

Warning: This unit is equipped with an internal combustion engine and should not be used on or near any unimproved forest-covered, brush-covered or grass-covered land unless the engine's exhaust system is equipped with a spark arrester meeting applicable local or state laws (if any). If a spark arrester is used, it should be maintained in effective working order by the operator. In the State of California the above is required by law (Section 4442 of the California Public Resources Code). Other states may have similar laws. Federal laws apply on federal lands. 

WARNING: Engine Exhaust, some of its constituents, and certain vehicle components contain or emit chemicals known to State of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm.

DANGER: This machine was built to be operated according to the rules for safe operation in this manual. As with any type of power equipment, carelessness or error on the part of the operator can result in serious injury. This machine is capable of amputating hands and feet and throwing objects. Failure to observe the following safety instructions could result in serious injury or death.

Children

Tragic accidents can occur if operator is not alert to presence of children. Children are often attracted to mower and mowing activity. They do not understand the dangers. Never assume that children will remain where you last saw them.

- Keep children out of the mowing area and under watchful care of a responsible adult other than the operator.
- 2. Be alert and turn mower off if a child enters the area.
- Before and while moving backwards, look behind and down for small children.
- Use extreme care when approaching blind corners, doorways, shrubs, trees, or other objects that may obscure your vision of a child who may run into the mower.
- Keep children away from hot or running engines. They can suffer burns from a hot muffler.
- Never allow children under 14 years old to operate a power mower. Children 14 years old and over should read and understand operation instructions and safety rules in this manual and should be trained and supervised by a parent.

General Operation

- Read this operator's manual carefully in its entirety before attempting to assemble this machine. Read, understand, and follow all instructions on the machine and in the manual(s) before operation. Be completely familiar with the controls and the proper use of this machine before operating it. Keep this manual in a safe place for future and regular reference and for ordering replacement parts.
- 2. This machine is a precision piece of power equipment, not a plaything. Therefore, exercise extreme caution at all times. Your unit has been designed to perform one job: to mow grass. Do not use it for any other purpose.
- 3. Never allow children under 14 years old to operate this machine. Children 14 years old and over should read and understand the instructions in this manual and should be trained and supervised by a parent. Only responsible individuals who are familiar with these rules of safe operation should be allowed to use this machine.
- 4. Thoroughly inspect the area where the equipment is to be used. Remove all stones, sticks, wire, bones, toys and other foreign objects, which could be tripped over or picked up and thrown by the blade. Thrown objects can cause serious personal injury. Plan your mowing pattern to avoid discharge of material toward roads, sidewalks, bystanders and the like. Also, avoid discharging material against a wall or obstruction, which may cause discharged material to ricochet back toward the operator.
- To help avoid blade contact or a thrown object injury, stay in operator zone behind handles and keep children, bystanders, helpers and pets at least 75 feet from mower while it is in operation. Stop machine if anyone enters area.

- Always wear safety glasses or safety goggles during operation and while performing an adjustment or repair to protect your eyes. Thrown objects which ricochet can cause serious injury to the eyes.
- Wear sturdy, rough-soled work shoes and close-fitting slacks and shirts. Shirts and pants that cover the arms and legs and steel-toed shoes are recommended. Never operate this machine in bare feet, sandals, slippery or light-weight (e.g. canvas) shoes.
- 8. Do not put hands or feet near rotating parts or under cutting deck. Contact with blade can amputate hands and feet.
- 9. A missing or damaged discharge cover can cause blade contact or thrown object injuries.
- 10. Many injuries occur as a result of the mower being pulled over the foot during a fall caused by slipping or tripping. Do not hold on to the mower if you are falling; release the handle immediately.
- 11. Never pull the mower back toward you while you are walking. If you must back the mower away from a wall or obstruction first look down and behind to avoid tripping and then follow these steps:
 - a. Step back from mower to fully extend your arms.
 - b. Be sure you are well balanced with sure footing.
 - c. Pull the mower back slowly, no more than half way toward you.
 - d. Repeat these steps as needed.
- 12. Do not operate the mower while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- 13. Do not engage the self-propelled mechanism on units so equipped while starting engine.
- 14. The blade control handle is a safety device. Never attempt to bypass its operation. Doing so makes the safety device inoperative and may result in personal injury through contact with the rotating blade. The blade control handle must operate easily in both directions and automatically return to the disengaged position when released.
- 15. Never operate the mower in wet grass. Always be sure of your footing. A slip and fall can cause serious personal injury. If you feel you are losing your footing, release the blade control handle immediately and the blade will stop rotating within three seconds.
- 16. Mow only in daylight or good artificial light. Walk, never run.
- 17. Stop the blade when crossing gravel drives, walks or roads.
- 18. If the equipment should start to vibrate abnormally, stop the engine and check immediately for the cause. Vibration is generally a warning of trouble.

