



Transferring A Call From One Handset To Another

When you want to transfer the call you are receiving to the other handset, follow the steps below:

Transferring

- 1. Press [intercom] to display 'CALL ON HOLD' on LCD, which will hold the call.
- 2. Use to select the handset you want to transfer to and press OK.

 In case that there are only two handsets, then you do not have to select. The press of [intercom] will directly page the other handset.

 Before the invited handset answering, press [intercom] again for canceling.
- 3. Press to hang up. The call is still hold before the transfer handset answers.

Answering

Press or SPK .

If the paged handset does not answer or hangs up by pressing ? , the call will go back to the handset that transfers the call.

Hanging up

Press 😨 .

Multihandset Functions

You may register 4 HANDSETS totally to your BASE unit. The expanded handsets (chargers) no need connect phone lines. You can place them wherever you like. When you have several handsets at your hand, you can follow below functions.

Conference Call

When one handset is in phone, all the other handsets will display 'LINE IN USE'. When another handsetioins in the talk, all the other handsets will display 'ON CONFERENCE'

Inviting

- 1. Press [intercom] to display 'CALL ONHOLD' on the screen to hold the call.
- 2. Press to select the handset you would like to invite and then press.

In case that there are only two handsets, then you do not have to select. The press of [intercom] will directly page the other handset. Before the invited handset answering, press[intercom] again for canceling.

- 3. When the screen is displaying 'ON INTERCOM', which means the invited handset already has joined in, press again.
- 4. 'ON CONFERENCE' displayed on the screen shows that the conference call is beginning.

Join in Press or SPK).

Quit

Any handset can quit the conference call by pressing

At most two handsets to be ON CONFERENCE CALL with the incoming caller.

One handset hanging up for quit CONFERENCE CALL; once the second handset hanging up will finish the talking.

Paging

LINE REMOTE CONTROL:

ANSWER NACHINE can be controlled by an incoming call from outline to set up answering mode, listen to voice messages and make recording etc.

Make a callfrom outlines.

Enter the passwords when the phone automatically answers the call with recording. Refer to <u>'Setting LINE REMOTE CONTROL SECURITY ID' (P12)</u> of section <u>'Setting Handset'</u> for password setting. Follow the voice instructions.

Note: ANSWERMACHINE automatically disconnects when if fails to receive REMOTE CONTROL password for 8 Seconds.

Note: Hang up the phone at 4th rings when listen to the recorded incoming message if AUTO ANSWER RING is set up to TS Mode. Hang up to exit.

STOPPING ALARM:

Press [ALM1] or [ALM2] to stop ALARM.

Press [STANDBY] to stop ALARM.

Alarm will resumes at preset time next day.

PAUSING ALARM (SNOOZE):

Press [SNOOZE/MUTE] to pause ALARM, which rings again after 7 minutes until ALARM DURATION has expired

Note: ALARM automatically pauses during INCOMING CALL or AUTO ANSWERING.

ANSWER MACHINE

SETTING ANSWERMACHINE ON/OFF:

Press [ANS ON/OFF] to switch between Answer On or Answer Off., And 'Answer On' or 'Answer Off' will be displayed on the screen with the corres ponding voice prompt .

Note: Answer On/Off can be selected via HANDSET remote control or LINE remote control, too.

INCOMING CALL AUTO ANSWER (RECORDICM):

ANSWER MACHINE will automatically answer the incoming call after the pre-set rings (3 rings or 5 rings or TS) and play the voice instruction 'Please leave your message after the tone'.

Note: ANSWER MACHINE will response after 10 ringing, but make no recording on 'ANSWER OFF' mode.

The buzzer will beep to indicate the recording is to start following the voice instruction..

Note: The maximum recording time is 1 minute for each massage. [CHARGE/IN USE] indication light flashes every one second to remind you that there are new messages.

The number of total messages and that of new messages will display separately on the screen.

Note:

The phone can save up to 59 messages in the memory.

Recording automatically stops if the memory is full with 'MEMORY IS FULL' displayed on the screen.

ANSWER MACHINE will stop recording and hang up when there is a 7-second silence in the recording process to avoid any unimportant messages and to save the memory capacity.

