Quick start: App menu

The app menu shows you all of your applications. To open it from the home screen, touch \odot . To close it, touch Home $\widehat{\odot}$.

Note: Your main menu will vary.

Recent apps

Touch and hold Home (a) to see the last few apps you used, then touch the app you want. Touch Home (a) to return to the home screen.

Social networking

my life, your life

Add accounts

When you add your **Facebook**, **MySpace**, or **Twitter** social networking accounts to MOTOBLUR, friends appear in your phone's **Contacts**, and status updates appear in **Social Status** and **Social Networking** widgets.

Find it: Menu > Settings > Accounts > Add account

Sign into your social networking account with the user name or email and password that you set up on that account (the same as on your computer). If you don't have social networking accounts, you can visit their web sites to set them up.

Note: Your network or other factors might affect the speed of widget updates. To download updates faster, see "Wi-FiTM" on page 50.

Update your status

After you add a social networking account to MOTOBLUR, you can update your status in a **Social Status** widget.

To add a **Social Status** widget, touch and hold an empty spot on your home screen, then touch **Motorola widgets**.

To update your status, just touch a **Social Status** widget and enter text. If you have more than one account, you can use the pull-down menu to limit which accounts are updated. When you open the widget, a number on the right side means you have unread status comments (touch it to open them).

View account updates & features

After you add a social networking account to MOTOBLUR, you can open and respond to friends' updates with a **Social Networking** widget.



To add a **Social Networking** widget, touch and hold an empty spot on your home screen, then touch **Motorola widgets**.

To open the **Social Networking** widget, touch it. Then:

Touch a person's name to open their info.

- · Touch the widget title to open a list view.
- Touch 2 to open the full update, then touch the social network's icon to open its web site.

To change which accounts or contacts appear in a **Social Networking** widget, open the widget and touch Menu . Then, choose **Services** (accounts), or **Show updates for** (contacts).

Edit & delete accounts

Find it: Menu > Settings > Accounts

Touch and hold an account, then touch **Open account** to edit it, or touch **Remove account** to remove it (along with its contacts and messages).

Dialing options

Find it: Phone



When you enter a number to dial, touch Menu (a) to add a pause (pauses two seconds), or wait (waits for your confirmation).

Touch to close dialer.

In-call options



During a call, touch Menu 📳 to choose **Bluetooth** (to use a wireless headset). Your touchscreen goes dark to avoid accidental touches. To wake it up, press Power 💽.

Tip: You can touch Home (a) or Back (5) to hide the active call display. To reopen it, touch (7) **Phone**.

Make, answer & end calls

To make a call, touch Phone, enter a number, then touch C to make the call over a CDMA network, or touch G to make the call over a GSM network.

Tip: To enter the international dialing code, touch and hold .

To answer a call, drag to the right.

To ignore a call, drag to the left.

To end a call, touch **End**.



Favorites

Find it: Phone > Favorites

- To call a number, touch it.
- To search, add, or delete entries, touch Menu

Handsfree

Note: Using a mobile device or accessory while driving may cause distraction and may be illegal. Always obey the laws and drive safely.

During a call:

- To use the speakerphone, touch Speaker.
- To use a Bluetooth™ device, touch Menu В
 Bluetooth.

Tip: You can purchase a Motorola car dock to turn your phone into an on-board navigator, handsfee device, music player and more, all while recharging it. Follow the dock's instructions to dock your phone. Then, touch > • CarDock and choose an option before you drive.

Mute, hold & record

During a call:

- To mute the current call, touch Mute.
- To put a call on hold, touch Hold.
- To record the current call, touch Voice Record.

Enter numbers during a call

To enter numbers during a call, touch Dialpad.

Recent calls

Find it: Phone > Call log

 Touch an entry to call it, send a text message, view call details, add the number to a firewall list of blocked calls or add the number to a firewall VIP list.

- To filter the list, touch the view name (like All calls) at the top.
- To delete a call from the list, touch Menu 📳 > **Delete**.

Conference calls

To start a conference call, call the first number. After they answer, touch **Add call** and call the next number. When the next number answers, touch **Merge calls**.

Your phone number

Find it: Menu 📳 > Settings > About phone > Status > CDMA status or GSM status

The status page lists your phone number.

Your caller ID

To hide your number from the people you call, touch Menu [8] > Settings > Call settings > CDMA network call settings or GSM network call settings > Additional call settings > Caller ID.