- Shut the engine off and wait until the blade comes to a complete stop before removing the grass catcher or unclogging the chute.
 - The cutting blade continues to rotate for a few seconds after the engine is shut off. Never place any part of the body in the blade area until you are sure the blade has stopped rotating.
- 20. Never operate mower without proper trail shield, discharge cover, grass catcher, blade control handle or other safety protective devices in place and working. Never operate mower with damaged safety devices. Failure to do so can result in personal injury.
- 21. Muffler and engine become hot and can cause a burn. Do not touch
- 22. Only use parts and accessories made for this machine by manufacturer. Failure to do so can result in personal injury.
- 23. If situations occur which are not covered in this manual, use care and good judgment. Contact your dealer for assistance.

Slope Operation

Slopes are a major factor related to slip and fall accidents, which can result in severe injury. Operation on slopes requires extra caution. If you feel uneasy on a slope, do not mow it. For your safety, use the slope gauge included as part of this manual to measure slopes before operating this unit on a sloped or hilly area. If the slope is greater than 15 degrees, do not mow it.

Do:

- 1. Mow across the face of slopes; never up and down. Exercise extreme caution when changing direction on slopes.
- Watch for holes, ruts, rocks, hidden objects, or bumps which can cause you to slip or trip. Tall grass can hide obstacles.
- Always be sure of your footing. A slip and fall can cause serious personal injury. If you feel you are losing your balance, release the blade control handle immediately, and the blade will stop rotating within 3 seconds.

Do Not:

- 1. Do not mow near drop-offs, ditches or embankments, you could lose your footing or balance.
- 2. Do not mow slopes greater than 15 degrees as shown on the slope gauge.
- 3. Do not mow on wet grass. Unstable footing could cause slipping.

Service

Safe Handling Of Gasoline:

- To avoid personal injury or property damage use extreme care in handling gasoline. Gasoline is extremely flammable and the vapors are explosive. Serious personal injury can occur when gasoline is spilled on yourself or your clothes, which can ignite. Wash your skin and change clothes immediately.
- 2. Use only an approved gasoline container.
- Never fill containers inside a vehicle or on a truck or trailer bed with a plastic liner. Always place containers on the ground away from your vehicle before filling.
- 4. Remove gas-powered equipment from the truck or trailer and refuel it on the ground. If this is not possible, then refuel such equipment on a trailer with a portable container, rather than from a gasoline dispenser nozzle.
- Keep the nozzle in contact with the rim of the fuel tank or container opening at all times until fueling is complete. Do not use a nozzle lock-open device.

- Extinguish all cigarettes, cigars, pipes and other sources of ignition.
- Never fuel machine indoor because flammable vapors will accumulate in the area.
- Never remove gas cap or add fuel while engine is hot or running. Allow engine to cool at least two minutes before refueling.
- 9. Never over fill fuel tank. Fill tank to no more than ½ inch below bottom of filler neck to provide for fuel expansion.
- 10. Replace gasoline cap and tighten securely.
- 11. If gasoline is spilled, wipe it off the engine and equipment. Move unit to another area. Wait 5 minutes before starting engine.
- 12. Never store the machine or fuel container near an open flame, spark or pilot light as on a water heater, space heater, furnace, clothes dryer or other gas appliances.
- 13. To reduce fire hazard, keep mower free of grass, leaves, or other debris build-up. Clean up oil or fuel spillage and remove any fuel soaked debris.
- 14. Allow a mower to cool at least 5 minutes before storing.

