## HANDSET DESCRIPTIONS



1. Earpiece: Allows you to hear the other caller.
2. Main Display Screen:

Displays all the information needed to operate your phone.
3. [(0)] Directional Keys:

Allows you to scroll through phone menu options and provides a shortcut to phone functions from idle mode.
4. [-] ] Left Soft Key: Press to access the Messaging menu or access the function listed above the key.
5. [8] ] Camera/Video Key: In idle mode, press once to start taking a picture. If pressed one more time, it toggles to the video recording mode.
6. [ $\square]$ SEND Key: Press to make or receive a call. In idle mode, press to access the All Calls list.

7. [ [120 ] Voicemail Key: In idle mode, press and hold to automatically connect to your voicemail box.
8. [ $\%= \pm$ ] Shift Key: Press to enter an asterisk ( ${ }^{*}$ ) character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to change the character input type. Press and hold to display the plus sign (+) for international dialing.
9. [ [+國] Vibrate Mode Key: Press and hold to activate/deactivate vibrate mode in idle mode. Press to enter the (\#) character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to add a space.
10. [ cieo ] CLR Key: Press to clear a character from the display. Press and hold to clear all characters. Within a menu, press to return to the previous menu. Press and hold to activate the G'zGEAR function in idle mode.
11. [] END/PWR Key: Press and hold to turn the phone on/off or press to end

a call or browser session. Within a menu, press to return to idle mode.
12. [/图] Speakerphone / Flashlight Key: With the flip open, press to turn speakerphone on or off. Press and hold to turn the flashlight on or off.
13. [ $\square$ ] Center Select Key: Press to access the MENU from idle mode. It also allows you to accept choices when navigating through the menu.
14. [ $\mathbb{\square}$ ] Right Soft Key: Press to access the Contacts menu in idle mode or access the function listed above the key.
15. Microphone: Allows the other caller to hear you.
16. External Speaker: Allows you to listen to music, sounds or ringtones.
17. Front Display Screen: Displays incoming calls, messages, signal, battery strength, time and date.

## FEATURE OVERVIEW

## WATER RESISTANCE

The Ravine ${ }^{9} 2$ is water resistant. It provides reliable performance for outdoor activities and in wet conditions such as driving rain or high humidity.
The tested device meets the requirements of the MIL-STD-810G (Rain \& immersion 1m, 30 min ) standard.
CAUTION: The Water Resistance feature does not guarantee protection against the usage of this device underwater. Do not use the handset underwater. We do not take responsibility for waterlogging due to the negligence of the user.

To maintain water resistance:

- Securely close the Charging/Data Port cover, microSD ${ }^{\text {mw }}$ card cover and the Headset Jack cover.
- Completely close the battery cover and slide the battery cover lock to the LOCK position.
- Make sure that the handset is completely dried up before you open any cover. When wet, clean the handset with a dry cloth, swish water from the handset, and dry it thoroughly before use.


## SHOCK RESISTANCE

The rugged construction of the Ravine ${ }^{\oplus} 2$ provides outstanding shock and vibration resistance. The tested device meets the requirements of the MIL-STD-810G (Drop 1.5m) standard.

CAUTION: The shock and vibration resistance features do not guarantee protection against every type of shock and vibration. Your handset may be damaged or malfunction depending on the severity of the shock or vibration.

## DUST RESISTANCE

For additional peace of mind, the Ravine ${ }^{\circledR} 2$ is also dust resistant. The device was tested using silica flour at a temperature of $95^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ and meets the MIL-STD-810G (DUST) standard.

[E]Your handset can be rinsed with clean water when dirty. To ensure water resistance, make sure that all covers are securely closed before rinsing.

- Periodically, clean the Charging Terminals and Battery Terminals with a dry cloth or cotton swab. Dust may cause electrical connection problems. Avoid wiping with excessive force, which can damage the terminals.

[^0]- Do not clean terminals inside the handset, or they may be damaged.
- If mud or sand is adhered to the handset, do not use it until wiping completely.
- Do not place the handset directly on sand. If sand gets into the Earpiece or Speaker, sounds may be difficult to hear. Sand getting into the handset's hinge can cause problems such as overheating.


## INSTALLING THE SIM CARD AND BATTERY

Your wireless device comes with a SIM card installed which along with a Global Feature on your account, enables you to make calls and access email in GSM Networks while traveling overseas.
Should your SIM card be lost or damaged, please follow these instructions for the installation of your new SIM.

## CAUTION

- Wipe your handset before opening the battery cover to prevent moisture or dust from entering
- Failure to follow the below directions for installing/removing the battery could result in product failure.
- Fully charge the battery before using the handset for the first time.

1. Remove the battery cover and battery, as instructed on page 24. Slide the SIM card into the slot in the direction of the arrow shown in the figure.

- To remove the SIM card, pull out the SIM card in the opposite direction of the arrow.


2. Slide the battery into the slot by aligning the contacts (1) and press down until you hear "click (2)."


Make sure that the sticker on the battery is put inside when you replace the back cover. Otherwise it may affect the water resistance function.
3. Insert the battery cover into the slots (1) and press the battery cover in the direction of the arrow (2).

4. Press down firmly on the side of the battery cover at each arrow point, as shown in the figure.


## 5. Slide the battery cover latch to the LOCK

 position in the direction of the arrow shown in the figure.

- Do not twist the battery cover as shown in the figure below. Doing so can damage the handset and the battery cover.
- Do not press hard on the battery cover with the battery cover tabs running over the handset because you may damage the battery cover tabs.
- Be careful not to get the tab of the battery caught between the edges of battery cover and the handset. Failure to do so will result in the loss of water resistance.
- If you are using a wrist strap (sold separately), be careful not to get it caught between the battery cover and the handset. Failure to do so will result in the loss of water resistance.



## REMOVING THE BATTERY

1. Slide the battery cover latch to the FREE position in the direction of the arrow as shown in the figure.

2. Insert your thumb in the right side groove and pull up the battery cover in the direction of the arrow.

3. Remove the battery by pulling the tab up.


Do not leave the removed battery in direct sunlight, or near heat sources such as an open flame or stove. Otherwise, it may malfunction or cause a fire by bursting or igniting. Do not hit, or exert excessive shock on the battery, as it can ignite or break.

## CHARGING THE BATTERY

1. Connect the USB cable into the Wall/USB Charger.
2. Plug the USB cable into the phone's Charging/ Data Port. Plug the Wall/USB Charger into an electrical outlet. The battery starts charging.
3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged.

4. Hold the small connector with the USB mark facing up. When inserting the connector into the Charging/Data Port on the handset, hold the connector straight against the port without tilting it vertically or horizontally and gently insert it. If the battery connector is not properly aligned, damage could occur to the charging connector and the phone may not be charged.

- Failure to completely reseal the Charging/Data Port cover after charging may allow water or other liquids to enter the casing, damaging the handset.



## 4. To remove the wall charger, unplug the USB cable from the phone's Charging/Data Port.

When you charge the battery with the handset powered off, you will see a charging status screen. After charging is completed, the Charge Complete message appears and you cannot operate the phone until it is powered on. To turn your phone on, press and hold the END/PWR Key \$ until your display turns on.

- The battery may not be fully charged at the time of purchase. Fully charge the battery before using.
- It is more efficient to charge the battery with the handset powered off.
- Battery operating time gradually decreases over time.
- If the battery fails to perform normally, you may need to replace the battery.


