
Using the Remote Controller

When using the remote controller, point it toward the ABX-N300's remote control sensor, as shown below.







Replacing the Battery

Use only a battery of the same type (CR2025).

While sliding the stopper to the side, pull out the battery holder.




2 Insert a lithium button battery in the battery holder, and then replace the holder.



Notes:

- If the remote controller doesn't work reliably, try replacing the battery.
- If you intend not to use the remote controller for a long time, remove the battery to prevent damage from leakage or corrosion.
- Expired batteries should be removed as soon as possible to prevent damage from leakage or corrosion.





■ About the Dock Adaptor


The ABX-N300's dock uses the Universal Dock system. By attaching an interchangeable part called a dock adaptor, you'll be able to insert your model of supported iPod/iPhone.

- Use a commercially available dock adaptor or the one that was included with your iPod/iPhone. If you insert your iPod/iPhone into the ABX-N300 without the appropriate dock adapter, excessive strain will be applied to the connector, damaging the dock connector or the dock connector port of your iPod/ iPhone
- If your iPod is a compact and lightweight model, and has no compatible adapter, you may connect it directly.






First align the front edge of the dock adaptor, and then press down on the rear edge.



■ Removing the Dock Adaptor

As shown in the illustration below, insert a slotted screwdriver or similar object into the slit of the dock adaptor, and lift the adapter up.


- If you connect an iPod/iPhone to the ABX-N300
 without attaching a dock adapter, you risk straining
 and damaging the connector. Even if the dock adapter
 is connected, you should avoid straining the connector
 by moving or wiggling the connected iPod/iPhone.
- When inserting or removing your iPod/iPhone, take care to insert or remove it in a straight line with the angle of the connector, and do not use excessive force.
- Do not forcefully press the controls of your iPod/ iPhone while it is connected to the ABX-N300, or wiggle your iPod/iPhone forward or backward. Doing so will cause damage or faulty contacts in the connector.
- Do not use the system in conjunction with other accessories such as an FM transmitter or microphone. Doing so may cause faulty operation.
- If your iPod/iPhone is in a case, it might not be able to fully connect with the connector, causing failure to sound or inability to operate the remote control. Remove your iPod/iPhone from its case before inserting it in the ABX-N300.


Linked Operation with Your iPod/iPhone

You can perform the following linked operations; however some of these operations might not work depending on your model of iPod/iPhone or the content being played.

- Power on/off (standby) operation
 When you switch the ABX-N300's power on/
 standby, your iPod/iPhone will be switched accordingly.
- Timer operation

The ABX-N300's timer will cause your iPod/iPhone to perform timer playback.










Top/Front Panel

The page numbers in parentheses show where you can find the main explanation for each item.





(1) Slide cover

Close the slide cover when transporting the ABX-N300 or when not using the dock.

(2) iPod/iPhone dock (XX)

Insert your iPod/iPhone here.

3 Display

4 MENU button (XX)

This button accesses the menu. Press it once again to close the menu.

⑤ [▲]/[▼] buttons (XX)

When the menu is displayed, use these buttons to select a menu item.

6 ENTER button

Press this button to confirm a setting you've made in a menu etc.

⑦ [➡] button (XX)

This button takes you back to the previous menu.

(8) [■] button (XX)

This button stops playback on the iPod/iPhone.

⑨ [►]/[II] button (XX)

This button starts playback on the iPod/iPhone. Pressing this during playback will pause the playback.

10 INPUT button (XX)

This button selects the source that will be heard.

(1) VOLUME buttons (XX)

These buttons adjust the volume.

② ON/STANDBY button (XX)

This button switches the power between on/standby.



This will be lit when the power is on, and unlit in standby mode.







Rear Panel



1 Wi-Fi antenna (XX)

Raise this antenna if you're connecting to the network wirelessly (via Wi-Fi).

2 Ethernet port (XX)


Connect your Ethernet cable here if you're connecting to the network via a cable.

③ LINE IN jack (XX)

Use a commercially available mini-plug audio cable to connect an external device's audio output to this jack. This allows the ABX-N300 to play back audio from a device such as a digital audio player, game device, television, or record player with built-in phono equalizer.

4 AC adapter jack (DC IN 16V 3A) (XX)

Connect the included AC adapter here.



Remote Controller (RC-806S)



① [也] (on/standby) button (XX)

This button switches the power between on/standby.

2 TIMER button (XX)

This button lets you set the clock and timer.

3 SLEEP button (XX)

This button is used to set the sleep timer.

4 SNOOZE button (XX)

Press this button to use the snooze function (temporarily stopping timer playback).

5 DISPLAY button (XX)

The information shown in the display will change each time you press this button. If you press this button when the ABX-N300 is in standby mode, the time will be displayed for eight seconds.

6 INPUT button (XX)

This button selects the source that will be heard.

⑦ [■] button (XX)

This button pauses playback on the iPod/iPhone.

8 TONE button (XX)

To adjust the treble (high-frequency range) or bass (low-frequency range), press this button to alternate between treble and bass settings.

