

10.1 Using the Display


The *home screen* is displayed when you are *not* on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to dial a phone number. To dial a number from the home screen, press the number keys and .



Note: Your home screen may look different from the display shown above, depending on your service provider.

Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key or right soft key to perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label. For soft key locations see page 1.

The following status indicators can display:



1. Signal Strength Indicator

Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when the *____ (no signal) indicator or ** (no transmit) indicator is displayed.

2. GPRS Indicator



Shows that your phone is using a high-speed General Packet Radio Service (GPRS) network connection. GPRS allows faster data transfer speeds. Indicators can include:

- S = GPRS PDP context activate
- G = GPRS attach
- G = GPRS packet data available

3. Data Transmission Indicator

Shows connection and data transmission status. Indicators can include:

- = secure packet data transfer
- ← = unsecure packet data transfer
- = secure application connection
- = unsecure application connection

- = secure Circuit Switch
 Data (CSD) call
- # = Bluetooth™
 connection is active.

4. Roam Indicator



Shows when your phone is seeking or using another network outside your home network. Indicators can include:

- = HSDPA home
- = 3G home
- **=** 2.5G home
- = 2G home

■ = HSDPA roam

= unsecure CSD call

- 🛂 = 3G roam
- = 2.5G roam
- = 2G roam

5. Active Line Indicator



Shows to indicate an active call, or to indicate when call diverting is on. Icons for dual-line SIM cards can include:

■ = line 1 active

1 = line 2 active

j₁ = line 1 active, call divert on

= line 2 active, call divert on

6. Messaging Presence Indicator



Shows when Instant Messaging (IM) is active. Indicators can include:

🔏 = IM active

= invisible to IM

(X) = busy

When a Java application is active, 👙 can display here.

7. Message Indicator



Displays when you receive a new message. Indicators can include:

= text message

= voicemail message

= voice and text
message

🤩 = IM message

8. Ring Style Indicator

Shows the ring style setting.

= loud ring

= soft ring

= vibrate and ring

: = vibrate

🖋 = silent

9. Battery Level Indicator

Vertical bars show the battery charge level. Recharge the battery when **Low Battery** displays and the battery alert sounds.


10.2 Using the 5-Way Navigation Key

Use the 5-way navigation key $(\dot{\Phi})$ to scroll up, down, left, or right in the menu system. Press the centre of the key $(\dot{\Phi})$ to select a highlighted menu item.



10.3 Using Menus

From the home screen, press • to enter the main menu.



Press •• to scroll to and highlight a menu feature icon in the main menu. The following icons may display in the main menu, depending on your service provider and service subscription options.

10.3.1 Selecting a Menu Feature

To select a menu feature, starting from the home screen:

Find the Feature

• Calls > Options > Filter by > Dialled Numbers


This example shows that from the home screen, you must press •• to open the menu, highlight and select
© Calls > Options > Filter by > Dialled Numbers, then highlight and select the call.

Press the navigation key (••) up, down, left or right to highlight items, and press it in (••) to select items. Press

the left/right soft keys to select the functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

10.3.2 Selecting a Feature Option

Some features require you to select an option from a list:



- Press ·ô· to scroll up or down to highlight the option you want.
- In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight the option.
- In an alphabetised list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list option.

Smart Key 10.4

- When an option has a list of possible values, press ·ô·left or right to scroll through and select a value.
- When an option has a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.

10.4 Smart Key

The smart key gives you another way to do things. For example, when you highlight a menu item, you can press the smart key to select it (instead of pressing ••). The smart key usually does the same thing as ••. To find the smart key, see page 1. To change what the smart key does in the home screen, see page 85.

10.5 External Display

When you close your phone, the external display shows the time, date, status indicators, and notifications for incoming calls and other events. After your phone is inactive for a while, the display shows only a clock. For a list of phone status indicators, see page 54.

To set the phone ring style in the external display:

1 Press a volume key to see Ring Styles.

- 2 Press the smart key repeatedly, until the style you want appears.
- 3 Press a volume key to return to the home screen.

