
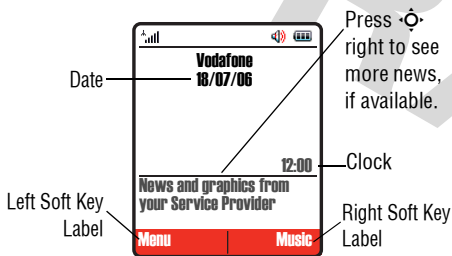

10.1 Using the Display

The *home screen* is displayed when you are *not* on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to dial a phone number. To dial a number from the home screen, press the number keys and .



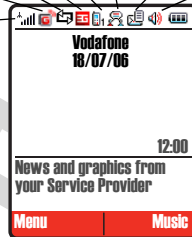
Note: Your home screen may look different from the display shown above, depending on your service provider.

Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key or right soft key to



perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label. For soft key locations see page 1.

The following status indicators can display:


1. Signal Strength
2. GPRS
3. Data
4. Roam
5. Active Line
6. Messaging Presence
7. Messages
8. Ring Style
9. Battery Level



1. Signal Strength Indicator

Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when the  (no signal) indicator or  (no transmit) indicator is displayed.





2. GPRS Indicator


 Shows that your phone is using a high-speed General Packet Radio Service (GPRS) network connection. GPRS allows faster data transfer speeds. Indicators can include:


-  = GPRS PDP context activate
-  = GPRS attach
-  = GPRS packet data available

3. Data Transmission Indicator


Shows connection and data transmission status. Indicators can include:

-  = secure packet data transfer
-  = unsecure packet data transfer
-  = secure application connection
-  = unsecure application connection

 = secure Circuit Switch Data (CSD) call

 = Bluetooth™ connection is active

4. Roam Indicator

 Shows when your phone is seeking or using another network outside your home network. Indicators can include:

-  = HSDPA home
-  = HSDPA roam
-  = 3G home
-  = 3G roam
-  = 2.5G home
-  = 2.5G roam
-  = 2G home
-  = 2G roam

5. Active Line Indicator

Shows to indicate an active call, or to indicate when call diverting is on. Icons for dual-line SIM cards can include:

= line 1 active

= line 2 active

= line 1 active, call divert on

= line 2 active, call divert on

6. Messaging Presence Indicator

Shows when Instant Messaging (IM) is active. Indicators can include:

= IM active

= invisible to IM

= busy

When a Java application is active, can display here.

7. Message Indicator

Displays when you receive a new message. Indicators can include:

= text message

= voicemail message

= voice and text message

= IM message

8. Ring Style Indicator

Shows the ring style setting.

= loud ring

= soft ring

= vibrate and ring

= vibrate then ring

= vibrate

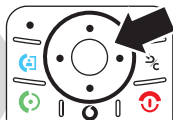
= silent

9. Battery Level Indicator

Vertical bars show the battery charge level. Recharge the battery when **Low Battery** displays and the battery alert sounds.

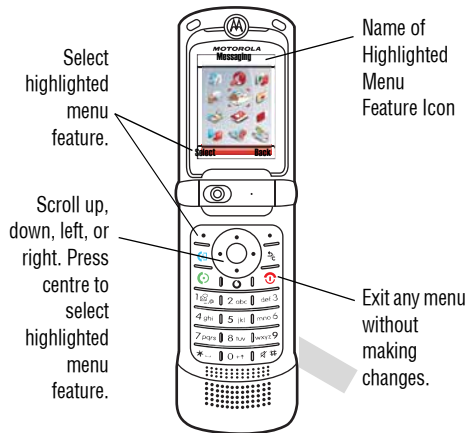
10.2 Using the 5-Way Navigation Key

Use the 5-way navigation key (◂◃) to scroll up, down, left, or right in the menu system. Press the centre of the key (◂◃) to select a highlighted menu item.



10.3 Using Menus













From the home screen, press ◂◃ to enter the main menu.



Press ◂◃ to scroll to and highlight a menu feature icon in the main menu. The following icons may display in the main menu, depending on your service provider and service subscription options.




