Get started

Insert SIM card

The phone is a $\operatorname{Dual}\,\operatorname{SIM}$ mobile phone allowing you to use two networks.

To insert SIM card(s):

- 1. Switch off the mobile phone and remove the rear cover and battery.
- 2. Insert the SIM card correctly in the card slot(s) (See figure below)



3. Finally insert the battery and replace the rear cover of the mobile phone.

Insert Memory card

- 1. Power off the mobile phone and remove the rear cover and battery.
- 2. Insert the Micro SD card into the slot.
- 3. Finally insert the battery and the rear cover of the mobile phone. Note: Use only compatible memory cards with this device. Incompatible memory cards may damage the card or the device and

corrupt the data stored in the card.

Charge the Battery or Connect to a computer
You can charge your battery using the charger or connect the USB cable (supplied with this phone) to the computer.
Note: Please use the standard battery (supplied with this phone), otherwise it may cause harm to your device or may explode.

Keys and parts

The smart phone gives you wonderful experience while using different functions such as Camera, Video recorder, FM radio, Music and Sound recorder. Let you install various APPs, games, and more (supports APK format) by downloading from Android Market.



Lock and Unlock the Screen

Press power button to lock the screen; also press power button to wake up and then drag the lock up to unlock as indicated in picture.







Make it yours

- 1) Home screen: You can access to all the features here on your phone. It displays application icons, widgets, shortcuts, and other features. Long press home screen and add Shortcuts, Widgets, Folders and Wallpaper.
- 2) Notification Bar: At the top of the screen, the Status bar displays the time, status, and notifications. If there is a new message, missed call or something in the notification bar, you can drag it down to open notification panel and click the desired one to have a view. When you finished, you can close it by dragging the panel up or pressing "Back".

 3) Launcher: Touch the Launcher icon at the bottom of the screen to
- view all installed applications.

Add Widgets and more icons to Home Screen

Adding widgets and icons to home screen

Long press Home screen, and then you can add Shortcuts, Widgets, Folders and Wallpapers to Home screen; or enter Launcher and long press and hold an application till the screen vibrates, and then release your finger hold.



Rearranging or removing widgets and icons on your Home screen

a) Long press and hold the widget or icon you want to move. Once the phone vibrates, don't release your hold on the icon. Drag the widget or icon to a new location on the screen. b) Press and hold on an icon till the phone vibrates, and drag the widgets or icon to the trash to remove!

Enter Launcher

Open and Switch Applications
The Launcher holds icons for all of the applications on your phone, including any application that you downloaded from Android Market or other sources. On the Home screen, touch the Launcher Icon ito open the main menu.



Slide the Launcher left or right to bring more icons into view.

Touch an application to open it.

Press Home icon or Back icon to close the Launcher.

Switch to Recently Used Application

Press and hold the icon for a few seconds.

Make a call

On the start screen choose and enter a complete phone number to make a call. Your phone supports smart search.



Delete the wrong input digit numbers.


Enter a complete phone number and dial out.






Call log




Reject a Call by Sending a busy Message

Drag this icon up to a busy message will show on the screen, short tap it to send out.








Add a contact

Tap and enter Contacts and then add a contact (see figure below.)

Tap "+" to add a new contact to Phone or SIM card. Or tap "Menu", and select "New contact".







Send and Receive Message(s)

Enter **Messaging > Compose new message:** you touch a text field where you want to enter text, to open the keyboard.



Tap this icon to select desired contact from phone book

Touch once to capitalize the next letter you type. Touch and hold for caps.

Press space (or a punctuation mark if needed) to enter the highlighted suggestion

- a. When you are composing a new text message, you can select text for cutting or copying. The selected text is highlighted in orange.

- opens with options.
 Tap "Menu" to add "Attach" including Pictures, Videos, Audios, etc to send MMS.



- b. When a new message comes, you can read by dragging notification panel and click the message, or entering Message to read it directly.
- Long press one of the all message thread, you have "View thread, View contact and Delete thread".

Browse the Web

a. Set up Internet/Data connection
Enter Settings > Wireless & networks, scroll down to find out Mobile
network, and then enter "Access Points Names, choose the desired WAP account.

To browse the web, you need switch on Data connection. If there is WiFi around, you can switch on WiFi to use it browse the web. You may need password to access Wi-Fi network.

Enjoy Music

When you copy music to your SD card, the Music player searches the card for music files and builds a catalog of your music, based on information about each file that is stored in the file itself.



Touch a tab to view your library in one of four ways.

Touch to open the album, songs or playlist.