## BATTERY HANDLING INFORMATION

5. Do not install the battery in humid places, like a bathroom, or places where water or liquid can come into contact with the handset or battery. Otherwise, the electrical circuits may short or erode and cause the handset to malfunction.

## DOSS

- Only use the battery and charger approved for use with the Ravine ${ }^{\oplus} 2$. Using any charger other than the one included with the phone may damage your phone or battery.
- Only use the battery for the system for which it is specified.
- Only use or replace the battery with a charging system or another battery that has been qualified with the system per this standard, IEEE-Std-1725-2006. Use of an unqualified battery or charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard.
- Only use the battery for its original purpose. As an improper battery use may result in a fire, explosion or other hazard.
- Try to keep batteries in a temperature between $41^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\left(5^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\right)$ and $95^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\left(35^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\right)$. If the battery is stored in temperatures above or below the recommended range, give it time to warm up or cool down before using. - Store the discharged battery in a cool, dark, and dry place.
- Purchase a new battery when its operating time gradually decreases after fully charging.
- Properly and promptly dispose of the battery according to local laws.
- Battery usage by children should be supervised.
- Dispose of used battery according to the instructions.
- Completely drain the battery before recharging. It may take one to four days to completely drain.
- When the device is not used for long period, remove the battery from the device.


## DON'TS

- Don't attempt to disassemble or open the battery - it is a sealed unit with no serviceable parts.
- Don't crush, bend or deform, puncture or shred the battery.
- Don't drop the phone or battery. If the phone or battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, and the user suspects damage, take it to a service center for inspection.
- Don't leave the battery in extremely hot or cold temperatures. Otherwise, it could significantly reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery.
- Don't modify or remanufacture, attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery, immerse or expose to water or other liquids, expose to fire, explosion or other hazard.
- Don't accidentally short-circuit the battery by carrying it in your pocket or purse with other metallic objects such as coins, clips and pens. This may critically damage the battery, and may cause fire or injury.
- Don't short-circuit a battery or allow metallic conductive objects to contact battery terminals.
- Don't dispose of the battery by placing into a fire.
- Don't use the battery with damage or a leak.


## G. CAUTION

There is a risk of explosion if battery is replaced by an incorrect type. Lithium ion batteries are recyclable. When you replace your battery, please request the repair center to recycle the battery in accordance with RBRC standards. When disposing of the battery by yourself, please call RBRC at (800) 822-8837 for proper disposal tips. Never touch any fluid that might leak from the battery. Such liquid when in contact with the eyes or skin, could cause injury to the skin or eyes. Should the liquid come into contact with the eyes, irrigate the eyes thoroughly with clean water and immediately seek medical attention. In the event the liquid comes into contact with the skin or clothing, wash it away immediately with clean water.

## USING A microSD ${ }^{\text {Tm }}$ CARD

By using a microSD'm card, you can store sounds, videos, images, photos, and other files.

## INSTALLING A microSD ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ CARD (OPTIONAL)

1. Open the microSD ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ card cover, and insert the microSD ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ card into the slot with the gold contacts facing up.
2. Press the microSD ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ card into the slot until you hear the "click", then close the microSD" ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ card cover.


## 3. "CARD INSERTED. PICTURE, VIDEO \& SOUND <br> WILL BE SAVED TO CARD MEMORY. ACCEPT <br> CHANGES?" will appear on the display.

## 4. Press the Center Select Key [Yes] to confirm.

## G. Caution

- Whenever installing or removing a memory card, make sure the handset is turned off and that the Wall/USB Charger is not connected.
- When installing or removing a memory card, avoid touching the memory card contacts and avoid damaging the memory card. Either can cause malfunction or loss of data.
- The front and back of the memory card look different. When inserting the memory card, make sure the correct side is facing up. If not, the memory card may not fit in the memory card slot, or the memory card and/or memory card slot may be damaged.
- Do not forcibly insert the memory card into the memory card slot. Hold it with the contacts facing down and carefully insert it.
- Failure to completely reseal the memory card slot after installing may result in damage if the handset is exposed to water.


## REMOVING A microSD ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ CARD

1. Open the microSD ${ }^{T M}$ card cover, and use your thumb to press and release the microSD ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ card.
2. Press the memory card inward, gently, until it pops out.
3. Remove the microSD ${ }^{T M}$ card and close the
 microSD ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ card cover.

- Never remove a memory card from the handset while it is being accessed. Doing so can damage the memory card or the data stored on it.
- The memory card is very small. Make sure you do not drop it.
- To ensure the proper function of removable memory, please use a microSD ${ }^{T M}$ card.
- Failure to completely reseal the memory card slot after removing may result in damage if the handset is exposed to water.


## CONNECTING TO THE HEADSET JACK

You can connect a compatible device equipped with a standard 2.5 mm plug to your handset for safe, convenient, hands-free conversations.

1. To open the Headset Jack cover, insert your fingertip into the notch and open the cover.

## 2. Plug the connector into the Headset Jack.

## GCAUTION



- Do not forcibly insert/remove the connector into/from the Headset Jack. Carefully insert/ remove it.
- Failure to completely reseal the Headset Jack cover after use may result in damage if the handset is exposed to water.

## TURNING THE PHONE ON AND OFF

TURNING ON

1. Press and hold the END/PWR Key 8 until the phone display turns on.
2. Enter your 4-digit lock code if the phone is locked. The default lock code is the last 4 digits of your phone number.
 Avoid any unnecessary contact with the internal antenna area while your handset is on.

## TURNING OFF

1. Press and hold the END/PWR Key until the phone display turns off.
T. Immediately change or recharge the battery when BATTERY LOW appears on the display.

- Turn the phone off before removing or replacing the battery. If the phone is on, unsaved data may be lost.


## MENU ACCESS

Your phone can be customized via the menu. Each function can be accessed by scrolling with the Directional Key or by pressing the number that corresponds with the menu item.

1. To access the menu, press the Center Select Key [MENU].
2. To scroll through the menu, press the Directional Key up, down, left or right.
3. To return to the previous page, press the CLR Key ane .
4. To exit the current menu, press the END/PWR Key $\$$.
5. To access the Messaging menu, press the Left Soft Key [-] [Message].
6. To access the Contact List, press the Right Soft Key $\boxtimes$ [Contacts].
E. All directions in this manual are based on the Grid menu layout and the HUD display theme. If you have changed the settings, the directions may vary.

## MAKING A CALL

## BY DIALING THE PHONE NUMBER

1. First, gently open the folding cover of the phone.
2. Enter the phone number including the area code if needed and press the SEND Kеу $\square$.
3. To end the call, press the END/PWR Key $\quad$.
4. When you place or receive a call from phone numbers stored in your Contact List, the name will be displayed.

## USING THE SPEED DIALING FUNCTION

1. If the speed dial is set, press the speed dial number you wish to connect to, and hold the last digit number you have assigned for the speed dial.
"Speed Dial" message appears, and your call is connecting to the contact.
2. To end the call, press the END/PWR Key $\approx$.

For more information on how to set one-touch dial, please refer to ONE TOUCH DIAL on page 137.

