

#### Touch

To choose an icon or option, touch it. Try it: In the home screen, touch 
Contacts.

#### Touch & hold

To open special options, touch and hold an icon or other item. Try it: In the home screen, touch **Contacts**, then touch and hold a contact to open options.




#### Drag

To scroll through a list or move slowly, *drag* across the touchscreen. Try it: In the home screen, touch

**Contacts**, then drag your contacts list up or down.

**Tip:** When you drag or flick a list, a *scroll bar* appears on the right. Drag the scroll bar to move the list to a letter A - Z.



#### Flick

To scroll through a list or move quickly, *flick* across the touchscreen (drag quickly and release).

**Tip:** When you flick a long list, touch the screen to stop it from scrolling.

### Key tips

#### Menu, home, & back

Press Home (a) to close any menu or app and return to the home screen. Press and hold Home (a) to show the last few apps you used, then touch an app to open it.

Touch Menu 🔡 to open menu options, or Back 🝮 to go back.



#### Sleep & wake up

To save your battery, prevent accidental touches, or when you want to wipe smudges off your touchscreen, put the touchscreen to sleep by pressing Power  $\boxed{\mathbf{O}}$ .

To wake up the touchscreen, press Home (a), then drag the moving circle to the bottom left corner of the screen.

Tip: To change how long your phone waits before the screen goes to sleep automatically, press Home (a) > (a) Settings > Display settings > Screen timeout.



#### Power key menu

Press and hold Power ① to turn off the phone (**Power off**), or set the mode (**Normal mode**, **Vibrate mode**, **Silent mode**, **Outdoor mode**), or turn on or off **Airplane mode**.

#### Adjust volume

Press the volume keys to change the ring volume (in the home screen), or the earpiece volume (during a call).



#### Quick start: Home screen

The short home screen gives you a few apps to play with. It's what you see when you turn on the phone or close the flip. It's basically like this:



The home screen gives you all your latest information in one place. It's what you see when you open the flip or press Home from a menu. It's basically like this:



### Use & change your home screen

On your home screen, *shortcuts* open your favorite apps, bookmarks, contacts and more.

Flick the home screen left/right to see more panels of shortcuts.

Tip: You can also touch the numbered squares at the bottom of the screen and then touch the panel number.

- To open something, touch it. Press Home a to return to the home screen.
  - You can find details about the settings for **Messages** ("Set up messaging" on page 16) or Mobile Music ("Music" on page 25).
- To add something, touch and hold an empty spot until you see the options. You can add apps, shortcuts, tools, and widgets.
- To change your wallpaper, touch Menu 🔡 > Wallpaper.
- To move or delete something, touch and hold it until you feel a vibration, then drag it to another spot, another panel, or into the trash.

#### Search

Use the search field on the home screen to search your phone and the web (**Device** or **Web**). To search, touch the field, enter text, then touch [Q] Search.



Type, then touch the icon for a text search.

#### Phone status & notifications

At the top of the screen, icons on the left notify you about new messages or events (flick the bar down for details) Icons on the right tell you about phone status:

### Home settings

Change your homescreen view to Moto home screen or OMS home screen.

Find it: Home (a) > Settings > Home settings > Select home > Moto Home

Find it: Home Settings > Home settings > Select home > OMS Launcher

Note: Your home screen may vary.

To return to the standard home screen press Home  $\boxed{\triangle} > \bigcirc \bigcirc$  Settings > Display settings > Home settings > Florid Home.

Dialing options

Find it: Home > Phone



#### In-call options



Note: Your video call options may be different.

Tip: To use other features during a call, like **Contacts**, press Home (a) or Back (5) to hide the active call display. To reopen it, touch No Phone.

#### Make & answer calls

To make a call, touch | Phone, enter a number, then touch &

To enter the international dialing code, touch and hold #.

To answer a call, touch **Answer**.

If your phone is locked, drag up to answer.

Note: When you hold your phone to your ear, the display goes dark to avoid accidental touches. When you move your phone away from your ear, the display lights up again.

#### End calls

To end a call, touch **End**. Touch **Decline** to send an incoming call to voicemail.

Tip: If your phone is locked, drag down to hang up.

#### Video calls

Make a call and see each other while you talk, you'll both need a 3G video phone. If your phone is roaming on a non-3G network, video calls will not work.

To make a video call, touch Sphone, enter a number, then touch Video call. To end a video call, touch End.

#### Speed dial

## Find it: Home > Settings > Call settings > Speed dial

- To add or edit entries, touch a number, then touch Menu Bb > Save.
- To clear entries, touch a number, then touch Menu
   > Discard.
- To call, touch Phone, then touch a number.