Call forwarding & waiting

You can forward calls all the time, or only when your phone is busy, unanswered, or unreachable (not on the network):

Find it: Menu 🔠 > Settings > Call settings > CDMA network call settings or GSM network call settings > Call forwarding

When you're on a call and a second call comes in, call waiting lets you answer it. You can turn off call waiting, to send second calls straight to your voicemail:

Find it: Menu 🔠 > Settings > Call settings > CDMA network call settings or GSM network call settings > Additional call settings > Call waiting

Restrict outgoing calls

To restrict your phone so that it can only dial a few numbers:

Find it: Menu 📆 > Settings > Call settings > CDMA network call settings or GSM network call settings > Fixed Dialing Numbers

- To turn fixed dialing on, touch Enable FDN.
- To add or delete the allowed numbers, touch FDN list.

Cool down

In very limited circumstances, such as where your phone has been exposed to extreme heat, "Cool Down" message screens will appear. To avoid possible damage to your battery and phone, you should follow

these instructions until the phone is within its recommended temperature range. When your phone is in "Cool Down" mode, only emergency calls can be made.

Emergency calls

Note: Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers (such as 911 or 112) that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked. Emergency numbers vary by country. Your pre-programmed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

- 1 Open the phone, then touch **Phone** (if your phone is locked, touch **Emergency Call**).
- 2 Enter the emergency number.
- 3 Touch **Call** to call the emergency number.



Contacts List

Touch a contact to call or email. Touch & hold to text, add to favorites, edit, or delete the contact.

Menu Options

Touch Menu 📳 to add, share, copy, backup, or delete contacts.

Transfer contacts

Your MOTOBLUR™ account merges your contacts from your social networking and email accounts into

one phonebook. All you need to do is add your accounts to MOTOBLUR, and it will handle the rest!

Tip: If you add a **Corporate Sync** account, you can send messages to your coworkers, even if you don't have them stored in your contacts.

- To transfer contacts with a computer, export them into a .CSV file on your computer. Then, go to www.motorola.com/mymotoblur, log into your MOTOBLUR account, and upload the .CSV file.

Call, text, or email contacts

View & use contacts

With a MOTOROLA **XT882** with MOTOBLUR, you'll know what everybody's up to and when. Every time you pick up a call, check a message, or look up a friend's contact info, sure, you'll see their name and number, but you'll see their social network status and smiling face, too.

To filter the contacts by group, touch Menu B
 > Display options > All, Phone, Social Network
 and so on. Touch the filter name you want then
 touch Done.

Tip: To change which account provides the pictures for your **Contacts**, from the home screen touch Menu **3** > **More Accounts** > **Picture source**.

- To change views, flick the list left or right to show contact History, A-Z, or Status.

- To send a contact's details in a message or over a Bluetooth connection, touch and hold the contact, then choose Share name card.

Tip: To add a shortcut to one of your contacts, touch and hold a blank spot on your home screen and then touch Motorola widgets > Contact quick tasks.



Edit or delete contacts

Find it: Contacts

To edit or delete contacts, touch and hold the contact, then touch **Edit contact** or **Delete contact**. You can set a ringer, address, and other details that will be saved on your phone and your MOTOBLUR account.

Where are contacts edited or deleted? Your phone edits the contacts in its memory, and also updates your MOTOBLUR account. Your changes won't affect your SIM card.

Tip: You can hide a contact's social status updates, or name (so their name appears for incoming calls and messages, but not in your in your Contacts). Open the contact, touch Menu 📳 > Edit > Additional info, then choose Hide in Contacts list or Hide social activity.

Link contacts

You might have two **Contacts** for the same person; maybe a Facebook friend who is also stored on your

SIM card, or one friend with two email addresses. To combine these two contacts:


Touch a contact to open it, then touch Menu (a) > Link contact and touch the second entry. Your MOTOBLUR account remembers this connection.

Create contacts

Find it: Contacts

To create a contact, touch Menu 🔛 > **New contact**.

Select the account to save the contact to, then enter the contact name and details.



Where are contacts saved? Your phone saves new contacts in its memory, your MOTOBLUR account, and other accounts you select: In Contacts, touch Menu [] > More > Settings to choose which accounts get updated. New contacts won't be on your SIM card, but they will download to any new

MOTOBLUR phone when you log into your MOTOBLUR account.

Synchronize contacts

When you change one of your **Contacts**, your phone automatically updates your MOTOBLUR account online. Also, your phone updates your **Contacts** and MOTOBLUR account whenever you change a friend in your social networking accounts.

So, you don't have to do anything to synchronize your **Contacts** with your other accounts! MOTOBLUR takes care of it for you.

Groups

You can put your contacts into groups that you create (like "friends," "family," or "work"). Then, you can find contacts faster by showing one group at a time.

To create a group in your contacts, touch Menu 🚼 > **Group management**, then touch Menu 📆 > **New group**. Enter a group name, then touch **Done**. To add members to the group, touch it, then touch Menu 📆 > **Add member**.


To show only one group in your contacts, touch Menu $^{\blacksquare n}$ > **Group management**, then touch the group.

Tip: To see more messages, flick or drag up.

