

Battery Tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, features, and accessories you use.

 Always use Motorola Original batteries and chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.



 New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.

- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.
- When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.

Installing the Battery


You must install and charge the battery to use your phone.

Caution: This phone comes with a 960 mAh (milliamp hours) battery and should be used only with Motorola Original batteries that are rated at 750 mAh or 1140 mAh. Use of any other battery could affect the performance of the phone and could also cause the phone to become noncompliant with the Specific Absorption Rate levels established by the FCC's Radiofrequency Exposure Guidelines.



Your phone is designed to use only Motorola Original batteries and accessories.





Charging the Battery



New batteries are partially charged. Before using your phone, install and charge the battery. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

Action

 Attach the charger into the phone, and plug the other end into an appropriate electrical outlet.



2 Press the release tab and remove the charger when you see the following on the internal display:

Charge Complete (if the phone is powered off)

or


Charged (if the phone is powered on)

Note: When you charge the battery, the battery level indicator in the upper right corner of the display shows how much of the charging process is complete. At least 1 segment of the battery level indicator must be visible to ensure full phone functionality while charging.

Turning On Your Phone

Action

1 Press & hold for 3 seconds.




2 If necessary, enter your 4-digit unlock code (the last 4 digits of your phone number) and press **OK** (2) to unlock the phone.

Adjusting Volume

Press the up or down volume keys to:

- adjust earpiece volume during a call
- adjust ringer volume from home screen (with flip open)
- turn off an incoming call alert



Making a Call



Action

Dial the number.

Tip: If you make a mistake, press the clear key **to** delete the last digit. Press and hold **to** clear all digits.

- 2 Press to make the call.
- 3 Press 5 to end the call.



Note: You must dial the phone number from the home screen. See page 20.

Answering a Call

When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.

When the phone flip is closed

Action

- 1 Open the flip to answer.
- 2 Close the flip to end the call.

Tip: To deactivate this feature, press \longrightarrow > More > Settings > In-Call Setup > Answer Options > Open to Answer, and select Off.)

Action

- 1 Press (1) to answer.
- 2 Press 5 to end the call.






Note: If the phone is locked, you must unlock it to answer the call.

Changing the Call Alert

Phone Flip Open


Press the down volume button to switch to lower call alert volume, then switch to vibrate and,



finally, silent alert. Press the up volume button to cycle back from silent alert to vibrate and then to the lowest alert volume setting.

Phone Flip Closed

Press the smart key, then press the up and down volume buttons to scroll through the alert styles: Loud, Soft, Vibrate, Vibe & Ring, and Silent.



After scrolling to the desired alert style, press the smart key to save the setting and return to the home screen.

Viewing Your Phone Number

To view your phone number from the home screen, press ⊚ . Your phone number displays after 2 seconds.

While you are on a call, press > My Tel. Numbers.

Sending a Multimedia Message





A Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS) message can contain media elements including text, pictures, animations, and sounds. You can send the message to other wireless phones and to email addresses



Copy—Copy text.

Paste—Paste text that was copied previously.

Entry Mode—Select **Numeric**, **Symbol**, **Primary**, or **Secondary** (see page 27).

Entry Setup—Select TAP or iTAP (see page 27).

Flip Layout—Reverse the sequence of text and multimedia object.

Action

4 Press NEXT (2) go to the next screen, and make the desired entries:

Subject:—Subject or title of message.

CC:—Message copy recipient(s).

Bcc:—Recipient(s) of message copy, not known to other recipient(s).

Priority:—Set to Normal or High.

Receipt—A delivery report.

Attachment—Attach a picture or sound.

5 Press **SEND** (\bigcirc) to send the message.

or

Press to send the message later, view message details, save the message in the drafts folder, or cancel the message.

Receiving a New Multimedia Message

Multimedia messages that you receive can contain different media objects:

- Photos, pictures, and animations are displayed as you read the message.
- A sound file begins playing when its slide is displayed.
 Use your phone's volume keys to adjust the volume as the sound file plays.

Note: In a multimedia letter, you may have to highlight an indicator embedded in the message text to play a sound file.

Attached files are appended to the message. To open the attachment, highlight the file indicator or file name and press VIEW (2) (image file type),
 PLAY (2) (sound file), or OPEN (2) (vObject such as Contacts entry or datebook entry, or unknown file type).

Using the Display




The *home screen* (shown below) is the standard display you see when you are *not* on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to place a call.

Labels at the bottom corners of the display show current soft key functions. Press the left (\bigcirc) or right soft key (\bigcirc) to perform the function indicated by the left or right label.

The following status indicators can display:

You cannot make or answer calls when the "no signal" indicator displays.

Using Menus





Selecting a Menu Feature







Tap Method Text Entry Rules

- Press a number key repeatedly to cycle through its characters. See the "Character Chart" on page 29.
- If you do not press a key for 2 seconds, the character in the block cursor is accepted, and the cursor moves to the next position.
- Press left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a message.
- The first character of every sentence is capitalized.
 While the first character is highlighted by the cursor, press down to force the character to lowercase.

Using iTAP® Software Text Entry Method

iTAP® software is a predictive text entry method that lets you enter a word using 1 keystroke per letter.

Note: You can switch languages within a message in iTAP text mode. Press 🗊 > Entry Setup to select the language you want to use.

Entering Words

Action

1 Press a number key 1 time to enter the first letter of the word.

The letters associated with the key are shown at the bottom of the display.


2 Press number keys (1 per letter) to enter the rest of the word.

Alternative words and letter combinations are shown at the bottom of the display. The word choices are updated with each keypress.

- 3 Press 📀 to highlight the word you want.
- **4** Press **SELECT** (*O*) to enter the word at the flashing cursor location.

A space is automatically inserted after the word.

For example, to spell the word "art," press [24] [75] [87]. The display shows:





Entering Novel Words

You may enter a word that the iTAP software does not recognize. If the word you want is not displayed:

Action

- 1 Press 1 or more times to delete letters until you see a letter combination that matches the start of the word.
- 2 Press left or right to highlight the letter or letter combination.
- 3 Press LOCK (\mathcal{O}) to "lock" the selected word portion.
- 4 Continue to enter letters and highlight letter combinations to spell the word.

Using Capitalization



The first word of a sentence is automatically capitalized, with following words in lowercase.

- 1 Enter the first digit and then highlight it to put the iTAP software in number entry mode
- 2 Press number keys to add digits to the number.
- 3 Press **SELECT** (\bigcirc) to enter the number at the flashing cursor location.

Deleting Letters and Words

Place the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, and then do the following:

Action

Press to delete 1 letter at a time.

Hold to delete the entire message.



Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, **but you must unlock it to answer**.

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked. For more information, see page 47.

Changing a Code or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000 at the factory. Your service provider may reset these numbers before you receive your phone.

If your service provider has *not* reset these numbers, we recommend that you change them to prevent other users from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.

To change a code or password:

If You Forget a Code or Password

If you forget your security code, contact your service provider.

If you forget your unlock code, try entering 1234 or the last 4 digits of your phone number. If that does not work, do the following at the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:



Setting a Screen Saver Image

You can set a picture or animation as a screen saver image. The image is displayed when the phone flip is open and no key presses are detected for a period of time.



The screen saver image is shrunk to fill the display, if necessary. An animation repeats for one minute, then the first frame of the animation is displayed.

Tip: Turn off the screen saver to extend battery life.

Specific Absorption Rate Data

The model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg. ¹ Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when

tested for use at the ear is 1.49 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 0.95 W/kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements).²

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.