9 S.BASS (Super Bass) button (XX)

This button lets you make Super Bass settings.

1 VOLUME [▲]/[▼] buttons (XX)

These buttons adjust the volume.

(11) MUTING button (XX)

This button temporarily silences the sound.

This button plays the song(s) repeatedly.






Network Setup

Connecting to the Network

The following diagram shows how you can connect the tuner to your home network. In this example, it's connected to a LAN port on a router, which has a 4-port 100 Base-TX switch built-in.



Network Requirements

■ Ethernet Network

For the best results, a 100 Base-TX switched Ethernet network is recommended. Although it's possible to play music on a computer that's connected to the network wirelessly, playback may be unreliable, so it is recommended to use wired connections.

■ Ethernet Router

A router manages the network, data-routing and supplying of IP addresses. Your router must support the following:

- NAT (Network Address Translation). NAT allows several networked computers to access the Internet simultaneously via a single Internet connection. The tuner needs Internet access for Internet radio.
- DHCP (Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol). DHCP supplies IP addresses to the network devices, allowing them to configure themselves automatically.
- A router with a built-in 100 Base-TX switch is recommended.

Some routers have a built-in modem, and some ISPs require you to use specific routers. Please consult your ISP or computer dealer if you're unsure.

■ CAT5 Ethernet cable

Use a shielded CAT5 Ethernet cable (straight-type) to connect the tuner to your home network.

■ Internet Access (for Internet radio)

To receive Internet radio, your Ethernet network must have Internet access. A narrowband Internet connection (e.g., 56 K modem, ISDN) will not provide satisfactory results, so a broadband connection is strongly recommended (e.g., cable modem, xDSL modem, etc). Please consult your ISP or computer dealer if you're unsure.

Notes:

- · To receive Internet radio with the tuner, your broadband Internet connection must be working and able to access the Web.
 - Consult your ISP if you have any problems with your Internet connection.
- The tuner uses DHCP to configure its network settings automatically. If you want to configure these settings manually, see "Network Setup" (page XX).
- The tuner does not support PPPoE settings, so if you have a PPPoE-type Internet connection, you must use a PPPoEcompatible router.
- · Depending on your ISP, you may need to specify a proxy server to use Internet radio. If your computer is configured to use a proxy server, use the same settings for the tuner (page XX).


- Disconnect the AC adapter, connect the Ethernet cable, wait ten seconds, and then reconnect the AC adapter.

- ▲ Press [MENU], select "Network Setup," and press [ENTER].

- Select "Ethernet" and press [ENTER].
- Choose DHCP "Enable" and press [ENTER].

You can also specify the IP address and other settings manually. In this case, choose "Disable" in step 6 above, then press [ENTER], and make the following settings.

Enter a static IP address provided by your ISP. Most routers use Class C IP addresses.

Subnet Mask

Enter the subnet mask address provided by your ISP (typically 255.255.255.0).

Gateway

Enter the gateway address provided by your ISP.

DNS Server

Enter a DNS server address provided by your ISP.

Proxy URL

To use a Web proxy, enter its URL here.

Proxy Port

If you're using a Web proxy, enter a proxy port number here.

Connecting via wireless LAN

- Disconnect the AC adapter and disconnect the Ethernet cable. Then raise the wireless LAN antenna, wait ten seconds, and reconnect the AC adapter.
- Press the remote controller's [MENU] button, select "Standby Mode," and press [ENTER].
- Select "Network Mode" and press [ENTER]. (The orange LED will light.)
- ▲ Press [MENU], select "Network Setup," and press [ENTER].

Wait while the display indicates "initializing..."

- Select "Wireless" and press [ENTER]. The ABX-N300 will search for access points.
- Choose the access point that you want to use, and press [ENTER].
- Choose the security method for that access point, and press [ENTER].
- Use the following buttons to enter the passcode.

[◄◄]/[▶►I]: Move the cursor left/right [ENTER]: Enter one character

Backspace

The passcode will be confirmed. This completes the setup.

Tip:

If a connection is not established even though you've waited three minutes or longer, it may be that the passcode was incorrect. In this case, try making the settings once again from the beginning.

However, if you have made the settings several times without success, disconnect the AC adaptor, wait at least ten seconds before reconnecting it, and then try making the settings again.

To access the Web Setup screen

Put the ABX-N300 in Standby mode (the orange LED will be lit).

If the orange LED does not light, perform steps 2 and 3 above.

Press [MENU], choose "Network Info," and press [ENTER].

The ABX-N300's IP address will be displayed.

Start up a browser on a computer that's connected to the same network, and enter the IP address of step 2 into the URL field of your browser to access it.

The Web Setup Menu screen will appear. Here you can edit the ABX-N300's name that is shown when using AirPlay, or update the firmware.

Caution:

- A router (access point) is required.
- Your iPhone and the ABX-N300 must be connected to the same network within the router. Also when using AirPlay with iTunes, that computer must be connected to the same network.















About Internet Radio and Media Servers













When the ABX-N300 is in Standby mode, pressing the remote's [MENU] button will display the following items.