#### Handsfree

**Note:** Using a mobile device or accessory while driving may cause distraction and may be illegal. Always obey the laws and drive safely.

To use the speakerphone during a call , touch **Speaker**:

### Mute, hold & record

During a call:

- To mute the current call, touch Mute.
- To put a call on hold, touch Hold.
- To record the current call, touch Record.

### Enter numbers during a call

To enter numbers during a call, touch **Keypad** and then touch the number.

#### Recent calls

Find it: Home > Phone > Call log

- To call a number, touch it.
- To send a text message or contact, make voice or video call, or other options, touch and hold an entry.
- To filter the list, touch Menu > Category.
- To clear the list, touch Menu > Delete.

### Conference calls

To start a conference call, call the first number. After they answer, touch **Hold**, then **New call** and call the next number. When the next number answers, touch **Merge**.

### Your phone number

Find it: Home > Settings > Call settings > My caller number

#### Your caller ID

To hide your number from the people you call, press Home Settings > Settings > Call settings > Other basic settings > Caller number.

### **Emergency calls**

Note: Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers (such as 911 or 112) that

you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked. Emergency numbers vary by country. Your pre-programmed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

- 1 Press Home > Phone (if your phone is locked, touch **Emergency**).
- 2 Enter the emergency number.
- 3 Touch Call to call the emergency number.

**Note:** Your mobile device can use AGPS satellite signals to help emergency services find you ("GPS & AGPS" on page 87).

### Call forwarding & waiting

You can forward calls all the time, or only when your phone is busy, unanswered, or unreachable (not on the network):

Find it: Home > Settings > Call settings > Voice call forwarding

When you're on a call and a second call comes in, **Call waiting** lets you answer it by touching **Answer**. You can turn off **Call waiting**, to send second calls straight to your voicemail:

Find it: Home > Settings > Call settings > Other basic settings > Call waiting

### Restrict outgoing calls

To restrict your phone so that it can only dial a few numbers:

Find it: Home > Settings > Call settings > Fixed dialing number


- To turn fixed dialing on, touch FDN is disabled.
- To add or delete the allowed numbers, touch Manage FDN list.

#### Contacts

contacts like you've never had before

### Quick start: Contacts

Find it: Home (a) > 🚣 Contacts



**Tip:** To search the list, touch  $\bigcirc$  to open a display keypad, then type a name. When you flick or drag this list, a scroll bar appears on the right. Drag the scroll bar to move the list faster.

### Import contacts from your SIM

If you need to import the contacts from your SIM card, touch  $\ref{eq:contacts}$ , then touch Menu  $\ref{eq:contacts}$  > Copy to phone.

## Call, text, or email contacts

Find it: Home > E Contacts

For **Voice call**, **Video call**, **Send msg**, **Send contact**, or other options, touch and hold the contact.

### View & use contacts

Find it: Home (a) > Contacts

- To filter the contacts by group, touch the filter name at the top.
- To find a contact, just type the name.
   Touch a contact to open their details. Touch Menu to start a call, send a message, and more.

#### Online contacts

**My PIM** is a service provided by China Mobile to synchronize your contacts, calendar and tasks.

Find it: Home 🝙 > 😺 My PIM

#### Edit or delete contacts

Find it: Home > E Contacts

Touch the contact, then touch Menu ( )> **Edit** or **Delete**. You can set a ringer, address, and other details.

Where are contacts edited or deleted? Your phone edits the contacts in its memory. Your changes won't affect your SIM card.

#### Create contacts

Find it: Home > Contacts > New

Touch a field to type name and details.



When you're finished, touch Save.

Where are contacts saved? You can choose where to save new contacts: Stored location:Phone or Stored location:SIM card

#### Synchronize contacts

When you change one of your **Contacts**, you can synchronize your contacts, see "Synchronize with Backup" on page 75.

### Groups

You can put your **Contacts** into groups that you create (like "friends," "family," or "work"). Then, you can find contacts faster by showing one group at a time.


To create a group in your **Contacts**, touch **Groups** > **New**. Enter a group name, then touch Menu  $\stackrel{\blacksquare}{\blacksquare}$  > **Save**. To add members, touch a group name, then touch Menu  $\stackrel{\blacksquare}{\blacksquare}$  > **Add**.

To show only one group in your **Contacts**, touch **Groups** at the top of your screen and choose the group name.

### Messaging

### Quick start: Messaging



Tip: To switch between folder and message view touch Menu [ ] > Folder view or Message view. To see more messages, flick or drag up.

