



Installing the SIM Card

Your *Subscriber Identity Module* (SIM) card contains your phone number, service details, and phonebook/message memory.




Caution: Do not bend or scratch your SIM card. Avoid exposing your SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt.



Installing a Memory Card

You can install a removable memory card in your phone. You can store additional multimedia objects (such as photos and sounds) on the memory card. **Caution:** Do not bend or scratch your memory card. Avoid exposing your memory card to static electricity, water, or dirt.



Battery Use

Battery performance depends on many factors, including your wireless carrier's network configuration; signal strength; the temperature at which you operate your phone; the features and/or settings you select and use; items attached to the phone's accessory connector; and your voice, data, and other application usage patterns.

Caution: To prevent injuries or burns, do not allow metal objects to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

Getting Started

To maximize your battery's performance:

- Always use Motorola Original batteries and battery chargers. The phone warranty does not cover damage caused from using non-Motorola batteries and/or battery chargers.
 - New batteries or batteries that have been stored for a long time may require a longer charge time.
- Maintain the battery at or near room temperature when charging.
- Do not expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- When you do not intend to use a battery for a while, store it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Batteries gradually wear down and require longer charging times. This is normal. If you charge your battery regularly and notice a decrease in talk time or an increase in charging time, then it is probably time to purchase a new battery.



The rechargeable batteries that power this phone must be disposed of properly and may need to be recycled. Refer to your battery's label for

battery type. Contact your local recycling center for proper disposal methods.

Warning: Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.


Installing the Battery



Your phone is designed to use only Motorola Original batteries and accessories. We recommend that you store batteries in their protective cases when not in use.

Notes:

- Your phone battery may be enclosed in a protective clear plastic case. Remove the battery from the case before attempting to install it.
- Your phone is shipped with a protective clear plastic liner covering the battery door latch. Remove the liner to ensure that the battery door attaches and closes properly.



Charging the Battery

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

| | Action |
|---|---|
| 1 | Insert the travel charger plug into your phone with the release tab facing up. Make sure that both of the plug's connector hooks engage to lock the plug in place. |
| | Note: It may take up to 10 seconds for your phone to provide a visible or audible indication that the battery is charging. |
| 2 | Plug the other end of the travel charger into the appropriate electrical outlet. |
| 3 | When your phone indicates Charge Complete, press |

3 When your phone indicates **Charge Complete**, press the release tab and remove the travel charger.

Tip: You can safely leave the travel charger connected to the phone after charging is complete. This will **not** damage the battery.

Turning Your Phone On

Action

1 Press and hold (power key) for 2 seconds to turn the phone on.

Note: It may take up to 4 seconds for the display

to illuminate after you turn the phone on.

2 If necessary, enter your SIM card PIN code and press **OK** (⊡) to unlock the SIM card.

Caution: If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in a row, your SIM card is disabled and your phone displays **SIM Blocked**.


3 If necessary, enter your 4-digit unlock code and press **OK** (⊡) to unlock the phone.

Note: At startup, you are prompted to personalize your phone. Select **YES** (\bigcirc) to set personal phone options, or **NO** (\bigcirc) to go to the idle display. For more information about personalizing your phone, see page 83.

Adjusting Volume

Press the volume key up or down to:

• increase or decrease earpiece volume during a call



• increase or decrease the ringer volume when the home screen is visible

Tip: At the lowest volume setting, press the volume key down once to switch to vibrate alert. Press it down again to switch to silent alert. Press the volume key up to switch back to vibrate alert, then ring alert.

• turn off an incoming call alert

Viewing Your Phone Number

To view your phone number from the home screen, press $\boxed{1}$ $\boxed{5}$.

While you are on a call, press $\square > My$ Tel. Numbers.

Note: Your phone number must be stored on your SIM card to use this feature. To store your phone number on the SIM card, see page 57. If you do not know your phone number, contact your service provider.

Locking and Unlocking the Keypad

You can lock your phone keypad to prevent accidental keypresses (for example, when carrying your phone in a purse or pocket).

When a memory card is installed on your phone, the phone prompts you to select a storage device when you download or store a multimedia object.

To view the contents of a memory card, go to the multimedia menu for a specific object type (such as **Pictures** or **Sounds**), then press **T** > **Switch Storage Device** > *device name*.

Creating a Music Playlist

You can download and play a variety of different types of ring tones and music on your phone. You can store these sound files in phone memory, or on a memory card.

Tip: To see the sound files stored on a memory card, go to the **Sounds** menu, then press **Switch Storage Device** > *device name*.

You can create a playlist of selected songs that play in the order you specify. Playlists you create are stored in the **Sounds** menu.

Activating Rhythm Lights

Rhythm lights make your phone's display and keys flash in synchronization with music or sounds around you.

You can adjust the following options:

Notes:

- Rhythm lights work only when your phone is idle and your battery is not low. Rhythm lights pause if you press a key or receive a call or message.
- Your phone also can flash for incoming calls and messages (see following sections).
- Some games might make your phone flash and vibrate.

Setting Ring Lights

Set up your phone to display a light pattern when you receive an incoming call. The same light pattern displays for all incoming calls.

Find the Feature

> Settings > Ring Styles > Ring Lights > light pattern

To display a distinctive light pattern for calls from a specific phonebook category, use the light ID feature described on page 82.

Setting Up a Bluetooth[®] Wireless Connection

Your phone supports Bluetooth wireless connections. You can set up a wireless link with a Bluetooth-enabled headset accessory, speakerphone, or handsfree car kit, or connect to a computer or hand-held device to exchange and synchronize data.

