

▲WARNING - Seizures





Charging the NINTENDO DS Battery Pack

Do not use the NINTENDO DS AC Adapter during a lightning storm. There may be a risk of electric shock from lightning.

Before you use your NINTENDO DS for the first time, or after you have not used it for a long time, you must charge the rechargeable battery pack. (For optimal battery pack life, do not let the battery pack remain completely discharged for long periods of time.)

The rechargeable battery pack can be recharged approximately 500 times, but performance may decrease after repeated recharges, depending on usage conditions such as temperature. Battery life may also decrease over time. After 500 recharges, battery life may become only 70% of the battery life when new.

It takes approximately three hours to recharge the battery. (The actual recharge time varies depending on how much battery life you have left.) When the Power Indicator LED becomes red, save your game and recharge the battery to prevent game data loss. You can play games while recharging the battery, but the recharge time is longer when you do so.

IMPORTANT: The NINTENDO DS AC Adapter is only for use with the NINTENDO DS portable & Game Boy Advance SP video game system. It is not compatible with the original Game Boy, Game Boy pocket, Game Boy Color or original Game Boy Advance.

When you are finished playing, always turn your system OFF, and unplug the AC Adapter (if you are using it) from both the wall socket and NINTENDO DS. Do not wrap the AC Adapter cord around the NINTENDO

1. Insert the AC Adapter's DC Connecter Plug into AC ADAPTER Connentor on the NINTENDO DS.

IMPORTANT: Be sure the DC Connector Plug is facing in the correct direction before inserting into AC ADAPTER Connentor to avoid damaging the DC Connector Plug and/or the External Extension Connector.

2. Swing the prongs out of the AC Adapter and insert into a standard 120-volt AC wall outlet. Be sure that the prongs are fully inserted into the outlet.

The Recharge Indicator LED will light up . You can play games while charging, however it will take longer to recharge the battery. The LED will turn OFF when the battery is fully charged.

3. When fully charged, remove the AC Adapter from the wall outlet and fold the prongs back into the housing. Remove the DC Connector Plug from AC ADAPTER Connector.

When disconnecting any plugs from the NINTENDO DS or wall outlet, carefully pull by the plug itself rather than by the cord.

Using the NINTENDO DS Video Game System

1. Insert a Game Pak into the DS Game Pak Slot or GBA Game Pak Slot onthe underside of the NINTENDO DS.

CAUTION: Always check the Game Pak edge connector for foreign material before inserting the Game Pak into the NINTENDO DS.

- 2. Turn on the power by pushing the Power Switch towards the screen.
- 3. The screen will display the NINTENDO DS logo, and then change to the display for the game that you are playing. Be sure to read the Game Pak instruction booklet for the game you are playing.
- 4. To remove the Game Pak after playing, first turn the power OFF by sliding the Power Switch towards the front, then slide the Game Pak out of the DS Game Pak Slot
- 5. When finished playing, fold the NINTENDO DS closed to protect the display screen. Note: The power does not automatically turn off when the system is folded closed.

Multiplayer Game Play Using NINTENDO DS Game Paks

Things to prepare:

Nintendo DS: the same number of pieces as players Game Software: the same number of pieces as players

- 1. Make sure that all Nintendo DS systems are powered off, then insert a game cartridge into the systems.
- 2. Turn on the power for all the systems.
- 3. Follow the instruction in Game Pak manual.

Cautions for Wireless Play:

- For better communication, please follow the guidelines below: -Keep the distance among Nintendo DS systems within 3m.
- -Keep the Nintendo DS systems facing each other.
- -Make sure that there is no obstacles between the Nintendo DS systems.