## USING THE CONTACT LIST

1. Press the Right Soft Key $\boxtimes$ [Contacts].
2. Select the contact and press the SEND Key $\square$.
3. To end the call, press the END/PWR Key $\square$.
4. If more than 1 number is saved, pressing the SEND Key will dial the default number.

## ABOUT PUSH TO TALK

Push to Talk calls may only be made with other Verizon Wireless Push to Talk subscribers, and only from the National Enhanced Services Rate and Coverage Area. A Push to Talk call is terminated by pressing the END/PWR Key or will automatically time out after 20 seconds of inactivity. While you are on a Push to Talk call, voice calls received will go directly to Voice Mail. When you are on
a voice call, you cannot receive a Push to Talk call. You cannot prevent others who have your wireless phone number from entering you into their Push to Talk Contact List. Only one person can speak at a time during Push to Talk calls. When using your phone keypad to make a Push to Talk call, you must enter the 10-digit phone number of the called party. Your Push to Talk service cannot be used for any applications that tether your phone to computers or other devices for any purpose. Push to Talk-capable phone and Calling Plan required. Ifyou wish to switch from a Push to Talk Calling Plan to another Calling Plan, you must first stop using your Push to Talk-capable phone and purchase or provide another compatible phone.

## TURNING PTT ON/OF

1. From idle mode, press the Center Select Key [MENU].
2. Select Settings \& Tools and press the Center Select Key [OK].
3. Select Call Settings, press the Center Select Key [OK], select PTT Mode then press the Center Select Key [OK].
4. Press the Directional Key up or down to select On/Off, then press the Center Select Key [OK].

## USING A PUSH TO TALK (PTT) ALERT

The Push To Talk (PTT) feature allows you to use your phone like a Walkie-Talkie to communicate with Verizon Wireless PTT subscribers.
An alert call is a call to notify a called party that the calling party wants to talk using a tone. The called party has option to answer or ignore the call.

## BY DIALING THE PHONE NUMBER

1. Enter the phone number and press the Left Soft Key [-] [Alert].
"Press PTT Key To Alert" message appears on your main display screen.
C. Left Soft Key [r] [Alert] is not available when PTT Mode is set to off.
2. Press the PTT Key/Red Side Key on the left hand side of the phone to alert.

3. Press and hold the PTT Key/Red Side Key while talking and then release the PTT Key/Red Side Key to let the other party talk.

## USING THE PTT CONTACT LIST

1. From the idle mode, press the PTT Key/Red Side Key to access your PTT Contact List.
2. Select the contact and press the Left Soft Key [-I [Alert].
"Press PTT Key To Alert" message appears on your main display screen.
3. Press and hold the PTT Key/Red Side Key while talking and then release



## USING A PUSH TO TALK (PTT) BARGE

A barge call automatically connects to the other party. The called party does not have the option to ignore the call.

## BY DIALING THE PHONE NUMBER

1. Enter the phone number.
2. Press and hold the PTT Key/Red Side Key on the left hand side of the phone.
3. Wait until the"OK to Talk" tone sounds and the message "Talking to" appears on the display. Speak while pressing down the PTT Key/Red Side Key
4. Release the PTT Key/Red Side Key 표표 to let the other party talk.
5. Press the END/PWR Key $\square$ to end the call.

## USING THE PTT CONTACT LIST

1. From the idle mode, press the PTT Key/Red Side Key to access your PTT Contact List.
2. Press and hold the PTT Key/Red Side Key on your left hand side of the phone.
3. Wait until the "OK to Talk"tone sounds and the message "Talking to" appears on the display. Speak while pressing down PTT Key/Red Side Key

4. Press the END/PWR Key $\square$ to end the call.

## ANSWERING CALLS

1. Press the SEND Key $\square$ to answer the incoming call.
T. Depending on your phone's settings, you may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any key.
2. To ignore incoming calls, press the Right Soft Key $\mathbb{\square}$ [Ignore].

## ANSWERING PTT CALLS

## INCOMING BARGE CALL

When you receive a barge call, you will hear the calling party speaking through the speakerphone. The calling party's phone number will appear on your display. If the calling party's number has already been registered in your PTT Contact List, the contact name will replace the phone number on the display.

1. Press and hold the PTT Key/Red Side Key to talk.
2. Release the PTT Key/Red Side Key to let the other party talk.
3. Press the END/PWR Key $\sigma$ to end the call.

## INCOMING ALERT CALL

When you receive an alert, you will hear the "PTT Alert"tone. The message "Incoming Alert" will be displayed with the phone number or contact name of the calling party. The PTT Alert tone repeats every 5 seconds until you answer or ignore the call. If you do not answer an incoming alert within 20 seconds, the PTT call will be automatically disconnected.

1. Answer or ignore the alert.

To answer the alert, press and hold the PTT Key/Red Side Key and begin talking.
To ignore the alert, press the Right Soft Key $\mathbb{\square}$ [Ignore].
2. Release the PTT Key/Red Side Key to let the other party talk.
3. Press the END/PWR Key $\sigma$ to end the call.

## ENDING A CALL

1. Press the END/PWR Key $\sigma$.

## MISSED CALL NOTIFICATION

When an incoming call is not answered, the missed call notification appears on the display.

## DISPLAY THE MISSED CALL FROM THE NOTIFICATION

1. Select View Now and press the Center Select Key [OK].
2. To dial the phone number, press the SEND Key $\square$.

DISPLAY A MISSED CALL FROM IDLE MODE

1. Press the Center Select Key [MENU], select Recent Calls and press the Center Select Key [OK].
2. Select Missed and press the Center Select Key [OK].
3. Select the missed call and press the Center Select Key [OPEN].
4. To dial the phone number, press the SEND Key $\square$.

## WAIT/PAUSE

Pauses are used for automated systems (i.e., voice mail or calling cards). The numbers entered after the pause will automatically be dialed after the pause. It is useful for dialing into systems that require a code.

## WAIT

The phone stops dialing until you press the SEND Key $\square$ to dial the next number.

1. Enter the phone number.
2. Press the Right Soft Key $\mathbb{\square}$ [Options].
3. Select Add Wait and press the Center Select Key [OK].
4. Enter additional number(s).
5. Press the SEND Key $\square$ to dial.

## 2-SEC PAUSE

The phone waits 2 seconds before sending the next digits automatically.

1. Enter the phone number.
2. Press the Right Soft Key $\mathbb{-}$ [Options].
3. Select Add 2-Sec Pause and press the Center Select Key [OK].
4. Enter additional number(s) (pin number or credit card number).
5. Press the SEND Key $\square$ to dial.

## MAKING AN INTERNATIONAL CALL

1. Press and hold the Shift Key Fot.

- The" + " symbol, required for international calls appears.

2. Enter the country code, area code, and phone number.
3. Press SEND Key $\square$ to make a call.
T. If you set Assisted Dialing to On, regardless of the user's intention, the entered phone numbers maybe changed to the wrong number by the auto-correct function.

## 3 WAY CALLING

You can talk to two participants at the same time. During the call, the normal airtime rates will be applied for each of the two calls.

1. Enter the phone number and press the SEND Key $\square \square$.
2. When you have connected, enter the second phone number to call and press the SEND Key $\square$.
3. When you're connected to the second party, press the SEND Key $\square$ again to begin your 3-Way call.
T. If one of the participants hangs up during the call, you and the remaining participant stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first one to hang up, all three calls are disconnected.