General Service:

- Never run an engine indoors or in a poorly ventilated area. Engine exhaust contains carbon monoxide, an odorless and deadly gas.
- Before cleaning, repairing, or inspecting, make certain the blade and all moving parts have stopped. Disconnect the spark plug wire and ground against the engine to prevent unintended starting.
- 3. Check the blade and engine mounting bolts at frequent intervals for proper tightness. Also, visually inspect blade for damage (e.g., bent, cracked, worn) Replace blade with the original equipment manufacture's (O.E.M.) blade only, listed in this manual. "Use of parts which do not meet the original equipment specifications may lead to improper performance and compromise safety!"
- Mower blades are sharp and can cut. Wrap the blade or wear gloves, and use extra caution when servicing them.
- Keep all nuts, bolts, and screws tight to be sure the equipment is in safe working condition.
- Never tamper with safety devices. Check their proper operation regularly.
- After striking a foreign object, stop the engine, disconnect the spark plug wire and ground against the engine.
 Thoroughly inspect the mower for any damage. Repair the damage before starting and operating the mower.
- Never attempt to make a wheel or cutting height adjustment while the engine is running.
- 9. Grass catcher components, discharge cover, and trail shield are subject to wear and damage which could expose moving parts or allow objects to be thrown. For safety protection, frequently check components and replace immediately with original equipment manufacturer's (O.E.M.) parts only, listed in this manual. "Use of parts which do not meet the original equipment specifications may lead to improper performance and compromise safety!"
- 10. Do not change the engine governor setting or over-rev the engine. The governor controls the maximum safe operating speed of the engine.
- 11. Maintain or replace safety labels, as necessary.
- 12. Observe proper disposal laws and regulations. Improper disposal of fluids and materials can harm the environment.

Setup and Adjustment




IMPORTANT

This unit is shipped without gasoline or oil in the engine. Fill up gasoline and oil as instructed in the engine operation section **BEFORE** operating your mower.

Loose Parts

Carton contents include: Wheels, Handles (upper & lower), Blade Control Handle, Chute Deflector & a Hardware Pack. Be certain to remove all loose parts before discarding the carton. Follow instructions below to attach these loose parts to your mower safely and properly for best performance.

Hardware Pack



For ease-of-assembly, identify the pieces in the hardware pack according to the chart below:

Tools Required

- Adjustable Wrench
- 1/2" Wrench
- 5/8" Wrench
- 7/16" Wrench
- 9/16" Wrench

NOTE: Reference to right, left, front and rear of the lawn mower is in relation to the operating position.

Attaching the Chute Deflector

NOTE: Use a 7/16" wrench and the hardware in **Group 1** to complete the following steps.

- 1. Align the holes on the chute deflector with the corresponding holes on the deck surface.
- 2. Insert carriage bolts up through the underside of the deck and through the chute deflector. See Figure 3-1.
- 3. Secure each bolt with a washer and lock nut.

Attaching Handles

NOTE: Use an adjustable wrench, a 1/2" wrench and the hardware in **Group 2** to complete the following steps.

Lower Handle

- 1. Lift the rear of the deck and place it on a block of wood to secure it.
- 2. Place the lower handle over the deck and align the holes on the deck with the corresponding holes on the handle.
- Secure the lower handle to the deck using the hex screws, shoulder screws, and flange lock nuts.
 See Figure 3-2.

Upper Handle

- 1. Place the upper handle in position over the lower handle keeping the blade control handle facing up.
- 2. Secure the upper handle to the lower handle using the carriage bolts, lock washers, and lock nuts from group 4 of the hardware pack. See Figure 3-3.