STOPPING AHTO ANSWER:

The AUTO ANSWER stops under one of the following circumstances:

Press or [SPK] on the HANDSET during answering.

OR: Other HANDSET answers the call.

OR: Press on ANSWER MACHINE or press [STANDBY].

Note: Duringthe AUTO ANSWER, pressing the Alarm clock, or pressing for CD player, or pressing [RADIO, AM/FM], all can startworking, but the AUTO ANSWER will not stop at the same time.

GUIDANCE FOR QUICK OPERATIONS

PRIOR TO USE

- Connect the PHONE LINE CORD to the "TEL LINE" jack on the bottom of BASE UNIT and to a telephone outlet.
- 2) Connect the AC Power Adaptor to the 12V DC jack on the bottom of BASE UNIT and to the wall power outlet.
- 3) Plug the RADIO ANTENNAto the terminal on the bottom of BASE UNIT. Note:Be sure to insert the RADIO ANTENAto ensure better reception of AM radio signal.
- 4) Install the battery pack into the battery compartment of HANDSET and be sure to charge the battery Pack for 12 hours before the initial use, otherwise the lasting time will be reduced and the battery life will be shortened.

Note: Properly-charged battery pack can last 5 days in STANFBY Mode, and about 4 hours of continuous use.

BASIC OPERATIONS CORDLESS PHONE

Making a Phone Call:

Pick up HANDSET and press , dial the phone number when the dial tone Is heard.

OR: Pick up HANDSET and dial the phone number, then press .

OR: Press **SPK** on HANDSET and dial the phone number when the dial tone is heard.

Note: [SPK] will be displayed on the screen of BASE UNIT in SPEAKER mode.

Terminating a Phone Call:

Place HANDSET back to the charger.

OR: Press on HANDSET to hang up.

Answering a Call:

Pick up HANDSET and press

OR: Press [SPK] and connect the call on SPEAKERPHONE mode.

Redialing:

Press or [SPK] and then press [redial] to dial the last-dialed call.

Adjusting the Phone Volume:

Press or on HANDSET to adjust the phone volume..

Switching Between HANDSET & SPEAKERPHONE:

Press [SPK] during the call in use to switch between HANDSET and SPEAKERPHONE.

Mute:

Press [mute] on HANDSET to activate mute and press again to cancel.

Note: When [mute] is activate, the callee cannot hear you.

GUIDANCE FOR ADVANCED OPERATIONS

Press 'MUTE' again to exit from REMOTE CONTROL mode.

Note: The voice instructions include:

For help menu, press 7;

To turn answer Off/On, press 4;

To playback, press 2;

To stop, press 2 again;



CD PLAYER & RADIO

SLEEP TIMER FOR CD PALAYER OR RADIO:

Press [SLEEP] during CD or RADIO playing to set up timer, and CDPLAYER or RADIO will automatically be turned off at the previously-set time. Options of 30 / 60 / 90 / 120 minutes and OFF can be chosen from, with the corresponding Icon displayed on the screen.



Press [SLEEP] to display the remaining time.

Press [SLEEP] to adjust the timer when the remaining time is still displayed on the screen.

Note: The corresponding Icon [SLEEP] will displayed on the screen after selection. Can not set the sleep time during the CD player as Alarm.

REPEATING CD PLAY:

Press [REP] to switch REPEAT modes when CD is playing with the corresponding Icons displayed on the screen. There are three REPEAT modes:

repeat all songs

repeat the current song

Shuffle mode randomly rearranges the track order. If you want to play the tracks in a randomorder, select Shuffle mode, that means if you didn't select the Shuffle mode, you will play your tracks in a particular order.

ALARM & SNOOZE

CANCELLING ALARM:

Press [**SET**] to cancel the alarm. Refer to the '<u>SETTING ALARM'</u> (P 14) for details.

OR: Press [ALM1] /[ALM2] to quickly cancel the alarm. Refer to the 'QUICK SETTING ALARM MODE & DURATION' (P 15) for details.

Note:

NO ALARM Icon, such as <CD>, <RADIO> or <BUZZER> displays on the screen once cancelled.

NO ALARM available once cancelled until ALARM to be re-set.

Attention: CALLER ID & CALL WATING Service must be subscribed from the local telephone company.