## CALL WAITING

If you are on a call and you receive another incoming call, you will hear one beep and the caller's phone number will appear on the display. With Call Waiting, you may put the active call on hold while you answer the other incoming call.

1. Press the SEND Key $\square$ to answer the other call. The first call will automatically be placed on hold. To switch back, press the SEND Key $\square$ again.

## VOLUME QUICK ADJUSTMENT

## ADJUSTING THE MASTER VOLUME

1. Press the Volume Keys 1 to adjust the master volume level.

- To check the ringtone's volume, press the Left Soft Key $-\square$ [Play].

2. Press the Center Select Key [SET] to save.

## ADJUSTING THE VOLUME DURING A CALL

1. To increase the volume, press the Volume Keys $\&$ D up.
2. To decrease the volume, press the Volume Keys $\square$ D down.

## CALLERID

Caller ID displays the name and the phone number of the person calling. If the caller's information is not stored in your contact list, only the phone number is displayed.

## VIBRATE MODE

Vibrate mode mutes the tones and activates an alert for an incoming call or message.

1. To activate, press and hold the Vibrate Mode Key
2. To deactivate, press and hold the Vibrate Mode Key

## MUTE FUNCTION

If you activate the mute function while you are talking on the phone, the person you are speaking with cannot hear any sounds from you but, you are still able to hear them. To activate mute function:

1. During a call, press the Left Soft Key $-\square$ [Mute].

## SPEAKERPHONE

The Speakerphone feature lets you hear audio through the speaker and talk without holding the phone.

1. To activate, with the flip open, press the Speakerphone / Flashlight Key //0.
2. To deactivate, press the Speakerphone / Flashlight Key /國again.

## FLASHLIGHT

Your phone provides you of the flashlight function. To activate the flashlight:

1. In the idle mode, press and hold the Speakerphone / Flashlight Key - The flashlight turns on.
2. Press and hold the Speakerphone / Flashlight Key $\mathbb{L}$ to deactivate the flashlight.
-The flashlight turns off after the "Flash Off" message appears on the display.

## VOICE DICTATION

By using the voice dictation function, you can input the text by speaking your words instead of using the keypad.

1. Press the Left Soft Key-// [Message], select New Message and press the Center Select Key [OK].
2. Select the desired message type to send and press the Center Select Key [0K].
3. Enter the email address or phone number in the "To"field and press the Center Select Key [OK].
4. In the Text field, press and hold the Voice Commands Key 노, and speak into the handset. Release the Voice Commands Key es after one word.
5. When entered text is correct, press the Center Select Key [OK] to confirm. If incorrect, amend the text by using the keypad. For details on how to use the keypad, see page 60,"TEXT INPUT."- Voice dictation mode cannot be used when the Bluetooth ${ }^{\oplus}$ connection is in use

- The voice dictation function supports US English only.
- Before using voice dictation, the phone should be trained by your voice.


## TEXT TO SPEECH

## READING OUT UNREAD MESSAGES WITH THE FLIP OPEN

With the flip open, the handset reads out the text information with a synthetic voice.

1. With the flip open in idle mode, press and hold the Voice Commands Key $\mathbf{y}$.

- The handset reads out unread received messages one after another for you with a synthetic voice.

2. Press the Left Soft Key [// [Again] to go back to the top of the message currently being read.
3. Press the Center Select Key [REPLY] to create a reply message for the currently reading message.
4. Press the Right Soft Key $\boxtimes$ [Options] to select the desired options.
5. Press the CLR Key
6. The handset returns to idle mode when reading out is done for all the unread messages or when the END/PWR Key $\sigma$ is pressed to abort reading.

## READING OUT UNREAD MESSAGES WITH THE FLIP CLOSED

With the flip closed, the handset reads out the text information with a synthetic voice

1. With the flip closed, press and hold the Voice Commands Key es.

- The handset reads out unread received messages one after another for you with a synthetic voice.

2. The handset returns to idle mode when reading out is done for all the unread messages.
3. Reading out will continue even when the flip is opened while reading out is in progress.

## AVAILABLE OPTIONS DURING A CALL

During a phone call, you can access the following features by pressing the Right Soft Key $\boxed{\square}[$ Options]. Press the Center Select Key [OK] to select any of the following options:

- Messaging
- Contact List
- Recent Calls
- Bluetooth Menu
- Main Menu
- Notepad
- Voice Record
- Voice Privacy


## MAKING AN EMERGENCY CALL

The 911 feature automatically places the phone in Emergency Call Mode when you dial the preprogrammed emergency number, 911 . It also operates in Lock Mode and out of the service area.

## MAKING AN EMERGENCY CALL IN LOCK MODE

1. Enter any of the numbers $911, * 911, \# 911$ or 112 and press the SEND Key $\square$.
G. The phone maintains Emergency Mode for 5 minutes. When the call ends, the phone returns to Lock Mode.

## MAKING AN EMERGENCY CALL IN ANY NETWORK MODE

1. Enter any of the numbers $911, * 911, \# 911$ or 112 and press the SEND Key $\square$ in ALL NETWORK MODE - CDMA Mode, GSM Mode and Global Mode.The phone will stay in Emergency Mode for 5 minutes in CDMA Mode. While the phone is in Emergency Mode, the phone can receive an incoming call or you can make outgoing calls even in the Emergency Callback Mode. In this case, making a call can automatically end the Emergency Callback Mode.The 911 call does not appear in the recent calls list.

## MOTION DETECTION

Using the Motion Detection function, you can control your handset just by shaking it.
By default, the Motion Detection function is set to OFF. To use the Motion Detection function:

1. From idle mode, press the Center Select Key [MENU] and select Settings\&Tools, then press the Center Select Key [OK].
2. Select Phone Settings and press the Center Select Key [OK], and select Motion Detection then press the Center Select Key [OK].
3. Select G'zGEAR or My Pics/Videos.
4. Select On and press the Center Select Key [SET].
When shaking the handset, be sure to hold the

handset firmly as shown in the figure and shake it from the right to left or vice versa.
T. When shaking the handset, make sure you do not hit the handset against nearby objects.

## STORING A PHONE NUMBER

## ADDING A NEW CONTACT

1. Enter the phone number you want to save.
2. Press the Left Soft Key[-] [Save].
G. If PTT Mode is set to on, you must access by pressing the Right Soft Key $\square$ select Save

To Contacts and press the Center Select Key [0K] as the Left Soft Key will show as Alert.
3. Select Add New Contact and press the Center Select Key [OK].
4. Select the type of number and press the Center Select Key [OK], then enter the name of contact.

- You can also store additional information such as the fax number, email address, and birthday information.

5. Press the Center Select Key [SAVE].

- Select Update Existing to add another phone number to a contact already stored in memory.
- You can also save the phone number to the SIM card.


## STORING A PHONE NUMBER INTO SIM CARD

You can copy or move contact information to the SIM card.
The SIM card can store up to 5 contacts entries.

1. Press the Right Soft Key $\square$ [Contacts] and select the contact you would like to copy or move.
2. Press the Right Soft Key $\square$ [Options].
3. Select [Copy \& Move] and press the Center Select Key [OK].
4. Select either [Move to SIM] or [Copy to SIM] and then press the Center Select Key [OK].

## OPTIONS TO CUSTOMIZE YOUR CONTACTS

Once the basic phone number and name information is stored in your Contacts, you can edit and/or customize the entries.