10.3.1 Selecting a Menu Feature

To select a menu feature, starting from the home screen:

Find the Feature  **Calls > Options > Filter by > Dialed Numbers**

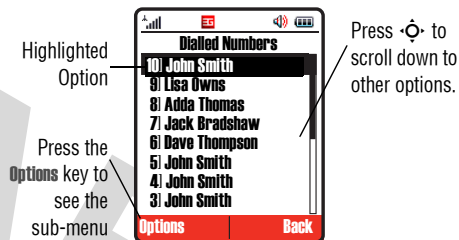
This example shows that from the home screen, you must press  to open the menu, highlight and select  **Calls > Options > Filter by > Dialed Numbers**, then highlight and select the call.


Press the navigation key () up, down, left or right to highlight items, and press it in () to select items. Press


the left/right soft keys to select the functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

10.3.2 Selecting a Feature Option



Some features require you to select an option from a list:



- Press  to scroll up or down to highlight the option you want.
- In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight the option.
- In an alphabetised list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list option.

- When an option has a list of possible values, press  left or right to scroll through and select a value.
- When an option has a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.

10.4 Smart Key

The smart key gives you another way to do things. For example, when you highlight a menu item, you can press the smart key to select it (instead of pressing ). The smart key usually does the same thing as . To find the smart key, see page 1. To change what the smart key does in the home screen, see page 85.

10.5 External Display

When you close your phone, the external display shows the time, date, status indicators, and notifications for incoming calls and other events. After your phone is inactive for a while, the display shows only a clock. For a list of phone status indicators, see page 54.

To set the phone ring style in the external display:

- 1 Press a volume key to see **Ring Styles**.

- 2 Press the smart key repeatedly, until the style you want appears.
- 3 Press a volume key to return to the home screen.

10.6 Using the Handsfree Speaker

When you activate your phone's integrated handsfree speaker, you can talk to the other party without holding the phone to your ear.

Press the **Speaker** key to turn the handsfree speaker on or off during a call.

When you turn the handsfree speaker on, your phone displays **Speakerphone On** in the home screen. The handsfree speaker remains on until you press the **Speaker** key again or turn the phone off.

Note: *The handsfree speaker is disabled when you connect your phone to a handsfree car kit or headset accessory.*

10.7 Changing a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your

service provider may reset these codes before you receive your phone.

If your service provider has not reset these codes, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.

You can also reset your SIM card PIN code or PIN2 code, if necessary. Your *Personal Identification Number* (PIN) code protects the information stored on your SIM card.

To change a code or password:

Find the Feature  > Settings > Security
> New Passwords

10.8 Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, but you must unlock it to answer.

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked (see page 70).

10.8.1 Locking Your Phone Manually

Find the Feature  > Settings > Security
> Phone Lock > Lock Now

Press	To
1 keypad keys	enter your unlock code
2 Ok key	lock the phone

10.8.2 Unlocking Your Phone

Your phone's unlock code is originally set to 1234. Many service providers reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number.

At the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:

Press	To
1 keypad keys	enter your unlock code
2 Ok key	unlock your phone

10.8.3 Setting Your Phone to Lock Automatically

You can set your phone to lock every time you turn it off:

Find the Feature

 > Settings > Security
> Phone Lock > Automatic Lock
> On

Press

1 keypad keys

2  key

To

enter your unlock code

activate automatic lock

10.9 If You Forget a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Many service providers reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number before you receive your phone.

If you forget your unlock code, try entering 1234 or the last 4 digits of your phone number. If that does not work, at the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:

Press

1 

2 keypad keys

3  key

To

display the unlock code *bypass* screen

enter your 6 digit *security code*



submit your security code

If you forget your security code, SIM card PIN code or PIN2 code, contact your service provider.

11.1 Storing Your Name and Phone Number

To store or edit your name and phone number information on your SIM card:

Find the Feature  > Settings > Phone Status
> My Tel. Numbers

Shortcut: Press   from the home screen to view or edit your name and phone number.


Tip: If you want to see your phone number while you are on a call press **Options** > **My Tel. Numbers**.

If you do not know your phone number, contact your service provider.

11.2 Setting the Time and Date

Your phone uses the time and date for the **Calendar**.