CHECKING CALLER ID:

Press to access 'INCOMING CALL LIST' under STANDBY mode. Scroll to roll up and down.

DELETING CALLER ID:

Press volumer STANDBY mode.

Scroll \diamondsuit to the number to be deleted.

DELETING ALLCALLER IDS:

Press and hold until 'DELETE ALL?' displayed on then screen.

CALL WAITING:

Press to listen to 2nd Caller When talking with 1st Caller, and press again to return to the 1st Caller.

HANDSET can be used as a Remote Control to set up ANSWER MACHINE mode, to listen to messages and to make recording etc.

Press 'MUTE' under STANDBY mode to access REMOTE CONTROL mode and the screen will display 'ANSWERER REMOTE'. Operate according to the voice instructions.

GUIDANCE FOR QUICK OPERATIONS

CD PLAYER

Playing CD:

Insert the CD into the CD slot and the CD will automatically play, with correspond -ing Icon appearing on the screen.

OR: Press I on CD/RADION Operation Panel with a CD already loaded.

Press ◄◄ to replay the currentsong, or press ◄◄ at the first second will back to the last song, and Press ▶▶ to skip to the next song.

Press [VOL+] / [VOL-] to adjust the volume.

Press ►II on CD/RADIO OPERATION PANEL during playing to make a pause.

Press [MUTE] on BASE UNIT to switch between pause and playing.

Press or press [STANDBY] to stop playing.

Fast Forwarding & Backwarding:

Press and hold both or last forwarding or fast backwarding.

FM/AM RADIO

Listening to RADIO:

Press [RADIO, AM/FM] to turn on the RADIO

Press [RADIO, AM/FM] during broadcasting to switch over RADIO between AM and FM.

Press [VOL+] / [VOL-] to adjust the volume.

Press on CD/RADIO OPERATION PANEL to turn off RADIO.

Searching for Stations:

Press ◄◄ or▶► for the tuner to search for a station.

Press and hold I◀◀ or▶▶I for fast automatic channel searching.

Presetting Stations:

Press [M1]~[M5] to turn into the corresponding preset radio stations with corresponding Icon appearing on the screen.

Press and hold [M1] \sim [M5] during radio playing until corresponding Icon displayed on the screen to save the preset station as the corresponding preset station.

Total of 10 stations can be preset, 5 stations each for AM and PM.

The preset stations will not be lost in memory with the power-off.

ANSWER MACHINE

Listening to the Voice Message:

Press ► on ANSWER MACHINE to play messages. It will play new messages when there are new ones .

Press **|** ◀ or **>** I on ANSWER MACHINE during the message playing to play previous or next message

Press on ANSWER MACHINE to stop or press [STANDBY].

GUIDANCE FOR QUICK OPERATIONS

Deleting the Voice Message:

Press [**DEL**] to delete the current message during the message playing. Press and hold [**DEL**] to delete all the **old messages** during the message playing.

ALARM CLOCK

There are two alarms as [ALM1] and [ALM2].

Press [SET] and the text 'SET TIME?' will be displayed on the screen, scroll [VOL+]/[VOL-] to 'ET ALARM1?'.

Press [SET] again to display 'SETAL1 HOUR', scroll [VOL+] / [VOL-] to select.

Press [SET] to confirm, and set the 'MINUTE' in the same way. And the 'SETAL1 MODE' appears on the screen, And scroll [VOL+] / [VOL-] to select the alarm mode in the following order.



Note: mode Once on OFF mode,no CD, or RADIO, or BUZZER icon displayed on the screen:

Press [SET] to confirm the mode, then 'SETAL1 VOLUME' appears on the screen.And scroll [VOL+] / [VOL-] to adjust the volume.

Note: The volume of the alarm increases gradually when it rings. The setting is for the maximum volume (no less than 5).

Press [SET] to confirm the Volume, then 'SETÁL1-DURATION' display on the screen.And scroll [VOL+] / [VOL-] to select the duration.

Note: Minimum duration is 10MIN, maximum duration is 120MIN for CD /RADIO and 30MIN for BUZZER.

Press [SET] to confirm and quit.

Note: Directly press [ALM1] to view the time and duration of ALM1, once 'ALARM1 XXMIN' and corresponding Icon appear on the screen , here " XXMIN"means the duration of the ALARM. Follow the same instructions for ALARM 2.