1. Press the Right Soft Key $\boxed{\square}$ [Contacts] and select the contact you would like to edit.
2. Press the Left Soft Key -// [Edit].
3. Edit the information and press the Center Select Key [SAVE] to save.

## ADDING OR CHANGING GROUPS

To organize your Contacts into groups:

1. Press the Right Soft Key $\square$ [Contacts], then select the contact you want to add to a group.
2. Press the Left Soft Key -// [Edit].
3. Select Group, press the Left Soft Key -// [Set].
4. Select either Personal or Business and then press the Center Select Key [MARK].
5. Press the Left Soft Key -// [Done].

- To create a new group, press the Right Soft Key $\boxed{\square}$ [New], and then press the Center Select Key [SAVE] after entering the group name.

6. Press the Center Select Key [SAVE] to update the contact entry.

## CHANGING THE CALL RINGTONE \& MESSAGE TONE

You can identify who is calling by setting different ringtones for different phone numbers in your Contacts.

1. Press the Right Soft Key $\boxtimes$ [Contacts], then select the contact whose ringtone you want to edit.
2. Press the Left Soft Key $-/ /$ [Edit].
3. Select Ringtone or Message Tone and press the Left Soft Key -// [Set].
4. To listen to the selected tone, press the Left Soft Key-// [Play]. To stop press the Left Soft Key -// [Stop]. To select, press the Center Select Key [OK].
5. Press the Center Select Key [SAVE] to update the contact entry.

## ADDING OR CHANGING THE PICTURE ID

To select a picture or graphic to assign to a Caller ID:

1. Press the Right Soft Key $\mathbb{\square}$ [Contacts], then select the contact you want to edit.
2. Press the Left Soft Key $-\square$ [Edit].
3. Select the Picture and press the Left Soft Key $-\square$ [Set].

## EXPOSURETO RADIO FREQUENCY SIGNALS

Your wireless handheld portable telephone is a low power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is 0 N , it receives and also sends out radio frequency (RF) signals. In August 1996, the Federal Communications Commissions (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for handheld wireless phones. Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standards previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies:

Those standards were based on comprehensive and periodic evaluations of the relevant scientific literature. For example, over 120 scientists, engineers, and physicians from universities, government health agencies, and industry reviewed the available body of research to develop the ANSI Standard (C951).
The design of your phone complies with the FCC guidelines (and those standards).

## ANTENNA SAFETY

Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could impair call quality, damage the phone, or result in violation of FCC regulations. Please contact your local dealer for replacement antenna.

Do not use the phone with a damaged antenna. If a damaged antenna comes into contact with the skin, a minor burn may result. Please contact your local dealer for replacement antenna.

## BATTERY SAFETY

Your device uses a removable and rechargeable lithium ion battery. Please contact customer service for assistance should you need a replacement battery.

## CHARGER

The Wall/USB Charger for this unit requires the use of a standard 120V AC power source for its operation.
Never attempt to disassemble or repair the Wall/USB Charger. Never use the Wall/ USB Charger if it has a damaged or worn power cord or plug. Always contact a PCD authorized service center, if repair or replacement is required.
Never alter the AC cord or plug on your Wall/USB Charger. If the plug will not fit into the available outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician. Never allow any liquids or water to spill on the Wall/USB Charger when it is connected to an AC power source.
Always use the authorized Wall/USB Charger to avoid any risk of bodily injury or damage to your cellular phone or battery.
Never attempt to connect or disconnect the Wall/USB Charger with wet hands. Always unplug the Wall/USB Charger from the power source before attempting any cleaning. Always use a dry, soft cloth dampened with water to clean the equipment, after it has been unplugged.
Handling the cord on this product or cords associated with accessories sold with this product, will expose you to lead, a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm. Wash your hands after handling. Always disconnect the Wall/USB Charger from the power source when it is not in use.
If the plug is not inserted completely, it may cause electric shock, heat generation
or fire. Do not use a damaged AC-Adapter or loosened plug. Do not touch the charging terminal with your hand or finger while it is conducting electricity. It may cause electric shock, injury or product failure.
Unplug the AC charger during lightning storms to avoid electric shock or fire. Do not overload a power outlet with too many devices.

## DRIVING SAFETY

Talking on the phone while driving is extremely dangerous and is illegal in some states. Remember, safety comes first. Check the laws and regulations on the use of phones in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. Also, if using your phone while driving, please:

- Give full attention to driving. Driving safely is your first responsibility.
- Use hands-free operation and/or one-touch, speed dialing, and auto answer modes, if available.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call, ifdriving conditions so require.
If you must use the phone while driving, please use one-touch, speed dialing, and auto answer modes.
An airbag inflates with great force. DO NOT place objects, including both installed or portable wireless equipment, in the area over the airbag or in the air bag deployment area. If in-vehicle wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

## ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Your wireless handheld portable telephone is a low power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is 0 N , it receives and also sends out radio frequency (RF) signals.

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from RF energy. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone. Therefore, use of your phone must be restricted in certain situations.

## PACEMAKERS

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association recommends that a minimum separation of six ( $6^{\prime \prime}$ ) inches be maintained between a handheld wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations ofWireless Technology Research.
Never come closer than six ( $6^{\prime \prime}$ ) inches to a person with a heart pacemaker implant when using your phone. Doing so could result in interference with the function of the pacemaker. Persons with pacemakers:

- ALWAYS keep the phone more than six inches from your pacemaker when the phone is turned on.
- Do not carry the phone in a breast pocket.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.
-If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn your phone OFF immediately.


## HEARING AIDS

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your service provider (or call the customer service line to discuss alternatives).

## OTHER MEDICAL DEVICES

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF energy.

Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information. Turn your phone OFF in healthcare facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or healthcare facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

## VEHICLES

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle. You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

## POSTED FACILITIES

Turn your phone OFF where posted notices so require.

## OTHER SAFETY GUIDELINES

## AIRCRAFT

FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while in the air. Turn your phone OFF before boarding an aircraft. Always request and obtain prior consent and approval of an authorized airline representative before using your phone aboard an aircraft.
Always follow the instructions of the airline representative whenever using your phone aboard an aircraft, to prevent any possible interference with airborne electronic equipment.

## BLASTING AREAS

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn your phone OFF when in a "blasting area" or in areas posted: "Turn off two-way radio." Obey all signs and instructions.

## POTENTIALLY EXPLOSIVE ATMOSPHERES

Turn your phone OFF when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.
Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include fueling areas such as gas stations; below deck on boats; fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities; vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane); areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders; and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

## GENERALSAFETY

## PRECAUTIONS

Your Handheld Portable Telephone is a high quality piece of equipment. Before operating, read all instructions and cautionary markings on (1) USB AC Adapter (2) Battery and (3) Product Using Battery.

Failure to follow the directions below could result in serious bodily injury and/or property damage due to battery liquid leakage, fire or rupture.
-DO NOT use or store this equipment in an extreme environment where high temperature or high humidity exists.

