## **Battery Instructions:**

2 "AA" batteries are included for demonstration and they can be used until replacement. When replacing new batteries, please follow the instructions below:

- 1. Open the battery compartment cover at the bottom of the vehicle, discard the included 2 "AA" batteries.
- 2. Insert 2 fresh "AA" batteries with positive (+) and negative (-) ends correctly matching the compartment markings.
- 3. Replace battery compartment cover.
- 4. Open the battery compartment cover at the back of the controller.
- 5. Insert 2 fresh "AAA" batteries with positive (+) and negative (-) ends correctly matching the compartment markings.
- 6. Replace battery compartment cover.

# Operation:

- 1. START: Move switch on bottom of vehicle to the "ON" position.
- 2. FORWARD/TURNING IN REVERSE: Push forward/reverse joystick up to move vehicle forward and down for turning in reverse.

#### For Best Results:

- 1. Do not mix old and new batteries.
- 2. Do not mix alkaline, standard or rechargeable batteries.
- 3. Use alkaline batteries only.