12/24H Format Beep Volume Limit Reset

The available settings for each item are shown below. (The default setting is underlined.)

"12/24H Format" 12H → 24H

Switches the time format between 12-hour and 24-hour. On models for the North American market, the default setting is "12H"; for other models, the default setting is "24H."

"Beep" On ←→ Off

Switches on/off the beep tone that sounds when you press a button on the top panel of the ABX-N300.

"Volume Limit" 10 → 40

Specifies the maximum volume in the range of 10–40. The default setting is 40.

"Reset" <u>Cancel</u> ←→ OK

If you select OK and then press the [ENTER] button, the ABX-N300 will be reset to its factory-set state.

- Use the [▲]/[▼] buttons to select a menu item, and then press the [ENTER] button.
- 2 Use the [▲]/[▼] buttons to change the setting.
- **3** Press the [ENTER] button to finalize the change, and exit the menu.

Troubleshooting

If you experience any problem while using the ABX-N300, look for a solution in this exticution.

If you can't resolve the issue yourself, try resetting the ABX-N300 before contacting your Onlyo dealer. Reset the ABX-N300 as described in the "Reset" section of "Other Settings" (this page).

Note that resetting the ABX-N300 will delete your custom settings.

Audio

There's no sound.

- Make sure the ABX-N300's volume is not set too low (see page 7).
- Make sure the correct input source is selected (see page 7).
- Make sure the ABX-N300 is not muted (see page 8).
- Check all connections and correct as necessary (see page 7).

The sound quality is not good.

- The sound quality can be affected by strong magnetic fields, such as that from a TV. Try moving any such devices away from the ABX-N300.
- If you have any devices that emit high-intensity radio waves near the ABX-N300, such as a cellular phone that's being used to make a call, the ABX-N300 may output noise.

Audio output is intermittent when the ABX-N300 is subjected to vibration.

The ABX-N300 is not a portable device. Use it in a location that's not subject to shock or vibration.

Power



- Unplug the AC adapter from the wall outlet, wait 10 seconds or more, then plug it in again.

The ABX-N300 turns off unexpectedly.

- If the sleep timer has been set and the SLEEP indicator is shown on the display, the ABX-N300 will turn off automatically after a specified period (see page 13).
- When timed playback finishes, the ABX-N300 automatically switches to Standby mode (see page 12).

Troubleshooting—Continued

iPod/iPhone

There's no sound.

- · Make sure your iPod/iPhone is properly seated in the ABX-N300's iPod dock. Even very thin iPod/iPhone cases can prevent the iPod/iPhone from seating properly on the dock connector, so always remove any case before inserting your iPod/iPhone (see page 7).
- Make sure the ABX-N300 is turned on, the input source is set to iPod, and the volume is not set too low.
- · Make sure that your iPod/iPhone is compatible with the system (see page 4).

Can't control your iPod with the ABX-N300's remote controller.

- · Make sure your iPod/iPhone is properly seated in the ABX-N300's iPod dock. Even very thin iPod/iPhone cases can prevent the iPod/iPhone from seating properly on the dock connector, so always remove any case before inserting your iPod/iPhone (see page 7).
- You may not be able to control your iPod/iPhone immediately after inserting it into the ABX-N300's iPod dock. In this case, wait a few moments until your iPod/iPhone wakes up.
- Depending on your iPod/iPhone model, its software version, or the content your playing some functions may not work as expected (see page 9)
- If your iPod/iPhone does not work, repove ', was a few moments, and then connect it again
- Check whether there might be a problem with your iPod/iPhone. For an iPod touch or iPhone, make sure that the app is working correctly.

Remote Controller

The remote controller doesn't work properly.

- Replace the battery with a new one.
- The remote controller is too far away from the ABX-N300, or there's an obstacle between them (see page 5).
- The ABX-N300's remote control sensor is being subjected to bright light (inverter-type fluorescent light or sunlight).

External Components

No sound is heard from your turntable.

• Make sure the turntable has a built-in phono equalizer. If the turntable doesn't have a phono equalizer builtin, you must provide one.

Timers

The timers don't work.

- Make sure the clock has been set correctly (see page 11).
- Timed operation will fail if the ABX-N300 is already on at the specified On time, so make sure it's set to Standby (see page 11).
- The timer may overlap with another timer. If you program two timers, make sure they don't overlap.
- If you press the [SLEEP] or [TIMER] button while a timed operation is in progress, the timer will be cancelled and the ABX-N300 won't turn off at the specified Off time (see page 12).
- Make sure the timer is set to suitable volume setting (see page 1)

Cock

The clock displays "--:--"

A power outage has occurred and the time setting lost. Set the clock again (see page 11). The timers will all be set to Timer Off, so you'll need to turn on any necessary timers (see page 12). The timer settings will be preserved.

The ABX-N300 contains a microcomputer. In very rare situations, severe interference, noise from an external source, or static electricity may cause it to malfunction or lockup. In the unlikely event that this should happen, unplug the AC adapter, wait at least 10 seconds, and then plug it back in again. If this doesn't resolve the issue, reset the ABX-N300 to its factory defaults (see page 30).