- DO NOT drop or abuse the equipment. Avoid striking, shaking or shocking. When not using, lay down the unit to avoid possible damage due to instability.
- DO NOT expose this equipment to rain or spilled beverages.
-DO NOT use unauthorized accessories.
- DO NOT disassemble the phone or its accessories. If service or repair is required, return unit to an authorized PCD cellular service center. If unit is disassembled, the risk of electric shock or fire may result.
-DO NOT place this equipment inside the microwave or pressurized container. It may cause explosion, product failure or fire.
- DO NOT throw this device into the fire or heat. It may cause explosion or fire.
- DO NOT short the terminal. Also, protect the terminal so that conductive objects, such as metal and pencil lead, do not touch or get caught in the terminal. It may cause fire or product failure. When plugging in the Wall/USB Charger, do not expose the metal strap or accessory to the electric plug. It may cause fire, electric shock, injury or product failure.
To avoid the risk of electric shock, do not use this device while there is lightning outside. The device is not water-proof. By placing it under a faucet or shower and adding water-pressure, or submerging it under water for a long time, the warranty will be invalid because the device will become non-repairable. If, by accident, you spill fluid, such as water, on the device, turn off the power, remove the battery and wipe off the fluid with a dry, clean cloth. By using this device with fluid on it, it may cause heat generation, fire, product failure or electric shock.
This device is not heat-resistant. Do not place it into a hot bath or liquid soap. Never touch the device's charging terminal with your hand or finger. It may cause electric shock, injury or product failure. If the device does not finish recharging within the specified timeframe, stop charging. It may cause leakage, heat generation, explosion or fire.
If the device is damaged by dropping it and the internal parts are exposed, do not touch the exposed parts. You might get an electric shock or injured from damaged parts. Call customer service for assistance.
- DO NOT place the device on an unstable area, such as wobbly stools or slanted places. The device may drop and cause injury. Also watch for shocks, particularly during vibration mode.
- DO NOT place the device near a child. They may accidentally swallow the device and suffocate.
- STOP using this device, if it starts to smoke, smell, make abnormal sounds or generate heat. If abnormality starts to happen while recharging, remove the Wall/USB Charger from the plug or cigarette lighter adapter, check that the device has cooled down, turn off the power, remove the battery and call customer service for assistance. Also, if the device has been damaged by dropping or getting it wet, discontinue using the device and call customer service. Never try to repair the device yourself. It is highly dangerous.
- DO NOT touch the device, battery or charging device while the phone is being recharged. It may cause a low-temperature burn.
If you are using the metal strap, be sure that it does not touch the charging terminal, especially the plug, while recharging. It may cause an electric shock, fire, injury or product failure.
To avoid injury or getting into an accident, check around you to ensure your safety while placing a call, messaging, taking a picture or playing a game with this device.
To avoid injury, do not use this device if the earpiece magnet picks up metal objects such as pins.
- NEVER bring the device near a floppy disk, magnetic card, magnetic tape, MOs, MDs, prepaid cards, or other similar objects. It may destroy or corrupt the data.
- NEVER press or poke the phone's display with your finger or another object. It may cause damage to the display.
- NEVER twist the device. It may cause product failure.
- DO NOT put stickers on the LCD screen or keypad. These stickers may touch and press keys when the Flip is closed. This may cause improper operating of the phone.


## GAMES

## SEIZURES/BLACKOUTS WARNING

A very small percentage of individuals may experience epileptic seizures when exposed to certain light patterns or flashing lights. ## REPETITIVE MOTION INJURIES

When you play games on your phone, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, arms, shoulders, neck, or other parts of your body. Follow these instructions to avoid problems such as tendonitis, carpal tunnel syndrome, or other musculoskeletal disorders:

- Take a minimum 15-minute break every hour of game playing.
- If your hands, wrists, or arms become tired or sore while playing, stop and rest for several hours before playing again.
- If you continue to have sore hands, wrists, or arms during or after play, stop playing and see a doctor.


## CAMERA

Do not aim your camera at the Sun. The sunlight passing through the Camera/ Camcorder Lens may cause damage to the camera.
Do not use your camera's flash close to a person's eyes. This may cause the person to lose eyesight temporarily and result in an accident.
Do not expose the Camera/Camcorder Lens to direct sunlight for a long period of time. It may cause explosion or fire from light-focus action.

## BODY-WORN OPERATION

This device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the phone kept 2.0 cm from the body. To maintain compliance requirements, use only belt-clips, holsters or similar accessories that maintain a 2.0 cm separation distance between the user's Body and the back of the phone, including the antenna.

The use of belt-clips, holsters and similar accessories should not contain metallic components in its assembly. The use of accessories that do not satisfy these requirements may not comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, and should be avoided.

## SAR INFORMATION

## THIS MODEL PHONE MEETS THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radiofrequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.
The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is $1.6 \mathrm{~W} / \mathrm{kg}$. * Tests for SAR are conducted with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.
The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is $1.0 \mathrm{~W} / \mathrm{Kg}$ and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is $1.12 \mathrm{~W} / \mathrm{Kg}$. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and FCC requirements). While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure.
The SAR testing for Body-worn operation was performed with a belt clip that provided a 2.0 cm separation. The User's Manual indicates that any holsters/dips used with this device should contain no metallic components.
The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines.

* In the United States and Canada, the SAR limit for mobile phones used by the public is 1.6 watts $/ \mathrm{kg}(\mathrm{W} / \mathrm{kg})$ averaged over one gram of tissue. The standard incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

## WHAT IS HEARING AID COMPATIBILITY?

The Federal Communications Commission has implemented rules and a rating system designed to enable people who wear hearing aids to more effectively use these wireless telecommunications devices. The standard for compatibility of digital wireless phones with hearing aids is set forth in American National Standard Institute (ANSI) standard C63.19. There are two sets of ANSI standards with ratings from one to four (four being the best rating): an " M " rating for reduced interference making it easier to hear conversations on the phone when using the hearing aid microphone, and a " T " rating that enables the phone to be used with hearing aids operating in the telecoil mode thus reducing unwanted background noise.

## HOW WILL I KNOW WHICH WIRELESS PHONES ARE HEARING AID COMPATIBLE?

The Hearing Aid Compatibility rating is displayed on the wireless phone box.
A phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for acoustic coupling (microphone mode) ifit has an "M3" or "M4" rating.


A digital wireless phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for inductive coupling (telecoil mode) if it has a" $T 3$ " or " $T 4$ " rating.
This phone has been tested and rated for use with hearing aids for some of the wireless technologies that it uses. However, there may be some newer wireless technologies used in this phone that have not been tested yet for use with hearing aids. It is important to try the different features of this phone thoroughly and in different locations, using your hearing aid or cochlear implant, to determine if you hear any interfering noise. Consult your service provider about its return and exchange policies and for information on hearing aid compatibility.

## HOW WILL I KNOW IF MY HEARING AID WILL WORK WITH A PARTICULAR DIGITAL WIRELESS PHONE?

You'll want to try a number of wireless phones so that you can decide which works the best with your hearing aids. You may also want to talk with your hearing aid professional about the extent to which your hearing aids are immune to interference, if they have wireless phone shielding, and whether your hearing aid has a HAC rating.

## TELETYPEWRITER (TTY) DEVICES

You can use an optional teletypewriter (TTY) device with your phone to send and receive calls. You must plug the TTY device into the phone's headset connector and set the phone to operate in one of three TTY modes.
ATTY is a communication device used by people who are hard of hearing or have a speech impairment. TTY does not work from mobile phone to mobile phone. Use a TSB-121 compliant cable (provided by the TTY manufacturer) to connect the TTY device to your phone. Your phone has a 2.5 mm jack. Set the phone to Medium volume level for proper operation. If you experience a high number of incorrect characters, adjust the volume as needed to minimize the error rate. For optimal performance, your phone should be at least 12 inches ( 30 centimeters) from the TTY device. Placing the phone too close to the TTY device may cause high error rates.

