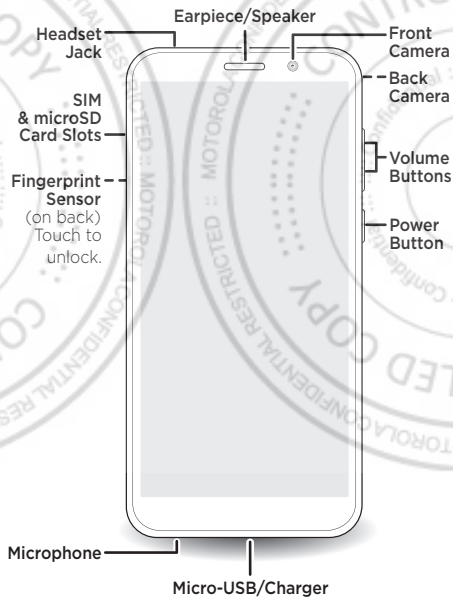
Put in the cards

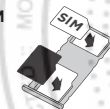
Nano SIM

Insert the nano SIM and memory cards.

Insert the SIM tool into the tray hole to pop out the tray.

Insert the SIM card(s) with the gold contacts down. Insert an optional microSD card (sold separately).

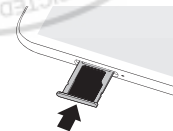
Single-SIM model:

Caution: Handle the tray with care to avoid bending.



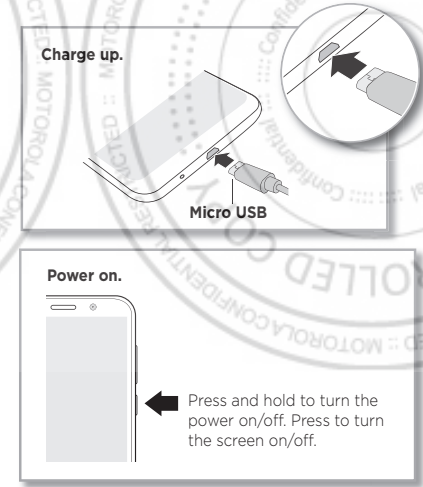
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Finish up