Read & reply to messages

To open a message and all of its replies, touch it.

- To respond to a message, open it and enter your response in the text box at the bottom of the screen.
- To open options, touch and hold a message.

Create messages

Find it: Messaging >

Enter the recipient and message. In text messages and emails, touch Menu 🔡 for options, like Add subject, Add Cc, or Insert contact.

Send & receive attachments

To send a file in a message, open a new message and touch Menu 🛗 > Attach.

When you receive a message with an attachment, open the message and touch the file name to download it. Then, touch the name again to open it. Some file formats can be converted to HTML for faster. viewing, and your phone will show a button that says Get HTML version.

Tip: To send and receive large attachments faster, see "Wi-FiTM" on page 50.

Set up messaging

To add email accounts, touch Menu 📳 > Settings > Accounts > Add account.

Corporate Sync is for Microsoft[™] Exchange server work email accounts. Enter details from your IT administrator.

Tip: You might need to enter your domain name with your user name (like domain/username). To enter a backslash, touch Symbols [SYM].

Note: Some work accounts might require you to add a password lock to your phone, for security. To stop an account from showing the contacts you create on your phone, touch ... Contacts, touch Menu 🔡 > More > Settings, then uncheck the account.

 Email is for most personal and other accounts that aren't on a Microsoft™ Exchange Server. For account details, contact the account provider and for setup see "Email" on page 22.

To change your settings, touch P Messaging > Menu 🔛 > **Settings**.

Tip: For social network accounts, see "Add accounts" on page 12.



Take that family photo, and post it online for everyone to see. Your camera has a built-in flash, for perfect photos every time.

Note: Photos are stored on your microSD memory card. **Picture Resolution** is 8MP, unless you change it.

To take the photo, lightly press the Camera key halfway until the autofocus box turns green, then press all the way to take the photo.

Your phone shows a brief preview and then stores the photo. To **see** the photo, touch the viewfinder, then touch the photo thumbnail. Then:

- To set the photo as a wallpaper or contact photo, touch More > Set as.
- To send the photo in a message or post it online, touch Select an action > Photo Share or Messaging or Bluetooth. For more info on sharing your photos, see "Share a photo" on page 27.
- To upload the photo, touch Quick upload.
- To delete the photo, touch More > Delete.

Camera settings



What music transfer tools do I need?

To put music on your computer and then load it on your phone, you need:

- A Microsoft[™] Windows[™] PC or Apple[™]Macintosh[™] computer.
- A USB data cable.

You need a memory card

Your music is stored on your memory card. Your phone supports removable microSD memory cards up to 32 GB capacity. To make sure your memory card is installed, go to "Assemble & charge" on page 3.

Tip: To see the available memory on your memory card, touch Menu > Settings > SD card & phone storage.

What music file formats can I play?

Your phone can play many types of files: MP3, MP4, AAC, ACC+, ACC+ Enhanced, MIDI, and WAV.

Note: Your phone does not support any DRM protected files.

What headphones can I use?

You can go wireless with Bluetooth™ stereo headphones or speakers (see "Bluetooth™ wireless" on page 48).

Get music

Rip a CD

Not literally. If you're new to digital music transfer, this means transferring music from a music CD to your computer.

To rip a music CD on your computer, you can use Microsoft™ Windows™ Media Player. You can download Windows Media Player from www microsoft com

- 1 On your computer, open Windows Media Player.
- 2 Insert a music CD into the computer's CD ROM drive.

Note: Make sure you change the format to MP3 in "Rip > Format > Rip Settings".

- 3 In the Windows Media Player window, click on the "Rip" tab.
- 4 Highlight the songs you want to import, and click "Start Rip".

The songs are imported to the Windows Media Player Library.







Manage & restore apps

For example, simple settings widget will use less than a streaming music player app. After installing an app, if you're not happy with how much memory, data, battery or processing power it's using, uninstall it. When your phone is connected (appears in the status bar), touch Back 1 to close the settings. Soon, MPP shows a URL at the bottom of your screen. Using a computer on the same Wi-Fi network, just type the URL into the browser to open the MPP home screen!

1 Turn on your phone and computer, and connect them with a USB-to-micro USB cable.



Your computer might guide you through installing Motorola drivers.

2 Once your computer has the correct Motorola drivers, it opens the MPP home page in your browser. A Motorola icon appears in your task bar, in the lower right of your computer screen. Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

Exposure to RF Energy

Your mobile device contains a transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives. and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your mobile device, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your mobile device transmits.

Specific Absorption Rate (IEEE)

Your model wireless phone meets the governmental requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The quidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed for the safety of all persons. regardless of age or health, and to account for any variations in measurements. The exposure standard for mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The IEEE SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 watts per kilogram (W/kg), averaged over one gram of tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using procedures accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequencies. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be below the maximum value.