OTHER IMPORTANT FEATURES

Auto Mute:

RADIO or CD PLAYER will automatically become mute under one of the following circumstances and the Icon <MUTE> will flash on the screen

When the phone is ringing OR: When the phone is in use.

OR: When HANDSET is under REMOTE CONTROL mode.

Auto Mute will be automatically cancelled

When the phone call is finished or the ring stops;

OR: Press [SNOOZE/MUTE] on BASE UNIT;.

GUIDANCE FOR ADVANCED OPERATIONS

HANDSET/PHONE BOOK

SAVING NUMBERS TO PHONE BOOK:

PHONE BOOK can save up to 64 numbers, frequently used for easy and quick access.

Saving a New Number to PHONE BOOK:

Press v to access PHONE BOOK under STANDBY mode.

Scroll to 'NEWENTRY' and press **OK**).

Enter the name (maximum 11 characters). Press to delete the wrongly entered characters before the cursor.

Note: Please refer to NAMING HANDSET (P.10) about how to entering character. Press (**) to confirm.

Enter the phone number (maximum 24 characters). Press to delete the wrongly entered numbers before the cursor.

Press **>** to save.

Scroll to 'PHONEBOOK'

Save the Recently Dialed Number to PHONE BOOK:

Press [redial] to show the recently dialed numbers on the screen.

Press .

Enter the name (maximum 11 characters). Press for deleting the wrongly entered characters before the cursor.

Note: Please refer to NAMING HANSET (P. 10) about how to entering character. Scroll \$\infty\$ to 'PHONE BOOK', where the phone number is displayed and edited if necessary.

Press (>) to save.

Saving INCOMING CALL Numbers To PHONE BOOK:

Press (A) to show INCOMING CALLLIST.

Scroll to the number to be saved.

Press FORMAT (##) to select the desired redial format (7-digit, 10-digit or 11-digit).

Press b to display and edit the caller's name shown on the screen.

Note: Please refer to NAMING HANSET (P. 10) about how to entering character.

Scroll to 'PHONEBOOK', where the phone number is displayed and edited if necessary.

Press (>) to save.

DIALING FROM PHONE BOOK:

Press v to access PHONE BOOK under STANDBY mode.

Scroll to the number to be dialed.

Press or [SPK] to dial.

EDITING PHONE BOOK:

Press v to access PHONE BOOK under STANDBY mode

Scroll to the number to be edited and press (OK) to confirm.

Press to go to 'EDIT' and press OK .

Press [SET] to confirm and quit.


Note: Directly press [ALM1] to view the time and duration of ALM1, once 'ALARM1 XXMIN' and corresponding Iconappear on the screen, here " XXMIN"means the duration of the ALARM. Follow the same instructions for ALARM 2.

QUICK SETTING ALARM MODE & DURATION:

Directly Press [ALM1] or [ALM2] for quick setting alarm mode and duration.

e.g. [ALM1]:

Directly press [ALM1] to view the time and duration of ALM1 Press [ALM1] to scroll to adjust the mode and duration.



Press and hold [ALM1] to skip to the setting of ALM1 directly. The same applies to ALM2.

GUIDANCE FOR QUICK OPERATIONS

Auto Pause

RADIO or CD PLAYER will automatically pause under one of the following circumstances:

When Auto ANSWERING of ANSWER MACHINE responds the INCOMING CALLS.

OR: Press to listen to the voice message or OGM;

OR: Press to record OGM or MEMO.

Auto Pause will automatically cease and RADIO or CD PLAYERER resumes under one of the following circumstances

When auto answering has finished:

OR: When voice message or OGM has stopped;

OR: When the recording is finished;

OR: Press [RADIO, AM/FM] or | with the CD in the CD slot.

[PAGE] Button/Search HANDSET:

Press the [PAGE] on BASE UNIT. CHARGER/IN USE indication light will illuminate if HANDSET is within the range of communication. And HANDSET will buzz continuously for 2 minutes.

Press [PAGE] on BASE UNIT again or press on HANDSET to stop PAGE.

NOTE: HANDSET will buzz for alarming if it is too far from BASE UNIT and the connection may be rebuilt under such circumstances. BASE UNIT will auto matically disconnect the phone when it detects HANDSET to be out of range continuously for more than 20 seconds.