## FDA CONSUMER UPDATE

FDSU.S. FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION - CENTER FOR DEVICES AND RADIOLOGICAL HEALTH CONSUMER UPDATE ON WIRELESS PHONES

1. Do wireless phones pose a health hazard?

The available scientific evidence does not show that any health problems are associated with using wireless phones. There is no proof, however, that wireless phones are absolutely safe. Wireless phones emit low levels of radiofrequency energy (RF) in the microwave range while being used. They also emit very low levels of RF when in the idle mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects. Many studies of low level RF exposures have not found any biological effects. Some studies have suggested that some biological effects may occur, but such findings have not
been confirmed by additional research. In some cases, other researchers have had difficulty in reproducing those studies, or in determining the reasons for inconsistent results.

## 2. What is FDA's role concerning the safety of wireless phones?

Under the law, FDA does not review the safety of radiation-emitting consumer products such as wireless phones before they can be sold, as it does with new drugs or medical devices. However, the agency has authority to take action if wireless phones are shown to emit radiofrequency energy (RF) at a level that is hazardous to the user. In such a case, FDA could require the manufacturers of wireless phones to notify users of the health hazard and to repair, replace or recall the phones so that the hazard no longer exists. Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, FDA has urged the wireless phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support needed research into possible biological effects of RF of the type emitted by wireless phones;
- Design wireless phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user that is not necessary for device function;
- Cooperate in providing users of wireless phones with the best possible information on possible effects of wireless phone use on human health.
FDA belongs to an interagency working group of the federal agencies that have responsibility for different aspects of RF safety to ensure coordinated efforts at the federal level. The following agencies belong to this working group:
- National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health
- Environmental Protection Agency
- Federal Communications Commission
- Occupational Safety and Health Administration
- National Telecommunications and Information Administration

The National Institutes of Health participates in some inter-agency working group activities, as well. FDA shares regulatory responsibilities for wireless phones with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). All phones that are sold in the United States must comply with FCC safety guidelines that limit RF exposure. FCC relies on FDA and other health agencies for safety questions about wireless phones. FCC also regulates the base stations that the wireless phone networks rely upon. While these base stations operate at higher power than do the wireless phones themselves, the RF exposures that people get from these base stations are typically thousands of times lower than those they can get from wireless phones. Base stations are thus not the subject of the safety questions discussed in this document.

## 3. What kinds of phones are the subject of this update?

The term "wireless phone" refers here to hand-held wireless phones with built-in antennas, often called "cell,""mobile," or"PCS" phones. These types of wireless phones can expose the user to measurable radiofrequency energy (RF) because of the short distance between the phone and the user's head.
These RF exposures are limited by Federal Communications Commission safety guidelines that were developed with the advice of FDA and other federal health and safety agencies. When the phone is located at greater distances from the user, the exposure to RF is drastically lower because a person's RF exposure decreases rapidly with increasing distance from the source. The so-called "cordless phones," which have a base unit connected to the telephone wiring in a house, typically operate at far lower power levels, and thus produce RF exposures far below the FCC safety limits.

## 4. What are the results of the research done already?

The research done thus far has produced conflicting results, and many studies have suffered from flaws in their research methods. Animal experiments
investigating the effects of radiofrequency energy (RF) exposures characteristic of wireless phones have yielded conflicting results that often cannot be repeated in other laboratories. A few animal studies, however, have suggested that low levels of RF could accelerate the development of cancer in laboratory animals. However, many of the studies that showed increased tumor development used animals that had been genetically engineered or treated with cancer-causing chemicals so as to be predisposed to develop cancer in the absence of RF exposure. Other studies exposed the animals to RF for up to 22 hours per day. These conditions are not similar to the conditions under which people use wireless phones, so we don't know with certainty what the results of such studies mean for human health. Three large epidemiology studies have been published since December 2000. Between them, the studies investigated any possible association between the use of wireless phones and primary brain cancer, glioma, meningioma, or acoustic neu-roma, tumors of the brain or salivary gland, leukemia, or other cancers. None of the studies demonstrated the existence of any harmful health effects from wireless phone RF exposures.
However, none of the studies can answer questions about long-term exposures, since the average period of phone use in these studies was around three years.
5. What research is needed to decide whether RF exposure from wireless phones poses a health risk?
A combination of laboratory studies and epidemiological studies of people actually using wireless phones would provide some of the data that are needed. Lifetime animal exposure studies could be completed in a few years. However, very large numbers of animals would be needed to provide reliable proof of a cancer promoting effect if one exists. Epidemiological studies can provide data that is directly applicable to human populations, but 10 or more years'follow-up may be needed to provide answers about some health effects, such as cancer. This is because the interval between the time of exposure to a cancer-causing
agent and the time tumors develop - if they do -may be many, many years. The interpretation of epidemiological studies is hampered by difficulties in measuring actual RF exposure during day-to-day use of wireless phones. Many factors affect this measurement, such as the angle at which the phone is held, or which model of phone is used.
6. What is FDA doing to find out more about the possible health effects of wireless phone RF?
FDA is working with the U.S. National Toxicology Program and with groups of investigators around the world to ensure that high priority animal studies are conducted to address important questions about the effects of exposure to radiofrequency energy (RF). FDA has been a leading participant in the World Health Organization International Electromagnetic Fields (EMF) Project since its inception in 1996. An influential result of this work has been the development of a detailed agenda of research needs that has driven the establishment of new research programs around the world.
The Project has also helped develop a series of public information documents on EMF issues. FDA and CTIA - The Wireless Association have a formal Cooperative Research and Development Agreement (CRADA) to do research on wireless phone safety. FDA provides the scientific oversight, obtaining input from experts in government, industry, and academic organizations. CTIA-funded research is conducted through contracts to independent investigators. The initial research will include both laboratory studies and studies of wireless phone users. The CRADA will also include a broad assessment of additional research needs in the context of the latest research developments around the world.

## 7. How can I find out how much radiofrequency energy exposure I can get by using my wireless phone?

All phones sold in the United States must comply with Federal Communications Commission (FCC) guidelines that limit radiofrequency energy (RF) exposures.

FCC established these guidelines in consultation with FDA and the other federal health and safety agencies. The FCC limit for RF exposure from wireless telephones is set at a Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) of 1.6 watts per kilogram ( $1.6 \mathrm{~W} / \mathrm{kg}$ ). The FCC limit is consistent with the safety standards developed by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (IEEE) and the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement. The exposure limit takes into consideration the body's ability to remove heat from the tissues that absorb energy from the wireless phone and is set well below levels known to have effects. Manufacturers of wireless phones must report the RF exposure level for each model of phone to the FCC. The FCC website (http://www.fda.gov (under " $c$ " in the subject index, select Cell Phones $>$ Research)) gives directions for locating the FCC identification number on your phone so you can find your phone's RF exposure level in the online listing.