Find the Feature  > Settings > Initial Setup
> Time and Date

To synchronise the time and date with the network, press  > **Settings** > **Initial Setup** > **Time and Date** > **Autoupdate** > **On**. 

To manually set the time and date, turn off **Autoupdate**, then, press  > **Settings** > **Initial Setup** > **Time and Date** > *time* or *date*.

To choose an analogue or digital clock for your home screen, press  > **Settings** > **Personalise** > **Home Screen** > **Clock**.

To turn the date on or off on your home screen, press  > **Settings** > **Personalise** > **Home Screen** > **Date**.


11.3 Setting a Ring Style


Your phone rings or vibrates to notify you of an incoming call or other event. This ring or vibration is called an *alert*.



You can select one of five different ring styles. The ring style indicator in the display shows the current ring style (see page 56).

To set a ring style:

Find the Feature  > Settings > Ring Styles
> *Style: style name*

Press	To
1  up or down	scroll to the ring style
2 Select key	select the ring style

Each ring style contains settings for specific event alerts, ringer ID, and ringer and keypad volume. To change these settings, press  > **Settings** > **Ring Styles** > *style* **Details**.

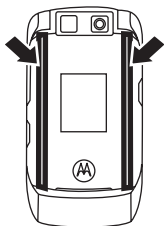
- If you select the **Silent** ring style, your phone will not use **Auto Answer** (see page 88).
- Java™ applications can make your phone vibrate or light up. You can turn off **App Vibration** and **App Backlight** under  > **Settings** > **Java Settings**.
- To change your ringer volume when your phone is closed, see page 59.
- To turn off alerts for messages that arrive during a call, select  > **Settings** > **In-Call Setup** > **MSG Alert** > **Not in Call**.

11.4 Ring & Event Lights

Your phone has lights on the outside that can pulse for incoming calls or messages.

To set the light for your **incoming calls**, press  > **Settings** > **Ring Styles** > **Ring Lights**.

To set the light for your **incoming messages**, press  > **Settings** > **Ring Styles** > **Event Lights**.



11.5 Setting a Wallpaper Image

You can set a photo, picture, or animation as a wallpaper (background) image in your phone's home screen. The wallpaper image displays as a faint watermark in text and menu displays.

When you set an animation as a wallpaper image, only the first frame of the animation displays.

Find the Feature

 > **Settings** > **Personalise**
> **Wallpaper**

Setting a Screen Saver Image

Setting	Description
Picture	Select the picture or animation for the background image in your home screen, or None for no wallpaper.
Layout	Select: Centre to centre the image on the display Tile to repeat the image across the display Fit-to-screen to stretch the image across the display.

11.6 Setting a Screen Saver Image

The screen saver image displays when the phone is on and no activity is detected for a specified time period.

Tip: This feature helps save your screen, but not your battery. To extend battery life, turn off the screen saver.

You can set a photo, picture, or animation as a screen saver image. The screen saver shows when the flip is open and no activity is detected for a specific time. The image shrinks to

fill the display, if necessary. An animation repeats for one minute, then the first frame of the animation displays.

Find the Feature



> Settings > Personalise
> Screen Saver

Setting	Description
Picture	Select the picture or animation for your screen saver or None for no screen saver.
Delay	Select how long your phone must be inactive before the screen saver picture displays. Note: <i>If this setting is longer than your Display Timeout setting, then your display will turn off before you see the screen saver.</i>

11.7 Setting Display Appearance

Note: The **Battery Save** feature tells your phone not to light the display or keypad unless you're in a dark place. To turn on this feature, press > Settings > Initial Setup > Battery Save > On.

To choose a phone **skin** that sets the look and feel of your phone's display:

Find the Feature  > Settings > Personalise
> Skin

To set your display brightness:

Find the Feature  > Settings > Initial Setup
> Brightness

You can set the amount of time that the display and keypad backlights remain on, or turn off backlights to extend battery life. The backlight turns back on when you open the flip or press any key.

Caution: The **Continuous** setting can decrease battery life.

Find the Feature  > Settings > Initial Setup
> Backlight

Note: To turn the backlight on or off for Java applications, press  > Settings > Java Settings > App Backlight.