Setup and Adjustment



IMPORTANT

This unit is shipped without gasoline or oil in the engine. Fill up gasoline and oil as instructed in the engine operation section **BEFORE** operating your mower.



Setup and Adjustment

Attaching the Wheels

NOTE: Use an adjustable wrench, 7/16" wrench and the hardware in **Group 3** to complete the following steps.

The holes in the deck provide three cutting heights. Use corresponding holes when attaching all four wheels (i.e. for the lowest cutting position, assemble each wheel at the highest hole on the deck). Refer to the Cutting Height Adjustment section for more information.

1. Secure each wheel to the deck as shown in Figure 3-4.

NOTE: The *cupped* side of each washer should be pressed against the deck.

Attaching the Blade Control Handle

NOTE: If the blade control is secured and in place on the upper handle, you may skip the following three steps. If, however, the blade control became displaced either during shipping or during assembly, reattach it as follows:

- 1. Insert the curved end of the blade control into the *center* hole located on the right side of the upper handle. See Figure 3-5.
- 2. Gently squeeze the blade control inward and insert the straight end into the *lower* hole located on the left side of the upper handle. See Figure 3-5.
- 3. Check to confirm that the blade control pivots freely against the upper handle.

Attaching Blade-Brake Cable

Unwrap the blade-brake cable from the engine and route the cable under the lower handle.

Attaching Z Fitting

- 1. To make it easier to attach the Z fitting, temporarily remove the left side of the blade control as shown in Figure 3-6.
- 2. Hook the Z end of the brake cable into the handle from the outside to inside. See Figure 3-6.
- 3. Reattach the left side of the blade control.







Securing Blade-Brake Cable

NOTE: Use the hardware in **Group 6** to complete the following steps.



WARNING: The cable must be routed properly to avoid contact with all sharp edges and hot surfaces. Such contacts damage the cable and render the controls inoperative.

- 1. Press the stud found inside the snap fitting into the hole found on the left side of the upper handle, as shown in Figure 3- 7.
- 2. Secure the cable to the lower left handle with a cable tie. See Figure 3-8. Trim off the extra length of the cable tie.



NOTE: Use a 7/16" wrench and the hardware in **Group 5** to complete the following steps.

- Attach the eye bolt to the upper handle and loosely thread the lock nut on to secure it. Do NOT tighten. See Figure 3-9.
- With the spark plug wire disconnected and grounded, depress the blade control and pull the rope out of the engine.
- 3. Loop the rope through the eye bolt. See Figure 3-9.
- 4. Tighten the eye bolt to the handle using the lock nut. DO NOT overtighten.

Cutting Height Adjustment

- 1. Remove the carriage bolts and related hardware from the wheels. See Figure 3-10.
- Reattach the wheels with carriage bolts at another hole. Remember to attach ALL wheels at the same relative position to ensure an even cut. Refer to instructions for Attaching The Wheels earlier in this section. For a higher cutting height, use the lower hole on the deck. For a lower cutting height, use the upper hole.



Operating Your Lawn Mower



This blade control is a safety device. Do not bypass its operations.

Use extreme care when handling gasoline. Gasoline is extremely flammable and the vapors are explosive. Never fuel the machine indoors or while the engine is hot or running. Extinguish cigarettes, cigars, pipes and other sources of ignition.

Know Your Lawn Mower




Figure 4-1: The main components on the mower.

Now that you have assembled your lawn mower, it's important to become aquainted with its controls and features.

Blade Control

The blade control is attached to the upper handle. Depress and squeeze it against the upper handle to operate the unit. Release it to stop the engine and blade.



WARNING: This blade control is a safety device. Never attempt to bypass its operations.

Recoil Starter

The recoil starter is attached to the right upper handle. Stand behind the unit, depress blade control, and pull the recoil starter rope to start the unit.

Gas and Oil Fill-Up

- 1. Check oil level and add oil if necessary. Follow engine manual for this.
- 2. Service the engine with gasoline as instructed in the engine manual. See engine manual for location of gas and oil fill.