[STANDBY] Button:

Press [STANDBY] to stop all the functions except the phone calls and REMOTE CONTROL function.


[SNOOZE/MUTE] Button:




BASE UNIT DISPLAY (DISPLAY IN STANDBY MODE)



Press [SET] to confirm and scroll [VOL+] / [VOL-] to adjust.

Press [SET] to confirm and quit.

Note: This setting is only for CD and RADIO

SETTING ALARM:

Press [SET] and the text 'SET TIME?' will be displayed on the screen. Scroll [VOL+] / [VOL-] to \(\text{SET ALARM1?'} \).

Press [SET] again to display 'SET AL1 HOUR', scroll [VOL+]

/ [VOL—] to select.

Press [SET] to confirm and set the 'MINUTE' in the same way, then

Press [SET] to confirm and set the 'MINUTE' in the same way, then 'SETAL1 MODE' appears on the screen. And scroll [VOL+] / [VOL-] to select the alarm mode in the following order



Note: It means OFF mode once there is no CD, or RADIO, or BUZZER icon displayed on the screen

Press [SET] to confirm the mode, then 'SET AL1 VOLUME' appears on the screen.

And scroll [VOL+] / [VOL-] to adjust the volume.

Note: The volume of the alarm increases gradually when it rings. The setting is for the maximum volume (no less than 5).

Press [SET] to confirm the Volume, then 'SETAL1-DURATION' display on the screen.



SETTING UPBASE UNIT:

SETTING AUTO ANSWER RING TIMES:

The ring times can be set with a toggle switch on the bottom of BASE UNIT with three selections: 3 rings, 5 rings and TS (TollSaver 3/5):



Setting rings enables ANSWER MACHINE to automatically answer INCOMING CALLS with the corresponding rings.

3 rings: ANSWER MACHINE will automatically answer the incoming calls after rings 3 times.

5 rings: ANSWER MACHINE will automatically answer the incoming calls after rings 5 times.

TS (Toll Saver 3/5):

- 1) When there are new messages existing, the answerer will automa -tically answer the incoming calls after it rings 3 times.
- 2) When there are not new messages, the answerer will automatically answer the incoming calls after itrings 5 times.
- Hereby, when you need to listen to the messages with line remote control mode, you can hang up after the 4th ring because it means there are no new messages.
- ◆ When the answerer is set at ANSWER OFF, it will not answer the incoming calls as above described but will answer after ringing for 10 times.

SETING DATE & TIME:

Press [SET] and the text 'SETTIME?' will be displayed on the screen.

Press [SET] again to display 'SET TIME-YEAR' and the 'YEAR' will flashes.

Scroll [VOL+] / [VOL-] to select.

Press [SET] for the third time to confirm YEAR.

And set 'MONTH', 'DATE', 'HOUR' and 'MINUET' in the same way.

The time displayed on the screen will be automatically updated with the confirmation of 'MINUTE', and will automatically update the WEEK.

Note:

- ◆ The WEEK only be accurate basing on the right YEAR.
- ◆ Every INCOMING CALL message from ANSWER MACHING reecording will will have week/time information.

GUIDANCE FOR ADVANCED SETTINGS

SETTING UPHANDSET

REGISGTERING HANDSET::

Press **OK**) to enter MENU.

Scroll to 'REGISTER', then press **OK** to confirm.

Press and hold [PAGE] on BASE UNIT until CHARGE/IN USE indicator blinks or a long buzzing is heard with HANDSET name, such as Handset (2), appearing on the screen.

Press to return to STANDBY mode.

Note: HANDSET in the package is pre-registered, three more HANDSETS can be purchased and registered to BASE UNIT in the same way described above.:

Please deregister HANDSET as follows if the previous registration fails:

Press and hold [PAGE] on BASE UNIT until CHARGER/IN USE indicator blinks.

Press and hold [PAGE] again until CHARGER/IN USE indicator blinks faster.

Press and hold [PAGE] and ALL HANDSETS have been deregistered. Register HANDSETS once again in the same way as described.

Note: Deregistration is NOT recommended except in case of absolute necessity.

NAMING HANDSET:
