# 1 Start Successfully

## 1.1 About the Manual

This manual is intended for all users who want to learn how to use Nero BurnRights. It is process-based and explains how to achieve a specific objective on a step-by-step basis.

## 1.2 About Nero BurnRights

Nero BurnRights allows a system administrator to authorize users without administrator rights to burn discs and connect new burners. This is necessary as users without administrator rights do not have access to the drivers needed for burning discs or for connecting new burners.

Additionally, the system administrator can assign rights for individual burners or Nero applications to users without administrator rights.


## 1.3 System Requirements

Nero BurnRights is part of the Nero product you have installed. Its system requirements are the same. Detailed system requirements of this and all other Nero products can be found in the Support section on our Web site [www.nero.com](http://www.nero.com).


## 1.4 Starting the Program

There are several ways to open Nero BurnRights, depending on various factors such as the product you have installed and the operating system you are using.

On Windows 7 and earlier versions of Windows, you can start Nero BurnRights via:

- **Start** (the start icon) > **(All) Programs** > **Nero** > **Nero 2014** > Nero BurnRights
- the  Nero 2014 desktop icon

On Windows 8, you can start Nero BurnRights via:

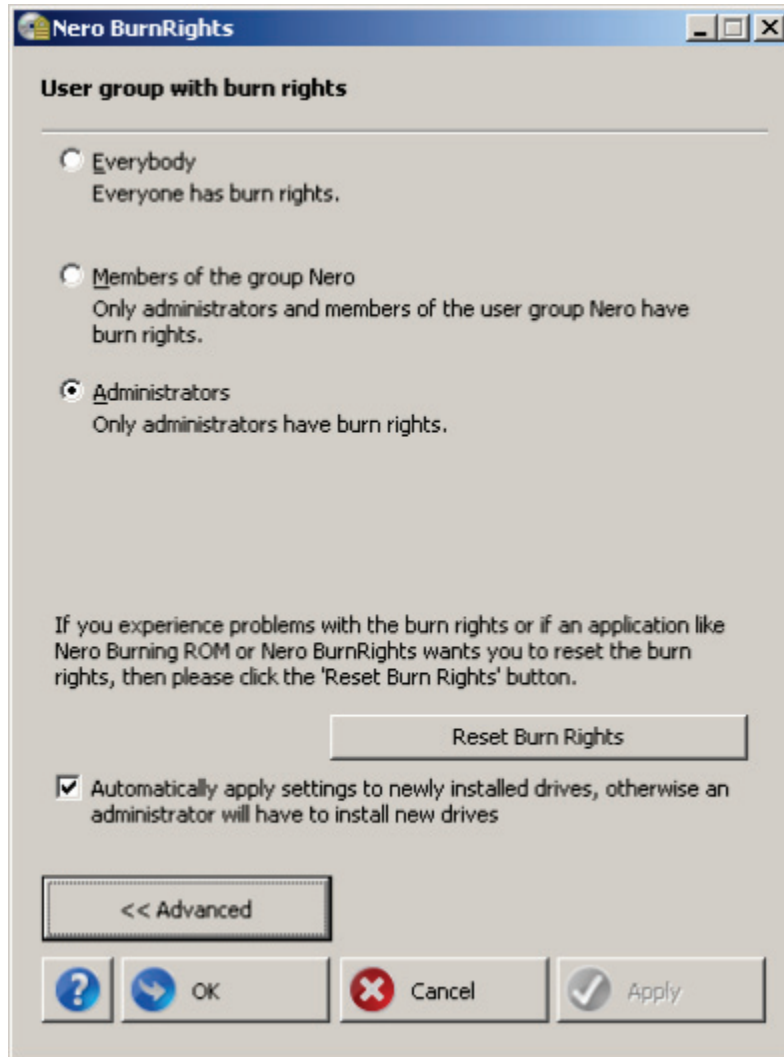
- the Nero 2014 tile (Windows 8 **Start** screen) or the  Nero 2014 desktop icon (Windows 8 desktop) if you use Nero 2014
- the Nero BurnRights tile (Windows 8 **Start** screen) if you use Nero BurnRights without Nero 2014 being installed



You can also start Nero BurnRights from the Control Panel.

## 2 Simple Nero BurnRights Window Under Windows XP


After starting Nero BurnRights under Windows XP, the **Nero BurnRights** window is opened.

The following setting options are available:

Option button <b>Everybody</b>	Assigns burn rights to all users.
Option button <b>Members of the group Nero</b>	Assigns burn rights only to members of the Windows group Nero. If the group Nero has not been created in Windows, Nero BurnRights automatically creates the group.