Searching for Other Devices

To connect your phone to a headset accessory or handsfree device:

Find the Feature

Settings > Connection
 Bluetooth Link
 Handsfree
 (Look For Devices)

Your phone displays a list of device(s) located within range of the phone. If your phone is already connected to a device, your phone lists the connected device and identifies it with a \checkmark (in use) indicator.

To connect to a device, highlight the device name and press **SELECT** (\square) .

The device may request permission to bond with your phone. Select YES (\bigcirc) and enter the correct PIN code to create a secure connection with the device. When the connection is made, the O (Bluetooth) indicator or a **Bluetooth Connected** message displays in the home screen.

Copying Objects to Another Device



You can use a Bluetooth wireless connection to copy a picture, sound, phonebook entry, datebook event, or bookmark from your phone to another phone, computer, or hand-held device.

Copying a Multimedia Object

Highlight the object on your phone that you want to copy to the other device, then press $\Box > Copy$.

Select a recognized device name listed in the **Object Exchange** menu, or [Look For Devices] to search for the device to which you want to copy the object.

Copying a Phonebook Entry, Datebook Event, or Bookmark

Highlight the item on your phone that you want to copy to the other device, then press $\blacksquare >$ Send > Bluetooth.

Select a recognized device name listed in the **Object Exchange** menu, or [**Look For Davices**] to search for the device to which you want to copy the item.

Taking and Sending a Photo


Shortcut: Press the camera key to activate the camera. Press the camera key again to take a photo.

To activate your phone's camera using the menu system:

Tip: When you want to take photos in low-light settings, press $\square > Flash > On$ to activate the built-in flash.

Changing Phone Skin

Change the look and feel of your phone's display by selecting a different skin setting.

Your phone displays the new skin. Press **BACK** (\frown) to return to the previous skin.

Sending a Multimedia Message



A *Multimedia Messaging Service* (MMS) multimedia message contains one or more slides with text and embedded media objects (including photos, pictures, animations, sounds,

voice records, and/or video clips). You can send the multimedia message to other wireless phone users, and to email addresses.






Learning to Use Your Phone

Using the Display

The *home screen* is displayed when you are **not** on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to dial a phone number.



Press the 5-way navigation joystick (P) up, down, left, or right to select a menu feature icon. If you select a menu icon by mistake, press P to return to the home screen.

The $\overline{\equiv}$ (menu) indicator shows that you can press the menu key ($\overline{\equiv}$) to enter the main menu.


Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key (\bigcirc) or right soft key (\boxdot) to perform the indicated function.

Notes:

- Your home screen may appear different than shown. For example, your service provider may hide the menu feature icons to allow a better view of the wallpaper image. You can still select the menu icons when they are hidden from view. To show or hide menu icons, see page 84.
- Your phone can display an analog or digital clock in the home screen (see page 84).
- Your phone's display normally is visible only when the display backlight is on, or when the display is viewed in direct sunlight. To extend battery life, the backlight turns off automatically when no activity is detected for a period of time. The backlight turns back on when you press any key. To set the time that the backlight stays on, see page 61.
- To extend battery life, you can set the display to turn off after a period of inactivity. The display turns back on when you press any key. To set the time that the display stays on, see page 62.





3. Signal Strength Indicator Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when the 1° (no signal) indicator or 1°X (no transmit) indicator is displayed.



4. Roam Indicator Shows when your phone is seeking or using another network outside your home network. Indicators can include:

7. Message Indicator Displays when you receive a new message. Indicators can include:

When you enter a message, a number in this location shows the number of characters left on the current page (text message), or the message size in bytes/kilobytes (multimedia message or letter).

9. Ring Style Indicator Shows the ring style setting.



Selecting a Menu Feature


This guide shows you how to select a menu feature, starting from the home screen.

Find the Feature T > Recent Calls > Dialed Calls

This example shows that from the home screen, you must press I, scroll to and select Recent Calls from the main menu, then scroll to and select Dialed Calls. Press () to scroll. Press () in to select the highlighted item. Press the left/right soft keys to select the functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

Selecting a Feature Option


Some features require you to select an option from a list:




- Press log to scroll up or down to highlight the option you want.
- In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight the option.
- In an alphabetized list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list option.
- When an option has a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.

Entering Text

Some features require you to enter information.



The message center lets you compose and send text messages.



Choosing a Text Entry Mode

Multiple text entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The mode you select remains active until you select another mode.

Press in any text entry screen to select one of the following entry modes:





Using the Smart Key

The *smart key* gives you another way to perform many basic phone functions. It anticipates

the next action you are likely to perform. For example, when you highlight a menu item, you can press the smart key to select it. You can use the smart key to make and end calls, turn features on and off, and open your phonebook. The smart key usually performs the same function as pushing in the 5-way navigation joystick ().


Using the Handsfree Speaker

When you activate your phone's integrated handsfree speaker, you can talk to the other party without holding the phone to your ear.

Press **SPEAKER** (\square) to turn the handsfree speaker on or off during a call.

When you turn the handsfree speaker on, your phone displays **Speaker On** in the home screen. The handsfree speaker remains on until you press **SPEAKER** (I) again or turn the phone off.

Note: The handsfree speaker is disabled when you connect your phone to a handsfree car kit or headset accessory.



Changing a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset these codes before you receive your phone.



If your service provider has **not** reset these codes, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.

You can also reset your SIM card PIN code, PIN2 code, and/or call barring password if necessary.

To change a code or password:

Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, **but you must unlock it to answer**.

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked (see page 66).





Specific Absorption Rate Data

The model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg.¹ Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when

tested for use at the ear is 0.33 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 0.46 W/kg. The SAR value for this product in its data transmission mode (body-worn use) is 0.43 W/kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements).²

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.