WARNING: Use extreme care when handling gasoline. Gasoline is extremely flammable and the vapors are explosive.

Never fuel the machine indoors or while the engine is hot or running. Extinguish cigarettes, cigars, pipes and other sources of ignition. A m

Starting Engine



WARNING: Be sure no one other than the operator is standing near the lawn mower while starting engine or operating mower. Never run engine indoors or in enclosed.

poorly ventilated areas. Engine exhaust contains carbon monoxide, an odorless and deadly gas. Keep hands, feet, hair and loose clothing away from any moving parts on engine and lawn mower.




Figure 4-2: To start mower, prime the engine, squeeze blade control handle, and pull recoil starter.

 Push primer three times. Wait about two seconds between each push. See Figure 4-2. In temperature around 55°F or below, prime five times. Do not prime to restart a warm engine.

NOTE: For the location of the primer on your mower, refer to the engine manual shipped with your unit.

- 2. Standing behind the mower, squeeze the blade control against upper handle. See Figure 4-2.
- Holding these two handles together firmly, grasp recoil starter handle and pull rope out with a rapid, continuous, full arm stroke. See Figure 4-2. Keeping a firm grip on the starter handle, let the rope rewind slowly. Repeat until engine cranks. Let the rope rewind each time slowly.

Stopping Engine

- 1. Release blade control to stop the engine and the blade.
- 2. Disconnect spark plug wire from spark plug and ground against the engine.

Using Your Lawn Mower

Be sure the lawn is clear of stones, sticks, wire, or other objects which could damage the lawn mower or the engine. Such objects could be accidently thrown by the mower in any direction and cause serious personal injury to the operator and others.



WARNING: If you strike a foreign object, stop the engine. Remove wire from the spark plug, thoroughly inspect the mower for any damage, and repair the damage

before restarting and operating the mower. Extensive vibration of the mower during operation is an indication of damage. The unit should be promptly inspected and repaired.

Operating Tips

- For best results, do not cut wet grass.
- New grass, thick grass, or wet grass may require a narrower cut.
- For a healthier lawn, never cut more than one-third of the total length of the grass.
- Your lawn should be cut in the fall as long as there is growth.
- Adjust ground speed according to condition of lawn.



Operating Your Lawn Mower



WARNING

The operation of any lawn mower can result in foreign objects being thrown into the eyes, which can damage your eyes severely. Always wear safety glasses while operating the mower, or while performing any adjustments or repairs on it.

Be sure no one other than the operator is standing near the lawn mower while starting engine or operating mower. Never run engine indoors or in enclosed, poorly ventilated areas. Engine exhaust contains carbon monoxide, an odorless and deadly gas. Keep hands, feet, hair and loose clothing away from any moving parts on engine and lawn mower.



Maintaining Your Lawn Mower



Always stop engine, disconnect spark plug, and ground against engine before performing any type of maintenance on your machine.

Never tip the mower more than 90° in any direction and do not leave the mower tipped for any length of time. Oil can drain into the upper part of the engine.



NOTE: Do not use a pressure washer or garden hose to clean the mower. These may cause damage to the engine. The use of water will result in shortened life and reduce serviceability.




Figure 5-1: Lubrication areas on the mower.

General Recommendations

WARNING: Always stop engine, disconnect spark plug, and ground against engine before cleaning, lubricating, or performing any kind of maintenance on your machine.

- Always observe safety rules when performing maintenance work.
- The warranty on this lawn mower does not cover items that have been subjected to operator abuse or negligence. To receive full value from warranty, operator must maintain the lawn mower as instructed here.
- Changing of engine-governed speed will void engine warranty.
- All adjustments should be checked at least once each season.

Lubrication

- Lubricate pivot points on the blade control at least once a season with light oil. The blade control must operate freely in both directions. See Figure 5-1.
- Lubricate the wheels at least once a season with light oil (or motor oil). If wheels are removed for any reason, lubricate surface of the axle bolt and inner surface of the wheel with light oil. See Figure 5-1.
- Follow the accompanying engine manual for engine lubrication schedule and instructions.