### Read & reply to messages

Every text and email is automatically delivered to you, ready for your immediate reply. The best part is you

don't have to dig through any apps, screens or menus—every message streams right to the phone, viewable exactly the way you want.

Find it: Home (a) > Messaging > Inbox

- To open a message, touch it.
- To respond to a message, just open it and touch Menu 🔠 > Reply. Type your response and touch Send
- For email, touch Messaging > Menu 🔠 > Enter Mail.

### Create messages

Find it: Home (a) > Messaging > New

Choose a message type, then enter the recipient and message. In text messages and emails, touch Menu 🔡 for options, like Add subject, Add page, or Discard.

### Send & receive attachments

To send a file in a message, open a new message and touch 🔊.

When you receive a message with an attachment, open the message and touch the file name to download it. Then, touch the name again to open it. Some file formats can be converted to HTML for faster viewing, and your phone will show a button that says Get HTML version.

Tip: To send and receive large attachments faster, use a Wi-Fi connection, in "Wi-Fi™" on page 34.

### Set up messaging

To add email accounts, press Home (a) > [ Mail > Others

**Email** is for personal email accounts. For account details, contact the account provider.

Note: While you are using a Wi-Fi network, you cannot access Yahoo Mail accounts. You can still use your browser to see these accounts at mail.vahoo.com.

To change your settings, press Home (a) > Messaging > Menu 🔛 > Enter mail > Others to change your user name or password.

### Instant messages

To send and receive instant messages, you can use **Fetion** or your browser.

- To use the instant messaging app, press Home (♠) > **№ Fetion**.
- To use your browser, press Home ( )> Browser > Menu 🔠 > Settings, then enter your provider's Web site and touch Go. Once you're there, follow the link to sign in.

**Note:** Your IM options will depend on your IM provider. To browse instant messaging apps, go to <a href="https://www.android.com/market">www.android.com/market</a>.

#### Voicemail

When you have a new voicemail, on shows at the top of your screen. To hear the voicemail, press Home > Phone, then touch and hold your voicemail number. To set your voicemail number, in the home screen press Home > Settings > Call settings > Voice mail.

### **Text entry**





### Battery tips

Your phone is like a small computer, giving you a lot of information and apps, at 3G speed, with a touch display! Depending on what you use, that can take a lot of power. So, if you want to save battery life between charges, you could reduce:

- recording or watching videos, listening to music, or taking pictures.
- WiFi™, and Bluetooth™ use: Press Home (a) >
   Settings, then touch Bluetooth or Wireless Lan settings > WLAN to turn them off or on.
- network searching: If you are out of coverage, to stop your phone from looking for networks, press and hold Power ① to open the Power key menu, then touch Airplane mode.

- display timeout delay: Home > Settings > Display settings > Screen timeout > (shorter setting).

#### Add shortcuts

- 1 Find an empty spot on your home screen where you want to add a shortcut. You can flick left or right to see other panels on your home screen.
- 2 Touch and hold the empty spot until you see a menu.

- 4 From the list, touch the app, shortcut, or tool you want.

### Add widgets

- 1 Find an empty spot on your home screen where you want to add a widget. You can flick left or right to see other panels on your home screen.
- 2 Touch and hold the empty spot until you see the a menu.
- 3 Touch Remote widget.
- 4 From the list, touch the widget you want.

#### **Profiles**

For incoming calls and other events, use profiles to set ringstyles and volume settings.

### Find it: Home > Settings > Profiles

You can select from the profiles listed profiles. To edit a profile just touch it. To create a new profile, press Menu 📳 > **New**.

#### Sounds

To choose your ringtone and volume press Home ( ) > ( ) Settings > Sound settings > Ringtone or Volume.

### Display settings

To set your display brightness and screen timeout press Home (a) > (a) Settings > Display settings > Brightness or Screen timeout.

Set date, time, time zone, and formats:

Set your menu language and region:

Find it: Home > Settings > Language and input > Select Language

Touch screen to show photo options.

To take the photo, press Camera .

Tip: Press the volume keys to zoom in and out.

When you see "Touch image for more options" touch the screen, then touch **Share** or **Delete**.

In the viewfinder touch Menu 🔠 > Gallery, then touch a photo.

- To set the photo as a wallpaper, touch Menu > Wallpaper.
- To send the photo in a message, touch Menu 🔡 > **Share**. For more info on sharing your photos, see "Share your photo gallery" on page 22.
- To delete the photo and return to the previous photo, touch Menu : > Delete.
- To show photo details, touch Menu 🔡 > Properties.

When you see "Touch video for more options" touch the screen, then touch to play, **Share**, or **Delete**.