10.6 Using the Handsfree Speaker

When you activate your phone's integrated handsfree speaker, you can talk to the other party without holding the phone to your ear.

Press the **Speaker** key to turn the handsfree speaker on or off during a call.

When you turn the handsfree speaker on, your phone displays **Speakerphone On** in the home screen. The handsfree speaker remains on until you press the **Speaker** key again or turn the phone off.

Note: The handsfree speaker is disabled when you connect your phone to a handsfree car kit or headset accessory.

10.7 Changing a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your

Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

service provider may reset these codes before you receive your phone.

If your service provider has not reset these codes, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.

You can also reset your SIM card PIN code or PIN2 code, if necessary. Your *Personal Identification Number* (PIN) code protects the information stored on your SIM card.

To change a code or password:

Find the Feature

10.8 Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, but you must unlock it to answer.

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked (see page 70).

10.8.1 Locking Your Phone Manually

10.9 If You Forget a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Many service providers reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number before you receive your phone.

If you forget your unlock code, try entering 1234 or the last 4 digits of your phone number. If that does not work, at the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:

11.1 Storing Your Name and Phone Number

To store or edit your name and phone number information on your SIM card:

Shortcut: Press 🕱 # from the home screen to view or edit your name and phone number.

Tip: If you want to see your phone number while you are on a call press Options > My Tel. Numbers.

If you do not know your phone number, contact your service provider.

11.2 Setting the Time and Date

Your phone uses the time and date for the Calendar.

Find the Feature

> Settings > Initial Setup

> Time and Date

To synchronise the time and date with the network, press • Settings > Initial Setup > Time and Date > Autoundate > On. T



To manually set the time and date, turn off **Autoupdate**, then, press • > Settings > Initial Setup > Time and Date > time or date.

To choose an analogue or digital clock for your home screen, press •• > Settings > Personalise > Home Screen > Clock.

To turn the date on or off on your home screen, press • > Settings > Personalise > Home Screen > Date.

11.3 Setting a Ring Style

Your phone rings or vibrates to notify you of an incoming call or other event. This ring or vibration is called an *alert*.

You can select one of five different ring styles. The ring style indicator in the display shows the current ring style (see page 56).

To set a ring style:

Find the Feature

Each ring style contains settings for specific event alerts, ringer ID, and ringer and keypad volume. To change these settings, press • > Settings > Ring Styles > style Details.

- If you select the Silent ring style, your phone will not use Auto Answer (see page 88).
- JavaTM applications can make your phone vibrate or light up. You can turn off App Vibration and App Backlight under ·• > Settings > Java Settings.
- To change your ringer volume when your phone is closed, see page 59.
- To turn off alerts for messages that arrive during a call, select • > Settings > In-Call Setup > MSG Alert > Not in Call.

11.4 Ring & Event Lights

Your phone has lights on the outside that can pulse for incoming calls or messages.

To set the light for your **incoming** calls, press • > Settings > Ring Styles > Ring Lights.

To set the light for your **incoming messages**, press • > **Settings**





11.5 Setting a Wallpaper Image

You can set a photo, picture, or animation as a wallpaper (background) image in your phone's home screen. The wallpaper image displays as a faint watermark in text and menu displays.

When you set an animation as a wallpaper image, only the first frame of the animation displays.

Find the Feature



| Setting | Description |
|---------|---|
| Picture | Select the picture or animation for the background image in your home screen, or None for no wallpaper. |
| Layout | Select: Centre to centre the image on the display Tile to repeat the image across the display Ht-to-screen to stretch the image across the display. |

11.6 Setting a Screen Saver Image

The screen saver image displays when the phone is on and no activity is detected for a specified time period.

Tip: This feature helps save your screen, but not your battery. To extend battery life, turn off the screen saver.

You can set a photo, picture, or animation as a screen saver image. The screen saver shows when the flip is open and no activity is detected for a specific time. The image shrinks to

fill the display, if necessary. An animation repeats for one minute, then the first frame of the animation displays.

