# Safety, Regulatory & Legal



### **BATTERY USE & SAFETY**

### DON'Ts

- Don't let the product come in contact with liquids. Liquids can get into the
  product's circuits, leading to corrosion.
- Don't place your product near a heat source. High temperatures can cause the battery to swell, leak, or malfunction.
- Don't dry a wet or damp product with an appliance or heat source, such as a hair dryer or microwave oven.

### D0s

- Do avoid leaving your product in your car in high temperatures.
- Do avoid dropping the product. Dropping your product, especially on a hard surface, can potentially cause damage.\*
- Do contact your retailer or Motorola if your product has been damaged by dropping, liquids or high temperatures.

### **BATTERY CHARGING**

Notes for charging your product's battery:

- During charging, keep your battery and charger near room temperature for efficient battery charging.
- New batteries are not fully charged.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- Motorola batteries and charging systems have circuitry that protects the battery from damage from overcharging.

### DRIVING PRECAUTIONS

Responsible and safe driving is your primary responsibility when behind the wheel of a vehicle. Using a mobile device or accessory while driving may cause distraction and may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

### While driving, NEVER:

- Type or read messages.
- Enter or review written data.
- · Surf the web.
- Input navigation information.
- · Perform any other functions that divert your attention from driving.

### SEIZURES/BLACKOUTS

Some people may be susceptible to epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, such as when playing videos or games. These may occur even if a person has never had a previous seizure or blackout.

If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult with your physician before playing videos or games or enabling a flashing-lights feature (if available) on your mobile device.

Discontinue use and consult a physician if any of the following symptoms occur: convulsion, eye or muscle twitching, loss of awareness, involuntary movements, or discrientation. It is always a good idea to hold the screen away from your eyes, leave the lights on in the room, take a 15-minute break every hour, and stop use if you are tired.



# CAUTION ABOUT HIGH VOLUME USAGE

Warning: Exposure to loud noise from any source for extended periods of time may affect your hearing. The louder the volume sound level, the less time is required before your hearing could be affected. To protect your hearing:

- Limit the amount of time you use headsets or headphones at high volume.
- Avoid turning up the volume to block out noisy surroundings.
- Turn the volume down if you can't hear people speaking near you.

If you experience hearing discomfort, including the sensation of pressure or fullness in your ears, ringing in your ears, or muffled speech, you should stop listening to the device through your headset or headphones and have your hearing checked.

### REPETITIVE MOTION

When you repetitively perform actions such as pressing keys or entering finger-written characters, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, arms, shoulders, neck, or other parts of your body. If you continue to have discomfort during or after such use, stop use and see a physician.

### SMALL CHILDREN

Keep your mobile device and its accessories away from small children. These products are not toys and may be hazardous to small children. For example:

- A choking hazard may exist for small, detachable parts.
- Improper use could result in loud sounds, possibly causing hearing injury.
- Improperly handled batteries could overheat and cause a burn.

### **GLASS PARTS**

Some parts of your mobile device may be made of glass. This glass could break if the product is dropped on a hard surface or receives a substantial impact. If glass breaks, do not touch or attempt to remove. Stop using your mobile device until the glass is replaced by a qualified service center.

### OPERATIONAL WARNINGS

### POTENTIALLY EXPLOSIVE ATMOSPHERES

## RADIO FREQUENCY (RF) ENERGY

### EXPOSURE TO RF ENERGY

Your mobile device contains a transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits FF energy. When you communicate with your mobile device, the system handling your network access controls the power level at which your mobile device transmits.

Your mobile device is designed to comply with local regulatory requirements in your country concerning exposure of human beings to RF energy.

### RF ENERGY OPERATIONAL PRECAUTIONS

For optimal mobile device performance, and to be sure that human exposure to RF energy does not exceed the guidelines set forth in the relevant standards, always follow these instructions and precautions:

- If you use the mobile device placed on your body (such as on your lap), always place the mobile device in a Motorola-supplied or approved case. If you do not use a body-worn accessory supplied or approved by Motorola, keep the mobile device and its antenna at least 2.5 centimeters (1 inch) from your body when transmitting.
- Using accessories not supplied or approved by Motorola may cause your mobile

### RF ENERGY INTERFERENCE/COMPATIBILITY

Nearly every electronic device is subject to RF energy interference from external sources if inadequately shielded, designed, or otherwise configured for RF energy compatibility. In some circumstances, your mobile device may cause interference with other devices.

### Follow Instructions to Avoid Interference Problems

Turn off your mobile device in any location where posted notices instruct you to do so. In an aircraft, turn off your mobile device whenever instructed to do so by airline staff. If your mobile device offers an airplane mode or similar feature, consult airline staff about using it in flight.

### Implantable Medical Devices

If you have an implantable medical device, such as a pacemaker or defibrillator, consult your physician before using this mobile device.

Persons with implantable medical devices should observe the following precautions:

- ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than 20 centimeters (8 inches) from the implantable medical device when the mobile device is turned ON.

### SPECIFIC ABSORPTION RATE (IEEE)

# YOUR MOBILE DEVICE COMPLIES WITH REGULATIONS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves (radio frequency electromagnetic fields) adopted by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and Industry Canada (IC). These limits include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health

The radio wave exposure guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 1.6 W/kg.

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. The highest SAR value under the FCC and IC guidelines for your device model is: 1.34 W/kg.

During use, the actual SAR values for your device are usually well below the values stated. This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimize interference on the network, the operating power of your mobile device is automatically decreased when full power is not needed for the wireless connection. The lower the power output of the device, the lower its SAR value.

The World Health Organization has stated that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for the use of mobile devices. They recommend that if you are interested in further reducing your exposure then you can easily do so by limiting your usage. ### liquids