In the viewfinder touch the screen, then touch Menu [ ] > **Gallery** to see a thumbnail of your videos.

To play the video, touch the thumbnail.

To delete the video, touch Menu 📳 > Delete.

### Set up music

#### What music transfer tools do I need?

To put music on your computer and then load it on your phone, you need:

- A Microsoft<sup>TM</sup> Windows<sup>TM</sup> PC.
- A USB data cable.

#### Do I need a memory card?

Your music can be stored on phone's internal memory (122 MB) or your memory card. Your phone supports removable microSD memory cards up to 16 GB capacity. To make sure your memory card is installed, go to "Assemble & charge" on page 3.

Tip: To see the available memory on your phone and memory card, press Home (a) > (a) Settings > Storage information.

#### What music file formats can I play?

Your phone can play many types of files: MP3, M4A, AAC, ACC+, MIDI, WAV, and OGG Vorbis.

**Note:** Your phone does not support any DRM protected files.

#### What headphones can I use?

You can go wireless with Bluetooth™ stereo headphones or speakers (see "Bluetooth™ wireless" on page 32).

#### Transfer using USB

Transfer music files from a computer to your memory card

- 1 With a memory card inserted, and your phone showing the home screen, connect a Motorola micro USB data cable from your phone's micro USB port to a USB port on your computer. Your phone should show a in the status bar.
  - Note: Your phone supports Microsoft™ Windows™ XP, and Windows Vista™. Other operating systems may not be compatible.
- 2 Your phone shows a USB connection dialog. Touch UMS mode. You can't use the files on your memory card while it is connected.
- 3 Find "Removable Device" (your memory card) in the "My Computer" window.

**Note:** Your phone's internal memory is also shown as a "Removable Device", so highlight and select "Properties" to check.

- 4 Drag and drop your music to a folder on your memory card.
  - **Tip:** To help manage your music, create a "Music" folder on your memory card.
- 5 When you're done, use the "Safely Remove Hardware" feature to finish.

### Music library

Open your music library, then select what you want to play.


Your music is stored by artists, albums, songs, and playlists. Touch a category, then touch the song or playlist you want to play.

When you see 
in the status bar, a song is playing, flick down to see details. Touch the song to return to the music controls.

To turn off your music, touch .

To add a song from the music library to a playlist, touch and hold the song then touch Add to playlist. Choose an existing playlist. From the music library you can create new playlists, touch Playlists > Menu 🔡 > Create.

To add a song to the playlist you're playing, touch Menu : > Add to in the music player.

To edit, delete and rename playlists, touch and hold the playlist, in the music library.

#### Quick start: Badio

Listen to news and music anywhere, for free.

Find it: Home > FM Radio



To tune stations, touch Menu 🔡 > More > Scan.

To change volume, touch the side volume keys. To use the loudspeaker, touch Menu 🔠 > More > By Loudspeaker.

To turn off the radio, touch Menu 🔠 > **Exit FM**.

#### use radio presets

To **store** the current station as a preset, touch Menu  $\mathbb{R} >$ **Save Channel**.

To go to a preset station, touch the channel number.

To manage presets, touch the channel number, then touch Menu 🔡 > Edit Channel.

To **clear** presets, touch the channel number, then touch Menu (B) > **Clear Chan...**.

# Battery Use & Safety

Important: Handle and store batteries properly to avoid injury or damage.

Most battery issues arise from improper handling of batteries, and particularly from the continued use of damaged batteries.

#### DON'Ts

- Don't disassemble, crush, puncture, shred, or otherwise attempt to change the form of your battery.
- Don't let the phone or battery come in contact with water. Water can get into the phone's circuits, leading to corrosion. If the phone and/or battery get wet, have them checked by your service provider or contact Motorola, even if they appear to be working properly.\*
- Don't allow the battery to touch metal objects. If metal objects, such as
  jewelry, stay in prolonged contact with the battery contact points, the battery
  could become very hot.

# Specific Absorption Rate (IEEE)

Your model wireless phone meets the governmental requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The quidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed for the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health, and to account for any variations in measurements. The exposure standard for mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The IEEE SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 watts per kilogram (W/kg), averaged over one gram of tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using procedures accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequencies. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be below the maximum value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a mobile device is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed

the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) submitted to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this mobile device when tested for use at the ear is 0.117 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this guide, is 0.93 W/kg. The SAR value for this mobile device in its data transmission mode (body-worn use) is 0.306 W/kg. Body-worn measurements can differ, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements. The SAR information includes the Motorola testing protocol, assessment procedure, and measurement uncertainty range for this product. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various mobile devices and at various positions, they meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.