Deck Care

Clean underside of the mower deck after each use to prevent build-up of grass clippings or other debris. Follow steps below for this job.

- 1. Disconnect spark plug wire. Drain gasoline from lawn mower, or place a piece of plastic under the gas cap.
- 2. Tip mower so that it rests on the housing. Keep the side with the air cleaner facing up. Hold mower firmly.

WARNING: Never tip the mower more than 90 degrees in any directions and do not leave the mower tipped for any length of time. Oil can drain into the upper part of the engine causing a starting problem.

- 3. Scrape and clean the underside of the deck with a suitable tool. Do not spray with water.
- Put the mower back on its wheels on the ground. If you had put plastic under the gas cap earlier, make sure to remove it now.

Engine Care

A list of key engine maintenance jobs required for good performance by the mower is given below. Follow the accompanying engine manual for a detailed list and instructions.

- 1. Maintain oil level as instructed in engine manual.
- Service air cleaner every 25 hours under normal conditions. Clean every few hours under extremely dusty conditions. Poor engine performance and flooding usually indicates that the air cleaner should be serviced. To service the air cleaner, refer to the engine manual.
- Clean spark plug and reset the gap once a season.
 Spark plug replacement is recommended at the start of each mowing season. Check engine manual for correct plug type and gap specifications.
- 4. Clean engine regularly with a cloth or brush. Keep the cooling system (blower housing area) clean to permit proper air circulation. Remove all grass, dirt and combustible debris from muffler area.

Blade Care

WARNING: When removing the cutting blade for sharpening or replacement, protect your hands with a pair of heavy gloves or use a heavy rag to hold the blade.

Periodically inspect the blade adapter for cracks, especially if you strike a foreign object. Replace when necessary.

- 1. Disconnect spark plug wire from spark plug. Turn mower on its side making sure that the air filter and the carburetor are up.




Figure 5-2: The blade and corresponding hardware.

- 2. Remove the bolt and the blade bell support which hold the blade and the blade adapter to the engine crankshaft. See Figure 5-2.
- 3. Remove blade and adapter from the crankshaft. See Figure 5-2.
- 4. The blade can be sharpened with a file or on a grinding wheel. Do not attempt to sharpen the blade while it is still on the mower. When sharpening the blade, follow the original angle of grind. Grind each cutting edge equally to keep the blade balanced.
- 5. Remove blade from the adapter and balance on a round shaft screwdriver for testing balance. Remove metal from the heavy side until it balances evenly.

WARNING: An unbalanced blade will cause excessive vibration when rotating at high speeds. It may cause damage to mower and could break causing personal injury.

- 6. Lubricate the engine crankshaft and the inner surface of the blade adapter with light oil. Slide the blade adapter onto the engine crankshaft.
- 7. Place the blade on the adapter such that the side of the blade marked "Bottom" (or with part number) faces ground when the mower is in the operating position. Make sure that the blade is aligned and seated on blade adapter flanges.
- 8. Place blade bell support on the blade. Align notches on the blade bell support with small holes in blade.
- 9. Replace hex bolt and tighten hex bolt to torque: 450 in. lbs. min., 600 in. lbs. max.

To ensure safe operation of your mower, periodically check the blade bolt for correct torque.

Off-Season Storage

The following steps should be taken to prepare your lawn mower for storage.

- Clean and lubricate mower thoroughly as described in the lubrication instructions.
- Do not use a pressure washer or garden hose to clean your unit.
- Refer to engine manual for correct engine storage instructions.
- Coat mower's cutting blade with chassis grease to prevent rusting.
- Store mower in a dry, clean area. Do not store next to corrosive materials, such as fertilizer.

When storing any type of power equipment in a poorly ventilated or metal storage shed, care should be taken to rust-proof the equipment. Using a light oil or silicone, coat the equipment, especially cables and all moving parts of your lawn mower before storage.