Option button <b>Administrators</b>	Assigns burn rights only to administrators. Administrators are users who have administrator rights according to the Windows user profile.
Button <b>Reset Burn Rights</b>	Resets the burn rights settings to the default value. By default burn rights are only assigned to Administrators.
Check box <b>Automatically apply settings to newly installed drives</b>	Applies the settings made to all newly installed drives automatically. If this check box is not selected, an administrator will have to install new drives manually.
Button <b>Advanced</b>	Opens the advanced view of the Nero BurnRights window (see Advanced Nero BurnRights Window Under Windows XP).
Button 	Displays the online help.
Button <b>OK</b>	Applies the settings made and closes the <b>Nero BurnRights</b> window.
Button <b>Cancel</b>	Discards the settings made and closes the <b>Nero BurnRights</b> window.
Button <b>Apply</b>	Applies all settings made without closing the <b>Nero BurnRights</b> window.



Groups to which users can be assigned are only available or can only be created if the computer is assigned to a domain.



If users are refused burn rights, they cannot burn any discs using the installed recorder. Such users only have access to the Image Recorder with the option of burning disk images.

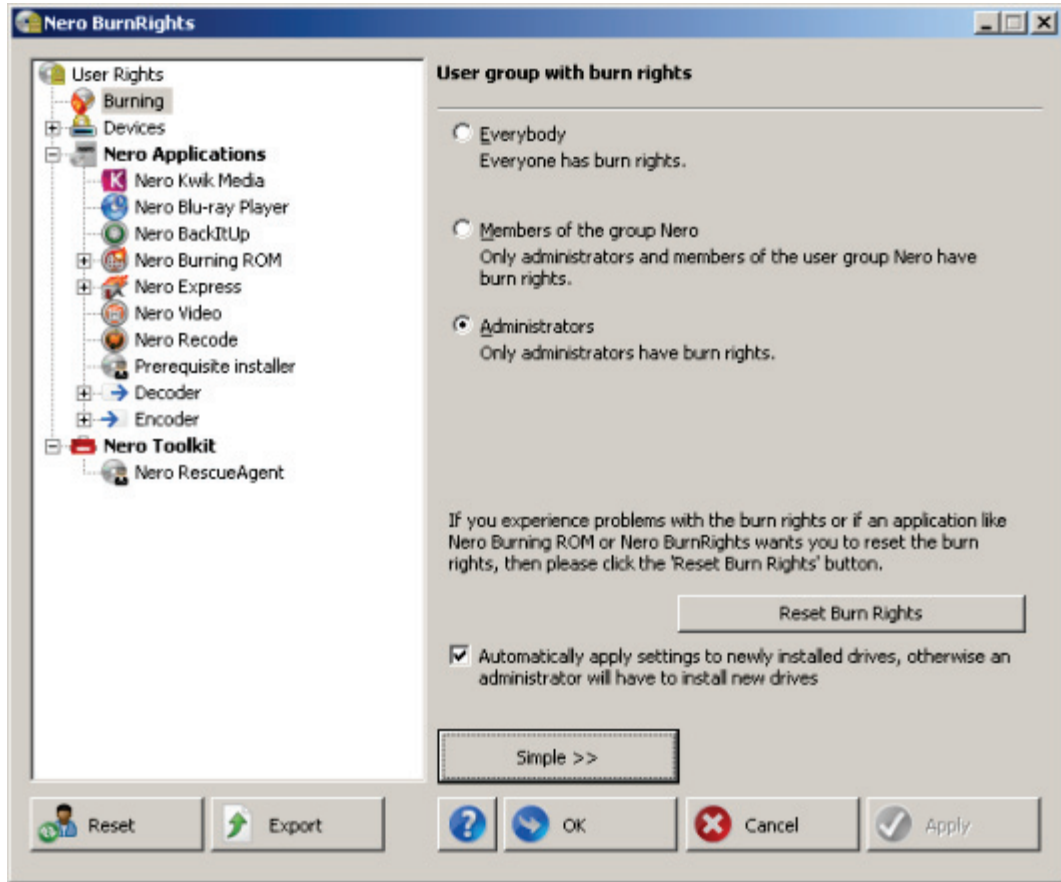

### 3 Advanced Nero BurnRights Window Under Windows XP

After starting Nero BurnRights under Windows XP and clicking the **Advanced** button, the extended **Nero BurnRights** window is opened. Here you can set up and assign the burn rights and other rights individually, according to your wishes.

Select an entry in the navigation tree to display the respective screen for editing on the right side.

Option button <b>Nobody</b>	Disables burn rights and/or other rights for all users.
Check box <b>Automatically apply settings to newly installed drives</b>	Applies the settings made to all newly installed drives automatically. If this check box is not selected, an administrator will have to install new drives manually.
Button <b>Reset Burn Rights</b>	Resets the burn rights settings to the default value. By default burn rights are only assigned to Administrators.
Button <b>Simple</b>	Opens the simple view of the Nero BurnRights window (see Simple Nero BurnRights Window Under Windows XP).

Button <b>Reset</b>	Resets all user rights configurations for all features and applications except the burn rights back to default settings.
Button <b>Export</b>	Creates a registry file with your rights settings except the burn rights.
Button 	Displays the online help.
Button <b>OK</b>	Applies all changes made and closes the <b>Nero BurnRights</b> window.
Button <b>Cancel</b>	Discards the settings made and closes the <b>Nero BurnRights</b> window.
Button <b>Apply</b>	Applies all changes made without closing the <b>Nero BurnRights</b> window.