You can set the display to turn itself off when no activity is detected for a specified time period. The display turns back on when you open the flip or press any key.

Find the Feature  > Settings > Initial Setup
> Display Timeout

11.8 Setting Answer Options

You can use different ways to answer an incoming call. To turn on or turn off an answer option:

Find the Feature  > Settings > In-Call Setup
> Answer Options

Options	
Multi-Key	Answer by pressing any key.
Open to Answer	Answer by opening the flip.

12.1 Turning Off a Call Alert

You can turn off your phone's incoming call alert before answering the call.

Press	To
either volume key	turn off the alert

12.2 Changing the Active Line

 Change the active phone line to make and receive calls from your other phone number.


Note: This feature is available only for dual-line-enabled SIM cards and is operator dependent.

Find the Feature	 > Settings > Phone Status > Active Line

The active line indicator in the display shows the currently active phone line (see page 56).


12.3 Viewing Call Log


Your phone keeps lists of the calls you recently received and dialed, even if the calls did not connect. The lists are sorted from newest to oldest entries. The oldest entries are deleted as new entries are added.



Shortcut: Press  from the home screen to view the Dialed Numbers list.

Find the Feature  > Calls > Options > Filter by

Press	To
1  up or down	scroll to Received Calls or Dialed Numbers
2  	select the list
3  up or down	scroll to an entry
4 	call the entry's number

Note:  means the call connected.

Tip: Press and hold  for two seconds to send the number as DTMF tones during a call.




Press	To
or 	make a video call to the entry's number
or 	view entry details
or Options	open the Last Calls Menu to perform various operations on the entry

Option	Description
Add Digits	Add digits after the number.
Attach Number	Attach a number from the Contacts or Call Log lists.
Send Tones	Send the number to the network as DTMF tones. This option displays only during a call.

The **Last Calls Menu** can include the following options:

Option	Description
Store	Create a contacts entry with the number in the No. field.
Delete	Delete the entry.
Delete All	Delete all entries in the list.
Hide Caller ID/ Show Caller ID	Hide or show your caller ID for the next call.
Send Message	Open a new text message with the number in the To field.

12.4 Redialling a Number

Press	To
1 	view the dialled numbers list
2 	scroll to the entry you want to call
3 	redial the number

12.5 Using Automatic Redial

When you receive a busy signal, your phone displays **Number Busy**.

12.6


Returning an Unanswered Call

With automatic redial, your phone automatically redials the number. When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates one time, displays the message **Redial Successful**, and then connects the call.

To turn automatic redial on or off:

Find the Feature  > **Settings** > **Initial Setup**
> **Auto Redial**



When automatic redial is turned off, you can manually activate the feature to redial a phone number. When you hear a busy signal and see **Number Busy**:

Press	To
 or Retry key	activate automatic redial

Your phone automatically redials the number. When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates one time, displays **Redial Successful**, and then connects the call.

12.6 Returning an Unanswered Call

Your phone keeps a record of your unanswered calls, and displays **X Missed Calls**, where **X** is the number of missed calls.

Press	To
1 View key	see the received calls list
2  up or down	select a call to return
3 	make the call

12.7 Using the Notepad

The most recent set of digits entered on the keypad are stored in your phone's notepad memory. This can be a phone number that you called, or a number that you entered but did not call. To retrieve the number stored in the notepad:

Find the Feature  > **Calls** > **Notepad**

Press	To
	call the number

Press or Options	To open the Dialing Menu to attach a number or insert a special character

12.8 Putting a Call On Hold or Mute

Press Options > Hold	To put all active calls on hold
--	---

Press Mute key (if available) or Options > Mute	To put all active calls on mute
---	---

12.9 Using Call Waiting

When you are on a call or downloading a file, an alert tone sounds to indicate that you have received a second call.

Press 1 	To answer the new call
2 Switch key or Link key or Options > End Call on Hold	switch between calls connect the 2 calls end the call on hold

You must turn on call waiting to use the feature. To turn call waiting on or off:

Find the Feature  > **Settings** > **In-Call Setup**
> **Call Waiting**

12.10 Using Caller ID

12.10.1 Incoming Calls

Calling line identification (Caller ID) displays the phone number for incoming calls.