## 8. What has FDA done to measure the radiofrequency energy coming from wireless phones?

The Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) is developing a technical standard for measuring the radiofrequency energy (RF) exposure from wireless phones and other wireless handsets with the participation and leadership of FDA scientists and engineers. The standard, "Recommended Practice for Determining the Spatial-Peak Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) in the Human Body Due to Wireless Communications Devices: Experimental Techniques," sets forth the first consistent test methodology for measuring the rate at which RF is deposited in the heads of wireless phone users. The test method uses a tissue-simulating model of the human head. Standardized SAR test methodology is expected to greatly improve the consistency of measurements made at different laboratories on the same phone. SAR is the measurement of the amount of energy absorbed in tissue, either by the whole body or a small part of the body. It is measured in watts/kg (or milliwatts $/ \mathrm{g}$ ) of matter. This measurement is used to determine whether a wireless phone complies with safety guidelines.
9. What steps can I take to reduce my exposure to radiofrequency energy from my wireless phone?
If there is a risk from these products-and at this point we do not know that there is-it is probably very small. But if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your exposure to radiofrequency energy (RF). Since time is a key factor in how much exposure a person receives, reducing the amount of time spent using a wireless phone will reduce $R F$ exposure.

- If you must conduct extended conversations by wireless phone every day, you could place more distance between your body and the source of the RF, since the exposure level drops off dramatically with distance.

For example, you could use a headset and carry the wireless phone away from your body or use a wireless phone connected to a remote antenna. Again, the scientific data do not demonstrate that wireless phones are harmful. But if you are concerned about the RF exposure from these products, you can use measures like those described above to reduce your RF exposure from wireless phone use.

## 10. What about children using wireless phones?

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to users of wireless phones, including children and teenagers. If you want to take steps to lower exposure to radiofrequency energy (RF), the measures described above would apply to children and teenagers using wireless phones. Reducing the time of wireless phone use and increasing the distance between the user and the RF source will reduce RF exposure. Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using wireless phones at all. For example, the government in the United Kingdom distributed leaflets containing such a recommendation in December 2000. They noted that no evidence exists that using a wireless phone causes brain tumors or other ill
effects. Their recommendation to limit wireless phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.
11. Do hands-free kits for wireless phones reduce risks from exposure to RF emissions?

Since there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from wireless phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used with wireless phones for convenience and comfort. These systems reduce the absorption of RF energy in the head because the phone, which is the source of the RF emissions, will not be placed against the head.
On the other hand, if the phone is mounted against the waist or other part of the body during use, then that part of the body will absorb more RF energy. Wireless phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet safety requirements regardless of whether they are used against the head or against the body. Either configuration should result in compliance with the safety limit.
12. Do wireless phone accessories that claim to shield the head from RF radiation work?
Since there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from wireless phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories that claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption. In February 2002, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) charged two companies that sold devices that claimed to protect wireless phone users from

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radiation with making false and unsubstantiated claims. According to FTC, these defendants lacked a reasonable basis to substantiate their claim.
13. What about wireless phone interference with medical equipment?

Radiofrequency energy (RF) from wireless phones can interact with some electronic devices. For this reason, FDA helped develop a detailed test method to measure electromagnetic interference (EMI) of implanted cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators from wireless telephones.
This test method is now part of a standard sponsored by the Association for the Advancement of Medical instrumentation (AAMI). The final draft, a joint effort by FDA, medical device manufacturers, and many other groups, was completed in late 2000. This standard will allow manufacturers to ensure that cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators are safe from wireless phone EMI. FDA has tested hearing aids for interference from handheld wireless phones and helped develop a voluntary standard sponsored by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE). This standard specifies test methods and performance requirements for hearing aids and wireless phones so that no interference occurs when a person uses a "compatible"phone and a "compatible" hearing aid at the same time. This standard was approved by the IEEE in 2000. FDA continues to monitor the use of wireless phones for possible interactions with other medical devices. Should harmful interference be found to occur, FDA will conduct testing to assess the interference and work to resolve the problem.

## EMERGENCY CALLS

Never rely solely upon your wireless phone for essential communications (e.g. medical emergencies), if it can be avoided, since a wireless phone requires a complex combination of radio signals, relay stations and landline networks for its operation.
Consequently, emergency calls may not always be possible under all conditions on all wireless phone systems. Your wireless phone, however, may sometimes be the only available means of communication at the scene of an accident. When making an emergency call, always give the recipient all necessary information as accurately as possible. Never terminate an emergency call until you have received clearance to do so.

## FCC ENHANCED 911 (E911) RULES BACKGROUND

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) requires wireless carriers to transmit specific latitude and longitude location (Automatic Location Identification = ALI) information as well as " 911 " calls to Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) to identify the location of the caller in case of emergency. Generally, the rules require that carriers identify an E 911 caller's location within 50 meters of the actual location for 67 percent of calls and within 150 meters of the actual location for 95 percent of calls.

## CASIO G'ZONE RAVINE ${ }^{\oplus} 2$ - ALI CAPABILITY

The Ravine ${ }^{\oplus} 2$ is an ALI-capable phone equipped with a GPS (Global Positioning System) receiver supporting a satellite-based GPS ALI-capable network to comply with the FCC's ALI requirements.
The network compliance with the above FCC requirements is dependent on: (a) the use of digital technology by the wireless network; (b) GPS satellite signals being able to reach the handset (such transmissions do not always work indoors, for example); and (c) handset signals reaching wireless "base stations" (atmospheric and environmental conditions may cause variations in handset receiving signal strength).
Also the transmission of the ALl information is subject, in part, to system constraints within the wireless network to which the E911 signal is transmitted and over which PCD has no control. Finally, customers are advised that the Ravine ${ }^{\ominus}$ 's ALI capability is to be used for E911 purposes only.

## 911 IN LOCK MODE

The " 911 "call service is available even in the lock mode.

1. Enter" 911 "then press the SEND Key $\square$.
2. The call connects.
3. The phone exits the Lock Mode for 5 minutes.
4. To exit emergency mode, press the END/PWR Key $\sigma$.

## 911 USING ANY AVAILABLE SYSTEM

1. Enter" 911 "then press the SEND Key $\square$.
2. The call connects.
3. The phone remains in Emergency Mode for 5 minutes.
4. To exit emergency mode, press the END/PWR Key $\$$.

## COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER FCC REGULATIONS

## OPERATING PROCEDURES

Never violate any of the following Rules and Regulations of the FCC when using your Cellular Phone. Such violations are punishable by fine, imprisonment or both.

- Never use obscene, indecent, or profane language.
- Never use your Cellular Phone to send false distress calls.
- Never wiretap or otherwise intercept a phone call, unless you have first obtained the consent of the parties participating in the call.
- Never make any anonymous calls to annoy, harass, or molest other people.
- Never charge another account without authorization, to avoid payment for service.
- Never willfully or maliciously interfere with any other radio communications.
- Never refuse to yield the line when informed that it is needed for an Emergency Call. Also, never take over a line by stating falsely that it is needed for an emergency.


## AVOID POTENTIAL HEARING LOSS

Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cellular telephones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss. This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds and Bluetooth ${ }^{\circledR}$ or other wireless devices). Exposure to very loud sound has also been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and other potential hearing problems varies.

The amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device, the device settings and the headphones. You should follow some commonsense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Set the volume in a quiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
-When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment, use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background environmental noise.
- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before your hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss. Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Excessive sound pressure from earphones can cause hearing loss.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech or experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.