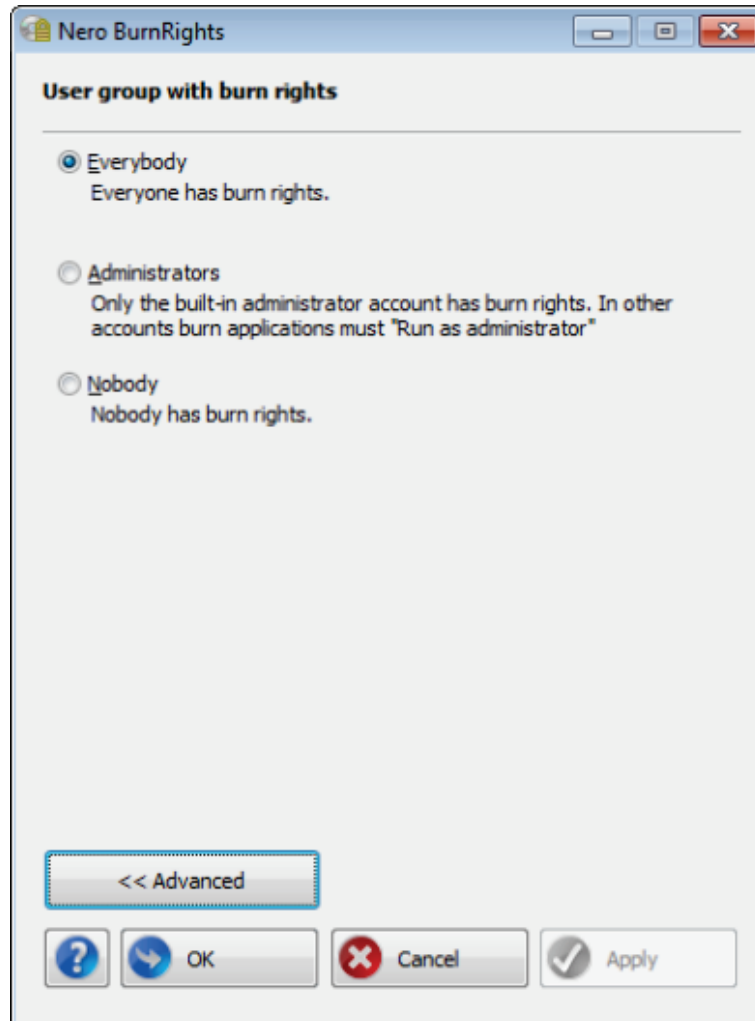

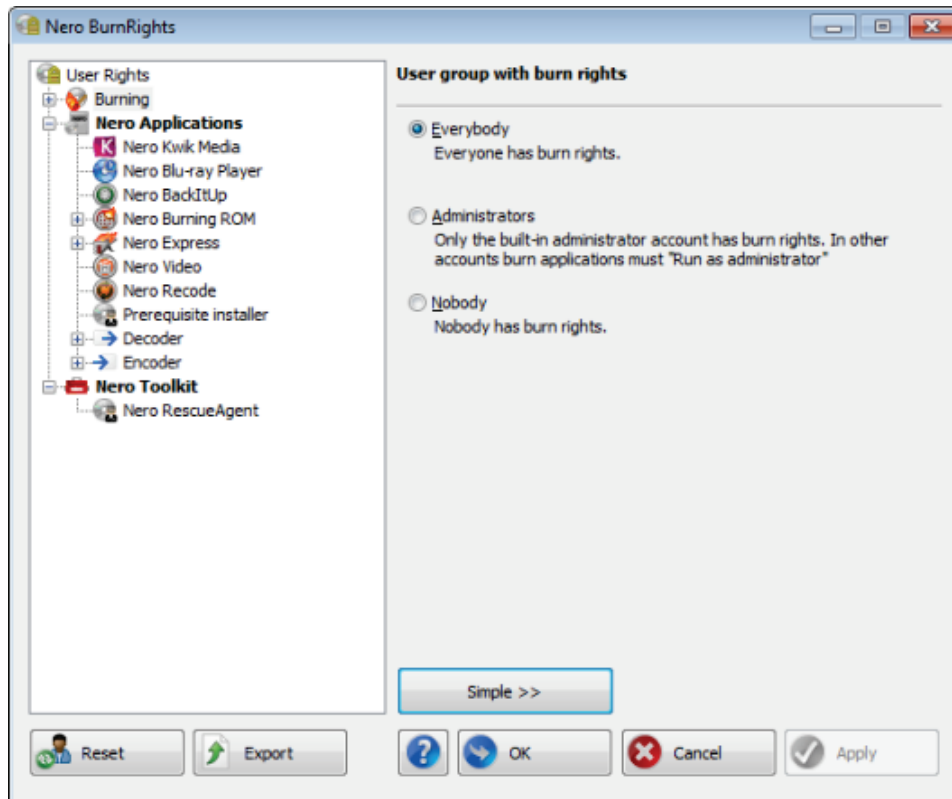