The phone displays the caller's name (and picture, if available) if the name is stored in your contacts, or **Incoming Call** when caller ID information is not available.

You can also set your phone to play a distinctive **Ringer ID** for specific entries stored in your contacts. For more information, see page 82.

12.10.2 Outgoing Calls

You can show or hide your phone number as an ID for the calls that you make.


While dialling (with digits visible in the display), press **Options > Hide Caller ID/Show Caller ID**.

12.11 Calling an Emergency Number

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 999, that you can call under any

circumstances, even when your phone is locked or the SIM card is not inserted. Your service provider can program additional emergency numbers into your SIM card. *However, your SIM card must be inserted in your phone in order to use the numbers stored on it.* See your service provider for additional information on this issue.

Note: *Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.*

Press	To
1 keypad keys	dial the emergency number
2 	call the emergency number

12.12 Dialling International Numbers

Press and hold **0** to insert the local international access code (+) from which you are calling. Then press the keypad keys to enter the country code and number.

12.13 Calling With Speed Dial

To call contact entries 1 to 9, press and hold the single-digit speed dial number for one second.

You can set speed dial to call the entries in your phone's contacts list or Fixed Dial list.

Find the Feature



> Settings > Initial Setup
> Speed Dial > Phone or Fixed Dial

To add a new contact entry, see page 81 To edit the **Location Number** for a contact entry, press > Contacts, highlight the entry, and press **Options** > Edit Contact.

12.14 Using Voicemail

Voicemail messages that you receive are stored on the network. To listen to your messages, you must call your voicemail phone number.

Note: Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

12.14.1 Listening to Voicemail Messages

Find the Feature



> Messaging > Call Voicemail

The phone calls your voicemail phone number. If no voicemail number is stored, your phone prompts you to store a number, see page 72. If you don't know your voicemail number, contact your service provider.

12.14.2 Receiving a Voicemail Message

When you receive a voicemail message, your phone displays (voicemail message indicator) and **New Voicemail**.

Note: The icon may vary depending on your service provider.

Press

Call key

To

listen to the message

The phone calls your voicemail phone number. If no voicemail number is stored, your phone prompts you to store a number.

12.14.3 Storing Your Voicemail Number

If necessary, use the following procedure to store your voicemail phone number on your phone. Usually, your service provider has already done this for you.

Find the Feature



> Messaging

Press

1 keypad keys

To

enter your voicemail number

2 **OK** key

store the number

You cannot store a **p** (pause), **w** (wait), or **n** (number) character in this number. If you want to store a voicemail number with these characters, create a contact entry for it. Then, you can use the entry to call your voicemail.








You can only speed dial contact entries that are stored on your phone (not on your SIM card).</i> To assign a speed dial key, see page 84. To use a speed dial key, just press and hold the key in your home screen.

Voice Dial a Number not Stored in Contacts (Digit Dial)	<p>Press and hold .</p> <p>When prompted, say “digit dial” (within two seconds). When prompted again, say the digits you want to dial (within two seconds per digit).</p> <p>Your phone recognizes the digits you want to dial. To voice dial a contacts entry, see page 81.</p>

13.2.2 Messaging



Your phone reads message settings from the USIM card. If you put another USIM card in your phone, your phone sends and receives messages for the phone number on the new card.

Send Voice Message	<p>While you are creating a message select: </p> <p>Options > Insert > New Voice Note</p> <p>To record the voice message, press the Capture key, speak, then press the Stop key. Your phone inserts the voice recording into a message and lets you enter email addresses or phone numbers to receive the message.</p>

Use a Postcard	Send a postcard:  > Messaging > Create Message  > Postcard
Read and Manage Messages	 > Messaging > Inbox Icons next to each message indicate if it is read  or unread  . Icons can also indicate if the message is locked  , urgent  , low priority  or has an attachment  . To set message options like Lock or Delete , highlight a message and press Options .
Send Quick Note Text Message	Send a quick note:  > Messaging > Templates > Text Templates Scroll to a note and press the Send key.




This model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR.
