## **Basic Function**



To turn on the power

Move the slide switch on the backside of the unit to the mode you want. (Music/FM)



To turn off the power

Move the slide switch on the back of the unit to 'Power Off.'

Tip

Power Off cannot be made while USB is connected with PC.

When no input is made in Stop and Pause, the power is automatically set to AUTO POWER SAVE MODE.

When the slide switch isn't set at an appropriate mode, "Invalid Mode Key!!!" is displayed.

#### **HOLD** function