Find the Feature

> Settings > Personalise

> Screen Saver

| Setting | Description |
|---------|---|
| Picture | Select the picture or animation for your screen saver or None for no screen saver. |
| Delay | Select how long your phone must be inactive before the screen saver picture displays. |
| | Note: If this setting is longer than your Display Timeout setting, then your display will turn off before you see the screen saver. |

11.7 Setting Display Appearance

Note: The **Battery Save** feature tells your phone not to light the display or keypad unless you're in a dark place. To turn on this feature, press • > Settings > Initial Setup > Battery Save > On.

To choose a phone **skin** that sets the look and feel of your phone's display:

Find the Feature

> Settings > Personalise> Skin

To set your display brightness:

Find the Feature > Settings

•• > Settings > Initial Setup > Brightness

You can set the amount of time that the display and keypad backlights remain on, or turn off backlights to extend battery life. The backlight turns back on when you open the flip or press any key.

Caution: The **Continuous** setting can decrease battery life.

Find the Feature

> Settings > Initial Setup> Backlight

Note: To turn the backlight on or off for Java applications, press • Settings > Java Settings > App Backlight.

You can set the display to turn itself off when no activity is detected for a specified time period. The display turns back on when you open the flip or press any key.

Find the Feature

> Settings > Initial Setup > Display Timeout

11.8 Setting Answer Options

You can use different ways to answer an incoming call. To turn on or turn off an answer option:


12.2 Changing the Active Line

Note: This feature is available only for dual-line-enabled SIM cards and is operator dependent.

The active line indicator in the display shows the currently active phone line (see page 56).

12.3 Viewing Call Log

Your phone keeps lists of the calls you recently received and dialled, even if the calls did not connect. The lists are sorted from newest to oldest entries. The oldest entries are deleted as new entries are added.

Shortcut: Press () from the home screen to view the Dialled Numbers list.

12.5 Using Automatic Redial

When you receive a busy signal, your phone displays **Number Busy**.

Returning an Unanswered Call

With automatic redial, your phone automatically redials the number. When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates one time, displays the message Redial Successful, and then connects the call.

To turn automatic redial on or off:

Find the Feature

→ > Settings > Initial Setup > Auto Redial

When automatic redial is turned off, you can manually activate the feature to redial a phone number. When you hear a busy signal and see Number Busy:

Your phone automatically redials the number. When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates one time, displays **Redial Successful**, and then connects the call.

12.10 Using Caller ID

12.10.1 Incoming Calls

Calling line identification (Caller ID) displays the phone number for incoming calls.

The phone displays the caller's name (and picture, if available) if the name is stored in your contacts, or **mcoming Call** Incoming Call when caller ID information is not available.

You can also set your phone to play a distinctive Ringer ID for specific entries stored in your contacts. For more information, see page 82.

12.10.2 Outgoing Calls

You can show or hide your phone number as an ID for the calls that you make.

While dialling (with digits visible in the display), press Options > Hide Caller ID/Show Caller ID.

12.11 Calling an Emergency Number

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 999, that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked or the SIM card is not inserted. Your service provider can program additional emergency numbers into your SIM card. However, your SIM card must be inserted in your phone in order to use the numbers stored on it. See your service provider for additional information on this issue

Note: Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

12.12 Dialling International Numbers

To call contact entries 1 to 9, press and hold the single-digit speed dial number for one second.

You can set speed dial to call the entries in your phone's contacts list or Fixed Dial list.

12.14 Using Voicemail

Voicemail messages that you receive are stored on the network. To listen to your messages, you must call your voicemail phone number.

Note: Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

12.14.1 Listening to Voicemail Messages

Find the Feature



> Messaging > Call Voicemail

The phone calls your voicemail phone number. If no voicemail number is stored, your phone prompts you to store a number, see page 72. If you don't know your voicemail number, contact your service provider.

12.14.2 Receiving a Voicemail Message

When you receive a voicemail message, your phone displays (voicemail message indicator) and New Voicemail.

Note: The icon may vary depending on your service provider.

The phone calls your voicemail phone number. If no voicemail number is stored, your phone prompts you to store a number.

12.14.3 Storing Your Voicemail Number

If necessary, use the following procedure to store your voicemail phone number on your phone. Usually, your service provider has already done this for you.


