




USIM PINs

PIN1

A four- to eight-digit code used to prevent unauthorized handset use.

■ PIN2

Required to reset total call time/cost and set cost limit.

■ PIN Lock & Cancellation (PUK)

PIN1/PIN2 Lock is activated if PIN1/PIN2 is incorrectly entered three times. Enter PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) to unlock. For details, contact SoftBank Mobile Customer Center. General Information.

· PIN1 and PIN2, 9999 by default, can be changed.

Codes

■ Security Code

A four-digit number required to use some handset functions. The code is 9999 by default.

■ Center Access Code

A four-digit number assigned at initial subscription. Required to access Voice Mail via landlines or to subscribe to fee-based information.

■ Network Password

A four-digit number assigned at initial subscription. Required to restrict incoming/outgoing calls (Call Barring).

 If Network Password is incorrectly entered three times, Call Barring settings are locked.
 Network Password and Center Access Code must be changed. For details, contact SoftBank Mobile Customer Center, General Information.




Handset, Battery & Charger





Battery

Do not dispose of batteries as municipal waste.





Avoid extremely cold and high temperatures. Use handset at an ambient temperature of 5 to 35°C, and humidity of 45 to 85%. If handset is left in an extremely hot place, handset may power off automatically.



Electromagnetic Waves

For body-worn operation, this handset has been tested and meets RF exposure guidelines when used with accessories containing no metal, that position handset a minimum of 15 mm from the body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with RF exposure guidelines.

FCC Information to User

931N has been tested and found to comply with the limits of a Class B digital device, pursuant to Part 15 of the FCC Rules. These limits are designed to provide reasonable protection against harmful interference in a residential installation. This equipment generates uses and can radiate radio $\frac{1}{145}$ frequency energy and, if not installed and used in accordance with the instructions, may cause harmful interference to radio communications. The influence on the human body of radio waves emitted from mobile phones is measured employing a unit known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g. at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.

The maximum SAR value for this model handset when tested for use at the ear is 0.274 W/kg and when worn on the body, as described in this guide, is 0.451 W/kg.

Body-worn Operation; this device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the handset kept 1.5 cm from the body. To maintain compliance with FCC RF exposure requirements, use accessories that maintain a 1.5 cm separation distance between the user's body and the back of the handset. The use of belt clips, holsters and similar accessories should not contain metallic components in its assembly. European RF Exposure Information

931N is a radio transmitter and receiver. This product has been confirmed not to exceed the limits recommended by international guidelines for radio frequency.

These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organization International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) and include a substantial safety margin to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The influence on the human body of radio waves emitted from mobile phones is measured employing a unit known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg. The maximum SAR value for this model handset, when placed on the ear, is XXXXX W/kg*. As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in SoftBank's Body SAR Policy. In this case, the maximum SAR value is XXXXX W/kg.

Since the SAR is measured at the highest transmitting power level, the actual SAR during a call is usually much lower. This is because mobile phones are designed to operate at their minimum power levels necessary to communicate with base stations.

The World Health Organization (WHO) has stated that present scientific information about mobile phone use does not indicate any adverse effects on the human body. They recommend limiting talking time or using a handsfree device to keep the mobile phone away from the head and body to reduce influence of exposure to radio waves.
